THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

In each of the four games in Week 8 the team lower in the standings picked up the victory, including the bottom three teams in the standings all winning...Austin Peay topped Murray State 20-13 to end what had been the longest active losing streak in Division I football (18 games); it was the first win for the Governors since beating Tennessee Tech in the final game of the 2012 season (Nov. 17)...Tennessee Tech senior safety Marty Jones tied the OVC single-game record with four interceptions in his team's win over No. 12 Eastern Kentucky; he now shares the record with five other players and is the first to record four picks in a game in the OVC since the 1986 season...The four interceptions by Jones is the most by a Division I player (FBS or FCS) this season; Jones was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network, marking the fourth OVC player to pick up the honor this season, and third in as many weeks...The loss was the first of the season for EKU who had been one of five undefeated FCS teams entering the weekend...UT Martin won at Tennessee State for the first time since the 2010 season and is now 2-0 in Sgt. York Trophy games, putting the team in the driver's seat to take home the trophy (contested between the four OVC schools from the state of Tennessee) for the first time since 2010; UTM just needs to beat Austin Peay this week to claim the trophy...Jacksonville State, who was idle this week, is now the only undefeated team in OVC play (3-0) and has won five games in a row overall...Southeast Missouri kicker Ryan McCrum has made four field goals from 50-plus yards this season; he is the only FCS player to accomplish that feat in 2014...This week's action includes Eastern Illinois hosting Tennessee State in the OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3, while Eastern Kentucky entertains Southeast Missouri, UT Martin hosts Austin Peay and Jacksonville State will host Tennessee Tech...In non-conference action Murray State hosts Kentucky Wesleyan.

OFFENSIVE

Darian Stone, QB • Sr., 6-0, 200 • Clinton, Tenn. • Tennessee Tech

Stone threw three touchdown passes in the fourth quarter as Tennessee Tech scored 29 unanswered points in the quarter to come-from-behind and upset No. 12 Eastern Kentucky 39-31. He started the quarter with a 14-yard touchdown to freshman Brock McCoin to cap a 13-play, 85-yard drive and five minutes later connected with Cody Matthews to pull Tech to within 31-24. With 3:41 to play in the game he connected with McCoin again to bring the team within a point and following a two-point conversion Tech led by one point. Overall Stone accounted for 291 yards of total offense in completing 26-of-45 passes for 225 yards and rushing 17 times for 66 yards.

DEFENSIVE

Marty Jones, FS • Sr., 5-11, 195 • Cincinnati, Ohio • Tennessee Tech

Jones tied the OVC single-game record with four interceptions (two of which came in the final 1:07 of the game) as Tennessee Tech upset No. 12 Eastern Kentucky 39-31 on Saturday night. The four interceptions are the most by a Division I (FBS or FCS) player this season. Jones had two interceptions in the second quarter, ending ECU drives at the TTU 39 and 32-yard lines. After the Golden Eagles had pulled ahead 39-31 late in the fourth quarter, he picked off Bennie Coney with 1:07 to play. But after a three-and-out possession Tech punted the ball back and this time Jones intercepted the other ECU quarterback, Jared McClain, at the Tech 35-yard line with 16 seconds left to seal the victory. It was the team's first win over a nationally-ranked opponent since November 2012 (No. 23 UT Martin). Jones also added a game-high 12 tackles and ran in a two-point conversion when he picked up a low snap and rushed to the end zone with 3:41 to play in the fourth quarter to give Tech a 32-31 lead and proved to be the game-winner. He now shares the OVC interceptions record with Jim Pickens (WKU, 1948), Buddy Pfaadt (EKU, 1966), Bud Qualk (Murray State, 1969), Jim Hardie (APSU, 1970) and Pat Smith (EKU, 1986). Jones currently ranks ninth nationally in interceptions (0.6/game) and 32nd in tackles (9.4/game).

SPECIALIST

Ladarius Vanlier, RS/WR • Jr., 5-8, 175 • Nashville, Tenn. • Tennessee Tech

Vanlier accounted for an OVC season-best 264 all-purpose yards including rushing for a 63-yard touchdown and returning a punt 79 yards for a touchdown as Tennessee Tech came from behind to upset No. 12 Eastern Kentucky 39-31, handing ECU its first loss of the season. The junior got the Golden Eagles on the board at the start of the second quarter when he returned a punt 79 yards for a score, marking his second punt return for a touchdown this season; he is one of just two FCS players (and five total Division I players) to return multiple punts for scores this season. With 2:01 to play in the game and his team leading by a point, Vanlier took a handoff and raced 63 yards untouched for a score to seal the victory for TTU. The junior finished the game with a career-high 140 rushing yards on 19 carries (7.4 ypc), six receptions for 45 yards and 79 punt return yards. Vanlier ranks fourth nationally in punt returns (17.1 yards/return) and sixth in kickoff returns (29.7 yards/return).

CO-NEWCOMER

Mickey Macius, QB • Fr., 6-3, 206 • Arlington Heights, Ill. • Austin Peay

In just his second career start, Macius completed 18-of-22 passes for 201 yards and three touchdowns as Austin Peay topped rival Murray State 20-13 and snapped Division I's longest losing streak (18 games) which dated back to the beginning of the 2013 season. His 81.8 completion percentage marked the first time an APSU quarterback had been above 80 percent since the 2003 season when the Gobs were playing non-scholarship football. All three of his touchdown passes went to fellow freshman Jared Beard, including a 30-yarder in the second quarter, a seven-yarder with 6:01 to play in the third quarter and a 14-yarder at the end of the third quarter that proved to be the game-winner. Macius also completed an 11-yard pass to Beard with 2:40 remaining in the game that allowed Austin Peay to run out the clock and seal the victory.

CO-NEWCOMER

Jalen Whitlow, QB • Jr., 6-2, 220 • Montgomery, Ala. • Eastern Illinois

Whitlow, the transfer from Kentucky, accounted for five touchdowns (two passing, three rushing) as Eastern Illinois won 52-13 at Southeast Missouri. He completed 17-of-30 passes for 213 yards and touchdown passes of 50 and 5 yards (both to Adam Drake) while also carrying the ball 15 times for 75 yards and scores of 3, 13 and 2 yards. Over the past four games he has now completed 131-straight passes with an interception. Whitlow currently ranks 20th nationally in rushing touchdowns (8), 25th in total offense (258.7 yards/game) and 29th in both rushing yards/carry (5.87) and points responsible for (13.1/game). It marks the fourth time this season Whitlow has been named Newcomer of the Week.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Jones Named National Player of the Week (Oct. 20): Tennessee Tech senior free safety **Marty Jones** was named the National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network on Oct. 20 after tying the OVC single-game record with four interceptions (two of which came in the final 1:07 of the game) as Tennessee Tech upset No. 12 Eastern Kentucky 39-31. Jones had two interceptions in the second quarter, ending EKV drives at the TTU 39 and 32-yard lines. After the Golden Eagles had pulled ahead 39-31 late in the fourth quarter, he picked off Bennie Coney with 1:07 to play. But after a three-and-out possession Tech punted the ball back and this time Jones intercepted the other EKV quarterback, Jared McClain, at the Tech 35-yard line with 16 seconds left to seal the victory. Jones also added a game-high 12 tackles and ran in a two-point conversion when he picked up a low snap and rushed to the end zone with 3:41 to play in the fourth quarter to give Tech a 32-31 lead and proved to be the game-winner.

Austin Peay Snaps Longest Losing Streak in Division I: It was a long time coming but Austin Peay finally picked up its first win under second-year head coach **Kirby Cannon** and ended the longest losing streak in Division I (FBS or FCS) with a 20-13 win over rival Murray State on Oct. 18. Freshman quarterback **Mickey Macius** threw three touchdown passes to freshman **Jared Beard** to secure the victory. It snapped an 18-game losing streak dating back to the first game of the 2013 season; it was the first win since the team topped Tennessee Tech 38-31 on Nov. 17, 2012 in the final game of the 2012 campaign.

Jones Ties OVC Single-Game Record for Interceptions: Tennessee Tech senior **Marty Jones** tied the OVC single-game record for interceptions when he picked off four passes (including two in the final 1:07 of the game) in a victory over No. 12 Eastern Kentucky on Oct. 18. He now shares the OVC interceptions record with Jim Pickens (WKU, 1948), Buddy Pfaadt (EKU, 1966), Bud Qualk (Murray State, 1969), Jim Hardie (APSU, 1970) and Pat Smith (EKU, 1986). The four interceptions are the most by a Division I players in 2014.

Vanlier Among Top Returners Nationally: Tennessee Tech junior return specialist **Ladarius Vanlier** is one of just two FCS players who have multiple punt return touchdowns this season, returning two punts for scores (Mercer's Chandler Curtis has three). Vanlier also has a kickoff return for a touchdown and along with Mercer's Curtis are the only FCS players to return both a kickoff and punt for a touchdown this season. Vanlier currently ranks fourth nationally in punt returns (17.1 yards/return) and sixth in kickoff returns (29.7 yards/return).

OVC Teams in the Top 25: After an open date Jacksonville State remained ranked No. 6 in the Sports Network poll (matching its highest ranking this season) and No. 7 in the FCS Coaches Poll. After its first loss of the season, Eastern Kentucky dropped six spots in both polls and is now No. 18 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 19 in the Sports Network poll. Tennessee State and Southeast Missouri are receiving votes in the Sports Network poll while Eastern Illinois is receiving votes in the FCS Coaches poll. Twice the season (Sept. 8 and Oct. 6) the OVC has had four teams ranked in the same week, the first time that has occurred since the end of the 2002 season. Overall five different OVC teams have been ranked this season and eight of nine current OVC teams have been ranked for at least one week over the past four years (2011-14).

Southeast Missouri Scores Win Over Top 3 Ranked Team; First OVC Non-Conference Win Over Top 3 Squad Since 1990: Southeast Missouri pulled off the biggest win of its Division I Era on Sept. 20 when they topped No. 3 ranked Southeastern Louisiana 24-23 at Houck Stadium. Southeast led the game entering the fourth quarter but fell behind 23-17 on a touchdown with 2:53 to go. But the Redhawks went 80 yards in 15 plays capped by Paul McRoberts 2-yard touchdown catch from Kyle Snyder (who had rushed up-the-middle for 15 yards on the previous play to set up the winning score). It marked the first non-conference victory by an OVC team over a Top 3 ranked squad since Sept. 8, 1990 when former member Middle Tennessee State (ranked No. 4 at the time) beat No. 1 Georgia Southern 16-13. Southeast would go on to defeat No. 20 Tennessee State on Oct. 4, marking the first time in its FCS history the program had bested two ranked teams in the same season.

Eastern Kentucky Tops FBS Miami (Ohio) In Week 1: For the fourth time in the last five years an OVC team has beaten a team from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) as Eastern Kentucky won 17-10 at Miami (Ohio) on Sept. 6. The win was the first for the Colonels over a FBS team since the 1985 season, snapping an 18-game losing streak for EKV against teams from the higher subdivision; EKV is now 7-20 all-time against FBS opponents while OVC teams are 33-191-1 all-time against FBS opponents. The streak of winning a FBS game in 4 of the past 5 years is even more impressive when you consider the OVC went from Sept. 25, 2004 to Sept. 4, 2010 without an FBS victory (a 50-game losing streak). Southeast's McCrum With FCS-Best Four Field Goals of 50-Plus Yards: Southeast Missouri State sophomore kicker **Ryan McCrum** is the only kicker in the FCS with four field goals of 50 yards or longer this season, and is tied with West Virginia's Josh Lambert by the most by a Division I player. McCrum has connected from 55, 54, 52 and 51 yards this season; his 55-yard field goal against Tennessee State is currently the third-longest field goal in the FCS this season. Overall McCrum is 13-of-16 in field goal attempts this season with seven of those coming from 40 yards or longer; he had misses of 46 and 43 yards in the Murray State game (Oct. 11) and missed from 52 yards against Eastern Illinois (Oct. 18).

OVC in the NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders (Oct. 19), Eastern Kentucky's **Devin Borders** ranks first nationally in blocked kicks (4) while teammate **Dy'Shawn Mobley** ranks sixth in rushing yards/carry (6.99). Eastern Illinois' **Adam Drake** ranks third in receptions/game (8.0) and fifth in total receiving yards (770) and receiving yards/game (110.0). Tennessee Tech's **Ladarius Vanlier** ranks fourth in punt returns (17.1 yards/return) and sixth in kickoff returns (29.7 yards/return). Southeast Missouri's **Ryan McCrum** is ninth in field goals made/game (1.63). Jacksonville State's **Jermaine Hough** is third in interceptions (0.7/game), while TTU's **Marty Jones** and EIU's **Jourdan Wickliffe** are tied for ninth in that category (0.6/game). Southeast Missouri's **Roper Garrett** is fourth in forced fumbles (0.63/game) and ninth in tackles (11.3/game). Murray State's **Jonathan Jackson** is seven in tackles/game (11.5) while UT Martin's **Tony Bell** is second in fumbles recovered (3). In the team rankings Tennessee State ranks first nationally in pass defense (129.8 yards/game) and pass efficiency defense (83.14), second in sacks/game (3.75), third in total defense (251.3 yards/

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game) and third down conversion defense (25.2%), fifth in passes intercepted (12), sixth in punt return yardage defense (2.80 yards/return) and eighth in scoring defense (16.3 points/game) and turnovers gained (19). Eastern Kentucky ranks third in fumbles recovered (11), turnovers gained (21), blocked kicks (5) and red zone defense (60.0%), seventh in rushing offense (257.1 yards/game) and eighth in passes intercepted (10). Jacksonville State ranks eighth in rushing offense (253.8 yards/game) and eighth in third down conversion defense (27.1%). Southeast Missouri ranks fifth in fourth down conversion percentage (76.9%), sixth in net punting (39.19 yards/punt), seventh in kickoff return yardage defense (15.73 yards/return) and 10th in sacks allowed/game (1.00). Murray State ranks fourth in punt return yardage defense (1.5 yards/return) while UT Martin is second in kickoff return yardage defense (15.1 yards/return).

Attendance: In the latest NCAA attendance rankings Jacksonville State currently ranks sixth in averaging 17,428 fans per game.

Delta Dental of Tennessee to Sponsor Sgt. York Trophy: Beginning this season Delta Dental of Tennessee is the presenting sponsor of the Sgt. York Trophy. The trophy (founded in 2007 by the Nashville Sports Council and OVC) goes to the winner of the quadrangular season football series between the four OVC football-playing schools located in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. As a corporal in the 2nd battalion, 328th Infantry, in the Battle of the Meuse River-Argonne (Oct. 8, 1918), York and seven other soldiers captured 132 prisoners, was promoted to sergeant and received the Distinguished Service Cross, the French Croix de Guerre, the French Legion of Honor, the Croce di Guerra of Italy and the War Medal of Montenegro. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). Tennessee State won its fifth Sgt. York Championship in 2014. The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring. UT Martin can claim its first title since 2010 with a win over Austin Peay this week.

OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3: For the second-straight year the OVC is producing a "Game of the Week" package that will air on ESPN3 this fall. The eight-game schedule is one again in conjunction with WebStream Sports, an Indianapolis-based company which is a proven leader in video production, streaming video and content creation Kevin Ingram, host of "The Wake Up Zone" on 104.5 The Zone in Nashville, will handle play-by-play duties while Bob Belvin, on-air talent and contributor at 100.7 FM/AM 540 (ESPN Clarksville), will provide analysis. The duo has worked together each of the past two years in the league's TV package. The OVC Football Game of the Week package is part of an overall five-year agreement with ESPN which was announced last October. The deal runs through the completion of the 2017-18 season.

The FCS Playoffs: In 2010 the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff field expanded to 20 teams, up from 16 previously, and last year (2013) the field increased to 24 for the first time. The expansion in 2010 to 20 teams was the first since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The field for the 2014 NCAA Division I Football Championship will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 23. The 24-team field is comprised of 11 automatic bids and 13 at-large berths. There are eight first round matchups (16 total teams), while eight (8) teams receive a bye into the second round. For the fifth time in 2014, the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Toyota Stadium, a 23,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 10.

OVC Playoff Success in 2013: After going since 2000 without a postseason victory the OVC had a breakout season in 2013. For the first time in its history the League put three teams (Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State and Tennessee State) in the playoffs and all three teams scored victories. TSU played first and snapped the OVC's 19-game losing streak with a 31-0 win over Butler (only the second shutout ever by an OVC team in the playoffs). Jacksonville State would then defeat Samford, setting an OVC playoff record with 55 points in the victory. In the second round Eastern Illinois topped TSU while Jacksonville State bested McNeese State to each advance to the quarterfinals. It marked just the second time in OVC history that two OVC teams advanced to the quarterfinals in the same postseason (1991 being the other). The four total wins in the postseason was the most in one postseason by the OVC and the four wins came by an average margin of 33.5 points/game.

James on Walter Payton Award Watch List: Jacksonville State running back **DaMarcus James** is among 20 players nationally named to the updated Walter Payton Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network on Sept. 30. EIU running back Shepard Little had been on the preseason list but was not included in the latest

update. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. The Sports Network will present the Heisman of the FCS for the 28th time on December 15 at the national awards banquet. Last season EIU quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo became the second OVC player to win the Walter Payton Award; overall the OVC had three of the 20 finalists for the award, the most of any FCS conference (Erik Lora finished seventh and Walter Powell was 17th a year ago). The Walter Payton Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2014 season. Ballots will be sent to a national panel of over 150 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The top three vote-getters will be invited to the presentation of the award.

Bell, Fitzpatrick Remain on Updated Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Two OVC players were among the 20 players nationally included on the updated Buck Buchanan Award Watch List on Sept. 30 by the Sports Network. The players were UT Martin senior linebacker **Tony Bell** and Tennessee State senior defensive back **Daniel Fitzpatrick** who were each on the preseason list. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, is presented annually to the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). No player from the OVC has ever won the award. The Buchanan Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The winner will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation on Dec. 15.

Lea on Jerry Rice Award Watch List: Jacksonville State offensive tackle **Justin Lea** is one of 21 players nationally named to the initial Watch List for the 2014 Jerry Rice Award. The award is presented by the Sports Network to the National Freshman of the Year in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The award is named for the legendary wide receiver Jerry Rice, who played in the FCS (then Division I-AA) at Mississippi Valley State. The award will be voted on by a national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The winner will be announced at The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation Dec. 15 in Philadelphia.

Humphries Sets OVC Single-Game Completions Record: Murray State sophomore quarterback **KD Humphries** set the OVC single-game completions record in a road game at Tennessee Tech on Oct. 4. The sophomore completed 48 passes to best the previous record of 45 set by former Murray State All-American Casey Brockman in each 2011 and 2012.

Humphries Named National Offensive Player of the Week (Oct. 13): Murray State sophomore quarterback **KD Humphries** was named National Co-Offensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network and National Offensive All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Oct. 13 after his six touchdown performance in a double overtime win over No. 23 Southeast Missouri. Humphries completed 21-of-36 passes for 297 yards and the six scores; he had at least one touchdown in each quarter, including the game-tying touchdown with 46 seconds left in regulation and the game-winning touchdown pass in double overtime to give the Racers the 44-41 victory.

Hough Named National Defensive All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News (Oct. 13): Jacksonville State junior defensive back **Jermaine Hough** was named National Defensive All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Oct. 13 after picking off two passes in a road win over No. 25 Tennessee State. Hough picked off a pass deep in his team's territory in the second quarter and then essentially ended the game with an interception in the end zone with six seconds to play as TSU was marching for a potential game-tying touchdown. Hough also added five tackles for the Gamecocks.

Hamm-Bey Named Sports Network's National Defensive Player of the Week (Oct. 6): Southeast Missouri State senior cornerback **Tim Hamm-Bey** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network on Oct. 6 for his play in a victory over nationally-ranked Tennessee State. Hamm-Bey had six tackles, five pass breakups and blocked a field goal as Southeast Missouri knocked off its second nationally-ranked opponent of the season, the first time that has happened in school history. He anchored a Redhawk defense that had a season-high 12 pass breakups as a unit and in the first quarter got a hand on TSU's field goal attempt, marking the fourth blocked kick of his career.

Jenkins Named National All-Star of the Week (Sept. 29): Jacksonville State quarterback **Eli Jenkins** was named National Offensive All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News after his performance in a 52-28 win over Murray State on Sept. 27. Jenkins rushed for a career-high 149 yards and rushed for three touchdowns while also completing 15-of-20 passes for 180 yards and another touchdown. The 15 completions and 180 passing yards were also career-highs for Jenkins who had touchdown runs of 12, 7 and 15 yards.

EKU's Absanon Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 8): Eastern Kentucky junior defensive back **Stanley Absanon** was named the National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network and College Sporting News following his performance in the team's win over FBS opponent Miami (Ohio). Early in the third quarter Absanon made a jarring hit in the end zone on a 3rd-and-4 play that prevented a RedHawk touchdown and saved four points (MU added a field goal instead). Three minutes later he picked off a pass and returned it 55 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 10. He would then seal the game by making an interception at midfield with less than one minute to play in the game. Absanon finished the game with two interceptions, six tackles and three pass breakups as ECU topped a FBS foe for the first time since the 1985 season.

Three OVC Student-Athletes Named Semifinalists for William V. Campbell Trophy: Three OVC football student-athletes were among the 167 semifinalists for the 2014 William V. Campbell Trophy®, presented by Fidelity Investments® and announced by The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF). The three OVC selections were Austin Peay punter **Ben Campbell**, Eastern Kentucky fullback **Caleb Watkins** and Jacksonville State offensive lineman **Max Holcombe**. The trio are three of just 37 student-athletes selected from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The award recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation, and up to 16 of the candidates will be named recipients of a prestigious NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award. Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The class is selected each year by the NFF Awards Committee, which is comprised of a nationally recognized group of media, College Football Hall of Famers and athletics administrators.

A Look at the Coaches: Six of the nine OVC coaches from last season returned to their respective teams in 2014. The three new coaches to the league are at Eastern Illinois (**Kim Dameron**), Jacksonville State (**John Grass**) and Southeast Missouri (**Tom Matukewicz**). Dameron comes to Charleston after most recently serving as the defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech. Grass was elevated from Offensive Coordinator to head coach after helping JSU to the FCS Quarterfinals a season ago. Matukewicz is at Southeast Missouri after a stint at Toledo. Grass and Tennessee State's **Rod Reed** are the only two OVC coaches who are currently coaching at their alma mater. The longest tenured coach in the league is UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** who enters his ninth season with the Skyhawks in 2014.

Preseason Forecasts: Jacksonville State has been picked the preseason favorite in the 2014 Ohio Valley Conference football race both a vote of league head coaches and sports information directors and in the inaugural OVC

media poll. In the coaches poll, the Gamecocks, who have also been picked preseason favorites in 2005, 2008, 2010 and 2011, picked up 10 of the 18 first-place votes to top the poll. The Gamecocks totaled 118 total points to out-distance two-time defending champion Eastern Illinois in the vote. The Panthers picked up four first-place votes and 110 total points in being picked second. Tennessee State picked up the other four first-place votes and was third with 107 points. Eastern Kentucky was picked fourth (82 points) and was followed in the poll by UT Martin (79), Murray State (54), Tennessee Tech (48), Southeast Missouri State (34) and Austin Peay (16). In the media poll the pollsters gave JSU 9 of 14 first-place votes and 118 total points. Tennessee State picked up four first-place votes and 113 total points in being picked second. Eastern Illinois received the other first-place vote and was picked third (98 points). The poll was rounded out by Eastern Kentucky (79), UT Martin (77), Murray State (56), Tennessee Tech (44), Southeast Missouri State (29) and Austin Peay (16).

JSU's James and TSU's Fitzpatrick Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Jacksonville State senior running back **DaMarcus James** was named the 2014 OVC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Tennessee State senior defensive end **Anthony Bass** was named Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Illinois and Jacksonville State each had eight Preseason All-OVC selections to lead all teams. Tennessee State had six picks. Tennessee Tech and UT Martin had two apiece while Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri each had one. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (10 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included nine players who were second-team picks in 2013. Of the 28 total selections, 20 were seniors, six were juniors and two were sophomores.

NFL Connections: As of October 20, there are 18 former Ohio Valley Conference players on NFL rosters (9 active, 2 practice squad, 7 on IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now with the New York Giants, and first-year quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo who won the Walter Payton Award in 2013 with Eastern Illinois and who is now the backup for Tom Brady in New England. Seven of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

Let's Get It Started: The 67th season of Ohio Valley Conference football got underway on Thursday, August 28. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2014. Since its beginning, 15 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the league have claimed at least one championship

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. Overall 2014-15 marks the ninth year the OVC has streamed live events. Starting with the re-branding of the streaming in 2012-13, events were offered free of charge and in an HD format and featured improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events are available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology. Approximately 41 OVC football games will be available on the OVCDN this season.

SGT. YORK TROPHY



The 2014 season marks the eighth of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

The 2014 season marks the first the award has been presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in February or March of each year).

Eastern Illinois Last Week: W, 52-13 at Southeast Missouri

GAME NOTES: Tennessee State and Eastern Illinois have played 17 previous times including twice a year ago when they also met in the second round of the FCS Playoffs. The Panthers won both of those meetings and have won three of the last four against the Tigers. In the first meeting a year ago the Panthers topped then No. 21-ranked TSU 34-16 as Jimmy Garoppolo passed for 410 yards and four touchdowns and Shepard Little rushed for 138 yards and a score. In the playoff meeting the Panthers led 37-0 at halftime on the way to a 51-10 victory. In that game Garoppolo had 240 passing yards and three scores while Little rushed for 184 yards and two touchdowns. Michael German passed for 242 yards and no interceptions in the loss.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State lost its third-straight OVC game, falling at home 21-16 to UT Martin. It marked the first time since the 1995 season that the Tigers lost back-to-back games at Hale Stadium (although the team did not play at the venue from 1999 until 2012). The TSU defense limited UT Martin to just 210 yards of total offense, but the team fumbled twice, was tackled for a loss six times and saw an interception returned for a touchdown in the loss. Michael German passed for 314 yards and two scores and in the process moved into eighth place in OVC history in career passing yards (7,336), eighth in career touchdown passes (51) and 10th in career total offense (7,409). Ryan Mitchell hauled in six passes for 156 yards and a 75-yard touchdown from German while Telvin Hooks had 28 rushing yards to pace the rushing attack that was limited to just 53 yards for the game. Michigan State transfer Ezra Robinson had 10 tackles, a sack and a pass breakup for the defense while Nick Thrasher added 11 tackles, moving him into second place in school history for tackles (trailing only his current coach Rod Reed). As a team TSU ranks first nationally in pass defense (129.8 yards/game) and pass efficiency defense (83.14), second in sacks/game (3.75) and third in total defense (251.3 yards/game) and third down conversion defense (25.2%).

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Two-time defending OVC champion Eastern Illinois proved they are still a contender this season with a convincing 52-13 victory over Southeast Missouri (who had previously been ranked in the Top 25 the week prior). The Panthers led 14-13 midway through the second quarter before the Panthers defense stepped up to shutout the Redhawks the rest of the way and the offense scored two touchdowns in each the third and fourth quarters. Junior transfer quarterback Jalen Whitlow earned his fourth OVC Newcomer of the Week honor of the season after accounting for five touchdowns in the victory. Whitlow passed for 213 yards and two scores and added three scores with his feet, finishing the game with 75 rushing yards on 15 carries. Whitlow's two passing touchdowns went to Adam Drake who finished the game with seven catches for 110 yards; Drake now has 165 career catches which is just one away from the OVC career Top 10. Drake ranks third nationally in receptions/game (8.0) and fifth in receiving yards/game (110.0) in 2014. Junior running back Shepard Little had his second strong rushing game after returning from an injury, tallying a game-high 103 yards on 22 carries. Junior safety Jourdan Wickliffe had two interceptions in the win, the second time in as many games he has had multiple interceptions; he currently ranks ninth nationally in interceptions (0.6/game) and ranks 10th in EIU career history for interceptions (9). The Panthers have won 14 of its last 15 OVC games dating back to the middle of the 2012 season. EIU currently ranks 12th nationally in total offense (480.3 yards/game) and eighth in passes intercepted (10).

GAME NOTES: Saturday marks the annual Homecoming game for Eastern Kentucky as they host Southeast Missouri State. The teams have played 24 previous times with the Colonels winning 21 total games including the last three and nine of the last 10. The Redhawks lone win in that stretch was a 40-21 win in 2010 on its way to the OVC Championship. Last season EIU led 24-0 at halftime on its way to a 31-7 win in Cape Girardeau. Then freshman JJ Jude had a game-high 114 rushing yards and a score while Jared McClain and punter Jordan Berry also scored touchdowns on the ground. Berry, who scored from 25 yards out on a fake field goal, also averaged 59.3 yards/punt during the game. DeMichael Jackson had 98 rushing yards for the Redhawks. This game marks the fourth nationally-ranked FCS opponent Southeast Missouri has played this season (No. 14 Southern Illinois, No. 3 Southeastern Louisiana and No. 20 Tennessee State were the others).

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri dropped its second-straight Conference game, falling 52-13 to two-time defending champion Eastern Illinois. It marked the first home loss of the season for Southeast who is now 4-4 on the year. The Redhawks were limited to a season-low 96 rushing yards and committed five turnovers in allowing 50 points at Houck Stadium for the first time since 2005. Quarterback Kyle Snyder passed for 210 yards and a score but was intercepted three times. Junior Peter Lloyd caught eight passes for 97 yards and tallied 162 yards on seven kickoffs, finishing the game with 263 all-purpose yards (the second-highest total in the OVC this season). He now ranks second in the OVC and 21st nationally in kickoff returns (26.2 yards/return). Sophomore linebacker Roper Garrett had 19 tackles (tied for the most by an OVC player this season) to lead the Southeast defense against EIU; Garrett now ranks ninth nationally in tackles (11.3/game) and fourth in forced fumbles/game (0.63/game). Southeast Missouri ranks fifth in fourth down conversion percentage (76.9%), sixth in net punting (39.19 yards/punt), seventh in kickoff return yardage defense (15.73 yards/return) and 10th in sacks allowed/game (1.00).

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky had been one of just five FCS teams undefeated on the season before allowing Tennessee Tech to score 29 unanswered points in a 39-31 loss in Cookeville on Saturday night. It was also the first road loss of the season for the Colonels who had been second nationally with four road wins on the season. After having a +10 turnover margin advantage over its previous five games, the Colonels were -4 in the loss at Tennessee Tech. Running back Dy'Shawn Mobley led the way with 163 rushing yards and a touchdown on 21 carries (7.8 ypc); Mobley currently ranks sixth nationally in rushing yards/carry (6.99) and 15th in the FCS in rushing yards/game (115.9/game). The quarterback duo of Bennie Cone and Jared McClain combined to go just 12-of-23 for 115 yards while being picked off four times and sacked four times. Brandon Stanley had eight tackles (including 2.0 for loss) and an interception. As a team EIU ranks third nationally in fumbles recovered (11), turnovers gained (21), blocked kicks (5) and red zone defense (60.0%), seventh in rushing offense (257.1 yards/game) and eighth in passes intercepted (10). After its loss EIU dropped six spots in each poll, falling to No. 18 in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 19 in the Sports Network poll.

GAME NOTES: UT Martin can claim its first Sgt. York Trophy championship since 2010 with a victory over Austin Peay on Saturday. The Skyhawks already have wins over fellow Tennessee schools Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech and will complete play a perfect 3-0 with a win. UTM tied for the title in 2012 but lost the tiebreaker and did not take home the actual trophy (which went to TSU). The meeting is the 63rd all-time between the teams with the Skyhawks having won six in a row and 10 of the last 11 overall. Last season UT Martin jumped out to 35-7 lead on its way to a 38-14 victory in Clarksville. Quarterback Jarod Neal completed 21-of-33 passes for 293 yards and two touchdowns, DJ McNeil had 114 yards and a score on the ground and Jeremy Butler pulled down 11 catches for 171 yards and two touchdowns for the Skyhawks. Austin Peay was led by Omar Williams who had 122 rushing yards while Timarious Mitchell threw two touchdown passes to Darryl Clack. Saturday's game marks the annual Homecoming contest for UTM and is the 100th for head coach Jason Simpson as the Skyhawks head coach and the final home game of the season for UTM.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay snapped an 18-game losing streak (which had been the longest in Division I) with a 20-13 victory over rival Murray State on Saturday. It also snapped a 10-game OVC losing streak for the program. In just his second career start freshman Mickey Macius was named OVC Co-Newcomer of the Week after completing 18-of-22 passes for 201 yards and three touchdowns in the victory. All three of his touchdown passes went to fellow freshman Jared Beard who finished the night with seven catches for 88 yards and the three scores. The duo also hooked up on an 11-yard completion with 2:40 left in the game that helped the Governors run out the clock and seal the victory. Beard was the first APSU player to catch three touchdown passes in a game since Devin Stark in 2012. Freshman Otis Gerron had his second big rushing game in a row, as he carried the ball 26 times for 137 yards (5.3 ypc) to pace the APSU rushing attack. Justin Roberson added 61 yards on the ground as the team finished with 148 total rushing yards. Punter Ben Campbell became the school's all-time leader in punt yardage during the game, breaking the record of 9,773 previously held by J.P. Hogan (2000-03). Campbell, who averaged 43.4 yards/punt on the night, is also now tied with Hogan for most punts in school history (259). Sophomore Rod Owens picked off two passes, recovered a fumble and had seven tackles for the Austin Peay defense.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin won its second-straight game by knocking off Tennessee State at Hale Stadium in Nashville on Saturday. The Skyhawks won despite tallying only 210 yards of total offense and giving up 367 yards to the Tigers. The defense did make plays when it mattered, forcing two fumbles (recovering one), tallying six tackles-for-loss and returning an interception for a touchdown early in the third quarter. That play came from Keith Jones who returned the interception 42 yards to put the Skyhawks up 14-3. The team led 21-3 later in the quarter when Jarod Neal hit Corey Rogers for a seven-yard touchdown pass. Neal completed 11-of-18 passes in the game and ranks 12th nationally in completion percentage (65.6%) and is 17th in passing efficiency (146.8). Redshirt junior Reuben Duckworth had 59 yards and a touchdown on the ground while Najee Ray added a game-high 60 rushing yards. Punter James Satterfield averaged 38.6 yards/punt with a long punt of 57 yards in the game; he currently ranks third in the OVC in punting (40.8 yards/punt). Senior All-American Tony Bell had two tackles, a tackle-for-loss, a forced fumble, a fumble recovery and three pass breakups in the game. He ranks second nationally in fumbles recovered (3) and 17th nationally in tackles-for-loss (1.7/game).

GAME NOTES: Tennessee Tech will look to knock off its second consecutive nationally-ranked opponent when it travels to OVC leader Jacksonville State on Saturday. The Gamecocks have won two in a row in the series, but the two prior games before that (2010 and 2011), the Golden Eagles topped nationally-ranked Jacksonville State squads (including scoring 28 fourth quarter points in 2010 to deny JSU an OVC Championship). A season ago Jacksonville State jumped out to a 24-7 halftime advantage on its way to a 34-14 win at Tucker Stadium. In that game DaMarcus James rushed for 126 yards and a touchdown while Kyle West threw for two touchdowns for the Gamecocks. Darian Stone had 99 passing yards and a score to go along with a team-best 79 rushing yards for the Golden Eagles. Tennessee Tech will be searching for its first road win of the season (0-4) while Jacksonville State is perfect (2-0) at home.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Trailing nationally-ranked Eastern Kentucky 31-10 early in the fourth quarter, Tennessee Tech came to life and exploded for 29 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to hand the Colonels its first loss of the season. Senior quarterback Darian Stone threw three touchdown passes in the fourth quarter (earning OVC Offensive Player of the Week honors) and Ladarius Vanlier added a 63 yard touchdown run to spark the Golden Eagles. Tech was within a point on Stone's third touchdown pass, but grabbed the lead when holder Marty Jones grabbed a low snap on the point-after attempt and raced for a two-point conversion to give the team a 32-31 lead. Jones, a free safety, had a huge game that included an OVC record-tying four interceptions (two of which came in the final 1:07) and a game-high 12 tackles in earning National Defensive Player of the Week honors. Jones now currently ranks ninth nationally in interceptions (0.6/game). In addition to his 63-yard rushing touchdown that sealed the victory, Vanlier added a 79-yard punt return in the second quarter, his second touchdown of the season on a punt return; Vanlier also has a kickoff return for a touchdown, making him one of just two FCS players with both a punt and kickoff return for a score this season. Vanlier had 264 all-purpose yards, the most by an OVC player this season. Freshman Brock McCain had a season-best 11 catches for 128 yards in the win.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Coming off an open week, Jacksonville State is now the only team undefeated in OVC play at 3-0. The Gamecocks have won five games in a row overall since a season-opening loss at FBS power Michigan State and have jumped back up to No. 6 in the national polls (equaling its highest-ranking of the season). In its last game the Gamecocks won 27-20 at No. 25 Tennessee State, knocking off its second nationally-ranked FCS opponent of the season. DaMarcus James had 93 rushing yards and two scores while Eli Jenkins had 95 passing yards and a score and added 52 yards on the ground. Taking out the team's season-opening game to Michigan State, the team is averaging 513.2 yards/game of total offense (which would rank fifth nationally) and 37.6 points/game (which would rank 17th nationally). Currently the Gamecocks rank 16th nationally in total offense (468.3 yards/game). Jermaine Hough was named National Defensive Player of the Week by College Sporting News after picking off two passes, including the game-sealing pass in the end zone with six seconds left. Hough currently ranks third nationally in interceptions (0.7/game) and 12th in passes defended (1.5/game). Junior Devaunte Sigler had a sack, a tackle-for-loss, a forced fumble and an interception in the victory. Not factoring in the Michigan State game, the team is allowing 312.4 yards/game, which would rank 16th nationally.

GAME NOTES: Murray State steps out of Conference play for the final time this season when they host Kentucky Wesleyan for the third time in school history and first time since 2009. In that meeting MSU led 31-7 at halftime on its way to a 66-10 victory. The Racers defense limited KWC to just 164 yards for the game while MSU scored via field goal, safety, fumble recovery, kickoff return, punt return, pass and run. Jeff Ehrhardt had 138 passing yards and two scores while Charlie Jordan rushed for 116 yards and two touchdowns. Defensively three different players had interceptions and Tamar Butler registered a game-high 17 tackles for the Racers. Kentucky Wesleyan was led by Travis Walker who had 72 yards on the ground.

SCOUTING KENTUCKY WESLEYAN: Kentucky Wesleyan, a Division II school located in Owensboro, Kentucky, will play its final road game of the season on Saturday when it travels to Murray State. The Panthers were 0-11 last season but have four victories so far in 2014. KWC is under the direction of 12th year head coach Brent Holsclaw, who was a record-setting quarterback at the school. This past week he saw quarterback Oliver Dalton etch himself into the Kentucky Wesleyan record book when he threw for a KWC record 526 yards and six touchdowns (the second-most in school history) on 27-of-39 passes in a 55-28 victory over Lindenwood-Belleville. Dalton has thrown for 20 touchdown passes and 2,273 yards in seven games this season. The game was tied at 28 with 3:52 to play in the third quarter before the Panthers scored 27 unanswered points on its way to the win. Xavier Mitchell had a career-high 11 passes for 225 yards and two touchdowns. Overall the team racked up 557 yards of total offense, including a school record 547 yards through the air. Defensively Cody Mills had nine tackles and leads the team with 53 total tackles on the season; he also has 10.0 tackles-for-loss and 4.0 sacks in seven games.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State saw its six-game winning streak against Austin Peay come to an end on Saturday when the Racers fell 20-13, as the Governors snapped an 18-game losing streak. MSU led 10-7 early in the third quarter before APSU scored 14-straight points in the third quarter to grab a lead for good. KD Humphries completed 28-of-44 passes for 235 yards, but was intercepted twice (after only being intercepted twice through the first six games of the season) and sacked once. Pokey Harris rushed for a team-high 88 yards on 13 carries (6.8 ypc) and also scored the team's lone touchdown of the night; he also caught four passes for 30 yards and had 62 yards on kickoff returns. Harris currently leads the OVC and ranks 33rd nationally in all-purpose yards (131.86/game). Junior Carson Greifenkamp was successful on field goal attempts from 36 and 28 yards on the night and is now 6-of-9 on the season. Defensively Jonathan Jackson had a game-high 11 tackles, including a tackle-for-loss. Jackson leads the OVC and ranks seventh nationally in tackles/game (11.5). Travis Taylor currently ranks 13th nationally in tackles/game (10.4) while also leading the OVC and ranking 14th in tackles-for-loss (1.7/game).
