## THIS WEEK'S adidas® OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



### PLAYER

#### **Craig Bradshaw, G • Jr., 6-3, 210 • Ridgetop, Tenn. • Belmont**

Bradshaw averaged 21.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.5 steals/game while hitting 52 percent (13-of-25) from the field and 85.7 percent (12-of-14) from the free throw line in a pair of Belmont victories. In the victory over Eastern Kentucky, the junior had a game-high 25 points on 8-of-15 shooting (3-of-7 3-pointers, 6-of-6 free throws) while also adding 10 rebounds, three assists and two steals. Bradshaw had a clutch basket with 18 seconds remaining that extended the Bruins advantage to three points. Two days later he had a team-high 17 points, three assists, two rebounds and a steal as Belmont shot 65 percent as a team to top Tennessee Tech on the road. Bradshaw currently ranks third in the OVC in scoring (17.7 points/game).

### NEWCOMER

#### **Alex Anderson, G • Jr., 5-11, 180 • Memphis, Tenn. • UT Martin**

Anderson, the transfer from Itawamba Community College, played all 85 minutes in two UT Martin games last week and averaged 15.5 points, 3.5 rebounds and 3.5 assists/game while hitting 55 percent (11-of-20) from the field and 60 percent (9-of-15) from 3-point range. In the Skyhawks overtime win at Eastern Illinois, Anderson hit 4-of-7 3-pointers on his way to 14 points while also adding five rebounds and two assists. He capped the week with 17 points on 5-of-8 3-point shooting while also adding five assists, two rebounds and a steal in a loss at SIUE. Anderson is the fourth different UTM player to win the Newcomer of the Week Award this season, making the Skyhawks one of just two OVC teams to accomplish that feat in a season since the award started in 1985-86 (MTSU in 1999-00 was the other).

### FRESHMAN

#### **Cornell Johnston, G • Fr., 5-7, 150 • St. Louis, Mo. • Eastern Illinois**

Johnston, who leads the OVC in 3-point percentage (51.8%), averaged 13.5 points, 5.0 assists and 2.5 rebounds/game while hitting 81.8 percent (9-of-11) from the field and 87.5 percent (7-of-8) from 3-point range in a pair of games. To start the week against UT Martin, Johnston hit 5-of-6 3-pointers on his way to 15 minutes; in that overtime contest the guard played all 45 minutes and also dished out six assists without a turnover. He capped the week by playing all 40 minutes in a come-from-behind victory over Southeast Missouri. In that contest Johnston hit 4-of-5 field goals (2-of-2 3-pointers), dished out four assists and had two rebounds. During the week he moved into 10th place on the EIU single-season assist list (122).

## NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

**OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights:** Murray State is now 14-0 in OVC play and has already clinched its 24th overall OVC Regular Season Championship...MSU is now just two wins away from completing a perfect OVC season and would become just the fifth team to accomplish that feat (and first since Austin Peay in 2003-04)...The Racers have now won 22 games in a row, tied for the second-longest winning streak in OVC history; the streak is the second-longest active streak nationally (behind only Kentucky)...Belmont sophomore Evan Bradds enters this week leading all Division I players in field goal percentage (71.4%); that is just above of the OVC's single-season record (70.0%)...Entering this week Murray State (70) is the highest ranked OVC team in the NCAA's RPI and in the KenPom rankings (No. 73)...Murray State enters the week with 10 true road victories tied for the second-most nationally and ranking only behind the 11 victories by Gonzaga and Albany...Murray State is now unofficially No. 28 in both the Associated Press Top 25 (42 total points) and the USA Today Coaches Poll (23 total points).

**OVC Tournament Field Takes Shape:** Entering the final week of the regular season seven teams have clinched a spot in the eight-team OVC Tournament field while two teams are competing for the final spot. Belmont, Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Morehead State, Murray State, SIUE and UT Martin have locked up spots while Southeast Missouri can claim a spot with a victory over a loss by Jacksonville State (JSU is in the field with two wins and a Southeast Missouri loss). Murray State has locked up the No. 1 seed and a double bye to the OVC Tournament semifinals while either Eastern Kentucky or Belmont will earn the No. 2 seed (EKU grabs that with a sweep of its three games this week).

**OVC Tournament Seeding FAQ:** The seeding for the OVC Tournament will see the winner of the East and West Divisions garnering the No. 1 and No. 2 overall seeds with the division winner with the best OVC winning percentage (Murray State) taking the No. 1 seed. As has been the case in the last four OVC Tournaments, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds receive double byes to the semifinals under the merit-based format. Seeding for the remainder of the tournament field (No. 3-8) will be based on conference winning percentage of the remaining teams regardless of divisions. Seeds No. 3 and No. 4 will receive a single bye to the quarterfinals while seeds No. 5/8 and No. 6/7 will square off in the first round. Overall the OVC will crown an OVC regular season champion, but not award trophies for finishing first place in each division.

**Murray State Claims 24th OVC Regular Season Championship:** With two games still left to be played Murray State has already locked up its 24th OVC Championship with a 14-0 record. It is the first overall regular season crown for the team since 2012. MSU has also won crowns in 1951, 1964, 1968, 1969, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2006, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2015.

**Murray State Two Wins Away From Becoming Fifth OVC Team to Complete Perfect Conference Season:** Entering the week at 14-0, Murray State is just two victories away from completing a perfect regular season and becoming only the fifth team in OVC history to accomplish that feat. The other teams with perfect OVC records in 67 years of OVC play are Western Kentucky teams in 1949-50 (8-0), 1965-66 (14-0) and 1969-70 (14-0) and the 2003-04 Austin Peay team (16-0).

**Overall Winning Streaks:** As of Monday Murray State has won 22-straight games which is the second-longest active streak nationally.

**Longest Winning Streaks in OVC History:** After setting the OVC record for longest winning streak during the 2011-12 season, Murray State has put together another long winning streak this season, reeling off 22-straight wins. They are one of eight teams all-time in OVC history to have a winning streak of 15 games or longer.

**Road Warriors:** As of Monday Murray State has a 10-1 record in true road games. The 10 overall road wins are tied for the second-most nationally with Hofstra, Iona, Rider, UMES and Yale and trailing only Gonzaga and Albany (11 wins apiece). Only two teams (Kentucky and Virginia) have fewer road losses than Murray State this season.

**Murray State Receiving Top 25 Votes:** For the fourth-straight week Murray State is receiving votes in the Associated Press Top 25 poll and for the third-straight week in the USA Today Coaches Poll. The Racers are up from 38 to 42 points in the AP Poll and are now unofficially 28th nationally. In the Coaches Poll Murray State went from 10 to 23 points and are now unofficially 28th. Murray State is the last OVC team to be ranked in the Top 25, climbing as high as No. 9 during the 2011-12 season (that was the first time an OVC team had been ranked in the Top 10 since 1970-71).

**700 Club:** Belmont head coach Rick Byrd became just the seventh active Division I head coach to reach the 700 win plateau on January 17 when his team won at Austin Peay. With the 700 victories Byrd joins an elite group that also includes Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim, Bob Huggins, Roy Williams, Bo Ryan and Rick Pitino (Youngstown State's Jerry Sloum needs just one more win entering this week to become the eighth active member). All-time the now 707 career wins rank Byrd 25th in NCAA Division I history.

**NCAA Stats Leaders:** Entering this week in the latest NCAA statistical leaders (Feb. 23), Eastern Kentucky ranks second nationally in turnover margin (+7.8/game), fourth in free throw percentage (77.4%), fifth in steals (9.8/game) and 15th in 3-pointers made/game (9.5). Murray State ranks ninth in field goal percentage (48.8%), 12th in scoring offense (79.5 points/game), 16th in scoring margin (+12.4 points/game), 18th in assists (15.8/game) and 22nd in 3-point percentage (39.5%). Belmont ranks sixth in 3-pointers made/game (9.5) while UT Martin is 16th in fewest fouls/game (15.4). Individually Belmont's **Evan Bradds** is first in field goal percentage (71.4%) while teammate **Reece Chamberlain** is 3rd in assists (5.7/game). Tennessee Tech's **Charles Jackson** is fifth nationally in double-doubles (16), 19th in field goal percentage (58.2%) and 31st in rebounding (9.3/game). Murray State's **Cameron Payne** is 18th in scoring (19.7 points/game), 20th in assists (5.8/game) and 32nd in steals (2.0/game). Eastern Kentucky's **Corey Walden** is third in steals (2.92/game) and 33rd in scoring (18.7 points/game) while teammate **Eric Stutz** is seventh in field goal percentage (61.3%). Austin Peay's **Chris Horton** is eighth in double-doubles (15), sixth in rebounding (11.0/game) and 36th in blocked shots (2.33/game). Southeast Missouri's **Jarekious Bradley** is 18th nationally in free throw percentage (87.5%).

## 2015 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2015 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 4-7 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tennessee. The tournament features eight men's and eight women's teams with the men's teams playing a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals and the women's team playing a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. bracket.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on the OVC Digital Network. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 6 at 6:30 and 8:30 p.m. and televised on ESPN2. The championship game on Saturday, March 7 is at 6 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 6 (ESPN3) and the women's championship game is on March 7 at 1:00 p.m. CT (ESPN3).

This marks the 21st time in 22 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

**CREDENTIALS.** For the sixth year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **The deadline to request credentials is MONDAY, MARCH 2 at 3 p.m.** No credentials will be mailed; they can be picked up at Media Will-Call, located at the back entrance of the arena (at the intersection of 5th Ave. North and Gay Street).

It is the second-largest victory over a Top 25 team by an OVC team, trailing only a 31-point win by Western Kentucky over No. 15 St. Bonaventure on January 3, 1953 (94-63 at a neutral site in Oklahoma City). **Colleg Insider.com Mid-Major Poll:** In the latest Colleg Insider.com Mid-Major Poll (Feb. 16 - the Feb. 23 poll was not yet released), Murray State is ranked fourth while Eastern Kentucky, Belmont and UT Martin were among the others receiving votes. Gonzaga picked up all 31 first-place votes to be ranked No. 1. Now in its 16th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, WAC and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

**Belmont's Bradshaw Named CoSIDA Academic All-District:** Belmont junior **Craig Bradshaw** has been named to the Capital One Academic All-District® men's basketball first-team as selected by CoSIDA. For appearing on the first-team Bradshaw will now go on the national ballot for consideration for Academic All-American. In the classroom, Bradshaw holds a 3.51 grade-point average in his chosen major of Public Relations. To be eligible for Academic All-America® consideration, a student-athlete must be a varsity starter or key reserve, maintain a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.30 on a scale of 4.00, have reached sophomore athletic and academic standings at his/her current institution and be nominated by his/her sports information director.

**Belmont's Chamberlain Named Candidate for Senior CLASS Award:** Belmont senior **Reece Chamberlain** is one of 30 Division I men's basketball players selected as candidates for the 2014-15 Senior CLASS Award®. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. The complete list of candidates follows this release. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. The candidate classes will be narrowed to 10 finalists later in the regular season, and those 10 names will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one male candidate and one female candidate who best exemplify excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition. The Senior CLASS Award winner will be announced during the 2015 NCAA Men's Final Four®.

**UTM's Smith Among Rare Company With Stat-Filled Game:** UT Martin senior guard **Deville Smith** put himself in rare company with his performance at Illinois-Chicago on December 15. Smith had 26 points, 7 assists, 6 rebounds, 5 blocks and 3 steals in the overtime victory over the Flames. He is the first Division I player to have a 25-point, 5-assist, 5-rebound, 5-block and 3-steal performance against a fellow Division I team since Minnesota's Joel Przybilla against Iowa in 1999-00 (Przybilla had 28 points, 18 rebounds, 7 blocks, 5 assists and 3 steals).

**Horton Records 10th Triple-Double in OVC History:** Austin Peay junior **Chris Horton** recorded just the 10th triple-double in OVC history on Nov. 16 when he had 15 points, 13 rebounds and 10 blocks against Berea College. It was the first triple-double in the OVC since the 2008-09 season and he was only the second player to ever do it with blocked shots. Below are a list of all-time OVC triple-doubles.

**Bradshaw Nets 42 Points, One of Six 40-Plus Point Efforts By an OVC Player in Last 11 Years:** When Belmont junior **Craig Bradshaw** scored 42 points at Ohio on Nov. 29, it was one of just six 40-plus point efforts by an OVC player over the last 11 years (back through the 2004-05 season). It was the most points by a Belmont player in the program's Division I era and the third-most points by a Division I player this season. **Payne Named Lou Henson Mid-Major Player of the Week by Colleg Insider.com (Dec. 15):** Murray State sophomore **Cameron Payne** was named the Lou Henson Mid-Major Player of the Week by Colleg Insider.com on Dec. 15 following his play at Evansville. Payne scored a career-high 32 points as Murray State won 81-79; the sophomore hit 10-of-19 field goals attempts, 4-of-7 3-pointers and 8-of-12 free throws while also adding eight assists, five rebounds and two steals in 35 minutes of action. Payne scored 20 of his 32 points in the first half as MSU built a 42-38 halftime advantage.

**Bradshaw Named National Player of the Week by NBCSports.com (Dec. 1):** Belmont's **Craig Bradshaw** was named the National Player of the Week by NBCSports.com/CollegeBasketballTalk following his play in three games that saw him average 33.0 points, 3.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.0 steals/game while hitting 58.2 percent (32-of-55) from the field, 58.6 percent (17-of-29) from 3-point range and 75 percent (18-of-24) from the free throw line in three Belmont victories. After scoring 29 and 28 points in games to open the week he hit 8-of-12 3-pointers on his way to a Belmont Division I scoring record of 42 points at Ohio; in that game he also raced the length of the court and hit the game-winning basket to lift his team to a 83-81 victory.

**Payne Named to Cousy Award Watch List:** Murray State's **Cameron Payne** has been named to the watch list of candidates for the 2015 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award. The annual honor, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes the top point guards in men's college basketball. The Watch List included 35 players right now and will be narrowed to 20 in early February, then the final five by early March. The winner will be honored on Monday of Final Four weekend in Indianapolis.

**Two OVC Players On Midseason Lou Henson Award Watch List:** Two OVC men's basketball players have been named to the midseason Lou Henson Award Watch list by CollegeInsider.com. The Lou Henson Award is presented annually to the Division I "Mid-Major" Player of the Year. The OVC selections included Murray State sophomore guard **Cameron Payne** and Eastern Kentucky senior guard **Corey Walden**. The group are among 40 players nationally nominated for the award. The award is named in honor of Henson who retired after a spectacular coaching career that lasted 41 years. The 2015 recipient will be announced at the CollegeInsider.com Awards Banquet on April 3 in Indianapolis, site of the 2015 men's NCAA Basketball Championship.

**OVC to Produce 14-Game National Television Package:** The OVC will produce the largest national television package in its history in 2014-15 as 14 Conference games will air on either the ESPN Family of Networks or the CBS Sports Network. The Conference will once again have seven games on the ESPN Family of Networks, including four regular season games as well as the OVC Tournament semifinals and championship game. The OVC will also have a seven-game package on CBS Sports Network, up from just four games on the network a season ago. The 14-game package ensures that every member institution is on national television at least once this year. In addition the OVC will produce five games that will air in select markets on the new American Sports Network.

**Recent Postseason Success:** Last year the OVC had four men's basketball teams selected for postseason play (1 NCAA, 1 NIT, 1 CIT, 1 CBI) which matched an all-time high for a single season, tying the mark set in 2011. Overall OVC teams were 7-3 in postseason play in 2014; the seven total wins were the most for the OVC in one post-season (topping four wins in the 1971 season). With wins by Belmont (who advanced to the NIT Quarterfinals) and Murray State (who won the CIT Championship), OVC teams have now at least won one game in postseason play for six-straight years (the longest stretch in league history). Also included in that mark are wins in four of the past six NCAA Tournaments.

**Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History; Byrd Ranks 7th Among Active NCAA Coaches:** With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 25th year at Austin Peay. Loos now has 390 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 472 for his career. Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** (who is in his third year in the OVC) has 707 career victories, which ranks seventh among active Division I head coaches. Loos and Byrd are two of just six active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years (the others are Syracuse's Jim Boeheim, Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, Oakland's Greg Kampe and Davidson's Bob McKillop).

**OVC Tournament Once Again at Municipal Auditorium:** The 2015 OVC Tournament will be once again be played at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. (March 4-7). It marks the fifth-straight year the tournament has been at the venue and the 10th time the combined men's and women's tournaments have been held at the venue (1994, 1995, 1996, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014); the men's tournament was also held there in 1967 and 1989. The OVC recently signed an extension with Municipal Auditorium to hold the tournament there through 2017. Beginning in 2011 the Championship switched to a format where the top eight men's and women's teams play in the merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds received two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds received one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round included the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. That format remains the same for the men's team, although the women's teams have switched back to a traditional bracket (1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc.) bracket this season. As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements included upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium.

**OVC Men's Hoops in Third Year of Divisional Play:** For the third year the OVC will use divisional play for men's basketball (the OVC women's teams are not using divisional play this year). The addition of Belmont University on July 1, 2012 gave the OVC 12 member institutions, the largest the Conference has been since it was formed in 1948 (the OVC is currently the nation's eighth-oldest Division I conference). The East Division includes Belmont, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech. The West Division includes Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri State, SIUE and UT Martin.

**Former OVC Players in the NBA:** There are currently four former OVC players on NBA rosters. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his fourth season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. Faried was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team in 2012 and helped lead Team USA to a Gold Medal in the World Cup of Basketball this past summer. Former Murray State All-American **Isaiah Canaan** was drafted by the Houston Rockets and played with the team last year and the first half of this season before being traded to the Philadelphia 76ers. Former Belmont All-American **Ian Clark** signed a free agent deal with the Utah Jazz after doing undrafted and has a guaranteed deal with the Jazz this season. Former Tennessee State star **Robert Covington** was cut by Houston after spending last year with the team, but signed a free agent contract with the Philadelphia 76ers right after the season began. Three other former OVC players are currently playing in the NBDL: Travis Betran (Austin Peay) with the Erie BayHawks, Kevin Murphy (Tennessee Tech) with the Idaho Stampede and Walker Russell (Jacksonville State) with the Westchester Knicks.

**The 2014-15 Season:** The 2014-15 season marks the 67th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 66 years, 13 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

**Murray State's Payne Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year:** The 2014-15 OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Murray State sophomore guard **Cameron Payne** who was named the OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Payne is the first sophomore to be named Preseason Player of the Year since the award was first handed out in 1993-94. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Murray State having the most selections (3) and Belmont (2) also having multiple picks. Payne was named both a first-team All-OVC selection and OVC Freshman of the Year after averaging 16.8 points, 5.4 assists, 3.6 rebounds and 1.7 steals/game and leading Murray State to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) Championship (where he was named MVP). In addition to Payne the other players named to the All-OVC Team last year and appearing on the preseason team this season are Southeast Missouri State senior guard **Jarekious Bradley**, Belmont junior guard **Craig Bradshaw**, Morehead State senior guard **Angelo Warner** and Murray State senior forward **Jarvis Williams**. The Preseason All-OVC Team was rounded out by Belmont senior guard **Reece Chamberlain**, Austin Peay junior center **Chris Horton**, Murray State senior guard **T.J. Sapp**, UT Martin senior forward **Myles Taylor** and Eastern Kentucky senior guard **Corey Walden**, who was the 2013-14 OVC Defensive Player of the Year.

**Murray State Picked as OVC Preseason Favorite:** In a vote of OVC head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors Murray State has was picked the preseason favorite for the 2014-15 season. Murray State, who has won a league-best 23 OVC regular season championships, picked up 15 of 24 first-place votes in being picked the overall regular season champion. The Racers were also tabbed the West Division favorites, picking up 22 of 24 first-place votes in that category, while two-time defending regular season champion Belmont was picked the East Division favorites. In the overall champion voting, in addition to Murray State picking up 15 first-place votes other teams with first-place votes included Belmont (7), Eastern Kentucky (1) and Morehead State (1). Since Murray State was picked as the overall champion, they were also an overwhelming favorite to take first place in its own division; the Racers have finished first in the West in each of the first two years of divisional play. MSU received 132 total points to top the West and were followed by Southeast Missouri (who picked up the other 2 first-place votes and 109 points), SIUE (77), Austin Peay (70), Eastern Illinois (64) and UT Martin (40). Belmont picked up 16 of the 24 first-place votes and 125 points in being picked the East Division favorite while Morehead State (103) and Eastern Kentucky (102) each picked up four first-place votes. The East was rounded out by Tennessee Tech (71), Jacksonville State (52) and Tennessee State (40).

**Westwood One Sports to Broadcast OVC Championship Game:** For the sixth consecutive season, the OVC Men's Basketball Championship game will be broadcast by the Westwood One Sports radio network, the largest provider of audio content in America. Westwood One Sports is the largest independent national audio media company in the U.S., delivering compelling, engaging, and fully-integrated audio content to over 8,200+ radio stations and digital media companies. Westwood One's powerful portfolio of iconic media, sports and entertainment brands, combined with some of the most recognized live events in the world, provide strong and unique brand engagement to over 225 million consumers each week.

**OVC Digital Network:** The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the eighth year the OVC has streamed live events, but the second year the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format and will feature improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans will also find it easier to log onto [OVCDigitalNetwork.com](http://OVCDigitalNetwork.com) and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.

#### Team Notes

#### Team Notes

### MURRAY STATE RACERS (24-4, 14-0)

#### Team Notes

Murray State topped Austin Peay in its lone game of last week to increase its winning streak to 22 games, the second-longest streak in OVC history (just one game behind the record 23-straight wins accomplished by the 2011-12 MSU team) and the second-longest streak nationally...The Racers continue to inch towards cracking the Top 25 polls and are now unofficially 28th in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Polls; MSU was the last OVC team to crack the Top 25, doing so in the 2011-12 season...Head coach Steve Prohm now has 99 wins in his four-year career at Murray State and is set to become the quickest coach in storied program history to 100 wins...Cameron Payne had 22 points, eight assists and three steals in the win over Austin Peay; he now ranks 28th in MSU career scoring history...The Racers rank first in the OVC in scoring (79.5 points/game), field goal percentage (48.8%), 3-point percentage (39.5%), field goal percentage defense (40.5%), assists (15.8/game), scoring margin (+12.4/game) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.3)...The Racers close out the regular season by hosting Eastern Illinois on Thursday and traveling to UT Martin on Saturday...If MSU wins both games it would become just the fifth team in OVC history to go through the OVC season undefeated (and first since APSU in 2003-04)...The team has already locked up its 24th OVC Regular Season Championship, the No. 1 seed for the OVC Tournament and a double bye to the semifinal round.

The team has also clinched a winning record, only the fourth time that has happened in the program's 23-year Division I history...The Skyhawks opened last week by earning its eighth road victory of the season, a 75-73 overtime victory at Eastern Illinois...The eight road victories this season are the most since the team won nine with future NBA player Lester Hudson in 2008-09; prior to this season UTM had only won seven combined road games over the past three seasons...Twymond Howard had 14 points and a season-high 13 rebounds at EIU including an offensive rebound and bucket that proved to be the game-winner in overtime...Marshun Newell averaged 18.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 2.5 assists/game last week including a career-high 24 points in the win at EIU; in that game he played all 45 minutes and scored the Skyhawks final seven points of regulation to help force overtime...Alex Anderson became the fourth different UTM player named OVC Newcomer of the Week this season, making UTM one of two schools in OVC history (MTSU in 1999-00 being the other) to have four different players win the award in the same season (the Newcomer Award began in 1985-86)...The Skyhawks rank second in the OVC in 3-point percentage (39.0%) and third in field goal percentage (47.1%), scoring defense (64.7 points/game), scoring margin (+5.3 points/game) and assist-to-turnover ratio (1.1)...UT Martin will close out the regular season with a road game at Tennessee State on Thursday and a home contest with OVC Champion Murray State on Saturday.
