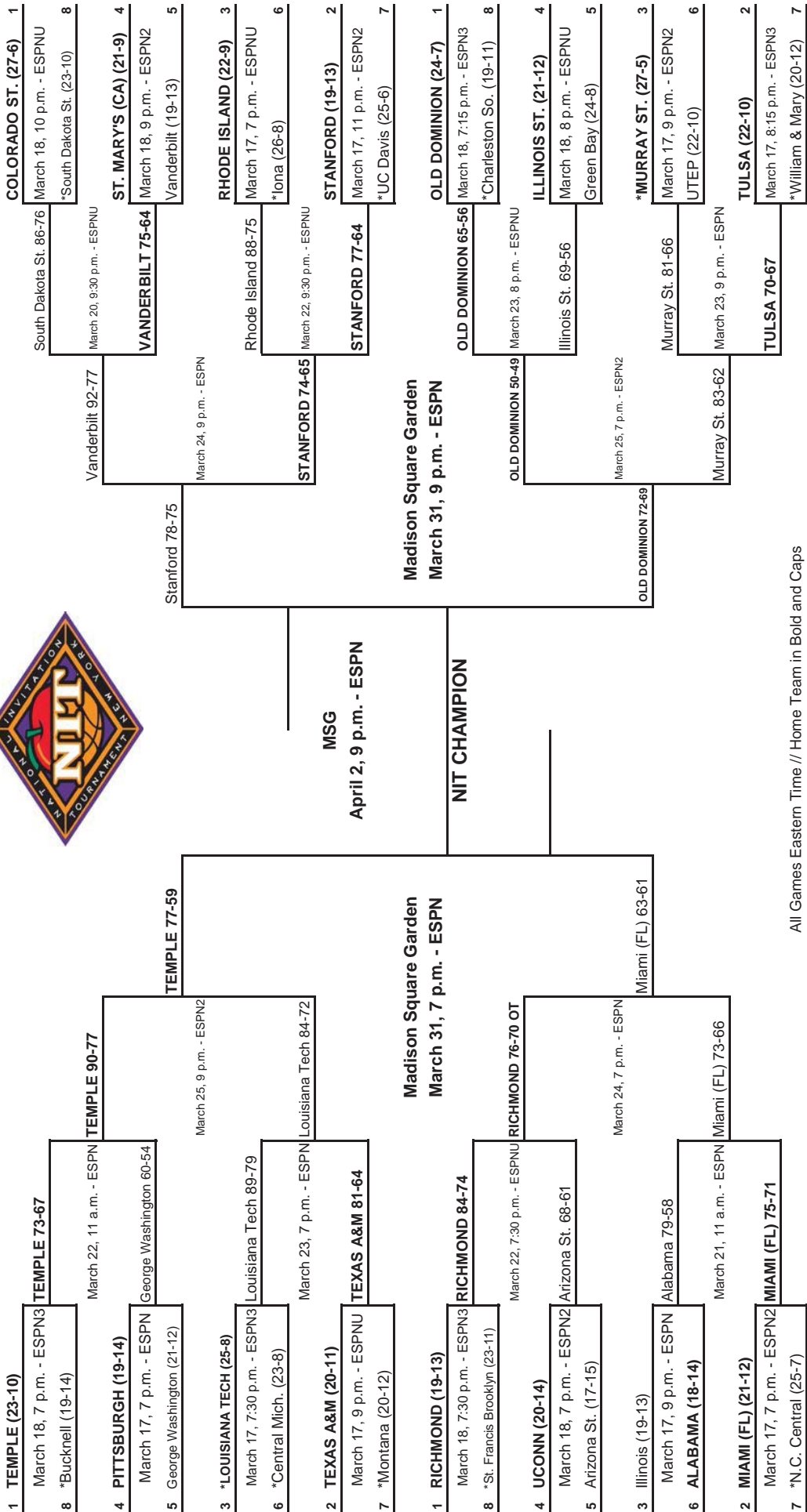

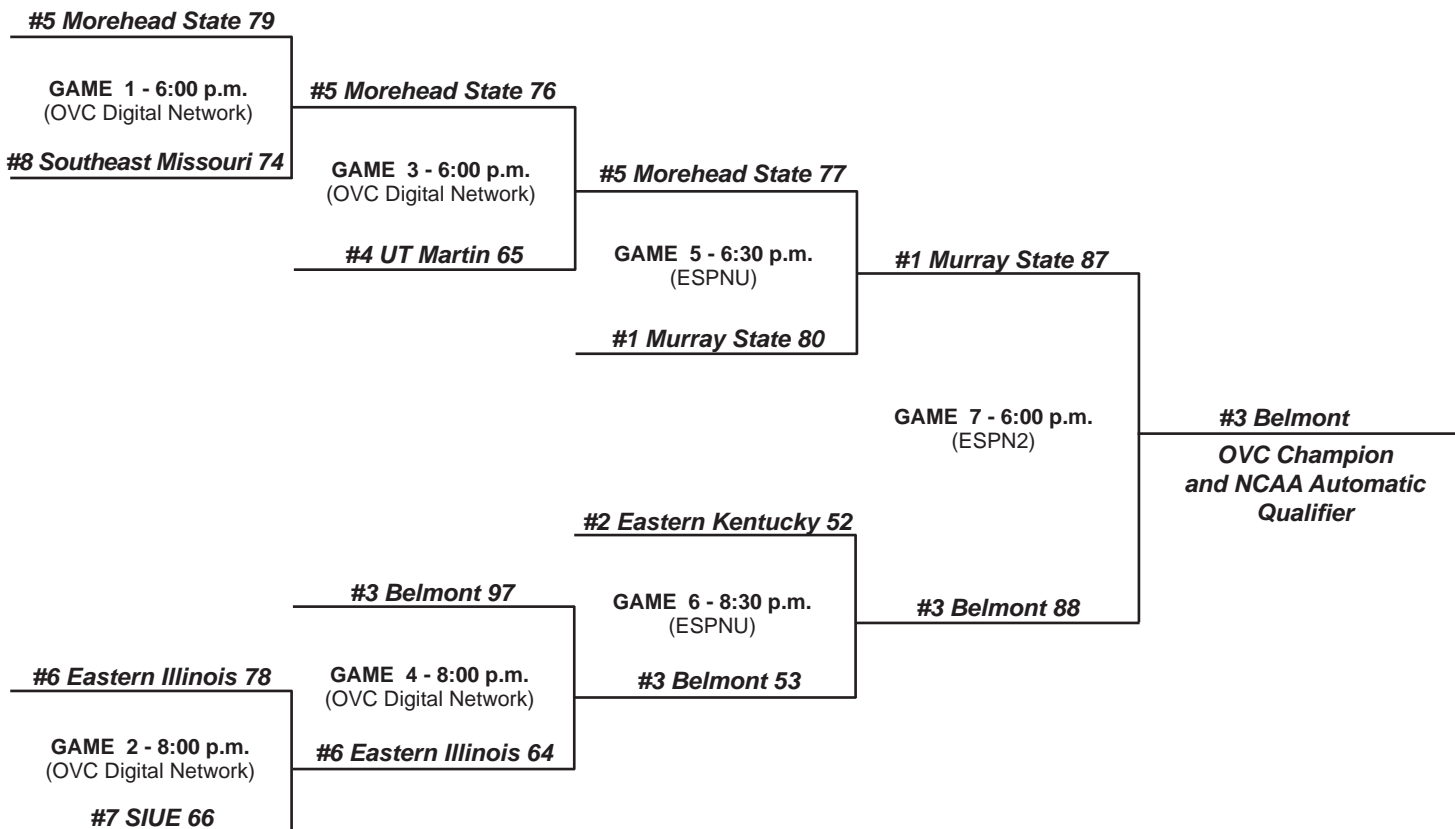

NOTES FROM AROUND THE LEAGUE

OVC Overview/This Week's Highlights: An OVC record five teams are competing in the postseason this year with Belmont playing in the NCAA Tournament, Murray State competing in the NIT and Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky and UT Martin participating in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT)...OVC teams are currently 8-4 so far, which set a record for most wins in a single postseason for the OVC (the old record was 7-3 a year ago)...Murray State, who won its 24th OVC regular season title after completing just the fifth perfect Conference record (16-0) in OVC history, began the postseason with a home court victory over UTEP in the NIT and advanced to the Quarterfinals with a road win over Tulsa before falling to Old Dominion in the Quarterfinals; it marked the second-straight OVC year an OVC team advanced to the Quarterfinals (Belmont did a season ago)...OVC teams are 6-2 in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) with Eastern Kentucky and UT Martin having each won two games to advance to the Quarterfinals where UTM topped ECU with a last second 3-pointer...UT Martin scored its first Division I national postseason victories with road victories over Northwestern State, USC Upstate and ECU; the Skyhawks have also won 12 road games this season, tied for the most nationally with Albany and Murray State...UT Martin has won 21 games this season, the second-most wins in school history...UTM senior Deville Smith recorded just the 11th triple-double in OVC history (21 points, 12 rebounds, 11 assists) when leading his team to a victory over Northwestern State to begin the CIT...EKU appeared in its third-straight national postseason tournament (CIT, NCAA, CIT) and scored home wins over Norfolk State and High Point to advance to the CIT Quarterfinals...EKU senior Corey Walden now ranks second in OVC single-season history with 99 steals and fifth in OVC career history with 236 steals...Eastern Illinois won its first-ever national postseason tournament game at the Division I level in the first round, winning at Oakland before falling to Evansville in the second round...EIU guard Cornell Johnston set a new OVC single-season 3-point percentage record this season (51.9%)...Belmont sophomore Evan Bradds finished the season leading all Division I players in field goal percentage (68.8%); that ranked second in OVC single-season history, just below of the OVC record of 70.0%.

OVC Sets League Record With Five Postseason Teams; Sets Record for Most Wins in Single Postseason (8): Overall the OVC has five teams competing in the postseason this year (1 NCAA, 1 NIT, 3 CIT) which set a new record for the league. It broke the previous mark of four teams set in both 2011 and 2014. Last season OVC teams were 7-3 overall; the seven wins marked the most by the league in a single postseason. This season OVC teams broke that mark as they are currently 8-4 in postseason games.

Wins in Seven-Straight Postseasons: After Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Murray State and UT Martin recorded wins in the postseason, OVC teams have now at least won one game in each postseason for seven-straight years, the longest stretch in league history. Morehead State won a NCAA game in 2009, Murray State won in the NCAA Tournament in 2010, Morehead State won in the NCAA's in 2011, Murray State won in the NCAA's in 2012, Eastern Kentucky won in the CIT in 2013 and Belmont (NIT) and Murray State (CIT) won games in 2014. The four different teams to record a victory in the single postseason is also an OVC record.

OVC Teams All-Time in the NCAA Tournament: Following the 2015 NCAA Tournament, OVC teams have won NCAA Tournament games in four of the past seven years. After going 19 years without a winning game (1990-2008) Morehead State broke through for the league by winning in 2009 and ending the losing streak. Murray State won a game in 2010 (Vanderbilt), followed by Morehead State besting Louisville in 2011 and the streak reached four-straight years when Murray State beat Colorado State in 2012. This season Belmont lost to No. 15 seed Virginia to fall to 0-7 all-time in the NCAA Tournament. Overall OVC teams are now 24-67 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.

OVC Teams All-Time in the NIT: Murray State earned an automatic bid to the National Invitation Tournament (NIT) by winning the OVC regular season championship but failing to win the league's tournament. It marks the eighth overall appearance in the NIT for Murray State (1980, 1982, 1983, 1989, 1994, 1996, 2011, 2015) and first since 2011. The Racers topped UTEP and Tulsa in the first two rounds before falling to No. 1 seed Old Dominion on a buzzer-beater 3-pointer heave. The Racers are now 4-8 all-time in the event and this year advanced to the Quarterfinals for the first time since 1980. All-time OVC teams are 17-15 in the NIT including sending teams to the Quarterfinals in two consecutive years (Murray State this year, Belmont last year). Murray State is looking to become the first OVC team to advance to Madison Square Garden since Western Kentucky did in 1965 (when there were 14 teams in the field and every squad played in New York City). No OVC team has advanced to the semifinals of the NIT since WKU did so in 1954 (when there were just 12 teams in the field and one win advanced the Hilltoppers to the semifinal round).

OVC Teams All-Time in the CIT: Three OVC schools (Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky and UT Martin) are participating in this season's CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT). This marks the seventh year for the national event. Eastern Illinois won in the first round but lost in its second round matchup while both Eastern Kentucky and UT Martin won its first two games to advance to the quarterfinals where they faced off against each other with UT Martin winning on a last second 3-pointer. UTM will now play at Evansville in the semifinals with the winner of that game playing either NJIT or Northern Arizona for the Championship. OVC teams are now 12-8 all-time in the CIT including Murray State's perfect 5-0 run last season as the Racers captured the Championship. In the process MSU became the first-ever OVC team to play in the month of April. The CIT is a 32-team field that is drawn from non-BCS schools and all 31 games of the tournament are played at campus sites. In an effort to minimize travel and missed class time, the CIT uses a format that determines future opponents by previous results. This means second round pairings are made after first round games are completed. Teams in the same geographical area are likely to be paired. The CIT was created in 2009; what began as a 16-team event, quickly expanded to 24 teams in 2011 and to 32 teams in 2012.

Murray State and UT Martin Tied For Most Road Wins Nationally: As of Monday both Murray State and UT Martin each have 12 road victories, which is tied for the most nationally with Albany. UTM will have a chance to secure road win No. 13 in the CIT Semifinals on Tuesday.

Belmont Wins 2014 OVC Tournament Championship: Belmont captured its second OVC Tournament title in three years in the league by topping No. 1 seed and nationally-ranked Murray State 88-87 in the title game on a 3-pointer by Taylor Barnett with 3.2 seconds remaining. The No. 3 seeded Bruins won three games in three days to win the title, besting Eastern Illinois, defending champion Eastern Kentucky and Murray State to win its first title since 2013 (its first year in the league).

Murray State Claims 24th OVC Regular Season Championship: Murray State won its 24th OVC Championship with a perfect 16-0 record this season. It is the first overall regular season crown for the team since 2012. MSU has also won crowns in 1951, 1964, 1968, 1969, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1988, 1989, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2006, 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2015.

Murray State Becomes Fifth OVC Men's Team to Complete Perfect Conference Season: Murray State completed a perfect 16-0 regular season and became only the fifth team in OVC history to accomplish that feat. The other teams with perfect OVC records in 67 years of OVC play are Western Kentucky teams in 1949-50 (8-0), 1965-66 (14-0) and 1969-70 (14-0) and the 2003-04 Austin Peay team (16-0). On the women's side UT Martin was also 16-0, marking the first time in OVC history that the men's and women's regular season champions each finished with undefeated records.

Payne and Prohm Semifinalists for Naismith Awards: Murray State's **Steve Prohm** and **Cameron Payne** were named to the Naismith Trophy semifinalist list for National Coach of the Year and National Player of the Year after leading Murray State to a perfect 16-0 Conference record, a 25-game winning streak during the season and a Top 25 national ranking.

Payne Named Finalist for Lute Olson Award: Murray State sophomore guard **Cameron Payne** is one of 25 finalists for the 2015 Lute Olson Award presented by CollegeInsider.com. The Lute Olson Award is presented annually to the nation's top Division I player who has played at least two seasons. The finalists for the award also represent the Lute Olson All-America Team; freshmen are not eligible for the Player of the Year Award but may be named to the Team. The award is named in honor of Hall of Fame coach Lute Olson, who won 780 games in 34 seasons, 24 of which were spent at the University of Arizona.

Walden Named Finalist for Lou Henson Award: Eastern Kentucky senior **Corey Walden** is one of 31 finalists for the 2015 Lou Henson Award presented by CollegeInsider.com. The Lou Henson Award is presented annually to the top Mid-Major player in Division I college basketball. The finalists for the award also represent the Lou Henson All-America team. The award is named in honor of Henson who retired after a spectacular coaching career that lasted 41 years. When he left the game in 2005 he was sixth all-time in career Division I wins with 779. He is the winningest coach at both Illinois and New Mexico State and is one of only 12 coaches in the history of the game to take two schools to the Final Four.

Prohm and Schroyer Named Finalists for Hugh Durham Award: Murray State head coach **Steve Prohm** and UT Martin head coach **Heath Schroyer** has been selected as two of 16 finalists for the 2015 Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award presented by CollegeInsider.com. The Hugh Durham Award is presented annually to the nation's top mid-major coach. The award is named in honor of Hugh Durham, who retired at the end of the 2004-05 season; Durham is one of just 12 coaches to have led two different programs to the NCAA Final Four (Florida State in 1972, Georgia in 1983) and is the only coach amongst that group to have led both schools to the lone Final Four appearance. The recipient of the award will be announced at the CollegeInsider.com awards banquet on April 3 in Indianapolis, site of the 2015 Men's Final Four.

Murray State Ranked in Both Top 25 Polls For One Week: After receiving votes for four weeks, Murray State finally broke into both major Top 25 polls on March 2, coming in at No. 24 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 25 in the Associated Press Poll. Prior to that ranking it was Murray State who was the last OVC team to be ranked in the Top 25, climbing as high as No. 9 during the 2011-12 season (that was the first time an OVC team had been ranked in the Top 10 since 1970-71). The Racers were ranked for the final 15 weeks of the 2011-12 season and finished the year ranked No.12 in the AP Poll and No. 12 in the AP poll and No. 16 in the USA Today poll. After the Racers lost to Belmont in the OVC Tournament finals, they dropped out of both Top 25 polls.

Murray State Sets OVC Record for Longest Winning Streak: After setting the OVC record for longest winning streak during the 2011-12 season, Murray State broke that record this season, by winning 25-straight games. They are one of eight teams all-time in OVC history to have a winning streak of 15 games or longer.

NCAA Stats Leaders: Entering this week in the latest NCAA statistical leaders (March 30), Eastern Kentucky ranks first nationally in turnover margin (+7.2/game), second in free throw percentage (77.9%), second in steals (9.7/game) and 17th in 3-pointers made/game (8.9). Murray State ranks eighth in scoring offense (79.0 points/game), 16th in field goal percentage (48.2%), 15th in scoring margin (+11.3 points/game), 21st in assists (15.5/game) and 30th in 3-point percentage (38.7%). Belmont ranks fourth in 3-pointers made/game (10.0), UT Martin is 13th in fewest fouls/game (15.1) and 22nd in 3-point percentage (39.0%) while Morehead State is 17th in steals (8.2/game). Individually Belmont's **Evan Bradds** is first in field goal

percentage (68.8%) while teammate **Reece Chamberlain** is 13th in assists (6.0/game) and **Craig Bradshaw** is 19th in 3-point percentage (42.3%). UT Martin's **Alex Anderson** is third in 3-point percentage (47.9%). Murray State's **Cameron Payne** is 13th in scoring (20.2 points/game), 15th in assists (6.0/game) and 34th in steals (1.94/game) while teammate **Jarvis Williams** is 21st in field goal percentage (56.7%). Tennessee Tech's **Charles Jackson** is eighth nationally in double-doubles (18), 19th in field goal percentage (57.1%) and 26th in rebounding (9.5/game). Eastern Kentucky's **Corey Walden** is first in steals (3.09/game) and 36th in scoring (18.6 points/game) while teammate **Eric Stutz** is eighth in field goal percentage (60.9%). Austin Peay's **Chris Horton** is 18th in double-doubles (15), eighth in rebounding (11.1/game) and 35th in blocked shots (2.33/game). Southeast Missouri's **Jarekious Bradley** is 16th in free throw percentage (88.3%).

Johnston Sets OVC Single-Season 3-Point Percentage Record: Eastern Illinois freshman **Cornell Johnston** set a new OVC single-season 3-point percentage record. His mark of 51.9 percent (55-of-106) finished ahead of the previous mark of 50.6 percent held by a pair of Eastern Kentucky players (Brad Divine and Jeff McGill).

Bradds Ranks Second in OVC Single-Season History in Field Goal Percentage: Belmont sophomore **Evan Bradds** ended his season with a 68.8 field goal percentage, which led all Division I players and ranked second in OVC single-season history (the current record is 70.0%).

Eastern Kentucky Posts 28-Point Road Win Over Nationally-Ranked Miami; Second-Largest Ever By OVC Team: Eastern Kentucky made history when it went on the road and beat No. 18 Miami (Fla.) 72-44 on December 19. It was the first victory over a nationally-ranked non-conference opponent for the team since topping No. 6 Dayton on Dec. 9, 1967. It is the second-largest victory over a Top 25 team by an OVC team, trailing only a 31-point win by Western Kentucky over No. 15 St. Bonaventure on January 3, 1953 (94-63 at a neutral site in Oklahoma City). OVC teams have knocked off at least one Top 25 opponent in five of the past six seasons. Here is a look at some recent OVC wins over Top 25 opponents.

Payne Named to USBWA All-District Team: Murray State's **Cameron Payne** was named to the United States Basketball Writers' Association of America (USBWA) All-District Four Team. The USBWA announced the teams from nine districts including a Player of the Year from each one; Payne was the only OVC selection on an All-District Team. USBWA District-4 consists of schools from Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia and Florida.

700 Club: Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** became just the seventh active Division I head coach to reach the 700 win plateau on January 17 when his team won at Austin Peay. With the 700 victories Byrd joins an elite group that also includes Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim, Bob Huggins, Roy Williams, Bo Ryan and Rick Pitino. All-time the now 711 career wins rank Byrd 25th in NCAA Division I history.

Neubauer Named Finalist for Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award: Eastern Kentucky University Head Men's Basketball Coach **Jeff Neubauer** is one of 16 finalists for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award. The award is given out annually to a coach that exemplifies high moral integrity off the court and success on it. The recipient of the 2015 award will be announced at the CollegelInsider.com Awards Banquet on April 3 in Indianapolis, site of the 2015 Final Four. Named for the late Skip Prosser, the former coach of Wake Forest who passed away in 2007, the award has been given out since 2008.

CollegelInsider.com Mid-Major Poll: In the latest CollegelInsider.com Mid-Major Poll (March 16), Murray State is ranked fifth, Belmont is 20th and Eastern Kentucky is among the others receiving votes. Gonzaga picked up all 31 first-place votes to be ranked No. 1. Now in its 16th season, the Mid-Major poll is made up of team's from the following conferences: America East, Atlantic Sun, Big Sky, Big South, Big West, Colonial, Horizon, Independents, Ivy, Metro Atlantic, Mid-American, Mid-Eastern, Missouri Valley, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Patriot, Southern, Southland, Southwestern, Summit, Sun Belt, WAC and West Coast. It is voted upon by coaches from those conferences, with one coach per conference casting a vote (Eastern Kentucky's Jeff Neubauer is the OVC representative).

Belmont's Bradshaw Named CoSIDA Academic All-American Belmont junior **Craig Bradshaw** has been named to the Capital One Academic All-American men's basketball third-team as selected by CoSIDA. Overall the OVC has had 235 student-athletes earn Academic All-America honors since 1970; Bradshaw is just the 10th OVC men's basketball student-athlete to earn the honor (but third in the past two years). In the classroom, Bradshaw holds a 3.51 grade-point average in his chosen major of Public Relations. To be eligible for Academic All-America® consideration, a student-athlete must be a varsity starter or key reserve, maintain a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.30 on a scale of 4.00, have reached sophomore athletic and academic standings at his/her current institution and be nominated by his/her sports information director.

UTM's Smith Among Rare Company With Stat-Filled Game: UT Martin senior guard **Deville Smith** put himself in rare company with his performance at Illinois-Chicago on December 15. Smith had 26 points, 7 assists, 6 rebounds, 5 blocks and 3 steals in the overtime victory over the Flames. He is the first Division I player to have a 25-point, 5-assist, 5-rebound, 5-block and 3-steal performance against a fellow Division I team since Minnesota's Joel Przybilla against Iowa in 1999-00 (Przybilla had 28 points, 18 rebounds, 7 blocks, 5 assists and 3 steals).

Horton and Smith Record 10th and 11th Triple-Doubles in OVC History: Austin Peay junior **Chris Horton** recorded just the 10th triple-double in OVC history on Nov. 16 when he had 15 points, 13 rebounds and 10 blocks against Berea College. It was the first triple-double in the OVC since the 2008-09 season and he was only the second player to ever do it with blocked shots. In the CollegelInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT), UT Martin senior Deville Smith recorded the 11th triple-double in OVC history with 21 points, 12 rebounds and 11 assists. Payne scored a career-high 32 points as Murray State won 81-79; the sophomore hit 10-of-19 field goals attempts, 4-of-7 3-pointers and 8-of-12 free throws while also adding eight assists, five rebounds and two steals in 35 minutes of action. Payne scored 20 of his 32 points in the first half as MSU built a 42-38 halftime advantage.

Bradshaw Named National Player of the Week by NBCSports.com (Dec. 1): Belmont's **Craig Bradshaw** was named the National Player of the Week by NBCSports.com/CollegeBasketballTalk following his play in three games that saw him average 33.0 points, 3.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.0 steals/game while hitting 58.2 percent (32-of-55) from the field, 58.6 percent (17-of-29) from 3-point range and 75 percent (18-of-24) from the free throw line in three Belmont victories. After scoring 29 and 28 points in games to open the week he hit 8-of-12 3-pointers on his way to a Belmont Division I scoring record of 42 points at Ohio; in that game he also raced the length of the court and hit the game-winning basket to lift his team to a 83-81 victory.

Belmont's Chamberlain Named Finalist for Senior CLASS Award: Belmont senior **Reece Chamberlain** is one of 10 Division I men's basketball players selected as finalists for the 2014-15 Senior CLASS Award®. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one male candidate and one female candidate who best exemplify excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition. The Senior CLASS Award winner will be announced during the 2015 NCAA Men's Final Four®.

Payne Named to Cousy Award Watch List: Murray State's **Cameron Payne** was named to the watch list of candidates for the 2015 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award. The annual honor, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes the top point guards in men's college basketball. The Watch List was initially 35 players and will be narrowed to five at the end of the season. The winner will be honored on Monday of Final Four weekend in Indianapolis.

Two OVC Players On Midseason Lou Henson Award Watch List: Two OVC men's basketball players have been named to the midseason Lou Henson Award Watch list by CollegeInsider.com. The Lou Henson Award is presented annually to the Division I "Mid-Major" Player of the Year. The OVC selections included Murray State sophomore guard **Cameron Payne** and Eastern Kentucky senior guard **Corey Walden**. The group are among 40 players nationally nominated for the award. The award is named in honor of Henson who retired after a spectacular coaching career that lasted 41 years. The 2015 recipient will be announced at the CollegeInsider.com Awards Banquet on April 3 in Indianapolis, site of the 2015 men's NCAA Basketball Championship.

OVC to Produce 14-Game National Television Package: The OVC will produce the largest national television package in its history in 2014-15 as 14 Conference games will air on either the ESPN Family of Networks or the CBS Sports Network. The Conference will once again have seven games on the ESPN Family of Networks, including four regular season games as well as the OVC Tournament semifinals and championship game. The OVC will also have a seven-game package on CBS Sports Network, up from just four games on the network a season ago. The 14-game package ensures that every member institution is on national television at least once this year. In addition the OVC will produce five games that will air in select markets on the new American Sports Network.

Recent Postseason Success: Last year the OVC had four men's basketball teams selected for postseason play (1 NCAA, 1 NIT, 1 CIT, 1 CBI) which matched an all-time high for a single season, tying the mark set in 2011. Overall OVC teams were 7-3 in postseason play in 2014; the seven total wins were the most for the OVC in one postseason (topping four wins in the 1971 season). With wins by Belmont (who advanced to the NIT Quarterfinals) and Murray State (who won the CIT Championship), OVC teams have won at least won at least one game in postseason play for six-straight years (the longest stretch in league history). Also included in that mark are wins in four of the past six NCAA Tournaments.

Loos is All-Time Winningest Coach in OVC History; Byrd Ranks 7th Among Active NCAA Coaches: With a 68-66 victory at Ohio on Dec. 9, 2009, Austin Peay head coach **Dave Loos** recorded his 320th career victory while in the OVC, a mark that ranks first all-time. Loos passed Cal Luther (319 wins at Murray State and UT Martin) for the all-time mark. Loos, the Dean of OVC coaches, is now in his 25th year at Austin Peay. Loos now has 391 victories in his tenure at Austin Peay and 473 for his career. Belmont head coach **Rick Byrd** (who is in his third year in the OVC) has 711 career victories, which ranks seventh among active Division I head coaches. Loos and Byrd are two of just six active Division I coaches to have coached at the same school for 20 or more years (the others are Syracuse's Jim Boeheim, Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, Oakland's Greg Kampe and Davidson's Bob McKillop).

OVC Men's Hoops in Third Year of Divisional Play: For the third year the OVC will use divisional play for men's basketball (the OVC women's teams are not using divisional play this year). The addition of Belmont University on July 1, 2012 gave the OVC 12 member institutions, the largest the Conference has been since it was formed in 1948 (the OVC is currently the nation's eighth-oldest Division I conference). The East Division includes Belmont, Eastern Kentucky, Jacksonville State, Morehead State, Tennessee State and Tennessee Tech. The West Division includes Austin Peay, Eastern Illinois, Murray State, Southeast Missouri State, SIUE and UT Martin.

Former OVC Players in the NBA: There are currently four former OVC players on NBA rosters. Former Morehead State All-American **Kenneth Faried** was the No. 22 overall pick in the 2011 NBA Draft and is in his fourth season with the Denver Nuggets. Faried was a two-time OVC Player of the Year, three-time OVC Defensive Player of the Year and set the NCAA Modern Era (since 1973) Rebounding record during his career. Faried was named to the NBA All-Rookie Team in 2012 and helped lead Team USA to a Gold Medal in the World Cup of Basketball this past summer. Former Murray State All-American **Isaiah Canaan** was drafted by the Houston Rockets and played with the team last year and the first half of this season before being traded to the Philadelphia 76ers. Former Belmont All-American **Ian Clark** signed a free agent deal with the Utah Jazz after doing undrafted and has a guaranteed deal with the Jazz this season. Former Tennessee State star **Robert Covington** was cut by Houston after spending last year with the team, but signed a free agent contract with the Philadelphia 76ers right after the season began. Three other former OVC players are currently playing in the NBDL: Travis Betran (Austin Peay) with the Erie BayHawks, Kevin Murphy (Tennessee Tech) with the Idaho Stampede and Walker Russell (Jacksonville State) with the Westchester Knicks.

The 2014-15 Season: The 2014-15 season marks the 67th of competition in the OVC. Over the previous 66 years, 13 different teams have claimed an OVC regular season championship.

OVC Tournament Once Again at Municipal Auditorium: The 2015 OVC Tournament was once again be played at Municipal Auditorium in Nashville, Tenn. (March 4-7). It marks the fifth-straight year the tournament has been at the venue and the 10th time the combined men's and women's tournaments have been held at the venue (1994, 1995, 1996, 2004, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014); the men's tournament was also held there in 1967 and 1989. The OVC recently signed an extension with Municipal Auditorium to hold the tournament there through 2017. Beginning in 2011 the Championship switched to a format where the top eight men's and women's teams play in the merit-based format. The No. 1 and 2 seeds received two byes to the semifinals while the No. 3 and 4 seeds received one bye into the quarterfinals. The first round included the No. 5 seed against the No. 8 seed and the No. 6 seed against the No. 7 seed. That format remains the same for the men's team, although the women's teams have switched back to a traditional bracket (1 vs. 8, 2 vs. 7, etc.) bracket this season. As part of the deal to host the tournament at Municipal Auditorium, the Nashville City Council and Municipal Auditorium committed \$200,000 to improvements at the venue, which opened in 1962. Among the major improvements included upgrades to the dressing rooms, two new scoreboards and the new OVC-branded playing surface. The floor was built by Horner Sports Flooring, whose corporate headquarters are in Dollar Bay, Mich. The company has made floors for many collegiate and National Basketball Association (NBA) teams, including building the floor for the 2010 NBA All-Star Game which was held at Texas Stadium.

Murray State's Payne Tabbed as Preseason Player of the Year: The 2014-15 OVC Preseason Men's Basketball team was headlined by Murray State sophomore guard **Cameron Payne** who was named the OVC Preseason Player of the Year. Payne is the first sophomore to be named Preseason Player of the Year since the award was first handed out in 1993-94. Overall seven different schools were represented on the team with Murray State having the most selections (3) and Belmont (2) also having multiple picks. Payne was named both a first-team All-OVC selection and OVC Freshman of the Year after averaging 16.8 points, 5.4 assists, 3.6 rebounds and 1.7 steals/game and leading Murray State to the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) Championship (where he was named MVP). In addition to Payne the other players named to the All-OVC Team last year and appearing on the preseason team this season are Southeast Missouri State senior guard **Jarekious Bradley**, Belmont junior guard **Craig Bradshaw**, Morehead State senior guard **Angelo Warner** and Murray State senior forward **Jarvis Williams**. The Preseason All-OVC Team was rounded out by Belmont senior guard **Reece Chamberlain**, Austin Peay junior center **Chris Horton**, Murray State senior guard **T.J. Sapp**, UT Martin senior forward **Myles Taylor** and Eastern Kentucky senior guard **Corey Walden**, who was the 2013-14 OVC Defensive Player of the Year.

Murray State Picked as OVC Preseason Favorite: In a vote of OVC head men's basketball coaches and sports information directors Murray State has been picked the preseason favorite for the 2014-15 season. Murray State, who has won a league-best 23 OVC regular season championships, picked up 15 of 24 first-place votes in being picked the overall regular season champion. The Racers were also tabbed the West Division favorites, picking up 22 of 24 first-place votes in that category, while two-time defending regular season champion Belmont was picked the East Division favorites. In the overall champion voting, in addition to Murray State picking up 15 first-place votes other teams with first-place votes included Belmont (7), Eastern Kentucky (1) and Morehead State (1). Since Murray State was picked as the overall champion, they were also an overwhelming favorite to take first place in its own division; the Racers have finished first in the West in each of the first two years of divisional play. MSU received 132 total points to top the West and were followed by Southeast Missouri (who picked up the other 2 first-place votes and 109 points), SIUE (77), Austin Peay (70), Eastern Illinois (64) and UT Martin (40). Belmont picked up 16 of the 24 first-place votes and 125 points in being picked the East Division favorite while Morehead State (103) and Eastern Kentucky (102) each picked up four first-place votes. The East was rounded out by Tennessee Tech (71), Jacksonville State (52) and Tennessee State (40).

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. This marks the eighth year the OVC has streamed live events, but the second year the events will be offered free of charge and in an HD format and will feature improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans will also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events will be available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps thanks new streaming technology.
