THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Jacksonville State topped Eastern Illinois to win its fourth OVC Championship (2003, 2004, 2011 and 2014) and earn the league's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs; it will be the fifth all-time Division I playoff appearance for the Gamecocks (2003, 2004, 2010, 2013, 2014)...JSU remained No. 3 in the FCS Coaches Poll this week and is likely to receive a first round bye in the FCS playoffs as one of the Top 8 national seeds...JSU head coach John Grass became the fifth coach in OVC history to win the OVC Championship in his first season as a collegiate head coach, joining Austin Peay's Boots Donnelly (1977), UT Martin's Jason Simpson (2006), Eastern Kentucky's Dean Hood (2008) and Eastern Illinois' Dino Babers (2012)...JSU has won nine games in a row, the third-longest streak in the FCS...Eastern Kentucky came from behind to beat Murray State and reach the nine-win plateau; the Colonels, who have a FBS win this season, will likely be an at-large selection to the playoffs, which would be the program's 21st all-time appearance (2nd all-time in NCAA history)...EKU's Dy'Shawn Mobley tied the OVC record for total touchdowns (6) and rushing touchdowns (5) while accounting for 224 rushing and 100 receiving yards against Murray State; the 324 all-purpose yards is the fourth-most by a FCS player this season...Mobley was named National Player of the Week by both the Sports Network and College Sporting News...For the second-straight week Murray State's Pokey Harris returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown, making him one of just three players in OVC history to accomplish that feat; overall Harris has three kickoff returns for scores this season (the most among Division I players), while averaging 28.8 yards/return (4th nationally)...JSU center Max Holcombe is scheduled to start his 48th consecutive game on Saturday which will break the OVC record in that category...This week Jacksonville State is at Southeast Missouri, UT Martin travels to Eastern Illinois, Murray State hosts Tennessee State and Austin Peay hosts Tennessee Tech in OVC action while ECU travels to FBS opponent Florida.


OFFENSIVE
Dy'Shawn Mobley, RB • Jr., 5-11, 215 • Powell, Tenn. • Eastern Kentucky

Mobley tied the OVC single-game record with six total touchdowns (5 rushing, 1 receiving), five of which came in the second half, as Eastern Kentucky won its ninth game of the season in coming from behind to defeat Murray State 43-36. Mobley finished the game with 324 all-purpose yards, the fourth-most by a FCS player this season. The transfer from Kentucky carried the ball 40 times for 224 yards (5.6 ypc) and five touchdowns (also tying the OVC record in that category), which is tied for the most by a FCS player this season. Mobley, a candidate for the Walter Payton Award, scored on runs of 2, 1, 8, 6 and 1 yards with the final two rushing scores coming in the fourth quarter as ECU overcame an early 20-point deficit to go ahead for good. In the third quarter he also caught a screen pass and went 72 yards for a touchdown (the longest play from scrimmage by an ECU player this season); Mobley finished with four catches for 100 yards. His six total touchdowns and 36 points tied the OVC record also held by Murray State's Derrick Cullors (1995 vs. Morehead State). DEFENSIVE
Michael Carlisle, LB • Sr., 6-0, 232 • Jonesboro, Ga. • Jacksonville State

Carlisle had 10 tackles (5 solo), 1.5 tackles-for-loss and a quarterback hurry as No. 3 Jacksonville State topped Eastern Illinois 27-20 to win its fourth OVC Championship. He helped the Gamecocks defense limit the high-powered Panthers offense to almost 200 yards less of total offense than its season average while also holding EIU to just 3-of-15 on third down.

SPECIALIST
Pokey Harris, RS/RB • Jr., 5-10, 173 • Winchester, Ky. • Murray State

Harris earned his second-straight OVC Specialist of the Week honor after returning a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown for the second-straight week. Entering the season only nine OVC players had ever returned a kickoff 100 yards for a score, but it has now happened in each of the last three weeks, the last two coming from Harris who took the opening kickoff against nationally-ranked Eastern Kentucky and put his team up 7-0. Harris is now one of just three players in OVC history to return two kicks 100 yards, joining Eastern Kentucky's Leon Brown (1989 and 1992) and Tennessee State's Avion Black (both in 1999). He is the only player in the FCS and one of two players in Division I (UAB's JJ Nelson) to return two 100-yard kickoffs this season. Harris has three total kickoff returns for a touchdown in 2014, the most among FCS players, while his 28.8 yards/kick return average is fifth nationally.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Jacksonville State Claims 2014 OVC Championship: With its victory over Eastern Illinois on Saturday, Jacksonville State clinched the outright 2014 OVC Championship and earned the league's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs. The Gamecocks have now won OVC titles in 2003, 2004, 2011 and 2014; the four titles are the seventh-most in OVC history.

Jacksonville State to Make Fifth NCAA FCS Playoff Appearance: With its league title this season the Jacksonville State Gamecocks secured the OVC's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs. It is the second-straight and fifth overall Division I playoff appearance for the program who has also appeared in 2003, 2004, 2010, 2013 and 2014. JSU is 2-4 all-time in the playoffs, including advancing to the quarterfinals last season (when they were an at-large selection) after wins over Samford and McNeese State.

Grass One of Five First-Year Coaches to Win OVC Title: Jacksonville State head coach **John Grass** led his team to the OVC Championship in his first year as a collegiate head coach. In doing so he became just the fifth OVC coach to lead his team to the title in his first season as a head coach, joining Austin Peay's Boots Donnelly (1977), UT Martin's Jason Simpson (2006), Eastern Kentucky's Dean Hood (2008) and Eastern Illinois' Dino Babers (2012).

Mobley Ties OVC Records for Total Touchdowns and Rushing Touchdowns in a Game: Eastern Kentucky junior running back **Dy'Shawn Mobley** tied a pair of OVC records with his performance against Murray State on Nov. 15. Mobley scored six total touchdowns (5 rushing, 1 receiving) to tie the OVC record also held by Murray State's Derrick Cullors (done in 1995 vs. Morehead State). His five rushing touchdowns tied the OVC record also held four other individuals (JSU's DaMarcus James, TTU's Derek White, APSU's Daniel Williams and YSU's Paris Wicks). Five of his six touchdowns came in the second half as ECU came from behind to win.

Mobley Named National Offensive Player of the Week (Nov. 17): Eastern Kentucky running back **Dy'Shawn Mobley** was named the National Offensive Player of the Week by the College Sporting News and Sports Network after his performance against Murray State on Nov. 15. Mobley tied the OVC single-game record with six total touchdowns (5 rushing, 1 receiving), five of which came in the second half as the team came from behind to defeat Murray State 43-36. Mobley finished the game with 324 all-purpose yards, the fourth-most by a FCS player this season. The transfer from Kentucky carried the ball 40 times for 224 yards (5.6 ypc) and five touchdowns (also tying the OVC record in that category), coming on runs of 2, 1, 8, 6 and 1 yards. He also caught a screen pass and went 72 yards for a touchdown and finished with four catches for 100 yards.

Holcombe Ties OVC Consecutive Starts Record: Jacksonville State senior offensive lineman **Max Holcombe** has now started 47 consecutive games, which ties the OVC record held by Eastern Illinois' Tim Kelly (2004-07).

NCAA Division I Playoff Information: The field for the 2014 NCAA Division I Football Championship will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 23 at 10 a.m. CT on ESPN. This season marks the second of an expanded field of 24 playoff teams. In 2010 the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff field expanded to 20 teams, up from 16 previously, before increasing to 24 for the first time last year. The expansion in 2010 to 20 teams was the first since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The 24-team field is comprised of 11 automatic bids and 13 at-large berths. There are eight first round matchups (16 total teams), while eight (8) teams receive a bye into the second round. For the fifth time in 2014, the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Toyota Stadium, a 23,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 10.

More on the Playoffs: In the previous 36 years of the FCS Playoffs (which started in 1978), the OVC has placed at least two teams in the field 19 times, including three of the last four (2010, 2011, 2013) and five of the last eight seasons. The OVC had three playoff teams for the first-time ever in 2013.

OVC Playoff Success in 2013: After going since 2000 without a postseason victory the OVC had a breakout season in 2013. For the first time in its history the League put three teams (Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State and Tennessee State) in the playoffs and all three teams scored victories. TSU played first and snapped the OVC's 19-game losing streak with a 31-0 win over Butler (only the second shutout ever by an OVC team in the playoffs). Jacksonville State would then defeat Samford, setting an OVC playoff record with 55 points in the victory. In the second round Eastern Illinois topped TSU while Jacksonville State bested McNeese State to each advance to the quarterfinals. It marked just the second time in OVC history that two OVC teams advanced to the quarterfinals in the same postseason (1991 being the other). The four total wins in the postseason was the most in one postseason by the OVC and the four wins came by an average margin of 33.5 points/game.

All-OVC Teams to Be Announced on Nov. 25: The 2014 All-OVC football teams as well as the Offensive Player, Defensive Player, Freshman and Coach of the Year awards will be announced on Tuesday, Nov. 25.

Jacksonville State No. 3 FCS Team in Sagarin Rankings: In the latest Sagarin Power Rankings release (Nov. 16), Jacksonville State is ranked third among FCS teams (behind only North Dakota State and Northern Iowa) and are No. 65 overall among 252 Division I teams (FBS and FCS combined).

TSU's Hall and MSU's Harris Each Tie OVC Record With 100-Yard Kickoff Returns for Touchdowns: Tennessee State senior **Darion Hall** returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against nationally-ranked Eastern Kentucky on Nov. 1. In doing so he became the 10th player in OVC history to achieve that feat and first since 2011 (TSU's Weldon Garlington). A week later on Nov. 8 Murray State junior **Pokey Harris** returned a kickoff 100 yards for a score to become the 11th player in league history to accomplish the feat. Then on Nov. 15 Harris returned another kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown, the 12th such play in OVC history. Harris is now one of just three players in OVC history to return two kickoffs 100 yards, joining Eastern Kentucky's Leon Brown (1989 and 1992) and Tennessee State's Avion Black (both in 1999).

Current FCS Winning Streaks: Jacksonville State enters this week having won nine-straight games, which is currently tied for the third-longest streak nationally. Below is the list of active winning streaks in the FCS.

EKU One of Seven FCS Teams With Five Road Victories: Entering this week Eastern Kentucky has five road victories (in six total road games). That mark is tied for the second-most nationally and trails only the seven road wins by Coastal Carolina. The other FCS teams with five road victories are Bucknell, Harvard, Jacksonville University, James Madison and North Dakota State.

OVC Teams in the Top 25: After topping Eastern Illinois Jacksonville State remained No. 3 in the FCS Coaches Top 25 but dropped one spot in the Sports Network poll as North Dakota State leap-frogged the Gamecocks. JSU picked up 10 first-place votes in the Sports Network poll and one first-place vote in the FCS Coaches poll. It is the highest ranking for the Gamecocks this season and highest mark since the team was ranked No. 2 in the 2010 season. Eastern Kentucky moved up to No. 14 in the Sports Network poll and No. 16 in the FCS

Coaches poll following its win over Murray State. Twice this season (Sept. 8 and Oct. 6) the OVC has had four teams ranked in the same week, the first time that has occurred since the end of the 2002 season. Overall five different OVC teams have been ranked this season and eight of nine current OVC teams have been ranked for at least one week over the past four years (2011-14).

Southeast Missouri Scores Win Over Top 3 Ranked Team; First OVC Non-Conference Win Over Top 3 Squad Since 1990: Southeast Missouri pulled off the biggest win of its Division I Era on Sept. 20 when they topped No. 3 ranked Southeastern Louisiana 24-23 at Houck Stadium. Southeast led the game entering the fourth quarter but fell behind 23-17 on a touchdown with 2:53 to go. But the Redhawks went 80 yards in 15 plays capped by Paul McRoberts 2-yard touchdown catch from Kyle Snyder (who had rushed up-the-middle for 15 yards on the previous play to set up the winning score). It marked the first non-conference victory by an OVC team over a Top 3 ranked squad since Sept. 8, 1990 when former member Middle Tennessee State (ranked No. 4 at the time) beat No. 1 Georgia Southern 16-13. Southeast would go on to defeat No. 20 Tennessee State on Oct. 4, marking the first time in its FCS history the program had bested two ranked teams in the same season.

Eastern Kentucky Tops FBS Miami (Ohio) In Week 1: For the fourth time in the last five years an OVC team has beaten a team from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) as Eastern Kentucky won 17-10 at Miami (Ohio) on Sept. 6. The win was the first for the Colonels over a FBS team since the 1985 season, snapping an 18-game losing streak for ECU against teams from the higher subdivision; ECU is now 7-20 all-time against FBS opponents while OVC teams are 33-192-1 all-time against FBS opponents. The streak of winning a FBS game in 4 of the past 5 years is even more impressive when you consider the OVC went from Sept. 25, 2004 to Sept. 4, 2010 without an FBS victory (a 50-game losing streak). Southeast's McCrum With FCS-Best Four Field Goals of 50-Plus Yards: Southeast Missouri State sophomore kicker **Ryan McCrum** is the only kicker in the FCS with four field goals of 50 yards or longer this season, and is tied with West Virginia's Josh Lambert by the most by a Division I player. McCrum has connected from 55, 54, 52 and 51 yards this season; his 55-yard field goal against Tennessee State is currently the third-longest field goal in the FCS this season. Overall McCrum is 17-of-22 in field goal attempts this season with nine of those coming from 40 yards or longer; he had misses of 46 and 43 yards in the Murray State game (Oct. 11), 52 yards against Eastern Illinois (Oct. 18), a desperation try of 62 yards against Tennessee Tech (Nov. 8) and from 39 yards against Austin Peay (Nov. 15).

Murray State Scores Division I Best 86 Points: Murray State scored 86 points in its victory over Kentucky Wesleyan on Oct. 25. The 86 points are the most by a Division I team (FBS or FCS) this season.

OVC Players Special on Kick/Punt Returns: OVC specialists have been strong in returning both kickoffs and punts this season. Murray State's **Pokey Harris** has returned three kickoffs for touchdowns (including two for 100 yards) which is first nationally. Tennessee Tech's **Ladarius Vanlier** and Murray State's **Janawski Davis** have each returned two punts for touchdowns this season, which is tied for second nationally. Overall Murray State has four players who have returned either a kick or punt for a touchdown this season. Vanlier currently ranks third nationally in punt returns (16.3 yards/return), Harris ranks fifth in kickoff returns (28.8 yards/return) while Southeast Missouri's **Peter Lloyd** is ninth nationally in kickoff returns (27.3 yards/return).

OVC in the NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders (Nov. 16), Eastern Kentucky's **Devin Borders** ranks first nationally in blocked kicks (5) while teammate **Dy'Shawn Mobley** is fourth in rushing touchdowns (19), fifth in scoring (10.9 points/game), ninth in total rushing yards (1,372), 10th in rushing yards/game (124.7) and 16th in all-purpose yards (148.36/game). Eastern Illinois' **Adam Drake** is second nationally in total receiving yards (1,175), fifth in receiving yards/game (106.8), sixth in receptions/game (7.5) and ninth in receiving touchdowns (11). Murray State's **Janawski Davis** is ninth in receiving touchdowns (11) while teammate **KD Humphries** is third in completions/game (25.73), fifth in completion percentage (67.7%), sixth in total passing yards (3,005), eighth in passing yards/game (273.2) and ninth in passing touchdowns (22) and total offense (293.5 yards/game). Tennessee Tech's **Ladarius Vanlier** is third in punt returns (16.3 yards/return) while Murray State's **Pokey Harris** is fifth in kickoff returns (28.8 yards/return) while Southeast Missouri's **Peter Lloyd** is eighth in that category. Southeast Missouri's **Ryan McCrum** is fifth in field goals made/game (1.55). Murray State's **Jonathan**

Jackson is fourth in tackles (12.1/game), Tennessee State's **Nick Thrasher** is seventh in that category (11.0) while Southeast Missouri's **Roper Garrett** is eighth (10.7) in tackles and second in forced fumbles/game (0.56). UT Martin's **Tony Bell** and Tennessee Tech's **Trey Thompson** are tied for fourth in fumbles recovered (3). In the team rankings Jacksonville State ranks first nationally in third down conversion defense (12.5%), fifth in rushing offense (279.7 yards/game), eighth in total offense (500.4 yards/game) and 14th in total defense (304.1 yards/game). Eastern Kentucky ranks second in turnovers gained (30) third in blocked kicks (7), fourth in blocked punts (3), fifth in fumbles recovered (15), ninth in rushing offense (243.1 yards/game) and kickoff returns (24.25 yards/return) and 10th in passes intercepted (15). Tennessee State ranks first in pass defense (124.8 yards/game), pass efficiency defense (90.62) and fourth down conversion defense (12.5%), seventh in sacks (3.18/game) and eighth in total defense (280.9 yards/game). Murray State ranks second nationally in punt return yardage defense (1.27 yards/return) and sixth in pass offense (313.5 yards/game) while UT Martin is seventh in punt return yardage defense (3.42 yards/return) and time of possession (32:39 and eighth in kickoff return yardage defense (16.38 yards/return).

Attendance: In the latest NCAA attendance rankings Jacksonville State currently ranks sixth in averaging 16,521 fans per game over five home contests.

Jacksonville State Secures 12th-Straight Winning Season: With its victory on October 25 Jacksonville State has secured its 12th-straight winning season, the longest stretch in school history and the third-longest active streak in FCS football. James and Mobley on Walter Payton Award Watch List: Eastern Kentucky running back **Dy'Shawn Mobley** was added to the Walter Payton Award Watch List on Nov. 4. He joins Jacksonville State running back **DaMarcus James** (who has been on the list since the preseason) as two of the 25 players nationally on the Watch List. EIU running back Shepard Little had been on the preseason list but was not included in the latest update. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. The Sports Network will present the Heisman of the FCS for the 28th time on December 15 at the national awards banquet. Last season EIU quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo became the second OVC player to win the Walter Payton Award; overall the OVC had three of the 20 finalists for the award, the most of any FCS conference (Erik Lora finished seventh and Walter Powell was 17th a year ago). The Walter Payton Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2014 season. Ballots will be sent to a national panel of over 150 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The top three vote-getters will be invited to the presentation of the award.

Bell on Updated Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: UT Martin senior linebacker **Tony Bell** is the lone OVC players on the updated Buck Buchanan Award Watch List by the Sports Network. Tennessee State senior Daniel Fitzpatrick had been on the list since the preseason but injuries have limited his play and he was not on the latest update. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, is presented annually to the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). No player from the OVC has ever won the award. The Buchanan Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The winner will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation on Dec. 15.

Lea on Jerry Rice Award Watch List: Jacksonville State offensive tackle **Justin Lea** is one of 21 players nationally named to the initial Watch List for the 2014 Jerry Rice Award. The award is presented by the Sports Network to the National Freshman of the Year in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The award is named for the legendary wide receiver Jerry Rice, who played in the FCS (then Division I-AA) at Mississippi Valley State. The award will be voted on by a national panel of sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The winner will be announced at The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation Dec. 15 in Philadelphia.

Bell and Garrett Named to CFPA Defensive Performer of the Year Watch List: Two OVC football players have been named to the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) National Defensive Performer of the Year Watch List. The selections were UT Martin senior linebacker **Tony Bell** and Southeast Missouri State sophomore linebacker **Roper Garrett** who were two of the 30 total FCS players named to the list.

Gerron and McCoin Named to CFPA Freshman Performer of the Year Watch List: Two OVC football players have been named to the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) National Freshman Performer of the Year Watch List. The selections were Austin Peay running back **Otis Gerron** and Tennessee Tech wide receiver **Brock McCoin**. The duo were two of the total 30 FCS players on the list.

Austin Peay's Campbell Nears OVC Single-Season Punts Record: With two games to play Austin Peay senior punter **Ben Campbell** has punted 87 times this season (tied for the most by a FCS player this year). That is just six punts away from the OVC single-season record of 93 set by Morehead State's John Christopher in 1982.

Humphries Sets OVC Single-Game Completions Record: Murray State sophomore quarterback **KD Humphries** set the OVC single-game completions record in a road game at Tennessee Tech on Oct. 4. The sophomore completed 48 passes to best the previous record of 45 set by former Murray State All-American Casey Brockman in each 2011 and 2012.

Jones Ties OVC Single-Game Record for Interceptions: Tennessee Tech senior **Marty Jones** tied the OVC single-game record for interceptions when he picked off four passes (including two in the final 1:07 of the game in a victory over No. 12 Eastern Kentucky on Oct. 18. He now shares the OVC interceptions record with Jim Pickens (WKU, 1948), Buddy Pfaadt (EKU, 1966), Bud Qualk (Murray State, 1969), Jim Hardie (APSU, 1970) and Pat Smith (EKU, 1986). The four interceptions are the most by a Division I players in 2014.

Austin Peay Snaps Longest Losing Streak in Division I: It was a long time coming but Austin Peay finally pulled up its first win under second-year head coach **Kirby Cannon** and ended the longest losing streak in Division I (FBS or FCS) with a 20-13 win over rival Murray State on Oct. 18. Freshman quarterback **Mickey Macius** threw three touchdown passes to freshman **Jared Beard** to secure the victory. It snapped an 18-game losing streak dating back to the first game of the 2013 season; it was the first win since the team topped Tennessee Tech 38-31 on Nov. 17, 2012 in the final game of the 2012 campaign.

UT Martin Claims 2014 Sgt. York Trophy Presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee: With a perfect 3-0 record this season UT Martin has claimed the 2014 Sgt. York Trophy presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee. It is the second outright title for the Skyhawks (2010 being the other). The trophy (founded in 2007 by the Nashville

Sports Council and OVC) goes to the winner of the quadrangular season football series between the four OVC football-playing schools located in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. As a corporal in the 2nd battalion, 328th Infantry, in the Battle of the Meuse River-Argonne (Oct. 8, 1918), York and seven other soldiers captured 132 prisoners, was promoted to sergeant and received the Distinguished Service Cross, the French Croix de Guerre, the French Legion of Honor, the Croce di Guerra of Italy and the War Medal of Montenegro. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). Tennessee State won its fifth Sgt. York Championship in 2014. The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring.

Three OVC Football Student-Athletes Named to CoSIDA Academic All-District Teams: Three OVC football student-athletes have been named to the Capital One Academic All-District® football teams as selected by CoSIDA. The selections were Tennessee Tech's **Cody Matthews** and Jacksonville State's **Max Holcombe** and **Jermaine Hough**. Each of the three were first-team selections and for making the first-team each will have his name appear on the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-American. The Capital One Academic All-America football team will be announced on Thursday, December 4. To be eligible for nomination, a student-athlete must have reached sophomore academic standing and have at least a 3.30 cumulative grade point average.

Johnson Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Nov. 10): Jacksonville State junior safety **Folo Johnson** was named the National Defensive All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Nov. 10 following his play against nationally-ranked Eastern Kentucky. Johnson had a career-high 14 tackles (including 12 solo stops) to help JSU to the win. He also had a four-yard tackle-for-loss and added a pass breakup as he helped key a defensive unit that limited ECU to just 100 rushing yards and held the Colonels to 1-for-14 on 3rd down.

TSU's Hall Named National Specialist of the Week (Nov. 3): Tennessee State senior **Darion Hall** was named National Specialist of the Week by the Sports Network on Nov. 3. Against nationally-ranked Eastern Kentucky, Hall returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown, marking just the 10th player in OVC history to achieve that feat. Hall finished that game with 262 all-purpose yards.

Jones Named National Player of the Week (Oct. 20): Tennessee Tech senior free safety **Marty Jones** was named the National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network and College Sporting News on Oct. 20 after tying the OVC single-game record with four interceptions (two of which came in the final 1:07 of the game) as Tennessee Tech upset No. 12 Eastern Kentucky 39-31. Jones had two interceptions in the second quarter, ending ECU drives at the TTU 39 and 32-yard lines. After the Golden Eagles had pulled ahead 39-31 late in the fourth quarter, he picked off Bennie Coney with 1:07 to play. But after a three-and-out possession Tech punted the ball back and this time Jones intercepted the other ECU quarterback, Jared McClain, at the Tech 35-yard line with 16 seconds left to seal the victory. Jones also added a game-high 12 tackles and ran in a two-point conversion when he picked up a low snap and rushed to the end zone with 3:41 to play in the fourth quarter to give Tech a 32-31 lead and proved to be the game-winner.

Humphries Named National Offensive Player of the Week (Oct. 13): Murray State sophomore quarterback **KD Humphries** was named National Co-Offensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network and National Offensive All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Oct. 13 after his six touchdown performance in a double overtime win over No. 23 Southeast Missouri. Humphries completed 21-of-36 passes for 297 yards and the six scores; he had at least one touchdown in each quarter, including the game-tying touchdown with 46 seconds left in regulation and the game-winning touchdown pass in double overtime to give the Racers the 44-41 victory.

Hough Named National Defensive All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News (Oct. 13): Jacksonville State junior defensive back **Jermaine Hough** was named National Defensive All-Star of the Week by the College Sporting News on Oct. 13 after picking off two passes in a road win over No. 25 Tennessee State. Hough picked off a pass deep in his team's territory in the second quarter and then essentially ended the game with an interception in the end zone with six seconds to play as TSU was marching for a potential game-tying touchdown. Hough also added five tackles for the Gamecocks.

Hamm-Bey Named Sports Network's National Defensive Player of the Week (Oct. 6): Southeast Missouri State senior cornerback **Tim Hamm-Bey** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network on Oct. 6 for his play in a victory over nationally-ranked Tennessee State. Hamm-Bey had six tackles, five pass breakups and blocked a field goal as Southeast Missouri knocked off its second nationally-ranked opponent of the season, the first time that has happened in school history. He anchored a Redhawk defense that had a season-high 12 pass breakups as a unit and in the first quarter got a hand on TSU's field goal attempt, marking the fourth blocked kick of his career.

Jenkins Named National All-Star of the Week (Sept. 29): Jacksonville State quarterback **Eli Jenkins** was named National Offensive All-Star of the Week by College Sporting News after his performance in a 52-28 win over Murray State on Sept. 27. Jenkins rushed for a career-high 149 yards and rushed for three touchdowns while also completing 15-of-20 passes for 180 yards and another touchdown. The 15 completions and 180 passing yards were also career-highs for Jenkins who had touchdown runs of 12, 7 and 15 yards.

EKU's Absanon Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 8): Eastern Kentucky junior defensive back **Stanley Absanon** was named the National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network and College Sporting News following his performance in the team's win over FBS opponent Miami (Ohio). Early in the third quarter Absanon made a jarring hit in the end zone on a 3rd-and-4 play that prevented a RedHawk touchdown and saved four points (MU added a field goal instead). Three minutes later he picked off a pass and returned it 55 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 10. He would then seal the game by making an interception at midfield with less than one minute to play in the game. Absanon finished the game with two interceptions, six tackles and three pass breakups as ECU topped a FBS foe for the first time since the 1985 season.

Three OVC Student-Athletes Named Semifinalists for William V. Campbell Trophy: Three OVC football student-athletes were among the 167 semifinalists for the 2014 William V. Campbell Trophy®, presented by Fidelity Investments® and announced by The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF). The three OVC selections were Austin Peay punter **Ben Campbell**, Eastern Kentucky fullback **Caleb Watkins** and Jacksonville State offensive lineman **Max Holcombe**. The trio are three of just 37 student-athletes selected from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The award recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation, and up to 16 of the candidates will be named recipients of a prestigious NFF National Scholar-Athlete Award. Nominated by their schools, which are limited to one nominee each, candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least 3.2 on a 4.0 scale, have outstanding football ability as a first team player or significant contributor and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship. The class is selected each year by the NFF Awards Committee, which is com-

OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3: For the second-straight year the OVC is producing a "Game of the Week" package that will air on ESPN3 this fall. The eight-game schedule is one again in conjunction with WebStream Sports, an Indianapolis-based company which is a proven leader in video production, streaming video and content creation Kevin Ingram, host of "The Wake Up Zone" on 104.5 The Zone in Nashville, will handle play-by-play duties while Bob Belvin, on-air talent and contributor at 100.7 FM/AM 540 (ESPN Clarksville), will provide analysis. The duo has worked together each of the past two years in the league's TV package. The OVC Football Game of the Week package is part of an overall five-year agreement with ESPN which was announced last October. The deal runs through the completion of the 2017-18 season.

A Look at the Coaches: Six of the nine OVC coaches from last season returned to their respective teams in 2014. The three new coaches to the league are at Eastern Illinois (**Kim Dameron**), Jacksonville State (**John Grass**) and Southeast Missouri (**Tom Matukewicz**). Dameron comes to Charleston after most recently serving as the defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech. Grass was elevated from Offensive Coordinator to head coach after helping JSU to the FCS Quarterfinals a season ago. Matukewicz is at Southeast Missouri after a stint at Toledo. Grass and Tennessee State's **Rod Reed** are the only two OVC coaches who are currently coaching at their alma mater. The longest tenured coach in the league is UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** who enters his ninth season with the Skyhawks in 2014.

Preseason Forecasts: Jacksonville State has been picked the preseason favorite in the 2014 Ohio Valley Conference football race both a vote of league head coaches and sports information directors and in the inaugural OVC media poll. In the coaches poll, the Gamecocks, who have also been picked preseason favorites in 2005, 2008, 2010 and 2011, picked up 10 of the 18 first-place votes to top the poll. The Gamecocks totaled 118 total points to out-distance two-time defending champion Eastern Illinois in the vote. The Panthers picked up four first-place votes and 110 total points in being picked second. Tennessee State picked up the other four first-place votes and was third with 107 points. Eastern Kentucky was picked fourth (82 points) and was followed in the poll by UT Martin (79), Murray State (54), Tennessee Tech (48), Southeast Missouri State (34) and Austin Peay (16). In the media poll the pollsters gave JSU 9 of 14 first-place votes and 118 total points. Tennessee State picked up four first-place votes and 113 total points in being picked second. Eastern Illinois received the other first-place vote and was picked third (98 points). The poll was rounded out by Eastern Kentucky (79), UT Martin (77), Murray State (56), Tennessee Tech (44), Southeast Missouri State (29) and Austin Peay (16).

JSU's James and TSU's Fitzpatrick Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Jacksonville State senior running back **DaMarcus James** was named the 2014 OVC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Tennessee State senior defensive end **Anthony Bass** was named Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Illinois and Jacksonville State each had eight Preseason All-OVC selections to lead all teams. Tennessee State had six picks, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin had two apiece while Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri each had one. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (10 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included nine players who were second-team picks in 2013. Of the 28 total selections, 20 were seniors, six were juniors and two were sophomores.

NFL Connections: As of November 10, there are 19 former Ohio Valley Conference players on NFL rosters (9 active, 3 practice squad, 7 on IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now with the New York Giants, and first-year quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo who won the Walter Payton Award in 2013 with Eastern Illinois and who is now the backup for Tom Brady in New England. Seven of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

Let's Get It Started: The 67th season of Ohio Valley Conference football got underway on Thursday, August 28. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2014. Since its beginning, 15 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the league have claimed at least one championship

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. Overall 2014-15 marks the ninth year the OVC has streamed live events. Starting with the re-branding of the streaming in 2012-13, events were offered free of charge and in an HD format and featured improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events are available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology. Approximately 41 OVC football games will be available on the OVCDN this season.

SGT. YORK TROPHY



The 2014 season marks the eighth of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

The 2014 season marks the first the award has been presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in February or March of each year).

UT Martin went 3-0 in Sgt. York games in 2014 to claim its second outright title.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky will conclude its regular season and look ahead to a probable at-large berth to the FCS Playoffs when they travel to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Florida on Saturday; it is the first-ever meeting between the two schools. It is the second FBS opponent of the season for the Colonels who won 17-10 at Miami (Ohio) in the second week of the season (its first win over a FBS opponent since 1985); overall the Colonels are 7-20 all-time against FBS opponents. Florida last played an OVC opponent in 2012, topping Jacksonville State 23-0.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky wrapped up the OVC portion of its schedule with a 43-36 come-from-behind victory over Murray State on Saturday. It marked the ninth overall win of the season for the team; the nine wins are the most in seven years under head coach Dean Hood and most since the 2007 season (9). The Colonels won on the back of junior Dy'Shawn Mobley who tied OVC records for total touchdowns (6) and rushing touchdowns (5) as he rushed for 224 yards and had 100 receiving yards in the win in being named National Player of the Week. The 324 all-purpose yards were the fourth-most by a FCS player this season. Five of his six touchdowns came in the second half including two rushing touchdowns in the final quarter as ECU completed the comeback. The 224 rushing yards were the most by a Colonels player since the 2011 season. Mobley currently ranks fourth nationally (and third in OVC single-season history) with 19 rushing touchdowns, while also ranking fifth in scoring (10.9 points/game), 10th in rushing yards/game (124.7) and 16th in all-purpose yards (148.36/game). Quarterback Bennie Coney completed 11-of-16 passes for 264 yards and a touchdown in the win while Jeff Glover had a team-high 161 receiving yards. After converting just one third down against Jacksonville State two weeks ago, ECU was 11-of-19 (57.9%) against Murray State. As a team Eastern Kentucky ranks second in turnovers gained (30) third in blocked kicks (7), fourth in blocked punts (3), fifth in fumbles recovered (15), ninth in rushing offense (243.1 yards/game and kickoff returns (24.25 yards/return) and 10th in passes intercepted (15). Even with a loss on Saturday, the Colonels would have nine Division I victories and a win over a FBS opponent, which would likely earn the team an at-large berth to the FCS Playoffs. ECU is ranked No. 14 in the Sports Network Top 25 and No. 16 in the FCS Coaches poll.

SCOUTING FLORIDA: Florida is coming off an overtime loss to South Carolina. Following the game it was announced head coach Will Muschamp will be stepping down after the season. Against the Gamecocks quarterback Treon Harris rushed for 11 yards, the first time since the 2012 season a UF signal caller had rushed for triple digits. Harris also passed for 60 yards and a touchdown in the contest. On the season Harris has completed 58.9 percent of his passes for 565 yards and four touchdowns while rushing for 242 yards and three additional scores. Matt Jones leads the Gators with 761 rushing yards on the season, while scoring a team-high six touchdowns. Antonio Morrison had a career-high 16 tackles against USC, his second game this season with 15 or more tackles; Morrison leads the team with 88 total tackles on the season. Florida has taken care of the football as of late, committing only two turnovers over its last three contests. As a team UF ranks second in the SEC and eighth nationally in red zone efficiency (91.67%).

GAME NOTES: UT Martin and Eastern Illinois will play for the 20th time on Saturday in Charleston. Both teams enter the contest with identical 5-6 records with the winner finishing the season at .500. UT Martin had won three in a row in the series until Eastern Illinois blasted the Skyhawks 70-22 in last year's regular season finale. In that game EIU scored 28 first quarter points and led 47-9 on its way to the win. Walter Payton Award winner Jimmy Garoppolo passed for 477 yards and six touchdowns (cementing his award-winning regular season) while Shepard Little rushed for a game-high 123 yards. Adam Drake hauled in 14 catches for 225 yards and three touchdowns while Jeff LePak had seven catches for 193 yards and three scores. The EIU defense limited the Skyhawks to just 295 yards of total offense and just 47 yards on the ground. Jarod Neal led UTM with 150 passing yards and two touchdowns. Entering this week EIU has won 11-straight home OVC games, which is the longest streak in school history and the longest active streak in the OVC.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin is coming off an open date after losing 45-16 at FBS No. 1 Mississippi State two weeks ago. The Skyhawks kept the game close early, trailing 7-3 after the first quarter; overall the team did not commit a turnover and had one more first down than MSU did. At the time the team's first quarter field goal made the Skyhawks one of just four teams to score in the opening quarter against the Bulldogs in 2014. In the game senior running back Abou Toure had 94 rushing yards, which at the time was the most rushing yards surrendered by the Bulldogs to a running back this season. Toure now has 980 rushing yards on the season and with 20 more yards will become just the sixth different UTM player to reach 1,000 rushing yards in a season. The quarterback tandem of Jarod Neal and Dylan Favre completed passes to 11 different players with William Tanner grabbing five passes for 57 yards. Buck Buchanan Award candidate Tony Bell led the way with nine tackles while adding 2.0 tackles-for-loss, a sack and a quarterback hurry. Bell currently ranks fourth nationally in fumbles recovered (3) and 11th in tackles-for-loss (1.7/game).

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois saw its hopes of a third-straight OVC Championship and berth in the FCS Playoffs come to an end with a 27-20 loss at No. 3 Jacksonville State. The Panthers kept the game close the entire way and had two possessions in the fourth quarter with a chance to tie the game but failed to after starting quarterback Jalen Whitlow left the game with an injury. Whitlow finished the game with 137 passing yards and 78 rushing yards and a touchdown; Whitlow now has 12 rushing touchdowns this season which ranks second in the OVC and 22nd nationally. Senior Adam Drake was limited to five catches for 22 yards but is now 10th in OVC history for career catches (191) and eighth in career receiving yards (2,833); this season Drake ranks second nationally in total receiving yards (1,175), fifth in receiving yards/game (106.8), sixth in receptions/game (7.5) and ninth in receiving touchdowns (11). Freshman kicker/punter Nick Bruno connected on field goals of 41 and 20 yards in the game and also punted seven times, including a long of 52 and three that were downed inside the 20-yard line. Overall EIU was held to a season-low 304 yards of total offense in the loss. Kamu Grugier-Hill and Laquesha Taylor each had 11 tackles for EIU against the Gamecocks. Grugier-Hill leads the team with 85 total tackles on the season.

GAME NOTES: After having clinched the OVC Championship last week, Jacksonville State looks to wrap-up a perfect OVC season and bolster its seeding for the FCS Playoffs at Southeast Missouri. The Redhawks are looking to get to .500 under first-year head coach Tom Matukewicz (which would be just the second time in the last 12 years for the program) and already have a pair of victories over nationally-ranked opponents this season, including Southeastern Louisiana when they were ranked No. 3 nationally on Sept. 20. In last year's regular season finale Jacksonville State led 28-6 at halftime and held on to win 42-34 behind 206 rushing yards and three touchdowns from All-American DaMarcus James. Eli Jenkins added 124 rushing yards and a touchdown (to go with 147 passing yards) and Troymaine Pope had 102 rushing yards as JSU rushed for 440 total yards. Southeast Missouri rushed for 410 yards with DeMichael Jackson racking up 183 yards and two touchdowns on the ground. Overall the two teams combined for 850 rushing yards which established a new NCAA record. Overall Jax State has won six-straight in the series.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State won its ninth-straight game (the third-longest active streak in the FCS) in topping Eastern Illinois 27-20 to win its fourth OVC Championship and earn its fifth FCS Playoff berth (and 15th NCAA Playoff appearance of all-time). JSU is now 7-0 in OVC play for the first time. The Gamecocks held EIU to a season-low total offense output (304 yards) and limited them to 3-of-15 on third down; overall JSU now ranks first nationally in third down conversion defense (22.9%). After allowing Michigan State to rack up 565 yards of total offense in the season-opener, the Gamecocks have rebounded to now rank 14th nationally in total defense (304.1 yards/game). Offensively DaMarcus James rushed for 112 yards and a touchdown while Eli Jenkins threw for a career-high 288 yards and a touchdown. Offensively the team ranks fifth nationally in rushing offense (279.7 yards/game) and eighth in total offense (500.4 yards/game) while averaging a FCS-best 83.4 plays/game. JSU is also one of just two schools this season to have four different players with 500 or more rushing yards (Sam Houston State is the other). Michael Carlisle was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after netting 10 tackles while Darius Jackson made the biggest defense play of the game, picking off a pass and returning it 27 yards for a touchdown in what proved to be the game-winning score. JSU is No. 3 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 4 in the Sports Network poll.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri snapped a four-game losing streak with a 42-7 victory over Austin Peay on Saturday. Quarterback Kyle Snyder completed 19-of-27 passes for 334 yards and five touchdowns (to four different receivers) and rushed for 35 yards in the victory. He was the first Southeast quarterback to throw for more than 300 yards in game since the 2008 season while his five touchdown passes tied the Redhawks single-game record also held by Jack Tomco. In his second game back from injury, Paul McRoberts hauled in six passes for 117 yards and two scores while Spencer Davis had 102 receiving yards and a touchdown. DeMichael Jackson gained 122 yards and a touchdown on the ground while also catching a touchdown pass. Overall the team had a season-high 531 yards of total offense; it also marked the third time this season the team had scored 40 or more points. Wisler Ymonice matched his career-high with 12 tackles while Reggie Jennings and Daniel Siehndel had 11 stops apiece. As a team Southeast ranks ninth nationally in sacks allowed/game (0.91) and 21st in red zone defense (72.1%).

GAME NOTES: In 25 previous meetings in the all-time series Murray State holds a slim 13-12 advantage over Tennessee State. The Racers won five-straight from 2008-12 before Tennessee State won 17-10 last season in bolstering its resume for an eventual at-large playoff berth. In that contest Murray State led 10-0 in the second quarter and the game was deadlocked late in the fourth quarter before Telvin Hooks ran for a 19-yard touchdown with just 1:28 to play to secure the victory. Hooks led all players with 129 rushing yards in the game, while the Tigers defense limited the Racers to just 24 rushing yards on the day. Parks Frazier had 247 passing yards for Murray State, completing passes to eight different receivers.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State is coming off its open date which followed a 31-27 road victory over Austin Peay two weeks ago. That win snapped a five-game losing streak for the banged up Tigers. In that contest TSU trailed 17-3 at halftime and was down 27-16 with seven minutes to play before Michael German threw two touchdown passes (the last coming with 35 seconds left) to cap the comeback. The senior German completed 30-of-46 passes for 395 yards and four touchdowns. With one game to play German ranks fifth in OVC history in touchdown passes (59), sixth in completions (627), seventh in total offense (8,278) and passing (8,206) and is 19 pass attempts away from fifth place in that category. Weldon Garlington caught eight passes from German for 143 yards and three touchdowns while Isaiah Freeman caught the game-winner in the fourth quarter (one of his six catches on the day). Darion Hall had 163 all-purpose yards, gaining 86 on the ground, 35 on catches and 42 on kickoff returns. Nick Thrasher had 12 tackles, a sack and two quarterback hurries against the Govs; he now ranks seventh nationally in tackles/game (11.0). As a team TSU ranks first nationally in pass defense (124.8 yards/game), pass efficiency defense (90.62) and fourth down conversion defense (12.5%), seventh in sacks (3.18/game) and eighth in total defense (280.9 yards/game).

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State is looking to snap a three-game losing streak and end its season on a positive note. The Racers jumped out to a 27-7 halftime lead over rival Eastern Kentucky last week, but surrendered 36 second half points in losing 43-36. The game started with a bang as junior Pokey Harris took the opening kickoff and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown. It marked the second-straight week Harris had returned a kickoff 100 yards for a score. Overall it is just the 12th time in OVC history that has happened and Harris is now one of just three players with two 100-yard kickoffs for scores in league history. Overall Harris has three kickoff returns for score this season which is the most in the FCS and tied for the most in Division I (FBS or FCS); he now ranks fifth in the FCS in kickoff return yardage average (28.8 yards/return). Quarterback KD Humphries completed 40-of-57 passes for 385 yards and a touchdown and rushed for a team-high 38 yards and two more scores. Humphries now has 3,005 passing yards on the season which is the ninth-highest single-season total in OVC history. His 283 completions currently ranks fifth in OVC history and he needs just three touchdown passes to reach the OVC Top 10. In the national rankings Humphries is third in completions/game (25.73), fifth in completion percentage (67.7%), sixth in total passing yards (3,005), eighth in passing yards/game (273.2) and ninth in passing touchdowns (22) and total offense (293.5 yards/game). Jonathan Jackson had 19 tackles in the game which is tied for the most in the OVC this season; Jackson also had 19 tackles against JSU earlier this season and he now ranks fourth nationally in tackles (12.1/game). Teammate Travis Taylor ranks 10th nationally in tackles (10.6/game).

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay and Tennessee Tech will conclude the 2014 season with the 48th all-time meeting in the series on Saturday in Clarksville. Tech leads the all-time series 29-18 with the teams splitting games each of the past two years. Last season Tennessee Tech outgained Austin Peay 402-to-186 in winning 34-0 and pushing the Govs to 0-12 on the season. Quarterback Darian Stone passed for 118 yards and rushed for a game-high 153 yards and a touchdown in the victory. Omar Williams had 39 rushing yards for the Govs who got 13 tackles apiece from A.J. Gray and Antonio Turner.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech played its fifth nationally-ranked opponent of the season (a sixth opponent is now ranked) when they lost 38-17 at home to No. 9 Chattanooga in the first meeting between the teams since 2006. The Golden Eagles managed just 171 yards of total offense while allowing the Mocs to net 457 yards. Ladarius Vanlier rushed for a 64 yard touchdown and averaged 11.6 yards on seven total carries on the day. Darian Stone added 11 rushing yards and 30 passing yards. Cory Webber made 17 tackles while Austin Tallant, last week's OVC Defensive Player of the Week, had 12 tackles, a pass breakup and forced a fumble. Punter Jonathan King averaged 43.2 yards/punt on five attempts, downing two inside the UTC 20-yard line.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay suffered its 31st-straight road defeat (the longest active streak nationally) on Saturday, falling 42-7 at Southeast Missouri. The team will enter the 2015 season without a win on the road since Sept. 18, 2010. Overall the team has 10 losses on the season, the seventh time in program history APSU has reached double-digit losses. Senior punter Ben Campbell punted four times last week to tie his APSU single-season record of 87 punts. Campbell needs just six punts this week to tie the OVC single-season record of 93 set by Morehead State's John Christopher in 1982. The team's lone touchdown against Southeast came on defense when Damien Whitfield intercepted a pass and returned it 12 yards for a touchdown; it marked the first defensive score for the team since 2011 when Amius Smith had a safety. It was the fourth interception by a Govs player this season. Trey Thomas made the start a quarterback, his first since the season opener, and completed 14-of-28 passes for 156 yards. Justin Roberson led the team with 65 rushing yards while Julian Franklin added 35.
