CO-PLAYER

Angelo Warner, G • Jr., 6-2, 195 • Orlando, Fla. • Morehead State

Warner averaged 22.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.5 steals/game while hitting 64.3 percent (18-of-28) from the field in a pair of Morehead State games at the Las Vegas Invitational. Warner had a team-high 22 points in each game, including hitting 10-of-12 (83.3%) shots in the team's Thanksgiving Day victory over Chattanooga. The junior also had three rebounds, three assists and two steals in 35 minutes of action against the Mocs. He capped the week by hitting 8-of-16 (50%) shots while also pulling down eight rebounds, dishing out three assists and netting three steals in an overtime loss to Gardner-Webb. He currently ranks sixth in the OVC in scoring (17.3 points/game) and leads the OVC and ranks 29th nationally in steals (2.56/game).

CO-PLAYER

Lucas Nutt, G • Sr., 6-1, 180 • Jonesboro, Ark. • Southeast Missouri

Nutt averaged 15.3 points, 5.0 assists and 2.0 rebounds/game while hitting 70 percent (14-of-20) from the field, 71.4 percent (5-of-7) from 3-point range and 81.3 percent (13-of-16) from the free throw line as Southeast Missouri won three games to capture the championship at the Cure UCD Classic in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico. The senior scored a season-high 21 points on perfect 6-of-6 shooting (including 3-of-3 from 3-point range) in the team's win over Northern Kentucky to open the event; he also dished out three assists in 29 minutes of action in that game. He followed that with seven points, five assists and two steals in a 30-point victory over Tulane. He capped the event by hitting 6-of-8 shots and scoring 18 points in a victory over Texas State; in that contest he dished out seven assists and grabbed six rebounds. Nutt currently leads the OVC and ranks eighth nationally in assists (6.5/game) while also ranking 28th nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio (3.47).

NEWCOMER

Jarekious Bradley, F • Jr., 6-5, 220 • Memphis, Tenn. • Southeast Missouri

Bradley, the transfer from East Mississippi Community College, earned the Newcomer of the Week award for the third time this season after averaging 16.7 points, 6.3 rebounds and 1.3 steals/game and hitting 54.8 percent (17-of-31) from the field and 55.0 percent (11-of-20) from 3-point range in three games as Southeast Missouri won the championship at the Cure UCD Classic in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico. The junior was named the MVP of the event as Southeast topped Northern Kentucky, Tulane and Texas State on its way to the title. He scored seven points and had a season-high 10 rebounds against NKU before scoring 20 or more points in each of the final two games of the event. In a 30-point victory over Tulane he hit 5-of-9 (55.6%) 3-pointers on his way to 23 points while also pulling down six rebounds and dishing out two assists. He capped the event on his 23rd birthday with 20 points (on 7-of-9 shooting, including 4-of-6 3-pointers), three rebounds and an assist against Texas State. Bradley currently ranks fourth in the OVC in scoring (18.4 points/game).

CO-FRESHMAN

Evan Bradds, G/F • Fr., 6-6, 200 • Jamestown, Ohio • Belmont

Bradds earned the award for the second-straight week after averaging 12.5 points, 4.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists/game and hitting 73.3 percent (11-of-15) from the field in two Belmont games. Bradds made his first start of the season against Brescia, hitting 7-of-10 shots on his way to 15 points in a blowout victory. In his 20 minutes against the Bearcats he also added four rebounds, three assists and two steals. In the team's game against nationally-ranked VCU on Sunday, he played a career-high 32 minutes and scored 10 points (on 4-of-5 shooting) to go along with five assists and four rebounds. Bradds currently leads the OVC in field goal percentage (70.0%).

CO-FRESHMAN

Antonius Cleveland, G • Fr., 6-5, 175 • Memphis, Tenn. • Southeast Missouri

Cleveland earned his second OVC Freshman of the Week award of the season after helping Southeast Missouri to the championship of the Cure UCD Classic in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico. The guard averaged 12.0 points, 2.7 assists and 1.7 rebounds/game while hitting 61.9 percent (13-of-21) from the field and 80 percent (8-of-10) from the free throw line. After scoring six points in the event opener against Northern Kentucky, Cleveland scored a season-high 17 points on 6-of-8 (75%) shooting in a 30-point victory over Tulane; in that contest he also added four assists and two rebounds. Cleveland capped the event with 13 points, four assists, two rebounds and a block in a win over Texas State.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: Southeast Missouri increased its winning streak to four games by winning three games and the championship at the Cure UCD Classic in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico last week; the Redhawks topped Northern Kentucky, Tulane and Texas State on its way to the title...Belmont's J.J. Mann became the fifth active OVC player to reach the 1,000-Point Club, doing so during Sunday's game with nationally-ranked VCU; UT Martin's Myles Taylor (14 points away) is likely the next player to reach that career milestone...Belmont saw its NCAA-best 23-game home court winning streak come to an end with a loss to No. 24 VCU on Sunday; the Bruins have a chance to end the nation's longest regular season home court winning streak on Tuesday when they play at Middle Tennessee (33-straight at home during the regular season)...Morehead State won a program record six games in the month of November...Austin Peay's Dave Loos won his 375th game at Austin Peay on Saturday when the Govs were victorious at Youngstown State...Mike Liabo returned to the UT Martin lineup and knocked down seven 3-pointers against Lipscomb last Monday; that is the eighth-most made 3-pointers in a game nationally this season.

OVC in the NCAA Statistical Rankings: In the latest NCAA statistical rankings (Dec. 2), Eastern Kentucky ranks second nationally in steals/game (11.9) and turnover margin (+7.9) and 12th in 3-pointers made/game (9.4). Southeast Missouri ranks 10th nationally in scoring (89.1 points/game) and assists (18.4/game), 12th in field goal percentage (51.7%) and 20th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.53). Individually Morehead State's **Chad Posthumus** ranks third nationally in rebounds/game (12.6) while Southeast Missouri's **Lucas Nutt** is eighth in assists/game (6.5) and Austin Peay's **Chris Horton** is eighth in blocks (3.86/game). Belmont's **Drew Windler** currently ranks sixth in 3-point percentage (61.9%).

Wins Over Top 25 Teams By OVC Teams: Belmont's win over No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 17 was the first for an OVC team in non-conference play since Murray State (ranked No. 14 at the time) beat No. 16 Saint Mary's at home on Feb. 18, 2012. It was the first road victory over a Top 25 team since the Racers topped No. 20 Memphis 76-72 on Dec. 11, 2011. The last time an OVC team beat an opponent ranked 11th or higher was in 1987 when Austin Peay bested No. 11 Illinois in the NCAA Tournament. CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: In the November 25 CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll (the newest poll was not available at release time), Belmont was ranked third overall (after being fifth the prior week) while Eastern Kentucky jumped into the poll at No. 22. Morehead State was the only other OVC school receiving votes. Wichita State picked up 27 of the 31 first-place votes to be ranked No. 1. Now in its 15th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, WAC and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

Eastern Kentucky Ties OVC Single-Game 3-Pointers Made Record: Eastern Kentucky tied the OVC single-game record for 3-pointers made in a game with 20 against Warren Wilson College on Nov. 13. The Colonels were 20-of-39 (51.3%) from 3-point range in the 114-45 victory and tied the record set by Southeast Missouri State a season ago.

Mann Named National Player of the Week by CBSSports.com NBCSports.com (Nov. 18): Belmont senior **J.J. Mann** was named National Player of the Week by both CBSSports.com and NBCSports.com after leading the Bruins to a 83-80 victory over No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 17. Mann scored a career-high 28 points, including three 3-pointers in the final 1:02 as Belmont topped its first Top 25 team since December 2003. Mann scored 11 of Belmont's final 13 points as the team overcame an eight-point deficit with 2:37 to play. He also scored 23 points in a come-from-behind victory over Indiana State earlier in the week. For the week Mann averaged 18.3 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.7 steals/game.

Two OVC Players Named Candidates for Senior CLASS Award: Two OVC men's basketball student-athletes have been named candidates for the 2013-14 Senior CLASS Award. The two players are among 30 male candidates nationally considered for the award (UT Martin's Heather Butler is one of 30 female candidates for the award as well). The OVC selections were Belmont guard **J.J. Mann** and Tennessee Tech forward **Dennis Ogbe**. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The Senior CLASS Award winners will be announced during the 2014 NCAA Men's Final Four® and NCAA Women's Final Four®. Each of the 30 candidate classes will be narrowed to 10 finalists midway through the regular season, and those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one male candidate and one female candidate who best exemplify excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

OVC Enters Season Having Won a Game in Four of Past Five NCAA Tournaments: Despite not winning a game in the 2013 NCAA Tournament, the OVC has won a NCAA Tournament game in four of the past five years. The four-year winning streak came to an end last season, as the OVC had been one of just nine conferences (3 non-BCS) to win a game from 2009-12.

OVC Tournament Once Again at Municipal Auditorium: The 2014 OVC Tournament will be once again be played at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. (March 5-8). It marks the fourth-straight year the tournament has been at the venue and the ninth time the combined men's and women's tournaments have been held at the venue (1994, 1995, 1996, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2013); the men's tournament was also held there in 1967. Beginning in 2011 the Championship switched to a format where the top eight men's and women's teams play in the merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds received two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds received one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round included the No. 5 seed

2014 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2014 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 5-8 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. The tournament features eight men's and eight women's teams in a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on the OVC Digital Network. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 7 at 6:30 and 9 p.m. and televised on ESPNU. The championship game on Saturday, March 8 is at 6 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 7 (ESPN3) and the women's championship game is on March 8 at a time TBA (ESPN3).

This marks the 20th time in 21 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the fifth year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, MARCH 3 at 1 p.m.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).



against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements included upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History; Byrd Ranks 8th Among Active NCAA Coaches: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 24th year at Austin Peay. Loos now has 375 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 457 for his career (which ranks him 28th among Division I head coaches). Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** (who is in his second year in the OVC) has 670 career victories, which ranks eighth among active Division I head coaches (who recently passed John Wooden's 669 wins on the all-time list). Loos and Byrd are two of just seven active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years (the others are Syracuse's Jim Boeheim, Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, Oakland's Greg Kampe, Coppin State's Fang Mitchell and Davidson's Bob McKillop).

Former OVC Players in the NBA: Entering the 2013-14 season there are four former OVC players on NBA rosters. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his third season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. Faried was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team in 2012 and was the MVP of the Rising Stars Game in 2013. The other three players are all rookies this season, including former Murray State All-American **Isaiah Canaan**, former Belmont All-American **Ian Clark** and former Tennessee State standout **Robert Covington**. Canaan and Covington are teammates with the Houston Rockets (Canaan was drafted in the second round while Covington signed a free agent deal) while Clark signed a free agent deal with the Utah Jazz.

The 2013-14 Season: The 2013-14 season marks the 66th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 65 years, 13 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

Southeast Missouri's Stone Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2013-14 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Southeast Missouri State senior **Tyler Stone**, who was named the Preseason Player of the Year. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Austin Peay, Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri having two selections apiece while Belmont, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and UT Martin had one selection each to round out the team. The squad features two players who were All-OVC first or second-team selections last season and three players who were selected to the All-Newcomer squad. The team is comprised of seven seniors and three juniors. Last season Stone ranked eighth in the OVC in scoring (15.5 points/game), fifth in rebounding (7.8/game) and blocked shots (1.3/game) and 12th in field goal percentage (49.2%) while leading Southeast Missouri to a winning overall record and berth in the OVC Tournament quarterfinals. Other selections to the Preseason All-OVC team were Tennessee State's **Patrick Miller**, Austin Peay's **Travis Betran** and **Will Triggs**, Eastern Kentucky's **Glenn Cosey** and **Corey Walden**, Belmont's **J.J. Mann**, Southeast Missouri's **Nino Johnson**, UT Martin's **Myles Taylor** and Jacksonville State's **Brian Williams**.

Eastern Kentucky, Southeast Missouri, Murray State Picked as OVC Preseason Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors Eastern Kentucky has been picked the favorites in the East Division while Murray State and Southeast Missouri State were tabbed co-favorites in the West Division in the OVC for 2013-14. Eastern Kentucky picked up 18 of a possible 24 first-place votes (schools were not allowed to vote for themselves) and a total of 128 points to lead all vote getting. The Colonels were followed in the East by defending OVC champion Belmont, who picked up the remaining six first-place votes and 116 total points. The East Division voting was rounded out by Morehead State (74 points), Jacksonville State (72), Tennessee State (60) and Tennessee Tech (42). The top of the West Division was shared by Southeast Missouri and defending West Champions Murray State. The Redhawks received 13 first-place votes while the Racers picked up the remaining 11 to both finish with 117 total points. The West was rounded out by Austin Peay (90 points), UT Martin (66), Eastern Illinois (58) and SIUE (44).

Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.
