THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Austin Peay, Jacksonville State and Southeast Missouri picked up their first victories of the season in Week 2...Tennessee State saw its game with Jackson State cancelled due to weather and is the lone undefeated team in the OVC (1-0)...Jacksonville State is now ranked No. 11/12 in the FCS polls while Austin Peay is No. 23 in the FCS Coaches poll and just outside the STATS polls (No. 26)...Southeast Missouri senior running back Marquis Terry is second nationally in rushing yards/carry (11.16) and fifth in total rushing yards (279); he rushed for a career-high 202 yards in Saturday's win over Dayton...16 former OVC players are currently on NFL rosters (11 active, 4 practice squad, 1 IR/PUP)...Austin Peay's 24-0 blanking of Presbyterian was the team's second shutout under head coach Will Healy...This season 36 OVC football games will be streamed on ESPN+ this season, after the OVC agreed to an extension on its media rights deal with ESPN; the ESPN+ broadcasts will replace games formerly on the OVC Digital Network...This week five of the eight games on the schedule can be viewed on ESPN+...This week's schedule once again includes a Thursday night game, as Tennessee Tech will play at FBS foe Utah State...That is one of three games for OVC teams against FBS opponents during Week 3...Only two OVC teams (Eastern Illinois and UT Martin) have home games this week...Southeast Missouri will take on regional rival Southern Illinois in the 86th all-time meeting between the schools; this year the rivalry has been branded "War for the Wheel" to embrace the influence and history of the Mississippi River between the two schools...Eastern Illinois and Indiana State will meet for the 85th time on Saturday.

OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

CO-OFFENSIVE

Daniel Santacaterina, QB • 6-1, 210, Jr. • Geneva, Ill. • Southeast Missouri

Santacaterina threw for three touchdowns and ran for another score in Southeast Missouri's 40-21 victory over Dayton. The transfer from Northern Illinois completed 21-of-31 passes for 269 yards and three touchdowns (including two in the fourth quarter) and also rushed for a nine-yard touchdown in the second quarter. He engineered scoring drives of 72, 73 and 90 yards in the fourth quarter as the Redhawks overcame a one-point deficit entering the frame to win by 19 points. Included in his trio of touchdown passes was a 73-yarder to Zack Smith. The junior currently ranks 12th nationally in passing efficiency (169.4), 13th in completion percentage (69.8%), 17th in passing touchdowns (4) and 25th in points responsible for/game (15.0).

CO-OFFENSIVE

Dresser Winn, QB • 6-3, 200, So. • Dresden, Tenn. • UT Martin

Winn had career-highs in completions (34), attempts (53), yards (355) and touchdowns (4) in UT Martin's game at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent Middle Tennessee. The sophomore had a touchdown in each quarter, keeping the Skyhawks in the game, as the team trailed by only 10 with 9:32 to play in the game before losing 61-37. Winn had touchdowns of 16, 11, 51 and 8 yards, two of which went to Terry Williams. The 34 completions and 54 attempts were the sixth-most in program history while the 355 yards were the 20th-most in UTM history in what was just his seventh collegiate start. Winn ranks eighth nationally in passing touchdowns (5), 10th in completions/game (24.5) and 22nd in passing yards/game (261.5).

DEFENSIVE

Leodis Moore III, LB • 5-9, 190, Jr. • Indianapolis, Ind. • Eastern Kentucky

Moore had seven tackles, a tackle-for-loss, an interception, pass breakup and blocked kick in Eastern Kentucky's loss at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent Marshall. His interception at his team's own 23-yard line in the second quarter kept the Colonels within seven points. His blocked point after attempt came in the first quarter.

Jason Pierce, P • 6-3, 215, Fr. • Powder Spring, Ga. • Jacksonville State

In his second career game, Pierce punted three times for an average of 47.7 yards in Jacksonville State's 71-0 victory over Mississippi Valley State. The freshman had a long punt of 61 yards and pinned two of his punts inside the Delta Devils 20-yard line.

CO-SPECIALIST

Nicholas Litang, K • 5-10, 205, Sr. • Boca Raton, Fla. • Southeast Missouri

Litang was perfect on kicks in Southeast Missouri's 40-21 come-from-behind victory over Dayton. The senior connected from 37 and 35 yards on field goal attempts and was 4-of-4 on point after attempts to net 10 points. He is currently perfect on the season in kicks (2-of-2 FGs and 7-of-7 PATs).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

ESPN+: The OVC has announced an extension of its media rights deal with ESPN that will make ESPN+, the first multi-sport, direct-to-consumer subscription streaming service from The Walt Disney Company Direct-to-Consumer & International segment, the exclusive home of regular season and OVC Championship broadcasts. This season 36 OVC football games will air on ESPN+ (eight other games will be on ESPN3). Fans can subscribe to ESPN+ for \$4.99 a month (or \$49.99 per year). ESPN+ is an integrated part of the completely redesigned ESPN App and also available on the web, iPhone, iPad, tvOS, Android Handset, Apple TV, Roku, Chromecast and FireTV. More information can be found at www.OVCsports.com/ESPN.

OVC in NCAA Statistical Leaders: Entering this week, Jacksonville State ranks first nationally in fourth down conversion percentage (100%) and fourth down conversion defense (0.0%), second in total defense (140.5 yards/game), third in rushing defense (14.5 yards/game), fourth in tackles-for-loss (11.0/game), fifth in scoring defense (10.0 points/game) and tackles-for-loss allowed (3.0/game) and sixth in total offense (528.5 yards/game) and pass efficiency defense (76.92) and 10th in scoring offense (44.0 points/game). Eastern Kentucky ranks fourth in turnovers gained (6) and blocked kicks (2), sixth in kickoff returns (28.0 yards/return) and eighth nationally in rushing offense (271.5 yards/game). Tennessee State ranks first in scoring defense (3.0 points/game), fumbles lost (0), interceptions thrown (0), turnovers lost (0) and fourth down conversion defense (0.0%), second in sacks (5.0/game), third in third down conversion defense (15.4%), sixth in turnover margin (+2.0/game) and time of possession (35:46), seventh in total offense (525.0 yards/game) and kickoff return defense (10.75 yards/return), ninth in rushing defense (66.0 yards/game) and pass efficiency defense (90.17) and 10th in passing offense (324.0 yards/game). Southeast Missouri ranks first in fumbles lost (0), interceptions thrown (0), turnovers lost (0) and red zone offense (100%) and third in turnover margin (+2.5/game). UT Martin ranks first in kickoff return defense (0.0 yards/return) while Austin Peay is first in fourth down conversion defense (0.0%) and interceptions thrown (0) and fourth in sacks allowed (0.5/game) while Eastern Illinois is fifth in fewest yards penalized/game (27.5). Individually, Southeast Missouri's **Marquis Terry** is second in rushing yards/carry (11.16), fifth in total rushing yards (279), sixth in rushing (139.5 yards/game) and 10th in all-purpose yards (178.0 yards/game). Tennessee State's **Chris Rowland** is second in all-purpose yards (226.0 yards/game), fifth in receiving yards/game (154.0) and 10th in punt returns (16.0 yards/return). Jacksonville State's **Josh Pearson** is sixth in receiving touchdowns (3), seventh in total receiving yards (260) and eighth in receiving yards/game (130.0). Eastern Illinois' **Alexander Hollins** is sixth in receiving touchdowns (3) and eighth in receptions/game (8.0). UT Martin's **Dresser Winn** is eighth in passing touchdowns (5) and 10th in completions/game (24.5). Southeast Missouri's **Zach Hall** is second in tackles (15.5/game) while TSU's **Christion Abercrombie** is sixth in sacks (1.5/game).

OVC Teams Against FBS Opponents: OVC teams will play 10 total games against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents in 2018. OVC teams are a combined 35-283-1 all-time against FBS foes, including wins over FBS teams in five of the past six seasons.

National Polls: A pair of OVC teams remain in the FCS Top 25 polls this week. After its win over Mississippi Valley State, Jacksonville State climbed one spot to No. 11 in the AFCA FCS Coaches Poll and No. 12 in the STATS Top 25. It marks the 63rd-straight week the team has been ranked. After a win over Presbyterian, Austin Peay moved up one spot to No. 23 in the Coaches Poll and remains unranked in the STATS poll (unofficially 26th). This year marks the first time the APSU program has ever been ranked.

Jacksonville State Sets OVC Record For Consecutive Conference Wins: With a victory over Eastern Kentucky on October 14, 2017, Jacksonville State won its 27th consecutive Conference game (dating back to the end of the 2013 season) which set the OVC all-time record, breaking the mark of 26 previously held by Eastern Kentucky (1992-95). The now 32-game streak is the second-longest in FCS history, trailing only 39-straight wins by Duquesne in the MAAC from 1999-2006. The streak is currently the longest active streak in Division I. OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3: For the sixth-straight year the OVC is producing a "Game of the Week" package that will air on ESPN3 this fall. The eight-game schedule is once again in conjunction with Tupelo Raycom. Kevin Ingram, host of "The Wake Up Zone" on 104.5 The Zone in Nashville, will handle play-by-play duties while Bob Belvin, on-air talent and contributor at 104.1 FM/AM 540 (ESPN Clarksville), will provide analysis. The duo has worked together each of the past six years in the league's TV package. Four of the eight contests are "Wildcard Selections" which will be announced 12 days before the game, guaranteeing the top matchups will be broadcast.

Two OVC Players on the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Jacksonville State junior safety **Marlon Bridges** and Austin Peay junior defensive end **Jaison Williams** are two of 25 players nationally named to the preseason Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. The award, sponsored by STATS, is given to the top defensive player in the FCS. A national panel of sports information/media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries will vote on the winner following the regular season. Last season JSU defensive end Darius Jackson became the first OVC player to win the award since the award began in 1995.

SEMO's Marquis Terry on Walter Payton Award Watch List: Southeast Missouri senior RB **Marquis Terry** is one of 25 players nationally on the preseason Walter Payton Award Watch List. The award, sponsored by STATS, is given to the top offensive player in the FCS. A national panel of sports information/media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries will vote on the winner following the regular season. Two OVC players, Eastern Illinois' Tony Romo (2002) and Jimmy Garoppolo (2013), have previously won the award, which began in 1987.

Three OVC Players on Senior Bowl Watch List: Three OVC players have been named to the Senior Bowl Watch List, that includes student-athletes from every level of college football. The Senior Bowl will be held on Saturday, January 29, 2019 in Mobile, Alabama. The OVC players on the preseason list were Jacksonville State offensive lineman **B.J. Autry**, Murray State quarterback **Drew Anderson** and JSU defensive lineman **Denzil Ware**.

League Shifts From Offense to Defense: At the end of the season (2017), three OVC teams ranked in the top seven nationally in total defense: Jacksonville State (2nd), UT Martin (6th) and Tennessee State (7th). In the past five years there have never been more than two OVC teams rank in the Top 25 in total defense at the end of the season. On the flip side, only one team (Austin Peay) finished in the Top 50 nationally in total offense (49th).

Sgt. York Trophy Presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee Enters 12th Season: This year marks the 12th of the Sgt. York Trophy presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee. The trophy (founded in 2007 by the Nashville Sports Council and OVC) goes to the winner of the quadrangular season football series between the four OVC football-playing schools located in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. As a corporal in the 2nd battalion, 328th Infantry, in the Battle of the Meuse River-Argonne (Oct. 8, 1918), York and seven other soldiers captured 132 prisoners, was promoted to sergeant and received the Distinguished Service Cross, the French Croix de Guerre, the French Legion of Honor, the Croce di Guerra of Italy and the War Medal of Montenegro. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy).

Hall Named STATS National Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 3): Southeast Missouri junior linebacker **Zach Hall** was named the STATS National Defensive Player of the Week by STATS on Sept. 3. Hall had 22 tackles in his team's game against Arkansas State on September 1. It is the most tackles by a NCAA player at any level (FBS, FCS, DII, DIII) in 2018, and most by an OVC player since the 2008 season. He also added a tackle-for-loss and forced a fumble.

NCAA Division I Playoff Information: This season marks the sixth of an expanded 24-team field for the NCAA Division I Football Championship; in 2010 the Football Championship Sub-division (FCS) playoff field expanded to 20 teams, up from 16 previously, and in 2013 the field increased to 24 for the first time. The expansion in 2010 to 20 teams was the first since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The 24-team field is comprised of 10 automatic bids and 14 at-large berths. There are eight first round matchups (16 total teams), while eight (8) teams receive a bye into the second round. For the ninth time in 2018, the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Toyota Stadium, a 20,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference serves as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 5.

Academic Success: During the past academic year (2017-18) there were 103 OVC football student-athletes who were named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll for having a 3.25 grade point average or higher. In addition, 11 student-athletes were awarded the OVC Academic Medal of Honor for achieving perfect 4.0 GPAs. The OVC also awards a Team Academic Award for the football program with the highest percentage of players with a 3.25 grade point average or higher; that award went to Jacksonville State for 2017-18.

A Look at the Coaches: There is only one new head coach in the OVC this season as **Dewayne Alexander**, taking over at his alma mater (Tennessee Tech), after having previously been an assistant coach. He is one of three OVC coaches, joining Jacksonville State's **John Grass** and Tennessee State's **Rod Reed**, who are currently coaching at their alma mater. The longest tenured coach in the league is UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** who enters his 13th season with the Skyhawks in 2018. Simpson has 78 overall victories in his career, seventh-most in OVC history.

Week Zero Games: For the second-straight season, Jacksonville State competed in a "Week Zero" game when they opened the season against nationally-ranked North Carolina A&T on Aug. 25 in the Guardian Credit Union FCS Kickoff at the Cramton Bowl in Montgomery, Alabama. The FCS Kickoff began in 2014 and allows teams to play a game a week ahead of the start of the season if the game is broadcast on national television. It was the only FCS vs. FCS game during the week (there were four other games involving FBS teams on the schedule).

Preseason Forecasts: For the fifth-straight year and seventh time in the past nine years, Jacksonville State was picked the preseason football favorite in the Ohio Valley Conference for 2018. The Gamecocks, who have won four-straight OVC Championships and 32-straight Conference games, received 14 of a possible 18 first-place votes in a poll of league head coaches and communications directors. The Gamecocks totaled 126 total points to out-distance Austin Peay, last year's league runner-up, who picked up the other four first-place votes and was tabbed second (112 points). The second-place prediction is the highest-ever for the Governors program. UT Martin was picked third (95) and followed by Eastern Illinois (73), Eastern Kentucky (69), Tennessee State (64), Southeast Missouri (62), Murray State (24) and Tennessee Tech (23).

SEMO's Terry and JSU's Bridges Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Southeast Missouri senior running back **Marquis Terry** and Jacksonville State junior defensive back **Marlon Bridges** were named the 2018 OVC Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and communications directors. Jacksonville State led the way with six total preseason selections, while Austin Peay followed with five picks. Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State and UT Martin had three picks apiece while Murray State and Tennessee Tech had two selections each. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last year (seven in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included 16 players who were second-team picks in 2017. Of the 30 total selections, 18 were seniors, seven were juniors and five were sophomores.

NFL Connections: As of September 9, there are 16 former Ohio Valley Conference players on NFL rosters (11 active, 4 practice squad, 1 injured reserve). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo, who has won two Super Bowl Championship with the Patriots and is now the starter for the 49ers, and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, a former First Round Draft pick who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII and who has been a Pro Bowl selection. Six of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

Let's Get It Started: The 71st season of Ohio Valley Conference football got underway earlier than usual this season as Jacksonville State will play in the Guardian Credit Union FCS Kickoff in Week Zero on Saturday, August 25. Three other OVC teams will play on Thursday, August 30 while the final five teams will play on Saturday, September 1. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools; since its beginning, 15 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the league have claimed at least one championship.

Instant Replay: For the second-straight year, the OVC will have instant replay for all non-conference and conference home football contests. The league has partnered with DVSPORT to implement replay which is defined by Rule 12 of the NCAA Football Rule Book.

I-AA No More: Although some people may still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (Football Bowl Subdivision teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2018 season marks the 12th of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

The 2018 season is the fifth that the award has been presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

Austin Peay completed a perfect 3-0 record in 2017 to win its first Sgt. York Trophy.

GAME NOTES: For the third consecutive week, Tennessee Tech will play a Thursday night game, this week traveling to Logan, Utah for its first-ever meeting with Utah State. The Golden Eagles are 2-34 all-time against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents, with its last win coming in 1980.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech played nationally-ranked Kennesaw State in front of a national television audience on ESPN2 last Thursday night. After a weather delay to open the game (which followed a lengthy weather delay in the team's opener at Chattanooga), Tennessee Tech opened the scoring with a 41-yard field goal by Nick Madonia. But the No. 7 ranked Owls would score 42 unanswered points on its way to a 49-10 victory. Shannon Fayne led the Golden Eagles with a career-high 14 tackles and after two games is third in the OVC and 48th nationally in tackles/game (9.5). Josh Poplar is second on the team with 15 tackles through two weeks. True freshman quarterback Bailey Fisher made his second career start and completing 19-of-30 passes for 179 yards and his first career passing touchdown while also rushing for 38 yards. Andrew Goldsmith was the team's top rusher, gaining 86 yards on 12 carries (7.2 ypc). Goldsmith currently ranks 29th nationally in all-purpose yards (132.0 yards/game). Josh Cunningham snagged a game-high seven catches for 63 yards after not having a catch in the season opener.

SCOUTING UTAH STATE: After a seven-point loss at Michigan State to open the season, Utah State bounced back with a 60-13 home victory over New Mexico State. The Aggies racked up 446 yards of total offense and scored double-digit points in each quarter in the victory. Senior running back Gerold Bright had a career-high 134 yards and a touchdown on 14 carries (9.6 ypc), while Darwin Thompson added 96 yards and a touchdown on six carries (16.0 ypc). Junior kicker Dominik Eberle tied the NCAA record for most points scored by a kicker (24) after kicking six field goals and going 6-of-6 on PATs. Three of his six field goals were greater than 50 yards (51, 51, 51) which made him one of just six players in NCAA history to achieve that feat in a game. This season USU has been strong on special teams, ranking third nationally in kickoff returns (44.5 yards/return). David Woodward had a team-best 13 tackles and added a sack in the win over NMSU and through two games has a team-high 29 stops. As a team Utah State has forced seven turnovers this season which ranks second nationally among all FBS schools. The program has recorded at least one turnover in 60 of its last 77 games.

GAME NOTES: Murray State will remain in the Bluegrass State this week to take on Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent Kentucky. It marks just the second matchup between the programs, with the other contest occurring during the 2003 season. In that matchup the Racers were limited to just 189 yards of total offense in a 37-6 loss. Jared Lorenzen threw four touchdowns to four different receivers and Shane Boyd rushed for 57 yards and a touchdown for the Wildcats. Stewart Childress passed for 100 yards while Ron Lane added 67 yards on the ground for the Racers. Murray State is 3-28-1 all-time against FBS opponents, with its last win coming in 1984 over Louisville.

SCOUTING MURRAY STATE: After falling at home to Southern Illinois in its season opener, Murray State went toe-to-toe with No. 17 ranked Central Arkansas before falling 26-13. A Gabriel Vicente 39-yard field goal began the scoring for Murray State, and his second field goal of the game, a 24-yarder in the second quarter, trimmed the margin to 7-6 early in the second quarter. That improved Vicente to 3-for-3 on the season in field goal attempts. The Bears pulled ahead 20-6 later in the second quarter, but the Racers rebounded as Drew Anderson connected with James Sappington on a 31-yard strike just eight seconds before the half. The second half saw only one score, a UCA touchdown early in the fourth quarter. Anderson, the transfer from Buffalo, finished the game 19-of-36 for 209 yards and a touchdown. Through two weeks he has completed 54.5 percent of his passes for 335 yards and a touchdown. For the second-straight game Sappington had three catches and leads the Racers with six grabs after two weeks. Senior Kenney Wooten had six tackles, a sack, a tackle-for-loss, an interception and blocked an extra point in the game. Quincy Williams had a game-high 12 stops against Central Arkansas and leads the team and ranks second in the OVC with 10.5 tackles/game. Murray State is first in the OVC and 18th nationally in net punting (39.73 yards/punt). The Racers lead the OVC and rank 31st nationally in red zone defense (75.0%).

SCOUTING KENTUCKY: Kentucky snapped a 31-game losing streak to Florida with a 27-16 win in Gainesville on Saturday to move to 2-0 on the season. It marked the team's first road win over a ranked SEC opponent since the 1998 season (No. 21 LSU). Junior Benny Snell rushed for 175 yards and through two games is averaging 150.0 yards/game and currently ranks fifth in UK history in rushing (2,724 yards). Quarterback Terry Wilson added 105 rushing yards, 151 passing yards and two touchdowns. Wilson was the first Kentucky quarterback with 100 passing and 100 rushing yards in the same game since the 2013 season. He had a 54-yard touchdown to Lynn Bowden in the victory, who finished the game with four catches for 79 yards. Wilson has completed 64.7 percent of his passes through two games. Senior linebacker Josh Allen had five tackles, a sack, forced a fumble and had a pass breakup in the victory to earn SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors; he is tied for second on the Kentucky team in tackles entering this week. Kash Daniel is tops on the team with 22 stops after two weeks.

GAME NOTES: After a pair of games against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) to open the season, UT Martin will kick off its home schedule by hosting in-state rival Chattanooga. The teams have played five previous times, with three of the meetings happening between 1991-93 and the last two meetings happening in 2013 and 2017. UT Martin pulled off its second-straight win in the series with a 21-7 victory in Chattanooga a year ago. In that game, the Skyhawks held No. 15 ranked UTC to just 150 yards of total offense, including six net rushing yards in the win. That defensive effort, which included five sacks, allowed the UTM offense to jump out to a 21-0 lead to cement the victory. LaDarius Galloway led the way with 79 rushing yards while Troy Cook completed 16-of-21 passes for 183 yards and three touchdowns.

SCOUTING CHATTANOOGA: Chattanooga is now 2-0 on the season after a home victory over Tennessee Tech and a thrilling overtime win at The Citadel this past weekend. The Mocs led 21-7 in the second quarter and were up 21-14 in the third quarter when The Citadel tied the game up. Neither team would score in the fourth quarter and The Citadel scored first in overtime on a five-yard run. Chattanooga would score its touchdown on three plays and did not hesitate on going for the two-point conversion and victory. Second-year head coach Tom Arth drew up a trick play that saw quarterback Nick Tiano lateral the ball to receiver Bryce Nunnally who threw a pass to Jordan Giberti for the game-winner. Nunnally finished the game with 10 catches for 268 yards and two touchdowns to earn STATS National FCS Offensive Player of the Week honors. His 268 receiving yards were just six off the school record and he now has two catches of 75 or more yards this season (the fourth player in school history to achieve the feat). Tiano passed for 347 yards and two touchdowns and has completed 61.7 percent of his passes for 665 yards through two games. The win snapped a six-game losing streak in overtime for the Mocs.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: UT Martin totaled 460 yards of total offense in its 61-37 loss to FBS foe Middle Tennessee on Saturday night. The Skyhawks ran 94 plays, the most by the team since the 2008 season, and finished with its most points ever against a FBS team. UTM trailed 26-17 at halftime and pulled to within 47-37 with 9:32 to play in the game before a late touchdown and 97-yard interception return by MTSU capped the scoring. Sophomore quarterback Dresser Winn, making his seventh career start, was named OVC Co-Offensive Player of the Week after completing 34-of-53 passes for 355 yards and four touchdowns (one in each quarter). His completions, attempts, yards and touchdowns were all career-highs and the completions and attempts were the sixth-most in program history. Terry Williams caught 10 passes for 70 yards and two touchdowns, while Jaylon Moore added seven catches for 113 yards. Kicker Ryan Courtright made a 44-yard field goal, four PATs and recovered a key on-side kick in the fourth quarter. Playing in his hometown, senior James Gilleylen had a game-high 10 tackles (8 solo) to go along with a sack. He shares the team lead for tackles (18) with Kevin Prather, Jr. entering this week.

GAME NOTES: For the second-straight week, Eastern Kentucky will take on a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponent when they travel to Bowling Green. The teams have played four previous times, beginning in 1940, and most recently in 2003. In that last meeting BGSU scored its lone win in the series, winning 63-13.

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky saw its record even at 1-1 after a 32-16 road loss to FBS foe Marshall. It was the first meeting between the two teams since the 1992 season. The Colonels special teams unit recovered three kicks (two punts and a kickoff) against the Thundering Herd and also blocked a point-after attempt. After two weeks, ECU is fourth nationally with a pair of blocked kicks. Junior Leodis Moore III was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after he had seven tackles, a tackle-for-loss, an interception, a pass breakup and a blocked kick in the contest. Ben Bascom added 11 tackles (including 2.5 for loss) while Aaron Patrick made seven stops. Patrick is 14th nationally in sacks (1.25/game). Senior LJ Scott scored his third rushing touchdown of the season in the game and now ranks fifth in the nation in that category. Scott is 11th nationally in kickoff returns (28.0 yards/return) and 21st in all-purpose yards (146.0 yards/game). Scott is one of four ECU running back averaging more than 30 rushing yards per game; as a team ECU is first in the OVC and eighth nationally in rushing (271.5 yards/game). As a team Eastern Kentucky also ranks fourth nationally in turnovers gained (6) and blocked kicks (2) and sixth in kickoff returns (28.0 yards/return).

SCOUTING BOWLING GREEN: Bowling Green has played a tough schedule to open the 2018 season, falling 58-24 at No. 24 Oregon and dropped a 45-14 decision in its home opener to Maryland, who is receiving votes in the national polls. The Falcons led the Terrapins 14-10 at halftime before being outscored 35-0 in the second quarter (including 28 fourth quarter points). Maryland finished the game with 565 yards of total offense while limiting Bowling Green to just 158 yards (including only 15 net rushing yards). Jarrett Doege was 17-for-27 for 143 yards and two touchdown tosses in the game but was sacked five times. He has completed 60 percent of his passes so far this season and has thrown multiple touchdown passes in six consecutive games dating back to last season. Brandon Harris had 11 tackles and forced a fumble against Maryland and leads the team with 18 tackles through two games. Kholbe Coleman added a career-high seven tackles and has 13 stops so far this season.

GAME NOTES: After seeing its game cancelled due to weather last week, Tennessee State returns to action on Saturday at fellow HBCU opponent Hampton. It marks the third all-time meeting between the teams and first since 1984 (a season TSU was 11-0 overall).

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: For the first time in the 29-year history of the Southern Heritage Classic, weather prevented the game between Tennessee State and Jackson State from being played. Heavy rain and lightning moved through the area prior to kickoff and the game was delayed for several hours until the cancellation announcement was made. The Tigers have not played since a 34-3 victory over Bethune-Cookman in the John Merritt Classic on September 1. In that game the Tigers had 525 yards of total offense while holding the Wildcats to just 244 yards (including 66 on the ground). Entering this week Tennessee State ranks first nationally in scoring defense (3.0 points/game), fumbles lost (0), interceptions thrown (0), turnovers lost (0) and fourth down conversion defense (0.0%), second in sacks (5.0/game), third in third down conversion defense (15.4%), sixth in turnover margin (+2.0/game) and time of possession (35:46), seventh in total offense (525.0 yards/game) and kickoff return defense (10.75 yards/return), ninth in rushing defense (66.0 yards/game) and pass efficiency defense (90.17) and 10th in passing offense (324.0 yards/game). Individually, Chris Rowland ranks second in the FCS in all-purpose yards (226.0/game) and fifth in receiving yards/game (154.0).

SCOUTING HAMPTON: After a long history in the MEAC, Hampton is playing this year as a FCS Independent before joining the Big South Conference. After a season opening win over Shaw, the Pirates dropped last week's game at Monmouth, a 2017 playoff participant, by a 56-28 mark. Monmouth finished the game with 556 yards of total offense while Hampton ended the contest with 429 yards (339 through the air). Hampton scored the first 14 points of the game, as Delmon Williams had touchdown passes of 32 and 70 yards. But Monmouth would score 42 unanswered points until the Hampton added its third touchdown late in the third quarter. Williams finished the game 23-of-37 for a career-high 339 yards and three touchdowns. In two games this season Williams has completed 65.5 percent of his passes and is averaging 240.5 yards/game through the air. He is also his team's second-leading rusher with 52 net yards on the year. Antonio Graham had five catches for 82 yards and a score while Ronald Bell added a team-high six receptions for 81 yards and a touchdown. Bell has a touchdown in both games this season. Kapri Doucet had 3.5 tackles-for-loss and a sack this season.

GAME NOTES: After not playing since the 2006 season prior to last season, Austin Peay and Morehead State are meeting for the second-straight year and 46th overall time on Saturday. The two teams played all but one season from 1962 to 2006 until the recent hiatus. After losing 10-straight in the series, Austin Peay won in 2006 and a year ago snapped a 29-game overall losing streak with a 69-13 victory in Clarksville. In that game, Austin Peay racked up 668 yards of total offense, including 477 on the ground in snapping what was the nation's longest losing streak. The Govs were led by Kentel Williams who had 203 rushing yards on just eight carries (25.4 ypc) while quarterback JaVaughn Craig was 8-of-12 passing for 118 yards and also rushed for 37 yards and four touchdowns. Morehead State was led by a two-quarterback tandem of Lawson Page and Jack Sherry who combined for 270 yards and two scores.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: After opening the season against No. 3 ranked Georgia, last year's national runner-up, Austin Peay earned its first win over the season, topping FCS foe Presbyterian 24-0. It marked the second shut-out for the Govs in three seasons under head coach Will Healy. After a long weather delay at the start of the game, the Austin Peay defense proved to be stout, allowing only 179 yards of offense on the night (85 on the ground, 94 through the air). The Govs more than doubled that effort, tallying 486 yards for the game. Quarterback JaVaughn Craig ran for a team-high 108 yards (his fourth career 100-yard rushing game) and a touchdown on eight carries (13.5 ypc) and passed for 127 yards. Fellow quarterback Jeremiah Oatsvall added 64 passing yards and 56 rushing yards and a score. DJ Montgomery set career-highs with 10 catches for 114 yards, including a long reception of 41 yards. On the defensive side of the ball, senior Gunnar Scholoto had a team-best 10 tackles while newcomer Rashon Davis had a pair of stops and made a key interception deep in PC territory. With the win Austin Peay tallied its third-straight home win, a first since the 1986 season. Entering this week the Govs are 11 nationally in fewest yards penalized (31.5/game) and 15th in fewest penalties (4.5/game).

SCOUTING MOREHEAD STATE: The Eagles will take on its second OVC opponent of the season when they host Austin Peay. Last week Morehead State evened its record at 1-1 on the season with a 48-19 win over Mount St. Joseph in its second game of the season. Senior quarterback Lawson Page rushed for a career-high 146 yards on just 10 carries (14.6 ypc) while passing for three touchdowns in the win. Redshirt freshman Jovan Smith added 104 yards on the ground as the Eagles finished with 422 rushing yards, the most for the team since joining the Pioneer Football League in 2001. The MSU defense was able to limit MSJ, who was coming off a 600-yard effort the prior week, to just 282 yards in the game. Kalen Carson had a team-high eight tackles while Jeremiah Draper had 1.5 sacks. Carson leads the team with 13 tackles through two games while Sayyid Kanu has 12 tackles and 1.5 tackles-for-loss.

GAME NOTES: For the 86th time regional rivals Southeast Missouri and Southern Illinois will meet on the gridiron. For the first time in that long-standing rivalry the game has been named "War for the Wheel" with the winner taking home an authentic ship's wheel to display on campus. When the series first began in 1909, the teams used to cross the Mississippi River by boat; one year the SIU boat sunk and the team had to swim to shore. SIU has won seven of the last nine and 10 of the last 12 games overall in the series. SEMO's last victory in the series came three years ago at Houchens Field, with its last win in Carbondale coming in 2010. A year ago Southern Illinois led 28-10 at halftime on its way to a 35-17 win in Cape Girardeau. Sam Straub passed for four touchdowns for SIU, two of them going to Darrell James who finished the game with 119 yards. Southeast was led by Marquis Terry who had 90 rushing yards and a touchdown while also catching three passes. Southeast Missouri head coach Tom Matukewicz spent seven years (2001-07) as an assistant coach at Southern Illinois.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri earned its first victory of the season on Saturday, coming from behind to top Dayton 40-21 in its home opener. It marked the first time the Redhawks scored 40 points in a game since October 2016. Junior quarterback Daniel Santacaterina, a transfer from Northern Illinois, was named OVC Co-Offensive Player and Newcomer of the Week after passing for 269 yards and three touchdowns and rushing for another score in the win. Santacaterina left the season-opener with Arkansas State after being hit but showed no signs in the impressive performance. He engineered three scoring drives in the fourth quarter as the Redhawks overcame the one-point deficit entering the final quarter. Senior Marquis Terry, who began the season on the Walter Payton Award Watch List, rushed for a career-high 202 yards on 16 carries (12.6 ypc) including a 95-yard touchdown run late in the game. Terry now ranks second nationally in yards/carry (11.16), fifth in total rushing yards (279) and sixth in rushing yards/game (139.5). Junior Justin Swift had a career-high 11 tackles (including 2.0 for loss) and forced a fumble against the Flyers. Teammate Zach Hall enters the week ranked second nationally in tackles/game (15.5). Senior kicker Nicholas Litang was named OVC Co-Specialist of the Week after connecting on two field goals and on all four of his PATs.

SCOUTING SOUTHERN ILLINOIS: Southern Illinois led Ole Miss 38-35 at halftime and finished the game with 629 yards of total offense (the sixth-highest total in school history) but came up on the short end of the scoreboard in a 76-41 loss, as the Rebels scored 27 fourth quarter points, sparked by an 88-yard interception return early in the final period. Quarterback Sam Straub completed 29-of-42 passes for 382 yards and four touchdowns while also rushing for 36 yards and another score; he has accounted for six scores in two games this season. He completed passes to seven different receivers, including nine to Landon Lenoir (83 yards, 1 TD) and six to Raphael Leonard (117 yards, 2 TDs). D.J. Davis rushed for a game-high 121 yards on 16 carries (7.6 ypc) and through two games this season is averaging 124.0 yards/game. Entering this week Jeremy Chinn leads the team with 14 tackles, while Qua Brown and Cody Crider each had 10 stops.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Illinois will open its home season by hosting Indiana State. The teams went from 2009 through 2016 without playing but will be meeting for the second-straight season and 85th time overall on Saturday. EIU has won six in a row in the series including 22-20 to open the 2017 season. In that meeting, Mitch Kimble connected with Dennis Turner on a 15-yard touchdown pass with three seconds to play to lift the Panthers to the two-point victory. Kimble finished the game with 202 passing yards while Isaiah Johnson had a team-best 65 yards and a touchdown on the ground. LeMonte Booker, who gave his team a 20-16 lead with 4:54 to play, led all players with 154 yards on 31 carries (5.0 ypc). Then freshman Mark Williams had a 73-yard interception return in the first quarter for Eastern Illinois.

SCOUTING INDIANA STATE: Indiana State opened the season with a 49-0 win over Quincy before falling 31-7 at FBS foe Louisville this past week. That game saw three separate weather delays and wet weather. The game was tied at 7-7 at halftime and UofL led 14-7 after three quarters before scoring 17 points in the fourth quarter to put the game out of reach. Ja'Quan Keys led the way with a career-high 102 yards on 20 carries while Titus McCoy added 38 yards and the team's lone touchdown. Keys leads the team with a 91.0 yards/game average after two contests. Jonas Griffith had a team-high 11 tackles against the Cardinals and also picked off a pass that led to the Sycamores score. Griffith has 19 tackles entering this week.

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois dropped to 0-2 on the season in falling 48-10 at rival Illinois State, who was nationally-ranked in both major FCS polls. Trailing 14-0, the Panthers had the ball at the ISU three-yard line but failed on fourth down, which would have cut the margin in half. On the next play, ISU scored on a 97-yard touchdown pass to go ahead 21-0. Jamal Scott led Eastern Illinois with 96 rushing yards and the team's lone touchdown of the day; the newcomer Scott is averaging 89.0 yards/game, which is second in the OVC and 25th nationally. Senior Alexander Hollins caught seven passes for 74 yards against the Redbirds. Entering this week he is sixth nationally in receiving touchdowns (3) and eighth in receptions/game (8.0). The Panthers have used a pair of quarterbacks this season, with Johnathan Brantley and Harry Woodberry combining for 391 yards and three touchdowns while completing 64.5 percent of their passes. Joe Captuo had a team-high 13 tackles against Illinois State to increase his season total to 16 stops. Iziah Gulley is second on the team with 12 tackles while Mark Williams has 11 tackles and two pass breakups. As a team Eastern Illinois ranks fifth nationally in fewest yards penalized (27.5/game) and 15th in fewest penalties (4.5/game).
