THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

No. 2 ranked Eastern Illinois won the battle for first place in the OVC, topping No. 21 Tennessee State in a game that featured the No. 1 offense in the FCS versus the No. 2 ranked defense...The Panthers jumped out to a 21-3 halftime advantage and racked up 567 yards of total offense and 34 points in the victory; that was 200 more yards of total offense and 13 more points than TSU had given up to an opponent in its other eight games this season...The game was played in front of 22,157 fans at LP Field, the ninth-largest crowd to witness a football game between two OVC teams...EIU quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo continued to etch his name in the OVC record books, throwing four touchdown passes to increase his single-season total to 35, breaking the mark of 34 previously held by Tony Romo; his final touchdown of the game marked the 100th touchdown of his career (which ranks 13th in NCAA history)...Garoppolo also set the OVC career attempts record in the win (1,432)...EIU wide receiver Erik Lora increased his career receptions total to 284, moving him into 10th place on the NCAA career list...Eastern Illinois remained No. 2 in both national polls while Tennessee State is now No. 23 in the Sports Network poll and No. 24 in the FCS Coaches poll; Jacksonville State, UT Martin and Eastern Kentucky are among the others receiving votes...EKU's Jordan Berry was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network after averaging 59.3 yards/punt on three attempts and also going untouched 25 yards on a fake field goal attempt to score his first collegiate touchdown...With a win over Southeast Missouri, Eastern Kentucky stayed one loss back of EIU in the standings (along with Murray State who was on bye); EIU will host Tennessee State (who has one OVC loss) this week in a key game...In other Conference action Eastern Illinois will host Tennessee Tech, Murray State travels to UT Martin and Austin Peay hosts Jacksonville State...In a non-conference tilt, Southeast Missouri will host Urbana University.

OFFENSIVE

Jimmy Garoppolo, QB • Sr., 6-3, 222 • Arlington Heights, Ill. • Eastern Illinois
Garoppolo set the OVC single-season touchdown passes record as No. 2 Eastern Illinois stayed perfect in the OVC with a 34-16 victory over No. 21 Tennessee State in Nashville. Against the No. 2 ranked defense nationally, Garoppolo completed 24-of-41 passes for 410 yards and four touchdowns and helped the Panthers rack up 567 yards of total offense in the game (200 yards more than TSU had given up to any other team this season). His fourth touchdown of the game was the 35th of the season for the Walter Payton Award candidate, breaking the previous OVC single-season record of 34 set by Tony Romo in 2002 (when he won the Payton Award). Garoppolo also set the OVC career record for pass attempts in the game and now has 1,432 attempts for his career. Garoppolo continues to rank first nationally in both passing yards (3,145) and touchdowns (35); the 35 touchdowns are the most of any Division I player (FBS or FCS). It marks the sixth time this season Garoppolo has been named OVC Offensive Player of the Week, which is one off the OVC record held by Ryan Perrilloux (2009); Garoppolo has earned the award eight times in his career, one off the record held by three players (Perrilloux, Romo and ECU's Markus Thomas).

Rashod Byers, CB • Jr., 5-8, 180 • Jacksonville, Fla. • Jacksonville State
Byers had six tackles and three pass break-ups as Jacksonville State went on the road to top Tennessee Tech 34-14. The junior helped the Gamecocks secondary hold TTU to just 8-of-23 passing for 99 yards. The defensive unit also had four sacks, eight tackles-for-loss and an interception in the victory.

Jordan Berry, P • Sr., 6-5, 205 • Essendon, Victoria, Australia • Eastern Kentucky
Berry averaged 59.3 yards on three punts and scored his first collegiate touchdown as Eastern Kentucky won 31-7 at Southeast Missouri. The senior punted three times for 179 yards, including a 76-yarder in the first quarter that was just two yards shy of the ECU single-game record and his second punt of 75 or more yards this season. In the second quarter he was the holder as ECU lined up for a 42-yard field goal attempt; he took the snap and ran 25 yards untouched for a touchdown that put the Colonels up 24-0.

NEWCOMER

Jeff LePak, WR • R-Jr., 6-6, 222 • Belton, Texas • Eastern Illinois
LePak, the transfer from Baylor was one of three Eastern Illinois receivers to finish with 100 or more receiving yards (the second time that has happened in EIU history as the No. 2 ranked Panthers went on the road to beat No. 21 Tennessee State, who had entered the game with the No. 2 defense in the FCS. LePak caught four passes for 112 yards and two touchdowns in the victory. He hauled in a 34-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter to put the Panthers up 21-3 and added a 25-yard score midway through the fourth quarter to make the margin 34-10. LePak also caught a 54-yard Hail Mary pass at the goal line right before halftime, but his momentum kept him half a yard out of the end zone.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Berry Named National Specialist of the Week (Oct. 28): Eastern Kentucky senior punter **Jordan Berry** was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network on Oct. 28 after a win over Southeast Missouri. Berry averaged 59.3 yards on three punts, including a long of 76 yards, and also scored in first collegiate touchdown. In the second quarter he was the holder as EKU lined up for a 42-yard field goal attempt; he took the snap and ran 25 yards untouched for a touchdown to put his team up by 24 points.

Ninth-Biggest OVC Crowd Watches EIU/TSU Game: The Tennessee State/Eastern Illinois game at LP Field on Oct. 26 was played in front of 22,157 fans, which marked the ninth-largest crowd to witness a football game between two OVC teams.

Garoppolo Sets OVC Career Touchdown Passes, Passing Yardage, Total Offense and Total Attempts Records: Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** continues to etch his name in the OVC record book, breaking the OVC's career records for touchdown passes and passing yards on Sept. 28 against Eastern Kentucky. The senior tossed his 86th touchdown pass to break the previous record of 85 held by former EIU All-American and current Dallas Cowboy quarterback Tony Romo. Garoppolo now has 100 career touchdown passes, which ranks 13th in NCAA FCS history. He also broke the OVC career record for passing yards, passing the old mark of 9,990 yards by Murray State's Casey Brockman; Garoppolo now has 11,251 passing yards, which ranks 16th in FCS history. On Oct. 19 Garoppolo set the OVC career total yards mark, passing the former record held by Brockman; Garoppolo now has 11,128 yards of total offense, which is 22nd in NCAA history. He set the OVC career passing attempts record on Oct. 26, passing the previous mark of 1,407 held by Morehead State's Chris Swartz (1987-90); Garoppolo now has 1,432 pass attempts. Through eight games this season the senior has 35 passing touchdowns (first among all Division I players both FBS or FCS) and 3,145 passing yards (which leads all FCS players).

Garoppolo Sets OVC Single-Season Passing Touchdowns Mark: After previously breaking Tony Romo's OVC career passing touchdown mark earlier in the season, Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** broke another Romo record on Oct. 26. The senior threw four touchdown passes in a victory over nationally-ranked Tennessee State, moving his season total to 35, and passing the mark of 34 established by Tony Romo in 2002 (the year he won the Walter Payton Award).

Lora Sets OVC Career Receptions Record; Now 10th in NCAA History: Eastern Illinois senior All-American wide receiver **Erik Lora** set the OVC career receptions record in the Panthers victory over nationally-ranked Illinois State on Sept. 14. Lora broke the 43-year old record held by Austin Peay's Harold "Red" Roberts who caught 232 passes from 1967-70. Lora, who also owns the OVC record for receptions in a game (21) and a season (136), now has 284 career receptions, which ranks 10th in NCAA FCS history. Although it is unlikely he will set the NCAA record of 395 (he is 111 away), he is just 33 catches away from ranking second in FCS history (that mark is 317 held by Jacquay Nunally of Florida A&M). Lora also now ranks second in OVC history for receiving yards (3,495) and is just 408 yards away from the record.

OVC Teams in the Top 25: Eastern Illinois remained No. 2 in both the Sports Network and FCS Coaches Top 25 polls following its win over nationally-ranked Tennessee State last week. The Panthers are the first OVC team to be ranked No. 2 since Jacksonville State was second in the polls on Oct. 25 and Nov. 1, 2010. The ranking for EIU is the highest since the team was also ranked No. 2 nationally in 2002 when Tony Romo was the team's starting quarterback. No OVC team has been ranked No. 1 in the polls since Tennessee State was No. 1 in the final regular season poll of the 1999 season. Tennessee State fell to No. 23 in the Sports Network poll and No. 24 in the FCS Coaches poll following its loss to No. 2 Eastern Illinois last week. Jacksonville State received votes in both major polls while UT Martin and Eastern Kentucky picked up votes in only the Sports Network poll.

Murray State's Powell Only Division I Player With Two 300-Plus All-Purpose Yard Games in 2013: Murray State senior **Walter Powell** is the only player in Division I (FBS or FCS) with two 300-plus all-purpose yard games in 2013. Powell had 306 all-purpose yards in a victory over Missouri State on Sept. 14 and added 310 all-purpose yards in a victory over Tennessee Tech on Oct. 5. As a junior Powell ranked second nationally in all-purpose yards (193.0 yards/game); this season Powell ranks 10th nationally (151.75 yards/game).

EKU's Berry, UTM's Satterfield and JSU's Thomas Earn National Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 9: Eastern Kentucky punter **Jordan Berry** and UT Martin's **James Satterfield** were named National Punters of the Week and Jacksonville State's **Griffin Thomas** was named National Placekicker of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week 9 of the 2013 season. Berry averaged 59.3 yards/punt on three punts, including a long of 76 yards, and also took a snap and scored a 25-yard touchdown on a fake field goal attempt. Satterfield averaged 52.7 yards/punt on three attempts, including a long of 58 and two inside the 20-yard line. Thomas connected on field goals of 44 and 47 yards in his team's win over Tennessee Tech. In addition to that trio, 10 other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferrals in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

NCAA Attendance Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA FCS attendance leaders, Jacksonville State is seventh nationally with an average of 17,975 fans per game.

Eastern Illinois Knocks Off FBS Foe San Diego State in Week 1; Jacksonville State Tops FBS Georgia State in Week 4: Week 1 of the 2013 season saw eight teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FBS) defeat teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) including Eastern Illinois thrashing defending Mountain West Conference Champion San Diego State 40-19. The 21-point margin of victory was the second largest for an OVC team ever over a FBS squad (the largest was a 24-point win by Eastern Kentucky over Louisville in 1985). In week four (Sept. 21), Jacksonville State knocked off first-year FBS opponent Georgia State 32-26 in overtime. It marked the first time since the 1987 season that OVC teams had won multiple FBS games in the same year (that season

Southeast Missouri's Washington Ties OVC and NCAA Record With 99-Yard Rush: Southeast Missouri sophomore running back **Lewis Washington** tied the OVC and NCAA records for longest rush when he raced 99 yards for a touchdown against Tennessee State on Oct. 5. He became just the 10th player in FCS history to achieve the feat since the subdivision formed in 1978. He is the second OVC player to achieve the feat, joining Eastern Kentucky's Bobby Washington who had the rush against Murray State in the 2007 season.

Jacksonville State Ties FCS Record By Playing in Three-Straight Overtime Games: Jacksonville State played in three-straight overtime games from Sept. 14-28. The Gamecocks topped North Alabama (Sept. 14) and Georgia State (Sept. 21) before falling to Murray State (Sept. 28). That tied the Division I all-time record for most consecutive overtime contests, equaling a mark by Penn in 2006 (no FBS team has ever played in three-straight).

Jacksonville State Ties NCAA Record For Most 100 Yard Rushers in a Game: When Jacksonville State had four players rush for 100 yards or more against Jacksonville University on Sept. 7, the Gamecocks tied the Division I (FBS and FCS) record for that feat. The record had been done seven times previously including Arizona State (1951), Texas (1969), Alabama (1973), Army (1984), Nebraska (2001), Nevada (2009), Arkansas State (2013). There is no NCAA record of a team from the FCS achieving the feat prior to JSU accomplishing it. The four JSU players over 100 yards were **Troymaine Pope** (160), **Miles Jones** (138), **Eli Jenkins** (128) and **DaMarcus James** (105).

Murray State Establishes OVC Record for Points Scored in a Half: With its 62-point first half explosion over Campbellsville on Sept. 7, Murray State established a new OVC record for most points

scored in a half. The Racers scored 41 points in the first quarter and added 21 points in the second quarter to break the previous record of 49. That old record had been achieved three times: Eastern Kentucky (1981), UT Martin (2007) and Murray State (2012).

Three OVC Players Remain on Updated Walter Payton Watch List: Three Ohio Valley Conference players were among the 20 players nationally named to the updated Walter Payton Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. The players, who were all on the preseason list released in July, are Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo**, Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** and Murray State wide receiver/return specialist **Walter Powell**. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. Last season the OVC has four finalists for the award with Lora finishing fourth, the highest finish for an OVC player since EIU's Tony Romo won the award in 2002. The three selections this preseason for the OVC ranked tied for second (along with the Southern Conference) among FCS conferences; the Missouri Valley Football Conference had four total selections on the list. The Payton Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The top three vote-getters will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation.

TSU's Godbolt Remains on Updated Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** is one of 20 players nationally on the updated Buck Buchanan Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. He was also on the initial list which was released in July. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, is presented annually to the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The Buchanan Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The winner will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation on Dec. 16.

EKU's Borders Named to Jerry Rice Award Watch List: Eastern Kentucky redshirt freshman **Devin Borders** has been named to the initial Jerry Rice Award Watch List by the Sports Network. The award, now in its third season, is given to the top first-year player in the FCS (true or redshirt freshman) and named after the NFL Hall of Famer who played collegiately at the FCS level (Mississippi Valley State). Borders is one of 20 players on the watch list. The Rice Award will be voted on by a national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The Rice Award Watch List can undergo revision during the season. The winner will be announced at The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation Dec. 16 in Philadelphia.

NCAA Division I Playoff Information: This season marks the first of an expanded 24-team playoff for NCAA Division I teams. In 2010 the FCS Playoffs expanded from 16 teams to 20 teams, the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. This year the top eight seeds will receive byes to the second round while the first round will feature 16 teams in eight total matchups. For the first time the Pioneer League will receive an automatic bid to the playoffs (bringing the number of auto bids to 11). For the fourth-straight year the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at FC Dallas Stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 4 (1 p.m. CT, ESPN2). The playoff field will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 24.

Sgt. York Trophy Enters Seventh Season in 2013: The Sgt. York Trophy is a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four football-playing OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the OVC announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). In 2007 Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season (that was the tiebreaker used only for the first year of the trophy series). Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. In 2009 Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games and in 2010 UT Martin became the third-straight OVC team to go 3-0 and win the trophy in claiming its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech shared the title (TSU went home with the trophy) while Tennessee State and UT Martin shared the title in 2012 (TSU once again took home the actual trophy). The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring.

Four OVC Student-Athletes Named Semifinalists for William V. Campbell Trophy: Four OVC student-athletes are among the 170 semifinalist named for the 2013 William V. Campbell Trophy which recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation. The four student-athletes are Austin Peay senior offensive lineman **Ben Stansfield**, Eastern Illinois senior kicker **Cameron Berra**, Eastern Kentucky senior linebacker **Ichiro Vance** and Tennessee Tech senior offensive lineman **James Normand**. The list was announced by the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame and are part of the 2013 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards. The 170 semifinalists represent the most ever since 2006 when the NFF increased the nomination standards to require a minimum cumulative 3.2 GPA. Of the semifinalists, 46 were from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The class is selected each year by the NFF Awards Committee, which is comprised of a nationally recognized group of media, College Football Hall of Famers and athletics administrators. The NFF Awards Committee will select up to 16 finalists, and the results will be announced via a national press release on Thursday, October 31. Each finalist

will receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship and they will vie for the 2013 William V. Campbell Trophy. Each of the 16 members of the 2013 National Scholar-Athlete Class will also travel to New York City to be honored Dec. 10 during the 56th NFF Annual Awards Dinner at the Waldorf-Astoria where their accomplishments will be highlighted in front of one of the most powerful audiences in all of sports. One member of the class will also be announced live at the event as the winner of the William V. Campbell Trophy.

Powell Named National Specialist of the Week (Oct. 7): Murray State senior **Walter Powell** was named the National Specialist of the Week by the College Sporting News following his performance against Tennessee Tech on Oct. 5. Powell returned a punt 88 yards for a touchdown (he returned a kickoff for a touchdown earlier this season) and finished the game with 310 all-purpose yards (including catching eight passes for 177 yards and two scores), his second 300-plus all-purpose yard output of the career. In the process he became Murray State's all-time leader in touchdowns.

Johnson Named National Specialist of the Week (Sept. 30): Tennessee Tech senior defensive lineman **Jordan Johnson** was named the National Specialist All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Sept. 30 after playing a key role in TTU's 38-37 win over Indiana State. After Indiana State had scored the first touchdown on the night, Johnson blocked the point after attempt and that single point proved to be the difference in the game. Later in the quarter Johnson rejected a 20-yard field goal attempt by the Sycamores which was scooped up by teammate James Hugueley and returned 87 yards for a touchdown to give Tech a 10-6 advantage.

Jude Named National Freshman of the Week (Sept. 23): Eastern Kentucky redshirt freshman running back **JJ Jude** was named National Co-Freshman of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 23 after his performance against Morehead State. Jude carried the ball 33 times for 195 yards and four touchdowns as ECU won 56-24. The four rushing touchdowns tied an ECU single-game record. Jude carried the ball 33 times (and averaged 5.9 yards/carry) after carrying the ball only 19 times in the first three games of the season.

Garoppolo Named National Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 16): Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named National Offensive Player of the Week by both the Sports Network and College Sporting News on Sept. 16 for his performance in a convincing victory over No. 16 Illinois State. It marked the second-straight week he earned the honor from College Sporting News. Garoppolo completed 26-of-41 passes for 480 yards and seven touchdowns (six in the first half) as EIU won 57-24 over its rival. The seven touchdown passes for the game broke the school record previously held by Tony Romo and Jeff Christensen (Garoppolo's high school quarterback coach).

Thomas Named National Specialist of Week (Sept. 16): Jacksonville State senior kicker **Griffin Thomas** was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 16 after hitting five field goals in JSU's double overtime victory over North Alabama. The five field goals set a new Jax State record while his 16 points tied the school record for points by a kicker. The senior started the day by connecting on a 50-yarder in the first quarter, becoming just the third player in Gamecock history to kick a 50-yard or longer field goal. Thomas added a 42-yard field goal in the second quarter and a 44-yarder with three minutes to go in the fourth quarter. His 26-yard field goal in the first overtime forced to second extra period where he nailed the game-winner.

Garoppolo Named National Offensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News (Sept. 9): Eastern Illinois senior quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo was named National Offensive All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Sept. 9 for his play against Southern Illinois. Garoppolo completed 34-of-56 passes for 440 yards and four touchdowns as No. 14 Eastern Illinois topped rival SIU 40-37 in double overtime on Saturday. The 440 passing yards are the fifth-best in EIU single-game history, while his 442 yards of total offense was the fourth-most in EIU history.

Bell Named National Defensive Player of the Week by Sports Network (Sept. 9): UT Martin junior linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 9 for his play against Boise State. Bell had six tackles (5 solo) including 5.0 tackles-for-loss (for a loss of 26 yards) against the Broncos. He also added a pair of sacks, forced two fumbles and had a fumble recovery.

McNulty Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 2): Eastern Illinois senior defensive back **Alex McNulty** was named National Co-Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network and National Defensive All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News on Sept. 2 for his efforts in EIU's 21-point victory over Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe San Diego State. The senior picked off two passes and returned them for a total of 50 yards including setting up EIU's final touchdown of the night in the fourth quarter. He also added five tackles, a tackle-for-loss and had two pass break-ups. He was part of a defensive unit that limited the Aztecs to just 19 points (1 touchdown, 4 field goals).

SEMO's Davis and Elias Earn National Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 8: Southeast Missouri's **Spencer Davis** was named the National Kick Returner of the Week while the Redhawks Justin Elias was named National Punt Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week 8 of the 2013 season. Davis returned a kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown while Elias returned a blocked punt 29 yards for a score in a game against nationally-ranked Eastern Illinois. In addition to that duo, eight other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

TTU's Zinchini Named National Punter of the Week From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 7: Tennessee Tech's **Chad Zinchini** was named National Punter of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following his performance in week 7 of the 2013 season. Garoppolo, Powell and Thomas Earn National Weekly Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 3: Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named National Performer of the Week (and National Quarterback of the Week) by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following his performance in week three of the 2013 season. In addition Murray State's **Walter Powell** was named National All-Purpose Performer of the Week and National Kickoff Returner of the Week while Jacksonville State kicker **Griffin Thomas** was named National Placekicker of the Week. Garoppolo had 480 passing yards and seven touchdowns in his team's convincing victory over nationally-ranked Illinois State. Powell accounted for 306 all-purpose yards, catching 11 passes for 155 yards and four touchdowns (including the game-winner with 24 seconds remaining) and also returning a kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown. Thomas kicked five field goals as JSU topped North Alabama in double overtime. In addition to the duo, 15 other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

Bell Earns National Defensive Performer of the Week, Stevenson National Kickoff Returner of the Week Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 2: UT Martin junior linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Performer of the Week (and National Linebacker of the Week) while Tennessee State junior **Martine Stevenson** was named National Kickoff Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week two of the 2013 season. Bell had six tackles, 5.0 tackles-for-loss, 2.0 sacks, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery in UT Martin's game at FBS foe Boise State. Stevenson returned a kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown in TSU's road win over Florida A&M. In addition to the duo, nine (9) other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

Vanlier and Little Share National Punt Returner of the Week Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 1: Tennessee Tech sophomore **Ladarius Vanlier** and Eastern Illinois sophomore **Shepard Little** were each named the National Punt Returners of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week one of the 2013 season. Vanlier returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown as Tennessee Tech routed Cumberland University while Little returned a punt 60 yards for a touchdown to push EIU to a victory over FBS opponent San Diego State. In addition to the duo, six (6) other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

A Look at the Coaches: Seven of the nine head coaches from last season return to their schools in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. The only newcomers are Austin Peay's **Kirby Cannon** and Jacksonville State's **Bill Clark**. Southeast Missouri's **Tony Samuel** and UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** are now the longest tenured active coaches, each entering the eighth seasons at their respective schools. Clark and TSU's **Rod Reed** are currently the only OVC football coaches serving as head coaches at their alma maters.

A Brother Coaching Duo: This season Tennessee Tech head coach **Watson Brown** and his brother Mack Brown (the head coach at Texas) could become the winningest set of brothers in NCAA Division I history. After week six of the 2013 season the duo has 360 victories (235 by Mack, 125 by Watson) which trails only Bill and Vince Dooley (362 total wins) on the all-time list.

Preseason Forecasts: For the first time since 2007, Eastern Illinois was picked as the preseason favorite in the OVC. The defending champion Panthers picked up 12 of a possible 18 first-place votes to top the poll with 122 points. Eastern Kentucky was second (114 points, 4 first-place votes) while Tennessee State ranked third (90 points, 2 first-place votes). The poll was rounded out by Jacksonville State (87), UT Martin (78), Murray State and Tennessee Tech (tied with 53 points), Southeast Missouri (35) and Austin Peay (16). Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 35 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 13 times (37.1%). After eight years of not picking the champion right (2003-2010), the 2011 preseason poll picked the right champion after the league finished in a three-way tie.

EIU's Lora and TSU's Godbolt Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** was named 2013 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** was tabbed OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Tennessee State led the way with seven selections on the preseason team while Eastern Illinois had six and Eastern Kentucky had four. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (11 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included 10 players who were second-team selections in 2012. Of the 27 total selections, 19 were seniors and eight were juniors.

NFL Connections: As of September 30, there are 14 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters (8 active, 4 practice squad members and 2 on IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now with the Denver Broncos. Eight of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the eighth year the OVC has streamed live events, but second year the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2013 season marks the seventh of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play in 2007. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games while Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy. UT Martin made it three straight years with the winning team going 3-0, completing the perfect season in 2010 to win its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech finished in a tie for the Trophy (2-1) and were declared co-champions. Tennessee State, however, will take home the actual trophy since they had gone the most seasons without winning it (2008, compared to 2009 for TTU).

Last year TSU held on to the trophy by finishing 2-1 and winning the tiebreaker with UT Martin.

If TSU tops Austin Peay on Nov. 9, it will claim the trophy outright; a loss and they would share the championship with UT Martin but still take home the trophy due to tiebreaker rules.

GAME NOTES: Fresh off a win over Tennessee State, the No. 2 ranked defense in the FCS, Eastern Illinois returns home to host Tennessee Tech. The Panthers enter the game undefeated and in first place in the OVC while Tennessee Tech is in search of its first OVC win of the season. Eastern Illinois has won six of the last eight in the series, although Tennessee Tech came out on top in each the 2010 and 2011 seasons. Last year the game was tied at 17 midway through the third quarter before back-to-back touchdown pushed Eastern Illinois out to the lead for good. After Tech tied the game on a Darian Stone to Da'Rick Rogers touchdown pass, Jimmy Garoppolo needed just two plays to hook up with Chris Wright for a 73-yard touchdown strike. Garoppolo finished the day with 376 passing yards and three touchdowns while Stone threw for 153 and rushed for 119 yards. Jourdan Wickliffe had 13 tackles and an interception for the Panthers while Tra'Darius Goff had 12 stops for Tech.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech dropped its fourth-straight game on Saturday, falling behind 17-0 to Jacksonville State on its way to a 34-14 loss. The Golden Eagles did have its starting quarterback Darian Stone back in the lineup after missing time due to an injury. Stone threw for 99 yards and a touchdown and rushed for a team-high 79 net yards (after being sacked four times for -30 yards). Ladarius Vanlier added 62 yards on the ground as Tech finished the game with 181 rushing yards, its highest output against a Division I team this season. Punter Chad Zinchini averaged 46.1 yards/punt on eight attempts, including a long of 58 yards and three downed inside the JSU 20-yard line. After falling behind 24-7 at halftime, the Tech defense played better in the second half, limiting JSU to just 140 yards. Tra'Darius Goff finished the game with a career-high 16 tackles while Marty Jones added 10 tackles, including 2.5 tackles-for-loss.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois took the No. 1 offense in the nation to Nashville and was able to top the No. 2 defense (Tennessee State) by a 34-16 margin to improve to 4-0 in OVC play. EIU finished the game with 567 yards of total offense, 200 more than TSU had allowed in a game this season. Senior Jimmy Garoppolo had another great game, passing for 410 yards and four touchdowns in the victory. Garoppolo leads all FCS players with 3,145 yards and all Division I players (FBS and FCS) with 35 passing touchdowns. His final touchdown of the day pushed him past former EIU and current Dallas Cowboy quarterback Tony Romo for the OVC single-season mark; Romo set the previous record of 34 in 2002 on his way to the Walter Payton Award. Garoppolo also set the OVC career passing attempts record in the game. Senior wide receiver Erik Lora pulled in 10 catches for 105 yards to move into 10th place on the NCAA FCS career receptions list (284). Keiondre Gober caught six passes for 128 yards and two scores and Jeff LePak caught four passes for 112 yards and two touchdowns (in earning OVC Newcomer of the Week honors). It marked the second time in EIU history the team had three receivers with 100-plus receiving yards in the same game. Sophomore Shepard Little became only the second running back to rush for more than 100 yards against TSU this season, carrying the ball 22 times for 138 yards (6.3 ypc) and a 21-yard touchdown. EIU continues to rank first nationally in total offense (592.0 yards/game) but slipped to No. 2 in scoring offense (46.3 points/game - just behind Coastal Carolina's 47.4 points/game).

GAME NOTES: The top two rushing defenses in the OVC will meet in Richmond on Saturday. It figures to be a key game in the OVC race, as both Tennessee State and Eastern Kentucky enter the game just one loss behind undefeated Eastern Illinois in the Conference standings. Eastern Kentucky has dominated the all-time series, leading 20-5; however, it is Tennessee State who has come out on top more recently. The Tigers have won three of the last four in the series. Last year EIU entered the contest at Hale Stadium in Nashville ranked 16th nationally with a 4-1 overall record. But it was the undefeated Tigers who came out on top and vaulted into the Top 25 the following week. The Colonels led 20-10 early in the fourth quarter before a Trabis Ward touchdown cut the margin to four points halfway through the quarter. After getting the ball back the Tigers used a 13-play drive capped off by a Michael German one-yard quarterback sneak with eight seconds left to win the game. German finished the day with 227 passing yards and a touchdown and 19 rushing yards and the game-winning score. Ward added 113 yards on the ground. T.J. Pryor threw for 230 yards for the Colonels, while Matt Denham had 114 rushing yards.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State suffered its first OVC loss of the season and saw its seven-game winning streak come to an end as it fell to the No. 2 ranked team in the country in Eastern Illinois. The Tigers had entered the game with the No. 2 defense in the country but allowed a season-high 567 yards and 34 points to the high-octane EIU offense. The Tigers have now slipped to the No. 6 total defense (297.7) and No. 4 scoring defense (15.8) in the FCS. TSU fell behind 21-3 at halftime but was able to score two fourth quarter touchdowns to pull within the final 34-16 margin. Playing without quarterback Michael German for the second-straight game, Ronald Butler completed 24-of-45 passes for 212 yards and two touchdowns. His favorite target was Lavataie Kelly who caught seven passes for 69 yards. Running back Tim Broughton, who ranks second in the OVC in rushing yards/game (102.0) carried the ball 16 times for 93 yards (5.8 ypc). Defensively Nick Thrasher had 10 tackles and a forced fumble. With the loss TSU slipped to No. 23 in the Sports Network and No. 24 in the FCS Coaches polls.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky won its third-straight game on Saturday, winning 31-7 at Southeast Missouri. Over the three-game winning streak EIU has outscored its opponents 93-20. The EIU rushing attack (which ranks first in the OVC) recorded 213 yards on the ground as redshirt freshman JJ Jude finished the game with 114 yards on 20 carries (including no negative carries). He had a 28-yard rushing touchdown less than four minutes into the contest. It marked the second 100-plus yard game of his season for Jude. Quarterback Jared McClain rushed for 38 yards and a touchdown and also passed for 120 yards and another score; on the season he has nine passing and six rushing touchdowns. Kicker Andrew Lloyd later added a 44-yard field goal, his longest make of the season. The EIU defense recovered two fumbles in the game as redshirt freshman Kiante Northington recorded six tackles, 2.0 tackles-for-loss and a pass break-up. Punter Jordan Berry averaged 59.3 yards/punt on three attempts, including a 76-yarder in the first quarter, which was just two yards shy of the EIU single-game record. Berry also went untouched on a 25-yard run off a fake field goal attempt in the second quarter, marking his first collegiate touchdown.

GAME NOTES: Murray State will travel to UT Martin for the 53rd all-time meeting between the schools located about 50 miles apart. Both teams are coming off victories over Austin Peay, Murray State two weeks ago before its bye week, and UT Martin last week. In recent years when the squads have gotten together there has been an offensive explosion, as the winning team has scored at least 38 points in each of the last 11 meetings. UT Martin has won the last two games and seven of the last eight overall in the series. In last year's meeting the two teams combined for an OVC record 125 points, shattering the previous mark of 10 set by the same two schools. The squads combined for 1,440 yards of total offense as UTM pulled out the 66-59 victory. Skyhawk quarterback Derek Carr set the NCAA FCS single-game passing efficiency record (min. 45 attempts) as he completed 42-of-46 passes for 560 yards and seven touchdowns without an interception (243.78 efficiency). That performance earned Carr National Player of the Week honors. Quentin Sims caught 12 passes for 146 yards and two scores for UTM, while Jeremy Butler added eight catches for 177 yards and four touchdowns. MSU's Casey Brockman completed 45-of-67 passes for 537 yards and an OVC record eight touchdown passes. Walter Powell hauled in 14 of those catches for 196 yards and three scores.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State improved to 3-1 in OVC play with a 31-3 victory over Austin Peay two weeks ago. The Racers were able to limit APSU to just 196 yards of total offense on its way to the victory. Senior Walter Powell became MSU's all-time leader in receiving yards, passing Marcus Harris during the game. Powell finished the day with six catches for 59 yards and a touchdown; he now has 196 career receptions, 21 away from the Murray State career mark. Powell already ranks sixth in OVC history for career receptions. Running back Jaamal Berry led the rushing attack, carrying the ball 22 times for 146 yards (6.6 ypc) and two touchdowns; he also caught three passes for 19 yards. Senior punter Steven Mix earned OVC Co-Specialist of the Week honors after averaging 41.8 yards/punt on five attempts during the game. Mix had four of his five punts downed inside the APSU 20-yard line, including three inside the five-yard line.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin recorded 482 yards of total offense and a season-high 38 points as the Skyhawks went on the road to top Austin Peay, improving to 4-1 on the road this season (and 4-0 against FCS teams on the road). Jarod Neal got the start at quarterback again and completed 21-of-33 passes for a career-high 293 yards and two touchdowns. Neal's favorite target was senior Jeremy Butler who caught 11 passes for 171 yards and two scores. Butler has now caught seven touchdown passes on the season, including six in his past four games; Butler has 17 touchdown catches in 18 career games at UTM. Senior DJ McNeil carried the ball 17 times for 114 yards (6.7 ypc) and a touchdown in the victory; it marked his fourth 100-yard rushing performance of the season (and fifth of his career). McNeil continues to rank first in the OVC in rushing yards/game (105.4) and his 18 career touchdowns ranks fourth all-time in UT Martin history. Senior linebacker Bobby Ellis had eight tackles, including 2.5 tackles-for-loss (for -7 yards) in the victory.

GAME NOTES: Southeast Missouri continues its three-game home stand when it steps out of OVC action for the final time this season. The Redhawks will entertain NCAA Division II opponent Urbana University in the first-ever meeting between the two schools. Southeast is 7-0 all-time under head coach Tony Samuel against non-Division I opponents.

SCOUTING URBANA: Urbana is a Division II schools located in Urbana, Ohio. The Blue Knights compete in the Mountain East Conference and are under the direction of sixth-year head coach David Taynor. Taynor, an alum of the school, took over prior to the 2008 season when the team moved to Division II. The team enters this week having won five games in a row after an impressive 41-5 home victory over Fairmount State. The victory could have been larger much wind chills in the mid-30s and wind gusts near 30 miles per hour slowed preseason All-American quarterback D.J. Mendenhall and the 10th-ranked offense in NCAA Division II. But after a slow start Mendenhall warmed up and finished the day with 224 passing yards and five touchdowns despite not playing a single snap in the fourth quarter. On the season Mendenhall has thrown for 29 touchdowns in eight games. Joe Webb has caught 11 of those scoring strikes. The team is now averaging 450.1 yards of offense and 32.8 points/game this season.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri fell behind 24-0 to Eastern Kentucky last week in eventually losing 31-7 to fall to 1-7 overall on the season. During the game junior Spencer Davis established a new Southeast Missouri career kick return yardage record in the game (2,033), breaking the previous record of 1,938 yards held by David Jackson (1983-86). Davis established the mark with an 18-yard return on the opening kickoff of the day and finished the afternoon with 98 kick return yards and 152 all-purpose yards. Davis ranks seventh in Southeast history for career all-purpose yards (3,362). DeMichael Jackson rushed for 98 yards on 23 carries for the Redhawks while quarterback Scott Lathrop completed 16-of-22 passes for 150 yards and a touchdown. Lathrop has passed for 514 yards and seven touchdowns over his past three starts. Lathrop's touchdown on Saturday went to Paul McRoberts, marking the third-straight game in which he has scored. Overall the Southeast Missouri defense allowed 333 yards of total offense to EKU, the fewest yards it has allowed in a game this season.

GAME NOTES: Jacksonville State will play its second-straight game in the state of Tennessee on Saturday when the Gamecocks travel to Austin Peay. JSU is coming off a victory over Tennessee Tech last week while APSU remains home for its second-straight home game, the first time that has happened this season. The two teams have played 23 previous times with the six most recent (2007-present) coming after the Governors came back to the OVC after playing non-scholarship football. The Gamecocks have won all six of those meetings; Austin Peay last won in 1979. A year ago Austin Peay jumped out to a 14-0 advantage over Jacksonville State a season ago before the Gamecocks went on a 35-2 run to put the game away. The JSU rushing attack played a big part in that, as DaMarcus James rushed for 149 yards and a score and Washaun Ealey added 80 yards and a touchdown on the ground. Ealey also caught four passes for 38 yards and two more touchdowns. The quarterback tandem of Marques Ivory and Coty Blanchard combined for 222 yards and two touchdowns through the air. Austin Peay's Jake Ryan threw for 375 yards and three touchdowns in the loss. JSU's Rashad Smith led all defensive players with 14 tackles and an interception.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State jumped out to a 24-7 lead on its way to a 34-14 victory at Tennessee Tech on Saturday. The win improved JSU to 6-2 on the season as the Gamecocks inched closer to cracking both Top 25 polls. The JSU defense recorded four sacks, eight tackles-for-loss and an interception in the victory. Junior Rashod Byers was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after recording six tackles and three pass break-ups in the win; he is the first Jax State player to win the Defensive Player of the Week award this season. Sophomore punter Hamish MacInnes recorded an 86-yard punt in the game, the longest punt by a player in the NCAA (any division) this season; he averaged 49.2 yards/punt on five punts during the contest. Third-string quarterback Kyle West entered the game in the second quarter after Eli Jenkins was injured and finished the contest 11-of-17 for 138 yards and a pair of touchdowns. That included a 35-yard touchdown pass to Early Calloway in the second quarter and a 26-yarder to Anthony Johnson in the fourth quarter. He helped manage an offense that did not have a turnover in the game. Junior DaMarcus James rushed for 126 yards and a touchdown in the win and also completed a pass for 36 yards (it was his first collegiate pass attempt). It was his ninth career 100-yard rushing game (most among active OVC players) and marked his 12th rushing touchdown of the year, which ranks him seventh nationally. James has now had at least one rushing touchdown in five-straight games.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay suffered its eighth loss of the season, falling to UT Martin on its Homecoming on Saturday. Despite the loss the Governors offense had its best game of the season, racking up 332 yards of total offense and scored a season-high 14 points; it marked the first time this season APSU had scored two touchdowns in the same game and equaled the amount of touchdowns the team had scored in the previous seven games combined. Sophomore running back Omar Williams came off the bench to replace an injured Tim Phillips (who had three rushes for 41 yards in the first quarter) to rush for 122 yards on 25 carries. It marked the second 100-yard performance of the season for Williams. As a team the Gobs rushed for a season-high 218 yards on 37 carries (5.9 ypc). Junior Darryl Clack caught both touchdown passes in the game, both from freshman quarterback Timarious Mitchell. Mitchell was the Gobs third different starting quarterback in the last three games and he completed a career-high 12 passes, was not sacked and did not throw an interception. Ben Campbell punted eight times and now has 61 punts on the season, 21 punts away from the team's single-season record.
