THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

OVC teams started the 2012 season going a perfect 3-0 against fellow Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams as Eastern Illinois beat Southern Illinois, Tennessee Tech topped Hampton and Tennessee State bested Florida A&M...In action against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams, UT Martin topped Memphis 20-17 as Cody Sandlin connected on a 43-yard field goal with four seconds remaining in the Liberty Bowl...The win was the 19th all-time by an OVC team over a FBS opponent and first since the 2010 season (when Jacksonville State beat Ole Miss)...UT Martin was previously 0-13 (0-12 while a member of the OVC) against FBS opponents dating back to the Division I split in the 1970s; it was the first loss for Memphis against a FCS foe in 23 years...Overall UT Martin was one of four FCS schools (joining Eastern Washington, McNeese State and Youngstown State) to beat a FBS opponent to open the season...Other OVC teams were 0-5 against FBS opponents during Week 1 of the season...EIU quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo was named National All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News and the National Performer of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) after throwing for 369 yards and five touchdowns in the team's win over SIU...UT Martin (Northern Illinois), Eastern Illinois (Western Michigan) and Austin Peay (Virginia Tech) will face FBS opponents during Week 2 of the 2012 season...This week's games feature five contests that can be seen on the OVC Digital Network and two additional games that will be available on ESPN3.

**OFFENSIVE**

Jimmy Garoppolo, QB • Jr., 6-3, 206 • Arlington Heights, Ill. • Eastern Illinois
Garoppolo became just the seventh Eastern Illinois quarterback to pass for five or more touchdowns in a game as the Panthers opened the season with a 49-28 win over rival Southern Illinois. The junior completed 32-of-49 passes for a career-high 369 yards and five touchdowns. Garoppolo threw touchdowns passes to four different receivers and the touchdowns went for 2, 14, 50, 11 and 31 yards. The five touchdowns moved him into fifth in EIU history (39) while the 369 passing yards were the 15th-best single-game effort in school history.

DEFENSIVE

Brooklyn Fox, DB • R-Sr., 6-4, 215 • Tulsa, Okla. • Eastern Kentucky

Fox intercepted two passes and recovered a fumble in Eastern Kentucky's season-opening loss at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Purdue. The senior's first interception came on the Boilermakers first drive of the game, picking off a pass at EIU's own 34-yard line. Fox also picked off a pass at the EIU 30-yard line in the second quarter, returning it 46 yards to the Purdue 24-yard line. The fumble recovery came early in the fourth quarter, setting the Colonels up at the Purdue 20-yard line. Fox was the first EIU player to tally three turnovers in a game since 2009 (Patrick McClellan).

SPECIALIST

Cody Sandlin, K • Sr., 6-2, 180 • Goodlettsville, Tenn. • UT Martin

After missing his first two field goal attempts of the night, Sandlin was money when it mattered, converting two field goals in the final five minutes of the game to give UT Martin a 20-17 victory at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Memphis. The win was the first for the Skyhawks over a FBS opponent and just the 19th all-time win for an OVC team against the higher subdivision. With 4:52 to play Sandlin connected on a 26-yard attempt to give UTM a 17-10 advantage. His most important kick of the game came with four seconds remaining, as the senior connected from 43-yards out to break a 17-17 tie and give the Skyhawks the victory.

CO-NEWCOMER

Troyaine Pope, RB • Fr., 5-9, 198 • Anniston, Ala. • Jacksonville State

In his collegiate debut Pope carried the ball 14 times for 65 yards (4.6 yards/carry) and caught a 19-yard touchdown pass in Jacksonville State's loss at No. 10 Arkansas. The touchdown catch came with 40 seconds to play in the first quarter and tied the game at seven against the high-powered Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team. Pope had a long run of 23 yards in the contest and was the team's leading rusher.

CO-NEWCOMER

Da'Rick Rogers, WR • Jr., 6-3, 205 • Calhoun, Ga. • Tennessee Tech

In his Tennessee Tech debut Rogers, the transfer from Tennessee who joined the team just days before the game, caught three passes for 75 yards, including a nine-yard touchdown with four seconds to play in the first half. That touchdown was setup by his 52-yard catch earlier in the same drive. The score put Tennessee Tech up 24-7 in a game it would go on to win 41-31.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

OVC Teams Versus FBS Foes: OVC schools will play 11 games against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) this season, with six of those matchups coming in Week 1 of the season. In week one of the season UT Martin topped Memphis 20-17 in the Liberty Bowl as Cody Sandlin hit a 43-yard field goal with four seconds remaining. It marked the first-ever win over an FBS team for UT Martin and the first loss for Memphis against an FCS foe in 23 years. It was the first OVC win over an FBS team since the 2010 season when Jacksonville State topped Ole Miss in double overtime. Overall OVC teams are 19-152-1 all-time against FBS foes. Below is a listing of the current OVC schools and wins over FBS schools while a member of the league. Five of the wins over FBS teams for OVC teams have been accomplished by teams no longer in the OVC (Akron, Middle Tennessee, Morehead State and Youngstown State - twice) and are not listed below.

FCS over FBS: Including UT Martin's win against Memphis in Week 1 of the 2012 season, four Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams topped Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) teams. Other FCS teams to win included Eastern Washington (Idaho), McNeese State (Middle Tennessee) and Youngstown State (Pitt).

Garoppolo Named National All-Star By College Sporting News (Sept. 3): Eastern Illinois junior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named a National All-Star by College Sporting News after his performance in Week 1 of the season against Southern Illinois. Garoppolo completed 32-of-49 passes for a career-high 369 yards and five touchdowns in the 49-28 victory.

OVC Teams in the Top 25: In the latest set of Top 25 polls, Eastern Kentucky is ranked 21st in the Sports Network Poll and 25th in the FCS Coaches Poll. Jacksonville State is the only other OVC team ranked, coming in at 24th in the Sports Network poll. Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin are all receiving votes in the Sports Network poll while Jacksonville State, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin are each receiving votes in the FCS Coaches Poll.

NCAA Stats Leaders: In the first set of NCAA statistical leaders Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** ranks first nationally in points responsible for (30.00/game), second in passing yards/game (369.0), third in total offense (366.0 yards/game), fourth in completions/game (32.0). EIU receiver **Erik Lora** ranks first nationally in receiving yards/game (151.0), second in receptions/game (13.0), ninth in points responsible for (18.0/game) and 15th in scoring (12.0/game). Tennessee Tech quarterback **Tre Lamb** is third nationally in points responsible for/game (24.0) and fifth in passing efficiency (187.65) and passing yards/game (339.0). TTU running back **Adam Urbano** is ninth in rushing (158.0 yards/game).

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Eastern Kentucky defensive back Brooklyn Fox is second in interceptions (2.0/game) while EIU defensive back DJ Bland is fourth in passes defended (3.0/game). In the team rankings Eastern Illinois ranks first nationally in fumbles recovered (4), turnovers gained (6), interceptions thrown (0) and fourth down conversion defense (0%), third in passing offense (433.0 yards/game) and fourth in kickoff returns (35.67 yards/return). Southeast Missouri ranks first nationally in turnovers lost (0), fumbles lost (0) and red zone offense (100%) and seventh in net punting (44.0 yards/punt). UT Martin ranks first nationally in sacks allowed (0) and fourth in punt return defense (-3.0 yards/game). Tennessee State ranks first nationally in fourth down conversion percentage (100%).

Five OVC Players Earns Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 1; Garoppolo Named National Performer of the Week:

Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named the National Performer of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) after throwing for 369 yards and five touchdowns in EIU's win over Southern Illinois. Garoppolo was also named one of the organization's National Quarterbacks of the Week, sharing the honor with Tennessee Tech's **Tre Lamb**, who threw for 339 yards and four touchdowns in a win over Hampton. Eastern Illinois wide receiver **Erik Lora** was named National Wide Receiver of the Week after catching 13 passes for 151 yards and two touchdowns. Among the other wideouts sharing the award is Jacksonville State's **Alan Bonner** who had eight catches for 107 yards and a touchdown against No. 10 Arkansas. Eastern Kentucky defensive back **Brooklyn Fox** was named National Defensive Back of the Week after picking off two passes and recovering a fumble in the Colonels game at Purdue. In addition to this group seven other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

Murray State's Brockman, EKU's Denham on Walter Payton Award Watch

List: Murray State senior quarterback **Casey Brockman** and Eastern Kentucky senior running back **Matt Denham** are two of the 20 players on the initial 2012 Walter Payton Award Watch List as determined by the Sports Network. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. The Watch List can undergo revision during the season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information/media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season on Nov. 19. The top three vote-getters will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation. The only former OVC player to win the award is former Eastern Illinois quarterback Tony Romo who took home the honor in 2002.

Southeast Missouri's Peiffer on Buck Buchanan Watch List: Southeast Missouri State senior linebacker **Blake Peiffer** is one of 20 players on the initial Buck Buchanan Award Watch List as determined by the Sports Network. The Buck Buchanan Award was established in 1995 and is given to the top defensive player at the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. The Watch List can undergo revision during the season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information/media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season on Nov. 19. The winner will be announced at the annual Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation. An OVC player has never won the Buck Buchanan Award.

NCAA Division I Playoff Information: This season marks the third of the expanded 20-team playoff field. Two years ago the field was expanded from 16 to 20 teams, marking the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The eight lowest-rated teams will play in first round games while the 12-highest rated teams will receive a bye into the second round. For the third-straight year the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at FC Dallas Stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 5. The playoff field will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 18. It was announced in August 2012 that the field would once again expand, this time to 24 teams beginning in the 2013 season. With the expansion will come an automatic bid for the Pioneer League, giving the playoffs 11 automatic bids and 13 at-large selections.

Sgt. York Trophy Enters Sixth Season in 2012: The Sgt. York Trophy is a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four football-playing OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the OVC announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). In 2007 Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season (that was the tiebreaker used only for the first year of the trophy series). Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. In 2009 Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games and a year ago UT Martin became the third-straight OVC team to go 3-0 and win the trophy in claiming its first title. Last year Tennessee Tech and Tennessee State each finished 2-1 in Sgt. York play this season to share the trophy; Tennessee State, however, took home the actual trophy by a tiebreaker, since they had gone longer without possessing the trophy (TSU last won in 2008 while TTU won in 2009). The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring.

A Look at the Coaches: Eight of the nine head coaches from last season return to their schools in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. The only newcomer is Eastern Illinois head coach Dino Babers, who took over for Bob Spoo who retired following a 25-year career at the school. Babers was most recently the special

teams coordinator and wide receivers coach at Baylor. Jacksonville State's **Jack Crowe** is the longest tenured coach in the league (in his 13th season at JSU). Two OVC coaches, Austin Peay's **Rick Christophel** and Tennessee State's **Rod Reed**, are currently coaching at their alma maters.

Preseason Forecasts: For the 12th time in the last 25 years (and first time since 2009), Eastern Kentucky was picked as the preseason favorite in the Ohio Valley Conference football race. The Colonels picked up 12 of the 18 possible first-place votes (124 points) while second-place Jacksonville State received the other six first-place votes (117). The poll was rounded out by Murray State (85 points), Tennessee Tech (83), Tennessee State (69), UT Martin (67), Southeast Missouri (44), Eastern Illinois (42) and Austin Peay (17). Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 34 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 13 times (38.2%). After eight years of not picking the champion right (2003-2010), last season the preseason poll and actual champion (be it by a three-way tie) were the same.

Murray State's Brockman, Southeast Missouri's Peiffer Headline Preseason All-OVC Team:

Murray State senior quarterback **Casey Brockman** was named 2012 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Southeast Missouri State senior linebacker **Blake Peiffer** was tabbed OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Kentucky led the way with 10 selections on the preseason team while Murray State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech had three picks apiece. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (13 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included nine players who were second-team selections in 2011. Of the 26 total selections, 18 were seniors, six were juniors and two were sophomores.

NFL Connections: As of September 2, there are 12 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters (9 active players, 2 practice squad players and 1 on IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now in his first season with the Philadelphia Eagles. Six of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL with Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri leading the way with two active players apiece.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to

be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 20-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the seventh year the OVC has streamed live events, but first time the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format and will feature improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2012 season marks the sixth of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and go to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play in 2007. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games while Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy. UT Martin made it three straight years with the winning team going 3-0, completing the perfect season in 2010 to win its first title.

Last season Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech finished in a tie for the Trophy (2-1) and were declared co-champions. Tennessee State, however, will take home the actual trophy since they had gone the most seasons without winning it (2008, compared to 2009 for TTU).

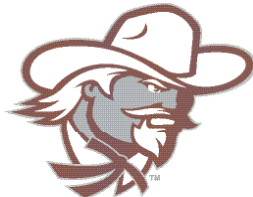

GAME NOTES: Thursday night marks the first-ever meeting between Tennessee Tech and North Greenville. It marks the second-straight week that TTU will be playing on a Thursday night. With a victory Tennessee Tech can open the season 2-0 for the first time since the 1989 season.

SCOUTING NORTH GREENVILLE: North Greenville, located in the state of South Carolina, is a NCAA Division II program that started its football team in the 1992 season. The Crusaders were 11-3 a year ago and lost 28-23 to No. 1 seed Delta State in the NCAA Division II Playoff quarterfinals. Following the season head coach Jamey Chadwell moved on to a head coaching job at Delta State and Carroll McCray took over at North Greenville. McCray served as head coach at Austin Peay from 2003-06 and was most recently at Mercer (2011) and Furman (2007-10). In week one of the season the Crusaders dropped a 24-12 decision at Albany State, a game that was a first round playoff rematch from 2011. Nelson Hughes completed 15-of-27 passes for 104 yards while NGU's rushing attack gained 75 yards on the ground.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech improved to 6-0 in home openers under head coach Watson Brown by topping Hampton (a team that was 7-4 last year) 41-31 last Thursday night. The high octane Tech offense ran 82 total plays and netted 548 yards of total offense, the second most in Brown's tenure with the Golden Eagles. The TTU defense was also stout, holding Hampton to just 192 yards on the night. Senior quarterback Tre Lamb passed for 339 yards and four touchdowns, as he completed 24-of-35 passes with no interceptions. The 339 yards was the second-highest total of Lamb's career. Running back Adam Urbano carried the ball 25 times for a career-high 158 yards (6.3 yards/game) and a touchdown. After sitting out last season Tremaine Hudson returned to the field on Thursday night and tied his career-high with eight receptions for 62 yards. Junior newcomer Da'Rick Rogers, who transferred from Tennessee just days before the Hampton contest, saw limited action but still managed to haul in three passes for 75 yards and a touchdown. For his efforts Rogers was named OVC Co-Newcomer of the Week. Defensively Marty Jones returned from missing all of last season to lead the team with 13 tackles while Howard Griffin added 12 tackles.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay travels to nationally-ranked Football Bowl Sub-division (FBS) opponent Virginia Tech on Saturday. It marks the first-ever meeting between the two schools. It also makes the second-straight week that Austin Peay has played a FBS opponent. The Govs are 2-16 all-time against FBS foes; its last win over a FBS team was in 1987 (a 25-22 win over Kansas State).

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay began the 2012 season against former OVC foe Western Kentucky. It marked the first matchup between the two schools since 2006, and first since WKU moved up to the FBS level. The Hilltoppers got off to a quick start, leading 35-0 at halftime before Wesley Kitts put the Governors on the board with a 68-yard run on the first play of the third quarter. That run tied a career-long for Kitts, matching a 68-yard run he had against Cumberland in 2010. Kitts finished the game with 104 yards, his second career 100-plus yard rushing game. Stephen Stansell added a 44-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to account for the final score. It marked the 74th-straight game in which the Governors had avoided being shutout. While APSU finished with 143 yards on the ground, the team was limited to just 11 passing yards. That marked the lowest passing output for the team since recording just five yards against Eastern Kentucky on Nov. 14, 1992. Senior safety Antwaun Majors led Austin Peay with 10 tackles on the night and also netted the team's only sack.

SCOUTING VIRGINIA TECH: Virginia Tech opens the season on Monday night (Sept. 3) when it hosts ACC rival Georgia Tech. The Hokies will then have the short week before hosting Austin Peay just five days later. VT is coached by Frank Beamer, who started his college head coach career at Murray State. At MSU Beamer compiled a 42-23-2 record in six seasons and captured a share of the 1986 OVC Championship. Overall Beamer has notched 251 career victories, eighth most all-time among FBS coaches and the most among active coaches. He has led the Hokies to three Big East (1995, 1996, 1999) and four ACC (2004, 2007, 2008 and 2010) conference championships and been named a conference Coach of the Year five times. Virginia Tech is the only FBS team to win 10 or more games in each of the past eight seasons; the team has also appeared in 19-straight bowl games. VT returns three offensive and nine defensive starters from last season.

GAME NOTES: Rivals Eastern Kentucky and Morehead State will meet for the 60th time on Saturday and first time since the 2008 season. Although Morehead State is a member of the OVC in all other sports, the Eagles play in the non-scholarship Pioneer League in football. Overall ECU has won six in-a-row in the series and 24 of the last 25 overall. The only Morehead State victory in that stretch was a 27-17 victory in 1990. In the last meeting the Colonels came out on top 16-8 thanks to three Taylor Long field goals and a C.J. Walker touchdown run.

SCOUTING MOREHEAD STATE: Morehead State opened the 2012 season with a convincing 55-0 victory over Southern Virginia last Thursday night in front of 6,579 fans at Jayne Stadium. Zach Lewis was named Pioneer League Offensive Player of the Week after going 16-of-22 for 249 yards and four touchdowns; Lewis now has 7,545 passing yards and 51 touchdowns in his college career. Sophomore running back Rees Macshara had 53 yards and 11 carries. Senior kicker Rainer Duzan connected on field goal attempts of 24 and 50 yards and made seven extra point attempts; the 50-yarder was a career-best. Jordan Hendrix led the Eagles with 11 tackles and also recovered a fumble.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky was over-matched by Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Purdue in the season opener, losing 48-6 to the Big Ten foe. The Colonels fell behind 20-0 early in the second quarter and were limited to only 190 yards of total offense on the afternoon. Purdue, on the other hand, amassed 547 yards of total offense. ECU was without senior quarterback T.J. Pryor who was out with an injury; in his place Jared McClain made his second career start and passed for 85 yards and rushed for 33 additional yards. Senior All-American Matt Denham was contained to 47 yards on the ground but did score the Colonels lone points on the game with a 30-yard touchdown scamper in the second quarter. Senior safety Brooklyn Fox was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after tallying two interceptions and recovering a fumble in the contest. He was the first ECU defender to tally three turnovers in a game since 2009. Fox now has five career interceptions. Overall the Colonels defense netted five forced turnovers, but did not score any points off those Purdue miscues. The game marked the seventh-straight season that Eastern Kentucky had opened the year on the road. It was also the 13th consecutive season the team has played a FBS opponent; the Colonels have not topped a FBS foe since 1985. The Colonels enter this week ranked No. 21 in the Sports Network Top 25 and No. 25 in the FCS Coaches poll.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Illinois will play its lone Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent of the 2012 season on Saturday when it travels to Kalamazoo. The matchup is the second all-time between EIU and Western Michigan; the two teams met in the 1996 season with the Panthers pulling off the 28-20 victory. In that game Mike Simpson completed 24-of-38 passes for 321 yards and four touchdowns. The win is one of four all-time for Eastern Illinois against FBS opponents (three of which have come while being a member of the OVC). Overall EIU is 4-26 against FBS opponents, last winning in 2004 (Eastern Michigan). The Panthers are 3-4 all-time against teams from the Mid-American Conference.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois started the 2012 season with a victory over rival Southern Illinois, the same program the Panthers ended the 2011 season against with a loss. The game marked the debut for Dino Babers as the Panthers head coach; Babers became just the sixth coach in EIU history to win his first game as head coach. Junior quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo earned National Player of the Week honors from each College Sporting News and College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) after completing 32-of-49 passes for 369 yards and five touchdowns. He is the first EIU player to throw for five touchdowns in a game since Tony Romo did so in Oct. 2002. In addition to those five touchdowns wide receiver Erik Lora and tight end Sam Hendricks also tossed touchdown passes given the Panthers seven on the night; the seven passing touchdowns set a new Eastern Illinois single-game record. Returning to the field after missing the entire 2011 season due to an injury Lora, the junior wideout, hauled in 13 passes for 151 yards and two touchdowns in addition to throwing a 24-yard touchdown pass. The 13 receptions were the most in FCS football in week one of the season and the fourth-best single-game total in Eastern Illinois history. The 49 points were the most scored in a game by the Panthers since 2009 and were the most in a season opener since scoring 62 against Lock Haven in 1991. The Panthers defense forced six turnovers in the SIU contest, the first time since Oct. 2005 that the team had forced six or more turnovers in a game. The Panthers continue to receive votes in the Sports Network Top 25.

SCOUTING WESTERN MICHIGAN: For the third-straight season Western Michigan was picked to finish third in the Mid-American Conference (MAC) West Division. This year the team picked up four of the 17 first-place votes in that division. WMU returns four All-MAC selections from 2011, including Davey O'Brien, Walter Camp Player of the Year and Manning Award candidate Alex Carder. The Broncos got the season started last week by falling 24-7 at Illinois. In that game Carder completed 26-of-43 passes for 239 yards and a touchdown but was picked off three times and sacked twice. The WMU defense held Illinois to 248 total yards, the least amount the team had allowed since Sept. 2010. Johnnie Simon led the Broncos with 18 tackles (10 solo) while Terry Easmon added 11 stops.

GAME NOTES: Jacksonville State kicks off the home portion of its 2012 season by hosting regional rival Chattanooga on Saturday. The teams are meeting for the 37th time overall and third-straight season. After winning four in a row (and 5 of 6) Jacksonville State lost 38-17 to Chattanooga a year ago on the road. The game was tied at 17 late in the second quarter before the Mocs scored the final 21 points of the game. Coty Blanchard completed 13-of-23 passes for 164 yards while Washaun Ealey ran for a team-high 49 yards and a score. UTC was led by quarterback B.J. Coleman, who is now with the Green Bay Packers practice squad, who passed for 296 yards and two scores while Chris Awuah ran for 77 yards and two touchdowns. Both teams started last week against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS).

SCOUTING CHATTANOOGA: Chattanooga opened the year at FBS opponent South Florida on Saturday, falling 34-13 to the Big East foe. The Mocs did not commit a turnover while the defense forced two takeaways from the Bulls. Freshman quarterback Jacob Huesman, the son of the Mocs head coach Russ Huesman, was 9-of-13 for 87 yards in his debut. Junior linebacker Wes Dothard, a Buck Buchanan Award candidate, had a team-high eight tackles including tackle-for-loss. Junior D.J. Key had a 43-yard interception return that helped set up Chattanooga's first half touchdown.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Facing one of the top teams in the FBS, Jacksonville State led Arkansas 14-7 early in the second quarter before eventually falling 49-24 to the 10th ranked team in the nation. In his collegiate debut freshman running back Troymaine Pope earned OVC Co-Specialist of the Week honors after carrying the ball 14 times for a team-high 65 yards and catching a 19-yard touchdown pass that tied the game at seven in the first quarter. Wide receiver Alan Bonner caught eight passes for 107 yards and a touchdown and carried the ball twice for 13 yards and another score. Making his return after suffering a season-ending injury in the first game of last season, Marques Ivory completed 14-of-28 passes for 160 yards and two scores; the two touchdown passes gave him 27 for his career, tying him for eighth in JSU history. Junior linebacker Rashad Smith led Jacksonville State with eight tackles, recovered a fumble that he returned 49 yards, forced another fumble and had a pass breakup. The fumble return was the first of his career and longest for a JSU player since the 2001 season. Junior kicker Griffin Thomas connected on a 49-yard field goal in the third quarter; the field goal was the longest of his career and fifth-longest in school history. Overall JSU allowed Arkansas to net 564 yards of total offense, the most the team has allowed in a game since 2003 (641 vs. Kansas). The game was played in front of 71,420 fans, the second-largest crowd to ever see the Gamecocks play (behind only 71,420 fans at Florida State in 2009). Jacksonville State slipped two spots to No. 24 in the Sports Network Top 25; the Gamecocks are still receiving votes in the FCS Coaches poll.

GAME NOTES: Southeast Missouri State will open up its home slate against Mars Hill College on Saturday. The Redhawks welcome the Division II foe to Houck Stadium in the first-ever meeting between the two teams. The Redhawks are 5-1 in season openers under current head coach Tony Samuel.

SCOUTING MARS HILL: Mars Hill is a Division II member of the South Atlantic Conference and is located in Mars Hill, S.C. The Lions are coming off an 8-3 season a year ago where the team made its first-ever NCAA playoff appearance; the squad returns 46 letterwinners and 15 starters this season. Mars Hill opened the season last Thursday against another Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) foe, Western Carolina. The Lions fell behind 17-0 at halftime and were down 24-0 before Jon Richt and Dimitri Holmes hooked up on a 17-yard pass play in the third quarter. Richt finished the game with 120 passing yards on the night while Holmes hauled in five passes for 71 yards and the score. On the ground Shaikel Davis carried the ball 18 times for 109 yards (6.1 yards/carry). Overall Mars Hill tallied 207 rushing yards but allowed Western Carolina to amass 342 rushing yards. Jasper Mason finished the game with 16 tackles, including 2.5 for loss.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri more than held its own against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent Central Michigan in its season opener last Thursday. The Redhawks led 24-10 in the second quarter after D.J. Foster caught a 15-yard touchdown pass from redshirt freshman Scott Lathrop. But CMU would outscore Southeast 28-3 the rest of the way in coming from behind to win 38-27. In his collegiate debut Lathrop completed 10-of-17 passes for 120 yards and a touchdown and ran for 31 yards and another score on 17 total carries. Senior Levi Terrell led the Redhawks rushing attack (which netted 203 total yards) with 88 total yards while sophomore Spencer Davis added 48 yards and a touchdown. Foster was the top receiver for Southeast, netting six passes for 97 yards and a score. Overall the Redhawks did not commit a turnover and forced three (2 fumbles, 1 interception) from CMU. George Neuhaus had two of the team's takeaways when he recovered a fumble and added an interception; Neuhaus also had four tackles in his first career start. Senior All-American Blake Peiffer had eight tackles against CMU, giving him 250 career tackles, which is 17th all-time in Redhawks history. Junior punter Joe Vucic averaged 47.6 yards/punt including a long of 68 (the second-longest of his career; after one week of the season he currently ranks third nationally in punting average. Overall Southeast Missouri had eight different players make their first career starts in the Central Michigan game. In the first set of NCAA statistical rankings, Southeast leads the FCS in red zone offense (100%), fewest turnovers (0) and fumbles lost (0) and is third in turnover margin (+3.0/game).

GAME NOTES: After a trip to nationally-ranked Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Florida State last weekend, Murray State opens its home season on Saturday with fellow Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) opponent Central Arkansas. The teams are meeting for the fourth time overall. The series dates back to meetings in 1939 and 1940 (which ended in a tie) but after those two games the squads did not play again until a 2010 contest at UCA. That year was the first under head coach Chris Hatcher for the Racers; MSU would come up just short as the Bears scored with 4:21 to play in the game to pull out the 21-20 victory. Nathan Dick paced Central Arkansas by passing for 210 yards and a touchdown while Jackie Hinton rushed for two scores. Jeff Ehrhardt had 247 passing yards and two scores for Murray State.

SCOUTING CENTRAL ARKANSAS: Central Arkansas made its first NCAA Division I Playoff appearance last season after joining the FCS in 2006. The team ended the year by winning eight-straight games (including a first round playoff victory over Tennessee Tech) before losing to Montana in the second round. The Bears finished 2011 ranked 14th and 15th in the two national polls and began this season ranked No. 21 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 24 in the Sports Network Top 25. Central Arkansas began the season at FBS foe Ole Miss, jumping ahead 20-14 at halftime before eventually falling 49-27 as Ole Miss scored on five-straight possessions in the second half to end the upset bid. Jackie Hinton led the UCA rushing attack, netting 52 yards on 13 carries. Quarterback Wynrick Smothers completed 25-of-32 passes for 247 yards and two touchdowns. Senior Rojae Jackson led the defense with 10 tackles, 2.5 tackles-for-loss and 1.5 sacks. UCA is ranked 20th in this week's FCS Coaches poll and 25th in the Sports Network Top 25.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Playing against one of the top teams in the country, Murray State was out-distanced 69-3 by No. 7 ranked Florida State on Saturday. FSU scored 14 first quarter points and led 28-3 at halftime before scoring 41 unanswered points in the second half. MSU's only score came in the second quarter when Jordan Benton converted a 28-yard field goal. All-American quarterback Casey Brockman was limited by the Seminoles vaunted defense, completing just 19-of-36 passing for 117 yards. Junior Walter Powell caught nine of Brockman's passes for 62 yards. Freshman Pokey Harris came off the bench to rush for 27 yards on nine carries. Making his collegiate debut, junior punter Steven Mix averaged 40.8 yards on nine punts, including punts of 50 and 52 yards. Junior newcomer Darian Yahyavi had eight tackles and recovered a fumble for the Racers.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee State and Jackson State meet in the 23rd annual Southern Heritage Classic at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis on Saturday night. This marks the 19th year in a row (and 21st overall) that the teams have squared off in this Classic which began in 1990 (the two other games were between TSU and Mississippi Valley State and Grambling). Tennessee State had won seven straight in the series until Jackson State pulled out a 33-26 victory in 2010 and added a 35-29 win a season ago (2011). In last year's meeting Jackson State scored early in the third quarter to grab a 28-24 lead that it would not relinquish. TSU quarterback Jeremy Perry passed for 226 yards and two scores while Trabis Ward rushed for 35 yards and a touchdown. All-American linebacker Rico Council led the TSU defense with 11 tackles, a sack and a forced fumble. Casey Therriault completed 27 passes for 337 yards and three scores for JSU. Six of the last seven meetings have been determined by a combined 31 points (including two of those that went into overtime). Tennessee State is 11-11 all-time in the event while Jackson State is 9-11. The all-time series between the two schools is at 23-20-2 in favor of Tennessee State.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State opened the 2012 season with its third-straight win in the John Merritt Classic, besting Florida A&M 17-14 thanks to a goal-line stand. After going ahead 17-0 with 4:11 to play in the third quarter, TSU saw FAMU score a pair of touchdowns and then drive to its own 1-yard line in the final minute of the game. But quarterback sneaks on back-to-back plays were both stopped short of the goal line, giving the Tigers back-to-back wins over FAMU for the first time since the 1986-87 seasons. Sophomore quarterback Michael German completed 22-of-32 passes for 263 yards and a touchdown for TSU while senior running back Trabis Ward carried the ball 28 times for 124 yards and a score. Florida transfer A.C. Leonard had a nice debut with a game-high seven catches for 47 yards. Sophomore linebacker Nick Thrasher, making his first start, was named Defensive MVP of the Classic after registering 11 tackles (9 solo) including 2.0 tackles-for-loss.

SCOUTING JACKSON STATE: Jackson State opened the 2012 season with a 56-9 loss at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent Mississippi State. The Tigers fell behind 35-0 late in the second quarter before getting on the board on a nine-yard touchdown pass from Dedric McDonald to E.J. Drewery. The team would later add a 25-yard field goal from Ryan Deising in the fourth quarter. McDonald finished the day with 136 passing yards and the touchdown. Milton Patterson led JSU with 10 tackles (5 solo).

GAME NOTES: A week after knocking off the first Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent in its program history, UT Martin plays its second-straight FBS foe, this week traveling to DeKalb, Ill. to play Northern Illinois. The matchup is the first between the two teams.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: After previously being 0-13 against teams from the FBS, UT Martin finally notched a victory, topping Memphis 20-17 at the Liberty Bowl on Saturday night. The game marked the first loss for Memphis against a Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) opponent in 23 years. Memphis had a 10-7 lead in the third quarter before DJ McNeil scored from five yards out to put the Skyhawks on top 14-10. Senior kicker Cody Sandlin, who had missed his first two field attempts of the night, added a 26-yard field goal with 4:52 to play to extend the lead to 17-10. But the Tigers marched 71 yards in 11 plays and capped a scoring drive with a 20-yard pass from Jacob Karam to Marcus Rucker to tie the game. The Skyhawks went 3-and-out and punted, but Memphis fumbled the punt return which was recovered by Nate Roterio at the Tiger 27-yard line. Three plays later Sandlin connected from 43-yards out to give UT Martin the victory. The two clutch fourth quarter field goals earned Sandlin OVC Specialist of the Week honors. Skyhawk quarterback Derek Carr completed 19-of-38 passes for 211 yards and a touchdown to Quentin Sims (who had eight catches for 70 yards on the night). Senior Jason McNair added 82 yards on the ground while Tevin Barksdale ran for 50 yards and McNeil had 42 on the ground. The UTM offense did not allow a sack during the game while the UTM defense notched a pair of sacks and 8.0 tackles-for-loss. DJ Roberts, Ben Johnson and Chris Wright each recorded nine tackles to lead the defense. The game included a two hour and 47 minute weather delay; the game began at 6:02 p.m. but did not conclude until 11:47 p.m. It marked the first season-opening road victory for UT Martin since the 1994 season (a win at Southern Illinois).

SCOUTING NORTHERN ILLINOIS: Entering its second season under head coach Dave Doeren, Northern Illinois is coming off an 11-3 season in 2011 that saw the team top Arkansas State 38-20 in the GoDaddy.com Bowl. The team returns 18 starters (including 10 on defense) this season. NIU opened the 2012 campaign by battling Iowa in a game played in front of 52,117 fans at Soldier Field in Chicago (the second year in a row NIU played a home game at the NFL venue). The Huskies built a 17-9 advantage with 9:43 to play in the third quarter before Iowa scored nine fourth quarter points to pull out the 18-17 victory; the last score came on a 23-yard rush with 2:15 to play in the game. Making his first career start quarterback Jordan Lynch had 119 rushing yards on 18 carries and passed for 54 yards. The NIU defense recorded six total sacks on the night and limited Iowa to 268 yards; a season ago the Huskies held only one opponent to under 268 yards of total offense. It marked the end of the team's nine-game losing streak dating back to last season; it had been the longest winning streak in the FBS entering the season.
