## THIS WEEK'S adidas® OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



### PLAYER

#### **Darion Rackley, G • Sr., 6-3, 170 • St. Louis, Mo. • Jacksonville State**

Rackley helped Jacksonville State to a pair of home victories last week in averaging 20.0 points, 5.5 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 2.0 steals/game while hitting 46.2 percent (12-of-26) from the field and 88.2 percent (15-of-17) from the free throw line. To start the week Rackley had 16 points, four rebounds, four assists and four steals in leading the Gamecocks to its first victory over Belmont since the Bruins joined the league three years ago. Three days later against Tennessee Tech he scored 24 points on 6-of-12 shooting including 11-of-12 at the free throw line; in that game he tied his career-high with six assists and pulled down seven rebounds (one shy of his career-high). Rackley is the first JSU player to be named OVC Player of the Week since Jan. 28, 2013 (when Tarvin Gaines shared the award) and first Gamecock to win the award solo since Feb. 15, 2010 (Nick Murphy).

### CO-NEWCOMER

#### **Trae Anderson, F • Jr., 6-4, 235 • St. Louis, Mo. • Eastern Illinois**

Anderson, the transfer from Southwestern Illinois College, averaged 15.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists, 1.0 blocks and 1.0 steals/game while hitting 61.1 percent (11-of-18) from the field and 88.9 percent (8-of-9) from the free throw line in a pair of games. In a victory at Austin Peay he scored 19 points on 7-of-10 field goals and 5-of-5 free throws while also contributing six rebounds, two assists and block and steals. At SIUE he contributed 11 points, three assists, two rebounds, a block and steal.

### CO-NEWCOMER

#### **Twymond Howard, F • Jr., 6-6, 210 • Pearl, Miss. • UT Martin**

Howard, the transfer from Southwest Mississippi Community College, averaged 14.0 points, 8.0 rebounds, 1.5 steals and 1.0 assists/game while hitting 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from the field in a pair of games. He began the week with a game-high 21 points on 6-of-7 shooting (2-of-3 3-pointers) and 7-of-8 free throws in a loss at Southeast Missouri; he also added five rebounds, two steals and two assists in that game. He capped the week with seven points and a game-high 11 rebounds in 39 minutes of action in a victory at Austin Peay.

### FRESHMAN

#### **Marcus Wallace, G • Fr., 6-1, 175 • Little Rock, Ark. • Southeast Missouri**

Wallace earned the Freshman of the Week award for the second-straight week after averaging 15.5 points, 2.5 steals and 2.0 assists/game and hitting 81.8 percent (9-of-11) from the field, 80 percent (4-of-5) from 3-point range and 90 percent (9-of-10) from the free throw line. Wallace came off the bench and was perfect from the field (4-of-4 overall, 3-of-3 3-pointers) in scoring 14 points in a victory over UT Martin; he also added three steals, a block and an assist against the Skyhawks. He capped the week with 17 points on 5-of-7 shooting (6-of-6 free throws) in an overtime loss to Murray State. He added three assists, two steals and a rebound in the contest. Wallace has now scored double figures in three-straight contests.

## NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

**OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights:** Murray State improved to 13-0 in OVC play and clinched its 24th overall OVC Regular Season Championship with an overtime win at Southeast Missouri on Saturday night... MSU is now just three wins away from completing a perfect OVC season and would become just the fifth team to accomplish that feat (and first since Austin Peay in 2003-04)...The Racers have now won 21 games in a row, tied for the second-longest winning streak in OVC history; the streak is the second-longest active streak nationally (behind only Kentucky)...Belmont sophomore Evan Bradds enters this week leading all Division I players in field goal percentage (70.6%); that is just above of the OVC's single-season record (70.0%)...Entering this week Murray State (69) is the highest ranked OVC team in the NCAA's RPI; four other OVC teams currently rank between 149 and 169 in the RPI including Eastern Kentucky (149), Belmont (152), Eastern Illinois (168) and UT Martin (169)...Murray State is also the highest ranked OVC team in the KenPom rankings, coming in at No. 71...Murray State enters the week with 10 true road victories tied for the second-most nationally and ranking only behind Albany (11-5)...Murray State is now unofficially No. 29 in the Associated Press Top 25, picking up 38 points this week; the Racers received 10 points in the USA Today Coaches Poll and are unofficially No. 34...Tuesday's scheduled game between Austin Peay and Eastern Kentucky in Richmond has been postponed until next Monday (Feb. 23) due to weather.

**Weather Changes Austin Peay/Eastern Kentucky Game:** The Austin Peay at Eastern Kentucky game originally scheduled for Tuesday, Feb. 17 has been moved to Monday, Feb. 23 due to weather.

**Murray State Claims 24th OVC Regular Season Championship:** With three games still left to be played Murray State has already locked up its 24th OVC Championship with a 13-0 record entering this week. It is the first overall regular season crown for the team since 2012. MSU has also won crowns in 1951, 1964, 1968, 1969, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2006, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2015. The Racers now will attempt to become fifth team in OVC history to finish the regular season undefeated joining Western Kentucky teams in 1949-50 (8-0), 1965-66 (14-0) and 1969-70 (14-0) and the 2003-04 Austin Peay team (16-0).

**Overall Winning Streaks:** As of Monday Murray State has won 21-straight games which is the second-longest active streak nationally.

**Longest Winning Streaks in OVC History:** After setting the OVC record for longest winning streak during the 2011-12 season, Murray State has put together another long winning streak this season, reeling off 21-straight wins. They are one of eight teams all-time in OVC history to have a winning streak of 15 games or longer.

**Road Warriors:** As of Monday Murray State has a 10-1 record in true road games. The 10 overall road wins are tied for the second-most nationally with Yale (10-5) and Rider (10-4) and trailing only Albany (11-5). Only two teams (Kentucky and Virginia) have fewer road losses than Murray State this season (but are undefeated in true road games).

**Murray State Receiving Top 25 Votes:** For the third-straight week Murray State is receiving votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll and for the second-straight week in the USA Today Coaches Poll. The Racers are up from 20 to 38 points in the AP Poll and are now unofficially 29th nationally. In the Coaches Poll Murray State went from eight to 10 points and is now unofficially 34th. Murray State is the last OVC team to be ranked in the Top 25, climbing as high as No. 9 during the 2011-12 season (that was the first time an OVC team had been ranked in the Top 10 since 1970-71).

**700 Club:** Belmont head coach Rick Byrd became just the seventh active Division I head coach to reach the 700 win plateau on January 17 when his team won at Austin Peay. With the 700 victories Byrd joins an elite group that also includes Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim, Bob Huggins, Roy Williams, Bo Ryan and Rick Pitino (Youngstown State's Jerry Slocum needs just one more win entering this week to become the eighth active member). All-time the now 705 career wins rank Byrd 25th in NCAA Division I history.

**Eastern Kentucky Posts 28-Point Road Win Over Nationally-Ranked Miami; Second-Largest Ever By OVC Team:** Eastern Kentucky made history when it went on the road and beat No. 18 Miami (Fla.) 72-44 on December 19. It was the first victory over a nationally-ranked non-conference opponent for the team since topping No. 6 Dayton on Dec. 9, 1967. It is the second-largest victory over a Top 25 team by an OVC team, trailing only a 31-point win by Western Kentucky over No. 15 St. Bonaventure on January 3, 1953 (94-63 at a neutral site in Oklahoma City). **NCAA Stats Leaders:** Entering this week in the latest NCAA statistical leaders (Feb. 16), Eastern Kentucky ranks second nationally in turnover margin (+7.8/game), fourth in free throw percentage (77.4%), fifth in steals (9.7/game) and 12th in 3-pointers made/game (9.0). Murray State ranks 12th in field goal percentage (48.8%), 14th in scoring offense (79.1 points/game), 21st in scoring margin (+11.6 points/game), 24th in assists (15.6/game) and 27th in 3-point percentage (39.0%). Belmont ranks seventh in 3-pointers made/game (9.5) while UT Martin is 13th in fewest fouls/game (15.2). Individually Belmont's **Evan Bradds** is first in field

## 2015 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2015 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 4-7 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tennessee. The tournament features eight men's and eight women's teams with the men's teams playing a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals and the women's team playing a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. bracket.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on the OVC Digital Network. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 6 at 6:30 and 8:30 p.m. and televised on ESPN2. The championship game on Saturday, March 7 is at 6 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 6 (ESPN3) and the women's championship game is on March 7 at 1:00 p.m. CT (ESPN3).

This marks the 21st time in 22 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

**CREDENTIALS.** For the sixth year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. The deadline to request credentials is **MONDAY, MARCH 2 at 3 p.m.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).

Tennessee Tech's **Charles Jackson** is fourth nationally in double-doubles (15), 21st in field goal percentage (57.8%) and 27th in rebounding (9.4/game). Murray State's **Cameron Payne** is 18th in scoring (19.6 points/game), 22nd in assists (5.7/game) and 40th in steals (1.96/game). Eastern Kentucky's **Corey Walden** is fourth in steals (2.92/game) and 37th in scoring (18.7 points/game) while teammate **Eric Stutz** is sixth in field goal percentage (61.6%). Austin Peay's **Chris Horton** is fourth in double-doubles (15), sixth in rebounding (11.0/game) and 37th in blocked shots (2.35/game). Southeast Missouri's **Jarekious Bradley** is 14th nationally in free throw percentage (89.0%).

**CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll:** In the latest CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Poll (Feb. 9 - the newest poll was not yet available), Murray State is ranked fifth and Belmont is 24th while Eastern Kentucky and UT Martin were among the others receiving votes. Gonzaga picked up all 31 first-place votes to be ranked No. 1. Now in its 16th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, WAC and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

**Belmont's Bradshaw Named CoSIDA Academic All-District:** Belmont junior **Craig Bradshaw** has been named to the Capital One Academic All-District® men's basketball first-team as selected by CoSIDA. For appearing on the first-team Bradshaw will now go on the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-American. In the classroom, Bradshaw holds a 3.51 grade-point average in his chosen major of Public Relations. To be eligible for Academic All-America® consideration, a student-athlete must be a varsity starter or key reserve, maintain a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.30 on a scale of 4.00, have reached sophomore athletic and academic standings at his/her current institution and be nominated by his/her sports information director.

**Belmont's Chamberlain Named Candidate for Senior CLASS Award:** Belmont senior **Reece Chamberlain** is one of 30 Division I men's basketball players selected as candidates for the 2014-15 Senior CLASS Award®. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. The complete list of candidates follows this release. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate classes will be narrowed to 10 finalists later in the regular season, and those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one male candidate and one female candidate who best exemplify excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition. The Senior CLASS Award winner will be announced during the 2015 NCAA Men's Final Four®.

**UTM's Smith Among Rare Company With Stat-Filled Game:** UT Martin senior guard **Deville Smith** put himself in rare company with his performance at Illinois-Chicago on December 15. Smith had 26 points, 7 assists, 6 rebounds, 5 blocks and 3 steals in the overtime victory over the Flames. He is the first Division I player to have a 25-point, 5-assist, 5-rebound, 5-block and 3-steal performance against a fellow Division I team since Minnesota's Joel Przybilla against Iowa in 1999-00 (Przybilla had 28 points, 18 rebounds, 7 blocks, 5 assists and 3 steals).

**Horton Records 10th Triple-Double in OVC History:** Austin Peay junior **Chris Horton** recorded just the 10th triple-double in OVC history on Nov. 16 when he had 15 points, 13 rebounds and 10 blocks against Berea College. It was the first triple-double in the OVC since the 2008-09 season and he was only the second player to ever do it with blocked shots. Below are a list of all-time OVC triple-doubles.

It was the most points by a Belmont player in the program's Division I era and the third-most points by a Division I player this season. **Payne Named Lou Henson Mid-Major Player of the Week by CollegeInsider.com (Dec. 15):** Murray State sophomore **Cameron Payne** was named the Lou Henson Mid-Major Player of the Week by CollegeInsider.com on Dec. 15 following his play at Evansville. Payne scored a career-high 32 points as Murray State won 81-79; the sophomore hit 10-of-19 field goals attempts, 4-of-7 3-pointers and 8-of-12 free throws while also adding eight assists, five rebounds and two steals in 35 minutes of action. Payne scored 20 of his 32 points in the first half as MSU built a 42-38 halftime advantage.

**Bradshaw Named National Player of the Week by NBCSports.com (Dec. 1):** Belmont's **Craig Bradshaw** was named the National Player of the Week by NBCSports.com/CollegeBasketballTalk following his play in three games that saw him average 33.0 points, 3.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.0 steals/game while hitting 58.2 percent (32-of-55) from the field, 58.6 percent (17-of-29) from 3-point range and 75 percent (18-of-24) from the free throw line in three Belmont victories. After scoring 29 and 28 points in games to open the week he hit 8-of-12 3-pointers on his way to a Belmont Division I scoring record of 42 points at Ohio; in that game he also raced the length of the court and hit the game-winning basket to lift his team to a 83-81 victory.

**Payne Named to Cousy Award Watch List:** Murray State's **Cameron Payne** has been named to the watch list of candidates for the 2015 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award. men's college basketball. The Watch List included 35 players right now and will be narrowed to 20 in early February, then the final five by early March. The winner will be honored on Monday of Final Four weekend in Indianapolis.

**Two OVC Players On Midseason Lou Henson Award Watch List:** Two OVC men's basketball players have been named to the midseason Lou Henson Award Watch list by CollegeInsider.com. The Lou Henson Award is presented annually to the Division I "Mid-Major" Player of the Year. The OVC selections included Murray State sophomore guard **Cameron Payne** and Eastern Kentucky senior guard **Corey Walden**. The group are among 40 players nationally nominated for the award. The award is named in honor of Henson who retired after a spectacular coaching career that lasted 41 years. The 2015 recipient will be announced at the CollegeInsider.com Awards Banquet on April 3 in Indianapolis, site of the 2015 men's NCAA Basketball Championship.

**OVC to Produce 14-Game National Television Package:** The OVC will produce the largest national television package in its history in 2014-15 as 14 Conference games will air on either the ESPN Family of Networks or the CBS Sports Network. The Conference will once again have seven games on the ESPN Family of Networks, including four regular season games as well as the OVC Tournament semifinals and championship game. The OVC will also have a seven-game package on CBS Sports Network, up from just four games on the network a season ago. The 14-game package ensures that every member institution is on national television at least once this year. In addition the OVC will produce five games that will air in select markets on the new American Sports Network.

**Recent Postseason Success:** Last year the OVC had four men's basketball teams selected for postseason play (1 NCAA, 1 NIT, 1 CIT, 1 CBI) which matched an all-time high for a single season, tying the mark set in 2011. Overall OVC teams were 7-3 in postseason play in 2014; the seven total wins were the most for the OVC in one postseason (topping four wins in the 1971 season). With wins by Belmont (who advanced to the NIT Quarterfinals) and Murray State (who won the CIT Championship), OVC teams have now at least won at least one game in postseason play for six-straight years (the longest stretch in league history). Also included in that mark are wins in four of the past six NCAA Tournaments.

**Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History; Byrd Ranks 7th Among Active NCAA Coaches:** With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 25th year at Austin Peay. Loos now has 390 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 472 for his career. Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** (who is in his third year in the OVC) has 705 career victories, which ranks seventh among active Division I head coaches. Loos and Byrd are two of just six active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years (the others are Syracuse's Jim Boeheim, Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, Oakland's Greg Kampe and Davidson's Bob McKillop).

**OVC Tournament Once Again at Municipal Auditorium:** The 2015 OVC Tournament will be once again be played at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. (March 4-7). It marks the fifth-straight year the tournament has been at the venue and the 10th time the combined men's and women's tournaments have been held at the venue (1994, 1995, 1996, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014); the men's tournament was also held there in 1967 and 1989. The OVC recently signed an extension with Municipal Auditorium to hold the tournament there through 2017. Beginning in 2011 the Championship switched to a format where the top eight men's and women's teams play in the merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds received two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds received one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round included the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. That format remains the same for the men's team, although the women's teams have switched back to a traditional bracket (1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc.) bracket this season. As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements included upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium.

**OVC Men's Hoops in Third Year of Divisional Play:** For the third year the OVC will use divisional play for men's basketball (the OVC women's teams are not using divisional play this year). The addition of Belmont University on July 1, 2012 gave the OVC 12 member institutions, the largest the Conference has been since it was formed in 1948 (the OVC is currently the nation's eighth-oldest Division I conference). The East Division includes Belmont, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech. The West Division includes Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri State, SIUE and UT Martin.

**Former OVC Players in the NBA:** There are currently four former OVC players on NBA rosters. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his fourth season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. Faried was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team in 2012 and helped lead Team USA to a Gold Medal in the World Cup of Basketball this past summer. Former Murray State All-American **Isaiah Canaan** is in his second year with the Houston Rockets after being drafted in the second round by the club. Former Belmont All-American **Ian Clark** signed a free agent deal with the Utah Jazz after doing undrafted and has a guaranteed deal with the Jazz this season. Former Tennessee State star **Robert Covington** was cut by Houston after spending last year with the team, but signed a free agent contract with the Philadelphia 76ers right after the season began. Three other former OVC players are currently playing in the NBDL: Travis Betran (Austin Peay) with the Erie BayHawks, Kevin Murphy (Tennessee Tech) with the Idaho Stampede and Walker Russell (Jacksonville State) with the Westchester Knicks.

**The 2014-15 Season:** The 2014-15 season marks the 67th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 66 years, 13 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

**Murray State's Payne Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year:** The 2014-15 OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Murray State sophomore guard **Cameron Payne** who was named the OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Payne is the first sophomore to be named Preseason Player of the Year since the award was first handed out in 1993-94. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Murray State having the most selections (3) and Belmont (2) also having multiple picks. Payne was named both a first-team All-OVC selection and OVC Freshman of the Year after averaging 16.8 points, 5.4 assists, 3.6 rebounds and 1.7 steals/game and leading Murray State to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) Championship (where he was named MVP). In addition to Payne the other players named to the All-OVC Team last year and appearing on the preseason team this season are Southeast Missouri State senior guard **Jarekious Bradley**, Belmont junior guard **Craig Bradshaw**, Morehead State senior guard **Angelo Warner** and Murray State senior forward **Jarvis Williams**. The Preseason All-OVC Team was rounded out by Belmont senior guard **Reece Chamberlain**, Austin Peay junior center **Chris Horton**, Murray State senior guard **T.J. Sapp**, UT Martin senior forward **Myles Taylor** and Eastern Kentucky senior guard **Corey Walden**, who was the 2013-14 OVC Defensive Player of the Year.

**Murray State Picked as OVC Preseason Favorite:** In a vote of OVC head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors Murray State has was picked the preseason favorite for the 2014-15 season. Murray State, who has won a league-best 23 OVC regular season championships, picked up 15 of 24 first-place votes in being picked the overall regular season champion. The Racers were also tabbed the West Division favorites, picking up 22 of 24 first-place votes in that category, while two-time defending regular season champion Belmont was picked the East Division favorites. In the overall champion voting, in addition to Murray State picking up 15 first-place votes other teams with first-place votes included Belmont (7), Eastern Kentucky (1) and Morehead State (1). Since Murray State was picked as the overall champion, they were also an overwhelming favorite to take first place in its own division; the Racers have finished first in the West in each of the first two years of divisional play. MSU received 132 total points to top the West and were followed by Southeast Missouri (who picked up the other 2 first-place votes and 109 points), SIUE (77), Austin Peay (70), Eastern Illinois (64) and UT Martin (40). Belmont picked up 16 of the 24 first-place votes and 125 points in being picked the East Division favorite while Morehead State (103) and Eastern Kentucky (102) each picked up four first-place votes. The East was rounded out by Tennessee Tech (71), Jacksonville State (52) and Tennessee State (40).

**Westwood One Sports to Broadcast OVC Championship Game:** For the sixth consecutive season, the OVC Men's Basketball Championship game will be broadcast by the Westwood One Sports radio network, the largest provider of audio content in America. Westwood One Sports is the largest independent national audio media company in the U.S., delivering compelling, engaging, and fully-integrated audio content to over 8,200+ radio stations and digital media companies. **OVC Digital Network:** The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the eighth year the OVC has streamed live events, but the second year the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format and will feature improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans will also find it easier to log onto [OVCDigitalNetwork.com](http://OVCDigitalNetwork.com) and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

#### Team Notes

Austin Peay dropped contest to Eastern Illinois and UT Martin last week and have now lost six games in a row...Although not officially eliminated from contention, the Governors need to win its final four contests of the year and get some help to make the eight-team OVC Tournament field for the first time since 2012... Freshman Josh Robinson averaged 14.5 points, 1.5 rebounds, 1.0 assists and 1.0 steals/game last week while hitting 44 percent (11-of-25) from the field and 45.5 percent (5-of-11) from 3-point range; Robinson came off the bench to score a game-high 21 points against UT Martin, marking his second 20-point outing of the season...Robinson hit 4-of-8 3-pointers against the Skyhawks; Robinson is averaging 9.8 points/game which is tops among freshmen in the OVC...Chris Horton had 10 points and 15 rebounds against UTM, marking his 15th double-double of the season which is now tied for first place in the OVC; Horton also became the 33rd member of the APSU 1,000-Point Club and just the seventh player in school history with 1,000 career points and 750 career rebounds... 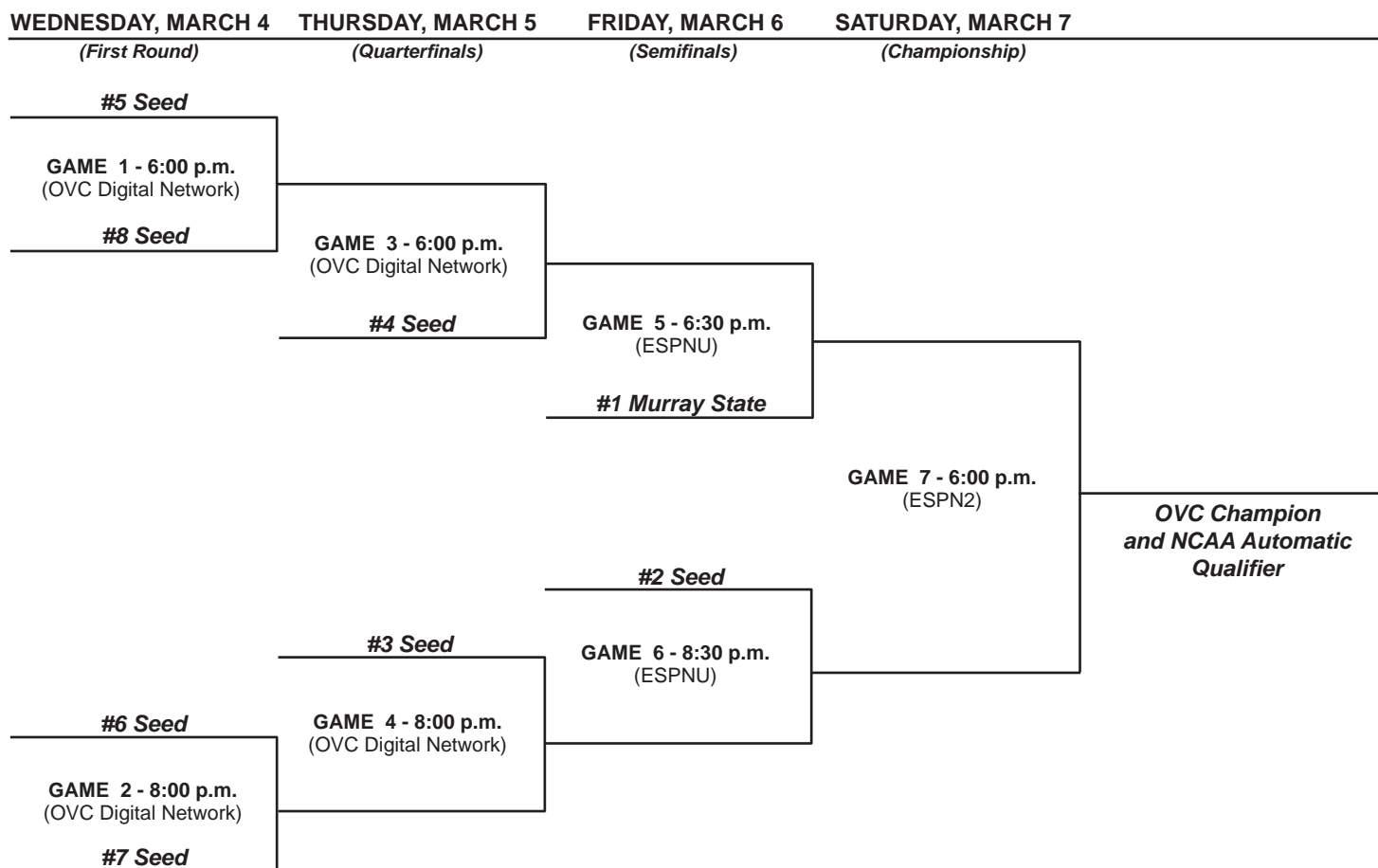
