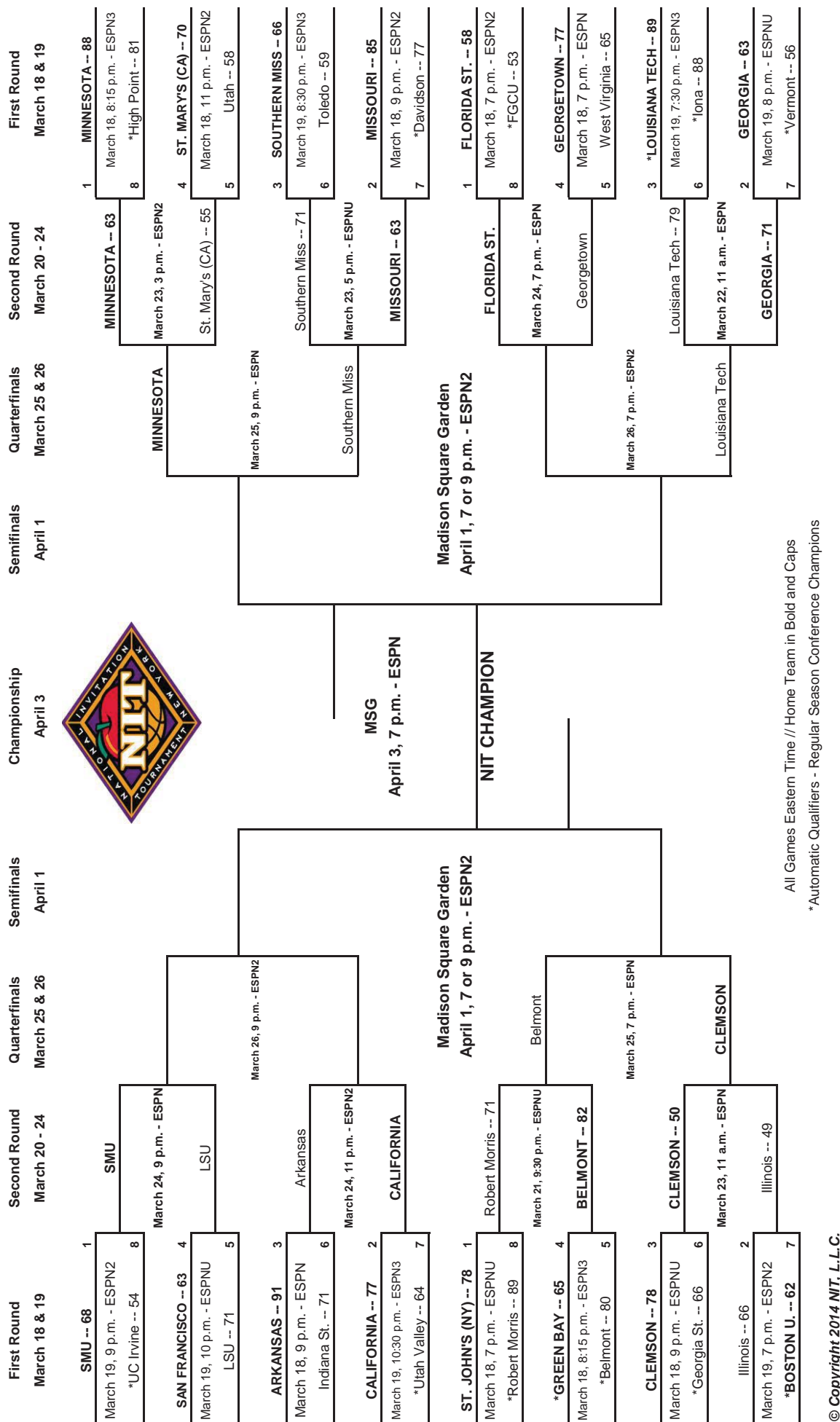

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: A record-tying four OVC men's basketball teams were selected for postseason play this year, as Eastern Kentucky appeared in the NCAA Tournament, Belmont is in the National Invitational Tournament (NIT), Morehead State played in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) and Murray State is playing in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT); the four schools ties the mark of four OVC schools selected in 2011...Belmont (2 wins) and Murray State (1 win) won early round matchups and are alive in their respective tournaments entering this week...With the wins OVC teams have now won at least one postseason game in six-straight years (an all-time league record)...The three victories in the postseason by the OVC are the most since 2002 when Tennessee Tech won three games in the NIT...In its second-ever appearance in the NIT Belmont topped Green Bay and Robert Morris and will now play Clemson in the NIT Quarterfinals for a berth in the Final Four at Madison Square Garden in New York City; the last OVC team to play in MSG for the NIT was Western Kentucky in 1965 (WKU also played in NYC as a member of the OVC in 1948, 1949, 1950, 1952, 1953 and 1954, although the format of the event was different then)...Murray State's Jarvis Williams now ranks first nationally in field goal percentage (63.8%).

OVC Ties League Record With Four Postseason Teams: Overall the OVC had four men's basketball teams selected for postseason play this season (1 NCAA, 1 NIT, 1 CIT, 1 CBI). That matches an all-time high for a single season, tying the mark set in 2011.

Wins in Six-Straight Postseasons: After both Belmont and Murray State recorded wins in the postseason, OVC teams have now at least won one game in each postseason for six-straight years, the longest stretch in league history. Morehead State won a NCAA game in 2009, Murray State won in the NCAA Tournament in 2010, Morehead State won in the NCAA's in 2011, Murray State won in the NCAA's in 2012 and Eastern Kentucky won in the CIT in 2013.

Multiple Postseason Victories: For the second time in five years OVC teams have won multiple postseason games this season as Belmont and Murray State have advanced in the postseason. The last time multiple teams won games was in 2010 when Murray State won in the NCAA Tournament and Morehead State won in the CBI. The three wins entering this week are the most for the OVC since 2002 when Tennessee Tech won three games in the NIT.

OVC Teams All-Time in the NIT: Belmont earned an automatic bid to the National Invitational Tournament (NIT) by winning the OVC regular season championship but failing to win the league's tournament. It marks the second all-time appearance in the NIT for Belmont, who lost to Austin Peay in the 2004 event. Belmont is the first OVC team to play in the NIT since Murray State participated in the 2011 event. After victories over Green Bay and Robert Morris in the first two rounds, the Bruins will now play at Clemson in the quarterfinals for a berth in the NIT Final Four at Madison Square Garden. OVC teams are now 15-23 all-time in NIT games. The last OVC team to advance this far was Tennessee Tech in 2002; the Golden Eagles won three games before falling to Memphis in the quarterfinals. This year marks the fourth-straight year and ninth time in the past 11 years that the Bruins will be participating in postseason play. Belmont was one of 13 automatic qualifiers for the NIT while the other 19 teams in the 32-team field were at-large selections.

OVC Teams All-Time in the CIT: Murray State is competing in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) for the first time in 2014. OVC teams are 2-6 all-time in the CIT, with Murray State's 2014 victory joining Eastern Kentucky's win over Gardner-Webb last season. The CIT is a 32-team field that is drawn from non-BCS schools and all 31 games of the tournament are played at campus sites. In an effort to minimize travel and missed class time, the CIT uses a format that determines future opponents by previous results. This means second round pairings are made after first round games are completed. Teams in the same geographical area are likely to be paired. The CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament was created in 2009. What began as a 16-team event, quickly expanded to 24 teams in 2011 and to 32 teams in 2012.

OVC Teams All-Time in the NCAA Tournament: Following Eastern Kentucky's loss to Kansas in the 2014 NCAA Tournament, OVC teams have won NCAA Tournament games in four of the past six years. After going 19 years without winning a game (1990-2008) Morehead State broke through for the league by winning in 2009 and ending the losing streak. Murray State won a game in 2010 (Vanderbilt), followed by Morehead State besting Louisville in 2011 and the streak reached four-straight years when Murray State beat Colorado State in 2012. OVC teams are now 24-66 all-time in the NCAA Tournament; EKV is 0-8 all-time in the event.

OVC Teams All-Time in the CBI: Morehead State played in the College Basketball Invitational (CBI) for the second time this season; the Eagles played in the 2010 event besting Colorado State before falling to Boston University in overtime and fell to Illinois State in this year's event. All-time OVC teams are 1-4 in CBI action. This marks the seventh year for the CBI, a 16-team invitational tournament. This marks the fourth postseason appearance for the MSU program over the past six years.

Eastern Kentucky Wins 2014 OVC Tournament Championship: Eastern Kentucky won its sixth OVC Tournament Championship this season by winning three games in three days as the No. 3 seed. The Colonels topped No. 6 seed Southeast Missouri (84-76), No. 2 seed Murray State (86-83) and No. 1 seed Belmont (79-73) to claim its first tournament title since 2007. The team has also won crowns in 1950, 1955, 1979, 2005 and 2007; the six titles are third-most in OVC history behind only Murray State (15) and Western Kentucky (10).

Belmont Claims 2014 OVC Regular Season Championship: In just its second year in the league Belmont claimed its second-straight OVC Regular Season Championship, finishing the year with a 14-2 record for the second-straight season. Overall it is the fifth-straight Conference crown for the Bruins who won three-straight Atlantic Sun titles before joining the OVC. Overall the Bruins have won seven conference championships over the last nine years. Since Belmont joined the Division I ranks in 1996-97, only eight other Division I programs have won five-straight conference titles (Butler, Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Nevada and Xavier are the others).

Wins Over Top 25 Teams By OVC Teams: Belmont's win over No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 17 was the first for an OVC team in non-conference play since Murray State (ranked No. 14 at the time) beat No. 16 Saint Mary's at home on Feb. 18, 2012. It was the first road victory over a Top 25 team since the Racers topped No. 20 Memphis 76-72 on Dec. 11, 2011. The last time an OVC team beat an opponent ranked 11th or higher was in 1987 when Austin Peay bested No. 11 Illinois in the NCAA Tournament. Cosey Ties OVC Single-Game 3-Pointers Made Record: Eastern Kentucky senior **Glenn Cosey** tied the OVC single-game record for 3-pointers made against Eastern Illinois on January 2. Cosey made 10-of-12 3-point attempts on his way to 34 points. The 10 made 3-pointers tied the record also held by EIU's Marc Polite (set in the 1999-00 season against Arkansas State). The 10 made 3-pointers are the fourth-most by a Division I player this season.

Eastern Kentucky Ties OVC Single-Game 3-Pointers Made Record: Eastern Kentucky tied the OVC single-game record for 3-pointers made in a game with 20 against Warren Wilson College on Nov. 13. The Colonels were 20-of-39 (51.3%) from 3-point range in the 114-45 victory and tied the record set by Southeast Missouri State a season ago.

Mann Named National Player of the Week by CBSSports.com NBCSports.com (Nov. 18): Belmont senior **J.J. Mann** was named National Player of the Week by both CBSSports.com and NBCSports.com after leading the Bruins to a 83-80 victory over No. 11 North Carolina on Nov. 17. Mann scored a career-high 28 points, including three 3-pointers in the final 1:02 as Belmont topped its first Top 25 team since December 2003. Mann scored 11 of Belmont's final 13 points as the team overcame an eight-point deficit with 2:37 to play. He also scored 23 points in a come-from-behind victory over Indiana State earlier in the week. For the week Mann averaged 18.3 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.7 steals/game.

Kelly Nets 40 Points, 1 of 5 40-Plus Point Efforts by an OVC Player In Last Decade: When Morehead State senior **Drew Kelly** scored 40 points on Dec. 19 against South Dakota, it was one of just five 40-plus point efforts by an OVC player over the last decade (back through the 2004-05 season). It was the most points by a Morehead State player since Ricky Minard scored 43 in the 2002-03 season. Below is a listing of 40-plus point games over the last 10 years.

Two OVC Players Named CoSIDA Academic All-Americans: A pair of OVC men's basketball players - Belmont senior **J.J. Mann** and Tennessee Tech senior **Dennis Ogbe** - have been named Capital One Division I Academic All-Americans, as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Mann was a first-team selection (of our five nationally) while Ogbe was a second-team pick. Overall the OVC has had 223 student-athletes earn Academic All-America honors since 1970; the duo are the fifth and sixth to earn the honor this academic year (2013-14). There have been nine OVC men's basketball players named Academic All-America all-time; the pair are the first OVC men's basketball players selected since 2006. Mann is only the second OVC men's basketball student-athlete to earn first-team honors (joining Southeast Missouri's Derek Winans in 2005). To be eligible for Academic All-America® consideration, a student-athlete must be a varsity starter or key reserve, maintain a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.30 on a scale of 4.00, have reached sophomore athletic and academic standings at his/her current institution and be nominated by his/her sports information director. Since the program's inception in 1952, CoSIDA has bestowed Academic All-America honors on more than 20,000 student-athletes in Divisions I, II, III and NAIA, covering all NCAA championship sports. Earlier in the year UT Martin senior forward **Terence Smith** was named an Academic All-District selection along with Mann and Ogbe.

Two OVC Players Named Candidates for Senior CLASS Award: Two OVC men's basketball student-athletes have been named candidates for the 2013-14 Senior CLASS Award. The two players are among 30 male candidates nationally considered for the award (UT Martin's Heather Butler is one of 30 female candidates for the award as well). The OVC selections were Belmont guard **J.J. Mann** and Tennessee Tech forward **Dennis Ogbe**. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The Senior CLASS Award winners will be announced during the 2014 NCAA Men's Final Four® and NCAA Women's Final Four®. Each of the 30 candidate classes will be narrowed to 10 finalists midway through the regular season, and those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one male candidate and one female candidate who best exemplify excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

Two OVC Players Announced as Nominees for Allstate NABC Good Works Team: Eastern Kentucky's **Deverin Muff** and Tennessee State's **Patrick Miller** have been announced as nominees for the Allstate NABC Good Works Team. The award recognizes a select group of college basketball student-athletes who have made significant contributions to the greater good of their communities through volunteerism and civic service. The pair are two of 117 men's nominees from which two 10-member teams will be selected later this year.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History; Byrd Ranks 8th Among Active NCAA Coaches: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 24th year at Austin Peay. Loos now has 383 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 465 for his career (which ranks him 28th among Division I head coaches). Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** (who is in his second year in the OVC) has 689 career victories, which ranks eighth among active Division I head coaches (who passed John Wooden's 669 wins on the all-time list this season). Loos and Byrd are two of just seven active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years (the others are Syracuse's Jim Boheim, Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, Oakland's Greg Kampe, Coppin State's Fang Mitchell and Davidson's Bob McKillop).

Former OVC Players in the NBA: Entering the 2013-14 season there are four former OVC players on NBA rosters. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his third season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. Faried was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team in 2012 and was the MVP of the Rising Stars Game in 2013. The other three players are all rookies this season, including former Murray State All-American **Isaiah Canaan**, former Belmont All-American **Ian Clark** and former Tennessee State standout **Robert Covington**. Canaan and Covington are teammates with the Houston Rockets (Canaan was drafted in the second round while Covington signed a free agent deal) while Clark signed a free agent deal with the Utah Jazz. Covington is currently playing with the Rio Grande Valley Vipers of the NBDL (and was named MVP of the NBDL All-Star Game), making him one of four total OVC players in that league. The others are Jacksonville State's **Nick Murphy** (Tulsa 66ers), TSU's **Kellen Thornton** (Idaho Stampede) and TTU's **Kevin Murphy** (Idaho Stampede).

The 2013-14 Season: The 2013-14 season marks the 66th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 65 years, 13 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

Southeast Missouri's Stone Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2013-14 All-OVC Preseason Men's Basketball Team was headlined by Southeast Missouri State senior **Tyler Stone**, who was named the Preseason Player of the Year. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Austin Peay, Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri having two selections apiece while Belmont, Jacksonville State, Tennessee State and UT Martin had one selection each to round out the team. The squad features two players who were All-OVC first or second-team selections last season and three players who were selected to the All-Newcomer squad. The team is comprised of seven seniors and three juniors. Last season Stone

ranked eighth in the OVC in scoring (15.5 points/game), fifth in rebounding (7.8/game) and blocked shots (1.3/game) and 12th in field goal percentage (49.2%) while leading Southeast Missouri to a winning overall record and berth in the OVC Tournament quarterfinals. Other selections to the Preseason All-OVC team were Tennessee State's **Patrick Miller**, Austin Peay's **Travis Betran** and **Will Triggs**, Eastern Kentucky's **Glenn Cosey** and **Corey Walden**, Belmont's **J.J. Mann**, Southeast Missouri's **Nino Johnson**, UT Martin's **Myles Taylor** and Jacksonville State's **Brian Williams**.

Eastern Kentucky, Southeast Missouri, Murray State Picked as OVC Preseason Favorites: In a vote of Ohio Valley Conference head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors Eastern Kentucky has been picked the favorites in the East Division while Murray State and Southeast Missouri State were tabbed co-favorites in the West Division in the OVC for 2013-14. Eastern Kentucky picked up 18 of a possible 24 first-place votes (schools were not allowed to vote for themselves) and a total of 128 points to lead all vote getting. The Colonels were followed in the East by defending OVC champion Belmont, who picked up the remaining six first-place votes and 116 total points. The East Division voting was rounded out by Morehead State (74 points), Jacksonville State (72), Tennessee State (60) and Tennessee Tech (42). The top of the West Division was shared by Southeast Missouri and defending West Champions Murray State. The Redhawks received 13 first-place votes while the Racers picked up the remaining 11 to both finish with 117 total points. The West was rounded out by Austin Peay (90 points), UT Martin (66), Eastern Illinois (58) and SIUE (44).

The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.
