THIS WEEK'S adidas® OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



CO-PLAYER

Craig Bradshaw, G • So., 6-3, 210 • Ridgetop, Tenn. • Belmont

Bradshaw recorded new career-highs in scoring in each of his three games last week, helping lead Belmont to a perfect 3-0 record and championship of the Springfield Bracket of the Hall of Fame Tipoff. For the week he averaged 20.3 points, 3.7 assists, 3.3 rebounds and 1.3 steals/game while hitting 57.5 percent (23-of-40) from the field, 50 percent (8-of-16) from 3-point range and 77.8 percent (7-of-9) from the free throw line. Bradshaw had 16 points, five rebounds, three steals and two assists without a turnover in 22 minutes against rival Lipscomb. He followed that with 21 points, four assists, two rebounds and a steal in a win over Holy Cross and capped the week with 24 points, five assists and three rebounds in a win over Hofstra. The sophomore knocked down at least two 3-pointers in each contest and currently ranks fifth in the OVC in 3-point percentage (43.3%).

CO-PLAYER

Chad Posthumus, C • Sr., 6-11, 265 • Winnipeg, Manitoba • Morehead State

Posthumus, who ranks third nationally in rebounding (13.3 points/game), had a monster week as Morehead State won a pair of road games and lost a close contest at nationally-ranked UCLA. The senior averaged 12.3 points and 16.7 rebounds/game while hitting 48.1 percent (13-of-27) from the field. He opened the week with a six-point, 16-rebound performance in a road victory over Northern Kentucky. Facing the No. 22-ranked UCLA Bruins, Posthumus had a career-high 21 points and 18 rebounds in 40 minutes of action. He capped the week with 10 points and 16 rebounds in a road victory over Nevada. The center now has four double-doubles on the season which ranks first in the OVC and eighth nationally. On the week he pulled down 20 offensive rebounds and on the season has helped the Eagles to five November victories, a new program record for the month.

NEWCOMER

Jarekious Bradley, F • Jr., 6-5, 220 • Memphis, Tenn. • Southeast Missouri

Bradley earned his second Newcomer of the Week honor of the season after averaging 23.5 points, 8.0 rebounds and 1.0 assists/game and hitting 58.6 percent (17-of-29) from the field and 90 percent (9-of-10) at the line in a pair of Southeast Missouri games. Bradley had 26 points and nine rebounds on 9-of-17 (52.9%) shooting as the Redhawks lost a four-point game at Ball State. He wrapped up the week with 21 points, seven rebounds and two assists on 8-of-12 (66.7%) shooting in a blowout victory over Mid-Continent. Bradley currently ranks third in the OVC in scoring (19.3 points/game).

FRESHMAN

Evan Bradds, G/F • Fr., 6-6, 200 • Jamestown, Ohio • Belmont

Bradds averaged 10.7 points, 5.3 rebounds and 1.3 steals/game while hitting 73.3 percent (11-of-15) from the field and 90.9 percent (10-of-11) at the free throw line in three Belmont victories. He opened the week by scoring a career-high 19 points and pulling down eight rebounds as the Bruins blitzed rival Lipscomb by a 94-64 margin. He was a perfect 7-of-7 at the free throw line in that contest and knocked down 6-of-8 (75%) shots in 20 minutes off the bench. Bradds had seven points, six rebounds and two steals in 27 minutes in a win over Holy Cross and added six points, two rebounds and two steals in 21 minutes in a win over Hofstra as Belmont claimed the championship of the Springfield Bracket of the Hall of Fame Tipoff in Uncasville, Conn. Bradds currently ranks second in the OVC in free throw percentage (93.8%).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: After knocking off No. 11 North Carolina last Sunday, Belmont completed a perfect 3-0 week with a victory over rival Lipscomb and neutral site wins over Holy Cross and Hofstra (in Uncasville, Conn.) to claim the championship of the Springfield Bracket of the Hall of Fame Tip-Off...Belmont begins this week with a 22-game home court winning streak, the longest in Division I (Missouri's 21-game streak is second); the Bruins host Brescia on Tuesday and VCU on Sunday...Morehead State also already set a program record with five wins during the month of November; the Eagles can extend that record with games against Chattanooga and either Gardner-Webb or IUPUI this week...Morehead State won a pair of road games last week (at Northern Kentucky, at Nevada) to move its road win total to three on the season; the Eagles won just four total road games all of last year...Morehead State senior Chad Posthumus is averaged 13.3 rebounds/game this season, a mark that ranks third nationally...Southeast Missouri's Tyler Stone and Jacksonville State's Brian Williams both went over the 1,000 career points scored total last week and joined TSU's Patrick Miller and UT Martin's Mike Liabo as the only active OVC players with 1,000 career points; Belmont's J.J. Mann should be the next person to join the club (980 career points entering this week).

Wins Over Top 25 Teams By OVC Teams: Belmont's win over No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 17 was the first for an OVC team in non-conference play since Murray State (ranked No. 14 at the time) beat No. 16 Saint Mary's at home on Feb. 18, 2012. It was the first road victory over a Top 25 team since the Racers topped No. 20 Memphis 76-72 on Dec. 11, 2011. The last time an OVC team beat an opponent ranked 11th or higher was in 1987 when Austin Peay bested No. 11 Illinois in the NCAA Tournament. Belmont Receiving Votes in Both AP and USA Today Polls: Following its win over No. 11/12 North Carolina on Nov. 17, Belmont is now receiving votes in both major Top 25 polls on Nov. 18. This week (Nov. 25) the Bruins picked up 33 points in the AP poll (unofficially 33rd) while they earned four points in the USA Today Coaches poll (unofficially 44th). Belmont received votes in eight different weeks during the 2012-13 season.

CollegiateInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: After being unranked in the first two polls of the 2013-14 season, after its victory over nationally-ranked North Carolina, Belmont vaulted to No. 5 in the CollegiateInsider.com Mid-Major Poll on November 18 (the No. 25 poll was not yet available). No other OVC teams were ranked in the Top 25, although Eastern Kentucky, Murray State, Eastern Illinois and Morehead State were among the others receiving votes. Wichita State picked up 27 of the 30 first-place votes to be ranked No. 1. Now in its 15th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, WAC and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

Belmont Home Winning Streak: Belmont enters this week with a 22-game home court winning streak which is the longest in Division I. The Bruins host Brescia and nationally-ranked (No. 24) VCU this week.

Eastern Kentucky Ties OVC Single-Game 3-Pointers Made Record: Eastern Kentucky tied the OVC single-game record for 3-pointers made in a game with 20 against Warren Wilson College on Nov. 13. The Colonels were 20-of-39 (51.3%) from 3-point range in the 114-45 victory and tied the record set by Southeast Missouri State a season ago.

Mann Named National Player of the Week by CBSSports.com NBCSports.com (Nov. 18): Belmont senior **J.J. Mann** was named National Player of the Week by both CBSSports.com and NBCSports.com after leading the Bruins to a 83-80 victory over No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 17. Mann scored a career-high 28 points, including three 3-pointers in the final 1:02 as Belmont topped its first Top 25 team since December 2003. Mann scored 11 of Belmont's final 13 points as the team overcame an eight-point deficit with 2:37 to play. He also scored 23 points in a come-from-behind victory over Indiana State earlier in the week. For the week Mann averaged 18.3 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.7 steals/game.

Two OVC Players Named Candidates for Senior CLASS Award: Two OVC men's basketball student-athletes have been named candidates for the 2013-14 Senior CLASS Award. The two players are among 30 male candidates nationally considered for the award (UT Martin's Heather Butler is one of 30 female candidates for the award as well). The OVC selections were Belmont guard **J.J. Mann** and Tennessee Tech forward **Dennis Ogbe**. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The Senior CLASS Award winners will be announced during the 2014 NCAA Men's Final Four® and NCAA Women's Final Four®. Each of the 30 candidate classes will be narrowed to 10 finalists midway through the regular season, and those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one male candidate and one female candidate who best exemplify excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

OVC Enters Season Having Won a Game in Four of Past Five NCAA Tournaments: Despite not winning a game in the 2013 NCAA Tournament, the OVC has won a NCAA Tournament game in four of the past five years. The four-year winning streak came to an end last season, as the OVC had been one of just nine conferences (3 non-BCS) to win a game from 2009-12.

2014 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2014 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 5-8 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. The tournament features eight men's and eight women's teams in a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on the OVC Digital Network. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 7 at 6:30 and 9 p.m. and televised on ESPN2. The championship game on Saturday, March 8 is at 6 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 7 (ESPN3) and the women's championship game is on March 8 at a time TBA (ESPN3).

This marks the 20th time in 21 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the fifth year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. played at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. (March 5-8). It marks the fourth-straight year the tournament has been at the venue and the ninth time the combined men's and women's tournaments have been held at the venue (1994, 1995, 1996, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2013); the men's tournament was also held there in 1967. Beginning in 2011 the Championship switched to a format where the top eight men's and women's teams play in the merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds received two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds received one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round included the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements included upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History; Byrd Ranks 8th Among Active NCAA Coaches: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 24th year at Austin Peay. Loos now has 374 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 456 for his career (which ranks him 28th among Division I head coaches). Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** (who is in his second year in the OVC) has 669 career victories, which ranks eighth among active Division I head coaches (who recently passed John Wooden's 669 wins on the all-time list). Loos and Byrd are two of just seven active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years (the others are Syracuse's Jim Boeheim, Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, Oakland's Greg Kampe, Coppin State's Fang Mitchell and Davidson's Bob McKillop).

Former OVC Players in the NBA: Entering the 2013-14 season there are four former OVC players on NBA rosters. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his third season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. Faried was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team in 2012 and was the MVP of the Rising Stars Game in 2013. The other three players are all rookies this season, including former Murray State All-American **Isaiah Canaan**, former Belmont All-American **Ian Clark** and former Tennessee State standout **Robert Covington**. Canaan and Covington are teammates with the Houston Rockets (Canaan was drafted in the second round while Covington signed a free agent deal) while Clark signed a free agent deal with the Utah Jazz.

The 2013-14 Season: The 2013-14 season marks the 66th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 65 years, 13 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

Southeast Missouri's Stone Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2013-14 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Southeast Missouri State senior **Tyler Stone**, who was named the Preseason Player of the Year. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Austin Peay, Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri having two selections apiece while Belmont, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and UT Martin had one selection each to round out the team. The squad features two players who were All-OVC first or second-team selections last season and three players who were selected to the All-Newcomer squad. The team is comprised of seven seniors and three juniors. Last season Stone ranked eighth in the OVC in scoring (15.5 points/game), fifth in rebounding (7.8/game) and blocked shots (1.3/game) and 12th in field goal percentage (49.2%) while leading Southeast Missouri to a winning overall record and berth in the OVC Tournament quarterfinals. Other selections to the Preseason All-OVC team were Tennessee State's **Patrick Miller**, Austin Peay's **Travis Betran** and **Will Triggs**, Eastern Kentucky's **Glenn Coasey** and **Corey Walden**, Belmont's **J.J. Mann**, Southeast Missouri's **Nino Johnson**, UT Martin's **Myles Taylor** and Jacksonville State's **Brian Williams**.

Eastern Kentucky, Southeast Missouri, Murray State Picked as OVC Preseason Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors Eastern Kentucky has been picked the favorites in the East Division while Murray State and Southeast Missouri State were tabbed co-favorites in the West Division in the OVC for 2013-14. Eastern Kentucky picked up 18 of a possible 24 first-place votes (schools were not allowed to vote for themselves) and a total of 128 points to lead all vote getting. The Colonels were followed in the East by defending OVC champion Belmont, who picked up the remaining six first-place votes and 116 total points. The East Division voting was rounded out by Morehead State (74 points), Jacksonville State (72), Tennessee State (60) and Tennessee Tech (42). The top of the West Division was shared by Southeast Missouri and defending West Champions Murray State. The Redhawks received 13 first-place votes while the Racers picked up the remaining 11 to both finish with 117 total points. The West was rounded out by Austin Peay (90 points), UT Martin (66), Eastern Illinois (58) and SIUE (44).

Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.
