THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

OVC teams were 3-1 against teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) in week two of the season and are now 6-1 against FBS foes on the season...Other OVC teams during the week were 0-3 against Football Bowl Subdivision teams and 2-0 against non-Division I opponents...Eastern Kentucky is ranked in both the FCS Top 25 polls (No. 20 in the Sports Network, No. 25 in the FCS Coaches) while Jacksonville State is No. 24 in the Sports Network poll (but unranked in the coaches poll)...This week's slate of games includes the first Conference game of the season as Austin Peay plays at Tennessee State; that game will be played at Hale Stadium on the TSU campus, the first game played in that venue since the 1998 season (TSU has played its home games in LP Field since 1999 and will play two games at LP Field this year)...It also marks the first game of the Sgt. York Trophy series which enters its sixth season in 2012...The trophy goes to the winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC football playing schools from Tennessee; Tennessee State is the defending champion...UT Martin is the only other OVC team to play a home game this week, as the Skyhawks open the home portion of its campaign against Southeastern Louisiana; the other five OVC teams all play road contests on Saturday and Jacksonville State has the week off...The week also features three OVC teams facing off with teams from the Missouri Valley Football Conference; OVC teams are 1-0 against MVFC schools so far this year.

CO-OFFENSIVE

DaMarcus James, RB • So., 5-10, 220 • Demopolis, Ala. • Jacksonville State

James carried the ball 16 times for 120 yards and a touchdown and caught a 30-yard touchdown in Jacksonville State's 27-24 victory over Chattanooga in its home opener. The rushing touchdown in the second quarter was the first of his career and put the Gamecocks on top 17-0. Midway through the third quarter he caught Coty Blanchard's pass and scored from 30 yards out to cap an 8-play JSU drive and put his team on top 24-10. James also had a key 13-yard rush that put the Gamecocks on the UTC 20-yard line with one second remaining in the game which setup Griffin Thomas' 37-yard game winning field goal as time expired. He is the second different Jacksonville State player to rush for and catch a touchdown pass in the same game this season.

CO-OFFENSIVE

Trabis Ward, RB • Jr., 5-10, 200 • Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. • Tennessee State

Ward carried the ball 22 times for 114 yards and a career-best three touchdowns as Tennessee State topped rival Jackson State 38-12 in the 23rd Annual Southern Heritage Classic played at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis. The junior became just the sixth TSU player to rush for three or more touchdowns in a game and first since the 2008 season (Javarris Williams). All of Ward's touchdowns came in the second quarter, the last coming on a 47-yard scamper to put the Tigers up 21-6 heading into halftime. For his efforts Ward was named Southern Heritage Classic MVP. Ward currently ranks 10th nationally in rushing (119.0 yards/game) and sixth nationally in scoring (12.0 points/game).

DEFENSIVE

Rashad Smith, LB • Jr., 6-1, 210 • Ft. Walton Beach, Fla. • Jacksonville State

Smith had a career-high 15 tackles, including 11 solo stops, in Jacksonville State's thrilling 27-24 victory over regional rival Chattanooga on Saturday. The junior linebacker also forced a fumble that was returned by teammate Pierre Warren for a 75-yard touchdown in the opening quarter. Smith became the first JSU player to have 15 or more tackles in a game since 2009 (Alexander Henderson). Smith currently ranks 14th nationally in tackles (11.5/game) and fourth in forced fumbles (1.00/game).

Griffin Thomas, K • Jr., 5-11, 170 • Snellville, Ga. • Jacksonville State

Thomas connected on a pair of field goals, including the game-winner as time expired, in Jacksonville State's 27-24 victory over rival Chattanooga on Saturday. The junior connected on a 33-yard field goal midway through the first quarter to give the Gamecocks a 3-0 lead. Later it was his 37-yarder as time expired that gave Jax State its first victory of the season. It marked the first game-winning field goal of Thomas' career. The field goal capped a six-play drive that came after the Mocs had tied the game with just 39 seconds to play.

NEWCOMER

Troymaine Pope, RB • Fr., 5-9, 198 • Anniston, Ala. • Jacksonville State

After leading the team in rushing (65 yards) in his collegiate debut at nationally-ranked Arkansas last week, Pope earned his first career start against Chattanooga on Saturday and netted his first career 100-yard game. The true freshman carried the ball 12 times for 105 yards, averaging 8.8 yards/carry against one of the top defensive teams in the Southern Conference. Pope joined teammate DaMarcus James in each reaching 100 yards on the night, giving JSU multiple 100-yard rushers in the same game for the first time since 2009. It marks the second-straight week Pope has earned the OVC Newcomer of the Week honor.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

OVC Teams Versus FBS Foes: OVC schools will play 11 games against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) this season. In week one of the season UT Martin topped Memphis 20-17 in the Liberty Bowl as Cody Sandlin hit a 43-yard field goal with four seconds remaining. It marked the first-ever win over an FBS team for UT Martin and the first loss for Memphis against an FCS foe in 23 years. It was the first OVC win over an FBS team since the 2010 season when Jacksonville State topped Ole Miss in double overtime. Overall OVC teams are 19-155-1 all-time against FBS foes. Below is a listing of the current OVC schools and wins over FBS schools while a member of the league. Five of the wins over FBS teams for OVC teams have been accomplished by teams no longer in the OVC (Akron, Middle Tennessee, Morehead State and Youngstown State - twice) and are not listed below.

FCS over FBS: Including UT Martin's win against Memphis in Week 1 of the 2012 season, four Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams topped Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams. Other FCS teams to win included Eastern Washington (Idaho), McNeese State (Middle Tennessee) and Youngstown State (Pitt). Week two of the season saw four more FCS schools (Illinois State, North Dakota State, Northern Arizona and Sacramento State) win games against FBS schools.

OVC Teams in the Top 25: Eastern Kentucky remains the only OVC team to be ranked in both national Top 25 FCS polls. The Colonels are 20th in the Sports Network poll and 25th in the FCS Coaches Poll. The only other OVC team who is ranked is Jacksonville State who appears at No. 24 in the Sports Network poll; the Gamecocks are just outside the Top 25 (28th) in the FCS Coaches Poll. Six other OVC schools are receiving votes in the Sports Network poll, including Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin.

NCAA Stats Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders, Southeast Missouri kicker **Drew Geldbach** leads the nation in field goals (2.50/game). Tennessee Tech running back **Adam Urbano** ranks second nationally in rushing (140.0 yards/game) and 11th nationally in all-purpose yards (151.5/game). TTU quarterback **Tre Lamb** is second in passing efficiency (187.36), third in points responsible for (21.0/game), fifth in passing yards/game (306.5) and eighth in total offense (317.0 yards/game). Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** is seventh in passing yards/game (297.0) while Murray State quarterback **Casey Brockman** is 10th in passing yards (281.0/game) and fifth in completions (30.0/game). Tennessee State running back **Travis Ward** is 10th nationally in all-purpose yards (119.0/game) and sixth in scoring (12.0/game). Eastern Illinois wide receiver **Erik Lora** is third in receiving yards/game (133.0) and fourth in receptions/game (9.0) while UT Martin wide receiver **Quentin Sims** is fourth in receptions (9.0/game) and sixth in receiving yards (111.0/game). UT Martin's **Chris Wright** is first nationally in fumbles recovered/game (1.0) while Eastern Kentucky's **Brooklyn Fox**, Tennessee State's **Steven Godbolt III** and Southeast Missouri's **Taylor Brock** are tied for second nationally in interceptions (1.0/game). In the team rankings Eastern Illinois ranks first nationally in fumbles recovered (7) and turnovers gained (10), fifth in passing offense (338.5 yards/game) and seventh in turnover margin (+2.0/game). Southeast Missouri ranks first in passes intercepted (6) and least interceptions thrown (0), second in turnovers gained (9)

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and fourth in turnover margin (+2.5/game). Austin Peay ranks first nationally in red zone offense (100%) and fourth down conversion defense (0%). Tennessee Tech is fourth in passing efficiency (187.9), seventh in total offense (513.0 yards/game), ninth in passing offense (306.5 yards/game) and ninth in net punting (41.17 yards/punt). Tennessee State is fifth in turnovers gained (7), fifth in fumbles recovered (4) and seventh in turnover margin (+2.0).

Huzzie Named National Linebacker of the Week From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 2: Murray State junior **Qua Huzzie** was named the National Linebacker of the Week from the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) after registering nine tackles, four tackles-for-loss and his first career interception against nationally-ranked Central Arkansas. In addition to Huzzie seven other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

Attendance Figures: Tennessee State played in front of 42,257 fans on Sept. 8 against Jackson State in the Liberty Bowl in Memphis. That is the most fans to see a FCS game so far in the 2012 season. In average home attendance Jacksonville State currently ranks eighth nationally after 18,993 fans saw its game with Chattanooga on Sept. 8.

Murray State's Brockman, EKU's Denham on Walter Payton Award Watch List: Murray State senior quarterback **Casey Brockman** and Eastern Kentucky senior running back **Matt Denham** are two of the 20 players on the initial 2012 Walter Payton Award Watch List as determined by the Sports Network. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. The Watch List can undergo revision during the season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information/media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season on Nov. 19. The top three vote-getters will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation. The only former OVC player to win the award is former Eastern Illinois quarterback Tony Romo who took home the honor in 2002.

Southeast Missouri's Peiffer on Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Southeast Missouri State senior linebacker **Blake Peiffer** is one of 20 players on the initial Buck Buchanan Award Watch List as determined by the Sports Network. The Buck Buchanan Award was established in 1995 and is given to the top defensive player at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. The Watch List can undergo revision during the season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information/media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season on Nov. 19. The winner will be announced at the annual Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation. An OVC player has never won the Buck Buchanan Award.

challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four football-playing OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the OVC announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). In 2007 Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season (that was the tiebreaker used only for the first year of the trophy series). Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. In 2009 Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games and a year ago UT Martin became the third-straight OVC team to go 3-0 and win the trophy in claiming its first title. Last year Tennessee Tech and Tennessee State each finished 2-1 in Sgt. York play this season to share the trophy; Tennessee State, however, took home the actual trophy by a tiebreaker, since they had gone longer without possessing the trophy (TSU last won in 2008 while TTU won in 2009). The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring.

NCAA Division I Playoff Information: This season marks the third of the expanded 20-team playoff field. Two years ago the field was expanded from 16 to 20 teams, marking the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The eight lowest-rated teams will play in first round games while the 12-highest rated teams will receive a bye into the second round. For the third-straight year the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at FC Dallas Stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 5. The playoff field will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 18. It was announced in August 2012 that the field would once again expand, this time to 24 teams beginning in the 2013 season. With the expansion will come an automatic bid for the Pioneer League, giving the playoffs 11 automatic bids and 13 at-large selections.

Garoppolo Named National All-Star By College Sporting News (Sept. 3): Eastern Illinois junior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named a National All-Star by College Sporting News after his performance in Week 1 of the season against Southern Illinois. Garoppolo completed 32-of-49 passes for a career-high 369 yards and five touchdowns in the 49-28 victory.

Garoppolo completed 32-of-49 passes for a career-high 369 yards and five touchdowns in the 49-28 victory while Fox intercepted two passes and recovered a fumble in a loss to FBS Purdue.

Five OVC Players Earns Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 1; Garoppolo Named National Performer of the Week: Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named the National Performer of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) after throwing for 369 yards and five touchdowns in EIU's win over Southern Illinois. Garoppolo was also named one of the organization's National Quarterbacks of the Week, sharing the honor with Tennessee Tech's **Tre Lamb**, who threw for 339 yards and four touchdowns in a win over Hampton. Eastern Illinois wide receiver **Erik Lora** was named National Wide Receiver of the Week after catching 13 passes for 151 yards and two touchdowns. Among the other wideouts sharing the award is Jacksonville State's **Alan Bonner** who had eight catches for 107 yards and a

touchdown against No. 10 Arkansas. Eastern Kentucky defensive back **Brooklyn Fox** was named National Defensive Back of the Week after picking off two passes and recovering a fumble in the Colonels game at Purdue. In addition to this group seven other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

A Look at the Coaches: Eight of the nine head coaches from last season return to their schools in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. The only newcomer is Eastern Illinois head coach Dino Babers, who took over for Bob Spoo who retired following a 25-year career at the school. Babers was most recently the special teams coordinator and wide receivers coach at Baylor. Jacksonville State's **Jack Crowe** is the longest tenured coach in the league (in his 13th season at JSU). Two OVC coaches, Austin Peay's **Rick Christophel** and Tennessee State's **Rod Reed**, are currently coaching at their alma maters.

Preseason Forecasts: For the 12th time in the last 25 years (and first time since 2009), Eastern Kentucky was picked as the preseason favorite in the Ohio Valley Conference football race. The Colonels picked up 12 of the 18 possible first-place votes (124 points) while second-place Jacksonville State received the other six first-place votes (117). The poll was rounded out by Murray State (85 points), Tennessee Tech (83), Tennessee State (69), UT Martin (67), Southeast Missouri (44), Eastern Illinois (42) and Austin Peay (17). Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 34 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 13 times (38.2%). After eight years of not picking the champion right (2003-2010), last season the preseason poll and actual champion (be it by a three-way tie) were the same.

Murray State's Brockman, Southeast Missouri's Peiffer Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Murray State senior quarterback **Casey Brockman** was named 2012 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Southeast Missouri State senior linebacker **Blake Peiffer** was tabbed OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Kentucky led the way with 10 selections on the preseason team while Murray State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech had three picks apiece. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (13 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included nine players who were second-team selections in 2011. Of the 26 total selections, 18 were seniors, six were juniors and two were sophomores.

NFL Connections: As of September 10, there are 13 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters (8 active players, 4 practice squad players and 1 on IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now in his first season with the Philadelphia Eagles. Seven of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL with Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri leading the way with two active players apiece.

football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the seventh year the OVC has streamed live events, but first time the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format and will feature improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2012 season marks the sixth of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play in 2007. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games while Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy. UT Martin made it three straight years with the winning team going 3-0, completing the perfect season in 2010 to win its first title.

Last season Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech finished in a tie for the Trophy (2-1) and were declared co-champions. Tennessee State, however, will take home the actual trophy since they had gone the most seasons without winning it (2008, compared to 2009 for TTU).

GAME NOTES: UT Martin hosts Southeastern Louisiana on Thursday night in its final regular season non-conference action of the season. The game is also the first of the season for the Skyhawks at home and first against a Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) opponent (after playing two FBS teams to start the year). Southeastern comes to town with first-year head coach Ron Roberts, who played two seasons of football (1988-89) at UT Martin and graduated in 1990. In the last meeting between the two schools (2010), Derek Carr threw for 390 yards and a touchdown and Jason McNair ran for 132 yards but UT Martin came out on the short end of a 24-10 decision after committing four turnovers.

SCOUTING SOUTHEASTERN LOUISIANA: Roberts took over at Southeastern Louisiana after guiding Delta State to four Gulf South Championships and four appearances in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. Overall he was 47-16 in five years at Delta State before taking over the Lions program before this season. Southeastern started the season with a 62-10 loss at SEC foe Missouri and opened its home season last week, falling 31-14 to South Dakota State. In that contest SDSU jumped out to a 13-0 advantage before the Lions were able to trim the lead to 13-7 early in the third quarter before the Jacks went on an 18-0 run to put the game out of reach. South Dakota State outgained Southeastern Louisiana 439-179 in total offense. The SLU defense was led by sophomore linebacker Kaleb Muse who had 14 tackles while senior defensive end Devan Walker added 10 stops. Quarterback Nathan Stanley completed 22-of-43 passes for 190 yards and a touchdown.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: After opening the season with a victory over Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent Memphis, the Skyhawks lost FBS opponent Northern Illinois last week. The Skyhawks were able to net 346 yards of total offense, including 264 passing yards for senior quarterback Derek Carr. Carr completed 19-of-35 passes and had a seven-yard touchdown pass to Corey Jordan in the fourth quarter. Carr now has 5,627 career passing yards, the third-most in school history. Senior Quentin Sims pulled down 10 passes for 152 yards, the highest yardage output by an OVC receiver so far this season. Sims currently ranks fourth nationally in receptions (9.0/game) and sixth nationally in receiving yards (111.0 yards/game). The UTM team is just 4-for-10 in the red zone this season after being 45-of-48 (94%) a season ago. Junior linebacker Ben Johnson had 13 tackles (10 solo) and a sack to lead the Skyhawk defense. Chris Wright recovered his second fumble of the season against NIU and leads all FCS players in that category (2).

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay travels to Tennessee State for the first Conference matchup of the 2012 season. The game is also the first of the sixth annual Sgt. York Trophy series, which is played between the four OVC schools from the state of Tennessee. Tennessee State is the defending Sgt. York Champion, winning the title for the third time a year ago (TSU also won in 2007 and 2008). Tennessee State leads the all-time series with Austin Peay by an 8-6 margin, although the Governors have won the last three meetings, each by three points. Since the series was renewed in 2007 after a 10-year break (when APSU was playing non-scholarship football), the last five meetings have each been decided by three or less points. In last year's meeting Tennessee State pulled ahead 34-20 with 7:32 to play in the third quarter before Austin Peay scored the final 17 points of the game, including touchdown runs by Ryan White and Wesley Kitts and a game-winning 35-yard field goal by Stephen Stansell with 11 seconds to play. Trabis Ward led the Tigers with 101 yards rushing while TSU quarterback Michael German passed for 304 yards and two touchdowns. Jake Ryan led the APSU attack with 314 passing yards and two scores. Saturday's game marks a return to on-campus football for Tennessee State, as the Tigers will play at Hale Stadium for the first time since the 1998 season. The game is the first of three at the venue for the Tigers this year. TSU and APSU last played against each other in Hale Stadium (also known as "The Hole") in 1996, when TSU captured a 38-14 victory. Saturday's game also features a pair of head coaches coaching at their alma maters.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay played its second-straight game against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent last week, losing at No. 15 Virginia Tech. The Gobs were limited to 221 yards of total offense, including just 62 passing yards. Senior Wesley Kitts recorded his second-straight 100-yard rushing game, tallying a career-high 110 yards on 22 carries, including a long rush of 32 yards. Kitts currently ranks fourth in the OVC and 19th nationally in rushing (107.0 yards/game). Terrence Oliver scored on a 10-yard run in the third quarter; it was his first career rushing touchdown and marked the 75-straight game the Gobs had scored in. Junior Earnest Smith had eight tackles and a sack against the Hokies while also forcing a fumble. Safety Johnathan Shuler led Austin Peay with nine tackles. APSU currently leads all FCS teams in red zone offense (100%) and fourth down conversion defense (0%).

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State improved to 2-0 for the first time since 2008 (when the team began 4-0) with a neutral site victory over Jackson State in the Southern Heritage Classic in Memphis on Saturday. Trabis Ward earned Classic MVP and OVC Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors after carrying the ball 23 times for 114 yards and three touchdowns. He became just the sixth TSU player to have three or more rushing touchdowns in a game and first since the 2008 season. Ward now ranks 10th nationally in rushing (119.0 yards/game) and sixth nationally in scoring (12.0 points/game). Redshirt freshman Telvin Hooks added 99 yards on 10 carries, including a 51-yard run. Overall the Tigers rushing attack netted 235 yards, while limiting Jackson State to just 46 yards on the ground. As a team Tennessee State ranks seventh nationally in turnover margin (+2.0/game).

GAME NOTES: Eastern Illinois and Illinois State will meet for the 101st playing of the Mid-American Classic on Saturday afternoon. Last year the two teams played for a traveling trophy for the first time in the long series, as the rivalry was re-branded with the Mid-American Classic moniker. Illinois State holds an advantage in the all-time series, which dates back to 1901. Last year Eastern Illinois scored a 33-26 victory to open the 2011 season. In that game Jimmy Garoppolo completed 25-of-34 passes for 304 yards and three touchdowns and also rushed for an additional touchdown. His touchdown pass to Chris Wright with 2:38 to play proved to be the game winner. Lorence Ricks pulled in seven catches for 114 yards and a score. Illinois State head coach Brock Spack was formerly an assistant coach under at Eastern Illinois under legendary coach Bob Spoo, who retired at the end of last season.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Coming off a victory over Southern Illinois to begin the season, Eastern Illinois suffered a loss at FBS foe Western Michigan this past Saturday. That game was tied at 14 at the end of the first quarter before WMU scored 28 unanswered points in the second quarter to put the game out of reach. Quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo, who earned National Player of the Week honors after his week one performance, completed 15-of-32 passes for 225 yards and a touchdown in week two of the season. Garoppolo was picked off twice and sacked four times. Five of his completions went to Erik Lora who netted 115 receiving yards in the game. Through two weeks of the season Lora ranks third nationally in receiving yards/game (133.0) and fourth in receptions/game (9.0). Garoppolo is seventh nationally in passing (297.0 yards/game) and moved into fifth place on the school's career passing list during the game. Nick Beard had 13 tackles as did newcomer LeQuince McCall. Eastern Illinois now ranks first nationally in fumbles recovered (7) and turnovers gained (10).

SCOUTING ILLINOIS STATE: Illinois State, winners of seven of its last eight games dating back to last season, is off to an unbeaten start to the season, topping Dayton 56-14 in week one of the season and last week besting Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Eastern Michigan 31-14. The win was the first over a FBS opponent for the Redbirds since topping Akron in the 1991 season; overall it broke a 20-game losing streak to FBS foes. It also marked the first time ISU had started the season 2-0 since 1999; that season the team went on to finish 11-3 and advanced to the semifinals of the FCS Playoffs. The Illinois State defense was able to force five turnovers against EMU and did not allow any second half points to the Eagles. Safety Ben Ericksen was named Missouri Valley Football Conference (MVFC) Defensive Player of the Week after recording two interceptions, four tackles and a pass breakup that resulted in another interception. Running back Darrelynn Dunn led the team with 129 rushing yards on 32 carries while also scoring two touchdowns. Jonathon Miller was named MVFC Newcomer of the Week after carrying the ball nine times for 81 yards (9.0 yards/carry) and a score. Quarterback Matt Brown was 14-of-22 for 155 yards and a touchdown.

GAME NOTES: After starting the season 2-0 for the first time since 1989, Tennessee Tech will play its first game away from Tucker Stadium on Saturday when they visit the fourth-ranked team in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), the Oregon Ducks. It is the first-ever meeting between the two schools. The game is the first non-Thursday game of the season for Tennessee Tech.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: After a home win over FCS foe Hampton to start the 2012 season, Tennessee Tech followed it with a 42-14 win over Division II North Greenville last Thursday night. It marks just the fourth time in the past 32 years that the Golden Eagles have started the season 2-0. Senior running back Adam Urbano was potent once again, carrying the ball 14 times for 122 yards (8.7 yards/game) and two touchdowns. It marked his second 100-yard game of the season and Urbano now ranks second nationally in rushing (140.0 yards/game) and 11th in all-purpose yards (151.5 yards/game). Senior quarterback Tre Lamb was solid again, completing 18-of-26 passes for 274 yards and three touchdowns. Lamb now has 4,045 career passing yards, making him only one of five players in TTU history with 4,000 or more passing yards. After two starts Lamb ranks second nationally in passing efficiency (187.36) and eighth in total offense (317.0 yards/game). One of Lamb's favorite targets as been his former high school teammate Da'Rick Rogers, who joined the team after transferring from Tennessee prior to the season. Against North Greenville Rogers caught five passes for 88 yards and a touchdown. Despite limited practice time with the team Rogers has caught eight passes for 163 yards (20.4 yards/catch) in two weeks. Will Johnson led the Tech defense with a career-best 13 tackles while Austin Tallant added 11 stops and William Dillard and Cory Webber each recorded their first career interceptions. Junior punter Chad Zinchini averaged 44.2 yards/punt

SCOUTING OREGON: Oregon opened the 2012 season with a 57-34 victory over Arkansas State (a game that saw the Ducks score 50 points in the first half) and followed that with 42-25 victory over Fresno State this past Saturday. In that game senior running back Kenjon Barner ran for 201 yards and three touchdowns in leading No. 4 Oregon to the victory. De'Anthony Thomas added 102 yards and two touchdowns as the Ducks tallied 366 total yards on the ground. Thomas also caught a team-high four passes for 26 yards. Through two games Thomas is averaging 16.6 yards/rush and tops the team with 81 receiving yards (10.1 yards/catch). Redshirt freshman quarterback Marcus Mariota was 19-of-27 for 166 yards and a score. Oregon has gotten off to quick starts this season, outscoring opponents 43-3 in the first quarter and 85-16 total in the first half.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky will travel to Conway, S.C. for its first-ever matchup with Coastal Carolina on Saturday night. The Colonels are 3-6 in FCS non-conference games under head coach Dean Hood. The team has not won a non-conference road FCS game since 2002, a streak of eight-straight losses.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: OVC preseason favorite Eastern Kentucky recorded its first win of the season on Saturday, topping Morehead State 24-17 in front of 11,600 fans at Roy Kidd Stadium. The win came a week after losing to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Purdue to start the 2012 season. The Colonels moved up one spot in the Sports Network poll to 20th and remained 25th in the FCS Coaches Top 25. Overall it was the 50th win over Morehead State in program history. The game kicked off the 44th season at Roy Kidd Stadium for the Colonels, who are now 10-3 in home openers since the 2000 season. After missing the first game of the year with an injury, senior quarterback T.J. Pryor returned to the gridiron and completed 13-of-22 passes for 148 yards and a touchdown. Cameron Bailey hauled in five of those passes, netting a team-high 49 receiving yards. On the ground senior All-American Matt Denham carried the ball 34 times for 166 yards and at touchdown. The output was 3.5 times for yards that Denham racked up in the season opener (47 yards at Purdue). In the process Denham passed the 2,000 career yard mark; for the game Denham did not have a negative rush on the night. Overall the offense won the time of possession battle, holding the ball for 41:46, the highest mark in five years under head coach Dean Hood. Defensively sophomore defensive back Brandon Stanley produced the games only turnover, intercepting a pass in the ECU end zone in the third quarter. He also ended a MSU drive with a sack in the third quarter. For the game Stanley totaled five solo tackles.

SCOUTING COASTAL CAROLINA: Coastal Carolina is off to a perfect start to the season after topping North Carolina A&T 29-13 in the season opener and winning a thrilling 47-45 triple overtime contest at Furman last week. The Chanticleers went ahead 22-12 with 4:12 to play in the game before Furman rebounded with two touchdowns in a 1:19 span to take a 25-22 lead (after one of the two point after attempts was blocked). But Coastal had one last drive left in them, and Alex Catron connected on a 45-yard field goal as time expired to force overtime. The teams each scored touchdowns in the first two overtimes and Coastal Carolina again scored to begin the third overtime as DeMario Bennett hauled in a 26-yard pass from Armasi Hillary. Bennett then added the two-point conversion to put his team up eight points. After Furman scored its third overtime touchdown, the Paladins two-point attempt pass sailed long, giving Coastal the 47-45 victory. Hillary finished the game 20-of-27 for 292 yards and two touchdowns while Catron connected on 3-of-4 field goals, making attempts from 35, 38 and 45 yards.

GAME NOTES: Regional rivals Southeast Missouri State and Southern Illinois meet for the 78th time on Saturday night in Carbondale. Southeast Missouri leads the all-time series although SIU has won five of the last six meetings including 38-10 a season ago in Cape Girardeau. In that contest Redhawks quarterback Matt Scheible passed for 144 yards and a touchdown and had a game-high 91 rushing yards. The Salukis were paced by quarterback Paul McIntosh who passed for 246 yards and a score and rushed for 65 additional yards. These two teams opened the brand new Saluki Stadium two years ago when Southeast Missouri upset then 5th-ranked Southern Illinois by a 24-21 margin. In that game Southeast running back Henry Harris had 142 yards and two touchdowns.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: After a season-opening loss at FBS foe Central Michigan, Southeast Missouri opened the home portion of its schedule last Saturday with a 30-18 win over Division II Mars Hill College. With the victory the Redhawks improved to 6-1 in home openers under current head coach Tony Samuel. The Southeast Missouri defense had six takeaways on the night including five interceptions; it marked the first time the team had five interceptions in a game since 1997 (Eastern Illinois). The Redhawks currently rank first nationally in passes intercepted (6) and least interceptions thrown (0); the team is also fourth among FCS schools in turnover margin (+2.5/game). Senior Tylor Brock accounted for two of the interceptions (he also forced a fumble) and is tied for second nationally in interceptions/game (1.0). Senior kicker Drew Geldbach converted on 3-of-4 field goal attempts, making attempts from 22, 22 and 32 yards. Geldbach currently ranks first nationally in field goals made/game (2.50). The Redhawks had 402 total yards of offense in the game, including 288 yards on the ground. Senior Levi Terrell led the way with 128 yards on 22 carries while senior Renard Celestin touched the ball nine times and netted 93 yards (10.3 yards/carry) and a pair of touchdowns. Redshirt freshman quarterback Scott Lathrop completed 12-of-21 passes for 114 yards and a score and rushed for a net of 37 yards, although he did have a 52-yard rush during the game. During the game sophomore return specialist Spencer Davis surpassed 1,500 all-purpose yards.

SCOUTING SOUTHERN ILLINOIS: Southern Illinois will be challenging its second OVC opponent of this young season, as the Salukis opened the year with a 49-28 loss to Eastern Illinois. A week ago SIU lost 30-14 at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Miami (Ohio). In that game Kory Faulkner completed 19-of-34 passes for 195 yards while Mika'il McCall carried the ball 16 times for a career-best 74 yards and two touchdowns. Overall the Salukis rushed for 154 yards. The SIU offense outgained the RedHawks 349-336 for the game; it marked the second-straight season the team had outgained an FBS foe (Ole Miss). Carlton Lewis had a career-high 11 tackles while Terrell Wilson had a career-high nine stops. The Saluki defense has now recorded a sack in 17 consecutive games and 30 of its last 31 games overall.

GAME NOTES: Murray State and Missouri State will each be searching for its first victory of the season when the two teams play a non-conference game on Saturday night in Springfield. Murray State has suffered losses to a pair of nationally-ranked teams in FBS foe Florida State and FCS opponent Central Arkansas. Missouri State is in the same boat, although both of their nationally-ranked opponents have been from the FBS level, playing No. 22 Kansas State and No. 23 Louisville to begin the year. This matchup marks the seventh in the all-time series. The last time the two teams played it was a memorable offensive shootout as the teams combined for 131 points and 1,423 yards of total offense. Murray State made history by becoming the first FCS school to have a 500-yard passer (Casey Brockman, 570), a 200-yard receiver (Marcus Harris, 213) and a 200-yard rusher (Mike Harris, 212). Brockman threw seven touchdown passes in that game, tying the OVC all-time record.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State netted 537 yards of total offense on Saturday against No. 20 Central Arkansas, but three red zone turnovers proved too much to overcome in a 42-20 loss in front of nearly 10,000 people at Roy Stewart Stadium. Senior quarterback Casey Brockman finished the game 41-of-63 for 445 yards and a touchdown but did throw three interceptions and was sacked five times. Ja-Vonta Trotter had a career-high 11 receptions for 92 yards while Walter Powell grabbed seven passes for 88 yards. Junior linebacker Qua Huzzie was named National Linebacker of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) after netting nine tackles, 4.0 tackles-for-loss and intercepting his first career pass. Murray State currently ranks 10th nationally in passing offense (293.5 yards/game).

SCOUTING MISSOURI STATE: After falling to Kansas State 51-9 in its first game of the season, the Bears lost 35-7 at No. 23 Louisville on Saturday. The Bears fell victim to UofL quarterback Teddy Bridgewater who completed 30-of-39 passes for 344 yards and two touchdowns. Missouri State was led by Ashton Glaser who completed 14-of-23 passes for 125 yards and a touchdown while Ryan Heaston led the rushing attack with 38 yards on nine carries. Sophomore Cal Schaffitzel registered 17 tackles (including 16 solo stops) while Ryan Callender added 10 stops for the Bears defense.
