Now in its 65th year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference. In May 2011 the Conference expanded for the second time in four years, adding Belmont University which began competition in the 2012-13 academic year. The addition of Belmont gave the OVC 12 members, the most the league has had at one time in its illustrious history. The move added a second team in the city of Nashville and was the first addition to the league since Southern Illinois University Edwardsville joined in 2008.

The 2009-10 school year saw a change in leadership as Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28. She is currently one of just five females to be the head of a Division I conference, and one of just eight to lead a Division I conference all-time. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud past dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles (Turkey) Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged Feb. 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.


Now in its seventh decade of competition, the Ohio Valley Conference includes charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Belmont University Eastern Illinois University, Jacksonville State University, Southeast Missouri State University, Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin.

The league's baseball presence has continued to evolve since its inception. The OVC baseball tournament moved to a neutral site for the first time in 2001 with Paducah, Ky. and Brooks Stadium hosting the tournament in front of raucous crowds. The success of the tournament led to Jackson, Tenn. and The Ballpark at Jackson – the home of the Seattle Mariner's Class AA affiliate – hosting the tournament three years ago.

The OVC also has made a statement in the NCAA Baseball Championship in recent years, with its teams involved in several memorable contests in the last decade. Tennessee Tech surprised Wake Forest in the opening round of the 2001 tournament and Southeast Missouri stunned host Alabama in the opening round of the 2002

championship. Five later, Austin Peay captured the collegiate baseball world's attention by taking Vanderbilt, the 2007 No. 1 overall seed, to extra innings. Eastern Illinois pushed host Nebraska to the limit in 2008 followed by Tennessee Tech's memorable contest against host Clemson in 2009. In 2011 Austin Peay topped host Georgia Tech in the first game of the Atlanta Regional and a season ago the Govs won two games in the Eugene Regional.

To begin the 2013 season, there were five former OVC players on Major League rosters (Austin Peay's Shawn Kelley, Matt Reynolds and A.J. Ellis, Morehead State's Jon Rauch and Tennessee Tech's Stephen Pryor).





2012 CHAMPIONS



Austin Peay claimed the 2012 OVC Baseball Championship with back-to-back victories over Eastern Illinois in the Championship Round.

After suffering a loss in its first game, the Govs battled back to beat Jacksonville State and Southeast Missouri to advance to the title round. There the team topped Eastern Illinois 7-0 to force a Sunday championship game.

Austin Peay scored two unearned runs in the first inning after a fielding error by Eastern Illinois shortstop Ryan Dineen extended the inning, allowing Greg Bachman and Rolando Gautier to single in runs.

There would be no more scoring in the quick-moving game until the bottom of the eighth when Cody Hudson singled home the third run of the game for the Governors.

Hudson and Tyler Childress were the only Governors to record multi-hits in the game, as eight of the nine APSU positional starters had at least one hit.

After starting Austin Peay's OVC Tournament victory over Jacksonville State on Friday afternoon, junior Casey Delgado returned to the mound on Sunday. He allowed only three hits over five innings of work in improving to 8-4 on the season. Senior Zach Toney, who started the first game of the tournament for Austin Peay, pitched the final four innings, not allowing a base runner and striking out four, in picking up a save and earning a spot on the All-Tournament Team.

It marked just the second shutout in OVC Championship Game history, equaling the feat Austin Peay achieved in a 5-0 win over Jacksonville State in 2005.

It was Austin Peay's fifth OVC tournament championship (1996, 2005, 2007, 2011, 2012), all coming under Gary McClure.
