THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

For the first time OVC teams have won four playoff games in the same season as two OVC teams have reached the FCS Quarterfinals; it marks the first time two OVC teams have been in the quarterfinals since 1991 (Eastern Kentucky and Middle Tennessee)...If EIU and JSU both win this weekend they would be matched up in the semifinals, which in turn would guarantee the OVC a team in the National Championship for the first time since EIU won the title in 1982...OVC teams have won the four playoff games this season (by an average of 33.5 points); the four wins are the most of any conference this season...The OVC and CAA are the only conferences with two teams left in the playoffs...After OVC teams had not won a road playoff game since 1986, they have now won in back-to-back weeks, with Tennessee State snapping the streak with a win at Butler in the first round and Jacksonville State winning at McNeese State in the second round...Eastern Illinois scored 51 points in its second round playoff game, the second-most by an OVC team in the playoffs (surpassed only by the 55 JSU scored in the first round); EIU snapped an 11-game losing streak in the playoffs win the win, its first since 1989...This year marked the first time the OVC had placed three teams in the FCS Playoffs in the same season...Eastern Illinois now has 12 victories, the second-most in OVC history (EKU holds the record with 13)...For the first time in league history three teams have 10-plus wins in the same season (EIU 12, JSU 11, TSU 10)...OVC teams are now 28-51 all-time in the FCS playoffs...OVC teams are 16-5 against FCS opponents this season; of those five losses, four are against teams currently ranked in the Top 25 (Southeastern Louisiana, Bethune-Cookman, Chattanooga and Coastal Carolina) and two of those teams are still playing in the playoffs...EIU quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo continues to lead the FCS with 4,729 passing yards and 51 touchdowns (now tied with Eastern Washington's Vernon Adams); the 51 touchdowns are third in FCS single-season history (just five away from the record), while the 4,729 yards are third in FCS history (just 347 yards away from the record)...Garoppolo also moved into seventh-place on the FCS career touchdown passes list (116) and seventh on the career passing yards list (12,835)...Garoppolo is 1 of 3 finalists for the Walter Payton Award which will be awarded next Monday (Dec. 16) in Philadelphia by the Sports Network...Saturday's matchups between Eastern Illinois/Towson and Jacksonville State/Eastern Washington are the first in each series history.

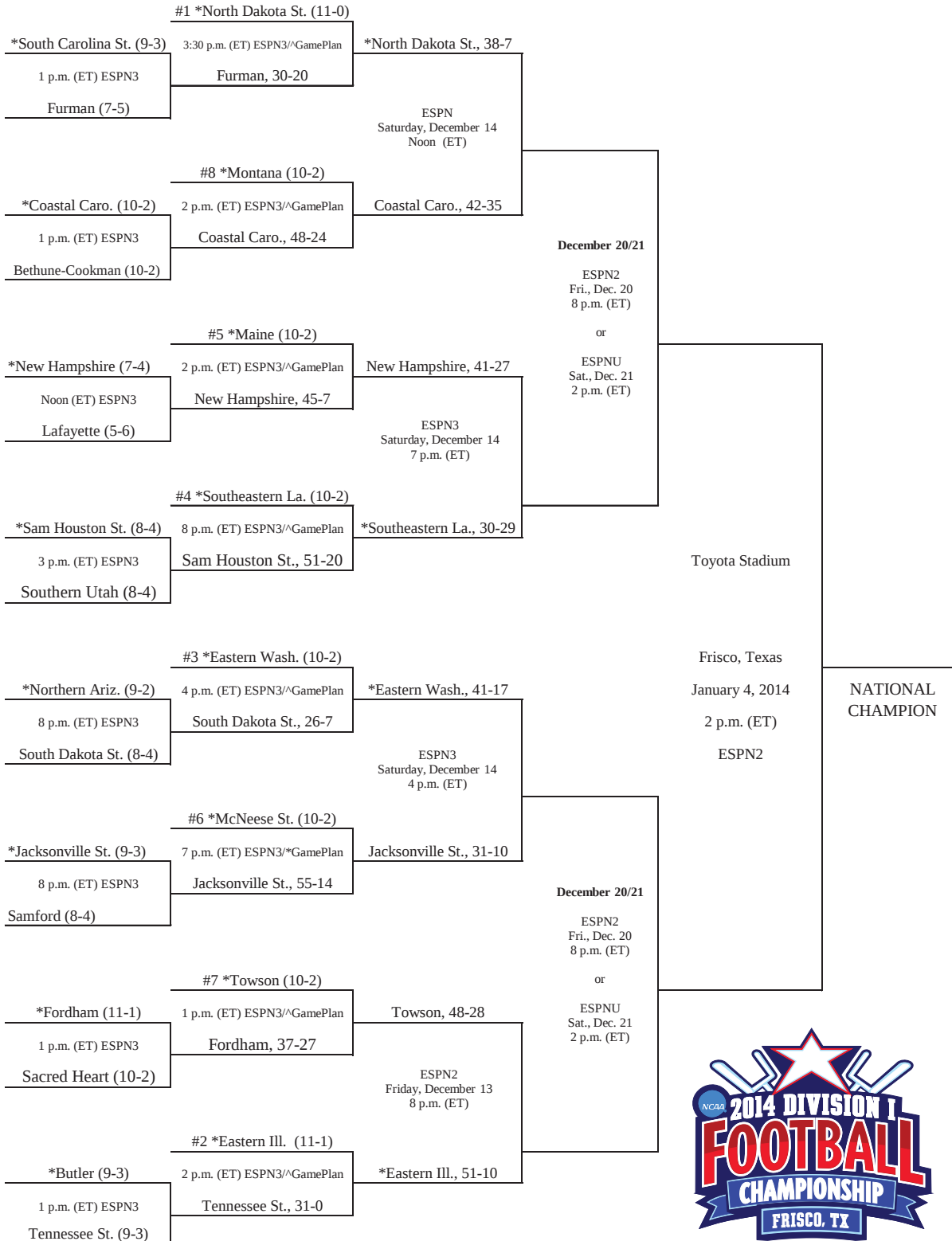

**OFFENSIVE**

Jimmy Garoppolo, QB • Sr., 6-3, 222 • Arlington Heights, Ill. • Eastern Illinois
Despite playing without two of his top three wide receivers, Garoppolo had another monster game, passing for 477 yards and six touchdowns in just a little over two and a half quarters as No. 2 Eastern Illinois improved to 11-1 on the season and a perfect 8-0 in the OVC with a 70-22 victory at UT Martin. The Walter Payton Award candidate threw touchdown passes of 33, 35, 9 and 40 yards in the first quarter alone and added a 51-yard touchdown pass prior to halftime to give the Panthers a 47-9 advantage. He added a 55-yard score in the third quarter before being lifted from the game. Garoppolo continues to lead all Division I players (FBS or FCS) with 4,489 passing yards and 48 touchdowns. The 48 touchdowns are third in FCS single-season history (just eight away from the record), while the 4,489 yards are fifth in FCS history (just 587 yards away from the record). The All-American also moved into eighth-place on the FCS career touchdown passes list (113) and ninth on the career passing yards list (12,595). It marks the seventh time this season Garoppolo has been named OVC Offensive Player of the Week (tying the OVC single-season record also held by JSU's Ryan Perrilloux) and the ninth time in his career (tying the all-time record held by Perrilloux, EIU's Tony Romo and ECU's Markus Thomas).

DEFENSIVE

Perry Cooper, LB • Jr., 6-3, 230 • The Woodlands, Texas • Murray State

Cooper had 12 tackles (6 solo) and a pass breakup, but his biggest play came on the final play of the game in Murray State's overtime victory over rival Eastern Kentucky. Cooper had the first hit on ECU quarterback Jared McClain, stopping him at the 1-yard line as the Racers held on for the 34-27 victory; it marked the first MSU victory over ECU since the 2004 season. The goal line stand was the second of the game for Murray State, as the team also stopped the Colonels inside the 1-yard line in the first half. The win enabled the Racers to finish 6-6 on the season, its third .500 or better season in the last four years, something the program has not done since the early 2000s.

Steven Mix, P • Sr., 6-1, 225 • Barlow, Ky. • Murray State

On a windy day Mix was only called upon to punt three times, but made the biggest play of the game with both of his legs instead of just one. Punting deep inside his own territory (MSU 13-yard line) early in the fourth quarter with his team clinging to a one-point lead, Mix had his punt blocked but instead of panicking he scooped up the ball and raced 11 yards for a first down. That extended the drive and eight plays later the Racers added a crucial 26-yard field goal to extend their advantage to 24-20; the team would go on to win 34-27 in overtime. Mix also had one of his other two punts on the day downed at the ECU 2-yard line.

NEWCOMER

Maikhail Miller, QB • So., 6-3, 234 • Fulton, Miss. • Murray State

Miller threw for 467 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for two additional scores as Murray State topped rival Eastern Kentucky 34-27 in overtime to finish the season at 6-6. It marked the first win by the Racers over the Colonels since the 2004 season. After missing the last two games Miller, the transfer from Ole Miss, returned to complete 37-of-54 passes for 467 yards; the 467 yards were the third-most in the OVC this season (and most by a player not named Jimmy Garoppolo) and seventh-most in MSU single-game history. Miller passed for 318 yards and two touchdowns after halftime including the 26-yard game-winner to Jesse Blackburn off a double-reverse option play. It marks the fifth-time this season he has been named OVC Newcomer of the Week.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

OVC Puts Two Teams in the Quarterfinals: For just the second-time in its history the OVC has put two teams in the quarterfinals in the same year. The only other time it happened was in 1991 when Eastern Kentucky and Middle Tennessee both advanced there (and EKV beat MTSU head-to-head). This year marks the first time an OVC team has been in the quarterfinals since 2000 (when the field included just 16 teams); overall OVC teams are 6-8 in the FCS quarterfinals, including losing its last four. No OVC team has been in the semifinals since 1991.

TSU Records First Road Playoff Win By OVC Team Since 1986; JSU Follows With Road Win the Following Week: Not only did Tennessee State snap the OVC's overall 19-game losing streak in the FCS Playoffs on Nov. 30, but they were the first OVC team to win on the road since Eastern Kentucky beat Eastern Illinois (prior to the Panthers joining the league) on the road in the 1986 playoffs. It snapped a 29-game losing streak in road playoff games for the OVC. Overall it was just the fifth road win for the OVC in the playoffs (which began in 1978). This past week JSU added to that road success by winning at McNeese State, marking the sixth OVC victory on the road in the playoffs.

OVC's Playoff Losing Streak Snapped; Records 4 Wins for First Time in Same Playoffs: After losing 19-straight playoff games and not winning since 2000 (Western Kentucky), the OVC put that streak to rest convincingly on Nov. 30 as both Tennessee State (over Butler) and Jacksonville State (over Samford) won first round games by a combined margin of 86-14. It marked the first time since the 1991 season that two OVC teams won playoff games on the same day. In was just as successful day this past Saturday as Eastern Illinois beat Tennessee State and Jacksonville State topped McNeese State. It marked the fourth victory by the OVC this postseason, an all-time record for the league in the playoffs. The four victories have come by an average margin of 33.5 points. OVC teams are now 28-51 all-time in the NCAA Division I Football Championship, including winning the 1979 and 1982 National Championships (both by Eastern Kentucky). In an interesting comparison, the OVC went 19-straight years without a victory in the NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament (1990-2008) before winning games in four-straight seasons (2009-12), making the OVC one of the most successful mid-major conferences in the postseason over that time period.

OVC Leads All Conference With Four Playoff Victories: The four playoff victories by the OVC so far in the playoffs are the most of any FCS conference. The CAA is second with three victories (3-1) while the Big South (2-0), Missouri Valley Football Conference (2-1) and Southland (2-2) have two wins apiece and the Big Sky (1-3), Patriot (1-2) and Southern Conference (1-2) each have one win.

OVC Teams Against Each Other in Playoffs: Last Saturday's matchup between Eastern Illinois and Tennessee State was only the third time in league history that two OVC teams squared off in the playoffs. Both of the other instances occurred between Eastern Kentucky and Middle Tennessee and happened in 1984 and 1991. In all three instances the team that won the regular season matchup also won the playoff tilt. If both Eastern Illinois and Jacksonville State win this weekend they will match up in the semifinals.

JSU Sets OVC Playoff Record for Points Scored: Jacksonville State's 55 points in its first round victory over rival Samford were the most points ever scored by an OVC team in the FCS Playoffs. The total eclipsed the previous record of 43 set by Eastern Illinois in a loss to Northern Iowa in 2001 (when Tony Romo was the Panthers quarterback). Eastern Illinois came close to equaling that mark in the second round, scoring 51 points in a victory over Tennessee State.

TSU Records Only Second Shutout by an OVC Team in Playoffs: Tennessee State's 31-0 shutout over Butler in the first round of the playoffs was only the second-ever by an OVC team in 76 total playoff games. The other was a 27-0 win by Western Kentucky over Florida A&M in the first round of the 2000 playoffs.

3 OVC Teams With 10+ Wins For First Time: For the first time in league history three OVC teams have eclipsed the 10-win plateau in the same season. Entering this week Eastern Illinois has 12 victories, Jacksonville State has 11 wins and Tennessee State has 10 wins. There had previously been only one other year (1990) when two teams reached 10-plus wins (Middle Tennessee had 11 and Eastern Kentucky had 10 that year).

EIU's 12 Victories Second-Most in OVC History: Eastern Illinois now has 12 victories on the season, just one off the OVC record of 13 set by Eastern Kentucky on its way to the 1982 National Championship (13-0). EIU is only the third OVC team to reach 12 victories in a season, joining the 1981 and 1991 EKV squads who each won 12.

OVC Puts Three Teams In FCS Playoffs For First Time: For the first time in league history the OVC placed three teams in the NCAA Division I Football Championship. Eastern Illinois earned the automatic bid while Jacksonville State and Tennessee State earned at-large berths. The three teams in the playoff are tied for the second-most among FCS conference this season (the Big Sky had the most with four). The OVC has now put multiple teams in the playoffs in 19 of 36 seasons since the event began in 1978. Overall the OVC has now had multiple teams in the field in three of the last four and five of the last eight years. This season marks the first of an expanded 24-team playoff for NCAA Division I teams. In 2010 the FCS Playoffs expanded from 16 teams to 20 teams, the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997.

Eastern Illinois Making Its 15th NCAA FCS Playoff Appearance: Eastern Illinois is making its 15th overall NCAA FCS Playoff appearance this season. It is the second-straight appearance for the program and sixth in the last nine years. The Panthers have also appeared in the playoffs in 1982, 1983, 1986, 1989, 1995, 1996, 2000, 2001, 2002, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009 and 2012. The 15 FCS playoff appearances ranks tied for seventh all-time; the all-time record is 22 (held by Montana) while Eastern Kentucky's 20 appearances are the most by an OVC team (and ranks second in NCAA history). EIU is now 4-14 all-time in the playoffs, as its victory over Tennessee State snapped an 11-game losing streak dating back to 1989.

Jacksonville State Making Fourth NCAA FCS Playoff Appearance: Jacksonville State is making its fourth overall NCAA FCS Playoff appearance, all of which have come since joining the OVC prior to the 2003 season. The Gamecocks have previously been in the field in 2003, 2004 and 2010. After going on the road in 2003 and 2004, JSU hosted Wofford in the second round in 2010 (after receiving a first round bye). After its wins over Samford and McNeese State this season, JSU is now 2-3 all-time in the Division I playoffs and are appearing as an at-large team for the second time.

Tennessee State Makes Fourth NCAA FCS Playoff Appearance: Tennessee State officially made its fourth NCAA FCS Playoff appearance this season and first since 1999. The Tigers have also been in the field in 1986, 1998 and 1999; the program also appeared in the 1981 and 1982 playoffs (prior to joining the OVC) but each of those appearances was later vacated. The Tigers are now 2-4 all-time in the playoffs (and 1-2 in the two years vacated including a win over Eastern Illinois in 1982).

Eastern Illinois Claims 2013 OVC Championship: Eastern Illinois won the 2013 OVC Championship which marked the seventh overall and second-straight title for the Panthers who have also won titles in 2001, 2002, 2005, 2006, 2009 and 2012. The seven titles are the sixth-most in OVC history.

Eastern Illinois Ranked First Nationally in NCAA's SRS: This year is the first the NCAA has used the Simple Rating System (SRS), an evaluation tool used by the selection committee (similar to the RPI in college basketball) used to gauge team quality. Within the NCAA SRS, the rating of a team is calculated largely by two components: a strength-of-schedule measure (SOS) and a win-loss differential (WL). The SRS was released for the first time after the playoff bracket was released and Eastern Illinois was ranked No. 1 nationally with a score of 25.30; that was just above two-time defending national champion North Dakota State who was second at 23.17. Jacksonville State was 12th (13.5) while Tennessee State was 15th (13.09).

Eastern Illinois First OVC Team With Double-Digit Wins Since 2000; Only Fourth OVC Team With 11 Wins in the Regular Season: Eastern Illinois was the first OVC team to record double-digit victories in a season since 2000 when Western Kentucky won 11 games overall (JSU and TSU later joined the 10-win club this season). Eastern Illinois finished the regular season 11-1, making it just the fourth team in OVC history to record 11 victories during the regular season, joining Middle Tennessee (1985), Murray State (1995) and Tennessee State (1999). Those three teams were all a perfect 11-0 during the regular season.

Perfect 8-0 in OVC: Eastern Illinois finished the year 8-0 in OVC play becoming the first OVC team to go undefeated in league play since Eastern Kentucky went a perfect 8-0 in 2007. Although OVC teams have played different numbers of Conference games over the years, there have been eight previous teams who have gone 8-0 in league play including: Eastern Kentucky (1981), Middle Tennessee (1992), Eastern Kentucky (1993), Eastern Kentucky (1994), Murray State (1995), Murray State (1996), Eastern Illinois (2005) and Eastern Kentucky (2007). Overall 34 OVC champions (including EIU this year) have compiled perfect undefeated and untied OVC seasons.

EIU's Babers Sets OVC Record For Two-Year Conference Record in First Two Seasons: No coach in OVC history has ever compiled a better Conference record in his first two years with a program than Eastern Illinois head coach **Dino Babers**. Babers is 14-1 in his first two years at EIU (6-1 in 2012, 8-0 this season) with eclipsed the previous record of 14-2 by Jacksonville State's Jack Crowe (set in 2003-04 when JSU had first joined the OVC).

Garoppolo Sets OVC Career Touchdown Passes, Passing Yardage, Total Offense, Total Completions and Total Attempts Records: Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** continues to etch his name in the OVC record book, breaking the OVC's career records for touchdown passes and passing yards on Sept. 28 against Eastern Kentucky. The senior tossed his 86th touchdown pass to break the previous record of 85 held by former EIU All-American and current Dallas Cowboy quarterback Tony Romo. Garoppolo now has 116 career touchdown passes, which ranks tied for seventh in NCAA FCS history. He also broke the OVC career record for passing yards, passing the old mark of 9,990 yards by Murray State's Casey Brockman; Garoppolo now has 12,835 passing yards, which ranks seventh in FCS history. On Oct. 19 Garoppolo set the OVC career total yards mark, passing the former record held by Brockman; Garoppolo now has 12,756 yards of total offense, which in 11th in NCAA history. He set the OVC career passing attempts record on Oct. 26, passing the previous mark of 1,407 held by Morehead State's Chris Swartz (1987-90); Garoppolo now has 1,618 pass attempts. On Nov. 9 he set the OVC career completions mark, passing the previous record of 938 by Brockman; Garoppolo now has 1,009 career completions. Through 13 games this season the senior has 51 passing touchdowns and 4,729 passing yards (both of which are first among FCS players; the 51 touchdowns are tied with Eastern Washington's Vernon Adams). Fresno State's Derek Carr (4,866) is the only Division I FBS player with more passing yards than Garoppolo.

Garoppolo Sets OVC Single-Season Passing Touchdowns and Passing Yards Mark: After previously breaking Tony Romo's OVC career passing touchdown mark earlier in the season, Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** broke another Romo record on Oct. 26. The senior threw four touchdown passes in a victory over nationally-ranked Tennessee State, moving his season total to 35, and passing the mark of 34 established by Tony Romo in 2002 (the year he won the Walter Payton Award). Garoppolo now has 51 passing touchdowns this year which ranks third in NCAA single-season history (just five away from the

record). In a victory over Murray State on Nov. 9 Garoppolo broke his own single-season passing yards mark of 3,823 (set a year ago); he now has 4,729 passing yards, which is third in NCAA FCS history (just 347 yards away from the record). The only OVC record he doesn't have right now is single-season completions; his 337 completions are 22 away from tying the mark Casey Brockman set in 2012.

Garoppolo Throws Touchdowns Early: Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** has thrown a Division I best 51 touchdown passes this season and the number could be a lot higher had his team not blown out most of its competition. EIU has won its 12 games by an average of 30.8 points/game (including only one victory closer than 18 points) and Garoppolo has not thrown the ball much in the second half and left most every game early. Of his 51 touchdown passes 24 have come in the first quarter and 37 of the 51 have come in the first half. Garoppolo has only thrown 14 second half touchdowns this season (8 in the third quarter, 6 in the fourth quarter).

Lora Sets OVC Career Receptions Record; Now 3rd in NCAA History: Eastern Illinois senior All-American wide receiver **Erik Lora** set the OVC career receptions record in the Panthers victory over nationally-ranked Illinois State on Sept. 14. Lora broke the 43-year old record held by Austin Peay's Harold "Red" Roberts who caught 232 passes from 1967-70. Lora, who also owns the OVC record for receptions in a game (21) and a season (136), now has 314 career receptions, which ranks third in NCAA FCS history. Although he will not set the NCAA record of 395 (he is 81 away), he is just three catches away from ranking second in FCS history (that mark is 317 held by Jacquay Nunnally of Florida A&M). Lora also now ranks second in OVC history for receiving yards (3,877) and is just 26 yards away from the record; that currently ranks him 13th in NCAA FCS history.

4,000-Yard Passer and 1,000-Yard Rusher in Same Season: This season Eastern Illinois has become one of just six teams in FCS history to have a 4,000-yard passer and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season and the first since 2008. Two other teams (Stephen F. Austin and Fordham) joined EIU on the list this season (and Eastern Washington is close to going the exclusive club). EIU's Garoppolo and Little have combined for 6,219 yards (and counting), the most of any of the duos.

Garoppolo In Final Three of Walter Payton Balloting; Lora Finishes 7th, Powell 17th in Balloting: Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** is one of three finalists (with Eastern Washington's Vernon Adams and Towson's Terrance West) for the Walter Payton Award, which is presented by the Sports Network to the top player in the FCS. The winner will be announced at the FCS Awards Banquet on Dec. 16 in Philadelphia. Garoppolo finished 10th in the balloting a season ago. The results of 4th-20th in the balloting have been released and Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** finished seventh overall (85 points) while Murray State wide receiver/return specialist **Walter Powell** finished 17th (17 total points). Of the 20 finalists for the award, the OVC's three selections were the most of any conference. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. The Payton Award is voted on by a national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. Former Eastern Illinois quarterback Tony Romo is the only OVC player to win the award (2002) and also the last OVC player invited to the awards banquet.

OVC Teams in the Top 25: Eastern Illinois remained No. 2 in both the Sports Network and FCS Coaches Top 25 polls for the sixth-straight week following the completion of the regular season (the next set of polls will be released after the playoffs). The Panthers are the first OVC team to be ranked No. 2 since Jacksonville State was second in the polls on Oct. 25 and Nov. 1, 2010. The ranking for EIU is the highest since the team was also ranked No. 2 nationally in 2002 when Tony Romo was the team's starting quarterback. No OVC team has been ranked No. 1 in the polls since Tennessee State was No. 1 in the final regular season poll of the 1999 season. Tennessee State is now No. 17 in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 19 in the Sports Network poll, which marks its highest rankings of the season. Jacksonville State finished the regular season No. 20 in the Sports Network poll and No. 21 in the FCS Coaches poll. An OVC team has not finished the season in the Top 10 of the final poll since 2001 (EIU was No. 9 that season).

JSU's James Sets OVC Single-Season Rushing Touchdowns Mark: With three rushing touchdowns on Nov. 23 against Southeast Missouri, Jacksonville State junior running back **DaMarcus James** broke the OVC single-season rushing touchdowns record of 21 previously held by Eastern Kentucky's Elroy Harris (1988). Harris actually had 27 total rushing scores in 1988, but the NCAA statistics rules at the time limited totals to just the regular season (it was changed to include the postseason in 2002). James now has 28 touchdowns on the season which ranks second nationally (behind Towson's Terrance West who has 33).

Jacksonville State and Southeast Missouri Set FCS Record for Combined Rushing Yards in a Game: In the Nov. 23 game between Southeast Missouri and Jacksonville State, those two teams combined for an FCS record 850 rushing yards, as JSU rushed for 440 while Southeast rushed for 410. That broke the previous FCS record of 811 yards between Stony Brook and VMI in 2008.

NCAA Attendance Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA FCS attendance leaders, Jacksonville State is ninth nationally with an average of 15,814 fans per game.

Jacksonville State Posts 11th-Straight Winning Season: Jacksonville State has now posted 11-straight winning seasons, which is the third-longest streak in FCS football and the longest such stretch in school history (JSU had nine straight winning seasons from 1970-78). The current longest FCS streak is Harvard at 13 seasons, while Montana State has had 12-straight winning seasons.

Southeast's Black Named Finalist for Jerry Rice Award Watch List: Southeast Missouri redshirt freshman defensive tackle **Austin Black** has been named one of the 20 finalists for the Jerry Rice Award by the Sports Network. The award, now in its third season, is given to the top first-year player in the FCS (true or redshirt freshman) and named after the NFL Hall of Famer who played collegiately at the FCS level (Mississippi Valley State). The Rice Award will be voted on by a national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season and the winner will be announced at The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation Dec. 16 in Philadelphia. No OVC player has won the award.

Babers and Reed Among 21 Finalists for Eddie Robinson Award: Two OVC coaches, Eastern Illinois' **Dino Babers** and Tennessee State's **Rod Reed**, are among the 21 finalists for the Eddie Robinson Award, presented to the National Coach of the Year by the Sports Network. Voting will reflect only regular-season results and will be conducted by a national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries. The winner will be announced at The Sports Network FCS Awards Banquet and Presentation to be held Dec. 16 in Philadelphia. Two previous Robinson Award winners have

Eastern Illinois Knocks Off FBS Foe San Diego State in Week 1; Jacksonville State Tops FBS Georgia State in Week 4: Week 1 of the 2013 season saw eight teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FBS) defeat teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) including Eastern Illinois thrashing defending Mountain West Conference Champion San Diego State 40-19. The 21-point margin of victory was the second largest for an OVC team ever over a FBS squad (the largest was a 24-point win by Eastern Kentucky over Louisville in 1985). In week four (Sept. 21), Jacksonville State knocked off first-year FBS opponent Georgia State 32-26 in overtime. It marked the first time since the 1987 season that OVC teams had won multiple FBS games in the same year (that season Austin Peay beat Kansas State and Youngstown State topped Bowling Green). OVC teams have now knocked off FBS foes in three of the last four years, as Jacksonville State beat Ole Miss in 2010 and UT Martin beat Memphis in 2012. Overall OVC schools 32-183-1 all-time against FBS foes.

FCS Over FBS: This season a record 16 teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) scored victories over teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS).

Numerous Single-Season Team Records Fall: Eastern Illinois has established many new OVC single-season team records this season including most points scored, most total yards, most first rounds and most passing touchdowns to name a few. In addition Jacksonville State set the OVC record for most rushing touchdowns (47), breaking 54-year old record of 42 established by Middle Tennessee in 1959.

Godfrey Breaks OVC Career Field Goals Made Record: With a field goal in his team's playoff loss at Eastern Illinois, Tennessee State senior kicker **Jamin Godfrey** broke the OVC career record for field goals with 59. That broke the previous record of 58 set by Murray State's Kienan Cullen (2008-11). Godfrey also set the career field goals attempted record, attempting 91 (breaking the old mark of 79 by Murray State's Paul Hickert from 1984-87).

Thomas Breaks OVC Single-Season Field Goals Made Record: Jacksonville State senior kicker **Griffin Thomas** broke the OVC record with 23 made field goals this season, connecting on his 23rd in the team's playoff win over McNeese State. Thomas, who ranks second nationally at 1.6 field goals made/game, broke the mark of 22 previously held by former JSU kicker Gavin Halford (2007) and Murray State's Rob Hart (1996).

Ninth-Biggest OVC Crowd Watches EIU/TSU Game: The Tennessee State/Eastern Illinois game at LP Field on Oct. 26 was played in front of 22,157 fans, which marked the ninth-largest crowd to witness a football game between two OVC teams.

James Ties OVC Single-Game Touchdown Mark: Jacksonville State junior running back **DaMarcus James** tied the OVC single-game rushing touchdowns record on Nov. 2 at Austin Peay. James scored five times on the ground to tie the mark also held by Paris Wicks (Youngstown State, 1981), Daniel Williams (Austin Peay, 1996) and Derek White (Tennessee Tech, 2007).

Southeast Missouri's Washington Ties OVC and NCAA Record With 99-Yard Rush: Southeast Missouri sophomore running back **Lewis Washington** tied the OVC and NCAA records for longest rush when he raced 99 yards for a touchdown against Tennessee State on Oct. 5. He became just the 10th player in FCS history to achieve the feat since the subdivision formed in 1978. He is the second OVC player to achieve the feat, joining Eastern Kentucky's Bobby Washington who had the rush against Murray State in the 2007 season.

Jacksonville State Ties FCS Record By Playing in Three-Straight Overtime Games: Jacksonville State played in three-straight overtime games from Sept. 14-28. The Gamecocks topped North Alabama (Sept. 14) and Georgia State (Sept. 21) before falling to Murray State (Sept. 28). That tied the Division I all-time record for most consecutive overtime contests, equaling a mark by Penn in 2006 (no FBS team has ever played in three-straight).

Jacksonville State Ties NCAA Record For Most 100 Yard Rushers in a Game: When Jacksonville State had four players rush for 100 yards or more against Jacksonville University on Sept. 7, the Gamecocks tied the Division I (FBS and FCS) record for that feat. The record had been done seven times previously including Arizona State (1951), Texas (1969), Alabama (1973), Army (1984), Nebraska (2001), Nevada (2009), Arkansas State (2013). There is no NCAA record of a team from the FCS achieving the feat prior to JSU accomplishing it. The four JSU players over 100 yards were **Troymaine Pope** (160), **Miles Jones** (138), **Eli Jenkins** (128) and **DaMarcus James** (105).

Murray State Establishes OVC Record for Points Scored in a Half: With its 62-point first half explosion over Campbellsville on Sept. 7, Murray State established a new OVC record for most points scored in a half. The Racers scored 41 points in the first quarter and added 21 points in the second quarter to break the previous record of 49. That old record had been achieved three times: Eastern Kentucky (1981), UT Martin (2007) and Murray State (2012).

Watson and Mack Brown Set Division I Record for Combined Coaching Victories: As each recorded victories on November 9, Tennessee Tech head coach **Watson Brown** and his brother Mack Brown (the head coach at Texas) became the winningest set of brothers in NCAA Division I history. The duo now has 365 victories (238 by Mack, 127 by Watson) which is three more than Bill and Vince Dooley (362 total wins) on the all-time list.

Austin Peay First 0-12 Team in OVC History: Austin Peay became the first team to go winless during a season since 1998 (UT Martin) this season. Because of the 12-game FCS schedule this year the Governors

were the first team in OVC history to go 0-12 overall.

Tennessee State Wins 2013 Sgt. York Trophy: With a 3-0 record this season Tennessee State claimed the 2013 Sgt. York Trophy. The Sgt. York Trophy is a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four football-playing OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the OVC announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). In 2007 Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season (that was the tiebreaker used only for the first year of the trophy series). Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. In 2009 Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games and in 2010 UT Martin became the third-straight OVC team to go 3-0 and win the trophy in claiming its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech shared the title (TSU went home with the trophy) while Tennessee State and UT Martin shared the title in 2012 (TSU once again took home the actual trophy). With its win in 2013, TSU has now won the trophy five times in the seven-year history of the award. The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring.

Two OVC Student-Athletes Named CoSIDA Academic All-Americans; Six Named Academic All-District: Austin Peay's **Ben Stansfield** and **Iosua Silva** were each named to the Capital One Academic All-America Team as selected by CoSIDA. The duo's selection brought the OVC's all-time Academic All-American total to 219, including 31 football student-athletes. The two earned the right to be Academic All-Americans after first being named to the Academic All-District Teams. In addition to those two four other players were named all-district including Eastern Illinois' **Dominic Pagliara**, Eastern Kentucky's **Jordan Berry**, Jacksonville State's **Max Holcombe** and Murray State's **Christian Duncan**. To be eligible for nomination, a student-athlete must have reached sophomore academic standing and have at least a 3.30 cumulative grade point average.

Four OVC Student-Athletes Named Semifinalists for William V. Campbell Trophy: Four OVC student-athletes are among the 170 semifinalist named for the 2013 William V. Campbell Trophy which recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation. The four student-athletes are Austin Peay senior offensive lineman **Ben Stansfield**, Eastern Illinois senior kicker **Cameron Berra**, Eastern Kentucky senior linebacker **Ichiro Vance** and Tennessee Tech senior offensive lineman **James Normand**. The list was announced by the National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame and are part of the 2013 NFF National Scholar-Athlete Awards. The 170 semifinalists represent the most ever since 2006 when the NFF increased the nomination standards to require a minimum cumulative 3.2 GPA. Of the semifinalists, 46 were from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

Garoppolo Named National Player of the Week (Nov. 25): Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named National Offensive All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Nov. 25 for his play in the regular season finale against UT Martin. Despite playing without two of his top three wide receivers, Garoppolo had another monster game, passing for 477 yards and six touchdowns in just a little over two and a half quarters as EIU beat UTM 70-22. The senior threw touchdown passes of 33, 35, 9 and 40 yards in the first quarter alone and added a 51-yard touchdown pass prior to halftime to give the Panthers a 47-9 advantage. He added a 55-yard score in the third quarter before being lifted from the game.

Little Named National Offensive Player of the Week (Nov. 18): Eastern Illinois sophomore running back **Shepard Little** was named National Offensive Co-Player of the Week by both the Sports Network and College Sporting News on Nov. 18 for his play against No. 22 Jacksonville State. Little rushed for two touchdowns, caught a touchdown pass and threw a touchdown pass all in the first quarter as No. 2 Eastern Illinois dominated No. 22 Jacksonville State, winning 52-14 to win the OVC Championship outright and earn an automatic berth in the NCAA Division I Football Championship. Little rushed for a three-yard score, then caught an 18-yard touchdown pass from Walter Payton Award candidate Jimmy Garoppolo and then less than two minutes later broke a 37-yard touchdown run. He then threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to Garoppolo with 3:22 left in the first quarter; overall Little's play helped the Panthers score a school record 35 points in the opening quarter. Little finished the day with 26 carries for 245 yards (9.4 ypc) and two touchdowns, two catches for 19 yards and a score and the 10-yard touchdown pass (264 all-purpose yards).

Bell Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Nov. 4): UT Martin junior linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network and College Sporting News after his dominating performance against Murray State. Bell had 4.5 sacks against the Racers which is the most by any Division I player in 2013 and tied for the most at any level of NCAA football this season. The 4.5 sacks are tied for the most by an OVC player over the last decade. Bell also recorded 16 tackles in the contest which UTM won 45-17, as the team outscored MSU 45-3 after the first quarter.

Lora Named National Specialist of the Week (Nov. 4): Eastern Illinois WR/RS **Erik Lora** was named National Specialist of the Week by the College Sporting News on Nov. 4 following his play against Tennessee Tech. Lora finished the game with 234 all-purpose yards, including returning a punt 80 yards for a touchdown. He also caught three touchdown passes in the game. The 80-yard punt return was tied for the longest in school history. Lora also returned another punt for a touchdown, only to see it called back due to penalty.

Berry Named National Specialist of the Week (Oct. 28): Eastern Kentucky senior punter **Jordan Berry** was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network on Oct. 28 after a win over Southeast Missouri. Berry averaged 59.3 yards on three punts, including a long of 76 yards, and also scored in first collegiate touchdown. In the second quarter he was the holder as ECU lined up for a 42-yard field goal attempt; he took the snap and ran 25 yards untouched for a touchdown to put his team up by 24 points.

MacInnes Named National Specialist of the Week (Oct. 28): Jacksonville State sophomore punter **Hamish MacInnes** was named National All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Oct. 28 for his performance against Tennessee Tech. MacInnes averaged 49.2 yards/punt on five attempts including a school record punt of 86 yards, the longest punt in the NCAA this season (any classification).

Powell Named National Specialist of the Week (Oct. 7): Murray State senior **Walter Powell** was named the National Specialist of the Week by the College Sporting News following his performance against Tennes-

Powell returned a punt 88 yards for a touchdown (he returned a kickoff for a touchdown earlier this season) and finished the game with 310 all-purpose yards (including catching eight passes for 177 yards and two scores), his second 300-plus all-purpose yard output of the season. In the process he became Murray State's all-time leader in touchdowns.

Johnson Named National Specialist of the Week (Sept. 30): Tennessee Tech senior defensive lineman **Jordan Johnson** was named the National Specialist All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Sept. 30 after playing a key role in TTU's 38-37 win over Indiana State. After Indiana State had scored the first touchdown on the night, Johnson blocked the point after attempt and that single point proved to be the difference in the game. Later in the quarter Johnson rejected a 20-yard field goal attempt by the Sycamores which was scooped up by teammate James Huguey and returned 87 yards for a touchdown to give Tech a 10-6 advantage.

Jude Named National Freshman of the Week (Sept. 23): Eastern Kentucky redshirt freshman running back **JJ Jude** was named National Co-Freshman of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 23 after his performance against Morehead State. Jude carried the ball 33 times for 195 yards and four touchdowns as ECU won 56-24. The four rushing touchdowns tied an ECU single-game record. Jude carried the ball 33 times (and averaged 5.9 yards/carry) after carrying the ball only 19 times in the first three games of the season.

Garoppolo Named National Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 16): Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named National Offensive Player of the Week by both the Sports Network and College Sporting News on Sept. 16 for his performance in a convincing victory over No. 16 Illinois State. It marked the second-straight week he earned the honor from College Sporting News. Garoppolo completed 26-of-41 passes for 480 yards and seven touchdowns (six in the first half) as EIU won 57-24 over its rival. The seven touchdown passes for the game broke the school record previously held by Tony Romo and Jeff Christensen (Garoppolo's high school quarterback coach).

Thomas Named National Specialist of Week (Sept. 16): Jacksonville State senior kicker **Griffin Thomas** was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 16 after hitting five field goals in JSU's double overtime victory over North Alabama. The five field goals set a new Jax State record while his 16 points tied the school record for points by a kicker. The senior started the day by connecting on a 50-yarder in the first quarter, becoming just the third player in Gamecock history to kick a 50-yard or longer field goal. Thomas added a 42-yard field goal in the second quarter and a 44-yarder with three minutes to go in the fourth quarter. His 26-yard field goal in the first overtime forced to second extra period where he nailed the game-winner.

Garoppolo Named National Offensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News (Sept. 9): Eastern Illinois senior quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo was named National Offensive All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Sept. 9 for his play against Southern Illinois. Garoppolo completed 34-of-56 passes for 440 yards and four touchdowns as No. 14 Eastern Illinois topped rival SIU 40-37 in double overtime on Saturday. The 440 passing yards are the fifth-best in EIU single-game history, while his 442 yards of total offense was the fourth-most in EIU history.

Bell Named National Defensive Player of the Week by Sports Network (Sept. 9): UT Martin junior linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 9 for his play against Boise State. Bell had six tackles (5 solo) including 5.0 tackles-for-loss (for a loss of 26 yards) against the Broncos. He also added a pair of sacks, forced two fumbles and had a fumble recovery.

McNulty Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 2): Eastern Illinois senior defensive back **Alex McNulty** was named National Co-Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network and National Defensive All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News on Sept. 2 for his efforts in EIU's 21-point victory over Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe San Diego State. The senior picked off two passes and returned them for a total of 50 yards including setting up EIU's final touchdown of the night in the fourth quarter. He also added five tackles, a tackle-for-loss and had two pass break-ups. He was part of a defensive unit that limited the Aztecs to just 19 points (1 touchdown, 4 field goals).

EIU's Garoppolo and Drake Earn National Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 13: Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named National FCS Performer of the Week (and National Quarterback of the Week) while teammate **Adam Drake** was by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in Week 13 of the 2013 season. Garoppolo threw for 477 yard and six touchdowns in just over 2.5 quarters of work while Drake caught 14 passes for 225 yards and three touchdowns (all three coming in the first quarter) as Eastern Illinois beat UT Martin 70-22. In addition to that duo, nine other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

APSU's Perry Earns National Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 12: Austin Peay senior **EnRiques Perry** was named National Kickoff Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following his performance in Week 12 of the 2013 season. Perry returned a kickoff 99 yards in the fourth quarter against Southeast Missouri. In addition to Perry, five other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

UTM's Bell, EIU's Lora and Little and ECU's Berry Earn National Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 10: UT Martin linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Performer of the Week (and National Linebacker of the Week), Eastern Illinois' **Erik Lora** and **Shepard Little** shared National Punt Returner of the Week honors and Eastern Kentucky punter **Jordan Berry** was named National Punter of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in Week 10 of the 2013 season. TTU's Zinchini Named National Punter of the Week From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 7: Tennessee Tech's **Chad Zinchini** was named National Punter of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following his performance in week 7 of the 2013 season. Against UT Martin Zinchini punted four times for 201 yards (50.2 yards/punt) including a long of 61 yards. Three of his four punts ended up inside the Skyhawks 20-yard line. In addition to Zinchini, 11 other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

JSU's James, MSU's Powell and EKU's Berry Earn National Weekly Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 6: Jacksonville State's **DaMarcus James** was named National Running Back of the Week, Murray State's **Walter Powell** was named National Punt Returner of the Week and Eastern Kentucky's **Jordan Berry** was named National Punter of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week 6 of the 2013 season. James rushed 184 yards and three touchdowns in a win over No. 22 UT Martin. Powell returned a punt 88 yards for a touchdown in his team's win over Tennessee Tech. Berry averaged 48.7 yards/punt including a long of 77 yards in a victory over Austin Peay. In addition to the trio, four other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

EIU's Lora, TSU's Leonard Earn National Weekly Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 4: Eastern Illinois wide receiver **Erik Lora** was named National Wide Receiver of the Week while Tennessee State tight end **A.C. Leonard** was named National Tight End of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week 4 of the 2013 season. Lora caught 14 passes for 198 yards and three touchdowns as EIU lost by four points at FBS foe Northern Illinois. Leonard caught five passes for 122 yards and two touchdowns as TSU topped Tennessee Tech in its OVC opener. In addition to the duo, seven other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

Garoppolo, Powell and Thomas Earn National Weekly Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 3: Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named National Performer of the Week (and National Quarterback of the Week) by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following his performance in week three of the 2013 season. In addition Murray State's **Walter Powell** was named National All-Purpose Performer of the Week and National Kickoff Returner of the Week while Jacksonville State kicker **Griffin Thomas** was named National Placekicker of the Week. Garoppolo had 480 passing yards and seven touchdowns in his team's convincing victory over nationally-ranked Illinois State. Powell accounted for 306 all-purpose yards, catching 11 passes for 155 yards and four touchdowns (including the game-winner with 24 seconds remaining) and also returning a kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown. Thomas kicked five field goals as JSU topped North Alabama in double overtime. In addition to the duo, 15 other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

Bell Earns National Defensive Performer of the Week, Stevenson National Kickoff Returner of the Week Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 2: UT Martin junior linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Performer of the Week (and National Linebacker of the Week) while Tennessee State junior **Martine Stevenson** was named National Kickoff Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week two of the 2013 season. Bell had six tackles, 5.0 tackles-for-loss, 2.0 sacks, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery in UT Martin's game at FBS foe Boise State. Stevenson returned a kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown in TSU's road win over Florida A&M. In addition to the duo, nine (9) other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

Vanlier and Little Share National Punt Returner of the Week Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 1: Tennessee Tech sophomore **Ladarius Vanlier** and Eastern Illinois sophomore **Shepard Little** were each named the National Punt Returners of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week one of the 2013 season. Vanlier returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown as Tennessee Tech routed Cumberland University while Little returned a punt 60 yards for a touchdown to push EIU to a victory over FBS opponent San Diego State. In addition to the duo, six (6) other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

A Look at the Coaches: Seven of the nine head coaches from last season return to their schools in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. The only newcomers are Austin Peay's **Kirby Cannon** and Jacksonville State's **Bill Clark**. Southeast Missouri's **Tony Samuel** (who was fired after the season was complete) and UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** are now the longest tenured active coaches, each in the eighth seasons at their respective schools. Clark and TSU's **Rod Reed** are currently the only OVC football coaches serving as head coaches at their alma maters.

Preseason Forecasts: For the first time since 2007, Eastern Illinois was picked as the preseason favorite in the OVC. The defending champion Panthers picked up 12 of a possible 18 first-place votes to top the poll with 122 points. Eastern Kentucky was second (114 points, 4 first-place votes) while Tennessee State ranked third (90 points, 2 first-place votes). The poll was rounded out by Jacksonville State (87), UT Martin (78), Murray State and Tennessee Tech (tied with 53 points), Southeast Missouri (35) and Austin Peay (16). Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 36 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 14 times (38.9%). After eight years of not picking the champion right (2003-2010), the 2011 preseason poll picked the right champion after the league finished in a three-way tie. The coaches once again got the pick correct this season with Eastern Illinois.

EIU's Lora and TSU's Godbolt Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** was named 2013 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** was tabbed OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Tennessee State led the way with seven selections on the preseason team while Eastern Illinois had six and Eastern Kentucky had four. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (11 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included 10 players who were second-team selections in 2012. Of the 27 total selections, 19 were seniors and eight were juniors.

NFL Connections: As of December 5, there are 15 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters (8 active, 4 practice squad members and 3 on IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now with the Denver Broncos. Eight of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the eighth year the OVC has streamed live events, but second year the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2013 season marks the seventh of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in February or March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play in 2007. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games while Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy. UT Martin made it three straight years with the winning team going 3-0, completing the perfect season in 2010 to win its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech finished in a tie for the Trophy (2-1) and were declared co-champions. Tennessee State, however, will take home the actual trophy since they had gone the most seasons without winning it (2008, compared to 2009 for TTU). Last year TSU held on to the trophy by finishing 2-1 and winning the tiebreaker with UT Martin.

This season TSU once again claimed the championship, winning it outright by going 3-0 in the competition.

GAME NOTES: After winning its first playoff game since 1989, No. 2 national seed Eastern Illinois remains at home to host No. 7 national seed Towson who picked up its first-ever Division I playoff victory last week by topping Fordham. The matchup features two of the three finalists for the Walter Payton Award in Eastern Illinois senior QB Jimmy Garoppolo and Towson junior RB Terrance West. EIU boasts the No. 1 offense in the nation (595.5 yards/game) while Towson ranks 12th in that category (463.0 yards/game). The matchup is the first-ever between the two teams and the winner will be appearing in the FCS semifinals for the first-time ever.

SCOUTING TOWSON: Towson scored its first-ever FCS Playoff victory on Saturday with a 48-28 victory over No. 9 Fordham. That game was tied 21-21 at halftime before the Tigers outscored the Rams 27-7 in the second half. Quarterback Peter Athens was efficient, completing 13-of-15 passes for 301 and three touchdowns while All-American running back Terrance West carried the ball 24 times for 76 yards and three touchdowns. West leads the nation with 33 rushing touchdowns (and also has one receiving touchdown on the season). West is just two rushing touchdowns away from the FCS single-season record of 35 set by Delaware's Omar Cuff in 2007 (Cuff also has the total touchdown record of 39). West has carried the ball 325 times for 1,941 yards (6.0 ypc) this season and is averaging 149.3 yards/game. Now in his fifth season with the program, head coach Rob Ambrose has made Towson a winner. Ambrose returned to his alma mater after nine seasons as an assistant coach at Connecticut and after two losing seasons has led the team to 9-3, 7-4 and now 11-2 records over the last three years. The Tigers won the CAA (9-3, 7-1) and made the playoffs in 2011, were co-CAA champions a season ago (7-4 6-2) and finished as the conference runners-up this year. Towson started the year with a 33-18 victory over UConn (the program's first-ever win over an FBS foe) and only suffered losses to nationally-ranked Villanova and Delaware. Towson's 11 victories are the most in program history.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois continued its offensive explosion by rolling up 553 yards of total offense in a 51-10 victory over Tennessee State in its first playoff game last Saturday. The Panthers rank first nationally in total offense (595.5 yards/game) and scoring offense (48.9 points/game) and have scored 50 or more points in four of its last five games (and seven total times this season). The Panthers continue to win by impressive margins, winning its 12 games by a 30.8 points/game margin (only one of its games have been decided by less than 18 points this season). Walter Payton Finalist Jimmy Garoppolo (who ranks first nationally with 4,729 yards and 51 touchdowns) wasn't needed much in the win over TSU as the Panthers jumped out to a 37-0 halftime lead; the senior finished the game with 240 passing yards and three touchdowns before the offense went exclusively to a ground game. Although the team is known for its passing attack, the Panthers have averaged 308 yards/game on the ground in its last four contests, two of which came against nationally-ranked opponents (overall on the season the team ranks 46th nationally in rushing at 146.8 yards/game). Shepard Little rushed for 184 yards and two touchdowns on just 12 carries (15.3 yards/carry); Little now has 1,493 rushing yards on the season which is seventh nationally and just 29 yards away from cracking the OVC single-season top 10. Little also ranks seventh nationally in all-purpose yards/game (160.77). Senior wide receiver Erik Lora caught three passes (and a touchdown) in the win over TSU and enters this week needing just three more catches to rank second in NCAA FCS history (he currently has 314 catches). Lora is also just 26 receiving yards away from becoming the OVC's all-time leader in that category. The EIU defense continues to be overshadowed by the team's potent offense but continues to shine, ranking third nationally in turnover gained (35), first in fumbles recovered (21) and fifth in turnover margin (+1.1/game).

GAME NOTES: Contrasting styles will meet on Saturday on the red turf in Cheney, as Eastern Washington's passing attack will host Jacksonville State's potent rushing attack. Eastern Washington ranks fourth nationally in total offense (529 yards/game) and sixth in scoring offense (40.5 points/game), as they are led by Walter Payton Award finalist Vernon Adams. Jacksonville State ranks 11th nationally in total offense (240.1 yards/game) and has won back-to-back playoff games by a margin of 43-12. The game could come down to which team's defense plays the best; JSU ranks 50th nationally in total defense while EWU is 103rd entering the game. This marks the first-ever meeting between the two schools. EWU has hosted an OVC team before, however, knocking off Southeast Missouri in the second round of the 2010 playoffs on its way to the national championship. Eastern Washington is 18-1 in the month of November and beyond since the 2010 season and is 13-1 at home over the past two seasons (the only loss was to Sam Houston State in last year's semifinals). Jacksonville State is 6-1 on the road this season (with its lone loss coming at No. 2 Eastern Illinois).

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: After winning its first Division I playoff game in the first round Jacksonville State went on the road and won its second playoff game (and first road contest) by dominating McNeese State 31-10. The Gamecocks defense sacked McNeese State eight times in the first half (11 times in the game) and built a 21-0 halftime advantage. The Gamecocks rolled up 263 yards on the ground (while limiting the Cowboys to just 46 rushing yards) as DaMarcus James had 127 yards and three touchdowns to increase his OVC record rushing touchdowns total to 28 (the second-most nationally); James has scored a rushing touchdown in 11-straight games. Quarterback Eli Jenkins threw a touchdown pass just two minutes into the game and finished the contest with 120 passing and 97 rushing yards. Over its last five games (three coming against nationally-ranked opponents) JSU is averaging 42.0 points/game and 304.8 rushing yards/contest. On the year JSU has rushed for an OVC record 47 touchdowns (breaking the former record of 42 set in 1959 by MTSU). Robert Gray and Dustin Gayton each had three sacks against McNeese State while Ketrick Wolfe added two. The Gamecocks rank fourth nationally in sacks/game (3.57) and has set a school record with 50 total sacks this season (Guyton leads the way with 6.5). The defense has also been good against the pass this season, ranking sixth nationally in pass efficiency defense (101.41).

SCOUTING EASTERN WASHINGTON: In 12-degree weather Eastern Washington broke a 14-14 halftime tie by outscoring South Dakota State 27-3 in the second half on its way to a 41-17 victory at "The Inferno" on Saturday. The EWU rush defense (ranked 67th nationally allowing 172.5 yards/game) was able to limit the nation's leader rusher in the game, holding All-American Zack Zenner to just 71 yards on 21 carries (3.4) after he had been averaging nearly 150 yards a game and had eight-straight 100-yard contests. EWU's Vernon Adams threw for five touchdowns (including two in the third quarter) and Quincy Forte ran for 202 yards in the victory. Adams now has 51 passing touchdowns on the season, tied with EIU's Jimmy Garoppolo for the nationally lead (five away from the FCS single-season record). Freshman Cooper Kupp, a favorite to win the Jerry Rice Award (given to the top freshman in the FCS) caught two touchdowns in the victory and now has 20 on the season, breaking the FCS record for most touchdown catches by a freshman; he has a touchdown catch in all 13 EWU games this season. Eastern, the Big Sky Champions, started the year with a 49-46 victory over No. 25 FBS foe Oregon State and after suffering back-to-back losses to Toledo and Sam Houston State in September have now won nine games in a row. This year marks the 10th playoff appearance for the Eagles (with seven of those coming in the 10 years); the team is 12-8 all-time in the playoffs including winning the 2010 National Championship and advancing to the semifinals last season.
