THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Eastern Kentucky remained the only undefeated team in the OVC with a 55-13 victory over Morehead State in its home opener, which was played in front of 16,700 fans (the program's largest home crowd since 2008)...The Colonels are 1 of just 13 teams undefeated at the FCS level after three weeks...EKU is now 3-0 for the first time since the 2002 season and ranks fourth nationally in both rushing offense (280.7 yards/game) and rushing defense (49.3 yards/game allowed)...Tennessee State shook off a road loss last week to crush rival Jackson State 35-7 in the Southern Heritage Classic at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis; the TSU defense limited JSU to -1 yards rushing in the game and on the season the Tigers are fourth nationally in total defense (221.0 yards/game allowed)...After four OVC teams were ranked in the Top 25 last week (the first time since 2002), Eastern Illinois dropped out of the polls this week but Jacksonville State remains No. 8, Tennessee State is No. 20 and Eastern Kentucky is No. 22...The OVC remains the No. 2 rated FCS conference in the latest Sagarin Power Rankings...The first Conference games of the season will be played this week as Eastern Kentucky travels to UT Martin (in the OVC's ESPN3 Game of the Week), Eastern Illinois hosts Austin Peay and Tennessee State entertains Tennessee Tech...The TSU/TTU game is also the first game of the annual Sgt. York Trophy presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee; the trophy goes to the winner of the quadrangular season series between the four OVC teams from the state of Tennessee (TSU has taken the trophy home each of the past three years)...In non-conference action Southeast Missouri hosts No. 3 Southeastern Louisiana, Jacksonville State hosts West Alabama and Murray State plays at FBS Western Michigan.



OFFENSIVE

Dy'Shawn Mobley, RB • Jr., 5-11, 215 • Powell, Tenn. • Eastern Kentucky

Mobley rushed for 123 yards on just six carries (20.5 yards/carry) in Eastern Kentucky's 55-13 victory over Morehead State in its home opener. The transfer from Kentucky took the ball on the first play from scrimmage and rushed 61 yards for a touchdown. He also set up the Colonels second touchdown with a 54-yard run later in the first quarter. The junior also had two catches for 10 yards as he saw most of his action in the first quarter. Mobley ranks 19th nationally in rushing yards/carry (6.64) and 24th in rushing yards/game (97.3).

DEFENSIVE

De'Ante Saunders, CB • Sr., 5-10, 195 • Deland, Fla. • Tennessee State

Saunders was named the Defensive MVP of the Southern Heritage Classic after intercepting two passes and returning one 45 yards for a first quarter touchdown. The senior picked off a pass with just over a minute to go in the opening quarter and raced to pay dirt to put TSU up 21-0 on its way to a 35-7 victory over rival Jackson State. He also picked off JSU later in the second quarter to net his third interception in the last two games. On the day he also contributed three tackles and a pass breakup and was part of a defensive unit that held the Jackson State to -1 yards rushing, 138 yards of total offense and 1-for-16 on third down attempts. Saunders currently ranks first nationally in interceptions (1.0/game) and 11th in passes defended (1.7).

Ryan McCrum, K • So., 6-0, 228 • St. Charles, Mo. • Southeast Missouri

McCrum scored 11 of Southeast Missouri's 23 points in his team's loss at No. 14 Southern Illinois. The sophomore was a perfect 3-of-3 on field goal attempts, connecting from 43, 38 and 43 yards; the 43 yards established a new career-long for McCrum. McCrum also made both of his extra point attempts and is perfect on kicks this season.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Eastern Kentucky Tops FBS Miami (Ohio) In Week 1: For the fourth time in the last five years an OVC team has beaten a team from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) as Eastern Kentucky won 17-10 at Miami (Ohio) on Sept. 6. The win was the first for the Colonels over a FBS team since the 1985 season, snapping an 18-game losing streak for ECU against teams from the higher subdivision; ECU is now 7-20 all-time against FBS opponents while OVC teams are 33-189-1 all-time against FBS opponents. The streak of winning a FBS game in 4 of the past 5 years is even more impressive when you consider the OVC went from Sept. 25, 2004 to Sept. 4, 2010 without an FBS victory (a 50-game losing streak). #FearTheFCS: In 2013 a record 16 Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams topped opponents from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). So far in 2014 five FCS teams have been victorious against teams from the FBS.

OVC Ranks Second Among FCS Conferences in Latest Sagarin Rankings: In the latest Sagarin Power Rankings the OVC is rated the second-best FCS conference, trailing only the Missouri Valley.

Offensive Valley Conference: Despite the loss of some high profile offensive players around the league in 2013, the OVC is still producing offense in 2014. After three weeks the OVC ranks second among FCS conferences in total offense (averaging 390.43 yards per team/game).

OVC Teams in the Top 25: In the latest FCS Top 25 polls, Jacksonville State remained No. 8 in the FCS Coaches poll and No. 9 in the Sports Network poll after being idle last week. Tennessee State is now No. 20 in both major polls after a neutral site victory over Jackson State. In improving to 3-0 with a win over Morehead State, Eastern Kentucky is now No. 22 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 23 in the Sports Network poll. After its third-straight loss, Eastern Illinois slipped out of the poll for the first time since the end of the 2012 season; the Panthers are still receiving votes in the Sports Network poll. On Sept. 8 of this season there were four total OVC teams ranked in the Top 25 polls (Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State and Tennessee State); that marked the first time since the end of the 2002 season that four OVC teams were ranked in the FCS Top 25 polls at the same time.

OVC in the NCAA Statistical Leaders: In the latest set of NCAA statistical leaders (Sept. 14) UT Martin's **Jarod Neal** ranks first nationally in completion percentage (74.6%), fifth in passing efficiency (176.4) and ninth in passing touchdowns (6). Tennessee State's **Tom Smith** ranks second nationally in rushing touchdowns (6) and fifth in scoring (12.0 points/game). Eastern Illinois wide receiver **Adam Drake** is second nationally in receptions/game (8.7), fifth in total receiving yards (343) and seventh in receiving yards/game (114.3). Murray State's **Janawski Davis** is first nationally in receiving touchdowns (5), scoring (18.0 points/game) and punt returns (29.0 yards/return) and fifth in points responsible for (18.0/game). Southeast Missouri's **Kyle Snyder** is fifth in passing yards/completion (17.66) and ninth in passing touchdowns (6) while his wide receiver **Paul McRoberts** is third in receiving touchdowns (4). Tennessee Tech's **Ladarius Vanlier** is sixth in punt returns (20.4 yards/return) and 11th in all-purpose yards (178.5/game). Tennessee State's **De'Ante Saunders** is first nationally in interceptions (1.0/game) while Eastern Kentucky's **Stanley Absanon** is third in passes defended (2.3/game). Tennessee State's **Anthony Bass** is fifth in tackles-for-loss (2.8/game) and sixth in sacks (1.67/game). In the team rankings Eastern Kentucky is second nationally in red zone defense (42.9%) and turnovers gained (9), fourth in rushing offense (280.7 yards/game) and rushing defense (49.3 yards/game), fifth in fumbles recovered (5), seventh in total offense (476.3 yards/game) and scoring defense (11.0 points/game) and ninth in punt return yardage defense (0.40 yards/return). Tennessee State is first nationally in third down conversion defense (14.3%) and fourth down conversion defense (0.0%), second in turnovers gained (9), passes intercepted (6) and pass efficiency defense (68.84), fourth in total defense (221.0 yards/game), sixth in sacks/game (4.0) and tackles-for-loss (10.0/game), seventh in pass defense (126.3 yards/game) and 10th in scoring offense (38.0 points/game). Southeast Missouri is first in fourth down conversion defense (0.0%), fifth in scoring offense (42.7 points/game) and sixth in passing yards/completion (17.39). Jacksonville State is first nationally in fumbles lost (0) and ninth in net punting (40.54 yards/punt). Murray State is third in scoring offense (47.0 points/game), punt returns (33.6 yards/punt) and punt return yardage defense (-0.67 yards/return), fifth in tackles-for-loss allowed (3.0/game) and fifth in sacks allowed (0.50/game). UT Martin is sixth in total offense (476.7 yards/game) and eighth in passing efficiency (162.81).

Delta Dental of Tennessee to Sponsor Sgt. York Trophy; First Game This Week: Beginning this season Delta Dental of Tennessee is the presenting sponsor of the Sgt. York Trophy. The trophy (founded in 2007 by the Nashville Sports Council and OVC) goes to the winner of the quadrangular season football series between the four OVC football-playing schools located in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. As a corporal in the 2nd battalion, 328th Infantry, in the Battle of the Meuse River-Argonne (Oct. 8, 1918), York and seven other soldiers captured 132 prisoners, was promoted to sergeant and received the Distinguished Service Cross, the French Croix de Guerre, the French Legion of Honor, the Croce di Guerra of Italy and the War Medal of Montenegro. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy). Tennessee State won its fifth Sgt. York Championship in 2014. The trophy is presented at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions hosted by the Nashville Sports Council in the spring.

OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3: For the second-straight year the OVC is producing a "Game of the Week" package that will air on ESPN3 this fall. The FCS Playoffs: In 2010 the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff field expanded to 20 teams, up from 16 previously, and last year (2013) the field increased to 24 for the first time. The expansion in 2010 to 20 teams was the first since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The field for the 2014 NCAA Division I Football Championship will be announced on Sunday, Nov. 23. The 24-team field is comprised of 11 automatic bids and 13 at-large berths. There are eight first round matchups (16 total teams), while eight (8) teams receive a bye into the second round. For the fifth time in 2014, the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Toyota Stadium, a 23,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 10.

OVC Playoff Success in 2013: After going since 2000 without a postseason victory the OVC had a breakout season in 2013. For the first time in its history the League put three teams (Eastern Illinois, Jacksonville State and Tennessee State) in the playoffs and all three teams scored victories. TSU played first and snapped the OVC's 19-game losing streak with a 31-0 win over Butler (only the second shutout ever by an OVC team in the playoffs). Jacksonville State would then defeat Samford, setting an OVC playoff record with 55 points in the victory. In the second round Eastern Illinois topped TSU while Jacksonville State bested McNeese State to each advance to the quarterfinals. It marked just the second time in OVC history that two OVC teams advanced to the quarterfinals in the same postseason (1991 being the other). The four total wins in the postseason was the most in one postseason by the OVC and the four wins came by an average margin of 33.5 points/game.

Running Backs James, Little on Walter Payton Award Watch List: Two OVC players were among the 20 players nationally named to the initial Walter Payton Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. The players were Jacksonville State senior running back **DaMarcus James** and Eastern Illinois junior running back **Shepard Little**. The Walter Payton Award was established in 1987 and is presented annually to the most outstanding college football player on the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) level. The Sports Network will present the Heisman of the FCS for the 28th time on December 15 at the national awards banquet. Last season EIU quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo became the second OVC player to win the Walter Payton Award; overall the OVC had three of the 20 finalists for the award, the most of any FCS conference (Erik Lora finished seventh and Walter Powell was 17th a year ago). The Walter Payton Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2014 season. Ballots will be sent to a national panel of over 150 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The top three vote-getters will be invited to the presentation of the award.

Bell, Fitzpatrick on Preseason Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Two OVC players were among the 20 players nationally named to the initial Buck Buchanan Award Watch List as announced by the Sports Network. The players were UT Martin senior linebacker **Tony Bell** and Tennessee State senior defensive back **Daniel Fitzpatrick**. The Buchanan Award, established in 1995, is presented annually to the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). No player from the OVC has ever won the award. The Buchanan Award Watch List can undergo revision during the 2013 season. Ballots will be sent to a panel of about 175 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries following the regular season. The winner will be invited to The Sports Network FCS Awards Presentation on Dec. 15.

EKU's Absanon Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 8): Eastern Kentucky junior defensive back **Stanley Absanon** was named the National Defensive Player of the Week by the Sports Network and College Sporting News following his performance in the team's win over FBS opponent Miami (Ohio). Early in the third quarter Absanon made a jarring hit in the end zone on a 3rd-and-4 play that prevented a RedHawk touchdown and saved four points (MU added a field goal instead). Three minutes later he picked off a pass and returned it 55 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 10. He would then seal the game by making an interception at midfield with less than one minute to play in the game. Absanon finished the game with two interceptions, six tackles and three pass breakups as ECU topped a FBS foe for the first time since the 1985 season.

following his performance in Week 2 of the 2014 season. Absanon had two interceptions in his team's win over FBS Miami (Ohio). In addition to Absanon, Jacksonville State's **Chris Landrum** was named National Defensive Lineman of the Week while Tennessee Tech's **Ladarius Vanlier** was named National Punt Returner of the Week. In addition to the trio, two other OVC players earned honorable mention honors for the week. The goal of CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams.

Three Players Earn National Weekly Honors From College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) For Week No. 1: Murray State's Janawski Davis and Shawn Samuels-Connell and Tennessee State's De'Ante Saunders were named National Punt Returners of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) following their performance in Week 1 of the 2014 season.

A Look at the Coaches: Six of the nine OVC coaches from last season returned to their respective teams in 2014. The three new coaches to the league are at Eastern Illinois (**Kim Dameron**), Jacksonville State (**John Grass**) and Southeast Missouri (**Tom Matukewicz**). Dameron comes to Charleston after most recently serving as the defensive coordinator at Louisiana Tech. Grass was elevated from Offensive Coordinator to head coach after helping JSU to the FCS Quarterfinals a season ago. Matukewicz is at Southeast Missouri after a stint at Toledo. Grass and Tennessee State's **Rod Reed** are the only two OVC coaches who are currently coaching at their alma mater. The longest tenured coach in the league is UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** who enters his ninth season with the Skyhawks in 2014.

Preseason Forecasts: Jacksonville State has been picked the preseason favorite in the 2014 Ohio Valley Conference football race both a vote of league head coaches and sports information directors and in the inaugural OVC media poll. In the coaches poll, the Gamecocks, who have also been picked preseason favorites in 2005, 2008, 2010 and 2011, picked up 10 of the 18 first-place votes to top the poll. The Gamecocks totaled 118 total points to out-distance two-time defending champion Eastern Illinois in the vote. The Panthers picked up four first-place votes and 110 total points in being picked second. Tennessee State picked up the other four first-place votes and was third with 107 points. Eastern Kentucky was picked fourth (82 points) and was followed in the poll by UT Martin (79), Murray State (54), Tennessee Tech (48), Southeast Missouri State (34) and Austin Peay (16). In the media poll the pollsters gave JSU 9 of 14 first-place votes and 118 total points. Tennessee State picked up four first-place votes and 113 total points in being picked second. Eastern Illinois received the other first-place vote and was picked third (98 points). The poll was rounded out by Eastern Kentucky (79), UT Martin (77), Murray State (56), Tennessee Tech (44), Southeast Missouri State (29) and Austin Peay (16).

JSU's James and TSU's Fitzpatrick Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Jacksonville State senior running back **DaMarcus James** was named the 2014 OVC Preseason Offensive Player of the Year while Tennessee State senior defensive end **Anthony Bass** was named Preseason Defensive Player of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Eastern Illinois and Jacksonville State each had eight Preseason All-OVC selections to lead all teams. Tennessee State had six picks, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin had two apiece while Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri each had one. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last season (10 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included nine players who were second-team picks in 2013. Of the 28 total selections, 20 were seniors, six were juniors and two were sophomores.

NFL Connections: As of September 15, there are 19 former Ohio Valley Conference players on NFL rosters (10 active, 2 practice squad, 7 on IR). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout Tony Romo, Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII, has been a Pro Bowl selection and is now with the New York Giants, and first-year quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo who won the Walter Payton Award in 2013 with Eastern Illinois and who is now the backup for Tom Brady in New England. Seven of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

Let's Get It Started: The 67th season of Ohio Valley Conference football got underway on Thursday, August 28. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2014. Since its beginning, 15 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the league have claimed at least one championship

I-AA No More: Although some people may accidentally still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. FCS is the only Division I football rank to host a NCAA-sponsored national championship (one of 89 championships the NCAA sponsors). The division formerly known as I-A was changed to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and those teams compete for the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) national championship. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (FBS teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. Overall 2014-15 marks the ninth year the OVC has streamed live events. Starting with the re-branding of the streaming in 2012-13, events were offered free of charge and in an HD format and featured improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events are available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology. Approximately 41 OVC football games will be available on the OVCDN this season.

SGT. YORK TROPHY



The 2014 season marks the eighth of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

The 2014 season marks the first the award has been presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

The award will be presented annually at the Nashville Sports Council's Celebration of Champions (held in February or March of each year).

GAME NOTES: Conference play begins on Saturday as Eastern Kentucky travels to UT Martin for the 25th all-time meeting between the two programs. Last year UT Martin scored a 16-7 victory in Richmond, its first-ever win at Roy Kidd Stadium and only its second win in the all-times series (UTM also won in 2010). A year ago the Skyhawks limited the Colonels to just 225 yards of total offense and forced three turnovers in pulling off the win. UTM kicker Jackson Redditt converted on 3-of-4 field goals, connecting from 38, 51 and 45 yards in being named OVC Specialist of the Week. Abou Toure rushed for 111 yards to lead the Skyhawk rushing attack while Dylan Favre passed for 138 yards. EKU was led by quarterback Kyle Romano who rushed for 48 yards and a touchdown and passed for 116 yards. Saturday's game is also the first of eight in the OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3 series for 2014. Since 2006 Eastern Kentucky (46 OVC wins) and UT Martin (40 OVC wins) rank No. 1 and No. 3 respectively in Conference wins.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky is off to its first 3-0 start since the 2002 season following a 55-13 victory over in-state foe Morehead State. The Colonels are now ranked No. 22 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 23 in the Sports Network Top 25. After three games EKU ranks fourth nationally in rushing offense (280.7 yards/game) as well as fourth in rushing defense (49.3 yards/game allowed) and are second nationally in turnovers gained (9). The Colonels scored on the first play of the game Saturday against Morehead State (a 61-yard rushing touchdown by Dy'Shawn Mobley) and led 46-0 at halftime; the 46 first half points were the most for the team since scoring 42 in the first half against Eastern Illinois in 2004. Playing only in the first half Mobley netted 123 rushing yards on six carries (20.5 yards/carry) in earning OVC Offensive Player and Newcomer of the Week honors. Jared Sanders, Channing Fugate and Jared McClain also had rushing scores for EKU. Defensively Chris Owens had six tackles, 2.0 tackles-for-loss and a sack for a defense that saw 27 different players record at least one tackle. EKU played in front of 16,700 fans at Roy Kidd Stadium, its largest home crowd since 2008. EKU is currently one of just 13 teams undefeated on the FCS level entering this week.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin scored its first victory of the season last Thursday as it topped NAIA Cumberland 63-7. The early date gave the Skyhawks a few extra days off prior to hosting the Colonels. The Skyhawks had 621 yards of total offense in the victory and now rank first in the OVC and sixth nationally in total offense (476.7 yards/game). Quarterback Jarod Neal continues to be efficient as he completed 15-of-18 passes for 199 yards and three touchdowns. Neal now ranks first nationally in completion percentage (74.6%) and fifth in passing efficiency rating (176.4). Dylan Favre also saw extension action in the win, completing 11-of-13 passes for 103 yards and a touchdown and rushing for 19 yards and an additional score. Overall UTM had 320 rushing yards on the night with Abou Toure leading the way with a career-high 123 yards and two scores. Overall eight different UT Martin players scored a touchdown in the win. UT Martin has won seven of its last nine OVC openers.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Illinois will host Austin Peay in its second home game of the 2014 season. The teams have played 14 previous times with EIU winning 11 of those meetings, including the last five in a row. Austin Peay's last victory in the series was a 15-13 victory in 2008. In last year's meeting the Panthers were ranked No. 4 nationally and built a 42-0 halftime lead on its way to a 63-7 victory in Clarksville. Walter Payton Award winner Jimmy Garoppolo completed 21-of-30 passes for 306 yards and five touchdowns as Erik Lora caught five of those passes for 133 yards and three touchdowns. Eastern also rushed for 192 yards as a team with Taylor Duncan scored two touchdowns and gaining 128 total yards. APSU was led by Tim Phillips who rushed for 83 yards and a touchdown.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay opened the newly renovated Governors Stadium on Saturday, falling 42-6 to nationally-ranked Chattanooga. It was the first time the Mocs had played in Clarksville since 1968. It marked the 14th-straight loss for the program dating back to the beginning of the 2013 season. The Govs did record its first points of the season in the first quarter as Darrien Boone completed a 45-yard touchdown pass to Javier Boone to cut the UTC lead to 14-6. It was one of six catches on the day for Booker who finished with 88 total receiving yards. Malik Boynton caught five passes on the afternoon as Boone finished the day 15-of-20 for 124 yards. The Govs finished the game with 42 team rushing yards with Justin Roberson leading the way with 27 yards on 11 carries. Senior punter Ben Campbell punted 10 times for a 36.2 yards/punt average with a long of 49; it marked the second consecutive game Campbell has had double-digit punts.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Playing its third-straight game against a solid opponent, Eastern Illinois fell to 0-3 under head coach Kim Dameron with a 34-15 loss to rival Illinois State. The Panthers trimmed the margin to 21-13 early in the third quarter when quarterback Jalen Whitlow scored on a 14-yard rush but following that play the squad yielded 13 consecutive points to the Redbirds in the remainder of the third quarter. Whitlow finished the contest 10-of-22 for 150 passing yards (and three interceptions) and 30 rushing yards on 11 attempts. Adam Drake caught six passes for 95 yards and in the process became the eighth player in EIU history with 2,000 career receiving yards (2,001). Drake currently ranks second nationally in receptions/game (8.7) and fifth in total receiving yards (343). Running back Taylor Duncan had 87 rushing yards in the game. After suffering the loss the Panthers dropped out of the Top 25 polls for the first time since November 5, 2012. EIU is still receiving votes in the Sports Network Top 25 poll. EIU, the two-time defending OVC champions, have won 12-straight OVC games, the second-longest active streak in the FCS (behind only North Dakota State's 13-straight conference wins). EIU's longest all-time OVC win streak is 13 games done from both 2000-02 and 2004-06. The team has also won eight-straight home OVC contests dating back to the 2011 season.

GAME NOTES: After an open date Tennessee Tech will travel to Tennessee State to open OVC play against nationally-ranked Tennessee State. The game is the first of the 2014 Sgt. York Trophy series presented by Delta Dental. The series is contested between the four football-playing schools from the state of Tennessee; TSU has won the trophy each of the past three years (although TTU shared the title with them in 2011 but lost a tiebreaker to bring home the actual hardware). Saturday's game is the 28th all-time meeting between the two teams; Tennessee State has won the last three and eight of the last 10 in the all-time series. Last year the Tigers led 17-7 at halftime on its way to a 41-21 victory in Cookeville. Michael German passed for 204 yards and three touchdowns for TSU while Tim Broughton added 86 yards on the ground. TTU quarterbacks Darian Stone and Jared Davis combined for 165 passing yards and a score. Saturday's game is the first of three this season at Hale Stadium on the TSU campus.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech is coming off an open date that followed its road loss at Indiana State on Sept. 6. In that contest the Golden Eagles fell behind 28-0 before scoring on back-to-back special teams plays in the third quarter. The first score came when Jordan Patrick blocked a punt which he recovered for a touchdown. Less than two minutes later Ladarius Vanlier returned a punt 72 yards for a touchdown to trim the Sycamore advantage in half. Vanlier would be named OVC Specialist of the Week for his play in the contest; Vanlier finished the day with 200 all-purpose yards (his second career 200-plus yard all-purpose game), gaining 112 yards on kickoffs, 74 yards on punts, nine rushing yards and five receiving yards. The junior currently ranks first in the OVC and 11th nationally in all-purpose yards (178.5/game) and is sixth in punt returns (20.4 yards/return). Darian Stone, playing the new QW hybrid position, had 37 rushing yards against ISU and is the team's leading rusher (79 yards) through two games.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: After a six-point road loss to Alabama State in Week 2 of the season, Tennessee State rebounded with a 35-7 victory over rival Jackson State in the 25th annual Southern Heritage Classic played in front of 46,914 fans at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis. The TSU defense continued to play stout, allowing just 138 yards of total offense on the night, including -1 net rushing yards on 26 total attempts. Tennessee State is currently first nationally in third down conversion defense (14.3%) and fourth down conversion defense (0.0%), second in turnovers gained (9), passes intercepted (6) and pass efficiency defense (68.84), fourth in total defense (221.0 yards/game), sixth in sacks/game (4.0) and tackles-for-loss (10.0/game), seventh in pass defense (126.3 yards/game) and 10th in scoring offense (38.0 points/game). Individually reigning OVC Defensive Player of the Year Anthony Bass is fifth in tackles-for-loss (2.8/game) and sixth in sacks (1.67/game). Senior De'Ante Saunders was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after picking off two Jackson State passes including returning one 45 yards for a touchdown. Saunders currently ranks first nationally in interceptions (1.0) and 11th in passes defended (1.7/game). Offensively newcomer Tom Smith scored two touchdowns against JSU to increase his season total to six (the second-most nationally). Starting quarterback Michael German left the game with an injury but is expected back this week; in his place Ronald Butler passed for 125 yards and a touchdown.

GAME NOTES: After an open date the Jacksonville State Gamecocks will be at home for the first time this season, hosting former Division II rival West Alabama at Burgess-Snow Field. The two programs have played 45 times but not since the 1992 season. Jacksonville State has won the last seven meetings (and 16 of the last 19) with West Alabama last winning in the 1985 season. The two teams played every season from 1952 through 1992 when JSU was a Division II squad. The game is the first home contest for first-year head coach John Grass; eight of the nine head coaches who have opened their tenure at JSU Stadium have done so with a victory or a tie. Overall the program has won eight-straight home openers dating back to the 2004 season.

SCOUTING WEST ALABAMA: West Alabama is off to a perfect 2-0 start under first-year head coach Brett Gilliland. Gilliland, a member of the UWA Athletic Hall of Fame, was a record-setting quarterback for his alma mater, concluding his career with the Tigers single-season (3,213) and career passing (6,689) marks. He would go on to be an assistant at Georgia Tech, Georgia Southern and most recently Kennesaw State. Through two games this season West Alabama is averaging 37.0 points and 433.5 yards/game. Three players have rushed for at least 100 yards this season for West Alabama, with Javae Swindle leading the way with 197 yards (98.5 yards/game) and a touchdown while Jabari Barker has a team-best three rushing scores. In the team's 30-6 home victory over Shaw on Saturday, the defense produced a school record nine sacks and held its opponent to -26 rushing yards. Jared Washington had three sacks to lead UWA.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State maintained its national rankings of No. 8 in the FCS Coaches and No. 9 in the Sports Network polls while being idle. After a season-opening loss to FBS power Michigan State, the Gamecocks pulled out an overtime win over nationally-ranked FCS opponent Chattanooga. It marked the fourth overtime game for the program over the past two years; JSU is 3-1 in extra period games over that time period. JSU has also won six of its last eight games against nationally-ranked FCS opponents. Quarterback Eli Jenkins was named OVC Offensive Player of the Week after the UTC game as he completed 15-of-21 passes for 122 yards and rushing for 82 yards and the game-winning score in overtime. The Gamecocks rushing attack compiled 285 total yards for the game with DaMarcus James leading the way with 112 yards and a score. But it was the Gamecocks defense that took center stage, limiting the Mocs to just 11 yards of total offense, the fewest yards the team has ever allowed to a Division I opponent. Had JSU not thrown two interceptions that UTC returned for touchdowns, the game would have been 17-0 in favor of the Gamecocks at intermission. Junior newcomer Devaunte Sigler, a transfer from Auburn, was named OVC Newcomer of the Week following the Chattanooga game, as he had five tackles, 2.0 tackles-for-loss, a sack and forced a fumble. Michael Carlisle added 2.0 sacks and a team-high eight tackles.

GAME NOTES: For the second-straight year Southeast Missouri and Southeastern Louisiana will square off on the gridiron. The two teams played for the first time a year ago when the Lions came out on top 45-7 in Hammond. Southeastern racked up 494 yards of total offense (309 on the ground) in the game as Bryan Bennett passed for 169 yards and rushed for 106 yards and three touchdowns. Southeast Missouri rushed for 206 yards as a team with DeMichael Jackson gaining a team-high 61 yards and Lennies McFerren adding 47 yards and a touchdown. Saturday is the annual Family Weekend game for Southeast Missouri.

SCOUTING SOUTHEASTERN LOUISIANA: After a tremendous 2013 campaign that saw the team win the Southland Conference Championship, finish 11-3 overall and advance to the FCS Playoff Quarterfinals. A big portion of the team's success can be attributed to now senior quarterback Bryan Bennett who played two seasons at Oregon before taking over for SLU in 2013. A season ago he threw for 3,165 yards and 21 touchdowns and rushed for 1,046 yards and 16 additional scores for the Lions. Through three games this season the All-American has passed for 748 yards and five touchdowns and rushed for 153 yards and three additional scores. Southeastern topped Jacksonville and Southern Utah in the first two games of the season before suffering a loss at FBS Tulane last week. Senior linebacker Isiah Corbett has been named Southland Conference Defensive Player of the Week twice this season including this past week after registering five tackles and two interceptions against the Green Wave. Southeastern is ranked No. 3 in the Sports Network poll and No. 4 in the FCS Coaches Top 25 this week.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: After a loss to FBS foe Kansas in Week 2, the road wasn't much easier for Southeast Missouri last week as they traveled to nationally-ranked FCS foe Southern Illinois and lost to its rival by a 50-23 margin. The team had five turnovers in the game which led to 29 SIU points and proved to be the difference in the game. Playing without injured starting running back DeMichael Jackson, the team rushed for 153 total yards as Lennies McFerren led the way with 80 yards on 16 carries. Quarterback Kyle Snyder added 51 yards to go along with 204 passing yards and a touchdown to Paul McRoberts. McRoberts hauled in seven total catches for 86 yards as he scored his fourth receiving touchdown of the season (third-most nationally). McRoberts currently ranks 16th nationally in averaging 91.7 yards/game. Kicker Ryan McCrum was named OVC Specialist of the Week after connecting on field goals from 43, 38 and 43 yards and adding two extra points. The 43-yard field goals were the longest of his career. Defensively senior Tim Hamm-Bey picked off a pass and returned it 56 yards for a touchdown; Hamm-Bey blocked a kick the week prior and has 14 tackles through three games this season (6 of which came against SIU). As a team Southeast Missouri is first in fourth down conversion defense (0.0%), fifth in scoring offense (42.7 points/game) and sixth in passing yards/completion (17.39).

GAME NOTES: For the second-straight game Murray State will play a team from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). The Racers played at nationally-ranked Louisville in Week 2 and after an open date last week return to the gridiron for its first-ever matchup with Western Michigan. It marks the third time in the Chris Hatcher Era that MSU has played a team from the Mid-American Conference. Murray State is 3-23-1 all-time against FBS opponents with its last win coming against Louisville in the 1984 season.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State is coming off its open date and will play its second FBS opponent on Saturday after losing 66-21 at No. 25 Louisville in its last game. Despite the loss the 21 points were the most the program had scored against a FBS opponent since the 2000 season (28 against Middle Tennessee). After falling behind 14-0, wide receiver Janawski Davis caught a pass from CJ Bennett and raced 57 yards for a touchdown. He would add a 9-yard touchdown caught in the third quarter and finished the game with 112 all-purpose yards. Davis currently is first nationally in receiving touchdowns (5), scoring (18.0 points/game) and punt returns (29.0 yards/return) and fifth in points responsible for (18.0/game) after two games. Jeremy Harness, who also caught a touchdown against Louisville, is eighth nationally in receiving touchdowns (3) entering this week. Starting quarterback CJ Bennett finished the game with 93 yards and a touchdown while KD Humphries played the second half, completing 13-of-19 passes for 158 yards and two scores. Linebacker Travis Taylor had a career-high 12 tackles against Louisville while also adding 2.0 tackles-for-loss and a sack. As a team MSU ranks third nationally in punt returns (40.54 yards/return) as well as punt return yardage defense (0.67 yards/return).

SCOUTING WESTERN MICHIGAN: After going 1-11 in 2013 under first-year head coach PJ Fleck, the Broncos have already matched that win total this season, besting Idaho last week after a season-opening loss to Purdue. In that victory sophomore quarterback Zach Terrell passed for 242 yards and three touchdowns while freshman running back Jarvion Franklin had a career-high 33 carries for 211 yards and three touchdowns. Franklin is averaging 187.0 yards/game this season and has all six of WMU's rushing touchdowns through two games while Terrell has thrown only one interception while completing 58.9 percent of his passes. Overall Western Michigan is averaging 39.5 points/game but are allowing 38.0 points/game on defense. Defensively Grant DePalma has a team-high 20 tackles while defensive tackle Cleveland Smith was named MAC West Defensive Player of the Week after netting three sacks against Idaho.
