NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: Three OVC teams will be in the postseason this year, marking the second-straight year that number has played in the postseason...Belmont will represent the OVC in the NCAA Tournament in its first year in the league while Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State will play in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT)...Belmont is a No. 11 seed in the NCAA Tournament and will play No. 6 seed Arizona in Salt Lake City; it marks the highest seed in the NCAA Tournament for Belmont, who is appearing in the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time in the last eight years...Overall OVC teams have won NCAA Tournament games in each of the past four years (Morehead State in 2009, Murray State in 2010, Morehead State in 2011 and Murray State in 2012), the first time in the 65-year history of the OVC that the league has won NCAA games in four-straight years...Belmont is in search of its first NCAA Tournament victory (currently 0-5); the Bruins have previously been matched up with No. 2 UCLA (2006), No. 2 Georgetown (2007), No. 2 Duke (2008), No. 4 Wisconsin (2011) and No. 3 Georgetown (2012)...In 2008 the Bruins pushed Duke to the limit before falling 71-70...Belmont is currently receiving votes in both the Associated Press and USA Today Top 25 polls...Belmont won the OVC regular season championship with a 14-2 overall conference mark; overall it was the team's fourth-straight regular season crown (they won three-straight Atlantic Sun titles before becoming to the OVC)...Belmont senior Ian Clark currently leads Division I in 3-point percentage (46.3%) and is 11th in 3-pointers made/game (3.09)...Entering the postseason, the OVC was ranked the 16th-best conference in the RPI; Belmont has a RPI of 19, Eastern Kentucky is at 69 and Tennessee State is at 105...Belmont was 6-2 against the Top 100 RPI and had the No. 2 non-conference strength of schedule nationally; the Bruins were seeded 44 out of 68 teams in this year's NCAA Tournament (ahead of four at-large teams)...This marks the first postseason appearance for ECU since 2010 (CBI) and its first trip ever to the CIT; Tennessee State is playing in the CIT for the second-straight year.

OVC One of Just 9 Conferences (3 Non-BCS) to Win NCAA Tournament Games in Each of Past Four Seasons: The OVC is one of just nine (9) Division I conferences to win a NCAA Tournament game in each of the past four years and one of just three non-BCS conferences to achieve the feat. The other non-BCS leagues to win a game in each of the last three years are the Atlantic 10 and West Coast Conferences. The ACC, Big 12, Big East, Big Ten, Pac-10/12 and SEC are the BCS-level conferences that have won at least one game in each of the past three years.

More on NCAA Success: The four-year winning streak in NCAA Tournament play is unprecedented in OVC history. After winning NCAA Tournament games in each 1987, 1988 and 1989, the OVC went 20 years without a NCAA victory. That changed in 2009 when Morehead State topped Alabama State 58-43 in front of a record crowd at the Opening Round game in Dayton, Ohio. A year later it was No. 13 seed Murray State who won, topping No. 4 seed Vanderbilt 66-65 when Danero Thomas nailed a buzzer-beater in San Jose. In 2011 it was Morehead State's turn again, as the Eagles were seeded 13th and sent to Denver to battle No. 4-seed Louisville. MSU got off to a 15-2 lead nearly eight minutes into the game but trailed 61-59 with 31 seconds to play. On its final possession senior Demonte Harper nailed a 3-pointer from the top of the key with 4.3 seconds remaining to give Morehead State the lead and Kenneth Faried blocked Louisville's last shot attempt to seal the victory. Last season it was Murray State who once again won, knocking off Colorado State 58-41 in the second round in a game played in Louisville. The Racers earned a No. 6 seed in that event, the highest seed ever for an OVC team since the tournament seeding began in 1979.

OVC Teams All-Time in the NCAA Tournament: The OVC enters the 2013 NCAA Tournament having won at least one game in the event in each of the past four years. OVC teams are 24-64 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.

OVC Teams All-Time in the CIT: Both Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee State will participate in the 2013 CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT). Austin Peay played in the 2009 event, Tennessee Tech competed in the event in 2011 and 2012 and Tennessee State also competed in the event in 2012; OVC teams are 0-4 all-time in the CIT. The CIT was established in 2009 with 16 teams in the field and expanded to 24 teams in 2011 and 32 teams in 2012.

Belmont Wins 2013 OVC Tournament Championship: With victories over Tennessee State and Murray State, Belmont claimed its first OVC Tournament Championship in its first year in the OVC. It marked the first time in the history of the 65-year league that a first-year program had won the OVC Tournament title.

Belmont Claims 2013 OVC Regular Season Championship: In its first year in the OVC Belmont won the OVC regular season championship, finishing 14-2 overall. Since the league was founded in 1948, outside of that inaugural year, no first-year member had ever won the OVC regular season title (or tournament title) until this season. Overall it marks the fourth-straight conference regular season title for Belmont, who won three-straight Atlantic Sun titles before joining the OVC; overall the Bruins have won six conference championships over the last eight years.

More on Belmont: Belmont is 2-2 against NCAA Tournament teams and 12-4 against teams playing in the postseason this year. Overall the Bruins are 83-19 (.814) over the past three years, the fourth-best winning percentage nationally over that time period (behind only Kansas, Ohio State and Duke). In addition Belmont joins just Kansas and Memphis as the only programs to earn automatic bids to the NCAA Tournament in six of the last eight years and is one of just four NCAA Division I non-football playing programs to reach the NCAA Tournament in six of the last eight years (joining Gonzaga, Marquette and Xavier).

Canaan Named to USBWA All-District Team For Second-Straight Year: Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** was named to the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) Men's All-District Team for District 4 in a vote by the 900-plus membership of the organization. Canaan, a senior from Biloxi, Miss., is on the USBWA All-District Team for the second-straight season after being picked to the team as a junior in 2012. The district is chosen from the rosters of the NCAA D-I teams from Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and Florida.

RPI: As of Monday, the OVC is rated as the 16th-best conference in Division I in the RPI (the highest the league has finished in the RPI over the past decade is 21st, doing so in 2005-06, 2009-10 and 2011-12). Belmont is 19th overall the RPI while Eastern Kentucky is 69th and Tennessee State is 105th.

Belmont Receiving Votes in Top 25: For the seventh week this season Belmont is receiving votes in the national Top 25 polls. The Bruins received votes in the USA Today Coaches Poll on Nov. 19 after its victory at Stanford, and then again on Feb. 4 and 11. After not receiving votes in the Feb. 18 poll, Belmont received votes each of the past four weeks. This week the team received 11 points in the Associated Press poll and 23 points in the USA Today poll.

Canaan Becomes 17th Member of OVC's 2,000-Point Club: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** became just the 17th member of the OVC's 2,000-Point Club in the Racers OVC Tournament semifinal victory over Eastern Kentucky. Canaan finished his career with 2,050 career points which is 14th in OVC history. He is the third OVC player in the last three years to reach the 2,000-Point Plateau (joining Morehead State's Kenneth Faried and Tennessee Tech's Kevin Murphy - both of who are playing in the NBA).

Clark and Canaan Named to Naismith Award Midseason Watch List: Belmont senior guard **Ian Clark** and Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** are two of 30 candidates nationally on the midseason list for the Naismith Player of the Year Award as announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. Canaan was on the preseason early list that included 50 players, while Clark makes his first appearance on the list this season. The Naismith Men's College Player of the Year presented by AT&T will be awarded on April 7, 2013 in Atlanta. In March, the Naismith Trophy voting academy will narrow the list to the four finalists.

Clark and Canaan Named to Two of 25 Finalists for Lou Henson Award by CollegeInsider.com: Belmont's **Ian Clark** and Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** are two of 25 finalists for the Lou Henson National Player of the Year Award by CollegeInsider.com. The award is presented annually to the top mid-major player in college basketball. It is named in honor of Lou Henson who retired after 41 years of coaching. The award will be presented at the CollegeInsider.com Awards Banquet in Atlanta during Final Four weekend.

Byrd Named Finalist for Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award: Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** has been named one of 20 finalists for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award by CollegeInsider.com. The Skip Prosser Award was established in 2008 to honor those who not only achieve success on the basketball court but who display moral integrity off of it as well. Prosser posted a career record of 291-146 in 14 seasons as a head coach. During his time at Wake Forest, his teams averaged 21 wins per season while playing in arguably the nation's most difficult league, the Atlantic Coast Conference. The 2013 recipient will be announced at the CollegeInsider.com awards banquet in Atlanta, site of the men's NCAA Basketball Championship. This marks the third time Byrd has been named finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award (2008, 2011).

Byrd Finalist for Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award: Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** has been named finalist for the 2013 Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award by CollegeInsider.com announced Wednesday. Aside from on-court success, Byrd also holds one of the highest head coach

ratings in the NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR). Moreover, for 13 consecutive years the Bruins have compiled a team G.P.A. of 3.0 or higher and Byrd has not had a player leave the Bruin program for any reason in over a decade. Byrd received the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award in 2011, following the Bruins' historic 30-5 season.

CollegelInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: In last week's CollegelInsider.com Mid-Major poll (March 11) Belmont was No. 3 while Murray State was No. 23 and Eastern Kentucky was in the others receiving votes. Gonzaga was ranked first and received all 31 first-place votes. Murray State finished the 2011-12 season ranked No. 1 in the poll, holding that spot for the final 12 weeks of the season; MSU was the first OVC team to ever be ranked No. 1 in the poll. Now in its 14th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, WAC and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

Belmont's Mann Named to Inaugural Allstate NABC Good Works Team: Belmont University men's basketball junior **J.J. Mann** has been named to the inaugural Allstate NABC Good Works Team® as announced by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and Allstate Insurance Company. He was one of just five Division I men's basketball players awarded the honor. The 6-6 guard/forward is extremely active in the Nashville community, giving of his time to numerous outreach projects. Among them, Mann serves as a regular volunteer for the Best Buddies Program, a tutor and activities leader at area schools, a server at the Nashville Rescue Mission, and member of Belmont's 2011 Sports Evangelism Mission Trip to Naples, Italy. The award recognizes a unique group of men's and women's college basketball student-athletes who have made outstanding contributions in the areas of volunteerism and civic involvement including building homes for the elderly, leading basketball clinics, reading to students and working with children with hearing disabilities.

Southeast Missouri Breaks OVC Record for 3-Pointers Made in a Game: In its victory over Austin Peay on Feb. 28, Southeast Missouri set a new OVC single-game record by knocking down 20 3-pointers (in 33 total attempts, a 60.6%). That broke the previous record of 19 set by Jacksonville State against Tennessee Temple in the 2007-08 season. The 20 made 3-pointers are the most by a Division I team this season.

OVC Tournament Once Again at Municipal Auditorium: The 2013 OVC Tournament was once again be played at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. (March 6-9). It marked the third-straight year the tournament has been at the venue and the eighth time the combined men's and women's tournaments have been held at the venue (1994, 1995, 1996, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012); the men's tournament was also held there in 1967. Beginning in 2011 the Championship switched to a format where the top eight men's and women's teams play in the merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds received two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds received one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round included the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements included upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium.

OVC Teams Compile 6-6 Record in Final Season of BracketBusters: OVC teams were 6-6 in the Ramada Worldwide BracketBuster games played on Saturday, Feb. 23. Belmont and Murray State capped off the night with back-to-back wins on ESPN2, as the Bruins thrashed 2012 NCAA Sweet 16 participant Ohio 81-62 and the Racers came from behind to best Top 80 RPI squad South Dakota State 73-62. Other OVC teams to win in BracketBusters this year were Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin. Eastern Kentucky was the third OVC team to have an ESPN TV game, as the Colonels lost at Valparaiso on ESPNU to kick off the day. This marked the first time the OVC had more than one team in a TV game in the series in the same year (and only the Missouri Valley Conference had more TV games this year with four). This was the 11th and final year of the event, which is an ESPN television property that allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involved "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there were 122 teams from 15 conferences in the pool of teams that will be selected for one of 13 nationally-televised games (5 on ESPN2, 4 on ESPNU and 4 on ESPN3). Overall OVC teams were 38-51 all-time in the BracketBusters event and 5-5 in TV games.

Murray State First OVC Team to Reach 600 Conference Victories: Murray State, who was a charter member of the OVC when the Conference was formed in 1948, became the first Conference member to reach 600 OVC wins with a victory over UT Martin on Jan. 3. No other league member currently has more than 500 Conference wins.

Two Teammates With 30 Points in Same Game: In Belmont's 107-72 victory over Southeast Missouri on Jan. 10, teammates **Ian Clark** and **Trevor Noack** each scored 30 points in the game. It marked the first time anywhere at the Division I level in 2012-13 that two teammates had scored 30 or more points in the same game. It was the first time that had happened in Division I since two other OVC players, Eastern Kentucky's Mike DiNunno (33) and Jaron Jones (30), did so in an overtime loss to Tennessee State on Jan. 28, 2012.

Two OVC Players Named to CoSIDA Capital One Academic All-District Team: Two Ohio Valley Conference student-athletes have been named to the Capital One Academic All-District® men's basketball teams as selected by CoSIDA. The selections were Tennessee Tech's **Dennis Ogbe** (3.86 GPA in electrical engineering) and Southeast Missouri's **Nick Niemczyk** (3.80 GPA in higher education). Both were first-team selections and for making the first-team had their names appear on the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-American. To be eligible for nomination, a student-athlete must have reached sophomore academic standing and have at least a 3.30 cumulative grade point average. District III selections include schools from the states of North Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia while District VI selections are from the states of Arkansas, Iowa, Louisiana, Minnesota, Missouri, Mississippi, North Dakota, South Dakota and Wisconsin.

Belmont's Johnson, Murray State's Canaan Named to Cousy Award Watch List: Belmont senior **Kerron Johnson** and Murray State senior **Isaiah Canaan** have been named to the watch list for the 2013 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award, which is presented by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The annual honor, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes the top point guards in men's college basketball. This watch list of candidates will be narrowed down to a final 20 around January 1st, final 10 near February 1st, and final five by approximately March 1st. A premier Selection Committee has been appointed by the Hall of Fame to review the final five candidates in contention for the nation's top collegiate point guard award. These Hall of Fame committees are made up of top college basketball personnel including media members, head coaches, Sports Information Directors and Hall of Famers. The winner of the 2013 Bob Cousy Award will be presented at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Championship Monday in Atlanta as part of NCAA Final Four weekend.

Canaan Named to Wooden Award Midseason Top 25 Watch List: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan**, who was one of 50 players named to the John Wooden Award Preseason Watch List, remained one of 25 players on the Midseason Watch List which was released in January. The players on the list are considered strong candidates for the midseason list and the official voting ballot, both of which are open to freshman and transfer students. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All American Team, consisting of the nation's top 10 players, will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round of the NCAA Tournament. The 37th annual Wooden Award ceremony will honor the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, and will include the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award. The event will take place the weekend of April 12-13, 2013.

Canaan Named Preseason All-American by Associated Press: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** was one of six players named to the Associated Press Preseason All-American team this season. Canaan was joined on the team by Indiana sophomore Cody Zeller, Creighton junior Doug McDermott, Lehigh senior C.J. McCollum, Ohio State junior Deshaun Thomas and Michigan sophomore Trey Burke. Canaan was named on 43 of the 65 media ballots, second only to McDermott (who was named on 62 ballots).

Canaan is Candidate for Senior CLASS Award: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** was one of 30 men's basketball student-athletes who are candidates for the Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition. The complete list of candidates follows this release. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate classes were narrowed to 10 men's and 10 women's finalists midway through the regular season (Canaan was not among the final 10).

No Freshmen: The SIUE men's basketball team is one of six Division I teams this season to not feature a freshman (either true or redshirt) on its roster. The other teams without a freshman include Ohio, Portland State, Savannah State, UAB and Valparaiso.

Canaan Named to All-Tournament Team at Charleston Classic: Murray State senior **Isaiah Canaan** was named to the Charleston Classic All-Tournament team after leading his team to a runner-up finish at the event. Canaan averaged 20.7 points, 3.7 assists and 3.0 rebounds/game as the Racers topped Auburn and St. John's before falling to Colorado.

Belmont's Clark and Noack Named to All-Tournament Team at Great Alaska Shootout: Belmont senior guard **Ian Clark** and senior forward **Trevor Noack** were named to the Great Alaska Shootout All-Tournament Team after leading his team to a third-place finish in the event. In the three games Clark averaged 16.3 points, 3.7 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 1.3 steals/game while hitting 51.6 percent (16-of-31) from the field and 59.1 percent (13-of-22) from 3-point range. In the Bruins win over host Alaska Anchorage he scored 14 points, dished out five assists and held UAA's leading scorer to just two field goals in 40 minutes. In the semifinal loss to Northeastern, Clark set a record in the 35-year old history of the Great Alaska Shootout by connecting on 9-of-11 (81.8) 3-pointers on his way to a game-high 29 points. In a third-place victory over Oral Roberts, Clark struggled offensively but limited ORU's top player (who entered the game averaged 24.0 points/game) to a season-low three points in 30 minutes of play. Noack averaged 13.7 points and 5.3 rebounds/game in scoring double figures in each game. He had 15 against each Alaska Anchorage and Oral Roberts and 11 against Northeastern. It marks the second-straight year an OVC player has been named to the event's All-Tournament Team (Murray State's Isaiah Canaan earned the honors last year).

OVC at 12 Schools for First Time With Addition of Belmont; League Begins First Year of Divisional Play: The addition of Belmont University on July 1, 2012 gave the OVC 12 member institutions, the largest the Conference has been since it was formed in 1948 (the OVC is currently the nation's eighth-oldest Division I conference). The 2012-13 also marks the first year that SIUE, who finished its reclassification process to Division I in August, is eligible for the postseason. The East Division includes Belmont, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech. The West Division includes Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri State, SIUE and UT Martin. The team who finishes first in each division will be guaranteed either the No. 1 or No. 2 seed for the OVC Tournament (and get a double bye into the semifinals); Seeds 3-8 in the tournament will be based on best Conference record, regardless of which division the team is from.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History; Byrd Ranks 7th Among Active NCAA Coaches: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 23rd year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 11 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 371 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 453 for his career (which ranks him 27th among Division I head coaches). Although he is in his first year in the OVC, Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** has 663 career victories, which ranks

seventh among active Division I head coaches.

The OVC Welcomes Four New Head Coaches: The OVC has four new head coaches this season. Tennessee State promoted head coach **Travis Williams** to its top spot after former coach John Cooper left for Miami (Ohio). Eastern Illinois is under the direction of **Jay Spoonhour** while Morehead State hired former Mississippi Valley State head coach **Sean Woods**. Although not new to his team, Belmont's **Rick Byrd** is new to the league as the Bruins are playing its first year in the league in 2012-13.

Former OVC Players in the NBA: Entering the 2012-13 season there are two former OVC players on NBA rosters. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his second season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. Faried was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team in 2012 after averaging 10.2 points and 7.7 rebounds/game in 46 contests. Former Tennessee Tech star **Kevin Murphy**, who scored 50 points in a game last season, was picked by the Utah Jazz with the 47th overall pick in the 2012 NBA Draft and begins his rookie season with the team. Murphy is currently playing with the Jazz's NBDL affiliate, the Reno BigHorns. Several other former NBA players are in the NBDL including Morehead State's **Demonte Harper** (Erie BayHawks), Tennessee Tech's **Liam McMorrow** (Iowa Energy), Jacksonville State's **Nick Murphy** (Iowa Energy) and Jacksonville State's **Walker Russell** (Fort Wayne Mad Ants).

The 2012-13 Season: The 2012-13 season marks the 65th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 64 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

Murray State's Canaan Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2012-13 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Murray State senior **Isaiah Canaan** who is the defending OVC Player of the Year and a preseason All-American selection. Overall six different schools were represented on the team with Belmont, Murray State, Southeast Missouri and Tennessee State having two selections apiece while SIUE and Tennessee Tech each had one selection to round out the team. The squad features three players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season, two players who were second-team selections and one player who was selected to the All-Newcomer squad. The team is comprised of eight seniors and two juniors. Last season Canaan was named the 2012 OVC Player of the Year and 2011-12 OVC Male Athlete of the Year after ranking 24th nationally in scoring (19.0), sixth in 3-point percentage (45.6%) and 13th in 3-pointers made/game (2.97). In addition to Canaan, Tennessee State senior forward **Robert Covington** and Tennessee Tech senior guard **Jud Dillard** were each first-team selections last year and are on the preseason team this year. The second-team selections from last year appearing on the preseason team this year are Southeast Missouri junior forward **Tyler Stone** and SIUE senior forward **Mark Yelovich**. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by the Belmont senior backcourt duo of **Kerron Johnson** and **Ian Clark**, Murray State senior forward **Ed Daniel**, Tennessee State junior guard **Patrick Miller** and Southeast Missouri senior guard **Marland Smith**.

Murray State, Belmont Picked as OVC Preseason Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors defending champion Murray State was picked the favorite in the West Division while newcomer Belmont was picked as the East Division favorite in the OVC for 2012-13. This year marks the first for divisional play in the OVC, which now includes 12 teams for the first time in Conference history. Murray State led the West Division voting, picking up 22 of a possible 24 first-place votes (schools were not allowed to vote for themselves) and 132 total points. Southeast Missouri State was tabbed second and picked up the remaining two first-place votes and 108 points. The West was rounded out by Austin Peay (92), SIUE (73), Eastern Illinois (49) and UT Martin (38). Belmont picked up 21 of the 24 first-place votes and 131 points to be picked the East Division favorites. Tennessee State was tabbed second and received the other three first-place votes and 109 points. The East was rounded out by Tennessee Tech (87), Morehead State (77) and Eastern Kentucky (56). Due to a NCAA APR penalty, Jacksonville State is ineligible for the OVC and NCAA Tournaments this season and was not included in the preseason voting.

Dial Global to Broadcast OVC Championship Game: For the fourth consecutive season, the 2013 Men's Basketball Championship game will be broadcast by the Dial Global (formerly Westwood One) radio network, the largest provider of audio content in America. Dial Global is one of the nation's largest providers of network radio programming and one of the largest domestic providers of traffic information in the U.S. Dial Global serves more than 5,000 radio and 170 TV stations in the U.S. Dial Global provides over 150 news, sports, music, talk and entertainment programs, features and live events to numerous media partners. Dial Global is home of the most prestigious sports broadcasts on radio. Dial Global's lineup includes regular season NFL football, the Playoffs and the Super Bowl; NCAA Football and Basketball including the Final Four; College World Series; Frozen Four; the Olympics; the Masters and more.

Replay Systems for OVC Basketball Venues Enter Year six: On Dec. 21, 2007, the Ohio Valley Conference mandated the use of courtside replay systems at all OVC basketball venues. The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.
