THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Tennessee State started the season with a 17-10 victory at Georgia State, marking its first victory over a FBS opponent as a member of the OVC (and first FBS win overall dating back to 1984)...It marked the fifth time in the last six years and sixth time in the last eight years that the OVC has at least one victory over a FBS opponent during the season...TSU's win was one of four by FCS teams over FBS foes during the first week of the season...Tennessee State senior linebacker Chris Collins was named National Defensive Player of the Week by STATS after netting 12 tackles, three tackles-for-loss, a sack and forcing a fumble in the victory...The win propelled Tennessee State into both Top 25 polls, coming in at No. 23 in the STATS polls and No. 24 in the FCS Coaches Poll; it marks the second-straight season the Tigers have been ranked...The only other OVC team ranked this week is Jacksonville State who is No. 5 in both polls after a victory over No. 12 ranked Chattanooga during Week Zero...Eastern Illinois drove 69 yards on the final possession of the game to score a touchdown with three seconds remaining to top Indiana State on the road...Combined with Jacksonville State's neutral site victory during Week Zero, OVC teams have three victories away from home to start the season...This week's schedule features all nine teams in action, with eight of those matchups coming away from home...Five of the games are against FBS opponents...Murray State is the lone OVC team to play at home this week when they host nationally-ranked Central Arkansas.

Roc Thomas, RB • 5-11, 193, Sr. • Oxford, Ala. • Jacksonville State

Thomas accounted for 190 all-purpose yards as No. 5 ranked Jacksonville State began the season with a 27-13 victory over No. 12 Chattanooga in the Guardian Credit Union FCS Kickoff Classic in Montgomery, Alabama during Week Zero. Thomas carried the ball 19 times for 122 yards (6.4 ypc) including a 76-yard touchdown in the first quarter. Thomas also caught three passes for 68 yards with a long reception of 48 yards.

CO-DEFENSIVE

Jonathan Hagler, LB • 6-0, 210, Sr. • Leeds, Ala. • Jacksonville State

In his first collegiate start, Hagler picked off a pass and returned it 52 yards for a touchdown as No. 5 Jacksonville State opened a 20-6 lead on its way to a 27-13 victory over No. 12 Chattanooga in the Guardian Credit Union FCS Kickoff during Week Zero. Hagler also had four tackles and a pass breakup during the victory.

CO-DEFENSIVE

Chris Collins, LB • 5-11, 230, Sr. • Fairburn, Ga. • Tennessee State

Collins recorded 12 tackles (9 solo), had three tackles-for-loss, a sack and forced a fumble as Tennessee State scored a victory over Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent Georgia State (17-10). With GSU driving on the opening series of the game, Collins knocked the ball loose two yards behind the scrimmage, allowing TSU to recover the ball on its own 25-yard line. In the third quarter the senior stopped a Georgia State runner at the four-yard line on fourth and goal to give TSU possession of the ball. Overall the Tennessee State defense allowed the FBS opponent just 273 yards of total offense for the game.

CO-SPECIALIST

Keith Wrzuszczak, P • 5-11, 212, Sr. • Geelong, Victoria, Australia • Eastern Kentucky

Wrzuszczak was able to keep a potent Western Kentucky punt return unit in check on Saturday in Bowling Green. The senior punted four times for a 40.5 yards/punt average, but only one punt was returnable for the WKU unit that ranked No. 2 nationally in punt returns a year ago (17.93 yards/return). Wrzuszczak had a long punt of 46 yards and placed one inside the Hilltoppers 20-yard line.

CO-SPECIALIST

Gabriel Vicente, K • 6-4, 200, Jr. • Miami, Fla. • Murray State

In his first-ever football game at any level (he had previously played soccer), Vicente was a perfect 7-of-7 on extra point attempts and connected from 30 yards on his lone field goal attempt in Murray State's 67-7 win over Kentucky Wesleyan. Vicente also kicked off four times for a 44.0 average.

NEWCOMER

Vincent Sellers, S • 6-1, 180, Fr. • Sarasota, Fla. • Tennessee State

Sellers recorded 10 tackles, including a tackle-for-loss, as Tennessee State opened the season with a 17-10 victory at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Georgia State. His biggest stop of the night came in the second quarter, as he made a tackle at the two-yard line and followed that with his tackle-for-loss which forced the Panthers to settle for a field goal. In the third quarter the freshman tracked down a GSU receiver on a 59-yard pass play, preventing a score, as Tennessee State's defense held Georgia State scoreless on that drive.

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Tennessee State Tops FBS Georgia State In Week 1: For the fifth time in the past six years and sixth time in the past eight seasons, an OVC beat has beaten a team from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) as Tennessee State topped Georgia State 17-10 on Aug. 31. It marked the first win for the Tigers over a FBS team since 1984 (prior to joining the OVC). OVC teams are now 35-217-1 all-time against FBS opponents. The recent success is impressive considering OVC teams went from 2004 to 2010 without a win over a FBS team (a 50-game losing streak). Collins Named National Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 4): Tennessee State senior linebacker **Chris Collins** was named National Defensive Player of the Week by STATS on September 4 after his play in the Tigers win over FBS Georgia State. Collins recorded 12 tackles (9 solo), had three tackles-for-loss, a sack and forced a fumble in the win. With GSU driving on the opening series of the game, Collins knocked the ball loose two yards behind the scrimmage, allowing TSU to recover the ball on its own 25-yard line. In the third quarter the senior stopped a Georgia State runner at the four-yard line on fourth and goal to give TSU possession of the ball.

Week Zero Games: Jacksonville State became the first OVC team to compete in "Week Zero" this season when they opened the season with a 27-13 win over No. 12 ranked Chattanooga on Aug. 26 at the Guardian Credit Union FCS Kickoff at the Cramton Bowl in Montgomery, Alabama. The FCS Kickoff began in 2014 and allows teams to play a game a week ahead of the start of the season if the game is broadcast on national television. It was one of three FCS games (and five FBS games) to be played in Week Zero. JSU will also play in the second annual Guardian Kickoff Classic on Aug. 25, 2018, against an opponent yet to be announced.

Jacksonville State, Tennessee State Ranked in National FCS Polls: Jacksonville State enters this week ranked No. 5 in both the STATS and FCS Coaches Top 25 polls. After receiving votes in the preseason, Tennessee State jumped to No. 23 in the STATS and No. 24 in the FCS Coaches poll following its 17-10 victory over FBS foe Georgia State. Several other OVC teams were among others receiving votes including UT Martin, Eastern Illinois and Eastern Kentucky.

Conference Winning Streaks: Jacksonville State has won 24 consecutive Conference games (dating back to the end of the 2013 season) which is the longest active streak nationally. Below is a list of active Conference winning streaks in the FCS. The all-time OVC record for consecutive Conference wins is 26 by Eastern Kentucky from 1992-95.

OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3: For the fifth-straight year the OVC is producing a "Game of the Week" package that will air on ESPN3 this fall. The eight-game schedule is once again in conjunction with Tupelo Raycom (formerly WebStream Sports), an Indianapolis-based company which is a proven leader in video production, streaming video and content creation Kevin Ingram, host of "The Wake Up Zone" on 104.5 The Zone in Nashville, will handle play-by-play duties while Bob Belvin, on-air talent and contributor at 104.1 FM/AM 540 (ESPN Clarksville), will provide analysis. The duo has worked together each of the past five years in the league's TV package. Four of the eight contests are "Wildcard Selections" which will be announced 12 days before the game, guaranteeing the top matchups will be broadcast.

season on the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. The award, sponsored by STATS, is given to the FCS Defensive Player of the Year. A national panel of over 150 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries will vote on the winner following the regular season. The three OVC players are Jacksonville State senior defensive lineman **Darius Jackson** (who finished fourth in balloting last year, tying the highest-ever finish by an OVC player) and sophomore defensive back **Marlon Bridges** as well as Tennessee State senior defensive lineman **Ebenezer Ogundeko**. The three selections were the second-most of any FCS conference.

UTM's Cook Named to CFPA Performer of the Year Watch List: UT Martin senior quarterback **Troy Cook** was the lone OVC player (and one of 42 nationally) on the preseason FCS National Performer of the Year Trophy Watch List by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA). The goal of the CFPA is to provide the most scientifically rigorous conferments in college football. Recipients are selected exclusively based upon objective scientific rankings of the extent to which individual players increase the overall effectiveness of their teams. The 2017 FCS National Performer of the Year Trophy is a 22-inch K-9 optic crystal trophy with 8-inch crystal football on top. All FCS players are eligible for the award. The award winner will be announced January 10, 2018.

Two OVC Kickers Named to Fred Mitchell Award Watch List: Tennessee State senior **Lane Clark** and Tennessee Tech junior **Nick Madonia** have been named to the 2017 Fred Mitchell Award Watch List. The Fred Mitchell Award is given to the nation's top collegiate place-kicker and takes into consideration excellence on the field and in the community. Overall 35 kickers were named to the initial watch list, including just six from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The winner will be announced in December.

Five OVC Players Named to Reece's Senior Bowl Watch List: Five OVC football student-athletes have been named to the 2017-18 Reese's Senior Bowl Watch List. The selections included Jacksonville State running back **Roc Thomas**, defensive end **Darius Jackson** and defensive back **Reggie Hall** and Tennessee State wide receiver **Patrick Smith** and defensive end **Ebenezer Ogundeko**. The five are among 31 FCS players on the watch list which includes over 400 total players from nearly every level of college football. These players are looking to fill the 110 roster spots that form the North and South squads for the nation's premier all-star game. The game will be played on Saturday, Jan. 28, 2017, inside Ladd-Peebles Stadium in Mobile, Ala. and will be televised on the NFL Network.

Sgt. York Trophy Presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee Enters 11th Season: This year marks the 11th of the Sgt. York Trophy presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee. The trophy (founded in 2007 by the Nashville Sports Council and OVC) goes to the winner of the quadrangular season football series between the four OVC football-playing schools located in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. As a corporal in the 2nd battalion, 328th Infantry, in the Battle of the Meuse River-Argonne (Oct. 8, 1918), York and seven other soldiers captured 132 prisoners, was promoted to sergeant and received the Distinguished Service Cross, the French Croix de Guerre, the French Legion of Honor, the Croce di Guerra of Italy and the War Medal of Montenegro. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy).

NCAA Division I Playoff Information: This season marks the fifth of an expanded 24-team field for the NCAA Division I Football Championship; in 2010 the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff field expanded to 20 teams, up from 16 previously, and in 2013 the field increased to 24 for the first time. The expansion in 2010 to 20 teams was the first since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The 24-team field is comprised of 10 automatic bids and 14 at-large berths. There are eight first round matchups (16 total teams), while eight (8) teams receive a bye into the second round. For the eighth time in 2017, the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Toyota Stadium, a

20,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference will serve as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 6.

Academic Success: During the past academic year (2016-17) there were 114 OVC football student-athletes who were named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll for having a 3.25 grade point average or higher. In addition, 10 student-athletes were awarded the OVC Academic Medal of Honor for achieving perfect 4.0 GPAs. The OVC also awards a Team Academic Award for the football program with the highest percentage of players with a 3.25 grade point average or higher; that award went to Eastern Illinois for 2016-17.

A Look at the Coaches: For the first time since 2011, all nine OVC head football coaches returned this season. Two OVC coaches, Jacksonville State's **John Grass** and Tennessee State's **Rod Reed**, are currently coaching at their alma mater. The longest tenured coach in the league is UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** who enters his 12th season with the Skyhawks in 2017. Simpson now has 72 overall victories in his career, eighth-most in OVC history (one out of seventh place).

Preseason Forecasts: For the fourth-straight year and sixth time in the past eight years, Jacksonville State has been picked the preseason football favorite in the OVC in a vote of league head coaches and sports information directors. The Gamecocks, who have won three-straight OVC Championships and 24-straight Conference games, received 16 of a possible 18 first-place votes in a poll of league head coaches and sports information directors. The Gamecocks totaled 128 total points to out-distance UT Martin, who picked up the other two first-place votes and was tabbed second (107 points). Tennessee State was picked third (96) and followed by Eastern Illinois (81), who was the last league team to beat Jacksonville State (at the end of the 2013 season). Eastern Kentucky was picked fifth (68) and followed by Tennessee Tech (64), Southeast Missouri (42), Murray State (41) and Austin Peay (21).

TSU's Smith and JSU's Jackson Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Tennessee State senior wide receiver **Patrick Smith** and Jacksonville State senior defensive lineman **Darius Jackson** were named the 2017 OVC Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and sports information directors. Jacksonville State led the way with nine total preseason selections. UT Martin had six picks, followed by five picks from Tennessee State, two picks apiece from Eastern Kentucky, Murray State and Southeast Missouri and one apiece from Eastern Illinois and Tennessee Tech. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last year (17 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included five players who were second-team picks in 2016. Of the 28 total selections, 19 were seniors, six were juniors and three were sophomores.

Instant Replay: Beginning this season the OVC will have instant replay for all non-conference and conference home football contests. The league has partnered with DVSPORT to implement replay which is defined by Rule 12 of the NCAA Football Rule Book.

Let's Get It Started: The 70th season of Ohio Valley Conference football got underway earlier than usual this season as Jacksonville State played in the Guardian Credit Union FCS Kickoff in Week Zero on Saturday, August 26. Six other OVC teams will play on Thursday, August 31 while the final two teams will play on Saturday, September 2. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools in 2016. Since its beginning, 15 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the league have claimed at least one championship.

I-AA No More: Although some people may still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (Football Bowl Subdivision teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

OVC Digital Network: The OVC launched the OVC Digital Network (OVCDN) in August 2012. The OVCDN is the exclusive home for live web streamed athletic contests involving OVC schools. Overall 2017-18 marks the 12th year the OVC has streamed live events. Starting with the re-branding of the streaming in 2012-13, events were offered free of charge and in an HD format and featured improved quality thanks to an investment in new equipment conference-wide. Fans also find it easier to log onto OVCDigitalNetwork.com and access the streams and can do so without any registration. The events are available on any computer, tablet or smart phone without needing any special downloads or apps; the league has also launched a Roku channel so fans can watch even more easily on their televisions. The games are also available on-demand immediately following the end of the contest. Approximately 36 OVC football games will be available on the OVCDN this season.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2017 season marks the 11th of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

The 2017 season is the fourth that the award has been presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

Last season Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin were each 2-1 to share the Sgt. York Championship. After tiebreakers UT Martin took home the traveling trophy for the third-straight year.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky makes the short trip to Lexington for its fifth all-time meeting with Kentucky on Saturday afternoon. The four previous meetings have come since 1998 with the last meeting in 2015 being the closest. The Colonels led that game 27-13 with 7:39 to go in the game and it took a Wildcat touchdown pass on fourth down with 52 seconds left to tie the game and force overtime. Kentucky scored on its first possession of the extra period before ECU failed to convert on fourth down on its possession. Bennie Coney passed for 183 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for another score while Ethan Thomas had a game-high 84 rushing yards. Patrick Towles passed for 329 yards and three scores (two to Dorian Baker) for the Wildcats. ECU is playing its second-straight Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent, and is 7-26 all-time against FBS teams, including a 17-10 win over Miami (Ohio) in 2014. Kentucky special teams coordinator Dean Hood was the head coach at Eastern Kentucky from 2008-15, winning 49 games and a pair of OVC Championships.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky opened the 2017 season by facing rival Western Kentucky for the first time since the 2008 season. ECU was able to limit the FBS Hilltoppers, who averaged 45.5 points and 523 yards of total offense/game last season, to 31 total points and 364 yards (including 100 rushing yards). UConn transfer Tim Boyle made his debut at quarterback for the Colonels and threw for game-high 320 yards and a pair of touchdown passes. Boyle connected with Ryan Markush seven times, as Markush finished the game with 107 receiving yards and two scores. Neiko Creamer added six catches for 79 yards. Senior punter and Australia native Keith Wrzuszczyk was named OVC Co-Specialist of the Week after averaging 40.5 yards/punt and limiting the explosive WKU returners to just one return during the game. The senior had a long punt of 46 yards and place one inside the 20-yard line. Defensively Luder Jean Louis had four tackles, 1.5 sacks and forced a fumble.

SCOUTING KENTUCKY: Kentucky, 8-3 over its past 11 regular season games, opened its season by avenging a loss to Southern Miss from the 2015 season by winning 24-17 in Hattiesburg. It marked the 600th all-time win in program history. UK limited Southern Miss to just 55 net rushing yards and scored 14 points off USM turnovers, including scoring on a 20-yard fumble recovery at the end of the third quarter. Those factors helped Kentucky win despite being out-gained for the game by a 364 to 254 margin. Stephen Johnson passed for 176 yards and a touchdown and rushed for another score while Benny Snell had a game-high 67 rushing yards. Courtney Love had a team-high nine tackles and recovered a fumble. New Kentucky punter Matt Pantone, a native of Melbourne, Australia, averaged 42 yards/punt in his debut.

GAME NOTES: For the second-time in the past three seasons, UT Martin will travel to Ole Miss for a matchup with the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) Rebels. Two years ago, Ole Miss was ranked 15th nationally and scored the first 55 points of the game in winning 76-3. The Rebels finished that victory with 662 yards of total offense while the Skyhawks were limited to just 290 yards. Chad Kelly passed for 211 yards and two scores for Ole Miss while Eugene Brazley rushed for 88 yards and a score. UTM was led by Jarod Neal who passed for 139 yards. Ole Miss would go on to finish that season 10-3 overall (6-2 SEC), including a win over No. 2 Alabama, and top Oklahoma State in the Sugar Bowl. After playing three FBS teams a season ago, this is the only FBS opponent for UT Martin this year. The Skyhawks are 1-23 all-time against FBS teams (beating Memphis in 2012).

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: Playing in a persistent rain, UT Martin opened the 2017 campaign last Thursday with a 36-0 shutout of Division II Clarion. It marked the first shutout for the Skyhawks since the 2011 season and gave head coach Jason Simpson his 73rd career victory, moving him into seventh place in OVC history. The UTM defense limited Clarion to 146 yards of total offense and forced three turnovers, two coming from interceptions. Overall the team made 11 tackles-for-loss, its most since the 2015 season. Kevin Prather, Jr. led the way with 11 tackles, including 3.0 for loss and breaking up two passes. Joseph Este finished the game with five pass breakups and currently ranks first in the nation in that category. Este also had five tackles including 2.0 tackles-for-loss. Junior transfer Ladarius Galloway carried the offense with 157 rushing yards on 17 carries (9.2 ypc) and caught three passes for 41 yards. Galloway had a 29-yard run for a score early in the fourth quarter and was the first UTM player to rush for 100 yards in his debut since the 2000 season, and first in the program's Division I history to reach 150 rushing yards in his debut. Quarterback Troy Cook, a preseason All-OVC selection, tossed a pair of touchdowns.

SCOUTING OLE MISS: Ole Miss began the Matt Luke Era with a victory, topping South Alabama 47-27. The Rebels led 13-10 at halftime but outscored USA 27-3 in the third quarter to pull ahead for good. Ole Miss finished the game with 531 yards of total offense including 429 passing yards and four touchdowns from sophomore quarterback Shea Patterson. Patterson had two touchdown passes longer than 70 yards, joining Eli Manning as the only players in school history to achieve the feat. Sophomore wide receiver A.J. Brown caught both of the long scores and finished the day with eight catches for a school record 233 yards and two scores. C.J. Moore had a career-high eight tackles in his first career start.

GAME NOTES: After a week off, Jacksonville State will travel to Atlanta for its third all-time meeting with Georgia Tech on Saturday. It marks the first meeting between the programs since 2009 (the teams also played in 2008). In that meeting the Yellowjackets were ranked No. 15 in the FBS while the Gamecocks were the No. 19 ranked team in the FCS. GT rushed for 335 yards while limiting JSU to just 98 yards on the ground. Jonathan Dwyer led the way with 95 rushing yards and two scores while quarterback Josh Nesbitt rushed for 93 yards and a score and passed for 141 yards and another score. Marques Ivory passed for 193 yards and two touchdowns for JSU in the 37-17 loss. Jacksonville State is 5-20 all-time against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents, including wins in 2010 and 2013 most recently.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Jacksonville State opened the season with a 27-13 victory over No. 12 Chattanooga in the Guardian Credit Union FCS Kickoff in Montgomery, Alabama during Week Zero. The Gamecocks did not have a game this past week and following the game with Georgia Tech on Saturday will have a week off before hosting transitioning FBS team Liberty (who opened the season with a win over Baylor). JSU, ranked No. 5 in both FCS Top 25 polls, was paced by senior Roc Thomas who rushed for 122 yards and a touchdown and caught three passes for 68 yards in being named OVC Offensive Player of the Week and NCAA.com National Player of the Week. In his debut at quarterback, Bryant Horn completed 14-of-20 passes for 182 yards and a touchdown. The Jacksonville State defense was once again stout, allowing just 294 yards of offense for the game, 117 of which came in the final 3:27 of the game against backups. Jonathan Hagler intercepted a pass and returned it 52 yards for a touchdown in earning OVC Co-Defensive Player of the Week honors. Quan Stoudemire added a team-best nine tackles while All-American Darius Jackson made four stops and had four quarterback hurries. Jackson also established a new JSU career record for tackles-for-loss (163) during the game. Overall it marked the 32nd-straight victory for JSU over non-FBS opponents during the regular season.

SCOUTING GEORGIA TECH: While Jacksonville State was one of the first teams to begin the season (playing in Week Zero), Georgia Tech was one of the last to begin play in taking on nationally-ranked Tennessee in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game at the new Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta on Monday night. The Yellowjackets open its 125th season of football coming off a win over Kentucky in the TaxSlayer Bowl to end last season. Overall the team ended last year by winning four-straight games and return 15 starters (seven on offense, eight of defense) from that team. Georgia Tech has led the ACC and ranked in the Top 10 nationally in rushing yards in each of the past nine seasons.

GAME NOTES: Saturday marks the first meeting between Southeast Missouri and Dayton. Southeast Missouri is 3-3 all-time against Pioneer Football League opponents.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri opened its 113th season of football with a 38-16 setup at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent Kansas. Senior quarterback Jesse Hosket completed 25-of-44 passes for 170 yards and two touchdowns in the opener. It marked the third time in his last four starts he had thrown for multiple touchdowns in a game. Sophomore Kristian Wilkerson caught nine passes for 68 yards and a touchdown; the nine receptions were the fifth-most among FCS players during Week 1 of the season. Marquis Terry had a game-high 87 rushing yards on 23 attempts; the 23 attempts were more than any Southeast player had in a game all of last season. Southeast Missouri has now scored in 67-straight games, the third-longest streak in the OVC. The Southeast defense forced three turnovers and limited the Jayhawks to just 73 net rushing yards. Senior Chad Meredith moved closer to the 200-career tackle mark with six tackles; Meredith now has 182 stops in his career and has started 23-straight games for the Redhawks. Mike Ford, who missed the last four games of last season with an injury, returned to action to net five tackles, a sack and two pass breakups. Sophomore Shabari Davis averaged 26.3 yards on three punt returns, including a long of 30 yards. That currently ranks him fifth nationally.

SCOUTING DAYTON: Dayton, a member of the non-scholarship Pioneer Football League, is known for its high-powered offense. The Flyers have a streak of 455 consecutive games without being shutout (261 of those coming as a FCS program). The team entered this season with a .761 winning percentage since 2000, the third-best among all FCS programs. Dayton began this season with a 13-10 road loss to Robert Morris. The game was decided by a 26-yard field goal with just four seconds remaining. UD scored the first 10 points of the game, beginning with a 16-yard touchdown pass from Kyle Kaparos to Matt Tunnacliffe. Kaparos finished the game with 122 passing yards in place of injured starter Alex Jeske, who is recovering from a broken foot. Tucker Yinger led the team with 107 rushing yards while Andrew McCormick led the Flyers with 11 tackles, a tackle-for-loss and a sack.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay will play its second-straight game against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), after a season-opening loss to Cincinnati. The Govs are 1-22 all-time against FBS opponents, with the lone win coming against Kansas State in 1987. Saturday will mark the first meeting between Austin Peay and Miami (Ohio). OVC teams have topped Miami in two of the past three seasons (EKU in 2014, EIU in 2016).

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: Austin Peay began its second season under Will Healy with a gutsy performance against Cincinnati, out-gaining the FBS Bearcats 313 to 248, including amassing 224 rushing yards (the fifth-consecutive game APSU had rushed for more than 200-plus yards). The game was tied at seven in the first quarter and Austin Peay was able to pull within six points early in the fourth quarter on a touchdown run by Josh Alexander. The 12-point loss was the second-closest margin ever in a loss against a FBS opponent; APSU had been outscored 377-40 in its last seven games against FBS teams. The Govs defense limited UC to just 97 rushing yards, the first time since 2012 the team had held an opponent to below 100 rushing yards. Starting quarterback JaVaughn Craig passed for 63 yards and a touchdown and was the team's leading rusher with 92 yards on 15 carries (6.1 ypc). Kentel Williams added 40 rushing yards and a pair of catches, including a 19-yard touchdown catch in the first quarter. Malik Boynton had nine tackles and forced a fumble for the Govs while Gunnar Scholato also added nine tackles.

SCOUTING MIAMI (OHIO): A year ago Miami started the season 0-6 but rebounded to win six-straight games and earn a spot in the St. Petersburg Bowl. This season Miami, picked second in East Division of the MAC Pre-season Poll, opened the season with a 31-26 road loss to Marshall. The RedHawks outgained Marshall by a 429 to 267 margin, but the Thundering Herd scored on two kickoff returns and an interception return to account for three of its four touchdowns. Quarterback Gus Ragland completed 23-of-44 passes for 298 yards and two touchdowns while running for a third score while Alonzo Smith led the team with 59 rushing yards. James Gardner hauled in eight passes for 111 yards while Ryan Smith added seven receptions for 98 yards and two scores.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Illinois takes on its lone Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent of the season when it takes the three-hour trip to DeKalb. The teams have played 36 previous times, but only once in the past 20 years. EIU topped NIU 24-10 in 1998 (the first meeting between the two since 1965) but in the last meeting in 2013, the Huskies came out on top 43-39. In that game All-American Jimmy Garoppolo got the Panthers off to a 20-6 lead after the first quarter and the game was the Panthers led 39-36 with 9:53 to go after Garoppolo connected with Erik Lora for a touchdown. But NIU would score a minute and a half later to go ahead for good. Garoppolo, currently the Patriots backup quarterback, finished the game 34-of-49 for 450 yards and six touchdowns while Jordan Lynch, who finished third for the Heisman that season and is now the NIU running backs coach, passed for 235 yards and a touchdown and rushed for 189 yards. That loss was the only suffered by either team during the 2013 regular season. EIU is 5-23 against FBS opponents since joining the OVC in 1996 (and 10-35 overall).

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: In its first meeting with Indiana State since 2009, Eastern Illinois saw its lead slip away late in the fourth quarter before mounting a last second drive to pull out a 22-20 victory. After falling down 20-16 with 4:54 to play, the team then failed to convert on a field goal attempt, giving EIU the ball back and allowing senior quarterback Mitch Kimble to orchestrate an 11-play, 69-yard drive that was capped by a 15-yard touchdown pass to Dennis Turner with three seconds remaining. Kimble finished the game 27-of-44 for 202 yards and a touchdown despite being sacked five times; 67 of his passes yards came on the final drive of the game. Isaiah Johnson was the team's leading rusher, gaining 65 yards on 15 carries and also scoring a touchdown. Senior Tray Mitchell had 11 tackles, 3.0 tackles-for-loss, a sack and a forced fumble and recovery; he also had a 19-yard interception return for a touchdown nullified by a penalty away from the ball. Freshman defensive back Mark Williams intercepted a pass in the first quarter which he returned 73 yards for a touchdown; it was the eighth longest interception return for a score in school history.

SCOUTING NORTHERN ILLINOIS: Northern Illinois began the season with a home setback to Boston College last Friday. The back-and-forth game was tied at 20 for most of the fourth quarter until BC used a 13-play drive capped by a field goal with just 2:13 remaining. The Huskies were able to drive down the field by its 39-yard attempt bounced off the front of the crossbar. Quarterback Ryan Graham passed for 190 yards and two touchdowns and was the team's top rusher with 99 yards on 12 attempts (8.3 ypc). His favorite target was Chad Beebe who hauled in six passes for 93 yards. Kyle Pugh led Northern Illinois with 17 tackles (and added an interception) after not registering a tackle as a freshman a season ago. Sutton Smith had five tackles-for-loss and a sack.

GAME NOTES: Central Arkansas travels to Murray State for the fifth all-time meeting between the two programs (and third in Murray). The series dates back to a meeting in 1939, but after a 1940 game the series was stagnant until 2010. The teams last played five years ago at Stewart Stadium when UCA was ranked No. 20 nationally. The Bears jumped out to a 28-7 advantage in that contest on the way to a 42-20 victory. The two teams combined for 960 yards of total offense, including 863 yards through the air. Casey Brockman, now MSU's quarterbacks coach, passed for 445 yards and a touchdown in the contest while Wynrick Smothers passed for 358 yards and five touchdowns for UCA.

SCOUTING CENTRAL ARKANSAS: Central Arkansas faced its first-ever nationally-ranked Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent when they traveled to No. 19/20 Kansas State. Following a 37-yard touchdown run by Brandon Cox late in the first quarter, UCA was tied 10-10 with the Wildcats. But Kansas State would score 28 second quarter points on its way to the 55-19 victory. Sophomore Carlos Blackman carried the ball 24 times for 114 yards while quarterback Hayden Hildebrand completed 27-of-35 passes for 198 yards and a touchdown. Hildenbrand completed passes to 11 different receivers, with junior newcomer Lester Wells catching six for 41 yards. Senior Tre Smith had six tackles to lead UCA against K-State. Central Arkansas was ranked No. 15 in the preseason FCS polls and are ranked 15 this week in the STATS poll and No. 16 in the FCS Coaches poll.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: Murray State never allowed Division II foe Kentucky Wesleyan a chance to stay in the game as the Racers scored 22 first quarter points on its way to a 46-0 halftime lead and eventually a 67-7 victory to open the 2017 season. MSU had 457 yards of total offense and in his Racer debut, quarterback Shuler Bentley completed 18-of-26 passes for 162 yards and four touchdowns. Three of those scores went to Jordan Gandy, who had four catches for 90 yards on the night. Gandy became just the fourth receiver in Murray State history to catch at least three touchdowns in a game. Demetric Johnson added seven catches for 80 yards and a score while Nick Collins rushed for 75 yards and a touchdown. Overall MSU ended up with more rushing yards (243) than passing yards (214), the first time they achieved that feat since 2014. The Racers defense limited KWC to 159 yards of total offense as Kenney Wooten had three sacks. Marico Paige and Bishop Woods each added six tackles. Junior kicker Gabriel Vicente was named OVC Co-Specialist of the Week after playing in his first-ever football game (he had previously only played soccer). Vicente was a perfect 7-of-7 in PATs and connected on his lone field goal attempt of the night.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech opened its second season under head coach Marcus Satterfield by falling to No. 25 ranked Western Illinois last Thursday night. The Golden Eagles fell behind 10-0 at halftime and then saw the Leathernecks score 24 unanswered points in the third quarter to put the game out of reach. Redshirt freshman Andre Sale got the start at quarterback and completed 11-of-21 passes for 223 yards and a pair of touchdowns. One of the touchdowns went to Darius Stafford who had a team-high 95 receiving yards. Senior Donte Byrd caught the other touchdown pass and finished the game with 76 receiving yards. TTU could not get the rushing game going, finishing with 0 net yards after 40 yards in losses. Elliott Normand finished the game with a career-high 18 tackles, just five shy of the school's single-game record. Deontay Wilson added 11 stops while Deven Sullivan had 10 tackles.

SCOUTING KENNESAW STATE: Kennesaw State is coming off an 8-3 season (3-2 in the Big South) in what was just its second year of existence. That led the Owls to receive votes in the national polls during the preseason. KSU began the season at No. 19 Samford in a game that featured over 850 yards of total offense, including 545 by KSU. Despite the high totals Kennesaw State did not lead during the second half (which was delayed by three hours due to storms at halftime), as Samford opened the third quarter with a scoring drive to pull ahead for good. Junior running back Jake McKenzie rushed for 48 yards and two touchdowns and also threw for a touchdown. Overall KSU rushed for 293 yards while holding Samford to just 70 yards on the ground. Izzy Sam had a team-high 10 tackles (including 2.0 for loss and a sack) while redshirt freshman Bryson Armstrong had seven tackles, an interception and recovered a fumble.

GAME NOTES: Tennessee State and Jackson State meet in the 28th annual Southern Heritage Classic at the Liberty Bowl in Memphis on Saturday night. This marks the 24th year in a row (and 26th overall) that the teams have squared off in this Classic which began in 1990 (the two other games were between TSU and Mississippi Valley State and Grambling). Tennessee State had won seven-straight in the series until Jackson State pulled off wins in 2010 and 2011, but since TSU has claimed victory in each of the last five years. Tennessee State is 16-11 all-time in the event while Jackson State is 9-16. The all-time series between the two schools is at 28-20-2 in favor of Tennessee State. In last year's game Tennessee State overcame a halftime deficit by scoring three-straight touchdowns, including two in an eight-second stretch of the third quarter. Erick Evans rushed for 109 yards and two scores for TSU while O'Shay Ackerman-Carter had 227 yards throw the air. Jackson State was led by Ivy LaMontiez who had 167 passing and 32 rushing yards. Jackson State scored on a pair of blocked punts in the game while TSU's defense was paced by Ebenezer Ogundeko who had 11 tackles and 2.0 sacks.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: Tennessee State opened the 2017 season by defeating a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent for the first time as a member of the OVC (and first time overall since 1984) in topping Georgia State 17-10 and spoiling the debut of the Panthers new stadium. The victory propelled the Tigers to No. 23 in the STATS Top 25 poll and No. 24 in the FCS Coaches Top 25, marking the second-straight season the program has been ranked. TSU limited Georgia State to 49 rushing and 273 yards of total offense. Senior linebacker Chris Collins led the way with 12 tackles, 3.0 tackles-for-loss, a sack and forcing a fumble. He also made a key stop at the four-yard line on fourth down late in the game to help TSU pull out the win. For his effort, he was named FCS National Defensive Player of the Week by STATS. Freshman safety Vincent Sellers also got into the act and earned OVC Newcomer of the Week honors after making 10 tackles including a key tackle on a 59-yard pass play in the third quarter to prevent a score. Offensively the game saw the debut of Florida transfer Treon Harris, who carried the ball 11 times for 91 yards (8.3 ypc) and a touchdown and passed for 145 yards. He connected with senior Patrick Smith for six completions and 70 yards; in the process Smith moved into ninth place on TSU's career receptions list (121). Seth Rowland added 76 yards and a touchdown on the ground for TSU.

SCOUTING JACKSON STATE: Jackson State opened the season at FBS TCU and was limited to just 65 yards of total offense in falling 63-0. The Tigers gained 40 yards on the first possession of the game, moving the ball to the TCU 35-yard line. Unfortunately that was as close as JSU would get to the end zone, only advancing the ball into TCU territory once more during the game. Brent Lyles passed for 40 yards, but was sacked three times and finished with -44 yards rushing on the night. Jordon Johnson had a team-best 41 rushing yards. Deion Pope led the Tigers with seven tackles while Ryan Theyard had an interception.
