PLAYER

Corey Wilford, G • Sr., 6-2, 180 • Hopkinsville, Ky. • Southeast Missouri

Wilford averaged 21.0 points, 3.0 assists and 1.5 rebounds/game while hitting 56.0 percent (14-of-25) from the field and 61.9 percent (13-of-21) from 3-point range in road victories over Austin Peay and Murray State, the first time in school history Southeast Missouri had swept those teams on the same road trip. At Austin Peay the senior hit his first six 3-point attempts and finished the game 8-of-12 from long range as he had a team-high 26 points and helped the team end a 14-game losing streak in Clarksville. Two days later he knocked down 5-of-9 3-pointers and scored 16 points at Murray State as Southeast topped the Racers on their home court for the first time since the 2006-07 season.

NEWCOMER

A.J. Jones, G • Jr., 6-4, 200 • Memphis, Tenn. • Southeast Missouri

Jones did not miss a field goal attempt in two games last week as Southeast Missouri won a pair of road games to earn the No. 6 seed in this week's OVC Tournament. The transfer from Paris Junior College averaged 13.5 points, 5.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists/game while hitting 9-of-9 from the floor, 4-of-4 from 3-point range and 5-of-6 at the free throw line. Jones started the week with seven points, four rebounds and five assists in just 13 minutes of action against Austin Peay. Two days later he hit 6-of-6 field goals, including 4-of-4 from 3-point range, on his way to 20 points at Murray State. He scored 15 of those 20 points in only eight first half minutes as the Redhawks topped the West Division leaders by 16 points.

FRESHMAN

Chris Horton, C • Fr., 6-8, 205 • Decatur, Ga. • Austin Peay

Horton capped his rookie season by averaging 11.0 points, 5.5 rebounds and 4.5 blocks/game while hitting 53.3 percent (8-of-15) from the field and 85.7 percent (6-of-7) from the free throw line in a pair of games. Horton had 12 points, four rebounds and two blocks in a loss to Southeast Missouri and followed it with 10 points, seven rebounds and seven blocked shots in the season-ending victory over UT Martin. That marked the fourth time this season Horton had blocked seven shots in a game. He finished the year with 100 blocks, the fourth-most in OVC single-season history. Horton earned OVC Freshman of the Week honors nine times this season, the second-most in OVC history (behind only 11 awards from EKU's Matt Witt in the 2002-03 season). Horton's 3.2 blocks/game currently ranks sixth nationally.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Winning Streak in NCAA Tournament Ends; Conference Has Still Won a Game in Four of Past Five Years: Despite not winning a game in the 2013 NCAA Tournament, the OVC has won a NCAA Tournament game in four of the past five years. The four-year winning streak came to an end this season, as the OVC had been one of just nine conferences (3 non-BCS) to win a game from 2009-12.

OVC Teams All-Time in the NCAA Tournament: Following the 2013 season, OVC teams are 24-65 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.

OVC Teams All-Time in the CIT: Eastern Kentucky scored the first victory for an OVC team in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) this season, topping Gardner-Webb on the road in the first round. The Colonels lost to Evansville in the second round. Evansville topped the other OVC team in the event, Tennessee State, in the first round. Austin Peay played in the 2009 event, Tennessee Tech competed in the event in 2011 and 2012 and Tennessee State also competed in the event in 2012; OVC teams are now 1-6 all-time in the CIT. The CIT was established in 2009 with 16 teams in the field and expanded to 24 teams in 2011 and 32 teams in 2012.

Belmont Wins 2013 OVC Tournament Championship: With victories over Tennessee State and Murray State, Belmont claimed its first OVC Tournament Championship in its first year in the OVC. It marked the first time in the history of the 65-year league that a first-year program had won the OVC Tournament title.

Belmont Claims 2013 OVC Regular Season Championship: In its first year in the OVC Belmont won the OVC regular season championship, finishing 14-2 overall. Since the league was founded in 1948, outside of that inaugural year, no first-year member had ever won the OVC regular season title (or tournament title) until this season. Overall it marks the fourth-straight conference regular season title for Belmont, who won three-straight Atlantic Sun titles before joining the OVC; overall the Bruins have won six conference championships over the last eight years.

Canaan and Clark Named Associated Press Honorable Mention All-Americans: OVC Co-Players of the Year **Isaiah Canaan** and **Ian Clark** were each named honorable mention All-Americans by the Associated Press following the season.

Clark Named to Lute Olson All-American Team: Belmont senior guard **Ian Clark** was named to the Lute Olson All-American Team by CollegeInsider.com following the season. Clark was one of 21 players nationally selected to the team. Clark was joined on the team by the likes of Cody Zeller, Otto Porter, Jr., Shabazz Muhammad and Doug McDermott.

Canaan Named to Lou Henson Mid-Major All-American Team: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** was one of 25 players named to the Lou Henson Mid-Major All-American Team by CollegeInsider.com.

Clark Named to Lefty Driesell Defensive All-American Team: Belmont senior Ian Clark was named to the Lefty Driesell Defensive All-American Team by CollegeInsider.com following the season. Clark, who was also named OVC Defensive Player of the Year, was a key defensive part of the Belmont team that was second in the OVC in scoring defense and field goal percentage defense.

Canaan Named to USBWA All-District Team For Second-Straight Year: Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** was named to the U.S. Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) Men's All-District Team for District 4 in a vote by the 900-plus membership of the organization. Canaan, a senior from Biloxi, Miss., is on the USBWA All-District Team for the second-straight season after being picked to the team as a junior in 2012. The district is chosen from the rosters of the NCAA D-I teams from Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and Florida.

OVC Finishes 16th in RPI: In the final ratings of the 2012-13 season the OVC was rated as the 16th-best conference in Division I in the RPI. It marks the highest finish for the league in the RPI over the past decade (the previous high had been 21st which was done in 2005-06, 2009-10 and 2011-12). Belmont was the highest OVC team in the RPI at 24th overall while Eastern Kentucky was 69th.

Belmont Receives Votes in Final Top 25 Polls: For the eighth different week this season Belmont received votes in the national Top 25 polls. The Bruins received votes in the USA Today Coaches Poll on Nov. 19 after its victory at Stanford, and then again on Feb. 4 and 11. After not receiving votes in the Feb. 18 poll, Belmont received votes each of the final five weeks of the season. The team received 11 points in the final Associated Press poll (which was released at the end of the regular season) and one point in the final USA Today poll.

Canaan Becomes 17th Member of OVC's 2,000-Point Club: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** became just the 17th member of the OVC's 2,000-Point Club in the Racers OVC Tournament semifinal victory over Eastern Kentucky. Canaan finished his career with 2,050 career points which is 14th in OVC history. He is the third OVC player in the last three years to reach the 2,000-Point Plateau (joining Morehead State's Kenneth Faried and Tennessee Tech's Kevin Murphy - both of who are playing in the NBA).

Canaan and Clark Participate in College 3-Point Championship: Murray State senior **Isaiah Canaan** and Belmont senior **Ian Clark** each participated in the Hampton Hotels Men's 3-Point Championship at the State Farm College Slam Dunk & 3-Point Championships held in Atlanta in conjunction with this year's Men's Final Four. The duo, the OVC Co-Players of the Year, were two of eight players who participated in the event. Clark finished third overall while Canaan did not advance past the first round.

Neubauer Named NABC District 19 Coach of the Year: Eastern Kentucky's **Jeff Neubauer** was selected as the 2013 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) All-District 19 Coach of the Year. Neubauer helped the team to a school record 25 wins and the program's first victory in a national postseason tournament game (the CIT) in 68 years. Along the way Neubauer became Eastern's second winningest coach and the first coach in program history to lead his team to three 20-win seasons. The Colonels were picked to finish fifth in the six-team Ohio Valley Conference East Division, but entered the final day of the regular season with a chance to claim a share of the conference championship. EKV finished with the second best record in the OVC at 12-4.

Clark and Canaan Named to Naismith Award Midseason Watch List: Belmont senior guard **Ian Clark** and Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** are two of 30 candidates nationally on the midseason list

2013 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2013 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 6-9 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. The tournament features eight men's and eight women's teams in a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on the OVC Digital Network. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 8 at 6 and 8 p.m. and televised on ESPN and ESPN3. The championship game on Saturday, March 9 is at 6 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 8 (ESPN3) and the women's championship game is on March 9 at 1:30 p.m. (ESPN3).

This marks the 19th time in 20 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

CREDENTIALS. For the fourth year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, MARCH 4 at 1 p.m.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).



for the Naismith Player of the Year Award as announced by the Atlanta Tipoff Club. Canaan was on the preseason early list that included 50 players, while Clark makes his first appearance on the list this season.

Clark and Canaan Named to Two of 25 Finalists for Lou Henson Award by CollegeInsider.com: Belmont's **Ian Clark** and Murray State's **Isaiah Canaan** are two of 25 finalists for the Lou Henson National Player of the Year Award by CollegeInsider.com. The award is presented annually to the top mid-major player in college basketball. It is named in honor of Lou Henson who retired after 41 years of coaching.

Byrd Named Finalist for Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award: Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** has been named one of 20 finalists for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award by CollegeInsider.com. The Skip Prosser Award was established in 2008 to honor those who not only achieve success on the basketball court but who display moral integrity off of it as well. Prosser posted a career record of 291-146 in 14 seasons as a head coach. During his time at Wake Forest, his teams averaged 21 wins per season while playing in arguably the nation's most difficult league, the Atlantic Coast Conference. The 2013 recipient will be announced at the CollegeInsider.com awards banquet in Atlanta, site of the men's NCAA Basketball Championship. This marks the third time Byrd has been named finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award (2008, 2011).

Byrd Finalist for Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award: Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** has been named finalist for the 2013 Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award by CollegeInsider.com announced Wednesday. Aside from on-court success, Byrd also holds one of the highest head coach ratings in the NCAA Academic Progress Rate (APR). Moreover, for 13 consecutive years the Bruins have compiled a team G.P.A. of 3.0 or higher and Byrd has not had a player leave the Bruin program for any reason in over a decade. Byrd received the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award in 2011, following the Bruins' historic 30-5 season.

CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: In the final CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major poll of the year Belmont was No. 5 while Eastern Kentucky and Murray State were among the others receiving votes. Wichita State finished No. 1 and received 30 of the 31 first-place votes (Gonzaga picked up the other vote). Murray State finished the 2011-12 season ranked No. 1 in the poll, holding that spot for the final 12 weeks of the season; MSU was the first OVC team to ever be ranked No. 1 in the poll. Now in its 14th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Great West, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, WAC and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

Belmont's Mann Named to Inaugural Allstate NABC Good Works Team: Belmont University men's basketball junior **J.J. Mann** has been named to the inaugural Allstate NABC Good Works Team® as announced by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and Allstate Insurance Company. He was one of just five Division I men's basketball players awarded the honor. The 6-6 guard/forward is extremely active in the Nashville community, giving of his time to numerous outreach projects. Among them, Mann serves as a regular volunteer for the Best Buddies Program, a tutor and activities leader at area schools, a server at the Nashville Rescue Mission, and member of Belmont's 2011 Sports Evangelism Mission Trip to Naples, Italy. The award recognizes a unique group of men's and women's college basketball student-athletes who have made outstanding contributions in the areas of volunteerism and civic involvement including building homes for the elderly, leading basketball clinics, reading to students and working with children with hearing disabilities.

Eastern Illinois Earns OVC Team Sportsmanship Award: The Eastern Illinois was the recipient of the 2012-13 Team Sportsmanship Award for men's basketball. Voted on by the student-athletes and coaches of the respective sports, the team awards are bestowed upon the Conference squads deemed to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical behavior as outlined by the OVC and NCAA. Included in the areas for evaluation are the conduct of student-athletes, coaches, staff and administrators and fans. Implemented in August 2005, the team honors are the most recent addition to an awards program that recognizes and celebrates sportsmanship within the Conference.

Southeast Missouri Breaks OVC Record for 3-Pointers Made in a Game: In its victory over Austin Peay on Feb. 28, Southeast Missouri set a new OVC single-game record by knocking down 20 3-pointers (in 33 total attempts, a 60.6%). That broke the previous record of 19 set by Jacksonville State against Tennessee Temple in the 2007-08 season. The 20 made 3-pointers are the most by a Division I team this season.

OVC Tournament Once Again at Municipal Auditorium: The 2013 OVC Tournament was once again be played at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. (March 6-9). It marked the third-straight year the tournament has been at the venue and the eighth time the combined men's and women's tournaments have been held at the venue (1994, 1995, 1996, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012); the men's tournament was also held there in 1967. Beginning in 2011 the Championship switched to a format where the top eight men's and women's teams play in the merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds received two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds received one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round included the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements included upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium.

OVC Teams Compile 6-6 Record in Final Season of BracketBusters: OVC teams were 6-6 in the Ramada Worldwide BracketBuster games played on Saturday, Feb. 23. Belmont and Murray State capped off the night with back-to-back wins on ESPN2, as the Bruins thrashed 2012 NCAA Sweet 16 participant Ohio 81-62 and the Racers came from behind to best Top 80 RPI squad South Dakota State 73-62. Other OVC teams to win in BracketBusters this year were Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin. Eastern Kentucky was the third OVC team to have an ESPN TV game, as the Colonels lost at Valparaiso on ESPNU to kick off the day. This marked the first time the OVC had more than one team in a TV game in the series in the same year (and only the Missouri Valley Confer-

ence had more TV games this year with four). This was the 11th and final year of the event, which is an ESPN television property that allowed Division I conferences to participate in a cutting-edge format that involved "wild card" pairings from the pool of participating teams, with half of the BracketBusters teams pre-designated as "home" and the remaining half as "road" teams. This year there were 122 teams from 15 conferences in the pool of teams that will be selected for one of 13 nationally-televised games (5 on ESPN2, 4 on ESPNU and 4 on ESPN3). Overall OVC teams were 38-51 all-time in the BracketBusters event and 5-5 in TV games.

Murray State First OVC Team to Reach 600 Conference Victories: Murray State, who was a charter member of the OVC when the Conference was formed in 1948, became the first Conference member to reach 600 OVC wins with a victory over UT Martin on Jan. 3. No other league member currently has more than 500 Conference wins.

Two Teammates With 30 Points in Same Game: In Belmont's 107-72 victory over Southeast Missouri on Jan. 10, teammates **Ian Clark** and **Trevor Noack** each scored 30 points in the game. It marked the first time anywhere at the Division I level in 2012-13 that two teammates had scored 30 or more points in the same game. It was the first time that had happened in Division I since two other OVC players, Eastern Kentucky's Mike DiNunno (33) and Jaron Jones (30), did so in an overtime loss to Tennessee State on Jan. 28, 2012.

Two OVC Players Named to CoSIDA Capital One Academic All-District Team: Two Ohio Valley Conference student-athletes have been named to the Capital One Academic All-District® men's basketball teams as selected by CoSIDA. The selections were Tennessee Tech's **Dennis Ogbe** (3.86 GPA in electrical engineering) and Southeast Missouri's **Nick Niemczyk** (3.80 GPA in higher education). Both were first-team selections and for making the first-team had their names appear on the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-American. To be eligible for nomination, a student-athlete must have reached sophomore academic standing and have at least a 3.30 cumulative grade point average. District III selections include schools from the states of North Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia while District VI selections are from the states of Arkansas, Iowa, Louisiana, Minnesota, Missouri, Mississippi, North Dakota, South Dakota and Wisconsin.

Belmont's Johnson, Murray State's Canaan Named to Cousy Award Watch List: Belmont senior **Kerron Johnson** and Murray State senior **Isaiah Canaan** have been named to the watch list for the 2013 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award, which is presented by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. The annual honor, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes the top point guards in men's college basketball. This watch list of candidates will be narrowed down to a final 20 around January 1st, final 10 near February 1st, and final five by approximately March 1st. A premier Selection Committee has been appointed by the Hall of Fame to review the final five candidates in contention for the nation's top collegiate point guard award. These Hall of Fame committees are made up of top college basketball personnel including media members, head coaches, Sports Information Directors and Hall of Famers. The winner of the 2013 Bob Cousy Award will be presented at the Hall of Fame's Class Announcement on Championship Monday in Atlanta as part of NCAA Final Four weekend.

Canaan Named to Wooden Award Midseason Top 25 Watch List: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan**, who was one of 50 players named to the John Wooden Award Preseason Watch List, remained one of 25 players on the Midseason Watch List which was released in January. The players on the list are considered strong candidates for the midseason list and the official voting ballot, both of which are open to freshman and transfer students. The National Ballot consists of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining at least a cumulative 2.0 GPA. The Wooden Award All American Team, consisting of the nation's top 10 players, will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round of the NCAA Tournament. The 37th annual Wooden Award ceremony will honor the Men's and Women's Wooden Award winners, and will include the presentation of the Wooden Award All American Teams and the Legends of Coaching Award. The event will take place the weekend of April 12-13, 2013.

Canaan Named Preseason All-American by Associated Press: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** was one of six players named to the Associated Press Preseason All-American team this season. Canaan was joined on the team by Indiana sophomore Cody Zeller, Creighton junior Doug McDermott, Lehigh senior C.J. McCollum, Ohio State junior Deshaun Thomas and Michigan sophomore Trey Burke. Canaan was named on 43 of the 65 media ballots, second only to McDermott (who was named on 62 ballots).

Canaan is Candidate for Senior CLASS Award: Murray State senior guard **Isaiah Canaan** was one of 30 men's basketball student-athletes who are candidates for the Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition. The complete list of candidates follows this release. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

No Freshmen: The SIUE men's basketball team is one of six Division I teams this season to not feature a freshman (either true or redshirt) on its roster. The other teams without a freshman include Ohio, Portland State, Savannah State, UAB and Valparaiso.

Canaan Named to All-Tournament Team at Charleston Classic: Murray State senior **Isaiah Canaan** was named to the Charleston Classic All-Tournament team after leading his team to a runner-up finish at the event. Canaan averaged 20.7 points, 3.7 assists and 3.0 rebounds/game as the Racers topped Auburn and St. John's before falling to Colorado.

Belmont's Clark and Noack Named to All-Tournament Team at Great Alaska Shootout: Belmont senior guard **Ian Clark** and senior forward **Trevor Noack** were named to the Great Alaska Shootout All-Tournament Team after leading his team to a third-place finish in the event. In the three games Clark averaged 16.3 points, 3.7 assists, 3.0 rebounds and 1.3 steals/game while hitting 51.6 percent (16-of-31) from the field and 59.1 percent (13-of-22) from 3-point range. In the Bruins win over host Alaska Anchorage he scored 14 points, dished out five assists and held UAA's leading scorer to just two field goals in 40 minutes. In the semifinal loss to Northeastern, Clark set a record in the 35-year old

history of the Great Alaska Shootout by connecting on 9-of-11 (81.8) 3-pointers on his way to a game-high 29 points. In a third-place victory over Oral Roberts, Clark struggled offensively but limited ORU's top player (who entered the game averaged 24.0 points/game) to a season-low three points in 30 minutes of play. Noack averaged 13.7 points and 5.3 rebounds/game in scoring double figures in each game. He had 15 against each Alaska Anchorage and Oral Roberts and 11 against Northeastern. It marks the second-straight year an OVC player has been named to the event's All-Tournament Team (Murray State's Isaiah Canaan earned the honors last year).

OVC at 12 Schools for First Time With Addition of Belmont; League Begins First Year of Divisional Play: The addition of Belmont University on July 1, 2012 gave the OVC 12 member institutions, the largest the Conference has been since it was formed in 1948 (the OVC is currently the nation's eighth-oldest Division I conference). The 2012-13 also marks the first year that SIUE, who finished its reclassification process to Division I in August, is eligible for the postseason. The East Division includes Belmont, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech. The West Division includes Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri State, SIUE and UT Martin. The team who finishes first in each division will be guaranteed either the No. 1 or No. 2 seed for the OVC Tournament (and get a double bye into the semifinals); Seeds 3-8 in the tournament will be based on best Conference record, regardless of which division the team is from.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History; Byrd Ranks 7th Among Active NCAA Coaches: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 23rd year at Austin Peay where he also serves as the Athletics Director, making him the only Division I head men's basketball coach to hold that distinction. Loos is one of just 11 active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years. Loos now has 371 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 453 for his career (which ranks him 27th among Division I head coaches). Although he is in his first year in the OVC, Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** has 663 career victories, which ranks seventh among active Division I head coaches.

The OVC Welcomes Four New Head Coaches: The OVC has four new head coaches this season. Tennessee State promoted head coach **Travis Williams** to its top spot after former coach John Cooper left for Miami (Ohio). Eastern Illinois is under the direction of **Jay Spoonhour** while Morehead State hired former Mississippi Valley State head coach **Sean Woods**. Although not new to his team, Belmont's **Rick Byrd** is new to the league as the Bruins are playing its first year in the league in 2012-13.

Former OVC Players in the NBA: Entering the 2012-13 season there are two former OVC players on NBA rosters. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his second season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. Faried was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team in 2012 after averaging 10.2 points and 7.7 rebounds/game in 46 contests. Former Tennessee Tech star **Kevin Murphy**, who scored 50 points in a game last season, was picked by the Utah Jazz with the 47th overall pick in the 2012 NBA Draft and begins his rookie season with the team. Murphy is currently playing with the Jazz's NBDL affiliate, the Reno BigHorns. Several other former NBA players are in the NBDL including Morehead State's **Demonte Harper** (Erie BayHawks), Tennessee Tech's **Liam McMorrow** (Iowa Energy), Jacksonville State's **Nick Murphy** (Iowa Energy) and Jacksonville State's **Walker Russell** (Fort Wayne Mad Ants).

The 2012-13 Season: The 2012-13 season marks the 65th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 64 years, 12 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

Murray State's Canaan Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2012-13 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Murray State senior **Isaiah Canaan** who is the defending OVC Player of the Year and a preseason All-American selection. Overall six different schools were represented on the team with Belmont, Murray State, Southeast Missouri and Tennessee State having two selections apiece while SIUE and Tennessee Tech each had one selection to round out the team. The squad features three players who were All-OVC first-team selections last season, two players who were second-team selections and one player who was selected to the All-Newcomer squad. The team is comprised of eight seniors and two juniors. Last season Canaan was named the 2012 OVC Player of the Year and 2011-12 OVC Male Athlete of the Year after ranking 24th nationally in scoring (19.0), sixth in 3-point percentage (45.6%) and 13th in 3-pointers made/game (2.97). In addition to Canaan, Tennessee State senior forward **Robert Covington** and Tennessee Tech senior guard **Jud Dillard** were each first-team selections last year and are on the preseason team this year. The second-team selections from last year appearing on the preseason team this year are Southeast Missouri junior forward **Tyler Stone** and SIUE senior forward **Mark Yelovich**. The Preseason All-OVC team was rounded out by the Belmont senior backcourt duo of **Kerron Johnson** and **Ian Clark**, Murray State senior forward **Ed Daniel**, Tennessee State junior guard **Patrick Miller** and Southeast Missouri senior guard **Marland Smith**.

Murray State, Belmont Picked as OVC Preseason Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors defending champion Murray State was picked the favorite in the West Division while newcomer Belmont was picked as the East Division favorite in the OVC for 2012-13. This year marks the first for divisional play in the OVC, which now includes 12 teams for the first time in Conference history. Murray State led the West Division voting, picking up 22 of a possible 24 first-place votes (schools were not allowed to vote for themselves) and 132 total points. Southeast Missouri State was tabbed second and picked up the remaining two first-place votes and 108 points. The West was rounded out by Austin Peay (92), SIUE (73), Eastern Illinois (49) and UT Martin (38). Belmont picked up 21 of the 24 first-place votes and 131 points to be picked the East Division favorites. Tennessee State was tabbed second and received the other three first-place votes and 109 points. The East was rounded out by Tennessee Tech (87), Morehead State (77) and Eastern Kentucky (56). Due to a NCAA APR penalty, Jacksonville State is ineligible for the OVC and NCAA Tournaments this season and was not included in the preseason voting.

The systems were put into place in January 2008 and have been used since. The systems are used in situations that are outlined by NCAA rules.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the seventh year the OVC has streamed live events, but first time the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format and will feature improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

Team Notes

It its first season in the OVC, Belmont won both the OVC regular season and tournament championships, becoming the first team in league history to claim either title in its first year in the league...Overall it was the program's fourth-straight regular conference title (they won the A-Sun in 2010, 2011 and 2012) and sixth conference crown in the last eight years...Belmont topped Tennessee State and Murray State in the OVC Tournament to earn the league's automatic bid (although with a Top 20 RPI and No. 2 non-conference strength of schedule, the team would have likely been an at-large selection to the NCAA Tournament)...Senior Ian Clark was named OVC Co-Player of the Year after ranking among the nation's leaders in 3-point percentage (45.9% - 3rd) and 3-pointers made/game (3.1 - 11th)...Clark was named a Lute Olson All-American by CollegeInsider.com after the season...Clark finished his career as the school's all-time leading scorer in its NCAA era...Clark was one of eight players to participate in the College 3-Point Championship at the Final Four in Atlanta (finishing third)...Senior Kerron Johnson was named MVP of the OVC Tournament after hitting the game-tying shot against Murray State to send the game into overtime and the game-winning shot in overtime...Belmont received a No. 11 seed in the NCAA Tournament (the highest seed in its six NCAA trips) and squared off with No. 6 seed Arizona in Salt Lake City...The Bruins came up on the short-end of that game losing 81-64 in what was the team's sixth NCAA Tournament appearance in the past eight years...Belmont was one of only three schools nationwide (Kansas and Memphis being the others) to have earned automatic NCAA bids in six of the last eight years...Belmont finished the year ranked first in the OVC in scoring (76.8 points/game), field goal percentage (49.1%), steals (9.8/game) and scoring margin (+12.2/game).

Team Notes

Murray State saw its reign of winning three-straight OVC regular season championships come to an end this season, as the Racers were 10-6 overall, but did finish first in the West Division...The Racers topped Eastern Kentucky in the OVC Tournament semifinals before falling in overtime to Belmont in the OVC Championship game...The Racers were not selected for the NIT, ending a three-year run of postseason play for the team (2 NCAA and 1 NIT appearance)...All-American Isaiah Canaan, the OVC Co-Player of the Year, finished his career with 2,050 points, becoming just the 17th player in OVC history (and third in as many years) to score 2,000 points in a career...Canaan also finished his career with 304 career 3-pointers, the second-most in OVC history (behind only 319 from APSU's Joe Sibbitt)...Canaan finished the season ranked sixth nationally in scoring (21.8) and was named to the Lou Henson All-American Team by CollegeInsider.com...Senior Ed Daniel finished the year ranked 14th nationally in rebounding (10.0) and 15th in double-doubles (15); Daniel nearly doubled his scoring and rebounding averages from his junior to senior seasons...Canaan and Daniel were named to the All-OVC first-team following the season...The senior class that included Canaan, Daniel and Jordan Burge finished their careers with 106 victories, the most by a four-year class in school history...Following the year Canaan was one of eight players to participate in the College 3-Point Championship held at the Final Four in Atlanta.

After winning two games in the final week of the season, Southeast Missouri earned the No. 6 seed for the OVC Tournament...The Redhawks topped Eastern Illinois in the first round by a 78-68 margin before falling to Eastern Kentucky 84-69 in the quarterfinals...Southeast Missouri has now won first round OVC Tournament games in each of the past three seasons but has been unable to advance past the quarterfinal round; after failing to make the OVC Tournament field from 2008-10, the squad has now appeared in the field in three-straight years (and in three of four years under head coach Dickey Nutt)...Junior Tyler Stone was named to the All-OVC second-team after averaging 15.5 points (8th in the OVC) and 7.8 rebounds (5th in the OVC) while hitting 49.2 percent from the field (12th in the OVC)...Senior Marland Smith finished his career with 251 made 3-pointers (10th in OVC history) and 697 3-point attempts (8th in OVC history)...In a victory over Austin Peay on Feb. 28, the Redhawks set a new OVC single-game record for 3-pointers made, hitting 20-of-33 (60.6%)...The 20 3-pointers made is tied for the most by a Division I team this season...As a team Southeast Missouri finished first in the OVC in 3-point percentage (39.8%), field goal percentage defense (40.2%) and assists (15.8/game)...That 3-point percentage ranked the team eighth nationally.
