THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Eastern Illinois wide receiver Erik Lora caught three touchdown passes and returned a punt 80 yards for a touchdown in EIU's win over Tennessee Tech; Lora now has 16 receiving touchdowns on the season (tied for first in OVC single-season history) and 32 career touchdown receptions (which is tied for the OVC career record)...Jacksonville State running back DaMarcus James rushed for five touchdowns in the Gamecocks victory over Austin Peay; the five rushing touchdowns ties the OVC single-season record (done four other times)...UT Martin linebacker Tony Bell had 4.5 sacks and 16 tackles in the Skyhawks win over Murray State; the 4.5 sacks are the most by a player on any NCAA level of football in 2013; Bell was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network for his performance...EIU quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo, who already holds numerous OVC passing records, needs just 15 completions to tie the OVC career completions mark; the senior now has 104 career touchdown passes, which ranks 11th in NCAA FCS history...Southeast Missouri redshirt freshman defensive tackle Austin Black was named to the updated Jerry Rice Award Watch List (the award is given to the top freshman in the FCS); Black blocked a potential game-winning field goal attempt in the Redhawks win over Urbana on Saturday... Eastern Illinois holds a one-game lead over Eastern Kentucky (its lone loss coming to EIU), while four other schools have two Conference losses entering this week...EIU is the only OVC team ranked in the Top 25 this week (both Jacksonville State and Eastern Kentucky are right outside the Top 25)...This week's OVC action includes No. 2 Eastern Illinois at Murray State, Eastern Kentucky at Jacksonville State, Austin Peay at Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech at Southeast Missouri.....In non-conference action UT Martin will travel to FBS foe Memphis for the second-straight year; the Skyhawks knocked off the Tigers last season for its first-ever win over an FBS opponent...OVC teams have two wins against FBS teams this season.

**OFFENSIVE**

DaMarcus James, RB • Jr., 5-10, 220 • Demopolis, Ala. • Jacksonville State
James tied the OVC single-game record by rushing for five touchdowns in Jacksonville State's win over Austin Peay. The junior carried the ball 19 times for 102 yards (5.4 ypc) and the five scores and caught two passes for five yards as the Gamecocks won 42-10. The five rushing touchdowns tied the OVC mark also held by Paris Wicks (Youngstown State, 1981), Daniel Williams (Austin Peay, 1996) and Derek White (Tennessee Tech, 2007). He is one of just four players at the FCS level to rush for five rushing touchdowns in a game in 2013. James broke the JSU record for rushing touchdowns in a game and also tied the school record by scoring 30 points. The junior has now scored a touchdown in six-straight games and has 17 on the season, which ranks him tied for third nationally. He also ranks sixth nationally in scoring (11.3 points/game).

DEFENSIVE

Tony Bell, LB • Jr., 6-1, 200 • Memphis, Tenn. • UT Martin

Bell had 4.5 sacks in UT Martin's 45-17 victory over Murray State on Saturday. The 4.5 sacks are the most by a Division I (FBS or FCS) player this season and tied for the most at any level of NCAA football (along with three Division III players). The 4.5 sacks are also tied for the most by any OVC player in the last decade (Tennessee Tech's Marcus Edwards also had 4.5 in 2010). Bell finished the game with 16 total tackles (7 solo), which is tied for the most in the OVC this season. Bell currently ranks fourth nationally in sacks (0.9/game).

SPECIALIST

Erik Lora, WR/RS • Sr., 5-11, 190 • Miami, Fla. • Eastern Illinois

Lora finished with 234 all-purpose yards including returning a punt 80 yards for a touchdown as No. 2 Eastern Illinois topped Tennessee Tech 56-21 on Saturday. After catching three touchdown passes in the game (5, 29 and 5 yards), Lora fielded a punt midway through the third quarter and raced 80 yards for his fourth touchdown of the day. That return tied for the longest punt return in Eastern Illinois history, and was the ninth-longest punt return in the FCS this season. Lora also returned another punt for a touchdown but saw it called back by penalty. The All-American finished the day with 115 yards on punt returns and caught 12 passes for 119 yards. Lora now has 16 receiving touchdowns on the season (the most by any NCAA player this season) and 32 for his career, both of which tied the OVC record in those respective categories. He also now has 296 career catches, which ranks him sixth in FCS history while his 9.7 catches/game this year ranks him second nationally as does his 128.0 receiving yards/game total. Lora also ranks fifth nationally in scoring (11.6 points/game) and is also averaging 21.6 yards/punt return.

NEWCOMER

Omar Williams, RB • So., 5-10, 185 • Memphis, Tenn. • Austin Peay

Williams carried the ball 35 times for a career-high 179 yards (5.1 ypc) in Austin Peay's game against Jacksonville State on Saturday. It marked the most rushing yards for an Austin Peay player since the 2009 season and was the fifth-highest single-game output in the OVC this season. The 35 carries was the most by an OVC player and sixth-most nationally in 2013. In the process he also became the first Governor to rush for 100 yards in consecutive games since the beginning of the 2012 season (Wesley Kitts). In fact Williams, in his first season with APSU after sitting out last season, outgained Jacksonville State, the second-leading rushing squad in the OVC, by himself during the game (179 yards to 175 yards).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Bell Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Nov. 4): UT Martin junior linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network after his dominating performance against Murray State. Bell had 4.5 sacks against the Racers which is the most by any Division I player in 2013 and tied for the most at any level of NCAA football this season. The 4.5 sacks is tied for the most by an OVC player over the last decade. Bell also recorded 16 tackles in the contest which UTM won 45-17, as the team outscored MSU 45-3 after the first quarter.

James Ties OVC Single-Game Touchdown Mark: Jacksonville State junior running back **DaMarcus James** tied the OVC single-game rushing touchdowns record on Nov. 2 at Austin Peay. James scored five times on the ground to tie the mark also held by Paris Wicks (Youngstown State, 1981), Daniel Williams (Austin Peay, 1996) and Derek White (Tennessee Tech, 2007).

Garoppolo Sets OVC Career Touchdown Passes, Passing Yardage, Total Offense and Total Attempts Records: Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** continues to etch his name in the OVC record book, breaking the OVC's career records for touchdown passes and passing yards on Sept. 28 against Eastern Kentucky. The senior tossed his 86th touchdown pass to break the previous record of 85 held by former EIU All-American and current Dallas Cowboy quarterback Tony Romo. Garoppolo now has 104 career touchdown passes, which ranks 11th in NCAA FCS history. He also broke the OVC career record for passing yards, passing the old mark of 9,990 yards by Murray State's Casey Brockman; Garoppolo now has 11,650 passing yards, which ranks 13th in FCS history. On Oct. 19 Garoppolo set the OVC career total yards mark, passing the former record held by Brockman; Garoppolo now has 11,521 yards of total offense, which in 19th in NCAA history. He set the OVC career passing attempts record on Oct. 26, passing the previous mark of 1,407 held by Morehead State's Chris Swartz (1987-90); Garoppolo now has 1,482 pass attempts. Through nine games this season the senior has 39 passing touchdowns and 3,544 passing yards (both of which are first among all Division I players both FBS or FCS)

Garoppolo Sets OVC Single-Season Passing Touchdowns Mark: After previously breaking Tony Romo's OVC career passing touchdown mark earlier in the season, Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** broke another Romo record on Oct. 26. The senior threw four touchdown passes in a victory over nationally-ranked Tennessee State, moving his season total to 35, and passing the mark of 34 established by Tony Romo in 2002 (the year he won the Walter Payton Award). Garoppolo now has 39 passing touchdowns this year which ranks 10th in NCAA single-season history.

Lora Sets OVC Career Receptions Record; Now 7th in NCAA History: Eastern Illinois senior All-American wide receiver **Erik Lora** set the OVC career receptions record in the Panthers victory over nationally-ranked Illinois State on Sept. 14. Lora broke the 43-year old record held by Austin Peay's Harold "Red" Roberts who caught 232 passes from 1967-70. Lora, who also owns the OVC record for receptions in a game (21) and a season (136), now has 296 career receptions, which ranks seventh in NCAA FCS history. Although it is unlikely he will set the NCAA record of 395 (he is 99 away), he is just 21 catches away from ranking second in FCS history (that mark is 317 held by Jacquay Nunnally of Florida A&M). Lora also now ranks second in OVC history for receiving yards (3,614) and is just 289 yards away from the record; that currently ranks him 24th in NCAA FCS history.

OVC Teams in the Top 25: Eastern Illinois remained No. 2 in both the Sports Network and FCS Coaches Top 25 polls for the third-straight week following its win over Tennessee Tech. The Panthers are the first OVC team to be ranked No. 2 since Jacksonville State was second in the polls on Oct. 25 and Nov. 1, 2010. The ranking for EIU is the highest since the team was also ranked No. 2 nationally in 2002 when Tony Romo was the team's starting quarterback. No OVC team has been ranked No. 1 in the polls since Tennessee State was No. 1 in the final regular season poll of the 1999 season. Following back-to-back losses Tennessee State fell out of the Top 25 polls. Both Jacksonville State and Eastern Kentucky (who play this weekend) are just outside the Top 25 and the winner of that game will likely be ranked next week. TSU and UT Martin are also receiving votes.

Murray State's Powell Only Division I Player With Two 300-Plus All-Purpose Yard Games in 2013: Murray State senior **Walter Powell** is the only player in Division I (FBS or FCS) with two 300-plus all-purpose yard games in 2013. Powell had 306 all-purpose yards in a victory over Missouri State on Sept. 14 and added 310 all-purpose yards in a victory over Tennessee Tech on Oct. 5. As a junior Powell ranked second nationally in all-purpose yards (193.0 yards/game); this season Powell ranks 14th nationally (147.44 yards/game).

NCAA Stats Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders (Nov. 3), Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** ranks first nationally in total passing yards (3,544), passing touchdowns (39), passing yards/game (393.8), second in total offense (393.8 yards/game) and points responsible for/game (27.1), third in completions/game (27.89), fifth in passing efficiency (173.1) and eighth in yards/completion (14.12). EIU wide receiver **Erik Lora** ranks first nationally in receiving touchdowns (16) and total receiving yards (1,152), second in receiving yards/game (128.0) and receptions/game (9.7), fifth in scoring (11.6 points/game) and 12th in all-purpose yards (148.11/game). Murray State's **Walter Powell** ranks second nationally in receiving touchdowns (13), sixth in kickoff returns (31.5 yards/return) and ninth in scoring (10.0 points/game). UT Martin's **Jeremy Butler** is sixth in total receiving yards (914), eighth in receiving yards/game (101.6) and receptions/game (7.8) and 10th in receiving touchdowns (9). Jacksonville State's **DaMarcus James** ranks third in rushing touchdowns (17) and sixth in scoring (11.3 points/game). Tennessee Tech's **Ladarius Vanlier** is eighth in punt returns (13.2 yards/return) while teammate **Chad Zinchini** is second in punting (46.0 yards/punt). Jacksonville State's **Griffin Thomas** is first in field goals/game (2.0) while Tennessee State's **Jamin Godfrey** is ninth (1.4). TSU's **Daniel Fitzpatrick** is fifth in interceptions (0.6/game), UT Martin's **Tony Bell** is fourth in sacks (0.9/game), EIU's **Jourdan Wickliffe** is second in forced fumbles/game (0/44) and Murray State's **Tray Carr** is fifth in fumbles recovered/game (0.5). In the team rankings Eastern Illinois is first nationally in punt returns (23.0 yards/return), second in passing offense (407.8 yards/game), total offense (587.6 yards/game), scoring offense (47.3 points/game), third in third down conversion percentage (28.8%), fourth in passing efficiency (169.85), fifth in kickoff return yardage defense (15.96 yards/return) and ninth in tackles-for-loss allowed (4.0/game). Eastern Kentucky is second in net punting (41.66 yards/punt), fourth in blocked kicks (6) and fifth in rushing defense (99.4 yards/game). Tennessee State is first in blocked punts (3), second in passes intercepted (16),

UTM's Bell, EIU's Lora and Little and EKU's Berry Earn National Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 10: UT Martin linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Performer of the Week (and National Linebacker of the Week), Eastern Illinois' **Erik Lora** and **Shepard Little** shared National Punt Returner of the Week honors and Eastern Kentucky punter **Jordan Berry** was named National Punter of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in Week 10 of the 2013 season. Bell had a NCAA-high 4.5 sacks and 16 total tackles in the Skyhawks win over Murray State. Lora and Little each returned punts for touchdowns in EIU's win over Tennessee Tech. Berry averaged 49.2 yards/punt on five attempts including four that landed inside the TSU 20-yard line. In addition to that quartet, four other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

NCAA Attendance Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA FCS attendance leaders, Jacksonville State is seventh nationally with an average of 17,975 fans per game while Tennessee State is 10th with an average of 15,213.

Eastern Illinois Knocks Off FBS Foe San Diego State in Week 1; Jacksonville State Tops FBS Georgia State in Week 4: Week 1 of the 2013 season saw eight teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FBS) defeat teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) including Eastern Illinois thrashing defending Mountain West Conference Champion San Diego State 40-19. The 21-point margin of victory was the second largest for an OVC team ever over a FBS squad (the largest was a 24-point win by Eastern Kentucky over Louisville in 1985). In week four (Sept. 21), Jacksonville State knocked off first-year FBS opponent Georgia State 32-26 in overtime. It marked the first time since the 1987 season that OVC teams had won multiple FBS games in the same year (that season Austin Peay beat Kansas State and Youngstown State topped Bowling Green). OVC teams have now knocked off FBS foes in three of the last four years, as Jacksonville State beat Ole Miss in 2010 and UT Martin beat Memphis in 2012. Overall OVC schools 32-182-1 all-time against FBS foes and have one more game against FBS teams this season (Nov. 9 when UTM plays at Memphis).

FCS Over FBS: So far this season a record 14 teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) have scored victories over teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS).

Ninth-Biggest OVC Crowd Watches EIU/TSU Game: The Tennessee State/Eastern Illinois game at LP Field on Oct. 26 was played in front of 22,157 fans, which marked the ninth-largest crowd to witness a football game between two OVC teams.

Southeast Missouri's Washington Ties OVC and NCAA Record With 99-Yard Rush: Southeast Missouri sophomore running back **Lewis Washington** tied the OVC and NCAA records for longest rush when he raced 99 yards for a touchdown against Tennessee State on Oct. 5. He became just the 10th player in FCS history to achieve the feat since the subdivision formed in 1978. He is the second OVC player to achieve the feat, joining Eastern Kentucky's Bobby Washington who had the rush against Murray State in the 2007 season.

Jacksonville State Ties FCS Record By Playing in Three-Straight Overtime Games: Jacksonville State played in three-straight overtime games from Sept. 14-28. The Gamecocks topped North Alabama (Sept. 14) and Georgia State (Sept. 21) before falling to Murray State (Sept. 28). That tied the Division I all-time record for most consecutive overtime contests, equaling a mark by Penn in 2006 (no FBS team has ever played in three-straight).

Jacksonville State Ties NCAA Record For Most 100 Yard Rushers in a Game: When Jacksonville State had four players rush for 100 yards or more against Jacksonville University on Sept. 7, the Gamecocks tied the Division I (FBS and FCS) record for that feat. The record had been done seven times previously including Arizona State (1951), Texas (1969), Alabama (1973), Army (1984), Nebraska (2001), Nevada (2009), Arkansas State (2013). There is no NCAA record of a team from the FCS achieving the feat prior to JSU accomplishing it. The four JSU players over 100 yards were **Troymaine Pope** (160), **Miles Jones** (138), **Eli Jenkins** (128) and **DaMarcus James** (105).

Murray State Establishes OVC Record for Points Scored in a Half: With its 62-point first half explosion over Campbellsville on Sept. 7, Murray State established a new OVC record for most points scored in a half. The Racers scored 41 points in the first quarter and added 21 points in the second quarter to break the previous record of 49. That old record had been achieved three times: Eastern Kentucky (1981), UT Martin (2007) and Murray State (2012).

Three OVC Players Remain on Updated Walter Payton Watch List: Three Ohio Valley Conference players were among the 20 players nationally named to the updated Walter Payton Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. The players, who were all on the preseason list released in July, are Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo**, Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** and Murray State wide receiver/return specialist **Walter Powell**. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. Last season the OVC has four finalists for the award with Lora finishing fourth, the highest finish for an OVC player since EIU's Tony Romo won the award in 2002. The three selections this preseason for the OVC ranked tied for second (along with the Southern Conference) among FCS conferences; the Missouri Valley Football Conference had four total selections on the list. The Payton Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The top three vote-getters will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation.

TSU's Godbolt Remains on Updated Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** is one of 20 players nationally on the updated Buck Buchanan Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. He was also on the initial list which was released in July. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, is presented annually to the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The Buchanan Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The winner will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation on Dec. 16.

Southeast's Black Named to Jerry Rice Award Watch List: Southeast Missouri redshirt freshman defensive tackle **Austin Black** has been named to the updated Jerry Rice Award Watch List by the Sports Network. The award, now in its third season, is given to the top first-year player in the FCS (true or redshirt freshman) and named after the NFL Hall of Famer who played collegiately at the FCS level (Mississippi Valley State). The Rice Award will be voted on by a national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The Rice Award Watch List can undergo revision during the season. The winner will be announced at The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation Dec. 16 in Philadelphia. Eastern Kentucky redshirt freshman wide receiver **Devin Borders** was on the initial watch list released but has not on the updated list of 22 released on Oct. 31.

NCAA Division I Playoff Information: This season marks the first of an expanded 24-team playoff for NCAA Division I teams. In 2010 the FCS Playoffs expanded from 16 teams to 20 teams, the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. This year the top eight seeds will receive byes to the second round while the first round will feature 16 teams in eight total matchups. For the first time the Pioneer League will receive an automatic bid to the playoffs (bringing the number of auto bids to 11). For the fourth-straight year the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at FC Dallas Stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 4 (1 p.m. CT, ESPN2). The playoff field will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 24.

Sgt. York Trophy Enters Seventh Season in 2013: The Sgt. York Trophy is a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four football-playing OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the OVC announced the creation of the trophy,

which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). In 2007 Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season (that was the tiebreaker used only for the first year of the trophy series). Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. In 2009 Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games and in 2010 UT Martin became the third-straight OVC team to go 3-0 and win the trophy in claiming its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech shared the title (TSU went home with the trophy) while Tennessee State and UT Martin shared the title in 2012 (TSU once again took home the actual trophy). The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring.

Four OVC Student-Athletes Named Semifinalists for William V. Campbell Trophy: Four OVC student-athletes are among the 170 semifinalist named for the 2013 William V. Campbell Trophy which recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation. The four student-athletes are Austin Peay senior offensive lineman **Ben Stansfield**, Eastern Illinois senior kicker **Cameron Berra**, Eastern Kentucky senior linebacker **Ichiro Vance** and Tennessee Tech senior offensive lineman **James Normand**. The list was announced by the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame and are part of the 2013 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards. The 170 semifinalists represent the most ever since 2006 when the NFF increased the nomination standards to require a minimum cumulative 3.2 GPA. Of the semifinalists, 46 were from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

Berry Named National Specialist of the Week (Oct. 28): Eastern Kentucky senior punter **Jordan Berry** was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network on Oct. 28 after a win over Southeast Missouri. Berry averaged 59.3 yards on three punts, including a long of 76 yards, and also scored in first collegiate touchdown. In the second quarter he was the holder as ECU lined up for a 42-yard field goal attempt; he took the snap and ran 25 yards untouched for a touchdown to put his team up by 24 points.

MacInnes Named National Specialist of the Week (Oct. 28): Jacksonville State sophomore punter **Hamish MacInnes** was named National All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Oct. 28 for his performance against Tennessee Tech. MacInnes averaged 49.2 yards/punt on five attempts including a school record punt of 86 yards, the longest punt in the NCAA this season (any classification).

Powell Named National Specialist of the Week (Oct. 7): Murray State senior **Walter Powell** was named the National Specialist of the Week by the College Sporting News following his performance against Tennessee Tech on Oct. 5. Powell returned a punt 88 yards for a touchdown (he returned a kickoff for a touchdown earlier this season) and finished the game with 310 all-purpose yards (including catching eight passes for 177 yards and two scores), his second 300-plus all-purpose yard output of the season. In the process he became Murray State's all-time leader in touchdowns.

Johnson Named National Specialist of the Week (Sept. 30): Tennessee Tech senior defensive lineman **Jordan Johnson** was named the National Specialist All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Sept. 30 after playing a key role in TTU's 38-37 win over Indiana State. After Indiana State had scored the first touchdown on the night, Johnson blocked the point after attempt and that single point proved to be the difference in the game. Later in the quarter Johnson rejected a 20-yard field goal attempt by the Sycamores which was scooped up by teammate James Huguely and returned 87 yards for a touchdown to give Tech a 10-6 advantage.

Jude Named National Freshman of the Week (Sept. 23): Eastern Kentucky redshirt freshman running back **JJ Jude** was named National Co-Freshman of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 23 after his performance against Morehead State. Jude carried the ball 33 times for 195 yards and four touchdowns as ECU won 56-24. The four rushing touchdowns tied an ECU single-game record. Jude carried the ball 33 times (and averaged 5.9 yards/carry) after carrying the ball only 19 times in the first three games of the season.

Garoppolo Named National Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 16): Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named National Offensive Player of the Week by both the Sports Network and College Sporting News on Sept. 16 for his performance in a convincing victory over No. 16 Illinois State. It marked the second-straight week he earned the honor from College Sporting News. Garoppolo completed 26-of-41 passes for 480 yards and seven touchdowns (six in the first half) as EIU won 57-24 over its rival. The seven touchdown passes for the game broke the school record previously held by Tony Romo and Jeff Christensen (Garoppolo's high school quarterback coach).

Thomas Named National Specialist of Week (Sept. 16): Jacksonville State senior kicker **Griffin Thomas** was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 16 after hitting five field goals in JSU's double overtime victory over North Alabama. The five field goals set a new Jax State record while his 16 points tied the school record for points by a kicker. The senior started the day by connecting on a 50-yarder in the first quarter, becoming just the third player in Gamecock history to kick a 50-yard or longer field goal. Thomas added a 42-yard field goal in the second quarter and a 44-yarder with three minutes to go in the fourth quarter. His 26-yard field goal in the first overtime forced to second extra period where he nailed the game-winner.

Bell Named National Defensive Player of the Week by Sports Network (Sept. 9): UT Martin junior linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 9 for his play against Boise State. Bell had six tackles (5 solo) including 5.0 tackles-for-loss (for a loss of 26 yards) against the Broncos. He also added a pair of sacks, forced two fumbles and had a fumble recovery.

McNulty Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 2): Eastern Illinois senior defensive back **Alex McNulty** was named National Co-Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network and National Defensive All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News on Sept. 2 for his efforts in EIU's 21-point victory over Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe San Diego State. The senior picked off two passes and returned them for a total of 50 yards including setting up EIU's final touchdown of the night in the fourth quarter. He also added five tackles, a tackle-for-loss and had two pass break-ups. He was part of a defensive unit that limited the Aztecs to just 19 points (1 touchdown, 4 field goals).

Vanlier and Little Share National Punt Returner of the Week Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 1: Tennessee Tech sophomore **Ladarius Vanlier** and Eastern Illinois sophomore **Shepard Little** were each named the National Punt Returners of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week one of the 2013 season. Vanlier returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown as Tennessee Tech routed Cumberland University while Little returned a punt 60 yards for a touchdown to push EIU to a victory over FBS opponent San Diego State. In addition to the duo, six (6) other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

A Look at the Coaches: Seven of the nine head coaches from last season return to their schools in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. The only newcomers are Austin Peay's **Kirby Cannon** and Jacksonville State's **Bill Clark**. Southeast Missouri's **Tony Samuel** and UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** are now the longest tenured active coaches, each entering the eighth seasons at their respective schools. Clark and TSU's **Rod Reed** are currently the only OVC football coaches serving as head coaches at their alma maters.

A Brother Coaching Duo: This season Tennessee Tech head coach **Watson Brown** and his brother **Mac Brown** (the head coach at Texas) could become the winningest set of brothers in NCAA Division I history. After week six of the 2013 season the duo has 361 victories (236 by Mack, 125 by Watson) which trails only Bill and Vince Dooley (362 total wins) on the all-time list.

Preseason Forecasts: For the first time since 2007, Eastern Illinois was picked as the preseason favorite in the OVC. The defending champion Panthers picked up 12 of a possible 18 first-place votes to top the poll with 122 points. Eastern Kentucky was second (114 points, 4 first-place votes) while Tennessee State ranked third (90 points, 2 first-place votes). The poll was rounded out by Jacksonville State (87), UT Martin (78), Murray State and Tennessee Tech (tied with 53 points), Southeast Missouri (35) and Austin Peay (16). Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 35 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 13 times (37.1%). After eight years of not picking the champion right (2003-2010), the 2011 preseason poll picked the right champion after the league finished in a three-way tie.

EIU's Lora and TSU's Godbolt Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** was named 2013 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** was tabbed OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Tennessee State led the way with seven selections on the preseason team while Eastern Illinois had six and Eastern Kentucky had four. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (11 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included 10 players who were second-team selections in 2012. Of the 27 total selections, 19 were seniors and eight were juniors.

NFL Connections: As of September 30, there are 14 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters (8 active, 4 practice squad members and 2 on IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now with the Denver Broncos. Eight of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the eighth year the OVC has streamed live events, but second year the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2013 season marks the seventh of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play in 2007. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games while Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy. UT Martin made it three straight years with the winning team going 3-0, completing the perfect season in 2010 to win its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech finished in a tie for the Trophy (2-1) and were declared co-champions. Tennessee State, however, will take home the actual trophy since they had gone the most seasons without winning it (2008, compared to 2009 for TTU).

Last year TSU held on to the trophy by finishing 2-1 and winning the tiebreaker with UT Martin.

If TSU tops Austin Peay on Nov. 9, it will claim the trophy outright; a loss and they would share the championship with UT Martin but still take home the trophy due to tiebreaker rules.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Illinois looks to keep its perfect OVC record intact when it travels to Murray State on Saturday. The Racers suffered its second OVC loss last week and are tied with a group of four teams with two Conference losses on the season. Last year Eastern Illinois snapped a two-game winning streak in the series for Murray State with a dramatic 50-49 overtime victory. In that game the teams combined for a NCAA record for combined plays (210), shattering the old record of 196. Eastern Illinois jumped out to a 20-7 lead before Murray State stormed back with 20 unanswered second quarter points to lead 36-20 early in the third quarter. The game was tied at 42 at the end of regulation before Jaamal Berry scored on a one-yard run in overtime to put the Racers on top. Chavar Watkins then caught a nine-yard touchdown pass for the Panthers and head coach Dino Babers decided to go for the victory, as All-American Erik Lora took the reverse handoff and threw the winning two-point conversion pass to Von Wise. Lora was named National Player of the Week for his efforts in the game, catching an OVC record 21 passes for 269 yards and three touchdowns in addition to throwing the winning two-point conversion. Jimmy Garoppolo threw for 393 yards and five touchdowns for EIU while Casey Brockman passed for 423 yards and two scores and rushed for another score for Murray State.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois won its fifth-straight game on Saturday with a 56-21 win over Tennessee Tech. Over that winning streak the Panthers have won by a margin of 33.2 points, with no game closer than 18 points. Senior Erik Lora was named OVC Specialist of the Week after returning a punt 80 yards for a touchdown and also catching 12 passes for 119 yards and three touchdowns to finish the game with 234 all-purpose yards. The three receiving touchdowns pushed his season total to 16 and career total to 32, tying the OVC records in both categories. Lora currently ranks first nationally in receiving touchdowns and yards (1,152) and 12th in all-purpose yards (148.11/game). Quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo passed for 399 yard and four touchdowns in the victory. He leads all Division I players (FBS or FCS) with 3,544 passing yards and 39 touchdowns this season. Garoppolo now has 104 career touchdown passes which is 11th in NCAA FCS history. Garoppolo will likely break another OVC record this week, as he is just 15 completions away from tying the OVC career mark in that category (currently held by Casey Brockman). EIU finished the game with 552 yards of total offense and now ranks second nationally in both total offense (587.6 yards/game - 9 yards behind Stephen F. Austin) and scoring offense (47.3 points/game - 0.4 points behind Coastal Carolina).

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State was tied 17-17 with UT Martin at halftime on Saturday but was outscored 28-0 in the second half in a 45-17 loss to the Skyhawks. The Racers got a defensive touchdown in the first half as T-Ray Malone recovered a fumble in the end zone to put MSU up 7-0. Jaamal Berry would add a touchdown later in the quarter to put his team up 14-0. Berry finished the game with 134 yards on 21 carries (6.4 ypc) in the game. Senior Walter Powell was held in check, grabbing only three catches for 61 yards and netting 53 yards on two kickoff returns; Powell currently ranks 14th nationally in all-purpose yards (147.44/game). Brandon Wicks led the defensive attack with 10 tackles and a fumble recovery. As a team Murray State ranks third nationally in fourth down conversion percentage (86.0%) and eighth in turnovers gained (22).

GAME NOTES: Tennessee Tech will travel to Cape Girardeau this week in search of ending a five-game losing streak and netting its first OVC victory of the season. Southeast Missouri is coming off a come-from-behind victory over Division II foe Urbana University, which snapped a two-game losing streak for the team. Tennessee Tech and Southeast Missouri have split the series over the last four years, with teams rotating victories in opposite years. A year ago it was Southeast Missouri who came out on top with a thrilling 41-38 victory in double overtime. The back-and-forth affair featured over 900 yards of combined offense and was knotted at 31 when Drew Geldbach connected on a 39-yard field goal with 3:58 to play. Both teams scored a touchdown in the first overtime and Geldbach put the Redhawks on top in the second overtime with a 34-yard field goal. The Southeast defense then stopped Tech on a 3rd-and-1 play, forcing a 34-yard Zach Sharp field goal attempt, which he missed wide left, ending the game. Geldbach was named OVC Specialist of the Week for his kicking efforts while Levi Terrell added 171 yards on the ground. Tre Lamb threw for 481 yards and three touchdowns and rushed for another for the Golden Eagles while Da'Rick Rogers caught 18 passes for 303 yards and two touchdowns.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech fell behind 42-7 to No. 2 ranked Eastern Illinois on its way to a 56-21 defeat. The Golden Eagles were out-gained 552 to 281 on the day but closed the game strong with two fourth quarter touchdowns. In place of starter Darian Stone, quarterback Jared Davis passed for 183 yards and three touchdown and rushed for a team-high 22 yards on three carries. The quarterback tandem completed passes to 10 different receivers on the afternoon. That included two passes to Eric Belew, both of which went for touchdowns. Defensively Malcolm Mitchell led the way with nine tackles (7 solo) and a sack for eight yards, while Jay Rudwall added eight tackles and a pass breakup.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri fell behind 21-7 and later trailed 35-31 in the fourth quarter before rebounding to top Urbana 37-35. Starting quarterback Scott Lathrop passed for two touchdowns early in the game but backup Kyle Snyder entered the game and threw two fourth quarter scores to push the team to the victory. The game-winner went to Paul McRoberts (his second touchdown catch of the game) with 37 seconds left in the contest; that played capped an eight-play, 61-yard drive. The Redhawks, however, missed its extra point attempt which left the door open for Urbana. The team drove to the Southeast 33-yard line and attempted a 50-yard kick which was blocked by redshirt freshman defensive tackle Austin Black. Black, who was named to the Jerry Rice Award Watch List last week, was the first Redhawk to block a kick since 2011 and also added two tackles in the game. DeMichael Jackson rushed for 112 yards and a touchdown which marked his second 100-yard rushing game of the season. Peter Lloyd caught four passes (two of which were touchdowns) to total a career-high 109 receiving yards for the game. McRoberts, who caught two touchdowns, now has caught a touchdown in four-straight games.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay will travel to Tennessee State for a Sgt. York Trophy series game on Saturday; the series is contested between the four OVC schools from the state of Tennessee. A victory by the Tigers and they will finish Sgt. York games 3-0 and win the title outright for just the second time (overall they have four total titles - 2007, 2008, 2011 and 2012); a loss and the worse they can finish is in a tie for the trophy. The game is the lone contest of the year on-campus at Hale Stadium for TSU; also known as "The Hole," the venue was home for TSU until 1999 season when the team moved to LP Field to play its games. A season ago TSU played three games at Hale Stadium (APSU, Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee Tech) and were a perfect 3-0 in those contests. TSU holds a 9-6 margin in the all-time series with the Govs, snapping a three-game losing streak a year ago with a 34-14 victory. In that game Michael German threw for 318 yards and three touchdowns and Telvin Hooks rushed for 66 yards for the Tigers while Jake Ryan threw for 271 yards and two scores for APSU.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay is still in search of its first victory of the season after falling to Jacksonville State 42-10 on Saturday. The team is off to a 0-9 start, its first since 1997. The Governors were led by running back Omar Williams who was named OVC Newcomer of the Week after carrying the ball 35 times for a career-high 179 yards. The 35 carries were the most in the OVC this season and the 179 yards were the fifth-most in the league in 2013. Williams actually gained more yards than the Jacksonville State team (175), who had entered the contest as the No. 2 rushing offense in the OVC. It marked the second-straight game Williams had rushed for 100 yards, the first time an APSU player had accomplished that feat since the beginning of the 2012 season. Chase Dunlap added a 34-yard field goal in the game, his first successful field goal since the Murray State game on Oct. 19. Punter Ben Campbell punted 10 times in the game and has now punted 71 times this season, just 11 away from the school single-season record. Freshman linebacker Antonio Turner had 13 tackles in the game, which was a season-high for the Govs. EnRiques Perry added 12 tackles in the game.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: After suffering its first OVC loss of the season last week (34-16 to No. 2 Eastern Illinois), Tennessee State suffered one of its most lopsided losses in school history, falling 44-0 at Eastern Kentucky. The only loss worse in its history was a 49-0 loss to the Colonels in the 2005 season. It also marked the first time the team was shutout since 2010 at Jacksonville State. TSU had season lows in passing (101) and total yards (172) while turning the ball over four times and committed 11 penalties for 109 yards. Tim Broughton, who entered the game with the most total rushing yards in the OVC this season, was limited to just 38 yards on 17 carries. Ronald Butler completed 15 passes for 101 yards but was sacked four times. Despite the last two games the Tigers still rank fifth nationally in total defense (298.4 yards/game) and seventh in scoring defense (18.6 points/game). Nick Thrasher led the way with 11 tackles while Greg Barksdale added 10 stops. Daniel Fitzpatrick picked off his sixth pass of the season which extended the team's streak of forcing at least one turnover to 23-straight contests. This season TSU has 16 interceptions, which ranks second nationally.

GAME NOTES: The most important game in the OVC this weekend may be in Jacksonville where two schools are fighting to stay alive in the OVC Championship hunt. Eastern Kentucky enters the weekend in second place, just one loss behind Eastern Illinois (who topped the Colonels earlier this season). Jacksonville State is one of four OVC teams with two Conference losses and needs a win to stay in the title hunt as well as keep its playoff hopes alive. In the latest Sports Network Top 25, both teams are just outside the rankings as Jax State is unofficially 26th while ECU is 28th. ECU and JSU have had some memorable matchups since the programs first played in 2003 when the Gamecocks joined the OVC. ECU now leads the all-time series 6-4 after winning the last three in a row. Included in those contests were the two teams combining for 86, 100 and 72 points. Two years ago Jax State (ranked No. 18 at the time) led 48-24 after a touchdown with 7:25 to play. At that point ECU quarterback T.J. Pryor took over, leading his team on drives of 64, 58 and 37 yards over the next 6:01 and throwing touchdown passes of 60, 18 and 37 yards to complete the improbable comeback as Eastern won 52-48. The final play of the game, the ECU defense stuffed JSU at the one-yard line to cap the victory. Last season both teams were ranked when they squared off (ECU at No. 21, JSU at No. 24), but this time the Colonels got off to a huge lead (34-8 at halftime) and held on for the 51-21 victory. Pryor finished that contest with four passing touchdowns while Matt Denham added 218 rushing yards and two scores (and a 28-yard receiving touchdown as well). Jax State was led by DaMarcus James who had 65 yards and a touchdown on the ground.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky handed Tennessee State its second-worst loss ever in topping the nationally-ranked Tigers 44-0 on Saturday. The Colonels led 34-0 at halftime and limited TSU to just 172 yards on the afternoon. It was the first shutout for ECU since blanking the Tigers 49-0 in 2005 (which was the worst loss ever for the TSU program). Eastern Kentucky has held its last four opponents to 10 points or less and ranks fifth nationally in rushing defense (99.4 yards/game) and 21st nationally in total defense (334.0 yards/game). Shawn Shupperd had six tackles, a sack and two tackles-for-loss in the game; he was part of a defensive line that held TSU to a season-low in yards. Junior quarterback Jared McClain passed for 129 yards and three touchdowns and rushed for a game-high 73 yards. He led ECU to four consecutive touchdown drives late in the second quarter and early in the third quarter. Punter Jordan Berry averaged 49.2 yards/punt on five attempts and had four of his five attempts land inside the TSU 20-yard line.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State won for the third time in four games by topping Austin Peay 42-10 on Saturday. The star of the game was junior running back DaMarcus James who rushed for five touchdowns, tying the OVC single-game record (held by 3 other players). James carried the ball 19 times for 102 yards (5.4) and now ranks third nationally with 17 rushing touchdowns this season; James also ranks sixth nationally in scoring (11.3 points/game) and has scored a touchdown in six-straight games. Sophomore quarterback Kyle West made his first career start and passed for 188 yards without an interception or being sacked. Junior cornerback Rashod Byers picked off a pass and returned it 95 yards for a touchdown late in the first quarter; that marked the sixth-longest interception return for a touchdown in school history and was Byers third career pick. Senior kicker Griffin Thomas, who ranks first nationally in field goals made/game (2.0), was a perfect 6-for-6 on point after attempts in the game and currently ranks 14th nationally in scoring (9.6 points/game).

GAME NOTES: UT Martin travels to the Liberty Bowl in battle the Memphis Tigers for the 14th time in school history on Saturday night. It marks the second-straight meeting between the schools, as a year ago the Skyhawks stunned the Tigers 20-17 on a field goal as time expired. The win was the first over a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent for UTM and the loss ended a 10-game winning streak by the Tigers to Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) opponents.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin won its second-straight game and for the third time in four contests by topping Murray State 45-17; it marked the eighth time in the last nine years the Skyhawks had topped the Racers. UTM fell behind 14-0 after one quarter but battled back to tie the game at 17 at the halftime break. But the second half was all Skyhawks as the team outscored the Racers 28-0. The 45 points were a season-high for UT Martin, marking the second-straight week the team had set a new season scoring high. Quarterback Jarod Neal completed 18-of-24 passes for 245 yards and three touchdowns without an interception in the game and rushed for 38 yards and another score in the victory. He has averaged 262.5 yards/game passing over the past four games since taking over the starting signal caller job. Senior Jeremy Butler caught nine passes for 133 yards and two touchdowns; Butler ranks sixth nationally in receiving yards (914), eighth in receptions/game (7.8) and 10th in receiving touchdowns (9) this season. DJ McNeil added 111 yards on the ground and continues to lead the OVC in rushing (106.0 yards/game); that marked his fifth 100-yard rushing game of the season. The defensive star of the game was junior linebacker Tony Bell who racked up 4.5 sacks, which was tied for the most by an OVC player over the last decade (with TTU's Marcus Edwards in 2010). Bell also netted 16 total tackles in the contest and earned National Defensive Player of the Week honors for his efforts. Senior cornerback Thad Williams also helped out defensively, netting two interceptions to go along with eight tackles; it marked the first time since the 2010 season that a UTM player had two interceptions in the same game. Overall the UTM defense netted season-highs with three interceptions and six sacks.

SCOUTING MEMPHIS: Memphis is under the direction of second-year head coach Justin Fuente, who spent the previous five years at TCU before coming to Memphis. Fuente is familiar with the OVC, having played two seasons as quarterback at Murray State where he set numerous school and conference records. In fact Fuente played against UT Martin twice during his career, throwing for five touchdowns in each game (both Racer victories). The Tigers have lost four games in a row entering this week, including the last two games at home. Memphis played last Wednesday night (Oct. 30) as it fell to Cincinnati by a 34-21 margin. The Tigers scored the first touchdown of the game but fell behind 27-14 early in the fourth quarter before pulling to within six points with 5:27 to go on a Brandy Hayes 31-yard rushing touchdown. But Memphis would get no closer as it was out-gained 437 to 232 on the night. Hayes finished the game with 76 rushing yards to lead the Tigers while quarterback Paxton Lynch completed 17-of-33 passes for 140 yards and two touchdowns. On the season Hayes has rushed for 520 yards (74.3 yards/game) and four touchdowns while Lynch has thrown for 1,333 yards and five touchdowns.
