THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Six OVC teams played their first Conference contests of the season on Saturday as Eastern Illinois, Murray State and UT Martin all picked up wins to join Tennessee State at the top of the standings (1-0)...Austin Peay is the only OVC team yet to play a Conference game...Tennessee Tech closed out the non-conference portion of the OVC schedule against FCS teams, as the Golden Eagles scored a 38-37 victory; OVC teams finished the regular season 13-5 against fellow FCS opponents...Eastern Illinois quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo became the OVC's all-time leader in career touchdown passes and passing yards in his team's blowout victory over Eastern Kentucky; Garoppolo now has 88 touchdown passes (breaking Tony Romo's old record) and 10,159 passing yards (breaking Casey Brockman's record) and is the only person in OVC history to pass the 10,000 yard mark...Garoppolo is now in search of the OVC total offense mark (he is 470 yards away from that record); he currently leads all Division I players (FBS or FCS) with 2,053 passing yards and 23 touchdowns this year...UT Martin has yet to trail to a FCS opponent this season and has not surrendered a point to a FCS team in the first half of a game this season (3 games vs. FCS teams), making them one of only three teams in the Sports Network Top 25 to achieve that feat...Tennessee Tech senior Jordan Johnson was named National Specialist of the Week by the College Sporting News after blocking two kicks in the team's one-point win over Indiana State...Eastern Illinois moved up to No. 5 in both Top 25 polls on Monday and has a bye this week...Week 6 of the season will feature the first exclusive week of OVC action with four Conference games...The action includes Jacksonville State at UT Martin in the OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3, Tennessee Tech at Murray State, Austin Peay at Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri at Tennessee State.

**OFFENSIVE**

Jimmy Garoppolo, QB • Sr., 6-3, 222 • Arlington Heights, Ill. • Eastern Illinois
Garoppolo became the OVC career leader in touchdown passes and passing yards in leading No. 8 Eastern Illinois to a dominating 42-7 victory over Eastern Kentucky on Saturday. The Walter Payton Award candidate completed 26-of-39 passes for 322 yards and three touchdowns and continues to lead all Division I players (FBS or FCS) with 2,053 passing yards and 23 touchdowns in 2013. In the first quarter he threw his 86th career touchdown pass to pass former EIU All-American and current Dallas Cowboy quarterback Tony Romo for the OVC record (he now has 88 touchdown passes which is 22nd in NCAA FCS history). In the second quarter he passed Murray State's Casey Brockman for the career passing yards mark, and also became the first OVC player and just 30th player in FCS history to go over 10,000 passing yards; Garoppolo now has 10,159 passing yards and also went over 10,000 yards of total offense (10,032). This marks the fourth-straight week Garoppolo has been named OVC Offensive Player of the Week, becoming the first player to do so since the 2009 season (JSU's Ryan Perrilloux).

CO-DEFENSIVE

Anthony Goodman, DB • So., 5-9, 190 • Lansing, Mich. • Eastern Illinois
Goodman helped key a defensive unit that limited Eastern Kentucky to just 266 yards of total offense (140 against the first team defense which came out with five minutes to play in the third quarter) and a late fourth quarter touchdown as No. 8 Eastern Illinois dominated the Colonels 42-7. Goodman had a game-high eight tackles (5 solo) and recovered a fumble that he returned for a touchdown. With just 23 seconds remaining before halftime, Goodman picked up the fumble forced by Jourdan Wickliffe and raced 70 yards for a touchdown to put the Panthers up 35-0 at the break. The 70-yard fumble return was the longest in school history.

CO-DEFENSIVE

James Huguely, CB • Jr., 6-0, 185 • Atlanta, Ga. • Tennessee Tech
Huguely made a career-high 12 tackles (8 solo) and returned a blocked field goal for a touchdown in Tennessee Tech's 38-37 victory over Indiana State. With Indiana State leading 6-3 and lining up for a 20-yard field goal late in the first quarter, Jordan Johnson blocked the attempt that Huguely picked up and raced 87 yards for a touchdown to put his team up 10-6.

Johnson blocked two kicks to help Tennessee Tech come-from-behind and beat Indiana State 38-37 on Saturday night. After Indiana State had scored the first touchdown on the night, Johnson blocked the point after attempt and that single point proved to be the difference in the game. Later in the quarter Johnson rejected a 20-yard field goal attempt by the Sycamores which was scooped up by teammate James Huguely and returned 87 yards for a touchdown to give Tech a 10-6 advantage.

NEWCOMER

Maikhail Miller, QB • So., 6-3, 234 • Fulton, Miss. • Murray State
Miller, the transfer from Ole Miss, accounted for three touchdowns and also tossed the winning two-point conversion in overtime as Murray State ended a nine-game losing streak against Jacksonville State by winning 35-34. The sophomore completed 14-of-26 passes for 109 yards and a touchdown and carried the ball 24 times for a team-high 134 yards (5.6 ypc) and two touchdowns. Miller threw a 29-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter to put the Racers up 10-0 and added a 14-yard run early in the fourth quarter to give his team a 27-24 advantage. Facing a 4th-and-10 in overtime, Miller connected on a 13-yard pass for a first down and then got the final 12 yards with his feet, eventually scoring on a one-yard touchdown run. He followed that by throwing the successful two-point conversion to Jeremy Harness in the flat to give MSU the win. Miller currently ranks second in the OVC and 39th nationally in total offense (236.2 yards/game).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Johnson Named National Specialist of the Week (Sept. 30): Tennessee Tech senior defensive lineman **Jordan Johnson** was named the National Specialist All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Sept. 30 after playing a key role in TTU's 38-37 win over Indiana State. After Indiana State had scored the first touchdown on the night, Johnson blocked the point after attempt and that single point proved to be the difference in the game. Later in the quarter Johnson rejected a 20-yard field goal attempt by the Sycamores which was scooped up by teammate James Huguely and returned 87 yards for a touchdown to give Tech a 10-6 advantage.

Garoppolo Sets OVC Career Touchdown Passes and Yardage Records: Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** continues to etch his name in the OVC record book, breaking the OVC's career records for touchdown passes and passing yards on Sept. 28 against Eastern Kentucky. The senior tossed his 86th touchdown pass to break the previous record of 85 held by former EIU All-American and current Dallas Cowboy quarterback Tony Romo. Garoppolo now has 88 career touchdown passes, which ranks 22nd in NCAA FCS history. He also broke the OVC career record for passing yards, passing the old mark of 9,990 yards by Murray State's Casey Brockman; Garoppolo now has 10,159 passing yards, making him one of just 30 players in FCS history to reach the 10,000 yard plateau. Through five games this season the senior has 2,053 passing yards and 23 touchdowns which leads all Division I players (FBS or FCS).

Lora Sets OVC Career Receptions Record; Now 12th in NCAA History: Eastern Illinois senior All-American wide receiver **Erik Lora** set the OVC career receptions record in the Panthers victory over nationally-ranked Illinois State on Sept. 14. Lora broke the 43-year old record held by Austin Peay's Harold "Red" Roberts who caught 232 passes from 1967-70. Lora, who also owns the OVC record for receptions in a game (21) and a season (136), now has 261 career receptions, which ranks 12th in NCAA FCS history. Although it is unlikely he will set the NCAA record of 395 (he is 134 away), he is just 56 catches away from ranking second in FCS history (that mark is 317 held by Jacquay Nunally of Florida A&M). Lora also now ranks second in OVC history for receiving yards (3,126) and is just 777 yards away from the record.

OVC Teams in the Top 25: After a convincing victory over Eastern Kentucky on Saturday, Eastern Illinois moved up to No. 5 in both the Sports Network and FCS Coaches Top 25 polls on Monday. That was a three-spot jump in the Sports Network poll and an impressive seven-spot leap in the Coaches poll. The Panthers are the first OVC team to be ranked in the Top 5 since Jacksonville State was ranked No. 4 on Nov. 15, 2010. The ranking for EIU is the highest since the team was ranked No. 2 nationally in 2002 when Tony Romo was the team's starting quarterback. UT Martin is the only other team ranked, moving from 23rd to 22nd in the Sports Network poll (they are unofficially 26th in the FCS Coaches poll); UTM has a pair of victories over FCS Top 25 teams this season (No. 24 Chattanooga and No. 7 Central Arkansas). Jacksonville State and Tennessee State are among the other teams receiving votes in both polls, while Murray State is picking up votes in the Sports Network poll.

UT Martin Among Few Ranked FCS Teams to Not Trail in a FCS Game This Season: UT Martin is currently one of three teams ranked in this week's Sports Network Top 25 poll to not trail to an FCS opponent this season and to also not allow a single point in the first half. The other two teams are No. 1 North Dakota State (in two games has not allowed a point to a FCS team) and No. 4 Northern Iowa. NDSU and UNI will play each other on Saturday while UT Martin hosts Jacksonville State.

NCAA Stats Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders (Sept. 29), Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** ranks first nationally in total passing yards (2,053), passing touchdowns (23), passing yards/game (410.6), total offense (411.0 yards/game) and points responsible for/game (28.0), third in completions (30.20/game) and seventh in passing efficiency (169.4). EIU wide receiver **Erik Lora** ranks first nationally in receptions/game (10.4) and receiving touchdowns (9) and second in receiving yards/game (132.8) and total receiving yards (664). Murray State wide receiver **Walter Powell** is third in receiving touchdowns (8) and seventh in kickoff returns (34.1 yards/return). UT Martin quarterback **Dylan Favre** ranks fifth in completion percentage (71.0%) while Jacksonville State running back **DaMarcus James** ranks ninth in rushing touchdowns (7). Tennessee State's **Martine Stevenson** is third in kickoff returns (40.2 yards/return) while Jacksonville State's **Griffin Thomas** is first nationally in field goals (2.4/game) and TSU's **Jamin Godfrey** is third (1.8/game). Tennessee Tech's **Chad Zinchini** is second in punting (48.3 yards/punt). TSU's **David Van Dyke** is first nationally in interceptions (0.80/game) while EIU's **Jourdan Wickliffe** is first in forced fumbles (0.80/game). Teammate **DJ Bland** is third in passes defended (1.8/game) while Murray State's **Tray Carr** is first in fumbles recovered/game (1.0) while the Racers **Chavez Sims** is fifth in sacks/game (1.3). In the team rankings Eastern Illinois is first nationally in total offense (598.0 yards/game) and passes intercepted (11), second in passing offense (429.8) and kickoff return yardage defense (13.2 yards/return), third in scoring offense (43.6 points/game) and turnovers gained (15), and sixth in turnover margin (+1.6/game) and passing efficiency (167.09). Tennessee State ranks second nationally in pass efficiency defense (85.60), third in total defense (252.8 yards/game), fourth in scoring defense (12.4 points/game) and pass defense (132.2 yards/game), sixth in kickoff returns (28.31 yards/return), seventh in turnovers gained (14) and eighth in fumbles recovered (6) and passes intercepted (8). Tennessee Tech ranks first nationally in red zone offense (100%), second in punt returns (23.17 yards/return) and third in net punting (42.86 yards/punt). Murray State ranks fifth in kickoff returns (28.88 yards/return) and eighth in passes intercepted (8).

NCAA Attendance Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA FCS attendance leaders, Jacksonville State is 10th nationally with an average of 17,603 fans per game while Tennessee State is 14th with 16,108 fans.

Eastern Illinois Knocks Off FBS Foe San Diego State in Week 1; Jacksonville State Tops FBS Georgia State in Week 4: Week 1 of the 2013 season saw eight teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FBS) defeat teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) including Eastern Illinois thrashing defending Mountain West Conference Champion San Diego State 40-19. 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margin of victory was the second largest for an OVC team ever over a FBS squad (the largest was a 24-point win by Eastern Kentucky over Louisville in 1985). In week four (Sept. 21), Jacksonville State knocked off first-year FBS opponent Georgia State 32-26 in overtime. It marked the first time since the 1987 season that OVC teams had won multiple FBS games in the same year (that season Austin Peay beat Kansas State and Youngstown State topped Bowling Green). OVC teams have now knocked off FBS foes in three of the last four years, as Jacksonville State beat Ole Miss in 2010 and UT Martin beat Memphis in 2012. Overall OVC schools 32-182-1 all-time against FBS foes and have one more game against FBS teams this season (Nov. 9 when UTM plays at Memphis).

FCS Over FBS: So far this season a record 14 teams from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) have scored victories over teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS).

Jacksonville State Ties FCS Record By Playing in Three-Straight Overtime Games: Jacksonville State played in three-straight overtime games from Sept. 14-28. The Gamecocks topped North Alabama (Sept. 14) and Georgia State (Sept. 21) before falling to Murray State (Sept. 28). That tied the Division I all-time record for most consecutive overtime contests, equaling a mark by Penn in 2006 (no FBS team has ever played in three-straight).

Jacksonville State Ties NCAA Record For Most 100 Yard Rushers in a Game: When Jacksonville State had four players rush for 100 yards or more against Jacksonville University on Sept. 7, the Gamecocks tied the Division I (FBS and FCS) record for that feat. The record had been done seven times previously including Arizona State (1951), Texas (1969), Alabama (1973), Army (1984), Nebraska (2001), Nevada (2009), Arkansas State (2013). There is no NCAA record of a team from the FCS achieving the feat prior to JSU accomplishing it. The four JSU players over 100 yards were **Troymaine Pope** (160), **Miles Jones** (138), **Eli Jenkins** (128) and **DaMarcus James** (105).

plosion over Campbellsville on Sept. 7, Murray State established a new OVC record for most points scored in a half. The Racers scored 41 points in the first quarter and added 21 points in the second quarter to break the previous record of 49. That old record had been achieved three times: Eastern Kentucky (1981), UT Martin (2007) and Murray State (2012).

Three OVC Players on Walter Payton Watch List: Three Ohio Valley Conference players were among the 20 players nationally named to the initial Walter Payton Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. The players were Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo**, Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** and Murray State wide receiver/return specialist **Walter Powell**. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. Last season the OVC has four finalists for the award with Lora finishing fourth, the highest finish for an OVC player since EIU's Tony Romo won the award in 2002. The three selections this preseason for the OVC ranked tied for second (along with the Southern Conference) among FCS conferences; the Missouri Valley Football Conference had four total selections on the list. The Payton Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The top three vote-getters will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation.

TSU's Godbolt on Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** is one of 20 players nationally named to the initial Buck Buchanan Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, is presented annually to the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The Buchanan Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The winner will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation on Dec. 16.

NCAA Division I Playoff Information: This season marks the first of an expanded 24-team playoff for NCAA Division I teams. In 2010 the FCS Playoffs expanded from 16 teams to 20 teams, the first expansion since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. This year the top eight seeds will receive byes to the second round while the first round will feature 16 teams in eight total matchups. For the first time the Pioneer League will receive an automatic bid to the playoffs (bringing the number of auto bids to 11). For the fourth-straight year the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at FC Dallas Stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 4 (1 p.m. CT, ESPN2). The playoff field will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 24.

Sgt. York Trophy Enters Seventh Season in 2013: The Sgt. York Trophy is a challenge trophy which goes to the annual winner of the quadrangular season series between the four football-playing OVC institutions in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the OVC announced the creation of the trophy, which is only the second traveling trophy involving more than two schools nationwide (the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy). It is named after Sgt. Alvin C. York, a native of Pall Mall, Tenn. and a Soldier who was one of the most honored of World War I. He received the Congressional Medal of Honor after the war and returned to his home state to dedicate his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). In 2007 Tennessee State and Austin Peay finished in a tie for the trophy with identical 2-1 records; both shared the award but Tennessee State went home with the hardware due to a 1-point win in the head-to-head meeting during the season (that was the tiebreaker used only for the first year of the trophy series). Tennessee State went 3-0 in Sgt. York play in 2008 to claim its second trophy. In 2009 Tennessee Tech claimed the trophy after going undefeated in Sgt. York games and in 2010 UT Martin became the third-straight OVC team to go 3-0 and win the trophy in claiming its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech shared the title (TSU went home with the trophy) while Tennessee State and UT Martin shared the title in 2012 (TSU once again took home the actual trophy). The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring.

Jude Named National Freshman of the Week (Sept. 23): Eastern Kentucky redshirt freshman running back **JJ Jude** was named National Co-Freshman of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 23 after his performance against Morehead State. Jude carried the ball 33 times for 195 yards and four touchdowns as ECU won 56-24. The four rushing touchdowns tied an ECU single-game record. Jude carried the ball 33 times (and averaged 5.9 yards/carry) after carrying the ball only 19 times in the first three games of the season.

Garoppolo Named National Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 16): Eastern Illinois senior quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named National Offensive Player of the Week by both the Sports Network and College Sporting News on Sept. 16 for his performance in a convincing victory over No. 16 Illinois State. It marked the second-straight week he earned the honor from College Sporting News. Garoppolo completed 26-of-41 passes for 480 yards and seven touchdowns (six in the first half) as EIU won 57-24 over its rival. The seven touchdown passes for the game broke the school record previously held by Tony Romo and Jeff Christensen (Garoppolo's high school quarterback coach).

Thomas Named National Specialist of Week (Sept. 16): Jacksonville State senior kicker **Griffin Thomas** was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 16 after hitting five field goals in JSU's double overtime victory over North Alabama. The five field goals set a new Jax State record while his 16 points tied the school record for points by a kicker. The senior started the day by connecting on a 50-yarder in the first quarter, becoming just the third player in Gamecock history to kick a 50-yard or longer field goal. Thomas added a 42-yard field goal in the second quarter and

Garoppolo Named National Offensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News (Sept. 9): Eastern Illinois senior quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo was named National Offensive All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Sept. 9 for his play against Southern Illinois. Garoppolo completed 34-of-56 passes for 440 yards and four touchdowns as No. 14 Eastern Illinois topped rival SIU 40-37 in double overtime on Saturday. The 440 passing yards are the fifth-best in EIU single-game history, while his 442 yards of total offense was the fourth-most in EIU history.

Bell Named National Defensive Player of the Week by Sports Network (Sept. 9): UT Martin junior linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network on Sept. 9 for his play against Boise State. Bell had six tackles (5 solo) including 5.0 tackles-for-loss (for a loss of 26 yards) against the Broncos. He also added a pair of sacks, forced two fumbles and had a fumble recovery.

McNulty Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 2): Eastern Illinois senior defensive back **Alex McNulty** was named National Co-Defensive Player of the Week by The Sports Network and National Defensive All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News on Sept. 2 for his efforts in EIU's 21-point victory over Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe San Diego State. The senior picked off two passes and returned them for a total of 50 yards including setting up EIU's final touchdown of the night in the fourth quarter. He also added five tackles, a tackle-for-loss and had two pass break-ups. He was part of a defensive unit that limited the Aztecs to just 19 points (1 touchdown, 4 field goals).

EIU's Lora, TSU's Powell Earn National Weekly Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 4: Eastern Illinois wide receiver **Erik Lora** was named National Wide Receiver of the Week while Tennessee State tight end **A.C. Leonard** was named National Tight End of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week 4 of the 2013 season. Lora caught 14 passes for 198 yards and three touchdowns as EIU lost by four points at FBS foe Northern Illinois. Leonard caught five passes for 122 yards and two touchdowns as TSU topped Tennessee Tech in its OVC opener. In addition to the duo, seven other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

Garoppolo, Powell and Thomas Earn National Weekly Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 3: Eastern Illinois quarterback **Jimmy Garoppolo** was named National Performer of the Week (and National Quarterback of the Week) by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following his performance in week three of the 2013 season. In addition Murray State's **Walter Powell** was named National All-Purpose Performer of the Week and National Kickoff Returner of the Week while Jacksonville State kicker **Griffin Thomas** was named National Placekicker of the Week. Garoppolo had 480 passing yards and seven touchdowns in his team's convincing victory over nationally-ranked Illinois State. Powell accounted for 306 all-purpose yards, catching 11 passes for 155 yards and four touchdowns (including the game-winner with 24 seconds remaining) and also returning a kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown. Thomas kicked five field goals as JSU topped North Alabama in double overtime. In addition to the duo, 15 other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

Bell Earns National Defensive Performer of the Week, Stevenson National Kickoff Returner of the Week Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 2: UT Martin junior linebacker **Tony Bell** was named National Defensive Performer of the Week (and National Linebacker of the Week) while Tennessee State junior **Martine Stevenson** was named National Kickoff Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week two of the 2013 season. Bell had six tackles, 5.0 tackles-for-loss, 2.0 sacks, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery in UT Martin's game at FBS foe Boise State. Stevenson returned a kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown in TSU's road win over Florida A&M. In addition to the duo, nine (9) other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

Vanlier and Little Share National Punt Returner of the Week Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 1: Tennessee Tech sophomore **Ladarius Vanlier** and Eastern Illinois sophomore **Shepard Little** were each named the National Punt Returners of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following performances in week one of the 2013 season. Vanlier returned a punt 93 yards for a touchdown as Tennessee Tech routed Cumberland University while Little returned a punt 60 yards for a touchdown to push EIU to a victory over FBS opponent San Diego State. In addition to the duo, six (6) other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week.

A Look at the Coaches: Seven of the nine head coaches from last season return to their schools in the Ohio Valley Conference this season. The only newcomers are Austin Peay's **Kirby Cannon** and Jacksonville State's **Bill Clark**. Southeast Missouri's **Tony Samuel** and UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** are now the longest tenured active coaches, each entering the eighth seasons at their respective schools. Clark and TSU's **Rod Reed** are currently the only OVC football coaches serving as head coaches at their alma maters.

A Brother Coaching Duo: This season Tennessee Tech head coach **Watson Brown** and his brother Mack Brown (the head coach at Texas) could become the winningest set of brothers in NCAA Division I history. After week four of the 2013 season the duo has 357 victories (232 by Mack, 125 by Watson) which trails only Bill and Vince Dooley (362 total wins) on the all-time list.

Preseason Forecasts: For the first time since 2007, Eastern Illinois was picked as the preseason

favorite in the OVC. The defending champion Panthers picked up 12 of a possible 18 first-place votes to top the poll with 122 points. Eastern Kentucky was second (114 points, 4 first-place votes) while Tennessee State ranked third (90 points, 2 first-place votes). The poll was rounded out by Jacksonville State (87), UT Martin (78), Murray State and Tennessee Tech (tied with 53 points), Southeast Missouri (35) and Austin Peay (16). Is being picked first in the preseason poll necessarily a good thing? In the past 35 years of preseason polls (all that were available), the preseason predicted champion has only gone on to win the OVC Championship 13 times (37.1%). After eight years of not picking the champion right (2003-2010), the 2011 preseason poll picked the right champion after the league finished in a three-way tie.

EIU's Lora and TSU's Godbolt Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Eastern Illinois senior wide receiver **Erik Lora** was named 2013 Ohio Valley Conference Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Tennessee State junior cornerback **Stephen Godbolt III** was tabbed OVC Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Tennessee State led the way with seven selections on the preseason team while Eastern Illinois had six and Eastern Kentucky had four. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (11 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included 10 players who were second-team selections in 2012. Of the 27 total selections, 19 were seniors and eight were juniors.

NFL Connections: As of September 30, there are 14 former Ohio Valley Conference players are on NFL rosters (8 active, 4 practice squad members and 2 on IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, a three-time Pro Bowl pick, Cortland Finnegan (Samford), who has been a Pro Bowl defensive back selection and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now with the Denver Broncos. Eight of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the eighth year the OVC has streamed live events, but second year the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

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SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2013 season marks the seventh of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in March of each year).

Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award after compiling 2-1 records in round robin play in 2007. Tennessee State took home the trophy, however, by winning the individual matchup with Austin Peay by one point in overtime. Tennessee State claimed the 2008 trophy after going 3-0 in Sgt. York games while Tennessee Tech won all three of its Sgt. York games to claim the 2009 trophy. UT Martin made it three straight years with the winning team going 3-0, completing the perfect season in 2010 to win its first title. In 2011 Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech finished in a tie for the Trophy (2-1) and were declared co-champions. Tennessee State, however, will take home the actual trophy since they had gone the most seasons without winning it (2008, compared to 2009 for TTU).

Last year TSU held on to the trophy by finishing 2-1 and winning the tiebreaker with UT Martin.

GAME NOTES: Saturday will mark the annual Homecoming game for UT Martin as the Skyhawks will host Jacksonville State in the OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3. JSU holds a 27-7 advantage in the all-time series and has won three of the last four in the series, although UTM won a season ago, coming out on top in a wild 49-47 game. That contest featured 1,126 yards of total offense and an amazing 13 passing touchdowns. Derek Carr was 28-of-43 for 402 yards and seven touchdowns for the Skyhawks (earning National Player of the Week honors) while Marques Ivory was 17-of-36 for 323 yards and six scores for the Gamecocks. Tevin Barksdale added 120 yards on the ground for UTM while DaMarcus James had 128 rushing yards for JSU. Both UT Martin wide receiver Quentin Sims and Jacksonville State wide out Alan Bonner tied the OVC record by hauling in five touchdown passes apiece.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State suffered its first loss of the season and first loss under new head coach Bill Clark in falling by one point in overtime to Murray State on Saturday. The Gamecocks fell behind 20-10 at halftime but pulled ahead in the fourth quarter on a one-yard touchdown run by DaMarcus James. After MSU had re-taken the lead in the fourth quarter, JSU marched down the field in 12 plays and got a Griffin Thomas 25-yard field goal to tie the game at 27 and force overtime for the third-straight week for the Gamecocks. James then rushed for a touchdown to start the overtime before Murray State countered with a score and then went for the 2-point conversion which they successfully converted to snap a nine-game losing streak to JSU. It snapped a six-game winning streak for the Gamecocks in overtime and tied a Division I record for most consecutive overtime games (with Penn set in 2006). Jax State did manage 652 yards of total offense, setting a new school record in its Division I era; but the team did throw three interceptions and lost a fumble to help the MSU cause. James finished the game with 189 rushing yards and three touchdowns and now ranks ninth nationally in rushing touchdowns (7) in 2013. Thomas had two field goals in the game and continues to lead all FCS players in field goals made/game (2.4); he is connected on at least one field goal in all five team games this season. Defensively Brandon Bender had 15 tackles (12 solo stops) and now ranks second in the OVC in tackles/game (9.4).

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin continued its hot streak to the season in improving to 3-1 overall with a 17-7 win over Southeast Missouri on Saturday. The Skyhawks jumped out to a 17-0 halftime advantage and allowed just 306 yards of total offense on the night. Entering this week the Skyhawks are one of just three teams in the Sports Network Top 25 to (A) not trail against a FCS team this season and (B) not allow a first half point against a FCS team this season; the other two teams are North Dakota State and Northern Iowa who play each other this weekend. The Skyhawks were led by DJ McNeil who rushed for 148 yards on 27 carries; McNeil now ranks first in the OVC and 19th nationally in rushing (111.8 yards/game). Abou Toure added 56 yards and Najee Ray had his first career touchdown in the second quarter. As a team UTM ranks second in the OVC and 26th nationally in rushing offense (217.5 yards/game). Quarterback Dylan Favre completed 11-of-16 passes for 118 yards and a touchdown; he now ranks fifth nationally in completion percentage (71.0%) on the season. The team converted 2-of-2 scoring chances in the red zone and is now 10-of-11 (90.9%) for the season which is second in the OVC and 20th nationally. Defensively senior linebacker Ben Johnson had 12 tackles; he continues to rank first in the OVC and now 34th nationally in tackles/game (9.8). Johnson now has three-straight double-digit tackle games.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee Tech will travel to Murray State for the 79th all-time meeting between the schools in a series that dates back to 1930. Murray State has won three-straight in the series including an impressive 70-35 victory a season ago. Murray State scored 28 first quarter points and jumped out to a 42-7 lead on its way to the victory. The Racers had 599 yards of total offense on the night as Casey Brockman completed 32-of-38 passes for 381 yards and two touchdowns while Jaamal Berry rushed for 142 yards and Duane Brady added 72 yards and three rushing scores. Tre Lamb threw for two touchdowns passes for the Golden Eagles while Ladarius Vanlier returned a kickoff 94 yards for a touchdown. Vanlier ended the game with 291 all-purpose yards and was named National Specialist of the Week.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Despite being outgained 554-to-264, Tennessee Tech was able to make some big plays and come-from-behind to top Indiana State 38-37. One of the biggest impacts was made by senior defensive tackle Jordan Johnson who blocked two kicks in the contest and was named National Special Teams Player of the Week afterwards. After Indiana State had scored the first touchdown on the night, Johnson blocked the point after attempt and that single point proved to be the difference in the game. Later in the quarter Johnson rejected a 20-yard field goal attempt by the Sycamores which was scooped up by teammate James Huguely and returned 87 yards for a touchdown to give Tech a 10-6 advantage. Huguely finished the game with a career-high 12 tackles to go along with his touchdown and was named OVC Co-Defensive Player of the Week. The Golden Eagles led 31-19 after a Jared Davis five-yard touchdown run before seeing Indiana State score 18 unanswered points to pull ahead 37-31 with 12:31 to play in the game. But Davis led the team on an 11-play, 77-yard touchdown drive that was capped with his two-yard touchdown pass to Zack Ziegler with 1:11 to play. The Tech defense still had to withstand one last Sycamore drive, but Tevin McDermott intercepted a pass at the TTU 35-yard line with 17 seconds left to prevent a potential game-winning field goal attempt; that was one of three interceptions on the night for the Golden Eagles. Davis, who replaced an injured Darian Stone during the game, was 11-of-12 for 97 yards and a passing and rushing touchdown on the night. As a team Tech ranks second nationally in punt returns (23.17 yards/return) and third in net punting (42.86 yards/punt). Senior punter Chad Zinchini is now second nationally in punting (48.3 yards/punt).

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State snapped a nine-game losing streak to Jacksonville State, coming from behind to top the Gamecocks 35-34 in overtime. After JSU had scored first in the extra period, sophomore quarterback Maikhal Miller was able to convert a 4th-and-10 with a 13-yard pass to Jeremy Harness and then carried four-straight times, punctuating the possession with a one-yard touchdown run. Instead of going for the extra point and forcing a second overtime, head coach Chris Hatcher made the call to go for it and Miller completed a pass to Harness to pull off the victory. Miller finished the game with 109 yards and a touchdown through the air and 134 yards and two touchdowns on the ground to earn OVC Newcomer of the Week honors. His performance was boosted by a MSU defense, who despite allowing 652 total yards (a new JSU Division I record), came up with three interceptions and a fumble recovery. Senior Brandon Wicks had 12 tackles and forced a key fumble in the final seconds of the first half to preserve a 10-point halftime lead. As a team MSU ranks fifth nationally in kickoff returns (28.88 yards/return) and 12th in turnovers gained (12).

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay will play its fifth-straight road game to start the season when they travel to Richmond, Ky. for a date with the Eastern Kentucky Colonels. ECU has dominated the all-time series, leading by a 40-5 margin, although Austin Peay has won two of the last four in the series (2009, 2011), both of those coming in Clarksville. The Governors have not won in Richmond since a 20-17 victory in 1977 (the year APSU won its lone OVC Championship). After that APSU victory, Eastern Kentucky won 22-straight in the series until losing 24-20 in 2009. A season ago ECU quarterback T.J. Pryor passed for 232 yards and two scores while Matt Denham rushed for 114 yards and two touchdowns as ECU won 45-14 in Richmond. The game is a matchup of the top two time of possession teams in the OVC; Austin Peay leads the league at 31:57 while Eastern Kentucky is second at 31:31.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay is coming off its bye week after playing one of the toughest schedules in the FCS to start the season. The Governors have played three FBS opponents (Tennessee, Vanderbilt and Ohio) and Chattanooga all on the road to begin the 2013 campaign. Before the bye week the team lost 38-0 at Ohio (who is now 3-1 on the season). After going 84 games without being shutout, it marked the second time in four games the Govs had been shutout. Sophomore newcomer Omar Williams carried the ball 13 times for 103 yards, becoming APSU's first 100-yard rusher of the season. Included in his total was a 57-yard scamper in the fourth quarter, the longest play from scrimmage for the Govs. Tim Phillips added 69 yards on the ground for APSU. After only four first downs in the first half, Austin Peay managed nine first downs in the second half. Austin Peay totaled 149,908 fans in its three games against FBS opponents this season.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky ran into the Eastern Illinois offensive buzz saw on Saturday, falling behind 35-0 at halftime on its way to a 42-7 loss to the No. 8 team in the country. The Colonels managed just 266 yards of total offense on the afternoon and scored its lone touchdown with 3:33 to play to avoid its first shutout since the 2006 season. That touchdown was a three-yard run by Caleb Watkins that capped a 14-play, 75-yard drive. Redshirt freshman JJ Jude led the rushing attack with 69 yards while Jared Sanders added 48 yards. Redshirt freshman wide receiver Devin Borders caught three passes for 33 yards and also blocked two field goal attempts in the game. Brandon Stanley led the way with eight tackles.

GAME NOTES: Southeast Missouri and Tennessee State will meet for the 22nd time in the all-time series which dates back to the 1991 season. Tennessee State has won the last two in the series, doing so by a combined margin of 95-31. A season ago the teams combined for nearly 1,000 yards of total offense and TSU pulled out to a 33-21 lead midway through the fourth quarter before the Redhawks scored with 2:22 to play to make the margin just five. But TSU, ranked 18th nationally at the time, recovered the on-side kick and scored five plays later to account for the final margin of 40-28 and improve to 7-0 on the season. Michael German passed for 154 yards and at touchdown for the Tigers, who were led by 267 rushing yards and four touchdowns from Trabis Ward. Scott Lathrop passed for 222 yard and a touchdown and rushed for 145 yards and another score from the Redhawks.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri dropped to 0-4 on the season with a 17-7 loss to nationally-ranked UT Martin on Saturday night in its home opener. The Skyhawks jumped out to a 17-0 halftime advantage but the Redhawks defense was stout in the second half, limiting UTM to just three first downs and 86 yards of offense over the final two quarters. Southeast also shutout SEC foe Ole Miss in the second half earlier this season. Quarterback Scott Lathrop passed for 71 yards and rushed for 64 while fellow quarterback Kyle Snyder also passed for 71 yards and rushed for 13 on the night. Ron Coleman tallied 40 rushing yards including the only touchdown of the night for the Redhawks, coming with 6:17 to play. The Southeast defense forced two fumbles for the third-straight game, finishing with an interception and a fumble recovery. As a team this season the Redhawks are first in the OVC in fewest penalties/game (5.25) and fewest penalty yards/game (42.5).

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State won its fourth-straight game by rolling over Division II foe Central State 73-6 in the Gateway Classic in St. Louis. The Tigers rolled up 539 yards of total offense for the game as it jumped out to a 28-0 first quarter advantage. The 539 yards were the most for the team since the 1998 season. The defense continued to play well and is now ranked third nationally in total defense (252.8 yards/game) and fourth in passing defense (132.2 yards/game) and scoring defense (12.4 points/game allowed). For the first time this season that defense did not pick off a pass, but they did force two fumbles and sacked the CSU quarterbacks three times. Offensively Tim Broughton rushed for 108 yards and two touchdowns and is second in the OVC and 37th nationally in rushing (90.8 yards/game). Darion Hall added 94 yards and a score. Getting his first start of the season, quarterback Michael German completed 8-of-8 passes for 159 yards and three touchdowns while backup Ronald Butler was 5-of-8 for 69 yards and three scores while also rushing for 43 yards.
