THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Nationally-ranked Eastern Illinois and Tennessee State each won last week to remain undefeated and setup a battle for first place in the OVC this Saturday in Nashville...EIU, who is now No. 2 in the national polls, is the top ranked offense in the country (595.6 yards and 48.0 points/game), while TSU is the No. 2 ranked defense in the country (264.0 yards and 13.5 points/game), behind only two-time defending national champion North Dakota State...EIU's No. 2 ranking is the highest for the program since the 2002 season and first OVC team to be ranked No. 2 since 2010 (Jacksonville State); no OVC team has been ranked No. 1 since Tennessee State was after the end of the regular season in 1999...EIU quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo became the OVC's all-time career leader in total offense (passing Casey Brockman) in his team's win over Southeast Missouri...Garoppolo ranks first nationally in passing yards (2,735) and passing touchdown (31) and needs just three touchdowns to tie Tony Romo's OVC single-season record; Romo set that record in 2002 on his way to winning the Walter Payton Award...EIU wide receiver Erik Lora and Murray State wide receiver Walter Powell are tied for first nationally in receiving touchdowns (13) this season, just three away from tying the OVC single-season record; the duo each have 29 career touchdowns which ranks fourth in OVC history...Powell is the only player in Division I (FBS or FCS) to have two 300 all-purpose yard games this season...Besides the EIU/TSU game on Saturday, the OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3 features Eastern Kentucky at Southeast Missouri...Other action includes Jacksonville State at Tennessee Tech and UT Martin at Austin Peay.

OFFENSIVE

Jimmy Garoppolo, QB • Sr., 6-3, 222 • Arlington Heights, Ill. • Eastern Illinois
Garoppolo earned his fifth OVC Offensive Player of the Week honor of the 2013 season after leading No. 3 Eastern Illinois to a 55-33 victory over Southeast Missouri and becoming the OVC career leader in total offense in the process. The Walter Payton Award candidate completed 22-of-30 passes for 376 yards and three touchdowns and increased his career total offense output to 10,741 yards, passing Murray State's Casey Brockman for first all-time. Garoppolo also increased his career passing yards total to 10,841, passing current New Orleans Saints head coach Sean Payton for the school record and moving him into 19th place on the FCS career list. The senior opened the game 10-for-10 with two touchdown strikes and 254 yards as EIU jumped out to a 27-6 lead after one quarter. Garoppolo now has 96 career touchdown passes, which ranks 14th in FCS history; he has also now passed for 200 or more yards in the first half of all seven EIU games this season. Garoppolo ranks first nationally in total offense (394.9 yards/game), total passing yards (2,735) and passing touchdowns (31).

DEFENSIVE

Daniel Fitzpatrick, S • Jr., 6-2, 210 • Fort Wayne, Ind. • Tennessee State
Fitzpatrick earned his second-straight OVC Defensive Player of the Week honor after leading No. 22 Tennessee State to a 29-15 victory over UT Martin. The junior had nine tackles and recorded his fifth interception of the season as the Tigers remained undefeated in OVC play. Early in the second quarter Fitzpatrick intercepted Skyhawk quarterback Jarod Neal and returned the pick 20 yards for a touchdown to put TSU up 21-0. The five interceptions are tied for the most in the FCS this season. He helped anchor a Tennessee State defense that allowed only 4.1 yards/play and recorded 12 tackles-for-loss and five sacks. TSU has now recorded at least one takeaway in 21-straight games dating back to the 2011 season and the team ranks second nationally in total defense (264.0 yards/game) and scoring defense (13.5 points/game).

CO-SPECIALIST

Steven Mix, P • Sr., 6-2, 225 • Barlow, Ky. • Murray State

Mix helped Murray State win the field position game against Austin Peay, averaging 41.8 yards/punt on five attempts as the Racers topped the Governors 31-3. Four of his five punts were downed inside the APSU 20-yard line, including three punts inside the four-yard line. Mix had a long punt of 58 on the day and none of his punts were returned.

CO-SPECIALIST

Spencer Davis, RS/WR • Jr., 5-8, 175 • Florissant, Mo. • Southeast Missouri

Davis returned a kickoff 93-yards for a touchdown in Southeast Missouri's game at No. 3 Eastern Illinois on Saturday. The kickoff return for a touchdown was the first of his collegiate career and the third-longest in Southeast history. He finished the day with 126 yards on kickoff return and five catches for 41 yards to compile 167 all-purpose yards on the afternoon. Davis also caught a 15-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter.

NEWCOMER

Shepard Little, RB • R-So., 5-10, 198 • Schuamburg, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

Little carried the ball 15 times for 129 yards (8.9 ypc) and three touchdowns as No. 3 Eastern Illinois topped Southeast Missouri 55-33. Little scored on a 19-yard run in the first quarter and added runs of 5 and 8 yards in the second quarter as the Panthers built a 41-20 halftime advantage. Little also had 17 punt return yards to finish the day with 146 all-purpose yards. He was one of two EIU players to go over 100 yards on the ground on the day, as the team racked up 670 yards of total offense, the fifth-highest single-game total in school history.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

OVC Features No. 1 Offense and No. 2 Defense in FCS; Those Two Teams Will Play on Saturday: In the latest set of NCAA FCS statistical leaders the OVC features the No. 1 ranked offense and No. 2 ranked defense in the nation (that defense was No. 1 the previous two weeks). Eastern Illinois has the No. 1 offense averaging 595.6 yards and 48.0 points/game while Tennessee State has the No. 2 defense, allowing just 264.0 yards and 13.5 points/game (second only to two-time defending national champion North Dakota State in both categories). The two teams will play this Saturday in Nashville.

Garoppolo Sets OVC Career Touchdown Passes, Passing Yardage and Total Offense Records: Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** continues to etch his name in the OVC record book, breaking the OVC's career records for touchdown passes and passing yards on Sept. 28 against Eastern Kentucky. The senior tossed his 86th touchdown pass to break the previous record of 85 held by former EIU All-American and current Dallas Cowboy quarterback Tony Romo. Garoppolo now has 96 career touchdown passes, which ranks 14th in NCAA FCS history. He also broke the OVC career record for passing yards, passing the old mark of 9,990 yards by Murray State's Casey Brockman; Garoppolo now has 10,841 passing yards, which ranks 18th in FCS history. On Oct. 19 Garoppolo set the OVC career total yards mark, passing the former record held by Brockman; Garoppolo now has 10,741 yards of total offense, which is nearing the Top 30 in NCAA history. Through seven games this season the senior has 31 passing touchdowns (first among all Division I players both FBS or FCS) and 2,735 passing yards (which leads all FCS players).

Garoppolo Closes in on Another Romo Record: Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** enters this week with 31 touchdown passes this season, just three away from tying the OVC single-season record of 34 established by Tony Romo in 2002 (the year he won the Walter Payton Award).

Lora Sets OVC Career Receptions Record; Now 11th in NCAA History: Eastern Illinois senior All-American wide receiver **Erik Lora** set the OVC career receptions record in the Panthers victory over nationally-ranked Illinois State on Sept. 14. Lora broke the 43-year old record held by Austin Peay's Harold "Red" Roberts who caught 232 passes from 1967-70. Lora, who also owns the OVC record for receptions in a game (21) and a season (136), now has 274 career receptions, which ranks 11th in NCAA FCS history. Although it is unlikely he will set the NCAA record of 395 (he is 121 away), he is just 43 catches away from ranking second in FCS history (that mark is 317 held by Jacquay Nunally of Florida A&M). Lora also now ranks second in OVC history for receiving yards (3,390) and is just 513 yards away from the record.

OVC Teams in the Top 25: Eastern Illinois moved up to second in both the Sports Network and FCS Coaches Top 25 polls following its win over Southeast Missouri last week. The Panthers are the first OVC team to be ranked No. 2 since Jacksonville State was second in the polls on Oct. 25 and Nov. 1, 2010. The ranking for EIU is the highest since the team was also ranked No. 2 nationally in 2002 when Tony Romo was the team's starting quarterback. No OVC team has been ranked No. 1 in the polls since Tennessee State was No. 1 in the final regular season poll of the 1999 season. Tennessee State moved up to 21st both of the polls this week; TSU will host Eastern Illinois on Saturday. Jacksonville State is receiving votes in both polls while UT Martin is also garnering votes in the Sports Network rankings.

Murray State's Powell Only Division I Player With Two 300-Plus All-Purpose Yard Games in 2013: Murray State senior **Walter Powell** is the only player in Division I (FBS or FCS) with two 300-plus all-purpose yard games in 2013. Powell had 306 all-purpose yards in a victory over Missouri State on Sept. 14 and added 310 all-purpose yards in a victory over Tennessee Tech on Oct. 5. As a junior Powell ranked second nationally in all-purpose yards (193.0 yards/game); this season Powell ranks ninth nationally (151.75 yards/game).

NCAA Stats Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders (Oct. 20), Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** ranks first nationally in total passing yards (2,735), passing touchdowns (31), passing yards/game (390.7), total offense (394.9 yards/game) and points responsible for/game (28.0), second in passing efficiency (176.6), sixth in completions (27.71/game) and 10th in completion percentage (66.7%). EIU wide receiver **Erik Lora** ranks first nationally in receiving touchdowns (13), second in receiving yards/game (132.6) and receptions/game (9.2), third in total receiving yards (928) and fifth in scoring (11.4 points/game). Murray State's **Walter Powell** ranks first nationally in receiving touchdowns (13), seventh in scoring (11.3 points/game) and ninth in total receiving yards (702), ninth in all-purpose yards (151.75 yards/game). Jacksonville State's **DaMarcus James** ranks seventh in rushing touchdowns (11), Murray State quarterback **Maikhaile Miller** ranks fourth in completion percentage (68.4%), Eastern Illinois wide receiver **Adam Drake** is sixth in receiving touchdowns (8) and Tennessee Tech's **Ladarius Vanlier** is seventh in punt returns (14.8 yards/return). Jacksonville State's **Griffin Thomas** is first in field goals (2.3/game) while Tennessee State's **Jamin Godfrey** is fourth (1.6/game) in that category, and Tennessee Tech's **Chad Zinchini** is second in punting (47.0 yards/punt). TSU's **Daniel Fitzpatrick** is fifth in interceptions/game (0.6), while EIU's **Jourdan Wickliffe** is second in forced fumbles/game (0.57) and Murray State's **Tray Carr** is first in fumbles recovered/game (1.00). In the team rankings Eastern Illinois is first nationally in total offense (595.6 yards/game), scoring offense (48.0 points/game) and passing offense (407.6 yards/game), third in passing efficiency (173.24), seventh in punt returns (15.3 yards/return) and tackles-for-loss allowed (4.0/game), eighth in passes intercepted (11) and kickoff return yardage defense (16.24 yards/punt), ninth in turnover margin (+1.0/game) and third down conversion defense (29.9%) and 10th in turnovers gained (18). Tennessee State is first nationally in passing efficiency defense (86.77) and blocked kicks (6), second in total defense (264.0 yards/game), scoring defense (13.5 points/game), blocked punts (3) and third down conversion defense (27.8%), third in passes intercepted (13), fourth in tackles-for-loss/game (8.8), fifth in turnover margin (+1.5/game) and interceptions thrown (3), sixth in turnovers gained (21), eighth in pass defense (154.1 yards/game) and 10th in passing efficiency (156.27). Eastern Kentucky is first in blocked kicks (6), fifth in rushing defense (93.4 yards/game) and eighth in net punting (39.4 yards/punt). Murray State is third in passes intercepted (13) and eighth in turnovers gained (20). Southeast Missouri is third in fewest yards penalized/game (32.71).

NCAA Attendance Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA FCS attendance leaders, Jacksonville State is seventh nationally with an average of 17,975 fans per game.

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SEMO's Davis and Elias Earn National Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 8: Southeast Missouri's **Spencer Davis** was named the National Kick Returner of the Week while the Redhawks Justin Elias was named National Punt Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week 8 of the 2013 season. Davis returned a kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown while Elias returned a blocked punt 29 yards for a score in a game against nationally-ranked Eastern Illinois. In addition to that duo, eight other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

Eastern Illinois Knocks Off FBS Foe San Diego State in Week 1; Jacksonville State Tops FBS Georgia State in Week 4: Week 1 of the 2013 season saw eight teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FBS) defeat teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) including Eastern Illinois thrashing defending Mountain West Conference Champion San Diego State 40-19. The 21-point margin of victory was the second largest for an OVC team ever over a FBS squad (the largest was a 24-point win by Eastern Kentucky over Louisville in 1985). In week four (Sept. 21), Jacksonville State knocked off first-year FBS opponent Georgia State 32-26 in overtime. It marked the first time since the 1987 season that OVC teams had won multiple FBS games in the same year (that season Austin Peay beat Kansas State and Youngstown State topped Bowling Green). OVC teams have now knocked off FBS foes in three of the last four years, as Jacksonville State beat Ole Miss in 2010 and UT Martin beat Memphis in 2012. Overall OVC schools 32-182-1 all-time against FBS foes and have one more game against FBS teams this season (Nov. 9 when UTM plays at Memphis).

FCS Over FBS: So far this season a record 14 teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) have scored victories over teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS).

the 10th player in FCS history to achieve the feat since the subdivision formed in 1978. He is the second OVC player to achieve the feat, joining Eastern Kentucky's Bobby Washington who had the rush against Murray State in the 2007 season.

Jacksonville State Ties FCS Record By Playing in Three-Straight Overtime Games: Jacksonville State played in three-straight overtime games from Sept. 14-28. The Gamecocks topped North Alabama (Sept. 14) and Georgia State (Sept. 21) before falling to Murray State (Sept. 28). That tied the Division I all-time record for most consecutive overtime contests, equaling a mark by Penn in 2006 (no FBS team has ever played in three-straight).

Jacksonville State Ties NCAA Record For Most 100 Yard Rushers in a Game: When Jacksonville State had four players rush for 100 yards or more against Jacksonville University on Sept. 7, the Gamecocks tied the Division I (FBS and FCS) record for that feat. The record had been done seven times previously including Arizona State (1951), Texas (1969), Alabama (1973), Army (1984), Nebraska (2001), Nevada (2009), Arkansas State (2013). There is no NCAA record of a team from the FCS achieving the feat prior to JSU accomplishing it. The four JSU players over 100 yards were **Troymaine Pope** (160), **Miles Jones** (138), **Eli Jenkins** (128) and **DaMarcus James** (105).

Murray State Establishes OVC Record for Points Scored in a Half: With its 62-point first half explosion over Campbellsville on Sept. 7, Murray State established a new OVC record for most points scored in a half. The Racers scored 41 points in the first quarter and added 21 points in the second quarter to break the previous record of 49. That old record had been achieved three times: Eastern Kentucky (1981), UT Martin (2007) and Murray State (2012).

Three OVC Players Remain on Updated Walter Payton Watch List: Three Ohio Valley Conference players were among the 20 players nationally named to the updated Walter Payton Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. The players, who were all on the preseason list released in July, are Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo**, Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** and Murray State wide receiver/return specialist **Walter Powell**. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. Last season the OVC has four finalists for the award with Lora finishing fourth, the highest finish for an OVC player since EIU's Tony Romo won the award in 2002. The three selections this preseason for the OVC ranked tied for second (along with the Southern Conference) among FCS conferences; the Missouri Valley Football Conference had four total selections on the list. The Payton Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The top three vote-getters will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation.

TSU's Godbolt Remains on Updated Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** is one of 20 players nationally on the updated Buck Buchanan Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. He was also on the initial list which was released in July. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, is presented annually to the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The Buchanan Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The winner will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation on Dec. 16.

EKU's Borders Named to Jerry Rice Award Watch List: Eastern Kentucky redshirt freshman **Devin Borders** has been named to the initial Jerry Rice Award Watch List by the Sports Network. The award, now in its third season, is given to the top first-year player in the FCS (true or redshirt freshman) and named after the NFL Hall of Famer who played collegiately at the FCS level (Mississippi Valley State). Borders is one of 20 players on the watch list. The Rice Award will be voted on by a national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The Rice Award Watch List can undergo revision during the season. The winner will be announced at The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation Dec. 16 in Philadelphia.

Four OVC Student-Athletes Named Semifinalists for William V. Campbell Trophy: Four OVC student-athletes are among the 170 semifinalist named for the 2013 William V. Campbell Trophy which recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation. The four student-athletes are Austin Peay senior offensive lineman **Ben Stansfield**, Eastern Illinois senior kicker **Cameron Berra**, Eastern Kentucky senior linebacker **Ichiro Vance** and Tennessee Tech senior offensive lineman **James Normand**. The list was announced by the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame and are part of the 2013 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards. The 170 semifinalists represent the most ever since 2006 when the NFF increased the nomination standards to require a minimum cumulative 3.2 GPA. Of the semifinalists, 46 were from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The class is selected each year by the NFF Awards Committee, which is comprised of a nationally recognized group of media, College Football Hall of Famers and athletics administrators. The NFF Awards Committee will select up to 16 finalists, and the results will be announced via a national press release on Thursday, October 31. Each finalist will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship and they will vie for the 2013 William V. Campbell Trophy. Each of the 16 members of the 2013 National Scholar-Athlete Class will also travel to New York City to be honored Dec. 10 during the 56th NFF Annual Awards Dinner at the Waldorf-Astoria where their accomplishments will be highlighted in front of one of the most powerful audiences in all of sports. One member of the class will also be announced live at the event as the winner of the William V. Campbell Trophy.

NCAA Division I Playoff Information: This season marks the first of an expanded 24-team playoff for NCAA Division I teams. In 2010 the FCS Playoffs expanded from 16 teams to 20 teams, the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. This year the top eight seeds will receive byes to the second round while the first round will feature 16 teams in eight total matchups. For the first time the Pioneer League will receive an automatic bid to the playoffs (bringing the number of auto bids

to 11). For the fourth-straight year the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at FC Dallas Stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 4 (1 p.m. CT, ESPN2). The playoff field will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 24.

Sgt. York Trophy Enters Seventh Season in 2013: The Sgt. York Trophy is a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four football-playing OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the OVC announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). In 2007 Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season (that was the tiebreaker used only for the first year of the trophy series). Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. In 2009 Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games and in 2010 UT Martin became the third-straight OVC team to go 3-0 and win the trophy in claiming its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech shared the title (TSU went home with the trophy) while Tennessee State and UT Martin shared the title in 2012 (TSU once again took home the actual trophy). The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring.

Powell Named National Specialist of the Week (Oct. 7): Murray State senior **Walter Powell** was named the National Specialist of the Week by the College Sporting News following his performance against Tennessee Tech on Oct. 5. Powell returned a punt 88 yards for a touchdown (he returned a kickoff for a touchdown earlier this season) and finished the game with 310 all-purpose yards (including catching eight passes for 177 yards and two scores), his second 300-plus all-purpose yard output of the season. In the process he became Murray State's all-time leader in touchdowns.

Johnson Named National Specialist of the Week (Sept. 30): Tennessee Tech senior defensive lineman **Jordan Johnson** was named the National Specialist All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Sept. 30 after playing a key role in TTU's 38-37 win over Indiana State. After Indiana State had scored the first touchdown on the night, Johnson blocked the point after attempt and that single point proved to be the difference in the game. Later in the quarter Johnson rejected a 20-yard field goal attempt by the Sycamores which was scooped up by teammate James Huguely and returned 87 yards for a touchdown to give Tech a 10-6 advantage.

Jude Named National Freshman of the Week (Sept. 23): Eastern Kentucky redshirt freshman running back **JJ Jude** was named National Co-Freshman of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 23 after his performance against Morehead State. Jude carried the ball 33 times for 195 yards and four touchdowns as EKV won 56-24. The four rushing touchdowns tied an EKV single-game record. Jude carried the ball 33 times (and averaged 5.9 yards/carry) after carrying the ball only 19 times in the first three games of the season.

Garoppolo Named National Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 16): Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named National Offensive Player of the Week by both the Sports Network and College Sporting News on Sept. 16 for his performance in a convincing victory over No. 16 Illinois State. It marked the second-straight week he earned the honor from College Sporting News. Garoppolo completed 26-of-41 passes for 480 yards and seven touchdowns (six in the first half) as EIU won 57-24 over its rival. The seven touchdown passes for the game broke the school record previously held by Tony Romo and Jeff Christensen (Garoppolo's high school quarterback coach).

Thomas Named National Specialist of Week (Sept. 16): Jacksonville State senior kicker **Griffin Thomas** was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 16 after hitting five field goals in JSU's double overtime victory over North Alabama. The five field goals set a new Jax State record while his 16 points tied the school record for points by a kicker. The senior started the day by connecting on a 50-yarder in the first quarter, becoming just the third player in Gamecock history to kick a 50-yard or longer field goal. Thomas added a 42-yard field goal in the second quarter and a 44-yarder with three minutes to go in the fourth quarter. His 26-yard field goal in the first overtime forced to second extra period where he nailed the game-winner.

Garoppolo Named National Offensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News (Sept. 9): Eastern Illinois senior quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo was named National Offensive All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Sept. 9 for his play against Southern Illinois. Garoppolo completed 34-of-56 passes for 440 yards and four touchdowns as No. 14 Eastern Illinois topped rival SIU 40-37 in double overtime on Saturday. The 440 passing yards are the fifth-best in EIU single-game history, while his 442 yards of total offense was the fourth-most in EIU history.

Bell Named National Defensive Player of the Week by Sports Network (Sept. 9): UT Martin junior linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 9 for his play against Boise State. Bell had six tackles (5 solo) including 5.0 tackles-for-loss (for a loss of 26 yards) against the Broncos. He also added a pair of sacks, forced two fumbles and had a fumble recovery.

McNulty Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 2): Eastern Illinois senior defensive back **Alex McNulty** was named National Co-Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network and National Defensive All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News on Sept. 2 for his efforts in EIU's 21-point victory over Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe San Diego State. The senior picked off two passes and returned them for a total of 50 yards including setting up EIU's final touchdown of the night in the fourth quarter. He also added five tackles, a tackle-for-loss and had two pass break-ups.

Against UT Martin Zinchini punted four times for 201 yards (50.2 yards/punt) including a long of 61 yards. Three of his four punts ended up inside the Skyhawks 20-yard line. In addition to Zinchini, 11 other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

JSU's James, MSU's Powell and EKU's Berry Earn National Weekly Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 6: Jacksonville State's **DaMarcus James** was named National Running Back of the Week, Murray State's **Walter Powell** was named National Punt Returner of the Week and Eastern Kentucky's **Jordan Berry** was named National Punter of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week 6 of the 2013 season. James rushed 184 yards and three touchdowns in a win over No. 22 UT Martin. Powell returned a punt 88 yards for a touchdown in his team's win over Tennessee Tech. Berry averaged 48.7 yards/punt including a long of 77 yards in a victory over Austin Peay. In addition to the trio, four other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

EIU's Lora, TSU's Leonard Earn National Weekly Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 4: Eastern Illinois wide receiver **Erik Lora** was named National Wide Receiver of the Week while Tennessee State tight end **A.C. Leonard** was named National Tight End of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week 4 of the 2013 season. Lora caught 14 passes for 198 yards and three touchdowns as EIU lost by four points at FBS foe Northern Illinois. Leonard caught five passes for 122 yards and two touchdowns as TSU topped Tennessee Tech in its OVC opener. In addition to the duo, seven other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

Garoppolo, Powell and Thomas Earn National Weekly Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 3: Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named National Performer of the Week (and National Quarterback of the Week) by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following his performance in week three of the 2013 season. In addition Murray State's **Walter Powell** was named National All-Purpose Performer of the Week and National Kickoff Returner of the Week while Jacksonville State kicker **Griffin Thomas** was named National Placekicker of the Week. Garoppolo had 480 passing yards and seven touchdowns in his team's convincing victory over nationally-ranked Illinois State. Powell accounted for 306 all-purpose yards, catching 11 passes for 155 yards and four touchdowns (including the game-winner with 24 seconds remaining) and also returning a kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown. Thomas kicked five field goals as JSU topped North Alabama in double overtime. In addition to the duo, 15 other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

Bell Earns National Defensive Performer of the Week, Stevenson National Kickoff Returner of the Week Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 2: UT Martin junior linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Performer of the Week (and National Linebacker of the Week) while Tennessee State junior **Martine Stevenson** was named National Kickoff Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week two of the 2013 season. Bell had six tackles, 5.0 tackles-for-loss, 2.0 sacks, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery in UT Martin's game at FBS foe Boise State. Stevenson returned a kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown in TSU's road win over Florida A&M. In addition to the duo, nine (9) other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

Vanlier and Little Share National Punt Returner of the Week Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 1: Tennessee Tech sophomore **Ladarius Vanlier** and Eastern Illinois sophomore **Shepard Little** were each named the National Punt Returners of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week one of the 2013 season. Vanlier returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown as Tennessee Tech routed Cumberland University while Little returned a punt 60 yards for a touchdown to push EIU to a victory over FBS opponent San Diego State. In addition to the duo, six (6) other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

A Look at the Coaches: Seven of the nine head coaches from last season return to their schools in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. The only newcomers are Austin Peay's **Kirby Cannon** and Jacksonville State's **Bill Clark**. Southeast Missouri's **Tony Samuel** and UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** are now the longest tenured active coaches, each entering the eighth seasons at their respective schools. Clark and TSU's **Rod Reed** are currently the only OVC football coaches serving as head coaches at their alma maters.

A Brother Coaching Duo: This season Tennessee Tech head coach **Watson Brown** and his brother Mack Brown (the head coach at Texas) could become the winningest set of brothers in NCAA Division I history. After week six of the 2013 season the duo has 359 victories (234 by Mack, 125 by Watson) which trails only Bill and Vince Dooley (362 total wins) on the all-time list.

Preseason Forecasts: For the first time since 2007, Eastern Illinois was picked as the preseason favorite in the OVC. The defending champion Panthers picked up 12 of a possible 18 first-place votes to top the poll with 122 points. Eastern Kentucky was second (114 points, 4 first-place votes) while Tennessee State ranked third (90 points, 2 first-place votes). The poll was rounded out by Jacksonville State (87), UT Martin (78), Murray State and Tennessee Tech (tied with 53 points), Southeast Missouri (35) and Austin Peay (16). Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 35 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 13 times (37.1%). After eight years of not picking the champion right (2003-2010), the 2011 preseason poll picked the right champion after the league finished in a three-way tie.

EIU's Lora and TSU's Godbolt Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** was named 2013 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** was tabbed OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Tennessee State led the way with seven selections on the preseason team while Eastern Illinois had six and Eastern Kentucky had four. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (11 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included 10 players who were second-team selections in 2012. Of the 27 total selections, 19 were seniors and eight were juniors.

NFL Connections: As of September 30, there are 14 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters (8 active, 4 practice squad members and 2 on IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now with the Denver Broncos. Eight of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the eighth year the OVC has streamed live events, but second year the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2013 season marks the seventh of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play in 2007. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games while Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy. UT Martin made it three straight years with the winning team going 3-0, completing the perfect season in 2010 to win its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech finished in a tie for the Trophy (2-1) and were declared co-champions. Tennessee State, however, will take home the actual trophy since they had gone the most seasons without winning it (2008, compared to 2009 for TTU).

Last year TSU held on to the trophy by finishing 2-1 and winning the tiebreaker with UT Martin.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky will travel to Southeast Missouri for the OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3. The game is the annual Homecoming contest for the Redhawks who are coming off a loss to nationally-ranked Eastern Illinois. Eastern Kentucky, coming off a win over Tennessee Tech following its bye week, leads the all-time series 20-3 and has won eight of the last nine against Southeast Missouri. The lone win in that stretch was a 40-21 victory by the Redhawks on its way to the OVC Championship in 2010. Last season the Colonels pulled off a 31-7 win in Cape Girardeau, jumping out to a 31-0 lead. In that contest Jared McClain completed 8-of-11 passes for 138 yards and rushed for 24 yards and two touchdowns while Matt Denham added 99 yards and a score for the Colonels. Southeast Missouri was led by Blake Jackson who rushed for 68 yards and a touchdown.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky won its second-straight game and third contest in four games by topping Tennessee Tech 24-10 on Saturday. The strong EKU defense limited Tech to just 200 yards of total offense on the day, including only 27 yards on the ground. Over the past two games EKU has allowed just 33 total rushing yards and the Colonels now rank first in the OVC and fifth nationally in rushing defense (93.4 yards/game). Senior linebacker Anthony Brown finished the game with five tackles, a sack, an interception, a pass break-up and two quarterback hurries. Offensively quarterback Jared McClain threw for 169 yards and rushed for 41 yards and a pair of touchdowns in the contest. McClain has now accounted for 13 total touchdowns this season, eight on the ground and five with his feet. Making a return from injury, redshirt freshman JJ Jude carried the ball 21 times for 60 yards for the Colonels. EKU ranks eighth nationally in net punting (39.4 yards/punt) and first nationally in blocked kicks (6).

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri fell behind 34-6 to No. 3 Eastern Illinois early in the second quarter and could not rebound in falling 55-33. Junior Spencer Davis was named OVC Co-Specialist of the Week after returning a kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter of the contest. It marked his first collegiate kick return for a touchdown and was the third-longest return in Southeast Missouri history. He also caught five passes for 41 yards (including a 15-yard touchdown in the first quarter) to finish the day with 167 all-purpose yards. Justin Elias scored a touchdown on a blocked punt, going 29 yards for a score early in the second quarter. Offensively DeMichael Jackson rushed for 126 yards and his first career touchdown, a 27-yard run in the second quarter. Quarterback Scott Lathrop finished the day by completing 15-of-22 passes for 117 yards and two touchdowns and rushing for an additional 28 yards. Linebacker Roper Garrett recorded a game-high 12 tackles; he currently ranks second on the team with 50 total tackles this season. As a team the Redhawks rank third nationally in fewest yards penalized/game (32.71) and sixth in kickoff return yardage defense (15.83 yards/return).

GAME NOTES: Jacksonville State will play at Tennessee Tech on Saturday in the annual Homecoming game for the Golden Eagles. It marks the 17th all-time meeting between the schools with JSU holding a 10-6 advantage in the series. The Gamecocks won 37-28 a season ago, snapping a two-game winning streak in the series for the Golden Eagles. A year ago TTU led until the end of the third quarter when Marques Ivory hooked up with Telvin Brown for an 86-yard touchdown pass to give JSU a 30-28 lead with 1:06 to play in the third frame. Washaun Ealey would add a late fourth quarter score to give JSU the nine-point victory. DaMarcus James led the Jax State rushing attack, finishing the day with 130 yards and a touchdown while Ivory threw for 277 yards. Tre Lamb had 171 passing yards and 41 rushing yards and a touchdown for Tennessee Tech.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State is coming off its bye week, which came one week after the Gamecocks lost to nationally-ranked Tennessee State at home. JSU entered the game with the top-rated rushing attack in the OVC but were limited to just 21 net yards on the ground on 34 total carries (0.6 ypc). DaMarcus James was limited to 15 yards, but did score a touchdown, his 11th of the season which ranks him seventh nationally. Starting quarterback Max Shortell passed for 131 yards before leaving the game with an injury. Both Eli Jenkins and Kyle West saw time in the game after Shortell left the field. Kicker Griffin Thomas made a pair of field goals in the game and continues to lead all FCS players by making 2.3 field goals/game this season. Thomas has made 16-of-20 field goals and 22-of-22 PATs this season. Thomas is just six field goals behind Gavin Halford for the Jax State single-season record. JSU failed to score a first half touchdown for the first time against an OVC opponent since the 2006 season, snapping a 50-game streak.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech was able to limit the Eastern Kentucky rushing through three quarters, but the Golden Eagles offense could never manage any consistency in falling 24-10. Tech finished the game with just 200 yards of total offense, including only 27 net yards rushing on 22 carries (1.2 ypc). Freshman Maleek Hall caught eight passes for 38 yards and rushed for 11 yards in his first collegiate start. Quarterback Jared Davis completed 21 passes for 173 yards and a touchdown to Krys Cates in the fourth quarter. Defensively Tra'Darius Goff had 10 tackles, including two tackles-for-loss and a sack, for the Golden Eagles. It marked the fourth game this season he has reached double-digit tackles; Goff now has 68 tackles on the year, second on the team. Senior Chad Zinchini averaged 41.4 yards on seven punts, including a long of 50 yards; Zinchini now ranks second nationally in punting (47.0 yards/punt). As a team TTU ranks 10th nationally in turnovers gained (18) and 12th in fumbles recovered (8).

GAME NOTES: Homecoming comes to Clarksville on Saturday as Austin Peay will host UT Martin in a Sgt. York Trophy series game on Saturday. The in-state rivals have played 61 previous times with UTM holding a 34-25-2 all-time advantage. The Skyhawks have won five in a row and nine of the last 10 in the series. A season ago UT Martin jumped out to a 21-3 halftime lead on its way to a 31-6 victory. Derek Carr threw for 266 yards and two touchdowns as Quentin Sims and Jeremy Butler both hauled in touchdown passes. Wesley Kitts had 118 rushing yards to lead APSU. Saturday marks just the second home game of the season for the Govs, who have played six road games already in 2013.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin dropped its second-straight home contest on Saturday, falling to No. 22 Tennessee State by a 29-15 margin. The Skyhawks have usually controlled the first half of games this season, but last week fell behind 23-0 at the break before managing two second half touchdowns. It marked the first time since 2010 that UTM had failed to score a point in the first half against an OVC opponent. TSU scored on a blocked field goal and an interception returns in the opening half and later added a safety and two field goals. The UTM defense only allowed 229 yards of total offense and one offensive score on the afternoon but the team allowed quarterback Jarod Neal to be sacked five times and the squad was flagged for 19 penalties in the loss. Neal, playing in place of an injured Dylan Favre for the second game, passed for 242 yards and a touchdown, with 10 of those passes going to Jeremy Butler who finished the day with 129 yards and a touchdown. It marked the fifth career 100-yard receiving game in two seasons for Butler, who has 15 receiving touchdowns in 17 career games with the Skyhawks. DJ McNeil, the leading rusher in the OVC at 104.1 yards/game, finished the day with only 54 yards.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay lost for the seventh time this season, falling 31-3 at rival Murray State on Saturday. It marked the 22nd-straight loss on the road for the Governors dating back to the 2010 season. Chase Dunlap converted on his second field goal of the season, a 38-yarder in the second quarter, for the lone points of the game for APSU. Tim Phillips, the transfer from Central Michigan, recorded his first 100-yard rushing game of his career, carrying the ball 26 times for 123 yards (4.7 ypc). Phillips also caught four passes for 28 yards to finish the day with 163 all-purpose yards. In place of injured starter Andrew Spivey, redshirt freshman walk-on Timarius Spivey completed 8-of-16 passes while sophomore Jacob Sexton completed 2-of-6 passes. Ben Campbell punted the ball nine times for 338 yards (37.6 yards/punt) including a long of 49 yards; Campbell has punted 53 times on the season and is now on pace to punt 91 times, which would break the APSU single-season record of 82 punts. Junior safety Johnathan Shuler led APSU with 10 tackles (8 solo) and forced two fumbles in the contest. Senior linebacker Craig Salley added eight tackles and a fumble recovery.

GAME NOTES: Something will have to give on Saturday as the No. 1 offense in the FCS travels to Nashville to battle the No. 2 defense in the FCS in a game to determine first place in the OVC. Eastern Illinois, now No. 2 in the national polls, enters the week 6-1 overall and 3-0 in the OVC, while Tennessee State, now ranked No. 21 in the polls, is 7-1 overall and 4-0 in the Conference. Eastern Illinois leads the all-time series 8-7, although the teams did not play a season ago. When the teams last played in 2011, Tennessee State pulled out an 18-17 victory in Charleston. EIU led 17-5 at the end of the third quarter in that game, but TSU's Trabis Ward rushed for two fourth quarter touchdowns, the last coming with 1:49 to play, to push the Tigers to victory. Ward finished the day with 142 rushing yards. Jimmy Garoppolo was limited to just 149 passing yards for the Panthers, as he was sacked three times and intercepted once.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois has achieved its highest ranking since the 2002 season after climbing to No. 2 in the FCS polls. The Panthers rank first nationally in both total offense (595.6 yards/game) and scoring offense (48.0 points/game) and have suffered only a loss to FBS Northern Illinois, who is undefeated and ranked 18th in the initial BCS standings. Senior quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo threw for 376 yards and three touchdowns in Saturday's win over Southeast Missouri and was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week for the fifth time this season. In the process Garoppolo became the OVC's career leader in total offense (10,741), passing Murray State's Casey Brockman. Garoppolo leads all FCS players in passing yards (2,735) and passing touchdowns (31); he needs just three more touchdowns to tie Tony Romo's OVC single-season record of 34. Erik Lora caught eight passes for 131 yards and a touchdown (he is tied for first nationally with 13 touchdowns this season) while Adam Drake hauled in three passes for 138 yards and a score. Shepard Little carried the ball 15 times for 129 yards (8.6 ypc) and three touchdowns while Taylor Duncan added 107 rushing yards and a score. Overall EIU racked up 670 yards of total offense, the fifth-highest mark in school history. In addition to its high-powered offense, Eastern Illinois also ranks eighth nationally in passes intercepted (11) and ninth in turnover margin (+1.0/game).

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State won its seventh-consecutive game on Saturday, building a 23-0 halftime advantage at UT Martin on its way to a 29-15 victory. The Tigers are now 5-0 away from home this season and moved up to 21st in both FCS Top 25 polls. TSU scored only one offensive touchdown in the game, scoring on a blocked field goal return, an interception and a safety in the first half and adding two Jamin Godfrey field goals in the second half. The No. 2 ranked defense in the country sacked UTM quarterback Jarod Neal five times, intercepted him once and tallied 12.0 tackles-for-loss in limited the Skyhawks to just 85 yards of rushing on the day. Daniel Fitzpatrick was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week for the second-straight week after netting nine tackles and his fifth interception of the season (tied for the national lead). Fitzpatrick returned that interception 20 yards for a touchdown to put TSU up 21-0. The Tennessee State defense has now recorded at least one takeaway in 21-straight games dating back to the 2011 season. The Tigers are first nationally in passing efficiency defense (86.77), third in passes intercepted (13), fifth in turnover margin (+1.5/game) and sixth in turnovers gained (21). In the absence of Michael German, freshman quarterback Ronald Butler played the entire game, completing 11-of-19 passes for 160 yards and a touchdown.
