THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Week 1 of the 2013 season saw OVC teams have success on the field, as Eastern Illinois dominated FBS foe San Diego State (winning by 21 points on the road), while UT Martin knocked off nationally-ranked FCS opponent Chattanooga...In addition Eastern Kentucky and Jacksonville State picked up wins over FCS teams while Tennessee Tech won a contest against a non-Division I team...EIU's win over San Diego State was the second-largest margin of victory ever by an OVC team over a FBS squad (trailing only a 24-point win by EKU over Louisville in 1985)...Overall OVC teams have topped FBS teams in three of the last four years (JSU beat Ole Miss in 2010 and UT Martin topped Memphis a season ago)...Eastern Illinois jumped up to No. 14 in the Sports Network Top 25 and No. 16 in the FCS Coaches poll; the only other OVC team ranked this week is Eastern Kentucky, who was No. 21 in the FCS Coaches poll (26th unofficially in the Sports Network rankings)...UT Martin and Jacksonville State are among the others receiving votes in both polls while Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech received votes in the Sports Network poll only...Eastern Illinois senior defensive back Alex McNulty was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network and College Sporting News after his two interception performance against the Aztecs...Week 2 of the season will once again feature nine games, including five against FBS opponents, three against FCS teams and one against a non-Division I squad.

The Eastern Illinois offensive line helped keep All-American quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo safe as the Panthers blasted defending Mountain West Conference champion San Diego State on its way to a 40-19 victory. The 21-point margin of victory was the second-largest win by an OVC team over a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent in history. Overall it marked the fifth FBS win for Eastern Illinois and first since the 2004 season. Against a SDSU defense that returned nine starters from a bowl team a year ago, the Panthers offensive line did not allow a sack and saw Garoppolo only get knocked down on only one pass attempt as the Walter Payton Award candidate completed 31-of-46 passes for 361 yards and three touchdowns. EIU also gashed the top-ranked rush defense in the MWC for 172 yards on the ground and two rushing scores. The unit included three returning starters (Pagliara, Seibert and Pierce) and two first-year starters (Borre, Lowery).

McNulty helped key the Eastern Illinois defensive attack as the Panthers scored a 21-point victory over Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe San Diego State on Saturday night. The redshirt senior was part of a defensive effort that allowed just 19 points, including only one touchdown and four field goals to the defending Mountain West Conference champions. McNulty picked off two passes during the game, making him one of four players at the FCS level to have two interceptions during the opening weekend. He returned those two interceptions for a total of 50 yards while also adding five tackles, a tackle-for-loss for seven yards and two of the team's 11 pass break-ups. The second interception came midway through the fourth quarter and set up EIU's final touchdown of the night two plays later.

CO-SPECIALIST

Shepard Little, RB/RS • So., 5-10, 198 • Schaumburg, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

With Eastern Illinois holding onto a seven-point lead over San Diego State early in the fourth quarter, Little broke a punt return for a 60-yard touchdown to put the Panthers ahead comfortably 33-19 on its way to a 40-19 victory over the FBS Aztecs. It marked the first punt return for a touchdown by EIU since the 2010 season. The sophomore also added a kick return for 13 yards and rushed 10 times for 62 yards to account for 161 yards of total offense on the night. It marked the first game action for Little in his Eastern Illinois career.

CO-SPECIALIST

Ladarius Vanlier, RB/RS • 5-7., 170, So • Nashville, Tenn. • Tennessee Tech

Vanlier accounted for 188 all-purpose yards and returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown as Tennessee Tech began the season with a 63-7 victory over Cumberland University. The 93-yard punt return came in the second quarter and was a school record length for the Golden Eagles; overall it marked Tech's first punt return for a touchdown in 23 seasons. It also came just three minutes after Vanlier had rushed for a 52-yard touchdown. The sophomore also returned the opening kickoff of the game 44 yards and finished the game by averaging 47.0 yards/touch (four total touches) on the night.

NEWCOMER

Max Shortell, QB • Jr., 6-6, 237 • Shawnee Mission, Kan. • Jacksonville State

Shortell, the transfer from the University of Minnesota, came off the bench to help Jacksonville State come-from-behind and top in-state foe Alabama State 24-22. The junior completed 13-of-23 passes for 216 yards and two touchdowns after entering the game in the second quarter with JSU down 6-0. He orchestrated scoring drives of 68 and 75 yards to give JSU the lead and then tossed a 45-yard touchdown pass to Telvin Brown later in the third quarter. He finished the game with a 155.41 passing efficiency.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Eastern Illinois Knocks Off FBS Foe San Diego State in Week 1: Week 1 of the 2013 season saw eight teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FBS) defeat teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) including Eastern Illinois thrashing San Diego State 40-19. The 21-point margin of victory was the second largest for an OVC team ever over a FBS squad (the largest was a 24-point win by Eastern Kentucky over Louisville in 1985). OVC teams have now knocked off FBS foes in three of the last four years, as Jacksonville State beat Ole Miss in 2010 and UT Martin beat Memphis in 2012. Overall OVC schools 20-161-1 all-time against FBS foes and have nine more games against FBS teams this season.

McNulty Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 2): Eastern Illinois senior defensive back **Alex McNulty** was named National Co-Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network and National Defensive All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News on Sept. 2 for his efforts in EIU's 21-point victory over Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe San Diego State. The senior picked off two passes and returned them for a total of 50 yards including setting up EIU's final touchdown of the night in the fourth quarter. He also added five tackles, a tackle-for-loss and had two pass break-ups. He was part of a defensive unit that limited the Aztecs to just 19 points (1 touchdown, 4 field goals).

Vanlier and Little Share National Punt Returner of the Week Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 1: Tennessee Tech sophomore **Ladarius Vanlier** and Eastern Illinois sophomore **Shepard Little** were each named the National Punt Returners of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week one of the 2013 season. Vanlier returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown as Tennessee Tech routed Cumberland University while Little returned a punt 60 yards for a touchdown to push EIU to a victory over FBS opponent San Diego State. In addition to the duo, six (6) other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

OVC Teams in the Top 25: After a convincing 21-point victory over FBS opponent San Diego State, Eastern Illinois jumped from 21st to 14th in the Sports Network Top 25 and from 23rd to 16th in the FCS Coaches poll on Sept. 2. Eastern Kentucky remains the only other OVC team to be ranked, falling from 19th to 21st in the FCS Coaches poll despite a 38-6 victory over Robert Morris to begin the season; the Colonels are unofficially 26th in the Sports Network poll. Both UT Martin and Jacksonville State picked up votes in both polls while Tennessee Tech and Tennessee State received votes in the Sports Network poll only.

OVC to Produce Nine-Game "Game of the Week" Package for ESPN3: This season the OVC will produce a nine-game "OVC Game of the Week" package that will be carried exclusively on ESPN3. The nine-game schedule will feature each of the nine OVC football-playing institutions at least once during the season and includes eight Conference matchups and one non-conference game. The games will be produced by WebStream Sports, an Indianapolis-based company which is a proven leader in video production, streaming video and content creation. Kevin Ingram, host of "The Wake Up Zone" on 104.5 The Zone in Nashville, will handle play-by-play duties while Bob Belvin, Sports Director for 100.7 FM/AM 540 (ESPN Clarksville), will provide analysis. 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Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. Last season the OVC has four finalists for the award with Lora finishing fourth, the highest finish for an OVC player since EIU's Tony Romo won the award in 2002. The three selections this preseason for the OVC ranked tied for second (along with the Southern Conference) among FCS conferences; the Missouri Valley Football Conference had four total selections on the list. The Payton Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The top three vote-getters will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation.

TSU's Godbolt on Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** is one of 20 players nationally named to the initial Buck Buchanan Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, is presented annually to the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The Buchanan Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The winner will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation on Dec. 16.

NCAA Division I Playoff Information: This season marks the first of an expanded 24-team playoff for NCAA Division I teams. In 2010 the FCS Playoffs expanded from 16 teams to 20 teams, the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. This year the top eight seeds will receive byes to the second round while the first round will feature 16 teams in eight total matchups. For the first time the Pioneer League will receive an automatic bid to the playoffs (bringing the number of auto bids to 11). For the fourth-straight year the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at FC Dallas Stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 4 (1 p.m. CT, ESPN2). The playoff field will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 24.

Sgt. York Trophy Enters Seventh Season in 2013: The Sgt. York Trophy is a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four football-playing OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the OVC announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). In 2007 Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season (that was the tiebreaker used only for the first year of the trophy series). Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008

to claim its second trophy. In 2009 Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games and in 2010 UT Martin became the third-straight OVC team to go 3-0 and win the trophy in claiming its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech shared the title (TSU went home with the trophy) while Tennessee State and UT Martin shared the title in 2012 (TSU once again took home the actual trophy). The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring.

A Look at the Coaches: Seven of the nine head coaches from last season return to their schools in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. The only newcomers are Austin Peay's **Kirby Cannon** and Jacksonville State's **Bill Clark**. Southeast Missouri's **Tony Samuel** and UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** are now the longest tenured active coaches, each entering the eighth seasons at their respective schools. Clark and TSU's **Rod Reed** are currently the only OVC football coaches serving as head coaches at their alma maters.

A Brother Coaching Duo: This season Tennessee Tech head coach **Watson Brown** and his brother Mack Brown (the head coach at Texas) could become the winningest set of brothers in NCAA Division I history. After week one of the 2013 season the duo has 354 victories (231 by Mack, 123 by Watson) which trails only Bill and Vince Dooley (362 total wins) on the all-time list.

Preseason Forecasts: For the first time since 2007, Eastern Illinois was picked as the preseason favorite in the OVC. The defending champion Panthers picked up 12 of a possible 18 first-place votes to top the poll with 122 points. Eastern Kentucky was second (114 points, 4 first-place votes) while Tennessee State ranked third (90 points, 2 first-place votes). The poll was rounded out by Jacksonville State (87), UT Martin (78), Murray State and Tennessee Tech (tied with 53 points), Southeast Missouri (35) and Austin Peay (16). Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 35 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 13 times (37.1%). After eight years of not picking the champion right (2003-2010), the 2011 preseason poll picked the right champion after the league finished in a three-way tie.

EIU's Lora and TSU's Godbolt Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** was named 2013 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** was tabbed OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Tennessee State led the way with seven selections on the preseason team while Eastern Illinois had six and Eastern Kentucky had four. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (11 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included 10 players who were second-team selections in 2012. Of the 27 total selections, 19 were seniors and eight were juniors.

NFL Connections: As of September 2, there are 15 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters (8 active, 4 practice squad members and 3 on IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now with the Denver Broncos. Eight of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the eighth year the OVC has streamed live events, but second year the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2013 season marks the seventh of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play in 2007. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games while Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy. UT Martin made it three straight years with the winning team going 3-0, completing the perfect season in 2010 to win its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech finished in a tie for the Trophy (2-1) and were declared co-champions. Tennessee State, however, will take home the actual trophy since they had gone the most seasons without winning it (2008, compared to 2009 for TTU).

Last year TSU held on to the trophy by finishing 2-1 and winning the tiebreaker with UT Martin.

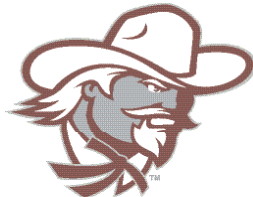

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky will travel up the interstate to battle in-state foe Louisville on Saturday. It marks the 27th all-time appearance between the two teams and first since the 2010 season. The teams have only played three times since the end of the 1961 season with matchups coming in 1985, 1991 and in 2010. In the 1985 meeting EKU blasted the Cardinals 45-21, the largest margin of victory ever for an OVC team over a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent. Louisville holds a 10-4-1 advantage over Eastern Kentucky in games played in Louisville.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky started the season strong with a convincing 38-6 victory over Robert Morris last Thursday as the team racked up 401 yards of total offense behind new starting quarterback Jared McClain. The junior McClain, who had made starts in prior seasons, accounted for four of EKU's five touchdowns in the game, rushing for two and passing for two scores. He passed for a 10-yard touchdown early in the first quarter and capped a drive with a one-yard rush later in that quarter. His two-yard touchdown pass early in the second quarter put the Colonels up 21-0 and his eight-yard run early in the fourth quarter extended the team's lead to 35-6. McClain finished the game 16-of-21 for 155 yards through the air and carried the ball a team-high 12 times for 44 yards. McClain also caught a 33-yard pass to setup EKU's first touchdown. Overall the Colonels rushed for 207 yards on the night with five players rushing for 20 or more yards. Jared Sanders led the way with 53 yards on the ground while redshirt freshman JJ Jude gained 50. Junior Caleb Watkins (who rushed for 39 yards) and tight end Nathan Watts each scored their first collegiate touchdowns during the game. With the win EKU has now won five-straight home openers.

SCOUTING LOUISVILLE: Louisville, ranked ninth last week, started the 2013 season with a convincing 49-7 victory over Ohio on Sunday. Junior quarterback Teddy Bridgewater began his Heisman campaign by completing 23-of-28 passes for 355 yards and five touchdowns; the five touchdown passes tied his career high and came in front of a sellout crowd of 55,332. Bridgewater is now tied for fourth on UofL's career passing touchdowns list and has thrown a touchdown pass in 13-straight games. Damian Copeland and Kai De La Cruz each caught two touchdowns as the team out-gained Ohio 615 to 273. Former Auburn running back Michael Dyer made his UofL debut during the game and rushed for a 46-yard touchdown in the third quarter. Defensively Preston Brown led the Cardinals with nine tackles. As a team Louisville was an impressive 13-of-16 on third downs against the Bobcats.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee Tech will travel to Madison, Wis. to battle nationally-ranked Wisconsin on Saturday. It is the first-ever meeting between the two teams. Wisconsin enters the week having won 27-consecutive home games against non-conference opponents, the second-longest streak nationally (behind LSU's 38). Tennessee Tech is 0-27 all-time against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). It marks the second time in three years the Golden Eagles have played a Big Ten team (they lost at Iowa in 2011).

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech started the 2013 season by winning its seventh-consecutive home opener, topping Cumberland University 63-7. That marked the largest opening game margin of victory in school history. Tech rolled up 505 yards of total offense, including 323 on the ground, while holding the Bulldogs to 179 total yards. Junior quarterback Darian Stone accounted for four total touchdowns in the game, completing 8-of-11 passes for 143 yards and two scores and rushing for 31 yards and two additional scores. Cody Forbes led all rushers with 69 yards, while Radir Annoor, Ladarius Vanlier and Stephen Bush each had 51 rushing yards. Freshman Isaiah McKinney added 47 yards and a rushing touchdown. In addition to his 51 rushing yards and touchdown, Vanlier also added a 93-yard punt return for a touchdown, a score that set a new school record for longest punt return; it also marked TTU's first punt return for a touchdown in 23 seasons. Vanlier, who only played in the first half, accounted for 188 all-purpose yards on the night. The Tech defense limited Cumberland to just 51 passing yards on the night, picked off two passes and added three sacks. Cory Webber had one of those interceptions and also added five tackles. In all the Golden Eagles used 71 different players in the game, 24 of who were playing in their first collegiate game.

SCOUTING WISCONSIN: Wisconsin started its first season under head coach Gary Andersen with a convincing 45-0 win over Massachusetts on Saturday. Sophomore Melvin Gordon ran for 144 yards (including a 70-yard touchdown) while senior James White added 143 yards and a 51-yard rushing touchdown. True freshman Corey Clement rushed for 101 yards, becoming the first Badger to rush for 100 yards in his debut since the 2006 season. The Badgers accounted for 598 yards of total offense, including 393 on the ground and 205 through the air. It marked the first time since 2011 that the team had 300 or more yards on the ground and 200 or more yards through the air in the same game. Quarterback Joel Stave was 9-for-17 for 197 yards and two touchdowns and had an additional rushing touchdown. Overall on the day UW had four scoring players of 50 or more yards against the Minutemen. Wisconsin has now won 16 consecutive season openers which is tied with USC for the third-longest active streak nationally. Wisconsin was ranked 23rd in both FBS polls last week but should move up when the new polls are released on Tuesday.

GAME NOTES: Rivals Tennessee State and Florida A&M will square off for the 53rd time on Saturday in Tallahassee. The teams played more many years at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta as part of the Atlanta Football Classic, playing 17 times in that event but after a year off in 2011, the teams rekindled the rivalry in the John Merritt Classic in Nashville in 2012. A season ago TSU jumped out to a 17-0 lead and held on to defeat the Rattlers 17-14. In that game Trabis Ward rushed for 124 yards and a score and Michael German passed for 263 yards and a touchdown. The victory for the Tigers pushed them the lead in the all-time series; TSU now leads that series 26-25-1. Both Tennessee State and Florida A&M opened the 2013 season by playing on Sunday.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State was the last OVC team to open the 2013 season, hosting nationally-ranked Bethune-Cookman Sunday night in the John Merritt Classic. The two teams fought off sluggish offenses for most of the game and combined for just 508 yards of offense on the evening. BC kicked a pair of field goals in the first half while TSU's Jamin Godfrey connected from 21 and 44 yards in the second quarter to tie the game at halftime. Godfrey put the Tigers ahead with a 26-yarder at the end of the third quarter before the Wildcats scored the only touchdown of the game with 5:01 to go. That six-yard pass play from Jackie Wilson to Jordan Murphy proved to be the difference-maker as TSU missed a 49-yard field goal as time expired. In his debut freshman Ronald Butler completed 13-of-21 passes for 132 yards. The TSU rushing game saw a two-back offense of Telvin Hooks (13 carries for 47 yards) and Tim Broughton (14 carries for 45 yards) get the majority of the work. Junior All-American tight end A.C. Leonard caught five passes for 38 yards and also had a 31-yard rush on the night. Linebacker Nick Thrasher had 10 tackles to lead TSU.

SCOUTING FLORIDA A&M: Florida A&M started its first full season under permanent head coach Earl Holmes with a 27-10 victory over Mississippi State in the 2013 MEAC-SWAC Challenge at the Florida Citrus Bowl in Orlando. Holmes took over as FAMU head coach on an interim basis at the end of the 2012 season, compiling a 1-1 record in two games. On Sunday FAMU jumped out to a 20-0 lead after Damien Fleming and Omari Albert rushed for touchdowns and Chase Varnadore connected on field goal attempts from 27 and 23 yards. Al-Tere McBurse capped the scoring with a 14-yard rush late in the fourth quarter. McBurse finished the game with 55 yards while the quarterback Fleming was 8-of-18 for 110 yards through the air and rushed for 38 yards. The Rattlers defense picked off three passes in the game while Michael Ducre led the way with eight tackles, a tackle-for-loss and a quarterback hurry.

GAME NOTES: UT Martin will travel to Boise State for the first matchup between the two schools. Boise State is one of two Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents for the Skyhawks this season; UTM will play Memphis later in the year. UT Martin is 1-14 all-time against teams from the FBS, although that one win came a season ago when the team knocked off Memphis 20-17 on a last second field goal attempt. Since the beginning of the 2000 season, Boise State is 79-4 (95.2%) at home, which ranks first in the FBS.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin started the season on a high note in knocking off No. 24 Chattanooga last Thursday night, its first-ever win over the in-state opponent in four tries. The Skyhawks grounded out 289 yards on the ground, ranking them 12th nationally after the first week of the season. The output was the most against a Division I squad for the team since 2008 (a span of 50 games). DJ McNeil rushed for a career-high 134 yards and a touchdown while Trent Garland added a career-high 116 yards and a touchdown. It was the first time the team had two 100-yard rushers in the same game since Sept. 2011. The run game also included 37 yards and a score by backup quarterback Dylan Favre (the nephew of the NFL legend). The junior transfer came off the bench to spark the UTM rally as he engineered three of the team's four scoring drives. In addition to his 13-yard rushing touchdown he completed 9-of-12 passes for 83 yards including a 13-yard pass to Chris Thompson early in the fourth quarter. Senior wide receiver Jeremy Butler hauled in a team-best 10 catches for 91 yards while Thompson added four catches for 40 yards. It was redshirt sophomore Jarod Neal who got the start at quarterback, finishing 10-of-15 for 79 yards. The staunch Skyhawk defense held UTC scoreless for the first 44 minutes of the game and finished the game with 5.5 tackles-for-loss, three sacks and an interception. Senior safety J'vontez Blackmon finished the game with six tackles and a key interception at the Chattanooga 38-yard line with the game tied 0-0; two plays later the Skyhawks scored and never trailed again. UTM is inching closer to the Top 25, coming in unofficially at 30th in the Sports Network Top 25 this week.

SCOUTING BOISE STATE: Boise State was ranked 19th in the preseason but suffered a 38-6 loss at Washington, a team it beat during the bowl season a year ago, this past weekend. It was the largest margin of defeat for the team since a 35-point loss to Georgia in 2005, and the fewest points scored by the potent offense since a shutout at Washington State in 1997. Despite the loss the Broncos are an impressive 88-11 all-time when ranked in the Top 25. The squad is now 84-9 in eight years under head coach Chris Peterson. Quarterback Joe Southwick completed 25-of-40 passes for 152 yards and an interception (his first in 133 attempts dating back to last season) while Jay Ajayi rushed for a team-best 93 yards on 23 attempts. Wide receiver Geraldo Boldewijn set a new career-high with eight receptions on the day while Matt Miller hauled in six catches to move into BSU's all-time top 10 for career receptions (134). Boise State enters the year with seven-straight 10-win seasons, the longest active streak nationally.

GAME NOTES: In-state rivals Eastern Illinois and Southern Illinois will play for the 63rd time on Saturday as EIU makes the trip to Carbondale. After playing in the final game of the 2011 season, the squads opened with each other last year as eventual OVC champion Eastern topped SIU by a 49-28 margin. In that game, the first under head coach Dino Babers, the Panthers netted 522 yards of total offense and pulled away thanks to 21 points in each the second and third quarters. Jimmy Garoppolo completed 32-of-49 passes for 369 yards and five touchdowns, while Erik Lora began his OVC Player of the Year season by grabbing 13 catches for 151 yards and two scores. The win snapped a four-game losing skid in the series by the Panthers.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: After its dominating performance at San Diego State on Saturday, Eastern Illinois is now ranked 14th in the Sports Network poll and 16th in the FCS Coaches poll. The Panthers went to the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent and won by 21 points, the second-largest margin of victory ever for an OVC team over an FBS school. Overall it marked the fifth win for the EIU program over an FBS squad and first since the 2004 season (Eastern Michigan). The Panthers offense line, who was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week as a unit, was the key to the game, not allowing All-American quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo to be sacked (he was touched only once during the game), and also allowing the rushing attack gain 172 yards on the ground. All of this came against a defense that was ranked first in the Mountain West last year when the team shared the conference title and went to a bowl game. Garoppolo began his Walter Payton candidacy by completing 31-of-46 passes for 361 yards and three touchdowns. Garoppolo now ranks third in OVC history in completions (703), fourth in passing yards (8,467) and touchdown passes (68) and fifth in total offense (8,358). His favorite target, fellow Payton Award candidate Erik Lora, hauled in 10 passes for 87 yards and two touchdowns, while Keiondre Gober had six catches for 140 yards and a score. Senior defensive back Alex McNulty was named National Defensive Player of the Week after picking off two passes, adding five tackles, a tackle-for-loss and two pass break-ups in the win. Sophomore Shepard Little returned a 60-yard punt for a touchdown in the game and added 62 yards on the ground to account for 161 yards of total offense on the night; he was named OVC Co-Specialist of the Week for his efforts. After week one of the season EIU ranks fourth nationally in passing offense and 11th nationally in total offense (533.0 yards/game).

SCOUTING SOUTHERN ILLINOIS: Southern Illinois, who is receiving votes in the Sports Network Top 25, saw its comeback attempt come up short against FBS opponent Illinois on Saturday. The Salukis trailed by 22 points midway through the fourth quarter but pulled to within 42-34 and had the ball first-and-goal at the nine-yard line but could not pull any closer. It was the SIU defense that helped the team get back into the game, forcing a key fumble and then a three-and-out on Illinois' last two possessions in the fourth quarter. Offensively it was quarterback Kory Faulkner who led the team as he passed for 312 yards and three touchdowns. Seven of those passes went to junior LaSteven McKinney who finished the day with 52 receiving yards. Fellow wide out MyCole Pruitt had 83 yards and a touchdown.

GAME NOTES: The Jacksonville State Gamecocks will welcome the Jacksonville University Dolphins to Burgess-Snow Field on Saturday for the first meeting between the two schools. The game will be the home opener for the Gamecocks who are coming off a FCS road victory over Alabama State last week.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE: The non-scholarship Dolphins jumped out to a 14-0 first quarter lead over perennial FCS power Delaware but was unable to hang on as the Blue Hens rallied for a 51-35 victory. UD scored 24 unanswered points from the end of the second quarter until the beginning of the fourth quarter to take control of the game. Sophomore quarterback Kade Bell threw for 261 yards and a career-best four touchdowns for the game. Andrew Robustelli proved to be one of his favorite targets, as he pulled in five catches for 101 yards and two scores. In total eight different receivers caught at least one pass for JU. The team struggled in the rushing game, however, as the team finished the game with -37 rushing yards. Only Johnnie Hicks (19 yards and four carries) and Orlando Thomas (6 yards on five carries) had positive rushing yards for the Dolphins. Ed Foley led the defense with 12 tackles and a fumble recovery while Andre Addison and Mike Klein each had 10 tackles.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State scored all 24 of its points in the third quarter on Saturday night to top Alabama State 24-22 to open the Bill Clark Era with a victory (Clark is the first new JSU coach to open with a victory since Jim Fuller in 1977). Coming off the bench Max Shortell, the transfer from Minnesota, completed 13-of-23 passes for 216 yards and two touchdowns to earn OVC Newcomer of the Week honors. He entered the game with JSU down 6-0 and orchestrated scoring drives of 68 and 75 yards before tossing a 45-yard touchdown pass to Telvin Brown. Shortell came into the game in relief of freshman Eli Jenkins who finished the game 4-of-7 for 24 yards. Running back Troymaine Pope led the team with 54 yards and a touchdown on the ground while also catching a 30 yard reception. DaMarcus James added 50 yards on the ground while Telvin Brown finished the game with 121 all-purpose yards, including netting five catches for 76 yards. Brandon Bender set a new career-high with 14 tackles while Jermaine Hough added nine stops. Brenton Tolson had two tackles, a sack and an interception at the JSU 26-yard line with 48 seconds to go in the game. With its performance JSU is still among the others receiving votes in each the Sports Network and FCS Coaches Top 25's.

GAME NOTES: Murray State will open the home portion of its season on Saturday when it entertains Campbellsville University. The meeting is the first between the two programs. The Racers were 3-2 in home games a season ago. The game is the first for Campbellsville against a FCS team since the 2004 season. In a change from tradition Murray State will have its "Senior Day" at the start of the season and will honor its 22 seniors prior to kickoff.

SCOUTING CAMPBELLVILLE: Campbellsville is a NAIA member of the Mid-South Conference and opened the season with a 24-17 loss to Lindsey Wilson. The Tigers opened the game with a 98-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by Jarrod Harrington and later led 17-3 late in the second quarter. Lindsey Wilson would add another score before halftime and then the two teams had to endure a nearly three-hour weather delay during the third quarter. After it was over LWC gathered all the momentum and scored two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to come from behind for the victory. The game ended nearly six hours after it started. Bryan Parnes finished the game 18-of-36 for 124 yards and a touchdown while Ben Axon led the team with 105 rushing yards.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State started the 2013 season by falling 58-14 to SEC foe Missouri on Saturday. Despite the loss it marked the first time the Racers had scored two touchdowns against an FBS team since 2004 (Connecticut). MSU started the game with sophomore newcomer Makhail Miller hooking up with Walter Powell for a 17-yard touchdown pass and the quarter ended with a Miller catching a five-yard touchdown pass from Jeremy Harness as MSU led 14-13. But that would be all the scoring for the Racers and the Tigers went on to score 45 unanswered points. Mizzou ended the contest with 694 yards of total offense compared to just 297 yards for the Racers. Miller, the transfer from Ole Miss, finished the day 16-of-32 for 145 yards and a touchdown while also rushing 11 times for a team-best 73 yards. His five-yard touchdown catch late in the first quarter ended up on ESPN's Top 10 list that night. Powell, the Walter Payton Award candidate who was second nationally in all-purpose yards last year, was limited to just four catches for 35 yards and 27 yards on three total kick returns (2 punts, 1 kickoff). Missouri was able to exploit the Racers rushing defense, gaining 358 yards on the ground. Five different Racers tallied seven tackles to lead the defensive effort.

GAME NOTES: After traveling to Hammond, La. to start the 2013 season, Southeast Missouri will make a shorter trip this week when they travel to Oxford, Miss. to play the Ole Miss Rebels. It marks the first meeting between the two schools and the fifth game against a current team from the SEC in Redhawks history. Southeast has previously played Arkansas (twice) and Missouri (twice, both before they joined the SEC). It marks the first game against a team from the state of Mississippi for the Redhawks since 1989 (Mississippi College). The last time Ole Miss played a team from the OVC (2010), they were upset in double overtime by Jacksonville State. Southeast Missouri is 1-17 all-time against FBS teams, last winning a game in 2002 (Middle Tennessee); since that victory the team has lost 12-straight contests to FBS foes.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri was shut out for final three quarters last Thursday to open the season, falling 45-7 at Southeastern Louisiana. It marked the fourth-straight loss in a season-opener for the program. In that game 28 players saw their first collegiate action and 11 players made their first career starters. Junior quarterback Kyle Snyder, who missed all of last year with an injury, got the start and completed 6-of-13 passes for 75 yards and ran for six yards on the ground. Scott Lathrop, who was the starter at quarterback last year, rushed for 41 yards on 12 carries for the team. DeMichael Jackson led Southeast with 61 rushing yards as the Redhawks totaled 206 total rushing yards on the evening. It marked the eighth time in the team's last nine games the squad had rushed for 200 or more yards. Junior Spencer Davis accounted for 136 all-purpose yards, netting 46 receiving yards, 66 kickoff return yards and 24 punt return yards. Davis is now just 428 yards away from breaking the Southeast career kickoff return yardage record of 1,938.

SCOUTING OLE MISS: Ole Miss began the season with what was one of the most exciting games of Week 1, a 39-35 victory at Vanderbilt last Thursday. The back-and-forth affair saw Jeff Scott score on a 75-yard run with 1:07 to left to push the Rebels to the season-opening victory. Ole Miss had grabbed a 10-0 first quarter lead but fell behind 21-10 and eventually 28-17 with 4:51 to go in the third quarter. Quarterback Bo Wallace helped key the rally, running for two touchdowns and converting a two-point conversion. Wallace tied his career-high with 31 completions on 47 attempts; he finished the game with 283 passing yards and 48 rushing yards. In his collegiate debut, highly touted Laquon Treadwell caught nine passes for 82 yards and the two-point conversion late in the third quarter. The nine receptions were the most by a Rebel since 2005. In his first collegiate game 285-pound Robert Nkemdiche, the No. 1 recruit coming out of high school, had two tackles, a tackle-for-loss and a pass break-up to go along with an 11-yard rush that came on a fake punt attempt.

GAME NOTES: Despite being separated by just 50 miles, Saturday will mark the first-ever meeting between Austin Peay and Vanderbilt on the football gridiron. This game marks the second of three-straight against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents for APSU. It marks only the second time in OVC history a team has played three FBS teams in the same year. Austin Peay is 1-15 all-time against teams from the FBS, winning against Kansas State in the 1987 season; since then the team has lost 12-straight games to FBS opponents. It also marks the second-straight week the Gobs will play a team from the SEC (APSU lost to Tennessee last week). Prior to last week's UT contest it had been 76 years since Austin Peay had played an SEC foe. Vanderbilt is 12-0-1 all-time against OVC opponents, having previously faced Tennessee Tech (10-0-1), Tennessee State (1-0) and Eastern Kentucky (1-0); the Commodores are 15-1 all-time against FCS foes. APSU is looking to snap a 17-game road losing streak.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay was out-gained 447 to 211 against Tennessee on Saturday, falling 45-0 to the Volunteers. The shutout marked the end of an 84-game streak of not being shutout dating back to the 2005 season (Drake). New starting quarterback Andrew Spivey completed 11-of-22 passes for 94 yards while Darryl Clack caught three of those passes, finishing with a team-high 80 receiving yards. Senior tailback Tim Phillips led the rushing attack with 38 yards while backup quarterback Jacob Sexton finished the game with 25 rushing yards to go along with his 38 passing yards. Junior punter Ben Campbell punted six times for a 45.0 yard average, including a long punt of 51 yards. Defensively Leron Eddy (making his APSU debut) and Johnathan Shuler each had seven tackles. The game was played in front of 97,169 fans, the largest crowd to ever see an Austin Peay team play and the third-largest crowd to ever see any OVC team play.

SCOUTING VANDERBILT: Vanderbilt will be looking for its fifth consecutive non-conference victory when it hosts Austin Peay on Saturday. The Commodores opened the season with a 39-35 loss to SEC foe Ole Miss last Thursday. The Commodores fell behind 10-0 but scored 21 unanswered points to lead at halftime. The team used a 7-play, 80-yard drive capped by a 34-yard strike to Steven Scheu with 1:30 to play to pull ahead 35-32 but was unable to stop Ole Miss who scored two plays later to pull off the season-opening victory. The loss snapped a seven-game overall and four-game SEC winning streak for Vandy. Quarterback Austyn Carta-Samuels finished the game 21-of-36 for 300 yards and two touchdowns. His favorite target was Jordan Matthews who hauled in 10 passes for 178 yards and a touchdown. Jerron Seymour led the rushing attack with 43 yards on five carries (8.6 ypc). Vanderbilt head coach James Franklin posted 15 victories in his first two years at the school, the best first two-year total in school history since 1904-05.
