THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

OVC teams were 6-2 on Saturday including a pair of victories against nationally-ranked teams; overall this season OVC squads are an impressive 11-4 against FCS teams...Including in the victories last week was Eastern Illinois' dominating 57-24 victory over No. 16 Illinois State...In the EIU win senior WR Erik Lora became the OVC career leader in receptions (240), surpassing the 43-year old record of 232 set by Austin Peay's Harold Roberts; Lora's 240 career catches now ranks 25th in NCAA FCS history...EIU quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo threw for an EIU record seven touchdowns (6 in the first half) in the victory and is now just six away from Tony Romo's OVC record; Garoppolo has 14 touchdown passes in three games this season...On Monday Garoppolo was named National Offensive Player of the Week for the second-straight week...UT Martin knocked off the highest-ranked FCS foe of the week, dropping No. 7 Central Arkansas 24-23; the Skyhawks now has won wins over nationally-ranked FCS teams this year with its only loss coming at FBS power Boise State...With the victory UT Martin moved into the Sports Network Top 25 at No. 24...Jacksonville State improved to 3-0 under first-year head coach Bill Clark with a double overtime victory over in-state rival North Alabama; senior Griffin Thomas kicked five field goals in that game (including the game-tying field goal in overtime and the game-winner in double overtime) and earned National Specialist of the Week honors from the Sports Network...Week 4 of the 2013 season will feature seven games including the first Conference matchup of the year...That game will be the OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3 as Tennessee Tech hosts Tennessee State; both teams are 2-1 entering the contest...That game is the first of the year in the Sgt. York Trophy series which is contested between the four OVC football teams from the state of Tennessee...In other action Southeast Missouri will play Southern Illinois in the first-ever collegiate football game at Busch Stadium in St. Louis and Eastern Kentucky will play at Morehead State...Four other OVC teams will face off with FBS opponents in games that can all be seen on ESPN3; Austin Peay plays at Ohio, Murray State is at Bowling Green, Eastern Illinois (who already owns a FBS win this season) is at Northern Illinois and Jacksonville State plays at Georgia State.

OFFENSIVE

Jimmy Garoppolo, QB • Sr., 6-3, 222 • Arlington Heights, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

Garoppolo powered the nation's No. 1 offense (631.3 yards/game) to a dominating 57-24 victory over No. 16 Illinois State in the 102nd all-time meeting of the Mid-American Classic. The Walter Payton Award candidate completed 26-of-41 passes for 480 yards and seven touchdowns without an interception. Six of his touchdown passes came in the first half as EIU built a 44-10 advantage. The seven touchdown passes for the game broke the school record previously held by Tony Romo and Jeff Christensen (Garoppolo's high school quarterback coach). Garoppolo completed an 86-yard touchdown pass to Keiondre Gober in the first quarter; that play is the longest passing play in the FCS this season. Overall the team racked up a school record 739 yards of total offense. The senior now has 79 career passing touchdowns, just six away from tying the OVC mark held by Romo, while his 9,387 career passing yards are just 603 away from the OVC record. Through three wins this season Garoppolo has thrown for an FCS-best 1,281 yards and 14 touchdowns against only one interception.

DEFENSIVE

J'vontez Blackmon, S • Sr., 6-0, 193 • Bryam, Miss. • UT Martin

With UT Martin clinging to a one-point lead over No. 7 Central Arkansas with seven seconds to play, Blackmon broke through the line and blocked a 42-yard field goal attempt by All-Southland Conference kicker Eddie Camara to give the Skyhawks the 24-23 victory. In the third quarter the senior intercepted a UCA pass and returned it 37 yards into Bears territory after Central Arkansas had cut the lead to just seven points. That marked his second interception of the season and fourth of his career. Blackmon also added four tackles and a pass breakup in the game.

CO-SPECIALIST

Griffin Thomas, K • Sr., 6-0, 198 • Snellville, Ga. • Jacksonville State

Thomas connected on five field goals, including the game-winner in double overtime, as Jacksonville State topped North Alabama 24-21 on Saturday. The five field goals set a new Jax State record while his 16 points tied the school record for points by a kicker. The senior started the day by connecting on a 50-yarder in the first quarter, becoming just the third player in Gamecock history to kick a 50-yard or longer field goal. Thomas added a 42-yard field goal in the second quarter and a 44-yarder with three minutes to go in the fourth quarter. His 26-yard field goal in the first overtime forced to second extra period where he nailed the game-winner.

CO-SPECIALIST

Walter Powell, RS/WR • Sr., 6-0, 187 • St. Louis, Mo. • Murray State

Powell accounted for 306 all-purpose yards in Murray State's 41-38 victory over Missouri State on Saturday. With his team trailing 14-6 beginning the second half, Powell took the opening kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown to shift the momentum of the game. For the game he returned three kickoffs for 151 yards (50.3 yards/return) and caught 11 passes for 155 yards and four touchdowns (including the game-winner with 24 seconds remaining). The 306 all-purpose yards are the fourth-most in a game at the FCS level this season while his 98-yard kickoff return touchdown was the fourth-longest this year.

CO-NEWCOMER

Maikhal Miller, QB • So., 6-3, 234 • Fulton, Miss. • Murray State

Miller, the transfer from Ole Miss, threw five touchdown passes as Murray State came from behind to top Missouri State 41-38. After the Bears had taken a four-point lead with 2:55 to play, the sophomore led the Racers on a 12-play, 75-yard drive that he capped with a 15-yard touchdown pass to Walter Powell on 4th-and-10 with 24 seconds to play in the game. He finished the game 24-of-33 for 275 yards with four of his five touchdown passes coming in the second half. In total he tossed scoring passes of 37, 52, 66, 4 and 15 yards with the final two both coming on fourth down.

CO-NEWCOMER

Dylan Favre, QB • Jr., 5-10, 195 • Klin, Miss. • UT Martin

Favre guided UT Martin to a 24-23 victory over No. 7 Central Arkansas on Saturday night, marking the second win over a Top 25 FCS program this season for the Skyhawks. The transfer from Pearl River Community College (and nephew of NFL legend Brett Favre) completed 14-of-19 (73.7%) passes for 146 yards and three touchdowns (with no interceptions) and carried the ball 20 times for a game-high 78 yards. He helped the Skyhawks jump out to a 14-point lead and after UCA had cut the lead to three points in the fourth quarter, helped engineer a 9-play, 68-yard drive that he capped with a 24-yard touchdown pass to Jeremy Butler to give UTM a 24-14 lead (and proved to be the game-winner).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Garoppolo Named National Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 16): Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named National Offensive Player of the Week by both the Sports Network and College Sporting News on Sept. 16 for his performance in a convincing victory over No. 16 Illinois State. It marked the second-straight week he earned the honor from College Sporting News. Garoppolo completed 26-of-41 passes for 480 yards and seven touchdowns (six in the first half) as EIU won 57-24 over its rival. The seven touchdown passes for the game broke the school record previously held by Tony Romo and Jeff Christensen (Garoppolo's high school quarterback coach).

Thomas Named National Specialist of Week (Sept. 16): Jacksonville State senior kicker **Griffin Thomas** was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 16 after hitting five field goals in JSU's double overtime victory over North Alabama. The five field goals set a new Jax State record while his 16 points tied the school record for points by a kicker. The senior started the day by connecting on a 50-yarder in the first quarter, becoming just the third player in Gamecock history to kick a 50-yard or longer field goal. Thomas added a 42-yard field goal in the second quarter and a 44-yarder with three minutes to go in the fourth quarter. His 26-yard field goal in the first overtime forced to second extra period where he nailed the game-winner.

Lora Sets OVC Career Receptions Record: Eastern Illinois senior All-American wide receiver **Erik Lora** set the OVC career receptions record in the Panthers victory over nationally-ranked Illinois State on Sept. 14. Lora broke the 43-year old record held by Austin Peay's Harold "Red" Roberts who caught 232 passes from 1967-70. Lora, who also owns the OVC record for receptions in a game (21) and a season (136), now has 240 career receptions. Lora also now ranks seventh in OVC history for receiving yards (2,871) and is just 1,032 yards away from the record.

Lora Now 25th in NCAA Career Receptions: After setting the OVC career mark for receptions on Sept. 14, Eastern Illinois senior **Erik Lora** is now 25th in NCAA FCS history in career receptions with 240. Although it is unlikely he will set the NCAA record of 395 (he is 155 away), he is just 77 catches away from ranking second in FCS history (that mark is 317 held by Jacquay Nunnally of Florida A&M).

Garoppolo Just Six Touchdown Passes to Tie OVC Career Mark: Entering this week's game Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** is just six touchdown passes away from the OVC career record of 85 currently held by former EIU All-American and current Dallas Cowboy quarterback Tony Romo. Garoppolo set the EIU single-game record with seven touchdown passes (6 in the first half) against Illinois State on Sept. 14 to increase his career total to 79. Garoppolo currently ranks first nationally among active FCS players in career passing yards/game (276.1) and second nationally in total offense (9,269), total passing yards (9,387), career completions (763) and total touchdowns responsible for (83). Through three games this season the senior has 1,281 passing yards and 14 touchdowns (against only one interception).

OVC Teams in the Top 25: After a perfect 3-0 start to the season Eastern Illinois is now ranked No. 8 in the Sports Network Top 25 and No. 10 in the FCS Coaches Poll. It is the highest ranking for EIU since the team was ranked No. 2 nationally in 2002 when Tony Romo was the team's starting quarterback. Eastern Illinois is the first OVC team to crack the Top 10 since the 2011 season (Jacksonville State); no OVC team was ranked in the Top 10 a season ago. UT Martin is the only other team ranked, jumping to 24th in the Sports Network Top 25 (they are unofficially 26th in the FCS Coaches poll) after topping its second FCS Top 25 team of the season on Saturday (No. 7 Central Arkansas). Eastern Kentucky dropped out of the FCS Coaches poll but is still receiving votes in both national polls, along with Jacksonville State and Tennessee State. Murray State and Tennessee Tech are each receiving votes in only the Sports Network poll.

Eastern Illinois Knocks Off FBS Foe San Diego State in Week 1: Week 1 of the 2013 season saw eight teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FBS) defeat teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) including Eastern Illinois thrashing defending Mountain West Conference Champion San Diego State 40-19. The 21-point margin of victory was the second largest for an OVC team ever over a FBS squad (the largest was a 24-point win by Eastern Kentucky over Louisville in 1985). OVC teams have now knocked off FBS foes in three of the last four years, as Jacksonville State beat Ole Miss in 2010 and UT Martin beat Memphis in 2012. Overall OVC schools 31-179-1 all-time against FBS foes and have five more games against FBS teams this season (four of which are this week).

FCS Over FBS: So far this season 13 teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) have scored victories over teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS).

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Murray State's **Walter Powell** was named National All-Purpose Performer of the Week and National Kickoff Returner of the Week while Jacksonville State kicker **Griffin Thomas** was named National Placekicker of the Week. Garoppolo had 480 passing yards and seven touchdowns in his team's convincing victory over nationally-ranked Illinois State. Powell accounted for 306 all-purpose yards, catching 11 passes for 155 yards and four touchdowns (including the game-winner with 24 seconds remaining) and also returning a kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown. Thomas kicked five field goals as JSU topped North Alabama in double overtime. In addition to the duo, 15 other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

NCAA Stats Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders (Sept. 15), Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** ranks first nationally in total passing yards (1,281), second nationally in passing yards/game (427.0), total offense (430.7 yards/game) and points responsible for (84), third nationally in completions/game (30.33) and eighth in passing efficiency (169.8). EIU wide receiver **Erik Lora** ranks second nationally in receptions/game (10.3), third in total receiving yards (409), fourth in receiving yards/game (136.3) and sixth in scoring (12.0 points/game). Murray State wide receiver **Walter Powell** is third in scoring (16.0 points/game) and third in kickoff returns (41.8 yards/return), UT Martin's **Jeremy Butler** is sixth in receptions/game (8.3) and EIU's **Keiondre Gober** is ninth in total receiving yards (330). Murray State quarterback **Maikhaill Miller** is third in total points responsible for (60) while Tennessee State's **Martine Stevenson** is second in kickoff returns (46.0 yards/return). Jacksonville State's **Griffin Thomas** is second in field goals (2.7/game) while TSU's **Jamin Godfrey** is third (2.3/game) and Tennessee Tech's **Chad Zinchini** is second in punting (49.2 yards/punt). TSU's **David Van Dyke** is first nationally in interceptions (1.0/game), EIU's **DJ Bland** is first in passes defended (3.0/game) and Murray State's **Tray Carr** and Southeast Missouri's **Travis Sanders** are tied for first in fumbles recovered/game (1.0). Murray State's **Chavez Sims** is fourth in sacks (1.7/game) and sixth in tackles-for-loss (2.2/game) while EIU's **Jourdan Wickliffe** is second in forced fumbles/game (1.0/game). In the team rankings Eastern Illinois is first nationally in total offense (631.3 yards/game), second in passing yards/game (430.7), passes intercepted (7) and kickoff return defense (13.31 yards/return), fifth in scoring offense (45.7 points/game) and ninth in punt returns (19.4 yards/return) and turnover margin (+1.7). Tennessee State is third in total defense (261.0 yards/game) and passing efficiency defense (84.79), fourth in turnovers gained (9), fifth in kickoff returns (32.38 yards/return) and sixth in scoring defense (11.7 points/game allowed). Murray State is first in red zone offense (100%), third in kickoff returns (37.25 yards/return), fourth in scoring offense (46.0 points/game), sixth in fewest penalties/game (3.33) and eighth in fewest penalties yards/game (29.33). Tennessee Tech is first nationally in red zone offense (100%), second in punt returns (27.8 yards/return), fourth in net punting (42.31 yards/punt) and ninth in tackles-for-loss/game (8.7). Jacksonville State is seventh in rushing offense (269.3 yards/game) and fumbles recovered (4) and 10th in passing efficiency defense (99.13).

NCAA Attendance Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA FCS attendance leaders, Jacksonville State is seventh nationally with an average of 19,213 fans per game. Tennessee State ranks 12th with 16,108 fans while Eastern Kentucky is 17th at 13,350.

OVC to Produce Nine-Game "Game of the Week" Package for ESPN3: This season the OVC will produce a nine-game "OVC Game of the Week" package that will be carried exclusively on ESPN3. The nine-game schedule will feature each of the nine OVC football-playing institutions at least once during the season and includes eight Conference matchups and one non-conference game. The games will be produced by WebStream Sports, an Indianapolis-based company which is a proven leader in video production, streaming video and content creation. Kevin Ingram, host of "The Wake Up Zone" on 104.5 The Zone in Nashville, will handle play-by-play duties while Bob Belvin, Sports Director for 100.7 FM/AM 540 (ESPN Clarksville), will provide analysis. Jacksonville State Ties NCAA Record For Most 100 Yard Rushers in a Game: When Jacksonville State had four players rush for 100 yards or more against Jacksonville University on Sept. 7, the Gamecocks tied the Division I (FBS and FCS) record for that feat. The record had been done seven times previously including Arizona State (1951), Texas (1969), Alabama (1973), Army (1984), Nebraska (2001), Nevada (2009), Arkansas State (2013). There is no NCAA record of a team from the FCS achieving the feat prior to JSU accomplishing it. The four JSU players over 100 yards were **Troymaine Pope** (160), **Miles Jones** (138), **Eli Jenkins** (128) and **DaMarcus James** (105).

Murray State Establishes OVC Record for Points Scored in a Half: With its 62-point first half explosion over Campbellsville on Sept. 7, Murray State established a new OVC record for most points scored in a half. The Racers scored 41 points in the first quarter and added 21 points in the second quarter to break the previous record of 49. That old record had been achieved three times: Eastern Kentucky (1981), UT Martin (2007) and Murray State (2012).

Three OVC Players on Walter Payton Watch List: Three Ohio Valley Conference players were among the 20 players nationally named to the initial Walter Payton Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. The players were Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo**, Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** and Murray State wide receiver/return specialist **Walter Powell**. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. Last season the OVC has four finalists for the award with Lora finishing fourth, the highest finish for an OVC player since EIU's Tony Romo won the award in 2002. The three selections this preseason for the OVC ranked tied for second (along with the Southern Conference) among FCS conferences; the Missouri Valley Football Conference had four total selections on the list. The Payton Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The top three vote-getters will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation.

TSU's Godbolt on Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** is one of 20 players nationally named to the initial Buck Buchanan Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, is presented annually to the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The Buchanan Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The winner will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation on Dec. 16.

NCAA Division I Playoff Information: This season marks the first of an expanded 24-team playoff for NCAA Division I teams. In 2010 the FCS Playoffs expanded from 16 teams to 20 teams, the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. This year the top eight seeds will receive byes to the second round while the first round will feature 16 teams in eight total matchups. For the first time the Pioneer League will receive an automatic bid to the playoffs (bringing the number of auto bids to 11). For the fourth-straight year the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at FC Dallas Stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 4 (1 p.m. CT, ESPN2). The playoff field will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 24.

Sgt. York Trophy Enters Seventh Season in 2013: The Sgt. York Trophy is a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four football-playing OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the OVC announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). In 2007 Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season (that was the tiebreaker used only for the first year of the trophy series). Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. In 2009 Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games and in 2010 UT Martin became the third-straight OVC team to go 3-0 and win the trophy in claiming its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech shared the title (TSU went home with the trophy) while Tennessee State and UT Martin shared the title in 2012 (TSU once again took home the actual trophy). The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring.

Garoppolo Named National Offensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News (Sept. 9): Eastern Illinois senior quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo was named National Offensive All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Sept. 9 for his play against Southern Illinois. Garoppolo completed 34-of-56 passes for 440 yards and four touchdowns as No. 14 Eastern Illinois topped rival SIU 40-37 in double overtime on Saturday. The 440 passing yards are the fifth-best in EIU single-game history, while his 442 yards of total offense was the fourth-most in EIU history.

The senior picked off two passes and returned them for a total of 50 yards including setting up EIU's final touchdown of the night in the fourth quarter. He also added five tackles, a tackle-for-loss and had two pass break-ups. He was part of a defensive unit that limited the Aztecs to just 19 points (1 touchdown, 4 field goals).

Vanlier and Little Share National Punt Returner of the Week Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 1: Tennessee Tech sophomore **Ladarius Vanlier** and Eastern Illinois sophomore **Shepard Little** were each named the National Punt Returners of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week one of the 2013 season. Vanlier returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown as Tennessee Tech routed Cumberland University while Little returned a punt 60 yards for a touchdown to push EIU to a victory over FBS opponent San Diego State. In addition to the duo, six (6) other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

Bell Earns National Defensive Performer of the Week, Stevenson National Kickoff Returner of the Week Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 2: UT Martin junior linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Performer of the Week (and National Linebacker of the Week) while Tennessee State junior **Martine Stevenson** was named National Kickoff Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week two of the 2013 season. Bell had six tackles, 5.0 tackles-for-loss, 2.0 sacks, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery in UT Martin's game at FBS foe Boise State. Stevenson returned a kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown in TSU's road win over Florida A&M. In addition to the duo, nine (9) other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

A Look at the Coaches: Seven of the nine head coaches from last season return to their schools in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. The only newcomers are Austin Peay's **Kirby Cannon** and Jacksonville State's **Bill Clark**. Southeast Missouri's **Tony Samuel** and UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** are now the longest tenured active coaches, each entering the eighth seasons at their respective schools. Clark and TSU's **Rod Reed** are currently the only OVC football coaches serving as head coaches at their alma maters.

Preseason Forecasts: For the first time since 2007, Eastern Illinois was picked as the preseason favorite in the OVC. The defending champion Panthers picked up 12 of a possible 18 first-place votes to top the poll with 122 points. Eastern Kentucky was second (114 points, 4 first-place votes) while Tennessee State ranked third (90 points, 2 first-place votes). The poll was rounded out by Jacksonville State (87), UT Martin (78), Murray State and Tennessee Tech (tied with 53 points), Southeast Missouri (35) and Austin Peay (16). Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 35 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 13 times (37.1%). After eight years of not picking the champion right (2003-2010), the 2011 preseason poll picked the right champion after the league finished in a three-way tie.

EIU's Lora and TSU's Godbolt Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** was named 2013 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** was tabbed OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now with the Denver Broncos. Eight of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the eighth year the OVC has streamed live events, but second year the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2013 season marks the seventh of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play in 2007. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games while Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy. UT Martin made it three straight years with the winning team going 3-0, completing the perfect season in 2010 to win its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech finished in a tie for the Trophy (2-1) and were declared co-champions. Tennessee State, however, will take home the actual trophy since they had gone the most seasons without winning it (2008, compared to 2009 for TTU).

Last year TSU held on to the trophy by finishing 2-1 and winning the tiebreaker with UT Martin.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay will play its third and final Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent of the season on Saturday when they travel to Ohio. It marks the first all-time meeting in the series between the schools. Austin Peay is 1-16 all-time against FBS opponents, including losses to SEC foes Tennessee and Vanderbilt this season. The team's lone win over a FBS foe came in 1987 when they topped Kansas State. The game also marks the first outside the state of Tennessee for the Governors this year. After this contest APSU only has two more games outside the Volunteer State in 2013.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay dropped to 0-3 on the season with a 42-10 loss to Chattanooga on Saturday. It was the first game of the season against a FCS opponent for the Gobs who had started the year with back-to-back games with SEC opponents. Late in the first quarter the Gobs marched 79 yards and 12 plays and Tim Phillips capped it with an 8-yard touchdown run to pull within 14-7. That score marked the first touchdown of the season for APSU. Phillips, the transfer from Central Michigan, finished the game with 78 yards on 18 carries and is the Gobs leading rusher on the season (183 yards; 61.0 yards/game). Senior Leron Eaddy picked off a pass late in the first half of the contest and ended the game with seven tackles. Punter Ben Campbell punted seven times in the game and for the season has punted 23 times in three contests. Austin Peay is a perfect 4-of-4 on fourth down this season, which ranks them first nationally in that category.

SCOUTING OHIO: After a season-opening loss to Top 10 foe Louisville, Ohio, last year's Independence Bowl champions, has bounced back with wins over North Texas and Marshall to move to 2-1 on the season. In front of 24,836 fans at Peden Stadium (the third-largest crowd in stadium history) on Saturday night, Ohio won the "Battle of the Bell" for the third-straight season, leading by as many as 14 points (31-17) before hanging on for the three-point victory. Senior quarterback Tyler Tettleton completed 25-of-38 passes for 266 yards and a touchdown in the win, including completing passes to eight different receivers. Senior wide receiver Matt Walters caught six of those passes (a career-high) for 83 yards while Donte' Foster had eight catches for 80 yards. Overall Ohio has won 18 of its last 24 games dating back to the 2011 season and is now 21-5 at home dating back to the start of the 2009 season.

GAME NOTES: History will be made on Saturday as Southeast Missouri and Southern Illinois will play the first football game at Busch Stadium, the home of Major League Baseball's St. Louis Cardinals. The game was originally scheduled to be played in Cape Girardeau but the Redhawks moved their home game to St. Louis in order to capitalize on the large amount of alumni of both schools in the area. The regional rivals are meeting for the 81st time as Southeast Missouri leads the all-time series by a 39-33-8 margin. SIU has won six of the last seven meetings including a 35-14 victory a season ago. The lone win by the Redhawks during that stretch was a 24-21 win over the nationally-ranked Salukis in 2010, a victory that eventually propelled Southeast to a Top 10 national ranking and OVC Championship. In last year's game Southern Illinois jumped out to a 21-0 halftime lead on its way to a 35-14 victory. The Salukis outgained the Redhawks 565 to 186 as quarterback Kory Faulkner passed for 383 yards and three touchdowns and Mika'il McCall rushed for 81 yards and two scores. Southeast was led by Levi Terrell who rushed for 67 yards.

SCOUTING SOUTHERN ILLINOIS: After losses to FBS foe Illinois and nationally-ranked OVC foe Eastern Illinois in double overtime to start the season, Southern Illinois notched its first victory of the year by topping Division II Charleston 31-10 on Saturday. The Salukis led 21-3 at halftime and were up 31-3 after three quarters as the team tallied 450 yards of total offense while holding UC to just 172 yards (50 on the ground). SIU did fumble the ball six times in the contest but was helped out by the stout defensive effort. Starting quarterback Kory Faulkner suffered an injury to his non-throwing shoulder in the final minute of the first half and was replaced by Ryan West who tossed two touchdown passes in the contest. On the ground Malcolm Agnew had 97 rushing yards on 14 carries (6.9 ypc), the most rushing yards for a Saluki since the end of the 2011 season. The Southern Illinois defense tallied 11.0 tackles-for-loss and has now held opponents to 50 yards or less on the ground in four of its last five contests dating back to last season.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri is coming off its bye week after losses at Southeastern Louisiana and Ole Miss to start the 2013 season. The Redhawks fell behind 31-0 to the SEC foe but held the Rebels scoreless in the second half and scoring two third quarter touchdowns to make the final score 31-13. The 13 points were the most the program had ever scored against an SEC team. Playing in place of injured starter Kyle Snyder, Scott Lathrop, the 2012 OVC Freshman of the Year, completed 16-of-24 passes for 159 yards and two touchdowns and also rushed for 26 yards. He completed passes to five different receivers including D.J. Foster who led the team with six catches for 53 yards and a touchdown. Through two games Southeast ranks just eighth in the OVC in rushing offense (149.5 yards/game) and the team led the OVC and ranked eighth nationally (262.36 yards/game) a season ago. Matt Starks leads the defense with 19 tackles after having a game-high nine solo stops against Ole Miss.

GAME NOTES: Jacksonville State will travel to first-year Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Georgia State for the third all-time meeting between the schools on Saturday afternoon. The teams played in each 2010 and 2011 (the first two years of GSU's program) when the Panthers were an FCS Independent. A year ago (when the teams did not play), Georgia State was a member of the CAA before transitioning to the Sun Belt this season (the team will be bowl eligible next year). In the last meeting Jacksonville State scored 23 second half points on its way to a 37-21 win in Jacksonville. Quarterback Coty Blanchard passed for 155 yards and a touchdown and rushed for 77 yards and two additional scores. JSU is 1-10 since joining the OVC against teams from the FBS (4-17 all-time). The Gamecocks upset SEC foe Ole Miss 49-48 in double overtime to begin the 2010 season.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State needed double overtime but remained perfect on the season with a 24-21 victory over Division II foe and longtime rival North Alabama in front of a crowd of over 20,000 on Saturday night. With the win first-year head coach Bill Clark became just the second coach in JSU history to win his first three games as head coach. The start for the Gamecocks was senior kicker Griffin Thomas who was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network for his effort. Thomas set the JSU school record for field goals in a game (5), connecting on 5-of-6 attempts including a 26-yarder to force the second overtime and a 20-yarder in the second overtime that proved to be the game-winner. Thomas also connected from 50 yards in the first quarter, marking him one of only three players in JSU football history to make a 50-yard or longer field goal. Thomas also added a point after to net 16 points in the contest, which also established a JSU school record. The victory marked the fifth-straight overtime victory for the Gamecocks. Freshman quarterback Eli Jenkins passed for 58 yards and rushed for a team-high 78 yards for the game. As a team JSU, who ranks seventh nationally in rushing offense (269.3 yards/game), finished the UNA contest with 159 yards on the ground. Running back Troymaine Pope added 65 yards on the ground and threw a 53-yard touchdown pass early in the first quarter. It marked the first touchdown pass by a non-quarterback for JSU since the 2008 season. Sophomore Brandon Bender had nine tackles, forced two fumbles and recovered a fumble in the game; through three games this season Bender leads the team (and ranks second in the OVC) in tackles (28).

SCOUTING GEORGIA STATE: Georgia State dropped its third game to start the season, falling to West Virginia 41-7 on Saturday. That loss followed home losses to FCS opponent Samford and Chattanooga to open the year. The team is under the direction of Trent Miles who turned around FCS program Indiana State (three-straight winning seasons just two years after the program went 0-12) before taking over in Atlanta. Against WVU on Saturday, senior running back Travis Evans rushed for a career-high 118 yards on just 12 carries, netting his first 100-yard career game as he became just the third player in GSU's brief history to reach the century mark on the ground. Included in his total was a 65-yard touchdown run in the third quarter. In two games this season Evans is averaging 71.5 yards/contest. Georgia State has used 13 true freshmen in games so far this season.

GAME NOTES: Murray State will wrap-up the non-conference portion of its regular season schedule with a game at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Bowling Green. It is the second FBS matchup of the year for the Racers who opened the season at Missouri. Murray State has lost 20-straight games to FBS opponents dating back to a tie against Memphis in the 1985 season.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: The Murray State offense continued its hot stretch by putting up 41 points in a come-from-behind victory over Missouri State on Saturday. The Racers now rank fourth nationally in scoring (46.0 points/game). MSU fell behind 14-6 at halftime before All-American Walter Powell returned the opening kickoff of the second half 98 yards for a touchdown to swing the momentum of the game. From that point on it was a back-and-forth affair with Missouri State grabbing a 38-34 lead with just 2:55 to play in the game. But quarterback Maikhail Miller helped engineer a 12-play, 75-yard drive that he capped with a 15-yard touchdown pass to Powell on fourth down with just 24 seconds to play. Miller finished the game with 272 passing yards and five touchdowns to earn OVC Co-Newcomer of the Week honors. Powell was an all-around monster in the game, racking up 306 all-purpose yards, including 11 receptions for 155 yards and four touchdowns. Powell, who ranked second nationally in all-purpose yards last season, is now ranked 17th nationally in that category this season (150.33 yards/game) while also ranking third nationally in scoring (16.0 points/game) and kickoff returns (41.8 yards/return). Powell earned OVC Co-Specialist of the Week honors for his performance in the game. Defensively junior linebacker Chavez Sims was dominant once again, totaling a game-high 13 tackles (7 in the second half), including 2.0 tackles-for-loss and 1.0 sacks. This came one week after a four sack performance against Campbellsville. Through three games this season the transfer from Jones County Junior College ranks fourth nationally in sacks (1.7/game) and sixth in tackles-for-loss (2.2/game).

SCOUTING BOWLING GREEN: Bowling Green suffered its first loss of the season on Saturday, falling 42-10 at Indiana. The Falcons had started the season with wins over Tulsa and at Kent State before the loss to the Hoosiers. Junior Paul Senn blocked a punt that he returned 56 yards for a touchdown (the first blocked punt returned for a score by the program since 2002) to tie the game in the first quarter and the team took a 10-7 lead early in the second quarter on a 45-yard field goal by Tyler Tate. But after that IU would score 35 unanswered points to end the game. Matt Johnson completed 25-of-44 passes for 248 yards for the Falcons while Shaun Joplin caught seven of those passes for 104 total yards. On the ground Travis Greene and Fred Coppet combined for 83 yards on 18 total carries. For the season Greene leads the team with 276 rushing yards (92.0 yards/game).

GAME NOTES: Eastern Illinois will matchup with its second Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent of the 2013 season on Saturday when it travels to in-state foe Northern Illinois. It marks the 36th meeting all-time between the schools but first since the 1998 season and only the fourth game between the teams since 1965. The last time the teams played the Panthers pulled off the 24-10 upset of the FBS opponent. That is one of four wins by EIU over a FBS opponent since the Panthers joined the OVC in 1996; included in that win total is a victory over San Diego State in Week 1 of this season.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois continued to impress this season as they improved to 3-0 on the year by blowing out rival Illinois State on Saturday night. The Panthers dominated the No. 16 ranked Redbirds in rolling up a school record 739 yards of total offense. During the game senior All-American Erik Lora caught his 233rd career pass which broke the OVC career receptions record which had stood for 43 years. Lora finished the game with 10 catches for 186 yards and three touchdowns and now has 240 career catches, which is 25th in NCAA FCS history. Adam Drake added 11 catches for 176 yards and two scores. That duo caught their passes from quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo who continued his red hot start to the season by throwing for 480 yards and a school record seven touchdowns (6 in the first half) in the victory. That performance earned him his second-straight National Player of the Week honor. Throw three games this year Garoppolo is first nationally with 1,281 passing yards and 14 touchdowns (against only one interception). Garoppolo now has 79 career passing touchdowns, just six away from the OVC career mark held by Tony Romo; he is also nearing the OVC career passing mark of 9,990 (just 603 yards away). The EIU offense now ranks first nationally, averaging 631.3 yards of total offense/game. The EIU defense has also been strong this season, ranking fourth nationally in turnovers gained (9) and second nationally in passes intercepted (7). In the national polls this week EIU moved up one spot to eighth in the Sports Network Top 25 and two spots to 10th in the FCS Coaches poll.

SCOUTING NORTHERN ILLINOIS: Northern Illinois will play its first home game of the season after road victories over Iowa and Idaho to begin the 2013 campaign. The Huskies are coached by Rod Carey, who coached the team in the Orange Bowl last season after jumping up from the offensive coordinator position. He has NIU receiving votes in both national polls this week, as the team is unofficially 29th in the Associated Press Top 25 and 33rd in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the win over Idaho this past weekend, the Northern Illinois defense recorded a school-record 11 quarterback sacks (7 in the second half) to help the team overcome a 28-14 second quarter deficit. NIU ended the game on a 31-7 run to start 2-0 for the first time since the 2003 season. Quarterback Jordan Lynch completed 17-of-29 passes for 152 yards and three touchdowns and carried the ball 23 times for 159 yards and two additional scores. Lynch now has thrown for six and rushed for two scores this year. Tommy Lee Lewis also rushed for over 100 yards (104) as NIU racked up 356 yards on the ground.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky will travel to play long-time rival Morehead State on Saturday night. Morehead State, who plays in the OVC in all other sports, is a member of the Pioneer League in football and is hosting EKU for the first time since the 1993 season. The teams played annually until 1995 (the last season for the Eagles playing OVC football) and did not play again until 2008. Last year the teams played in Richmond with the Colonels winning 24-17. That game was tied at 10 midway through the third quarter before Matt Denham scored the go-ahead touchdown with 4:10 to go in that quarter. Denham led the way with 166 yards on the ground while the EKU defense limited Morehead State to just nine yards on the ground. Overall EKU has won seven in a row and 25 of the last 26 in the series; the lone victory for MSU in that stretch was a 27-17 win in the 1990 season.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky suffered its first home loss of the season on Saturday, falling 51-32 to No. 21 Coastal Carolina. The Colonels entered the game ranked eighth nationally in rush defense (including limiting FBS power Louisville to 78 yards on the ground), but allowed CCU to amass 339 yards on the ground. With the loss the Colonels slipped out of the Top 25 in the FCS Coaches poll; EKU is still receiving votes in both major polls. EKU trailed 14-10 at the end of the first quarter but Jared McClain found Devin Borders for a 7-yard touchdown pass early in the second quarter and then Christian Albertson returned a fumble 28 yards for a score to put his team up 24-14. But after that point the game was all in favor of Coastal Carolina who scored 38 unanswered points before Eastern added a late fourth quarter touchdown. McClain finished the game 15-of-34 for 233 passing yards and two touchdowns and gained a team-best 93 yards on the ground on 10 carries. McClain surpassed the 1,000-yard career passing mark with a completion in the third quarter. Tyler Horn led the way with 11 tackles while Anthony Brown, who missed the Louisville game two weeks ago, added eight stops and added a pass breakup.

SCOUTING MOREHEAD STATE: Morehead State dropped its Pioneer League opener on Saturday, falling 69-19 at Jacksonville University. MSU fell behind 31-16 at halftime before the Dolphins used a 21-0 spurt out of halftime as JU finished the day with 719 yards of total offense. Freshman Brandon Reeves led the Eagles with 86 yards on the ground, averaging 5.1 yards/carry on his 17 attempts. Rob Harden added 62 yards and a score as the MSU team ended up with 223 yards on the ground. Freshman quarterback Austin Gahafer rushed for 38 yards and a score and completed 11 passes for 93 yards. Kicker Luke Body added field goals of 33 and 44 yards. Junior defensive back Michael Jackson had two interceptions (the first MSU player to do that since 2009) to go along with four tackles. Through three games this season the Eagles have been outscored 149 to 42, and outgained by over 250 yards of total offense per game.

GAME NOTES: In-state rivals Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech will meet in the first OVC football game of the 2013 season on Saturday night. The game is part of the "OVC Game of the Week" package that will air on ESPN3. The Tigers have won seven of the last nine in the series including 22-21 in Hale Stadium on the TSU campus a season ago. That game came down to the final play of the game as A.C. Leonard caught a touchdown pass from Michael German and Jamin Godfrey added the winning extra point with no time on the clock. German finished the day with 294 passing yards while Trabis Ward rushed for 129 yards. Darian Stone led the TTU attack, throwing for two touchdowns and rushing for a team-high 86 yards and another score. Godfrey was named National Specialist of the Week after converting on five field goals in the contest (37, 32, 27, 41 and 22). The game is a part of the annual Sgt. York Trophy series, competed for by the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee. Tennessee State has taken home the trophy each of the last two years (sharing the title with TTU in 2011 and UTM last season) while Tennessee Tech has not taken home the trophy since 2009.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State won its second-straight game by topping Jackson State 26-16 in the Southern Heritage Classic held at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis on Saturday. The tough TSU defense forced six turnovers, including five interceptions to improve to 2-1 on the season. Included in the interceptions was one that Daniel Fitzpatrick returned 50 yards for a touchdown to put TSU up 26-10 midway through the fourth quarter. David Van Dyke also picked off a pass for the third-straight game and currently leads all FCS players in that category (1.0/game). As a team the Tigers rank third nationally in total defense (261.0 yards/game allowed) and sixth in scoring defense (11.7 points/game allowed). After being suspended for the first two games of the season, junior quarterback Michael German returned to action, coming off the bench to pass for 42 yards and rush for a touchdown. TSU got productive running games once again from the duo of Telvin Hooks (92 yards) and Tim Broughton (91 yards). Kicker Jamin Godfrey, who ranks third nationally in field goals (2.3 made/game) connected from 26, 23, 29 and 42 yards in the contest. Godfrey is now 13 points away from fourth on the TSU career scoring list.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech bounced back from its loss to FBS foe Wisconsin with a 30-27 road victory over Hampton, who was its first FCS opponent of the season. Trailing 20-10 in the third quarter, the Golden Eagles scored 20 unanswered points to win the game. The win snapped a six-game losing streak on the road dating back to the beginning of the 2012 season. Tech was able to limit the Hampton rushing attack to just 55 yards on 29 carries (1.9 ypc). Bill Dillard led the defense with eight tackles and a fumble recovery. Cody Matthews finished the game by catching nine passes for 114 yards and a touchdown; his touchdown catch of 32 yards came on a 4th-and-14 play with just over four minutes to play in the game. Junior Cody Forbes rushed for a career-best 73 yards on 19 carries; he leads the team with 155 yards (51.7/game) on the season. Ladarius Vanlier had an 80-yard kickoff return in the third quarter that helped start the comeback; Vanlier ranks 27th nationally in all-purpose yards/game (140.67). As a team Tech ranks second nationally in punt returns (27.8 yards/return) and fourth in net punting (42.31 yards/punt).
