THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Playing a variety of opponents from different levels of football, OVC teams did what they were suppose to in Week 1 of the 2014 season...The league was 1-0 against Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) foes and 4-0 against non-Division I opponents while going 0-4 against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS)...Last year OVC teams were an impressive 16-7 against fellow FCS teams...Southeast Missouri scored 77 points in its win over Missouri Baptist, a game that was the first of the Tom Matukewicz Era at Southeast Missouri; the 77 points were the most scored by a FCS team in Week 1 of the season...The Redhawks also did not allow a point, its first shutout of a non-conference opponent since the 1990 season...Three OVC teams remained ranked in the two major FCS Top 25 polls with Jacksonville State (No. 9), Eastern Illinois (No. 14/16) and Tennessee State (No. 14/16) among the ranked squads; Eastern Kentucky, Murray State and Southeast Missouri are among other teams receiving votes...With the NFL season starting this week, 16 former OVC players are on NFL rosters (9 active players, 2 practice squad players, 5 players on IR)...This week's schedule features three games against teams from the FBS and five against FCS squads...Included in the FCS matchups are two games where both teams are ranked in the Top 25...No. 9 Jacksonville State will travel to No. 13 Chattanooga while No. 14 Eastern Illinois will host No. 25 Southern Illinois (that game is the only one featuring an OVC team playing at home this week).



OFFENSIVE

Adam Drake, WR • Sr., 6-2, 195 • Charleston, Ill. • Eastern Illinois

Drake caught 11 passes for 109 yards and a touchdown as Eastern Illinois lost at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Minnesota to open the season. The 11 catches are the fourth-most by a player in the FCS this season. The senior capped the game with a 32-yard touchdown reception from Andrew Manley on the final play of the game. With his performance he moved into 10th place on the EIU career receiving yards list (1,767) and career receptions list (120) while registering his seventh 100-yard receiving career game.

DEFENSIVE

Anthony Bass, DE • Sr., 6-3, 240 • Clarksville, Tenn. • Tennessee State

Bass was named Defensive MVP of the John Merritt Classic in helping anchor a Tennessee State defense that allowed only 76 yards of total offense, five first downs and no offensive points in a 58-6 victory over Edward Waters. Bass had four tackles, 2.5 tackles-for-loss, 2.0 sacks and his first career interception which he returned 24 yards.

SPECIALIST

Andrew Lloyd, K • Sr., 6-0, 188 • Winchester, Va. • Eastern Kentucky

Lloyd converted on field goal attempts of 34, 25 and 25 yards and made both of his point after attempts as Eastern Kentucky opened the season with a 29-10 victory at Robert Morris. His first field goal came in the second quarter and then he added two more in the third quarter to push the Colonel advantage to 23-3 entering the fourth quarter. All seven of Lloyd's kickoffs on the night were downed for touchbacks.

NEWCOMER

Tom Smith, RB • Jr., 5-11, 205 • Apopka, Fla. • Tennessee State

Smith, the transfer from Tennessee, rushed for 151 yards on 12 carries (12.6 ypc) and four touchdowns in his Tennessee State debut on Saturday. The junior put up those numbers in only two quarters of work as TSU built a 30-6 halftime advantage on its way to a 58-6 win over Edward Waters in the John Merritt Classic. His performance helped the Tigers rack up 439 total rushing yards on the game, establishing a new team single-game record.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

OVC Teams Versus FBS Foes: OVC schools will play 11 total games against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) this season. Last season Eastern Illinois knocked off San Diego State and Jacksonville State defeated Georgia State (two of a record 16 FCS wins over FBS teams during the 2013 season). OVC schools have scored FBS victories in three of the past four years (as JSU topped Ole Miss in 2010 and UT Martin beat Memphis in 2012). Overall OVC schools 32-183-1 all-time against FBS foes. So far this season two FCS teams (North Dakota State and Bethune-Cookman) have knocked off FBS teams.

OVC Teams in the Top 25: Entering this season for the first time in the last decade three OVC teams were ranked in the Preseason Top 25. Entering this week Jacksonville State is now No. 9 in both major polls after its loss to FBS Michigan State. Eastern Illinois is No. 14 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 16 in the Sports Network poll. After its season-opening win Tennessee State is now No. 14 in the Sports Network and No. 16 in the FCS Coaches poll. Eastern Kentucky continues to receive votes in both Top 25 polls while Murray State and Southeast Missouri are now receiving votes in the Sports Network poll.

OVC in the NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders (August 31) Tennessee State's **Tom Smith** ranks first nationally in rushing touchdowns (4), first in scoring (24.0 points/game), sixth in rushing (151.0 yards/game) and eighth in total rushing yards (151). Murray State's **Janawski Davis** is tied with Smith for first nationally in scoring (24.0 points/game) while ranks second nationally in receiving touchdowns (3) while teammate **Jeremy Harness** is third in receiving touchdowns (2), third in punt returns (37.5 yards/return), eighth in scoring (12.0 points/game). Murray State quarterback **CJ Bennett** is first nationally in points responsible for (30.0/game), second in passing touchdowns (5) and sixth in passing efficiency (197.9). Eastern Kentucky's **Dy'Shawn Mobley** is eighth in rushing yards/game (142.0) while teammate **Andrew Lloyd** is first in field goals made/game (3.0). Eastern Illinois' **Adam Drake** is fourth in receptions/game (11). In the team rankings Tennessee State is first nationally in rushing offense (439.0 yards/game), turnovers gained (6), pass efficiency defense (16.42) and red zone defense (0.0%), second in total defense (81.0 yards/game), fumbles recovered (3), passes intercepted (3), third in kickoff returns (38.5 yards/return) and fifth in scoring offense (58.0). Southeast Missouri is first nationally in scoring offense (77.0 points/game), scoring defense (0 points/game), third down conversion percentage (77.8%) and red zone offense (100%), second in total defense (81.0 yards/game) and passing efficiency (260.06), fifth in passing defense (39.0 yards/game) and pass efficiency defense (43.97), sixth in punt returns (22.0 yards/return), seventh in rushing defense (42.0 yards/game) and ninth in rushing offense (304.0). Eastern Kentucky is second nationally in total offense (624.0 yards/game) and rushing offense (407.0 yards/game) and fourth in rushing defense (28.0 yards/game). Murray State is second nationally in scoring offense (73.0 points/game), fourth in punt returns (39.0 yards/return) and fumbles recovered (2), seventh in passing efficiency (195.54) and third in third down percentage (66.7%).

The FCS Playoffs: In 2010 the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff field expanded to 20 teams, up from 16 previously, and last year (2013) the field increased to 24 for the first time. The expansion in 2010 to 20 teams was the first since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The field for the 2014 NCAA Division I Football Championship will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 23. The 24-team field is comprised of 11 automatic bids and 13 at-large berths. There are eight first round matchups (16 total teams), while eight (8) teams receive a bye into the second round. For the fifth time in 2014, the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Toyota Stadium, a 23,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 10.

OVC Playoff Success in 2013: After going since 2000 without a postseason victory the OVC had a breakout season in 2013. For the first time in its history the League put three teams (Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State and Tennessee State) in the playoffs and all three teams scored victories. TSU played first and snapped the OVC's 19-game losing streak with a 31-0 win over Butler (only the second shutout ever by an OVC team in the playoffs). Jacksonville State would then defeat Samford, setting an OVC playoff record with 55 points in the victory. In the second round Eastern Illinois topped TSU while Jacksonville State bested McNeese State to each advance to the quarterfinals. It marked just the second time in OVC history that two OVC teams advanced to the quarterfinals in the same post-season (1991 being the other). The four total wins in the postseason was the most in one postseason by the OVC and the four wins came by an average margin of 33.5 points/game.

Running Backs James, Little on Walter Payton Award Watch List: Two OVC players were among the 20 players nationally named to the initial Walter Payton Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. The players were Jacksonville State senior running back **DaMarcus James** and Eastern Illinois junior running back **Shepard Little**. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. The Sports Network will present the Heisman of the FCS for the 28th time on December 15 at the national awards banquet. Last season EIU quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo became the second OVC player to win the Walter Payton Award; overall the OVC had three of the 20 finalists for the award, the most of any FCS conference (Erik Lora finished seventh and Walter Powell was 17th a year ago). The Walter Payton Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2014 season. Ballots will be sent to a national panel of over 150 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The top three vote-getters will be invited to the presentation of the award.

Bell, Fitzpatrick on Preseason Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Two OVC players were among the 20 players nationally named to the initial Buck Buchanan Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. The players were UT Martin senior linebacker **Tony Bell** and Tennessee State senior defensive back **Daniel Fitzpatrick**. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, is presented annually to the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). No player from the OVC has ever won the award. The Buchanan Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The winner will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation on Dec. 15.

COACHES TELECONFERENCE

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OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3: For the second-straight year the OVC is producing a "Game of the Week" package that will air on ESPN3 this fall. The eight-game schedule is one again in conjunction with WebStream Sports, an Indianapolis-based company which is a proven leader in video production, streaming video and content creation Kevin Ingram, host of "The Wake Up Zone" on 104.5 The Zone in Nashville, will handle play-by-play duties while Bob Belvin, on-air talent and contributor at 100.7 FM/AM 540 (ESPN Clarksville), will provide analysis. The duo has worked together each of the past two years in the league's TV package. The OVC Football Game of the Week package is part of an overall five-year agreement with ESPN which was announced last October. The deal runs through the completion of the 2017-18 season.

Delta Dental of Tennessee to Sponsor Sgt. York Trophy: Beginning this season Delta Dental of Tennessee is the presenting sponsor of the Sgt. York Trophy. The trophy (founded in 2007 by the Nashville Sports Council and OVC) goes to the winner of the quadrangular season football series between the four OVC football-playing schools located in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. As a corporal in the 2nd battalion, 328th Infantry, in the Battle of the Meuse River-Argonne (Oct. 8, 1918), York and seven other soldiers captured 132 prisoners, was promoted to sergeant and received the Distinguished Service Cross, the French Croix de Guerre, the French Legion of Honor, the Croce di Guerra of Italy and the War Medal of Montenegro. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). Tennessee State won its fifth Sgt. York Championship in 2014. The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring.

A Look at the Coaches: Six of the nine OVC coaches from last season returned to their respective teams in 2014. The three new coaches to the league are at Eastern Illinois (**Kim Dameron**), Jacksonville State (**John Grass**) and Southeast Missouri (**Tom Matukewicz**). Dameron comes to Charleston after most recently serving as the defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech. Grass was elevated from Offensive Coordinator to head coach after helping JSU to the FCS Quarterfinals a season ago. Matukewicz is at Southeast Missouri after a stint at Toledo. Grass and Tennessee State's **Rod Reed** are the only two OVC coaches who are currently coaching at their alma mater. The longest tenured coach in the league is UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** who enters his ninth season with the Skyhawks in 2014.

Preseason Forecasts: Jacksonville State has been picked the preseason favorite in the 2014 Ohio Valley Conference football race both a vote of league head coaches and sports information directors and in the inaugural OVC media poll. In the coaches poll, the Gamecocks, who have also been picked preseason favorites in 2005, 2008, 2010 and 2011, picked up 10 of the 18 first-place votes to top the poll. The Gamecocks totaled 118 total points to out-distance two-time defending champion Eastern Illinois in the vote. The Panthers picked up four first-place votes and 110 total points in being picked second. Tennessee State picked up the other four first-place votes and was third with 107 points. Eastern Kentucky was picked fourth (82 points) and was followed in the poll by UT Martin (79), Murray State (54), Tennessee Tech (48), Southeast Missouri State (34) and Austin Peay (16). In the media poll the pollsters gave JSU 9 of 14 first-place votes and 118 total points. Tennessee State picked up four first-place votes and 113 total points in being picked second. Eastern Illinois received the other first-place vote and was picked third (98 points). The poll was rounded out by Eastern Kentucky (79), UT Martin (77), Murray State (56), Tennessee Tech (44), Southeast Missouri State (29) and Austin Peay (16).

of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Illinois and Jacksonville State each had eight Preseason All-OVC selections to lead all teams. Tennessee State had six picks, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin had two apiece while Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri each had one. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (10 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included nine players who were second-team picks in 2013. Of the 28 total selections, 20 were seniors, six were juniors and two were sophomores.

NFL Connections: As of September 1, there are 16 former Ohio Valley Conference players on NFL rosters (9 active, 2 practice squad, 5 on IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now with the New York Giants, and first-year quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo who won the Walter Payton Award in 2013 with Eastern Illinois and who is now the backup for Tom Brady in New England. Seven of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

Let's Get It Started: The 67th season of Ohio Valley Conference football got underway on Thursday, August 28. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2014. Since its beginning, 15 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the league have claimed at least one championship

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. Overall 2014-15 marks the ninth year the OVC has streamed live events. Starting with the re-branding of the streaming in 2012-13, events were offered free of charge and in an HD format and featured improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events are available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology. Approximately 41 OVC football games will be available on the OVCDN this season.

SGT. YORK TROPHY



The 2014 season marks the eighth of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

The 2014 season marks the first the award has been presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in February or March of each year).

GAME NOTES: For the second year in a row Tennessee Tech and Indiana State will be squaring off on the gridiron. Last season the Golden Eagles won a thriller in Cookeville as Jared Davis hit Zack Ziegler for a two-yard touchdown with 1:11 to play in pulling out the 38-37 victory. Davis finished the game 11-of-12 passes for 97 yards while Ziegler hauled in eight catches including the game-winner. Marty Jones led the Tech defense with 16 tackles. Shakir Bell had 201 rushing yards and a score while quarterback Mike Perish passed for 288 yards and two scores. Tech is looking to start the season 2-0 for the second time under Coach Brown and just the third time since the 1989 season.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech improved to 8-0 in home openers under head coach Watson Brown with a 33-7 victory over Kentucky Christian last week. Overall the team has a three-game winning streak dating back to the end of the 2013 season. Tech unveiled its new "QW" position in last Thursday's game as it put two quarterbacks on the field at the same time. The multi-dimension Darian Stone rushed and caught a touchdown out of that position; he was the team's leading rusher with 42 yards and then caught a touchdown from quarterback Jared Davis. Davis finished the game 18-of-25 for 168 yards and two touchdowns; he hooked up with Cody Matthews six times as Matthews tallied 74 yards and a score. Ladarius Vanlier averaged 13.9 yards on five punt returns and 24.5 yards on two kickoff returns, finished with 157 all-purpose yards on the game. Defensive end Midoho Okpokowuruk had a career-high seven tackles and 2.5 tackles-for-loss in the win on Thursday. He buoyed a defensive attack that limited Kentucky Christian to just 203 yards of total offense. In replacing All-American punter Chad Zinchini, Jonathan King averaged 45.0 yards/punt on five punts in his collegiate debut; King dropped three inside the 20-yard line.

SCOUTING INDIANA STATE: Indiana State enters this week having lost 10-straight games dating back to last season. The losing streak began with its loss at TTU on Sept. 28 of last season. The team opened the 2014 season with a 28-10 loss at in-state rival Indiana. Mike Perish completed 17-of-32 passes for 140 yards while Buck Logan rushed for 47 yards and the team's lone touchdown of the game. Mark Sewall led the team with 11 tackles and a pass breakup while Conn Underwood added nine tackles, 3.0 tackles-for-loss and a sack. Saturday's game marks a stretch where the Sycamores will play four of its next five at home.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky and Miami (Ohio) will renew a series that was last contested in the 1935 season. Eastern Kentucky is 6-20 all-time against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), having lost 18 in-a-row against teams from that classification. ECU last topped a FBS opponent in 1985 (Louisville).

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky began the season with a victory over Robert Morris for the second-straight season, topping the Colonials 29-10 on the road. The Colonels racked up 624 yards of total offense, the second-most in the nation during the week, and 407 yards on the ground. The 407 rushing yards were the most by the team since the 2001 season (475 yards vs. Glenville State). Despite topping RMU for the second-straight season, it was the first season-opening road victory for the program since 1992. Kentucky transfer Dy'Shawn Mobley carried the ball 25 times for 142 yards in his ECU debut. Quarterback Jared McClain added 90 rushing yards and a score to go along with 134 passing yards while sophomore JJ Jude had 84 rushing yards. Senior kicker Andrew Lloyd was named OVC Specialist of the Week after connecting on 3-of-3 field goals, hitting from 34, 25 and 25 yards. He also had seven kickoffs on the night, each of which was downed for a touchback. Senior Tyrelle Johnson equaled his career-high with eight tackles against Robert Morris; he was part of a defensive unit that limited the Colonials to just 28 rushing yards on 24 carries (1.2 yards/carry). Defensive back Brandon Stanley added seven tackles. Eastern Kentucky continues to receive votes in both Top 25 polls.

SCOUTING MIAMI (OHIO): Miami opened its season with a 15-points loss to Marshall last weekend. The RedHawks fell behind 28-3 at halftime before scoring 17 unanswered points in the third quarter to pull to 28-20 at the beginning of the fourth. Quarterback Andrew Hendrix passes for 318 yards and three touchdowns while also rushing for 46 yards (one yard off the team lead). David Frazier was his favorite target as he hauled in six passes for a career-high 109 yards. The team finished the game with 418 yards of total offense, which was 115 yards more than any game during the 2013 season. Kent Kern led the team with 13 tackles.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee State will square off with Alabama State for the first time since the 2000 season when it travels to Montgomery for Saturday's matchup. The game is being billed as the "Inaugural Classic" between the two HBCU schools. The two teams have played 12 previous times with TSU winning 10 of those games, including the 2000 contest by a 39-13 margin.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State began the season in soggy conditions but easily disposed of Edward Waters, winning 58-6 at LP Field in the annual John Merritt Classic. The Tigers racked up a school record 439 rushing yards (the most in the nation in Week 1) and limited its overmatched opponent to just 81 yards of total offense on the night (the second lowest margin allowed nationally during Week 1). Junior newcomer Tom Smith made an impression in the rushing game, carrying the ball 12 times for 151 yards (12.6 yards/carry) and scoring four touchdowns in just two quarters of play. The four rushing touchdowns were the most for a FCS player during the week and most for a TSU player since Trabis Ward scored four in October 2012. Smith, a transfer from the University of Tennessee, was named OVC Newcomer of the Week for his efforts. Senior defensive end Anthony Bass was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after making four tackles, 2.5 tackles-for-loss and netting his first career interception. Tennessee State is now ranked No. 14 in the Sports Network Top 25 and No. 16 in the FCS Coaches Top 25.

SCOUTING ALABAMA STATE: Alabama State opened its 2014 season with a 51-20 road loss to No. 16 Sam Houston State. Junior Daniel Duhart threw for 259 yards and two scores while DeMario Bell had a career-high in receiving yards (134) while also pulling in a 69-yard scoring pass. Malcolm Cyrus has 132 total yards of offense on the day. Kicker Preston Clark connected on both of his extra points, both of his field goals and averaged 36.4 yards per punt with two of those downed inside the 20. Defensively Torey Davis and Kourtney Berry each had 13 tackles.

GAME NOTES: In a battle of nationally-ranked teams, Jacksonville State will travel to Chattanooga for a Saturday contest. The two teams are playing for the 38th meeting all-time and first since the 2012 season. That season the teams were both 0-1 and coming off losses to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents just like they are this season. The 2012 game saw JSU jump out to a 17-0 lead before UTC tied the game at 24 with just 39 seconds to go. But a good kickoff return led to a quick six-play, 35-yard drive that was capped when Griffin Thomas nailed a 37-yard field goal as time expired to give the Gamecocks the victory. Then sophomore DaMarcus James rushed for 120 yards and a score while Troymaine Pope added 100 yards for Jax State. The Mocs were led by Jacob Huesman who had 181 passing yards and two touchdowns and rushed for a game-high 166 yards and a score. It marks the second time that Jacksonville State will be in the Top 10 nationally when they play at Finley Stadium; JSU was ranked No. 10 in 2011 when it was upset 38-17 by then No. 23 UTC.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State started the season with the toughest opponent on its schedule, losing 45-7 to FBS No. 8 Michigan State (the defending Rose Bowl Champions). The game was the first for the program on a Friday and first-ever against a Big Ten opponent. The Gamecocks were limited to just 244 yards of total offense on the night, including 22 rushing yards on 25 carries. All-American DaMarcus James had just 17 yards and saw his streak of 12-straight games with a rushing touchdown come to an end. Jax State used three quarterbacks in the game with Eli Jenkins (82 passing, 7 rushing yards), Max Shortell (117 passing yards, 1 TD) and Christian LeMay (23 passing, 23 rushing yards) all seeing action against the tough MSU defense. Sophomore Josh Barge hauled in seven passes for 98 yards on the night. Defensively senior linebacker Ben Endress recorded 10 total tackles, marking his third career double-double game. Overall 19 players made their debut with JSU against the Spartans.

SCOUTING CHATTANOOGA: Chattanooga entered this season with its highest preseason ranking ever, coming in at No. 14 in the Sports Network and No. 16 in the FCS Coaches polls; the Mocs are No. 13 in the Sports Network and No. 15 in the FCS Coaches poll entering this week. The Mocs were engaged in a defensive battle in its season-opener at FBS Central Michigan, as the two teams combined for just 579 yards on the night. UTC jumped out to the 16-0 lead as Jacob Huesman and Tommy Hudson connected for two touchdowns, including a 70-yarder with 3:34 to play in the second quarter. But the CMU defense would shutout Chattanooga the rest of the way and a 26-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter put the Chippewas on top for good. Huesman finished the game with 150 yards passing and two touchdowns but also threw a career-high four interceptions. Senior defensive end Davis Tull had six tackles and blocked a field goal on the night.

GAME NOTES: Southern Illinois will travel to Eastern Illinois for the 69th all-time meeting in the series on Saturday night; this one will feature a pair of nationally-ranked teams. The Salukis hold a 41-26-1 advantage in the series although the Panthers have won the last two including a thrilling 40-37 double overtime contest in Carbondale last season. In that game the teams combined for over 1,100 yards of total offense as National Player of the Year Jimmy Garoppolo threw for 440 yards and four touchdowns. All-American wide receiver Erik Lora hauled in 11 catches for 136 yards and a score while Adam Drake added seven catches for 103 yards and two scores. It was Cameron Berra who connected on the game-winning 36-yard field goal in the second overtime after seeing his potential game-winner at the end of regulation blocked. Kory Faulkner passed for 294 yards and four touchdowns and shared the team lead with 55 rushing yards.

SCOUTING SOUTHERN ILLINOIS: Southern Illinois started the season last Thursday night with a 45-0 victory over NAIA foe Taylor University. While its defense did not allow a point the Salukis offense racked up 546 yards of total offense in the victory. The action got started on the first play from scrimmage as senior Malcolm Agnew took a handoff and ran 65 yards for a touchdown; he finished the night with 145 yards on just seven carries (20.7 yards/carry) while Mika'il McCall added 80 yards and a score. Quarterback Mark Iannotti added 181 passing yards and two scores and 19 rushing yards. All-American tight end MyCole Pruitt had four catches for 37 yards and a touchdown; he now has 1,777 career receiving yards, just 32 away from third-place on the SIU career list. SIU is now ranked No. 25 in the FCS Coaches poll and are unofficially No. 26 in the Sports Network Top 25.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Two-time defending OVC champion Eastern Illinois started its season with a 42-20 loss at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent Minnesota. The Panthers defense was tough in the first half and trailed the Golden Gophers 14-0 at halftime. But Minnesota scored 21 unanswered points to begin the second half to push the advantage to 35. Despite the slow start the Panthers played tough down the stretch, scoring 20 points over the game's final 6:57. Andrew Manley scored on a 2-yard run and then hit Jimmy Lera and Adam Drake with touchdown passes over the final 30 seconds of the game. Manley ended the night 18-of-34 for 200 yards and two touchdowns while Jalen Whitlow completed 14-of-23 passes for 110 yards and rushed for a team-high 77 yards. Senior wide receiver Adam Drake was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week after hauling in 11 catches for 109 yards and a touchdown. Kamu Grugier-Hill led the way defensively with eight tackles and recovered a fumble. By scoring multiple times in the final quarter, Eastern Illinois extended its streak of consecutive games scoring to 127 (dating back 2003 season). EIU is No. 16 in this week's Sports Network Top 25 poll and No. 14 in the FCS Coaches Poll.

GAME NOTES: Murray State will travel to Louisville for the 19th all-time meeting between the in-state foes and first since the 2011 season. In that meeting Louisville jumped out to a 21-0 lead in the second quarter on its way to a 21-9 victory. The Racers were led by Mike Harris who rushed for 116 yards and a touchdown while Casey Brockman threw for 148 yards. Will Stein passed for 226 yards and two scores for the Cardinals. Murray State is 3-22-1 all-time against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS); its last victory over an FBS team came in 1984 when they defeated Louisville 26-23; the following year the Racers tied Memphis and since have lost 22-straight games to FBS opponents.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: After blitzing Union by a 73-26 margin to open the season, Murray State is now receiving votes in the Sports Network Top 25 poll. The Racers scored 28 points in the first quarter and added 24 more in the second quarter to grab a 52-13 halftime advantage. Making his debut CJ Bennett, the transfer from South Alabama, completed 13-of-22 passes for 167 yards and five touchdowns. Three of the touchdown passes went to Janawski Davis (who caught four total passes for the game) while the other two went to Jeremy Harness. Davis had a huge game overall, touching the ball only six times but scoring the three receiving touchdowns and added a 62-yard punt return for a touchdown; Davis finished the contest with 135 all-purpose yards. The balanced rushing attack saw four players rush for more than 50 yards, which Nick Taylor leading the way with 82 yards. The first time junior newcomer Shaun Samuels-Connell touched the ball in a MSU uniform he returned a punt 68 yards for a touchdown; he later had a 13-yard punt return and averaged 17.5 yards on two kickoff returns. The strong safety also had a pair of solo tackles. Defensively sophomore linebacker Jonathan Jackson recovered a fumble (which set up the Racers first touchdown of the game) and later blocked an extra point and returned it 98 yards for two points; he also added seven tackles and a sack.

SCOUTING LOUISVILLE: Louisville opens its 2014 season on Labor Day Monday night against Miami (Fla.), the team they defeated in the Russell Athletic Bowl to cap the 2013 season. The Cardinals are under the direction of head coach Bobby Petrino who begins his second stint with the Cardinals who begin their first season in the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC). Petrino spent four years (2003-06) with UofL in leading the Cards to an Orange Bowl Championship in 2006 before leaving for the NFL. But after stints at Arkansas and Western Kentucky he is back at the school where he has compiled a 41-9 record (prior to the start of the season). With last year's quarterback Teddy Bridgewater in the NFL, Louisville turns to sophomore Will Gardner to lead the offense this season; he saw action in five games last season. The Cardinals defense, which led the nation in total defense in 2013, has to replace seven starters but does return senior Lorenzo Mauldin who had 9.5 sacks a season ago. Louisville is 22-1 at home under Bobby Petrino (prior to the Miami game).

GAME NOTES: Southeast Missouri will travel to Kansas on Saturday for the first-ever matchup between the two schools. Southeast is 1-18 all-time against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) with the lone win coming over Middle Tennessee in the 2002 season. Kansas has won three-straight season openers.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri began the Tom Matukewicz era with a 77-0 rout of Missouri Baptist in its 2014 season-opener last Thursday. The 77 points were the most Southeast scored in a game during its NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision tenure and are the most by an FCS team this season. Southeast finished the game with 516 yards of total offense, its most since the 2012 season. The Redhawks also notched their first shutout over a non-conference opponent since 1990 and currently rank first nationally in scoring defense (0.0 points/game). Southeast held Missouri Baptist to just 81 total yards, the fewest allowed in a game since Southeast moved to the FCS. Quarterback Kyle Snyder tied a career-high with two rushing touchdowns and threw for 198 yards and two additional scores; he helped the team to scoring drives on each of Southeast's first seven possessions. DeMichael Jackson accounted for 148 all-purpose yards and scored on a 66-yard screen pass from Snyder while also adding a team-high 82 rushing yards and a touchdown. Sophomore linebacker Roper Garrett registered his second double-digit tackle game of his young career, netting a game-high 10 tackles while also adding a sack, 2.5 tackles-for-loss and forcing two fumbles. Newcomer Joshua Wilson recovered a fumble in the end zone, accounting for Southeast's first defensive touchdown of the season. After its blowout win the Redhawks are now receiving votes in the Sports Network Top 25 poll.

SCOUTING KANSAS: Kansas had an open date to begin the 2014 season and starts play with Southeast Missouri this weekend. It marks the second-straight year the Jayhawks have had a bye week to open the season. Coming off a 3-9 season last year the team returns eight offensive and nine defensive starters this season. The team did suffer season-ending injuries to a pair of senior running backs during the preseason and third-year head coach Charlie Weis will now have to turn to newcomers in the backfield. The team will be quarterbacked by sophomore Montell Cozart who played in seven and started three games a season ago.
