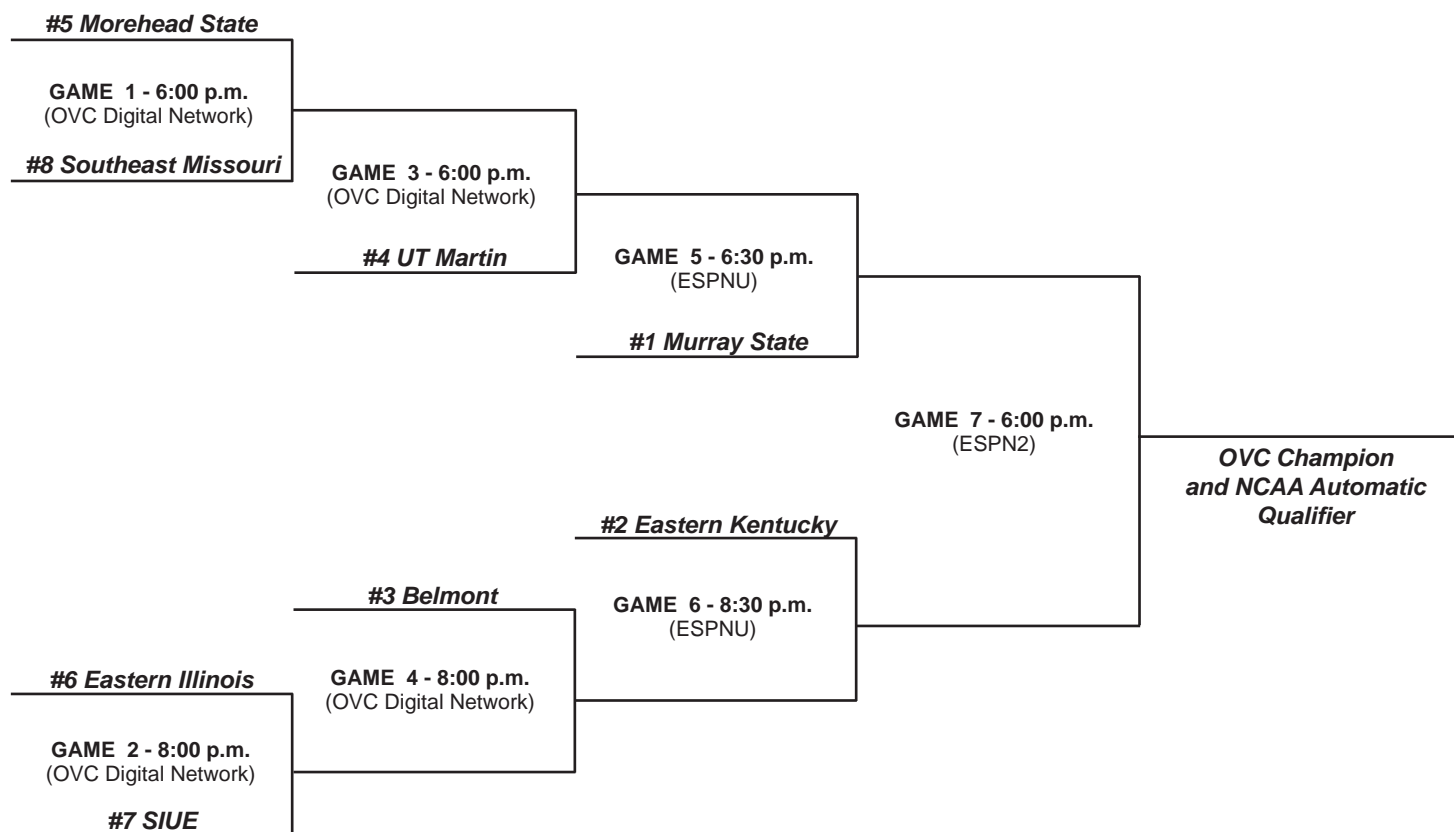

## THIS WEEK'S adidas® OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK



### CO-PLAYER

#### Corey Walden, G • Sr., 6-2, 189 • Daytona Beach, Fla. • Eastern Kentucky

With his team needing three wins in six days to win the OVC East and earn the No. 2 seed for the OVC Tournament, Walden averaged 17.7 points, 3.7 rebounds, 3.7 steals and 1.0 assists/game while hitting 63 percent (17-of-24) from the field and 86.4 percent (19-of-22) from the free throw line in helping the Colonels accomplish that feat. While being limited to just 17 minutes at Austin Peay due to a lingering injury, Walden scored 15 points, grabbed eight rebounds and had four steals in a win over Jacksonville State last Thursday. He capped the week with a huge game against Tennessee Tech, helping the Colonels overcome the Golden Eagles in a three-point victory. Walden finished that game with a career-high 35 pointers on 11-of-14 shooting (and 13-of-15 free throws) and five steals. The senior had a layup, key rebound and sank two free throws in the final 25 seconds to secure the victory. With his 11 steals during the week he tied the EKV career record and move into the OVC Top 10 lists for both steals in a season (84) and career (221). Walden currently ranks first in the OVC in steals (3.0/game), second in scoring (18.6 points/game), second in free throw percentage (81.8%), sixth in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.6), sixth in minutes played (34.2/game), seventh in field goal percentage (54.1%) and seventh in assists (3.6/game).

### CO-PLAYER

#### Cameron Payne, G • So., 6-2, 180 • Memphis, Tenn. • Murray State

Payne averaged 26.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 5.5 assists and 1.5 steals/game in a pair of Murray State victories as the Racers wrapped-up just the with undefeated Conference record in league history (16-0) while also running its overall winning streak to an OVC record 24 games. Payne started the week with 22 points, five assists (against only one turnover), four rebounds and two steals in a home court victory over Eastern Illinois. He capped the week with 31 points, eight rebounds, six assists, one steal and one block in 38 minutes of action at UT Martin. In that game he connected on 12-of-24 field goals (4-of-9 3-pointers) in 38 minutes of play. Payne currently leads the OVC in scoring (20.2 points/game) and assist-to-turnover ratio (2.4), ranks second in assists (5.7/game), third in steals (2.0/game), fifth in 3-pointers made/game (2.2) and seventh in free throw shooting (78.9%).

### NEWCOMER

#### Twymond Howard, F • Jr., 6-6, 210 • Pearl, Miss. • UT Martin

Howard, the transfer from Southwest Mississippi Community College, averaged 18.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 1.5 assists and 1.0 steals/game while hitting 56.5 percent (13-of-23) from the field and 88.9 percent (8-of-9) at the free throw line in a pair of games. In a victory at Tennessee State he played all 40 minutes and finished the game with 19 points (on 8-of-13 shooting), seven rebounds, two assists and a block as the Skyhawks won and clinched a first round bye for the OVC Tournament. He capped the week with 17 points (on 5-of-10 shooting), five rebounds, two steals and an assist in a close home loss to OVC Champion Murray State. Howard ranks eighth in the OVC in rebounding (6.4/game) and 12th in scoring (13.2 points/game).

### FRESHMAN

#### Aleksa Jugovic, G • Fr., 6-3, 185 • Leskovac, Serbia • Tennessee Tech

Jugovic averaged 14.0 points, 4.0 assists, 1.5 rebounds and 1.0 steals/game while hitting 63.6 percent (7-of-11) from the field, 66.7 percent (6-of-9) from 3-point range and 80 percent (8-of-10) from the free throw line in a pair of road games. In a game at Morehead State, the freshman scored a season-high 18 points in knocking down 3-of-4 3-pointers and making 7-of-8 free throws. Jugovic also added four assists in 27 minutes off the bench. After that performance he earned just his third start of the season at Eastern Kentucky two days later. Against the Colonels Jugovic hit 3-of-5 3-pointers in scoring 10 points; he also added four assists, three rebounds and two steals.

## NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

**OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights:** Murray State became just the fifth OVC men's basketball team (and first since 2003-04) to complete an undefeated Conference season with a pair of wins last week to finish 16-0...Overall the Racers claimed its 24th OVC Regular Season Championship and will be the No. 1 seed for the OVC Tournament...The Racers have now won 24 games in a row, which is the longest winning streak in OVC history and second-longest streak in the nation (behind only undefeated Kentucky)...After receiving votes the past four weeks Murray State finally broke into the national Top 25 polls on Monday, becoming the first OVC team to be ranked in the Top 25 polls since the 2011-12 Racers team reached as high as No. 9 nationally; the Racers are No. 24 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 25 in the Associated Press Poll...Defending OVC Tournament Champion Eastern Kentucky enters the event as the No. 2 overall seed and is looking to become the first team to repeat as tournament champions since Murray State won three-in-a-row from 1997-99...The No. 3 and 4 seeds for the OVC Tournament are Belmont and UT Martin who each receive byes to the quarterfinals...The first round matchups include No. 5 Morehead State/No. 8 Southeast Missouri and No. 6 Eastern Illinois and No. 7 SIUE...Belmont sophomore Evan Bradds enters this week leading all Division I players in field goal percentage (70.4%); that is just above of the OVC's single-season record (70.0%)...EKU's Corey Walden is now eighth in OVC career history for steals (221) and ninth in single-season history (84) in that category...Entering this week Murray State (65) is the highest ranked OVC team in the NCAA's RPI and in the KenPom rankings (No. 73)...Both the OVC men's (Murray State) and women's (UT Martin) champions were a perfect 16-0 in Conference play this season, making the OVC the only Conference nationally to accomplish that feat in 2014-15.

**2015 All-OVC Teams Announced on Tuesday:** The announcement of the 2015 All-OVC Men's Basketball Teams along with the Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year, Freshman of the Year and Coach of the Year awards will be announced on Tuesday, March 3. The announcement will come first via Twitter (@OVCsports), between Noon and 1 p.m. CT. A formal press release and posting on OVCsports.com will come after 1 p.m.

**Murray State Ranked in Both Top 25 Polls:** After receiving votes for four weeks, Murray State finally broke into both major Top 25 polls on March 2, coming in at No. 24 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 25 in the Associated Press Poll. Murray State is the last OVC team to be ranked in the Top 25, climbing as high as No. 9 during the 2011-12 season (that was the first time an OVC team had been ranked in the Top 10 since 1970-71). The Racers were ranked for the final 15 weeks of the 2011-12 season and finished the year ranked No.12 in the AP Poll and No. 12 in the AP poll and No. 16 in the USA Today poll.

**Murray State Claims 24th OVC Regular Season Championship:** Murray State won its 24th OVC Championship with a perfect 16-0 record this season. It is the first overall regular season crown for the team since 2012. MSU has also won crowns in 1951, 1964, 1968, 1969, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2006, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2015.

**Murray State Becomes Fifth OVC Men's Team to Complete Perfect Conference Season:** Murray State completed a perfect 16-0 regular season and became only the fifth team in OVC history to accomplish that feat. The other teams with perfect OVC records in 67 years of OVC play are Western Kentucky teams in 1949-50 (8-0), 1965-66 (14-0) and 1969-70 (14-0) and the 2003-04 Austin Peay team (16-0). On the women's side UT Martin was also 16-0, marking the first time in OVC history that the men's and women's regular season champions each finished with undefeated records.

**Overall Winning Streaks:** As of Monday Murray State has won 24-straight games which is the second-longest active streak nationally.

**Murray State Sets OVC Record for Longest Winning Streak:** After setting the OVC record for longest winning streak during the 2011-12 season, Murray State broke that record this season, by winning its last 24 games entering the post-season. They are one of eight teams all-time in OVC history to have a winning streak of 15 games or longer.

**OVC Tournament Once Again at Municipal Auditorium:** The 2015 OVC Tournament will be once again be played at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. (March 4-7). It marks the fifth-straight year the tournament has been at the venue and the 10th time the combined men's and women's tournaments have been held at the venue (1994, 1995, 1996, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014); the men's tournament was also held there in 1967 and 1989. The OVC recently signed an extension with Municipal Auditorium to hold the tournament there through 2017. Beginning in 2011 the Championship switched to a format where the top eight men's and women's teams play in the merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds received two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds received one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round included the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. That format remains the same for the men's team, although the women's teams have switched back to a traditional bracket (1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc.) bracket this season. As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements included upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium.

**NCAA Stats Leaders:** Entering this week in the latest NCAA statistical leaders (March 1), Eastern Kentucky ranks first nationally in turnover margin (+7.6/game), second in free throw percentage (77.7%), fifth in steals (9.7/game) and 17th in 3-pointers made/game (9.7). Murray State ranks 12th in scoring offense (78.8 points/game), 16th in field goal percentage (48.3%), 16th in scoring margin (+12.1 points/game), 23rd in assists (15.8/game) and 27th in 3-point percentage (39.0%). Belmont ranks sixth in 3-pointers made/game (9.7) while UT Martin is 16th in fewest fouls/game (15.3) and Morehead State is 16th in steals (8.3/game). Individually Belmont's **Evan Bradds** is first in field goal percentage (70.4%) while teammate **Reece Chamberlain** is 17th in assists (5.8/game) and **Craig Bradshaw** is 29th in 3-point percentage (41.7%). Tennessee Tech's **Charles Jackson** is fourth nationally in double-doubles (18), 25th in field goal percentage (57.1%) and 26th in rebounding (9.5/game). Murray State's **Cameron Payne** is 13th in scoring (20.2 points/game), 21st in assists (5.7/game) and 39th in steals (1.97/game). Eastern Kentucky's **Corey Walden** is second in steals (3.0/game) and 34th in scoring (18.6 points/game) while teammate **Eric Stutz** is sixth in field goal percentage (61.7%). Austin Peay's **Chris Horton** is 10th in double-doubles (15), seventh in rebounding (11.1/game) and 35th in blocked shots (2.33/game). Southeast Missouri's **Jarekious Bradley** is 15th nationally in free throw percentage (87.8%).

**Road Warriors:** As of Monday Murray State has an 11-1 record in true road games. The 11 overall road wins are tied for the second-most nationally trailing only Albany (12). Only two teams (Kentucky and Virginia) have fewer road losses than Murray State this season.

**Eastern Kentucky Posts 28-Point Road Win Over Nationally-Ranked Miami; Second-Largest Ever By OVC Team:** Eastern Kentucky made history when it went on the road and beat No. 18 Miami (Fla.) 72-44 on December 19. It was the first victory over a nationally-ranked non-conference opponent for the team since topping No. 6 Dayton on Dec. 9, 1967. It is the second-largest victory over a Top 25 team by an OVC team, trailing only a 31-point win by Western Kentucky over No. 15 St. Bonaventure on January 3, 1953 (94-63 at a neutral site in Oklahoma City). ## 2015 OVC TOURNAMENT

The 2015 Ohio Valley Conference Men's & Women's Tournaments will be held March 4-7 at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tennessee. The tournament features eight men's and eight women's teams with the men's teams playing a merit-based format with the No. 1 and 2 seeds getting double byes into the semifinals and the No. 3 and 4 seeds getting a bye into the quarterfinals and the women's team playing a traditional 1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc. bracket.

The first round and quarterfinal games (which start at 12 and 2 p.m. for the women, and 6 and 8 p.m. for the men) can be seen on the OVC Digital Network. The men's semifinals will be held on Friday, March 6 at 6:30 and 8:30 p.m. and televised on ESPN. The championship game on Saturday, March 7 is at 6 p.m. and televised live on ESPN2. The women's semifinals are set for 12 and 2 p.m. on March 6 (ESPN3) and the women's championship game is on March 7 at 1:00 p.m. CT (ESPN3).

This marks the 21st time in 22 years that the tournament has been held in Nashville.

**CREDENTIALS.** For the sixth year in a row, credentials will be requested through an online system. That information will be available in January. **700 Club:** Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** became just the seventh active Division I head coach to reach the 700 win plateau on January 17 when his team won at Austin Peay. With the 700 victories Byrd joins an elite group that also includes Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim, Bob Huggins, Roy Williams, Bo Ryan and Rick Pitino. All-time the now 708 career wins rank Byrd 25th in NCAA Division I history.

**CollegelInsider.com Mid-Major Poll:** In the latest CollegelInsider.com Mid-Major Poll (Feb. 23 - the March 1 was not yet available), Murray State is ranked fourth while Eastern Kentucky and Belmont were among the others receiving votes. Gonzaga picked up all 31 first-place votes to be ranked No. 1. Now in its 16th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, WAC and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

**Belmont's Bradshaw Named CoSIDA Academic All-American** Belmont junior **Craig Bradshaw** has been named to the Capital One Academic All-American men's basketball third-team as selected by CoSIDA. Overall the OVC has had 235 student-athletes earn Academic All-America honors since 1970; Bradshaw is just the 10th OVC men's basketball student-athlete to earn the honor (but third in the past two years). In the classroom, Bradshaw holds a 3.51 grade-point average in his chosen major of Public Relations. To be eligible for Academic All-America® consideration, a student-athlete must be a varsity starter or key reserve, maintain a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.30 on a scale of 4.00, have reached sophomore athletic and academic standings at his/her current institution and be nominated by his/her sports information director.

**UTM's Smith Among Rare Company With Stat-Filled Game:** UT Martin senior guard **Deville Smith** put himself in rare company with his performance at Illinois-Chicago on December 15. Smith had 26 points, 7 assists, 6 rebounds, 5 blocks and 3 steals in the overtime victory over the Flames. He is the first Division I player to have a 25-point, 5-assist, 5-rebound, 5-block and 3-steal performance against a fellow Division I team since Minnesota's Joel Przybilla against Iowa in 1999-00 (Przybilla had 28 points, 18 rebounds, 7 blocks, 5 assists and 3 steals).

**Horton Records 10th Triple-Double in OVC History:** Austin Peay junior **Chris Horton** recorded just the 10th triple-double in OVC history on Nov. 16 when he had 15 points, 13 rebounds and 10 blocks against Berea College. **Payne Named Lou Henson Mid-Major Player of the Week by CollegelInsider.com (Dec. 15):** Murray State sophomore **Cameron Payne** was named the Lou Henson Mid-Major Player of the Week by CollegelInsider.com on Dec. 15 following his play at Evansville. Payne scored a career-high 32 points as Murray State won 81-79; the sophomore hit 10-of-19 field goals attempts, 4-of-7 3-pointers and 8-of-12 free throws while also adding eight assists, five rebounds and two steals in 35 minutes of action. Payne scored 20 of his 32 points in the first half as MSU built a 42-38 halftime advantage.

**Bradshaw Named National Player of the Week by NBCSports.com (Dec. 1):** Belmont's **Craig Bradshaw** was named the National Player of the Week by NBCSports.com/CollegeBasketballTalk following his play in three games that saw him average 33.0 points, 3.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.0 steals/game while hitting 58.2 percent (32-of-55) from the field, 58.6 percent (17-of-29) from 3-point range and 75 percent (18-of-24) from the free throw line in three Belmont victories. After scoring 29 and 28 points in games to open the week he hit 8-of-12 3-pointers on his way to a Belmont Division I scoring record of 42 points at Ohio; in that game he also raced the length of the court and hit the game-winning basket to lift his team to a 83-81 victory.

**Belmont's Chamberlain Named Finalist for Senior CLASS Award:** Belmont senior **Reece Chamberlain** is one of 10 Division I men's basketball players selected as finalists for the 2014-15 Senior CLASS Award®. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one male candidate and one female candidate who best exemplify excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition. The Senior CLASS Award winner will be announced during the 2015 NCAA Men's Final Four®.

**Payne Named to Cousy Award Watch List:** Murray State's **Cameron Payne** was named to the watch list of candidates for the 2015 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award. The annual honor, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes the top point guards in men's college basketball. The Watch List was initially 35 players and will be narrowed to five at the end of the season. The winner will be honored on Monday of Final Four weekend in Indianapolis.

**Two OVC Players On Midseason Lou Henson Award Watch List:** Two OVC men's basketball players have been named to the midseason Lou Henson Award Watch list by CollegelInsider.com. The Lou Henson Award is presented annually to the Division I "Mid-Major" Player of the Year. The OVC selections included Murray State sophomore guard **Cameron Payne** and Eastern Kentucky senior guard **Corey Walden**. The group are among 40 players nationally nominated for the award. 41 years. The 2015 recipient will be announced at the CollegeInsider.com Awards Banquet on April 3 in Indianapolis, site of the 2015 men's NCAA Basketball Championship.

**OVC to Produce 14-Game National Television Package:** The OVC will produce the largest national television package in its history in 2014-15 as 14 Conference games will air on either the ESPN Family of Networks or the CBS Sports Network. The Conference will once again have seven games on the ESPN Family of Networks, including four regular season games as well as the OVC Tournament semifinals and championship game. The OVC will also have a seven-game package on CBS Sports Network, up from just four games on the network a season ago. The 14-game package ensures that every member institution is on national television at least once this year. In addition the OVC will produce five games that will air in select markets on the new American Sports Network.

**Recent Postseason Success:** Last year the OVC had four men's basketball teams selected for postseason play (1 NCAA, 1 NIT, 1 CIT, 1 CBI) which matched an all-time high for a single season, tying the mark set in 2011. Overall OVC teams were 7-3 in postseason play in 2014; the seven total wins were the most for the OVC in one postseason (topping four wins in the 1971 season). With wins by Belmont (who advanced to the NIT Quarterfinals) and Murray State (who won the CIT Championship), OVC teams have now at least won at least one game in postseason play for six-straight years (the longest stretch in league history). Also included in that mark are wins in four of the past six NCAA Tournaments.

**Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History; Byrd Ranks 7th Among Active NCAA Coaches:** With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 25th year at Austin Peay. Loos now has 391 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 473 for his career. Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** (who is in his third year in the OVC) has 708 career victories, which ranks seventh among active Division I head coaches. Loos and Byrd are two of just six active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years (the others are Syracuse's Jim Boeheim, Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, Oakland's Greg Kampe and Davidson's Bob McKillop).

**OVC Men's Hoops in Third Year of Divisional Play:** For the third year the OVC will use divisional play for men's basketball (the OVC women's teams are not using divisional play this year). The addition of Belmont University on July 1, 2012 gave the OVC 12 member institutions, the largest the Conference has been since it was formed in 1948 (the OVC is currently the nation's eighth-oldest Division I conference). The East Division includes Belmont, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech. The West Division includes Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri State, SIUE and UT Martin.

**Former OVC Players in the NBA:** There are currently four former OVC players on NBA rosters. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his fourth season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. Faried was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team in 2012 and helped lead Team USA to a Gold Medal in the World Cup of Basketball this past summer. Former Murray State All-American **Isaiah Canaan** was drafted by the Houston Rockets and played with the team last year and the first half of this season before being traded to the Philadelphia 76ers. Former Belmont All-American **Ian Clark** signed a free agent deal with the Utah Jazz after doing undrafted and has a guaranteed deal with the Jazz this season. Former Tennessee State star **Robert Covington** was cut by Houston after spending last year with the team, but signed a free agent contract with the Philadelphia 76ers right after the season began. Three other former OVC players are currently playing in the NBDL: Travis Betran (Austin Peay) with the Erie BayHawks, Kevin Murphy (Tennessee Tech) with the Idaho Stampede and Walker Russell (Jacksonville State) with the Westchester Knicks.

**The 2014-15 Season:** The 2014-15 season marks the 67th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 66 years, 13 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

**Murray State's Payne Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year:** The 2014-15 OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Murray State sophomore guard **Cameron Payne** who was named the OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Payne is the first sophomore to be named Preseason Player of the Year since the award was first handed out in 1993-94. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Murray State having the most selections (3) and Belmont (2) also having multiple picks. Payne was named both a first-team All-OVC selection and OVC Freshman of the Year after averaging 16.8 points, 5.4 assists, 3.6 rebounds and 1.7 steals/game and leading Murray State to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) Championship (where he was named MVP). In addition to Payne the other players named to the All-OVC Team last year and appearing on the preseason team this season are Southeast Missouri State senior guard **Jarekious Bradley**, Belmont junior guard **Craig Bradshaw**, Morehead State senior guard **Angelo Warner** and Murray State senior forward **Jarvis Williams**. The Preseason All-OVC Team was rounded out by Belmont senior guard **Reece Chamberlain**, Austin Peay junior center **Chris Horton**, Murray State senior guard **T.J. Sapp**, UT Martin senior forward **Myles Taylor** and Eastern Kentucky senior guard **Corey Walden**, who was the 2013-14 OVC Defensive Player of the Year.

**Murray State Picked as OVC Preseason Favorite:** In a vote of OVC head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite for the 2014-15 season. Murray State, who has won a league-best 23 OVC regular season championships, picked up 15 of 24 first-place votes in being picked the overall regular season champion. The Racers were also tabbed the West Division favorites, picking up 22 of 24 first-place votes in that category, while two-time defending regular season champion Belmont was picked the East Division favorites. In the overall champion voting, in addition to Murray State picking up 15 first-place votes other teams with first-place votes included Belmont (7), Eastern Kentucky (1) and Morehead State (1). Since Murray State was picked as the overall champion, they were also an overwhelming favorite to take first place in its own division; the Racers have finished first in the West in each of the first two years of divisional play. MSU received 132 total points to top the West and were followed by Southeast Missouri (who picked up the other 2 first-place votes and 109 points), SIUE (77), Austin Peay (70), Eastern Illinois (64) and UT Martin (40). The East was rounded out by Tennessee Tech (71), Jacksonville State (52) and Tennessee State (40).

### AUSTIN PEAY GOVERNORS (8-22, 3-13)

Home: 6-7, Away: 1-14, Neutral: 1-1

#### Team Notes

Austin Peay closed out the 2014-15 season by losing nine of its final 10 games, although the team did snap an eight-game losing streak the final week of the season with a home victory over SIUE...The Governors, who have won eight OVC regular season and four OVC Tournament titles, failed to make the eight-team OVC Tournament field for the third-consecutive season...It was announced that head coach Dave Loos would return for his 26th season in 2015-16; Loos is the winningest coach in OVC history (391 victories)...Junior Chris Horton pulled down an OVC-best 20 rebounds in a victory over SIUE in the final week of the regular season; he was the first APSU player to grab 20 rebounds in a game since the 1993-94 season (Tyrone Beck)...The 20 rebounds were the 10th-most in a game by a Division I player this season...Horton finished his third season in a Gobs uniform with 262 blocks, which ranks second in OVC history (177 behind the all-time leader)...Nationally Horton ranks seventh in rebounding (11.1/game); he was the first APSU player to average double-figure rebounds since 1990-91 (Tommy Brown)...Horton's 15 double-doubles this season were the second-most in the OVC...Horton averaged 34.5 minutes/game, the most by a Gobs post player since Drake Reed in 2008-09 (36.7 minutes/game)...Horton was the only Austin Peay player to average double figures as freshman Josh Robinson was second on the team with a 9.9 points/game average; Robinson averaged 12.1 points/game in 16 OVC contests.

### BELMONT BRUINS (19-10, 11-5)

#### Team Notes

Belmont finished the season tied with Eastern Kentucky for first place in the OVC East Division, but lost the tiebreaker with the Colonels (the tiebreaker eventually came down to record vs. East No. 3 Morehead State) and earned the No. 3 overall seed for the OVC Tournament (after being the No. 1 overall seed in each of its first two seasons in the OVC)...The Bruins will receive one bye to the quarterfinals and open up tournament play on Thursday against either Eastern Illinois (a team it lost to on the road) or SIUE (a team they topped at home by four points in early January)...Belmont, who won the 2013 OVC Tournament, is 3-1 all-time in OVC Tournament play; last year they lost to Eastern Kentucky in the title game...Sophomore Evan Bradds enters this week leading all Division I players in field goal percentage (70.4%) which currently stands as the best mark in OVC single-season history (better than the previous mark of 70.0% by MTSU's Warren Kidd in 1990-91)...Junior Craig Bradshaw ranks in the OVC's Top 10 in 3-pointers made (2nd - 2.5/game), scoring (3rd - 17.9/game), 3-point percentage (5th - 41.7%), steals (8th - 1.6/game), assists (9th - 3.2/game) and assist-to-turnover ratio (9th - 1.0/game)...Bradshaw also gets it done in the classroom and was named 1 of 16 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans nationally last week (the OVC has had must 10 men's basketball players earn that honor all-time); he holds a 3.51 grade point average in public relations...Senior Reece Chamberlain leads the OVC in assists (5.8/game), is second in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.4/game) and sixth in steals (1.7/game).

After starting Conference play 6-0, Eastern Illinois was 3-7 over its final 10 games (including 2-4 down the stretch) to slip to the No. 6 overall seed for the OVC Tournament...It marks the third-straight season the team has qualified for the event (the last two years they were the No. 7 seed) after not making the field in 2011 or 2012...The Panthers are looking for its first OVC Tournament victory since 2010 when they knocked off Eastern Kentucky in the first round and gave eventual champion Murray State all it could handle in the semifinals before falling by four points...The Panthers open play on Wednesday against No. 7 seed SIUE a team they split with this season (each winning on its home court)...EIU is 6-2 against SIUE over the last four years (since SIUE started playing a full Conference schedule)...With 16 overall wins the Panthers are assured of only its second winning season since 2001 (2009-10 being the other during that stretch)...That 2001 season was the only year the Panthers have cut down the nets in March, doing so with OVC all-time leading scorer Henry Domercant...Freshman point guard Cornell Johnston (who stands just 5'7 and weighs 150 pounds) is the only EIU player to start all 28 games this season...He also set the EIU single-season freshman assist record (126) and ranks third in the OVC in assists (4.5/game)...Johnston also ranks first in the OVC in 3-point percentage (52.2%) and over his last 13 games (since Jan. 15) he is hitting 66.0 percent (31-of-47) from 3-point range...Junior Chris Olivier is first on the team in rebounding (5.5/game) and second in scoring (12.9/game); he has come off the team's bench in 12 of his last 13 games...Olivier missed six games due to illness in late January/early February but has scored 17 or more points in three of four games since his return on Feb. 14.

### EASTERN KENTUCKY COLONELS (19-10, 11-5)

#### Team Notes

Defending OVC Tournament Champion Eastern Kentucky will look to become the first OVC men's team to repeat as champions since Murray State won three in-a-row from 1996-1999...After winning three games in six days during the final week of the regular season, the Colonels finished in a tie for first place in the East Division with Belmont but won the tiebreaker and will be the No. 2 seed and get a double bye to the semifinals (the team opens play on Friday night)...It is the highest seed for the program since also being the No. 2 seed in 2007 (when they topped Austin Peay for the tournament crown)...EKU has won 4 of its last 5 OVC Tournament games while the team's six OVC Tournament Championships (1950, 1955, 1979, 2005, 2007, 2014) rank third all-time in OVC history...Overall EKU has won eight of its last nine games, with the lone loss coming by five points at Belmont, in a game where Corey Walden did not play for the Colonels...Walden is tied for second nationally in steals (3.0/game) as his 84 steals rank ninth in OVC single-season history while his 221 career steals is eighth in OVC history...Walden had a career-high 35 points in the regular season finale victory over Tennessee Tech, including a layup, key rebound and two free throws in the final 25 seconds of the game to secure the three-point victory...Walden has scored 33 or more points in three different games this season and ranks second in the OVC in scoring (18.6 points/game)...Fellow senior Eric Stutz is sixth nationally in field goal percentage (61.7%); he is currently averaging 15.5 points and 5.8 rebounds/game.

#### Team Notes

Jacksonville State concluded its season with a pair of road losses to finish with a 5-11 OVC mark and miss out on the OVC Tournament field for the third-straight season...The Gamecocks had been hot down the stretch, winning three-straight games (including topping Belmont) but came up just short of eighth place in the standings...Senior Jamal Hunter capped his career by setting the school record for blocked shots in a game (9) against Morehead State; he broke the previous mark of seven (which he had done twice)...Hunter finished the season with 63 blocks, setting a new school single-season record and single-season blocks/game record (2.1/game)...Hunter is one of just four players in Gamecock history (and the only two-year player) to net 100 or more career blocks (108)...Senior Darion Rackley capped his four-year career with 1,326 points, making him 12th on the Jax State career scoring list (and second in the program's Division I Era); Rackley is first all-time in JSU history in free throws made and attempted...In addition to Rackley (15.1 points/game), D.J. Felder was the only other Gamecock to average in double figures this season (10.0/game); Felder's 5.5 rebounds/game were also the most in the team...As a team Jacksonville State ranked second in the OVC in free throw percentage this season (71.6%).

### MURRAY STATE RACERS (26-4, 16-0)

Home: 14-1, Away: 11-1, Neutral: 1-2

#### Team Notes

Murray State became just the fifth team in OVC history (and first since 2003-04) to compile an undefeated Conference record as the Racers finished the year 16-0 in OVC play...The Racers enter the postseason having won 24 games in a row, which is a new OVC record for longest winning streak (breaking the mark of 23 by the 2011-12 Murray State squad that was ranked in the Top 10 nationally); the 24-game winning streak is the second-longest streak nationally behind only Kentucky...Overall the Racers won its 24th OVC regular season championship...MSU is now in search of its 16th OVC Tournament title (the program's 15 current titles in the most all-time) and third in the last six seasons (2010, 2012)...As the No. 1 seed the Racers receive a double bye to the semifinals and will open play on Friday night; since the OVC went to a merit-based bracket in 2011, the Racers have been either the No. 1 or 2 seed in each of those five seasons...All-time MSU is 63-34 in the OVC Tournament (the 63 wins are the most of any program; second place currently sits at 38 by APSU and EKU)...Sophomore Cameron Payne leads the OVC in scoring (20.2 points/game) and assist-to-turnover ratio (2.4), ranks second in assists (5.7/game), third in steals (2.0/game), fifth in 3-pointers made/game (2.2) and seventh in free throw shooting (78.9%)...Senior Jarvis Williams ranks third in the OVC in rebounding (8.3/game), four in field goal percentage (57.1%) and sixth in scoring (15.4 points/game) while his 10 double-doubles were third-most in the league...Murray State cracked both major Top 25 polls on Monday becoming the first OVC school to be ranked since the Racers climbed to as high as No. 9 during the 2011-12 season; MSU is No. 24 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 25 in the AP Poll.

#### Team Notes

#### Team Notes

Tennessee Tech ended the season with five-straight losses to finish OVC play 4-12 overall and miss the OVC Tournament for the second time in the last three seasons...The Golden Eagles struggled away from home, compiling a 2-14 road record (with wins over North Florida and UMKC, both of which came in the month of December)...Newcomer Charles Jackson finished the year with an OVC-best 18 double-doubles which was the second-most in TTU single-season history, trailing only the mark of 20 set by Lorenzo Coleman in 1996-97...Jackson had a season-best 17 rebounds in his season finale at Eastern Kentucky; the 17 rebounds are tied for the fifth-most by an OVC player in 2014-15...In 30 games this season Jackson averaged 13.0 points and 9.5 rebounds/game while hitting 57.1 percent from the field; those numbers ranked him second in the OVC in rebounding and fifth in field goal percentage...Freshman Aleksa Jugovic had a career-high 18 points during the final week of the regular season; he finished the season by knocking down 31 3-pointers, which was the second-most on the Golden Eagle squad...Newcomer Torrance Rowe led the team with 52 3-pointers during the season...Dwan Caldwell had season averages of 11.6 points and 5.3 rebounds/game...As a team Tennessee Tech led the OVC in rebounding (37.0/game) during the regular season.

#### Team Notes

First-year head coach Heath Schroyer helped the Skyhawks to a huge turnaround in just one season, taking a squad that was 8-23 (3-13 OVC) before his arrival to 18-11 (10-6 OVC) in 2014-15...The team also is guaranteed of a winning record, only the fourth time that has happened in the program's 23-year Division I history... Since winning the OVC regular season championship in 2009, the Skyhawks had only qualified for two OVC Tournaments (2011, 2013), but were seeded eighth in each of those seasons; this year UTM will be the No. 4 seed and get a bye to the quarterfinal round where they will play either No. 5 Morehead State or No. 8 Southeast Missouri on Thursday night (the Skyhawks topped MSU in its only meeting this year and split with Southeast Missouri)...Should they win that contest they will meet No. 1 seed Murray State for the third time this season; despite losing to the Racers twice, UT Martin lost those two games by a combined nine points and both games were nip-and-tuck...UT Martin is just 2-8 all-time in OVC Tournament games...UNLV transfer Deville Smith leads the team in scoring (14.0 points/game) and ranks fifth in the OVC in assists (4.4/game)...Fellow senior Marshun Newell enters the postseason averaging 13.3 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.6 assists and 0.9 steals/game while hitting 41.6 percent (57-of-137) from 3-point range...UTM has four active players who average between 14.0 and 12.1 points/game in its balanced attack...The team's nine road victories this season are the most since the program won nine with All-American and future NBA player Lester Hudson in 2008-09; prior to this season UTM had only won seven combined road games over the past three seasons.
