THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Eastern Illinois clinched at least a share of the OVC Championship with its 37-17 victory at Murray State on Saturday...Overall it marks the seventh OVC crown and second in a row for the Panthers...EIU has won six-straight games since its lone loss of the season (to nationally-ranked and undefeated FBS foe Northern Illinois)...EIU WR Erik Lora moved into third-place in NCAA FCS history with 306 career receptions on Saturday; he needs just 11 more to move into second place...EIU QB Jimmy Garoppolo set another OVC record on Saturday when he took over the top spot in the career completions list (951); he passed Casey Brockman's old record of 938...Garoppolo leads all Division I players (FBS or FCS) with 3,843 passing yards and 40 touchdowns this season...Jacksonville State scored seven rushing touchdowns as it dominated Eastern Kentucky by a 68-10 margin...Two of the rushing touchdowns were scored by DaMarcus James, who now has 19 for the season, which ranks third nationally; James is just two rushing scores away from tying the OVC record of 21 held by ECU's Elroy Harris (1988)...There are now four teams tied in the loss column (2) for second place: Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and UT Martin...Tennessee State topped Austin Peay to claim the 2013 Sgt. York Trophy, which is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in Tennessee; it marks the fifth time (and third-straight year) in the seven-year history of the award that TSU has taken home the trophy...Both Tennessee Tech head coach Watson Brown and his brother Mack (head coach at Texas) won on Saturday moving their career Division I win total to 363, the most all-time for a duo of brothers (passing the record previously held by Bill and Vince Dooley)...EIU will try to win the OVC title outright when it hosts Jacksonville State (who will likely be ranked nationally on Monday) in the OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3...In other action UT Martin is at Eastern Kentucky, Southeast Missouri plays at Austin Peay and Tennessee State hosts Murray State.

Marty Jones, FS • R-Jr., 6-1, 190 • Cincinnati, Ohio • Tennessee Tech

Jones had five tackles, forced a fumble and had an interception as Tennessee Tech went on the road and topped Southeast Missouri 41-16 to snap a five-game losing streak. His interception, the eighth of his career, came late in the second quarter as the Redhawks were trying to mount a comeback. He later forced a fumble in the second half. Jones currently ranks second in the OVC with 8.3 tackles/game.

Griffin Thomas, K • Sr., 6-0, 198 • Snellville, Ga. • Jacksonville State

Thomas kicked a pair of field goals and made eight extra points as Jacksonville State topped Eastern Kentucky 68-10 on Saturday. The senior, who leads all FCS players with 2.0 made field goals/game, tied the JSU school record with a 52-yarder early in the game. That is the longest field goal in the OVC this season and his second of over 50 yards. He later added a 33-yarder to increase his season total to 20 (out of 24 attempts), which is just two away from the OVC single-season record. Thomas also tied the Jax State record for extra points in a game (8) and averaged 64.0 yards/kickoff on 11 attempts, including five that went for touchbacks. It marks the second time this season he has been named OVC Specialist of the Week.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Eastern Illinois Claims At Least a Share of OVC Championship: Eastern Illinois has clinched at least a share of the 2013 OVC Championship and can win the title outright with one more victory. It marks the seventh overall and second-straight title for the Panthers who have also won titles in 2001, 2002, 2005, 2006, 2009 and 2012. The seven titles are the sixth-most in OVC history.

Garoppolo Sets OVC Career Touchdown Passes, Passing Yardage, Total Offense, Total Completions and Total Attempts Records: Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** continues to etch his name in the OVC record book, breaking the OVC's career records for touchdown passes and passing yards on Sept. 28 against Eastern Kentucky. The senior tossed his 86th touchdown pass to break the previous record of 85 held by former EIU All-American and current Dallas Cowboy quarterback Tony Romo. Garoppolo now has 105 career touchdown passes, which ranks 11th in NCAA FCS history. He also broke the OVC career record for passing yards, passing the old mark of 9,990 yards by Murray State's Casey Brockman; Garoppolo now has 11,949 passing yards, which ranks 12th in FCS history. On Oct. 19 Garoppolo set the OVC career total yards mark, passing the former record held by Brockman; Garoppolo now has 11,853 yards of total offense, which in 16th in NCAA history. He set the OVC career passing attempts record on Oct. 26, passing the previous mark of 1,407 held by Morehead State's Chris Swartz (1987-90); Garoppolo now has 1,522 pass attempts. On Nov. 9 he set the OVC career completions mark, passing the previous record of 938 by Brockman; Garoppolo now has 951 career completions. Through 10 games this season the senior has 40 passing touchdowns and 3,843 passing yards (both of which are first among all Division I players both FBS or FCS).

Garoppolo Sets OVC Single-Season Passing Touchdowns Mark: After previously breaking Tony Romo's OVC career passing touchdown mark earlier in the season, Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** broke another Romo record on Oct. 26. The senior threw four touchdown passes in a victory over nationally-ranked Tennessee State, moving his season total to 35, and passing the mark of 34 established by Tony Romo in 2002 (the year he won the Walter Payton Award). Garoppolo now has 40 passing touchdowns this year which ranks 9th in NCAA single-season history (16 away from the record).

Lora Sets OVC Career Receptions Record; Now 3rd in NCAA History: Eastern Illinois senior All-American wide receiver **Erik Lora** set the OVC career receptions record in the Panthers victory over nationally-ranked Illinois State on Sept. 14. Lora broke the 43-year old record held by Austin Peay's Harold "Red" Roberts who caught 232 passes from 1967-70. Lora, who also owns the OVC record for receptions in a game (21) and a season (136), now has 306 career receptions, which ranks third in NCAA FCS history. Although it is unlikely he will set the NCAA record of 395 (he is 89 away), he is just 11 catches away from ranking second in FCS history (that mark is 317 held by Jacquay Nunnally of Florida A&M). Lora also now ranks second in OVC history for receiving yards (3,708) and is just 195 yards away from the record; that currently ranks him 21st in NCAA FCS history.

OVC Teams in the Top 25: Eastern Illinois remained No. 2 in both the Sports Network and FCS Coaches Top 25 polls for the fourth-straight week following its win over Murray State. The Panthers are the first OVC team to be ranked No. 2 since Jacksonville State was second in the polls on Oct. 25 and Nov. 1, 2010. The ranking for EIU is the highest since the team was also ranked No. 2 nationally in 2002 when Tony Romo was the team's starting quarterback. No OVC team has been ranked No. 1 in the polls since Tennessee State was No. 1 in the final regular season poll of the 1999 season. After its blowout victory over Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State jumped back into the Top 25 polls for the second time this season. The Gamecocks (who were ranked 24th on Oct. 7) are now No. 22 in the Sports Network poll and No. 23 in the FCS Coaches poll. Tennessee State is receiving votes in both polls while Eastern Kentucky and UT Martin are receiving votes in the Sports Network poll.

JSU's James Nears OVC Single-Season Rushing Touchdowns Mark: Jacksonville State junior running back **DaMarcus James** currently has 19 rushing touchdowns this season, just two away from the OVC single-season record of 21 held by Eastern Kentucky's Elroy Harris (1988). Harris actually had 27 total rushing scores in 1988, but the NCAA statistics rules at the time limited totals to just the regular season (it was changed to include the postseason in 2002). James' 19 touchdowns this season ranks third nationally.

Watson and Mack Brown Set Division I Record for Combined Coaching Victories: As each recorded victories on November 9, Tennessee Tech head coach **Watson Brown** and his brother Mack Brown (the head coach at Texas) became the winningest set of brothers in NCAA Division I history. The duo now has 363 victories (237 by Mack, 126 by Watson) which is one more than Bill and Vince Dooley (362 total wins) on the all-time list.

Murray State's Powell Only Division I Player With Two 300-Plus All-Purpose Yard Games in 2013: Murray State senior **Walter Powell** is the only player in Division I (FBS or FCS) with two 300-plus all-purpose yard games in 2013. Powell had 306 all-purpose yards in a victory over Missouri State on Sept. 14 and added 310 all-purpose yards in a victory over Tennessee Tech on Oct. 5. As a junior Powell ranked second nationally in all-purpose yards (193.0 yards/game); this season Powell ranks 20th nationally (140.10 yards/game).

NCAA Stats Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders (Nov. 10), Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** ranks first nationally in total passing yards (3,843), passing touchdowns (40), passing yards/game (384.3) and total offense (387.6 yards/game), third in points responsible for/game (25.6) and completions/game (27.9) and fifth in passing efficiency (170.1). EIU wide receiver **Erik Lora** ranks first nationally in receiving touchdowns (17) and receptions/game (9.7), second in total receiving yards (1,246), third in receiving yards/game (124.6) and eighth in scoring (11.0 points/game). Murray State's **Walter Powell** ranks fourth nationally in receiving touchdowns (13) while UT Martin's **Jeremy Butler** is seventh in total receiving yards (1,009), eighth in receptions/game (7.5) and ninth in receiving yards/game (100.9). Jacksonville State's **DaMarcus James** ranks third in rushing touchdowns (19) and fourth in scoring (11.4 points/game). Tennessee Tech's **Ladarius Vanlier** is ninth in punt returns (12.9 yards/return) while teammate **Chad Zinchini** is second in punting (45.9 yards/punt). Jacksonville State's **Griffin Thomas** is first in field goals/game (2.0) while Tennessee State's **Jamin Godfrey** is 10th (1.4). TSU's **Daniel Fitzpatrick** is sixth in interceptions (0.5/game), EIU's **Jourdan Wickliffe** is second in forced fumbles/game (0.40) and Murray State's **Tray Carr** is second in fumbles recovered/game (0.5). In the team rankings Eastern Illinois is first nationally in total offense (589.0 yards/game), scoring offense (46.3 points/game) and punt returns (23.0 yards/return), second in passing offense (396.9 yards/game), fourth in tackles-for-loss allowed (3.8/game), fifth in passing efficiency (167.27), eighth in turnovers gained (24) and ninth in kickoff return yardage defense (16.12). Tennessee State is first in blocked punts (3) and third down conversion defense (26.3%), second in passes intercepted (16), third in interceptions thrown (4) and passing efficiency defense (98.75), fourth in total defense (279.6 yards/game), fifth in scoring defense (17.5 points/game), turnovers gained (25) and tackles-for-loss (8.5/game), sixth in blocked kicks (6) and 10th in pass defense (167.5 yards/game).

Jacksonville State is fifth in pass efficiency defense (99.52), sixth in sacks/game (3.3) and 10th in red zone offense (89.4%). Eastern Kentucky is first in blocked kicks (7) and fourth in net punting (39.59 yards/punt).

NCAA Attendance Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA FCS attendance leaders, Jacksonville State is seventh nationally with an average of 17,755 fans per game.

Eastern Illinois Knocks Off FBS Foe San Diego State in Week 1; Jacksonville State Tops FBS Georgia State in Week 4: Week 1 of the 2013 season saw eight teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FBS) defeat teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) including Eastern Illinois thrashing defending Mountain West Conference Champion San Diego State 40-19. The 21-point margin of victory was the second largest for an OVC team ever over a FBS squad (the largest was a 24-point win by Eastern Kentucky over Louisville in 1985). In week four (Sept. 21), Jacksonville State knocked off first-year FBS opponent Georgia State 32-26 in overtime. It marked the first time since the 1987 season that OVC teams had won multiple FBS games in the same year (that season Austin Peay beat Kansas State and Youngstown State topped Bowling Green). OVC teams have now knocked off FBS foes in three of the last four years, as Jacksonville State beat Ole Miss in 2010 and UT Martin beat Memphis in 2012. Overall OVC schools 32-183-1 all-time against FBS foes.

Southeast Missouri's Washington Ties OVC and NCAA Record With 99-Yard Rush: Southeast Missouri sophomore running back **Lewis Washington** tied the OVC and NCAA records for longest rush when he raced 99 yards for a touchdown against Tennessee State on Oct. 5. He became just the 10th player in FCS history to achieve the feat since the subdivision formed in 1978. He is the second OVC player to achieve the feat, joining Eastern Kentucky's Bobby Washington who had the rush against Murray State in the 2007 season.

Jacksonville State Ties FCS Record By Playing in Three-Straight Overtime Games: Jacksonville State played in three-straight overtime games from Sept. 14-28. The Gamecocks topped North Alabama (Sept. 14) and Georgia State (Sept. 21) before falling to Murray State (Sept. 28). That tied the Division I all-time record for most consecutive overtime contests, equaling a mark by Penn in 2006 (no FBS team has ever played in three-straight).

Jacksonville State Ties NCAA Record For Most 100 Yard Rushers in a Game: When Jacksonville State had four players rush for 100 yards or more against Jacksonville University on Sept. 7, the Gamecocks tied the Division I (FBS and FCS) record for that feat. The record had been done seven times previously including Arizona State (1951), Texas (1969), Alabama (1973), Army (1984), Nebraska (2001), Nevada (2009), Arkansas State (2013). There is no NCAA record of a team from the FCS achieving the feat prior to JSU accomplishing it. The four JSU players over 100 yards were **Troyaine Pope** (160), **Miles Jones** (138), **Eli Jenkins** (128) and **DaMarcus James** (105).

Murray State Establishes OVC Record for Points Scored in a Half: With its 62-point first half explosion over Campbellsville on Sept. 7, Murray State established a new OVC record for most points scored in a half. The Racers scored 41 points in the first quarter and added 21 points in the second quarter to break the previous record of 49. That old record had been achieved three times: Eastern Kentucky (1981), UT Martin (2007) and Murray State (2012).

Three OVC Players Remain on Updated Walter Payton Watch List: Three Ohio Valley Conference players were among the 20 players nationally named to the updated Walter Payton Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. The players, who were all on the preseason list released in July, are Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo**, Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** and Murray State wide receiver/return specialist **Walter Powell**. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. Last season the OVC has four finalists for the award with Lora finishing fourth, the highest finish for an OVC player since EIU's Tony Romo won the award in 2002. The three selections this preseason for the OVC ranked tied for second (along with the Southern Conference) among FCS conferences; the Missouri Valley Football Conference had four total selections on the list. The Payton Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The top three vote-getters will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation.

TSU's Godbolt Remains on Updated Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** is one of 20 players nationally on the updated Buck Buchanan Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. He was also on the initial list which was released in July. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, is presented annually to the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The Buchanan Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The winner will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation on Dec. 16.

Southeast's Black Named to Jerry Rice Award Watch List: Southeast Missouri redshirt freshman defensive tackle **Austin Black** has been named to the updated Jerry Rice Award Watch List by the Sports Network. The award, now in its third season, is given to the top first-year player in the FCS (true or redshirt freshman) and named after the NFL Hall of Famer who played collegiately at the FCS level (Mississippi Valley State). The Rice Award will be voted on by a national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The Rice Award Watch List can undergo revision during the season. The winner will be announced at The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation Dec. 16 in Philadelphia. Eastern Kentucky redshirt freshman wide receiver **Devin Borders** was on the initial watch list released but has not on the updated list of 22 released on Oct. 31.

NCAA Division I Playoff Information: This season marks the first of an expanded 24-team playoff for NCAA Division I teams. In 2010 the FCS Playoffs expanded from 16 teams to 20 teams, the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. This year the top eight seeds will receive byes to the second round while the first round will feature 16 teams in eight total matchups. For the first time the Pioneer League will receive an automatic bid to the playoffs (bringing the number of auto bids to 11). For the fourth-straight year the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at FC Dallas Stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 4 (1 p.m. CT, ESPN2). The playoff field will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 24.

Tennessee State Wins 2013 Sgt. York Trophy: With a 3-0 record this season Tennessee State claimed the 2013 Sgt. York Trophy. The Sgt. York Trophy is a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four football-playing OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the OVC announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). In 2007 Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season (that was the tiebreaker used only for the first year of the trophy series). Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. In 2009 Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games and in 2010 UT Martin became the third-straight OVC team to go 3-0 and win the trophy in claiming its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech shared the title (TSU went home with the trophy) while Tennessee State and UT Martin shared the title in 2012 (TSU once again took home the actual trophy). With its win in 2013, TSU has now won the trophy five times in the seven-year history of the award. The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring.

Six OVC Student-Athletes Named to CoSIDA Academic All-District Teams: Six Ohio Valley Conference football student-athletes have been named to the Capital One Academic All-District @ football teams as selected by CoSIDA. The selections were Austin Peay's **Ben Stansfield** and **Iosua Siliva**, Eastern Illinois' **Dominic Pagliara**, Eastern Kentucky's **Jordan Berry**, Jacksonville State's **Max Holcombe** and Murray State's **Christian Duncan**. Each of the six were first-team selections and for making the first-team each

will have his name appear on the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-American. The Capital One Academic All-America football team will be announced on Thursday, December 5. To be eligible for nomination, a student-athlete must have reached sophomore academic standing and have at least a 3.30 cumulative grade point average.

Four OVC Student-Athletes Named Semifinalists for William V. Campbell Trophy: Four OVC student-athletes are among the 170 semifinalist named for the 2013 William V. Campbell Trophy which recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation. The four student-athletes are Austin Peay senior offensive lineman **Ben Stansfield**, Eastern Illinois senior kicker **Cameron Berra**, Eastern Kentucky senior linebacker **Ichiro Vance** and Tennessee Tech senior offensive lineman **James Normand**. The list was announced by the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame and are part of the 2013 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards. The 170 semifinalists represent the most ever since 2006 when the NFF increased the nomination standards to require a minimum cumulative 3.2 GPA. Of the semifinalists, 46 were from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

Bell Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Nov. 4): UT Martin junior linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network and College Sporting News after his dominating performance against Murray State. Bell had 4.5 sacks against the Racers which is the most by any Division I player in 2013 and tied for the most at any level of NCAA football this season. The 4.5 sacks are tied for the most by an OVC player over the last decade. Bell also recorded 16 tackles in the contest which UTM won 45-17, as the team outscored MSU 45-3 after the first quarter.

Lora Named National Specialist of the Week (Nov. 4): Eastern Illinois WR/RS **Erik Lora** was named National Specialist of the Week by the College Sporting News on Nov. 4 following his play against Tennessee Tech. Lora finished the game with 234 all-purpose yards, including returning a punt 80 yards for a touchdown. He also caught three touchdown passes in the game. The 80-yard punt return was tied for the longest in school history. Lora also returned another punt for a touchdown, only to see it called back due to penalty.

Berry Named National Specialist of the Week (Oct. 28): Eastern Kentucky senior punter **Jordan Berry** was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network on Oct. 28 after a win over Southeast Missouri. Berry averaged 59.3 yards on three punts, including a long of 76 yards, and also scored in first collegiate touchdown. In the second quarter he was the holder as ECU lined up for a 42-yard field goal attempt; he took the snap and ran 25 yards untouched for a touchdown to put his team up by 24 points.

MacInnes Named National Specialist of the Week (Oct. 28): Jacksonville State sophomore punter **Hamish MacInnes** was named National All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Oct. 28 for his performance against Tennessee Tech. MacInnes averaged 49.2 yards/punt on five attempts including a school record punt of 86 yards, the longest punt in the NCAA this season (any classification).

Powell Named National Specialist of the Week (Oct. 7): Murray State senior **Walter Powell** was named the National Specialist of the Week by the College Sporting News following his performance against Tennessee Tech on Oct. 5. Powell returned a punt 88 yards for a touchdown (he returned a kickoff for a touchdown earlier this season) and finished the game with 310 all-purpose yards (including catching eight passes for 177 yards and two scores), his second 300-plus all-purpose yard output of the season. In the process he became Murray State's all-time leader in touchdowns.

Johnson Named National Specialist of the Week (Sept. 30): Tennessee Tech senior defensive lineman **Jordan Johnson** was named the National Specialist All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Sept. 30 after playing a key role in TTU's 38-37 win over Indiana State. After Indiana State had scored the first touchdown on the night, Johnson blocked the point after attempt and that single point proved to be the difference in the game. Later in the quarter Johnson rejected a 20-yard field goal attempt by the Sycamores which was scooped up by teammate James Huguely and returned 87 yards for a touchdown to give Tech a 10-6 advantage.

Jude Named National Freshman of the Week (Sept. 23): Eastern Kentucky redshirt freshman running back **JJ Jude** was named National Co-Freshman of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 23 after his performance against Morehead State. Jude carried the ball 33 times for 195 yards and four touchdowns as ECU won 56-24. The four rushing touchdowns tied an ECU single-game record. Jude carried the ball 33 times (and averaged 5.9 yards/carry) after carrying the ball only 19 times in the first three games of the season.

Garoppolo Named National Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 16): Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named National Offensive Player of the Week by both the Sports Network and College Sporting News on Sept. 16 for his performance in a convincing victory over No. 16 Illinois State. It marked the second-straight week he earned the honor from College Sporting News. Garoppolo completed 26-of-41 passes for 480 yards and seven touchdowns (six in the first half) as EIU won 57-24 over its rival. The seven touchdown passes for the game broke the school record previously held by Tony Romo and Jeff Christensen (Garoppolo's high school quarterback coach).

Thomas Named National Specialist of Week (Sept. 16): Jacksonville State senior kicker **Griffin Thomas** was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 16 after hitting five field goals in JSU's double overtime victory over North Alabama. The five field goals set a new Jax State record while his 16 points tied the school record for points by a kicker. The senior started the day by connecting on a 50-yarder in the first quarter, becoming just the third player in Gamecock history to kick a 50-yard or longer field goal. Thomas added a 42-yard field goal in the second quarter and a 44-yarder with three minutes to go in the fourth quarter. His 26-yard field goal in the first overtime forced to second extra period where he nailed the game-winner.

Garoppolo Named National Offensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News (Sept. 9): Eastern Illinois senior quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo was named National Offensive All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Sept. 9 for his play against Southern Illinois. Garoppolo completed 34-of-56 passes for 440 yards and four touchdowns as No. 14 Eastern Illinois topped rival SIU 40-37 in double overtime on Saturday. The 440 passing yards are the fifth-best in EIU single-game history, while his 442 yards of total offense was the fourth-most in EIU history.

A Look at the Coaches: Seven of the nine head coaches from last season return to their schools in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. The only newcomers are Austin Peay's **Kirby Cannon** and Jacksonville State's **Bill Clark**. Southeast Missouri's **Tony Samuel** and UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** are now the longest tenured active coaches, each entering the eighth seasons at their respective schools. Clark and TSU's **Rod Reed** are currently the only OVC football coaches serving as head coaches at their alma maters.

Preseason Forecasts: For the first time since 2007, Eastern Illinois was picked as the preseason favorite in the OVC. The defending champion Panthers picked up 12 of a possible 18 first-place votes to top the poll with 122 points. Eastern Kentucky was second (114 points, 4 first-place votes) while Tennessee State ranked third (90 points, 2 first-place votes). The poll was rounded out by Jacksonville State (87), UT Martin (78), Murray State and Tennessee Tech (tied with 53 points), Southeast Missouri (35) and Austin Peay (16). Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 35 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 13 times (37.1%). After eight years of not picking the champion right (2003-2010), the 2011 preseason poll picked the right champion after the league finished in a three-way tie.

EIU's Lora and TSU's Godbolt Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** was named 2013 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** was tabbed OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Tennessee State led the way with seven selections on the preseason team while Eastern Illinois had six and Eastern Kentucky had four. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (11 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included 10 players who were second-team selections in 2012. Of the 27 total selections, 19 were seniors and eight were juniors.

NFL Connections: As of September 30, there are 14 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters (8 active, 4 practice squad members and 2 on IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now with the Denver Broncos. Eight of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the eighth year the OVC has streamed live events, but second year the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2013 season marks the seventh of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in February or March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play in 2007. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games while Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy. UT Martin made it three straight years with the winning team going 3-0, completing the perfect season in 2010 to win its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech finished in a tie for the Trophy (2-1) and were declared co-champions. Tennessee State, however, will take home the actual trophy since they had gone the most seasons without winning it (2008, compared to 2009 for TTU). Last year TSU held on to the trophy by finishing 2-1 and winning the tiebreaker with UT Martin.

This season TSU once again claimed the championship, winning it outright by going 3-0 in the competition.

GAME NOTES: The OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3 will feature an exciting matchup between first-place Eastern Illinois and surging Jacksonville State. A victory by the Panthers will give it the OVC title outright while a victory by the Gamecocks keep their OVC title hopes alive and will bolster its NCAA playoff resume. The two teams have split the 10 all-time meetings, which began in 2003 when Jacksonville State joined the OVC. Over that time period both teams have been dominant in the OVC, with one of those teams winning the title in seven of those nine years (the only years neither team won or shared the title was 2007, 2008 and 2010). Eastern Illinois won last year's meeting, which was a back-and-forth affair. Jacksonville State jumped out to a 14-0 lead before an EIU field goal just before halftime gave the Panthers a 17-14 advantage. JSU led 28-24 after a Washaun Ealey touchdown with 9:03 to play in the game, but Jimmy Garoppolo led the team on an 11-play, 80-yard drive capped with a 15-yard touchdown pass to Chris Wright with 3:37 to play. JSU would then drive down to the EIU 18-yard line, but time ran out before they could attempt a potential game-tying field goal. Jake Walked rushed for 103 yards for EIU on the day while Erik Lora caught 11 passes for 128 yards. JSU was led by Ealey's 149 yards and three touchdowns on the ground.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State set numerous school records in throttling Eastern Kentucky 68-10 last Saturday. The 68 points were the second-most in school history (and most against an OVC team) while the 58-point margin of victory was the sixth-largest in school history. It also marked the worst loss for EIU in its OVC history. The Gamecocks scored on 11 of 14 possessions and racked up 503 yards of total offense against the OVC's top rushing defense. Eli Jenkins was named OVC Offensive Player and Newcomer of the Week after rushing for 120 yards and three touchdowns on just seven carries; included in that was a 71-yard touchdown run. DaMarcus James added two more rushing scores (he has seven over the last two weeks) and now has 19 on the season, just two away from the OVC single-season record; James currently ranks third nationally in rushing scores and has a touchdown in seven-straight games. Griffin Thomas kicked two field goals (he ranks first nationally with 2.0 field goals made/game) including a 52-yarder, which is the longest in the OVC this season; Thomas has made 20 field goals this season, just two away from the OVC single-season record. Senior linebacker Rashad Smith had nine tackles, 1.5 tackles-for-loss and a sack in the victory. The JSU defense has held its last three opponents to under 300 yards of total offense. JSU moved back into the national polls for the second time this season, coming in at No. 22 in the Sports Network poll and No. 23 in the FCS Coaches poll.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois won its seventh-straight game, topping Murray State 37-17 (after leading 30-0) on Saturday. The win gave the Panthers at least a share of its second-straight and seventh overall OVC Championship. Senior Jimmy Garoppolo threw for 299 yards and a touchdown (his statistical lows for the season) but still guided the Panthers offense (ranked No. 1 nationally) to 607 yards of total offense. Garoppolo now ranks 11th in NCAA FCS history in passing touchdowns (105) and 12th in career passing yards (11,949). He ranks first among all Division I players (both FBS and FCS) with 3,843 passing yards and 40 touchdowns; he is 16 touchdowns away from the FCS single-season record. Sophomore running back Shephard Little rushed for 173 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries while Taylor Duncan added 88 yards and a score. Little (938) and Duncan (809) are on pace to become the first EIU tandem to rush for 1,000 yards in the same season; that has happened 32 times in FCS history (it is unclear yet whether it has happened in OVC history). Senior Erik Lora grabbed 10 catches and a touchdown in the win; the touchdown was the 33rd of his career, moving him into sole possession of first place in OVC history. He now has 306 career catches, which is third in FCS history, just 11 catches out of second place.

GAME NOTES: UT Martin and Eastern Kentucky enter the week in a group of four teams tied for second place and the loser of Saturday's game will be out of contention for the playoffs while the winner will keep their hopes alive for another week. Both teams are coming off losses a week ago. Eastern Kentucky has won 22 of the previous 23 meetings in the all-time series. The Colonels won the first 20 games in the series before the Skyhawks broke through with a 10-7 victory in 2010. Since that game EIU has won both meetings including a 28-16 victory a season ago. In that contest UTM jumped out to a 16-7 advantage early in the third quarter before EIU capped the game with three Tyrone Goard touchdown passes over the final 17:31. Goard caught a 25-yard touchdown from Jared McClain with 2:31 to play in the third quarter and added a 78 and 27-yard score each from T.J. Pryor in the fourth quarter. Goard finished the day with seven catches for 175 yards and four touchdowns while Matt Denham rushed for 94 yards. Derek Carr threw for 223 yards for the Skyhawks who were limited to just 269 yards of total offense on the day.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin built a 6-0 lead over Football Bowl Sub-division (FBS) opponent Memphis and led by that margin until 23 seconds before halftime before allowing a Tiger touchdown. Memphis would then score two late fourth quarter touchdowns to pull out the 21-6 victory. Senior Jeremy Butler caught five passes for 95 yards and now has 1,009 receiving yards on the season; that is just 86 yards away from 10th place on the OVC single-season list. Junior running back Abou Toure led the ground attack with a career-high 113 yards on 17 carries (6.6 ypc). He became the first player to gain 100 yards on the ground against Memphis this season. His day included a 51-yard rush that led to the Skyhawks second field goal of the game. Jackson Redditt converted field goals of 41 and 21 yards in the game but also missed field goals from 29 and 42 yards. Thad Williams led UTM with a season-best 10 tackles while DJ Roberts added seven tackles, 2.5 tackles-for-loss and forced a fumble. Cornerback Camaren Harris had three tackles, two pass breakups and a key interception.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky suffered its worst-ever loss to an OVC opponent on Saturday when the Colonels fell 68-10 to Jacksonville State. The win snapped a three-game winning streak in the series for EIU. JSU scored on 11 of the 14 times they had the ball while the Colonels turned the ball over a season-high four times which led to 17 Gamecock points. Eastern also had a punt blocked and averaged just 1.9 yards/carry on 59 rushing attempts. In its four losses this season, EIU has turned the ball over 12 times; in its six victories the team has turned the ball over only seven total times. The team's lone touchdown of the day came on the opening drive of the second half as quarterback Jared McClain scored on a two-yard bootleg to cap a 20-play drive that took 8:21 off the clock and covered 79 yards. McClain, who was sacked five times on the day, finished with 56 yards passing. Jared Sanders was the team's leading rusher with 45 yards on 12 carries.

GAME NOTES: Saturday's contest marks the final game at Governors Stadium in its current structure. After the game concludes the 67-year old stadium will be cleared and a ceremonial demolition will occur on the stadium's east side. The 16 million dollars project will have a renovated structure that will feature four levels, including offices, dressing rooms, a training room, meeting rooms, a weight room and club seating and skyboxes. The team will honor the "Legends of Governors Stadium" at the game, as the program is inviting back all former football players for a final sendoff to the venue. The meeting is the 18th all-time between the two schools with Southeast Missouri winning the last three and 10 of the last 12 overall. A season ago Southeast Missouri jumped out to a 31-7 halftime advantage on its way to a 48-27 victory. The two teams combined for 875 yards of total offense. Scott Lathrop completed just two passes for 36 yards, but did most of the work with his feet, rushing for 179 yards and two touchdowns. Levi Terrell added 137 yards and two scores as the Redhawks racked up 399 yards of offense on the ground. Jake Ryan passed for 304 yards and three scores for the Governors.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri fell behind 28-3 at halftime to Tennessee Tech and could never rebound in losing 41-16 on Saturday. The game was the final home contest of the season for the Redhawks who close out the year with two on the road; the team honored its 10 seniors prior to the contest. DeMichael Jackson netted 100-plus yards on the ground for the third time this season, carrying the ball 17 times for 104 yards (6.1 ypc) and also catching two passes for nine yards. Jackson currently ranks sixth in the OVC in rushing (65.4 yards/game). Paul McRoberts grabbed six catches for 66 yards and a touchdown; it marked the fifth-straight game in which he had scored a touchdown. For the season McRoberts has caught nine touchdown passes, which ranks tied for third in the OVC. Defensively Tim Hamm-Bey had a season-high 10 tackles (9 solo stops); that marked his total number of tackles over the five prior games. Ben Kargbo added nine tackles; he currently ranks seventh in the OVC in tackles (7.1/game). Travis Sanders came through with 2.0 sacks; he currently ranks 10th in the OVC in that category (0.44/game).

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay dropped to 0-10 on the season with a 31-6 loss to rival Tennessee State at Hale Stadium on Saturday. It marks the first time the program has been 0-10 since the 1997 season; the team needs a win in its final two games of the season to avoid the first OVC team to go winless in a season since 1998 (UT Martin was 0-11; no OVC team has ever gone 0-12). The 25-point margin of defeat was the smallest of the season for the Govs. APSU was limited to just 92 total yards of offense on the day, the first time the team had failed to net 100 yards of offense in a game since the 2008 season (at North Dakota State). Freshman kicker Chase Dunlap connected on two field goals on Saturday, including a career-long of 48 yards. It was the first 40-plus yard field goal for the Govs since the 2012 season finale. Punter Ben Campbell had nine punts in the game and now has 80 on the season, two away from the APSU single-season record (set by Grad Wright in 1990). Quarterback Andrew Spivey, who had missed the previous three games with an injury, returned in the second quarter of the contest.

GAME NOTES: Murray State will travel to Nashville to face Tennessee State at LP Field. The game is the final regular season contest of the season for the Tigers who have an open date next week. TSU is looking for its ninth victory of the season to keep its hopes of an at-large berth to the FCS Playoffs alive. Murray State has won the last five meetings in the series, including the last two by an average of 26 points. A year ago the Tigers entered the game with an 8-1 record and No. 18 national ranking and led 28-20 late in the third quarter. But MSU would rebound to score the final 29 points of the game to pull out a 49-28 victory. Casey Brockman passed for 271 yards and two touchdown passes and rushed for another score, while Jaamal Berry rushed for 163 yards and three scores. MSU finished the game with 555 yards of total offense. Tennessee State was led by Michael German who passed for 273 yards and two touchdowns while Trabis Ward rushed for 111 yards and a score.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State lost its second-straight OVC game, falling 37-17 to the No. 2-ranked Eastern Illinois Panthers. Making his first MSU start, junior quarterback Parks Frazier completed 32-of-50 passes for 255 yards and a pair of touchdowns. The 32 completions and 50 attempts were the most by a player making his first career start for the Racers. Frazier helped MSU go 10-for-16 on third down during the game and allowed the team to go without a three-and-out the entire game. The Racers gained 132 yards on the ground, as Duane Brady led the way with 60 yards on six carries; Jaamal Berry added 44 and Frazier had 28. Senior All-American Walter Powell had nine catches for 74 yards; he currently ranks fifth in OVC history in career receptions (208) and 10th in career receiving yards (2,650). Darnell Smith led the defense with 12 tackles (8 solo) while Sam Small added 11 stops (8 solo) and Corey Addison had 10.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State rebounded from back-to-back blowout losses to top Austin Peay 31-6 on Saturday. The win helped the Tigers improve to 3-0 in Sgt. York Trophy games this season and take home the 2013 Sgt. York Championship. It marks the fifth time in the seven years of the competition that TSU has taken home the trophy; the series is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools from the state of Tennessee. The Tigers defense was dominant, holding the Governors to just 92 yards of total offense on the afternoon. TSU currently ranks fourth nationally in total defense (279.6 yards/game) and fifth in scoring defense (17.5 points/game). In the game Harold Watson had eight tackles, 1.5 tackles-for-loss, 1.0 sacks and a pass breakup while Nick Thrasher added eight tackles and Detorrius Shipley had 3.0 tackles-for-loss (including 2.0 sacks) for a total loss to 20 yards. Freshman quarterback Ronald Butler completed 13-of-21 passes for 167 yards and two touchdowns, including a 28-yarder to Chris Sanders-McCollum early in the first quarter. Senior running back Tim Broughton gained 73 yards on the ground to go over the 1,000-yard mark on the season. Sophomore Telvin Hooks added 66 yards and a pair of rushing touchdowns.
