THIS WEEK'S adidas® OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



CO-PLAYER

Ian Clark, G • Sr., 6-3, 175 • Memphis, Tenn. • Belmont

Clark earned the OVC Player of the Week honor for the third-straight week after averaging 20.5 points, 3.5 assists and 2.5 rebounds/game and hitting 66.7 percent (16-of-24) from the field and 83.3 percent (6-of-7) from 3-point range in road victories over Morehead State and Eastern Kentucky. Clark had 20 points, four assists and three rebounds in a one-point win over Morehead State, hitting 7-of-10 (70%) from the field and 3-of-4 (75%) from long range in that victory. In that win Clark had five points and two assists in the final 4:17, including an assist to J.J. Mann on what proved to be the game-winner with 1:13 to play (giving the Bruins its first lead since 2-0). Two days later he scored 21 points, had three assists and two rebounds while hitting 64.3 percent (9-of-14) from the field and 3-of-3 from 3-point range. Clark currently ranks first nationally in 3-point percentage (51.1%), ninth in 3-pointers made/game (3.43), 18th in field goal percentage (57.6%) and 24th in scoring (19.2 points/game). In addition he ranks first nationally in effective field goal percentage according to Ken Pomeroy.

CO-PLAYER

Tarvin Gaines, F • Sr., 6-6, 225 • West Memphis, Ark. • Jacksonville State

Gaines was instrumental in Jacksonville State going 2-0 last week, including its first-ever victory over Murray State in 17 tries. The senior averaged 20.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 1.5 blocks and 1.0 steals/game while hitting 53.6 percent (15-of-28) from the field and 90.9 percent (10-of-11) from the free throw line. Gaines started the week by scoring 28 points on 11-of-18 (61.1%) shooting in a victory over Austin Peay; he added four rebounds, a block and steal in the win. Two days later Gaines had 13 points, eight rebounds, two blocks, a steal and an assist in the dramatic 65-64 win over Murray State. Since the team's leading scorer (Darion Rackley) went down with an injury five games ago, Gaines has averaged 18.8 points and 6.4 rebounds/game over that stretch.

CO-NEWCOMER

Sherman Blanford, F • Jr., 6-6, 215 • Philadelphia, Pa. • Eastern Illinois

Blanford shared the OVC Newcomer of the Week honor for the second-straight week after averaging 18.0 points, 11.5 rebounds, 2.5 blocks and 2.0 assists/game and hitting 47.8 percent (11-of-23) from the field and 77.8 percent (14-of-18) from the free throw stripe in a pair of Eastern Illinois victories. In the team's overtime win over Southeast Missouri on Saturday night, Blanford posted career-highs in points (21) and rebounds (16), including nine offensive caroms. He was also 9-of-11 from the free throw line, including two free throws with six seconds left to force overtime. He began the week with 15 points, seven rebounds, three blocks, three assists and a steal in a victory over UT Martin.

CO-NEWCOMER

Corey Walden, G • So., 6-2, 206 • Daytona Beach, Fla. • Eastern Kentucky

Walden shared the OVC Newcomer of the Week honor for the second-straight week after averaging 23.0 points, 3.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists and 1.5 steals/game while hitting 61.9 percent (13-of-21) from the field, 50 percent (3-of-6) from 3-point range and 89.5 percent (17-of-19) from the free throw line in a pair of games. Walden had 22 points on 7-of-11 shooting in a win over Tennessee State; in that game he also added five rebounds, three assists and a steal. Two days later he hit 6-of-10 shots on his way to a game-high 24 points in a loss to first-place Belmont; Walden also added two steals, two rebounds, two assists and a steal in that game. Walden currently ranks 10th nationally in free throw percentage (90.5%).

FRESHMAN

Chris Horton, C • Fr., 6-8, 195 • Decatur, Ga. • Austin Peay

Horton earned his sixth OVC Freshman of the Week honor of the season after averaging 10.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 2.0 blocks/game in a pair of road contests last week. The freshman also hit 52.9 percent (9-of-17) from the field as Austin Peay lost games at Jacksonville State and Tennessee Tech. Horton had 18 points (on 8-of-12 shooting), 10 rebounds and two blocks in 29 minutes of action against JSU to start the week. He closed the week with two points, four rebounds, two blocks and an assist against Tech. Horton currently leads the OVC in blocked shots (3.0/game) and is ninth in rebounding (6.5/game).

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NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: Belmont remains perfect (8-0) atop the OVC standings at the halfway point of the Conference season...The Bruins topped Eastern Kentucky for the second time this season and have a two-game lead over the Colonels in the East Division as well as a two-game lead of Murray State for the No. 1 seed race...Belmont enters the week No. 14 nationally in the RPI (the Bruins are 7-2 against Top 100 RPI teams this season)...Overall four OVC teams (Belmont, Eastern Kentucky, Murray State and Tennessee State) are in the Top 100 of the RPI...Belmont has the highest RPI of any of the 122 teams who will compete in this year's BracketBusters series; the pairings for that will be announced next Monday at 6:30 p.m. ET on ESPNU...Overall there are 13 TV games (5 on ESPN2, 4 on ESPNU and 4 on ESPN3) in the event...UT Martin snapped a 12-game OVC losing streak with a win at SIUE last week...Belmont's Ian Clark currently leads the nation in 3-point percentage (51.1%), is ninth in 3-pointers made/game (3.43), 18th in field goal percentage (57.6%) and 24th in scoring (19.2 points/game)...Murray State's Isaiah Canaan ranks eighth nationally in scoring (21.51 points/game) and has moved into sixth place on the OVC career 3-pointers made list (270), one away from fifth place...Canaan also needs just 204 points to become the 17th 2,000-point scorer (but third in as many years) in OVC history (assuming MSU plays in 3 postseason games, he would need to average 17 points/game to achieve that feat).

RPI: Entering this week the OVC is rated as the 16th-best conference in Division I. Belmont enters the week as No. 14 among all teams in the RPI. Since OVC play began at the beginning of January, Belmont's RPI has improved from No. 20 to 14th. Overall three other OVC teams are currently in the Top 100 of the RPI, with Eastern Kentucky ranking 76th, Murray State ranking 96th and Tennessee State ranking 99th.

Ian Clark's Shooting Among Nation's Best: Belmont senior guard **Ian Clark** is scorching the nets this season as he currently ranks first nationally in 3-point percentage (51.1%) and an impressive 18th in overall field goal percentage (57.6%). When looking at the 17 players who rank above him nationally in field goal percentage, only one is listed as a guard (Indiana's Victor Oladipo). Oladipo, however, has only attempted 31 3-pointers this season, while Clark has attempted 141. When you combine the 3-point makes/attempts of the players above Clark, it adds up to 51-of-136 (37.5%), while Clark is an impressive 72-of-141 (51.1%) on the season. In addition Ken Pomeroy ranks Clark No. 1 nationally in effective field goal percentage. Clark is shooting 75-of-114 (65.8%) from 2-point range this season.

OVC Teams to Compete Once Again in ESPN Ramada Worldwide BracketBusters Series; Pairings to Be Announced Next Monday (Feb. 4): OVC teams will once again compete in the ESPN Ramada Worldwide BracketBusters series this season. This marks the eighth-straight season the every OVC teams has competed in the event. Now it its 11th year, BracketBusters is an ESPN television property that has been tremendously successful with its nine events. The event has allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involves "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the ESPN BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there are 122 teams from 15 conferences in the pool of teams that will be selected for one of 13 nationally-televised games (5 on ESPN2, 4 on ESPNU and 4 on ESPN3). The TV pairings will be announced on a ESPNU special on Monday, Feb. 4 at 6:30 p.m. ET (5:30 p.m. CT), with the non-TV pairings to be announced immediately following that special.

Murray State, Belmont, Eastern Kentucky Ranked in CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: In last week's CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major poll (Jan. 21 - the new poll had not been released yet), Belmont was No. 5, Murray State was No. 11 and Eastern Kentucky was No. 18. Gonzaga was ranked first and received 27 first-place votes while Wichita State, Creighton, Bucknell and Creighton picked up the remaining 4 first-place votes. Murray State finished the 2011-12 season ranked No. 1 in the poll, holding that spot for the final 12 weeks of the season; MSU was the first OVC team to ever be ranked No. 1 in the poll. Now in its 14th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, WAC and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders released on Jan. 28, Belmont ranks ninth nationally in 3-pointers made/game (8.9), 10th in field goal percentage (49.2%), 11th in 3-point percentage (40.2%), 11th in steals (9.7/game), 19th in assists (16.1/game), 21st in scoring margin (+13.6/game) and 25th in scoring offense (77.0/game). Eastern Kentucky ranks seventh in turnover margin (+4.9/game), 13th in free throw percentage (75.7%) and 15th in 3-pointers made/game (8.5). Austin Peay is 10th nationally in 3-point percentage (40.3%), Morehead State is ninth in steals (9.9/game) and Jacksonville State is 11th in 3-point percentage defense (28.1%). Individually Belmont's **Ian Clark** is first nationally in 3-point percentage (51.1%), ninth in 3-pointers made/game (3.43), 18th in field goal percentage (57.6%) and 24th in scoring (19.5 points/game). Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** ranks eighth nationally in scoring (21.1 points/game) and 18th in 3-pointers made/game (3.0). Murray State's **Ed Daniel** is seventh in rebounding (11.0/game) and fifth in double-doubles (12). Austin Peay's **Chris Horton** is ninth in blocks (3.0/game) while teammate **Travis Betran** is 14th in 3-point percentage (44.2%). Eastern Kentucky's **Corey Walden** is 10th in free throw percentage (90.5%).

OVC One of Just 9 Conferences (3 Non-BCS) to Win NCAA Tournament Games in Each of Past Four Seasons: The OVC is one of just nine (9) Division I conferences to win a NCAA Tournament game in each of the past four years and one of just three non-BCS conferences to achieve the feat. The other non-BCS leagues to win a game in each of the last three years are the Atlantic 10 and West Coast Conferences. The ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-10/12 and SEC are the BCS-level conferences that have won at least one game in each of the past three years.

COACHES TELECONFERENCE

During the regular season a monthly teleconference featuring the league's 10 head coaches will be held on Tuesday mornings at 10 a.m. Central Time. The initial teleconference will take place Jan. 8 with the next call following on Feb. 5 (women's coaches calls will be held on Wednesday's - Jan. 16 and Feb. 13). On Monday, March 4 a call featuring the men's & women's coaches who make the 8-team OVC Tournament field will be held at 9 a.m. (schedule to be announced). 2013 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2013 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 6-9 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. The tournament features eight men's and eight women's teams in a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on the OVC Digital Network. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 8 at 6 and 8 p.m. and televised on ESPNU and ESPN3. The championship game on Saturday, March 9 is at 6 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 8 (ESPN3) and the women's championship game is on March 9 at 1:30 p.m. (ESPN3).

This marks the 19th time in 20 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the fourth year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, MARCH 6 at 1 p.m.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).



More on NCAA Success: The four-year winning streak in NCAA Tournament play is unprecedented in OVC history. After winning NCAA Tournament games in each 1987, 1988 and 1989, the OVC went 20 years without a NCAA victory. That changed in 2009 when Morehead State topped Alabama State 58-43 in front of a record crowd at the Opening Round game in Dayton, Ohio. A year later it was No. 13 seed Murray State who won, topping No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 when Danero Thomas nailed a buzzer-beater in San Jose. In 2011 it was Morehead State's turn again, as the Eagles were seeded 13th and sent to Denver to battle No. 4-seed Louisville. MSU got off to a 15-2 lead nearly eight minutes into the game but trailed 61-59 with 31 seconds to play. On its final possession senior Demonte Harper nailed a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 4.3 seconds remaining to give Morehead State the lead and Kenneth Faried blocked Louisville's last shot attempt to seal the victory. Last season it was Murray State who once again won, knocking off Colorado State 58-41 in the second round in a game played in Louisville. The Racers earned a No. 6 seed in that event, the highest seed ever for an OVC team since the tournament seeding began in 1979.

Murray State First OVC Team to Reach 600 Conference Victories: Murray State, who was a charter member of the OVC when the Conference was formed in 1948, became the first Conference member to reach 600 OVC wins with a victory over UT Martin on Jan. 3. No other league member currently has more than 500 Conference wins.

Two Teammates With 30 Points in Same Game: In Belmont's 107-72 victory over Southeast Missouri on Jan. 10, teammates **Ian Clark** and **Trevor Noack** each scored 30 points in the game. It marked the first time anywhere at the Division I level in 2012-13 that two teammates had scored 30 or more points in the same game. It was the first time that had happened in Division I since two other OVC players, Eastern Kentucky's Mike DiNunno (33) and Jaron Jones (30), did so in an overtime loss to Tennessee State on Jan. 28, 2012.

Belmont's Johnson, Murray State's Canaan Named to Cousy Award Watch List: Belmont senior **Kerron Johnson** and Murray State senior **Isaiah Canaan** have been named to the watch list for the 2013 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award, which is presented by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The annual honor, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes the top point guards in men's college basketball. This watch list of candidates will be narrowed down to a final 20 around January 1st, final 10 near February 1st, and final five by approximately March 1st. A premier Selection Committee has been appointed by the Hall of Fame to review the final five candidates in contention for the nation's top collegiate point guard award. These Hall of Fame committees are made up of top college basketball personnel including media members, head coaches, Sports Information Directors and Hall of Famers. The winner of the 2013 Bob Cousy Award will be presented at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Championship Monday in Atlanta as part of NCAA Final Four weekend.

Canaan Named to Wooden Award Midseason Top 25 Watch List: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan**, who was one of 50 players named to the John Wooden Award Preseason Watch List, remained one of 25 players on the Midseason Watch List which was released in January. The players on the list are considered strong candidates for the midseason list and the official voting ballot, both of which are open to freshman and transfer students. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All American Team, consisting of the nation's top 10 players, will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round of the NCAA Tournament. The 37th annual Wooden Award ceremony will honor the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, and will include the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award. The event will take place the weekend of April 12-13, 2013.

Canaan Named Preseason All-American by Associated Press: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** was one of six players named to the Associated Press Preseason All-American team this season. Canaan was joined on the team by Indiana sophomore Cody Zeller, Creighton junior Doug McDermott, Lehigh senior C.J. McCollum, Ohio State junior Deshaun Thomas and Michigan sophomore Trey Burke. Canaan was named on 43 of the 65 media ballots, second only to McDermott (who was named on 62 ballots).

Canaan Named to Naismith Award Early Season Watch List: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** is one of 50 players nationally named to the Naismith Award early season watch list and announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. The 50-player watch list was compiled by the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors, which based its criteria on player performances from the previous year and expectations for the 2012-13 college basketball season. The Naismith Men's College Player of the Year presented by AT&T will be awarded on April 7, 2013 in Atlanta. In late February, the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Board of Selectors will compile a mid-season team of the top 30 players in the nation. Then in March, the Naismith Trophy voting academy will narrow the list to the four finalists.

Canaan is Candidate for Senior CLASS Award: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** is one of 30 men's basketball student-athletes who are candidates for the Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition. The complete list of candidates follows this release. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate classes will be narrowed to 10 men's and 10 women's finalists midway through the regular season, and those names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one men's finalist and one women's finalist who best exemplifies excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

No Freshmen: The SIUE men's basketball team is one of six Division I teams this season to not feature a freshman (either true or redshirt) on its roster. The other teams without a freshman include Ohio, Portland State, Savannah State, UAB and Valparaiso.

Canaan Named to All-Tournament Team at Charleston Classic: Murray State senior **Isaiah Canaan** was named to the Charleston Classic All-Tournament team after leading his team to a runner-up finish at the event. Canaan averaged 20.7 points, 3.7 assists and 3.0 rebounds/game as the Racers topped Auburn and St. John's before falling to Colorado.

Belmont's Clark and Noack Named to All-Tournament Team at Great Alaska Shootout: Belmont senior guard **Ian Clark** and senior forward **Trevor Noack** were named to the Great Alaska Shootout All-Tournament Team after leading his team to a third-place finish in the event. In the three games Clark averaged 16.3 points, 3.7 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 1.3 steals/game while hitting 51.6 percent (16-of-31) from the field and 59.1 percent (13-of-22) from 3-point range. In the Bruins win over host Alaska Anchorage he scored 14 points, dished out five assists and held UAA's leading scorer to just two field goals in 40 minutes. In the semifinal loss to Northeastern, Clark set a record in the 35-year old history of the Great Alaska Shootout by connecting on 9-of-11 (81.8) 3-pointers on his way to a game-high 29 points. In a third-place victory over Oral Roberts, Clark struggled offensively but limited ORU's top player (who entered the game averaged 24.0 points/game) to a season-low three points in 30 minutes of play. Noack averaged 13.7 points and 5.3 rebounds/game in scoring double figures in each game. He had 15 against each Alaska Anchorage and Oral Roberts and 11 against Northeastern. It marks the second-straight year an OVC player has been named to the event's All-Tournament Team (Murray State's Isaiah Canaan earned the honors last year).

OVC Tournament Once Again at Municipal Auditorium: The 2013 OVC Tournament will once again be played at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. (March 6-9). It marks the third-straight year the tournament has been at the venue and the eighth time the combined men's and women's tournaments have been held at the venue (1994, 1995, 1996, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012); the men's tournament was also held there in 1967. Beginning in 2011 the Championship switched to a format where the top eight men's and women's teams play in the merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds received two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds received one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round included the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements included upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium. Last year's event (2012) saw the largest neutral site crowds ever in Nashville and the second-largest championship game attendance ever at a neutral site. For the semifinal games last year 5,142 fans attended the Murray State/Tennessee Tech and Tennessee State/Morehead State games. A day later 6,454 fans attended the Murray State/Tennessee State Championship game. That crowd was the largest ever for a neutral site OVC Tournament game in Nashville and the second-largest neutral site championship crowd ever (trailing only the 8,145 fans who saw the 1993 Championship in Rupp Arena in Lexington, Ky.).

OVC at 12 Schools for First Time With Addition of Belmont; League Begins First Year of Divisional Play: The addition of Belmont University on July 1, 2012 gave the OVC 12 member institutions, the largest the Conference has been since it was formed in 1948 (the OVC is currently the nation's eighth-oldest Division I conference). The 2012-13 also marks the first year that SIUE, who finished its reclassification process to Division I in August, is eligible for the postseason. The East Division includes Belmont, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech. The West Division includes Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri State, SIUE and UT Martin. The team who finishes first in each division will be guaranteed either the No. 1 or No. 2 seed for the OVC Tournament (and get a double bye into the semifinals); Seeds 3-8 in the tournament will be based on best Conference record, regardless of which division the team is from.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 23rd year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 11 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 368 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 450 for his career (which ranks him 27th among Division I head coaches). Although he is in his first year in the OVC, Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** has 654 career victories, which ranks seventh among active Division I head coaches.

The OVC Welcomes Four New Head Coaches: The OVC has four new head coaches this season. Tennessee State promoted head coach **Travis Williams** to its top shot after former coach John Cooper left for Miami (Ohio). Eastern Illinois is under the direction of **Jay Spoonhour** while Morehead State hired former Mississippi Valley State head coach **Sean Woods**. Although not new to his team, Belmont's **Rick Byrd** is new to the league as the Bruins are playing its first year in the league in 2012-13.

Former OVC Players in the NBA: Entering the 2012-13 season there are two former OVC players on NBA rosters. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his second season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. Faried was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team

in 2012 after averaging 10.2 points and 7.7 rebounds/game in 46 contests. Former Tennessee Tech star **Kevin Murphy**, who scored 50 points in a game last season, was picked by the Utah Jazz with the 47th overall pick in the 2012 NBA Draft and begins his rookie season with the team. Murphy is currently playing with the Jazz's NBDL affiliate, the Reno BigHorns. Several other former NBA players are in the NBDL including Morehead State's **Demonte Harper** (Erie BayHawks), Tennessee Tech's **Liam McMorrow** (Iowa Energy), Jacksonville State's **Nick Murphy** (Iowa Energy) and Jacksonville State's **Walker Russell** (Fort Wayne Mad Ants).

The 2012-13 Season: The 2012-13 season marks the 65th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 64 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

Murray State's Canaan Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2012-13 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Murray State senior **Isaiah Canaan** who is the defending OVC Player of the Year and a preseason All-American selection. Overall six different schools were represented on the team with Belmont, Murray State, Southeast Missouri and Tennessee State having two selections apiece while SIUE and Tennessee Tech each had one selection to round out the team. The squad features three players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season, two players who were second-team selections and one player who was selected to the All-Newcomer squad. The team is comprised of eight seniors and two juniors. Last season Canaan was named the 2012 OVC Player of the Year and 2011-12 OVC Male Athlete of the Year after ranking 24th nationally in scoring (19.0), sixth in 3-point percentage (45.6%) and 13th in 3-pointers made/game (2.97). In addition to Canaan, Tennessee State senior forward **Robert Covington** and Tennessee Tech senior guard **Jud Dillard** were each first-team selections last year and are on the preseason team this year. The second-team selections from last year appearing on the preseason team this year are Southeast Missouri junior forward **Tyler Stone** and SIUE senior forward **Mark Yelovich**. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by the Belmont senior backcourt duo of **Kerron Johnson** and **Ian Clark**, Murray State senior forward **Ed Daniel**, Tennessee State junior guard **Patrick Miller** and Southeast Missouri senior guard **Marland Smith**.

Murray State, Belmont Picked as OVC Preseason Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors defending champion Murray State was picked the favorite in the West Division while newcomer Belmont was picked as the East Division favorite in the OVC for 2012-13. This year marks the first for divisional play in the OVC, which now includes 12 teams for the first time in Conference history. Murray State led the West Division voting, picking up 22 of a possible 24 first-place votes (schools were not allowed to vote for themselves) and 132 total points. Southeast Missouri State was tabbed second and picked up the remaining two first-place votes and 108 points. The West was rounded out by Austin Peay (92), SIUE (73), Eastern Illinois (49) and UT Martin (38). Belmont picked up 21 of the 24 first-place votes and 131 points to be picked the East Division favorites. Tennessee State was tabbed second and received the other three first-place votes and 109 points. The East was rounded out by Tennessee Tech (87), Morehead State (77) and Eastern Kentucky (56). Due to a NCAA APR penalty, Jacksonville State is ineligible for the OVC and NCAA Tournaments this season and was not included in the preseason voting.

Dial Global to Broadcast OVC Championship Game: For the fourth consecutive season, the 2013 Men's Basketball Championship game will be broadcast by the Dial Global (formerly Westwood One) radio network, the largest provider of audio content in America. Dial Global is one of the nation's largest providers of network radio programming and one of the largest domestic providers of traffic information in the U.S. Dial Global serves more than 5,000 radio and 170 TV stations in the U.S. Dial Global provides over 150 news, sports, music, talk and entertainment programs, features and live events to numerous media partners. Dial Global is home of the most prestigious sports broadcasts on radio. Dial Global's lineup includes regular season NFL football, the Play-offs and the Super Bowl; NCAA Football and Basketball including the Final Four; College World Series; Frozen Four; the Olympics; the Masters and more.

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year six: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the seventh year the OVC has streamed live events, but first time the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format and will feature improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

Murray State split a pair of hard-fought games last week, topping Tennessee Tech 47-39 on Thursday before losing at Jacksonville State 65-64 on Saturday... 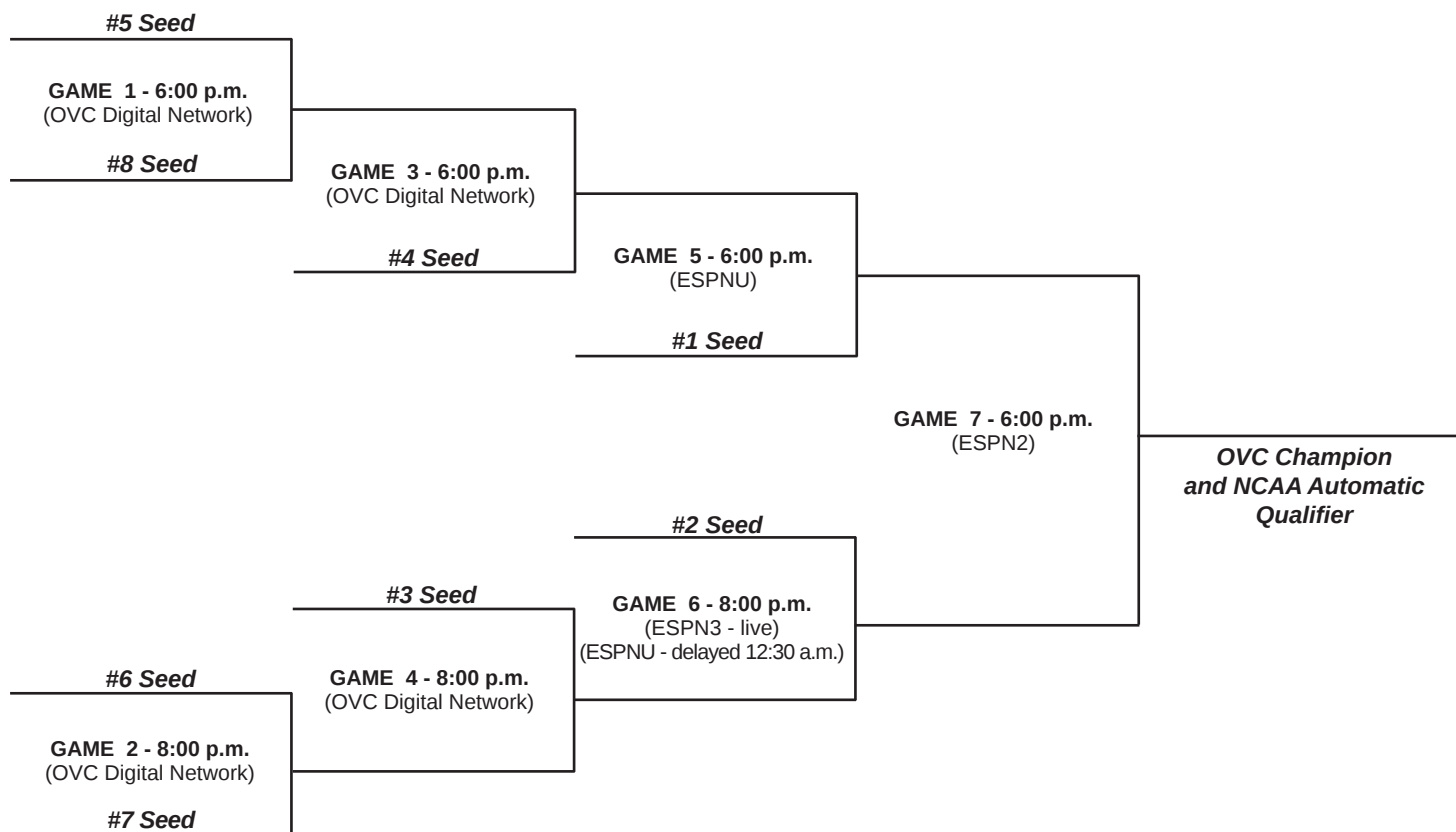
