THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

Southeast Missouri senior running back Marquis Terry ran for an OVC record 311 yards in the Redhawks victory over Southern Illinois; that broke the previous mark of 310 set by Murray State's Steve Chaney in 2005...Terry also had an OVC record 438 all-purpose yards, which broke the old OVC mark of 399 set by Kentel Williams in 2016...That performance earned him National Player of the Week honors by STATS and the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA)...Austin Peay scored 78 points in its win at Morehead State; it marked the most points by an OVC team against a Division I opponent in league history...After two weeks outside the Top 10, Jacksonville State is back at No. 9 in the FCS Coaches Poll this week; the Gamecocks have been ranked in the Top 10 in 61 of the past 63 weeks...Austin Peay is up to No. 21 in the Coaches Poll, its highest ranking in school history...EIU wide receiver Alexander Hollins has six receiving touchdowns this season (3 in two different games) and currently leads the FCS with six touchdown catches...JSU begins Conference play this week having won 32-straight OVC games, the longest streak in league history and seven games away from the FCS all-time mark...This season 36 OVC football games will be streamed on ESPN+, after the OVC- agreed to an extension on its media rights deal with ESPN; the ESPN+ broadcasts will replace games formerly on the OVC Digital Network...Conference play begins this week with four games on the schedule, all of which can be seen on ESPN+...Austin Peay will host UT Martin in the first game of the Sgt. York Trophy series, Tennessee State (who has seen its last two games cancelled because of weather) is at Eastern Illinois, Southeast Missouri will travel to Eastern Kentucky and Tennessee Tech plays at Jacksonville State.

OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSIVE

Marquis Terry, RB • 5-7, 180, Sr. • Atlanta, Ga. • Southeast Missouri

Terry set OVC records for rushing yards (311) and all-purpose yards (438) as Southeast Missouri won 48-44 at rival Southern Illinois, marking its first victory in Carbondale since 2010. Terry carried the ball 30 times (10.4 ypc) and scored on touchdown runs of 74, 23, 11 and 10 yards. He broke the former OVC record of 310 yards set by Murray State's Steve Chaney in 2005. The 311 yards is the most by a player at any level of NCAA football (FBS, FCS, II, III) this season. The senior also caught one pass for 13 yards and had five kickoff returns for 114 yards, breaking the former OVC all-purpose yardage mark of 399 set by Austin Peay's Kentel Williams in 2016. The 438 all-purpose yards is the most by a NCAA football player this season (no other player has reached 400 yards, and no other FCS player has reached 300 yards). Terry, who had an upset stomach before the game, became the first running back in SEMO's Division I era to rush for 200 yards in back-to-back games. Terry currently ranks first nationally in all-purpose yards (264.67/game) and rushing touchdowns (6) and second in rushing yards (590) and rushing yards/game (196.7).

DEFENSIVE

Steven Crowder, LB • 6-2, 233, So. • Mount Olive, Ala. • Eastern Kentucky

Crowder had 11 tackles (seven solo), a sack and interception in Eastern Kentucky's near win at Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Bowling Green. The sophomore picked off a pass early in the third quarter that gave the Colonels the ball at the BGSU 31-yard line and led to a game-tying touchdown. His sack came on the opening possession of the game and forced a punt and led an EKU touchdown. Crowder also added a quarterback hurry.

SPECIALIST

Matt Reyna, KR/WR • 5-8, 170, Jr. • Kingwood, Texas • Eastern Illinois

Reyna returned a first quarter kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown and finished Saturday's game against Indiana State with 160 kickoff return yards on four attempts (40.0 ypr). Reyna is one of 12 players at the FCS level to return a kickoff for a touchdown this season and became the first EIU player to do so since October 2015. The 96-yard return was the fifth-longest in school history. Reyna ranks sixth nationally in combined kick return yardage (274) and 12th in kickoff return average (27.4 yards/return)

NEWCOMER

Johnathan Brantley, QB • 6-1, 195, Jr. • Houston, Texas • Eastern Illinois

Brantley, the transfer from Tulane, completed 37-of-49 passes for 443 yards and four touchdowns with no interceptions in Eastern Illinois' 55-41 loss to Indiana State. The 443 passing yards were the eighth-highest in school history, the sixth-most in the FCS this season and he became the first EIU quarterback to reach the 400-yard mark since Jimmy Garoppolo in 2013. Brantley had touchdown passes of 15, 17, 73 and 6 yards, three of which went to Alexander Hollins (who is first nationally with six touchdowns this season). Overall the junior completed passes to six different receivers and also led the team with 15 rushing yards. Brantley ranks fifth nationally in completion percentage (71.9%), 19th in completions/game (21.33), 23rd in passing efficiency (154.3 and 26th in passing touchdowns (3).

NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

Terry Sets OVC Records for Rushing Yards and All-Purpose Yards in a Game: Southeast Missouri senior running back Marquis Terry established new OVC records for rushing yards in a game (311) and all-purpose yards (438) in a game in the team's 48-44 victory over Southern Illinois on Sept. 15. Terry carried the ball 30 times for his 311 yards (10.4 ypc) and scored on touchdown runs of 74, 23, 11 and 10 yards. He broke the former OVC rushing record of 310 yards set by Murray State's Steve Chaney in 2005. The 311 yards is the most by a player at any level of NCAA football (FBS, FCS, II, III) this season. The senior also caught one pass for 13 yards and had five kickoff returns for 114 yards, breaking the former OVC all-purpose yardage mark of 399 set by Austin Peay's Kentel Williams in 2016. The 438 all-purpose yards is the most by a NCAA football player this season (no other player has reached 400 yards, and no other FCS player has reached 300 yards).

Terry Named National Player of the Week (Sept. 17): Southeast Missouri senior running back Marquis Terry was named the STATS National Offensive Player of the Week and the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) FCS National Performer of the Week after his performance against Southern Illinois on Sept. 15. Terry set OVC records for rushing yards (311) and all-purpose yards (438) as Southeast Missouri won 48-44 at rival Southern Illinois, marking its first victory in Carbondale since 2010. Terry carried the ball 30 times (10.4 ypc) and scored on touchdown runs of 74, 23, 11 and 10 yards. The senior also caught one pass for 13 yards and had five kickoff returns for 114 yards. Terry, who had an upset stomach before the game, became the first running back in SEMO's Division I era to rush for 200 yards in back-to-back games.

Austin Peay Sets OVC Record For Points Against a Division I Opponent: Austin Peay scored 78 points in a win at Morehead State on Sept. 15. That marked the most points scored by an OVC football team against a Division I opponent, breaking the mark of 76 by UT Martin over Murray State in 2007.

OVC in NCAA Statistical Leaders: Entering this week, Jacksonville State ranks first in fourth down conversion percentage (100%) and fourth down conversion defense (0.0%), second in rushing defense (14.5 yards/game) and total defense (140.5 yards/game), third in tackles-for-loss (11.0/game), fourth in pass efficiency defense (76.92), fifth in tackles-for-loss allowed (3.0/game), sixth in total offense (528.5 yards/game) and scoring defense (10.0 points/game), seventh in scoring offense (44.0 points/ game) and ninth in passing defense (126.0 yards/game). Tennessee State ranks first in fumbles lost (0), interceptions thrown (0) and turnovers lost (0), second in scoring defense (3.0 points/game) and time of possession (35:46), third in sacks/game (5.0) and third down conversion defense (15.4%), sixth in turnover margin (+2.0/game), seventh in pass efficiency defense (90.17), eighth in total offense (525.0 yards/game) and rushing defense (66.0 yards/game) and 10th in passing yards/completion (17.05) and total defense (244.0 yards/game). Southeast Missouri ranks first in fumbles lost (0) and red zone offense (100%), second in passes intercepted (6), third in turnover margin (+2.67/game), fourth in turnovers gained (9) and eighth in turnovers lost (1). Eastern Kentucky ranks sixth in punt return yardage defense (0.0/return) and seventh in rushing offense (310.7 yards/game) and blocked kicks (2). UT Martin is first in kickoff return defense (0.0 yards/return), Austin Peay is eighth in rushing offense (301.3 yards/game) and Tennessee Tech is ninth in fewest yards penalized/game (31.0). Individually, Southeast Missouri's Marquis Terry is first nationally in all-purpose yards (264.67/game) and rushing touchdowns (6), second in rushing (196.7 yards/game) and rushing yards (590) and fifth in rushing yards/carry (10.73) and scoring (12.0/game). Tennessee State's **Chris Rowland** is third in all-purpose yards (226.0 yards/game) and receiving yards/game (154.0) and 10th in receptions/game (7.0). EKU's **Daryl McCleskey, Jr.** is 10th in rushing yards/carry (8.18). Eastern Illinois' Alexander Hollins is first in receiving touchdowns (6), third in receptions/game (8.7), fifth in scoring (12.0/game), ninth in receiving yards (368) and 14th in receiving yards/game (122.7). UT Martin's Terry Williams is fourth in receptions/game (8.3) while Jacksonville State's **Josh Pearson** is ninth in receiving yards/game (130.0). EIU's **Johnathan Brantley** is fifth in completion percentage (71.9%). Southeast Missouri's Zach Hall is fifth in tackles (13.7/game) while TSU's Christion Abercrombie is seventh in sacks (1.5/game).

Jacksonville State and Austin Peay Ranked in National Polls: A pair of OVC teams remain in the FCS Top 25 polls this week. Despite being idle, Jacksonville State climbed two spots to No. 9 in the AFCA FCS Coaches Poll and two spots to No. 10 in the STATS Top 25. After being out of the Top 10 for two weeks, JSU is ranked in the Top 10 for the 61st time in the past 63 weeks (and ranked in the Top 25 for the 64th consecutive week). After a win over Morehead State, Austin Peay jumped two spots to No. 21 in the Coaches Poll and are back in the STATS poll at No. 24. This year marks the first time the APSU program has ever been ranked, with No. 21 being the highest ranking in program history.

Jacksonville State Sets OVC Record For Consecutive Conference Wins: With a victory over Eastern Kentucky on October 14, 2017, Jacksonville State won its 27th consecutive Conference game (dating back to the end of the 2013 season) which set the OVC all-time record, breaking the mark of 26 previously held by Eastern Kentucky (1992-95). The now 32-game streak is the second-longest in FCS history, trailing only 39-straight wins by Duquesne in the MAAC from 1999-2006. The streak is currently the longest active streak in Division I. OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3: For the sixth-straight year the OVC is producing a "Game of the Week" package that will air on ESPN3 this fall. Kevin Ingram, host of "The Wake Up Zone" on 104.5 The Zone in Nashville, will handle play-by-play duties while Bob Belvin, on-air talent and contributor at 104.1 FM/AM 540 (ESPN Clarksville), will provide analysis. The duo has worked together each of the past six years in the league's TV package. Four of the eight contests are "Wildcard Selections" which will be announced 12 days before the game, guaranteeing the top matchups will be broadcast.

#FearTheFCS: So far in 2018 six Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) teams have topped opponents from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). In 2017, FCS teams won nine games against FBS opponents.

OVC Teams Against FBS Opponents: OVC teams will play 10 total games against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents in 2018. OVC teams are a combined 35-286-1 all-time against FBS foes, including wins over FBS teams in five of the past six seasons.

Two OVC Players on the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List: Jacksonville State junior safety Marlon Bridges and Austin Peay junior defensive end Jaison Williams are two of 25 players nationally named to the preseason Buck Buchanan Award Watch List. The award, sponsored by STATS, is given to the top defensive player in the FCS. A national panel of sports information/media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries will vote on the winner following the regular season. Last season JSU defensive end Darius Jackson became the first OVC player to win the award since the award began in 1995.

SEMO's Marquis Terry on Walter Payton Award Watch List: Southeast Missouri senior RB **Marquis Terry** is one of 25 players nationally on the preseason Walter Payton Award Watch List. The award, sponsored by STATS, is given to the top offensive player in the FCS. A national panel of sports information/media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries will vote on the winner following the regular season. Two OVC players, Eastern Illinois' Tony Romo (2002) and Jimmy Garoppolo (2013), have previously won the award, which began in 1987.

Three OVC Players on Senior Bowl Watch List: Three OVC players have been named to the Senior Bowl Watch List, that includes student-athletes from every level of college football. The Senior Bowl will be held on Saturday, January 29, 2019 in Mobile, Alabama. The OVC players on the preseason list were Jacksonville State offensive lineman B.J. Autry, Murray State quarterback Drew Anderson and JSU defensive lineman Denzil Ware.

Sgt. York Trophy Presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee Enters 12th Season: This year marks the 12th of the Sgt. York Trophy presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee. The trophy (founded in 2007 by the Nashville Sports Council and OVC) goes to the winner of the quadrangular season football series between the four OVC football-playing schools located in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. As a corporal in the 2nd battalion, 328th Infantry, in the Battle of the Meuse River-Argonne (Oct. 8, 1918), York and seven other soldiers captured 132 prisoners, was promoted to sergeant and received the Distinguished Service Cross, the French Croix de Guerre, the French Legion of Honor, the Croce di Guerra of Italy and the War Medal of Montenegro. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy).

Hall Named STATS National Defensive Player of the Week (Sept. 3): Southeast Missouri junior linebacker Zach Hall was named the STATS National Defensive Player of the Week by STATS on Sept. 3. Hall had 22 tackles in his team's game against Arkansas State on September 1. It is the most tackles by an FCS player this season and most by an OVC player since the 2008 season. He also added a tackle-for-loss and forced a fumble.

NCAA Division I Playoff Information: This season marks the sixth of an expanded 24-team field for the NCAA Division I Football Championship; in 2010 the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff field expanded to 20 teams, up from 16 previously, and in 2013 the field increased to 24 for the first time. The expansion in 2010 to 20 teams was the first since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The 24-team field is comprised of 10 automatic bids and 14 at-large berths. There are eight first round matchups (16 total teams), while eight (8) teams receive a bye into the second round. For the ninth time in 2018, the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Toyota Stadium, a 20,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference serves as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 5.

Academic Success: During the past academic year (2017-18) there were 103 OVC football student-athletes who were named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll for having a 3.25 grade point average or higher. In addition, 11 student-athletes were awarded the OVC Academic Medal of Honor for achieving perfect 4.0 GPAs. The OVC also awards a Team Academic Award for the football program with the highest percentage of players with a 3.25 grade point average or higher; that award went to Jacksonville State for 2017-18.

A Look at the Coaches: There is only one new head coach in the OVC this season as **Dewayne Alexander**, taking over at his alma mater (Tennessee Tech), after having previously been an assistant coach. He is one of three OVC coaches, joining Jacksonville State's **John Grass** and Tennessee State's **Rod Reed**, who are currently coaching at their alma mater. The longest tenured coach in the league is UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** who enters his 13th season with the Skyhawks in 2018. Simpson has 78 overall victories in his career, seventh-most in OVC history.

Week Zero Games: For the second-straight season, Jacksonville State competed in a "Week Zero" game when they opened the season against nationally-ranked North Carolina A&T on Aug. 25 in the Guardian Credit Union FCS Kickoff at the Cramton Bowl in Montgomery, Alabama. The FCS Kickoff began in 2014 and allows teams to play a game a week ahead of the start of the season if the game is broadcast on national television. It was the only FCS vs. FCS game during the week (there were four other games involving FBS teams on the schedule).

Preseason Forecasts: For the fifth-straight year and seventh time in the past nine years, Jackson-ville State was picked the preseason football favorite in the Ohio Valley Conference for 2018. The Gamecocks, who have won four-straight OVC Championships and 32-straight Conference games, received 14 of a possible 18 first-place votes in a poll of league head coaches and communications directors. The Gamecocks totaled 126 total points to out-distance Austin Peay, last year's league runner-up, who picked up the other four first-place votes and was tabbed second (112 points). The second-place prediction is the highest-ever for the Governors program. UT Martin was picked third (95) and followed by Eastern Illinois (73), Eastern Kentucky (69), Tennessee State (64), Southeast Missouri (62), Murray State (24) and Tennessee Tech (23).

SEMO's Terry and JSU's Bridges Headline Preseason All-OVC Team: Southeast Missouri senior running back Marquis Terry and Jacksonville State junior defensive back Marlon Bridges were named the 2018 OVC Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and communications directors. Jacksonville State led the way with six total preseason selections, while Austin Peay followed with five picks. Eastern Illinois, Eastern Kentucky, Southeast Missouri, Tennessee State and UT Martin had three picks apiece while Murray State and Tennessee Tech had two selections each. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last year (seven in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included 16 players who were second-team picks in 2017. Of the 30 total selections, 18 were seniors, seven were juniors and five were sophomores.

NFL Connections: As of September 17, there are 15 former Ohio Valley Conference players on NFL rosters (10 active, 4 practice squad, 1 injured reserve). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo, who has won two Super Bowl Championship with the Patriots and is now the starter for the 49ers, and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, a former First Round Draft pick who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII and who has been a Pro Bowl selection. Six of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

Let's Get It Started: The 71st season of Ohio Valley Conference football got underway earlier than usual this season as Jacksonville State will play in the Guardian Credit Union FCS Kickoff in Week Zero on Saturday, August 25. Three other OVC teams will play on Thursday, August 30 while the final five teams will play on Saturday, September 1. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools; since its beginning, 15 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the league have claimed at least one championship.

Instant Replay: For the second-straight year, the OVC will have instant replay for all non-conference and conference home football contests. The league has partnered with DVSport to implement replay which is defined by Rule 12 of the NCAA Football Rule Book.

I-AA No More: Although some people may still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (Football Bowl Subdivision teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

ESPN+: The OVC has announced an extension of its media rights deal with ESPN that will make ESPN+, the first multi-sport, direct-to-consumer subscription streaming service from The Walt Disney Company Direct-to-Consumer & International segment, the exclusive home of regular season and OVC Championship broadcasts. This season 36 OVC football games will air on ESPN+ (eight other games will be on ESPN3). Fans can subscribe to ESPN+ for \$4.99 a month (or \$49.99 per year). ESPN+ is an integrated part of the completely redesigned ESPN App and also available on the web, iPhone, iPad, tvOS, Android Handset, Apple TV, Roku, Chromecast and FireTV. SGT. YORK TROPHY \(\triangle \) DELTA DENTAL

The 2018 season marks the 12th of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC hotball-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

The 2018 season is the fifth that the award has been presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

Austin Peay completed a perfect 3-0 record in 2017 to win its first Sgt. York Trophy.

GAME NOTES: Austin Peay and UT Martin will kick off the annual Sgt. York Trophy series on Saturday afternoon when the two program meet for the 67th time. The Sgt. York Trophy is contested between the four football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee and was won for the first time by APSU a season ago. UT Martin had won nine games in a row in the series until Austin Peay scored a 7-0 victory last season over the then No. 18 ranked Skyhawks. The only score in the game came in the second quarter when Terrius Callahan scored on a 22-yard run, in his only rush attempt of the game. Both teams finished below 300 yards of total offense. Jeremiah Mitchell had 14 tackles and forced a fumble while Gunnar Scholato added 12 tackles and half a sack for Austin Peay. The game marked first win for APSU over a nationally-ranked team since 2009 and was the team's first regulation shutout against a Division I opponent since 1980. UT Martin was 2-1 against nationally-ranked opponents last season.

SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY: The Austin Peay offense exploded for a school record 78 points, 11 touchdowns and 758 yards of total offense in a 78-40 win at Morehead State. The 78 points are the most ever scored by an OVC team against a Division I opponent. The Govs rushed for 518 total yards, the third-highest total in school history. Kentel Williams, playing in his first game of the season, carried the ball eight times for 181 yards (22.6 ypc) and three touchdowns; he also had 80 kick return yards and nine receiving yards (and a touchdown) to finish the game with 270 all-purpose yards. Quarterback Jeremiah Oatsvall added a career-high 117 rushing yards. Oatsvall also passed for 121 yards and two touchdowns while JaVaughn Craig passed for 119 yards and two scores. Austin Peay now ranks eighth nationally in rushing offense (301.3 yards/game) and 19th in total offense (465.3 yards/ game). Despite surrendering 40 points, the Govs defense allowed only 313 total yards of offense for the game. Junior Jaison Williams had seven tackles, 3.5 tackles-for-loss and a sack. Malik Davis added a team-high 11 tackles. The Govs are ranked No. 21 in this week's AFCA FCS Coaches Poll, its highest ranking in program history.

SCOUTING UT MARTIN: Playing its first non-FBS opponent of the season, UT Martin dropped its home opener to Chattanooga 34-24 on Saturday. That win allowed UTC to improve to 3-0 on the season while UTM fell to 0-3. The Mocs jumped out to a 20-0 lead but the Skyhawks rebounded to pull within 10 points twice during the fourth quarter but see its final drive stall at the Chattanooga one-yard line. For the game, UT Martin out-gained Chattanooga 457 to 361, but through a pair of interceptions and was sacked five times. Junior wide receiver Terry Williams snagged 10 passes for 141 yards and rushed three times for 48 yards (16.0 ypr) to finish the contest with 229 all-purpose yards. Williams ranks fourth nationally in receptions/game (8.3). Dresser Winn passed for 300 yards and two scores and rushed for another touchdown in the contest. Winn ranks second in the OVC and 25th nationally in total offense (275.3 yards/game) while also ranking 10th nationally in completions/game (25.33). Brandon Anderson had a team-high 10 tackles while Kevin Prather, Jr. added nine stops (including 2.0 for loss). Prather, Jr. is third in the OVC and 40th nationally with 9.7 tackles/game. As a team, UTM ranks first nationally in kickoff return defense (0.0).

GAME NOTES: After having back-to-back games cancelled due to Mother Nature, Tennessee State will open OVC play when they travel to play Eastern Illinois on Saturday afternoon. Eastern Illinois has won six-straight in the series after a double overtime thriller in Nashville a season ago. TSU, ranked No. 24 nationally at the time, pulled ahead in the second overtime on a 40-yard field goal by Lane Clark before EIU responded with an eight-play drive that ended on a Scotty Gilkey, Jr. one-yard touchdown run. Gilkey capped the game with 104 rushing yard and a pair of scores to go along with 46 passing yards. TSU was led by Treon Harris who passed for 119 yards and ran for 67 yards. Clark hit three field goals for the Tigers, including a 50-yarder.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE: In a program first, Tennessee State has had its last two games cancelled because of weather. The Tigers game with Jackson State in Memphis was cancelled on Sept. 8 after lightning and storms prevented the contest from ever starting. This past week TSU was scheduled to play at Hampton, but that game was cancelled due to Hurricane Florence. The Tigers have not played since a 34-3 victory over Bethune-Cookman in the John Merritt Classic on September 1. In that game the Tigers had 525 yards of total offense while holding the Wildcats to just 244 yards (including 66 on the ground). Entering this week Tennessee State ranks first nationally in fumbles lost (0), interceptions thrown (0) and turnovers lost (0), second in scoring defense (3.0 points/game) and time of possession (35:46), third in sacks/game (5.0) and third down conversion defense (15.4%), sixth in turnover margin (+2.0/game), seventh in pass efficiency defense (90.17), eighth in total offense (525.0 yards/game) and rushing defense (66.0 yards/ game) and 10th in passing yards/completion (17.05) and total defense (244.0 yards/game).

SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS: Eastern Illinois is 0-3 to begin the season for the first time since 2015. That season, the second under head coach Kim Dameron, the Panthers rebounded to finish 7-5 (7-1 in the OVC) and earn an at-large berth to the FCS Playoffs. Last week EIU had 501 yards of total offense but fell victim to Indiana State by a 55-41 margin. Tulane transfer Johnathan Brantley completed 37-of-49 passes for 443 yards and four touchdowns without throwing an interception, the 443 yards were the eighth-most in EIU history and he was the first Panther to reach the 400yard passing plateau since Jimmy Garoppolo in 2013. Brantley has been incredibly accurate this season, completing 71.9 percent of his passes, which ranks fifth nationally. He ranks third in the OVC and 34th nationally in total offense (249.0 yards/game), despite splitting time the first two games. His favorite target has been senior Alexander Hollins, who caught 10 passes for 167 yards and three touchdowns against ISU. Hollins ranks first nationally with six receiving touchdowns, third with 8.7 receptions/game and 14th with 122.7 receiving yards/game. Aaron Gooch also added 10 catches in the game, finishing the contest with 110 yards. Despite a fast paced "air raid" attack this season, the Panthers have thrown only one interception in 130 attempts this season.

GAME NOTES: Eastern Kentucky and Southeast Missouri enter Saturday's OVC opener having only lost games to FBS opponents so far this season. The Redhawks are looking to win its second-straight in the series, following a 29-10 win at home last year. That victory snapped a six-game winning streak for the Colonels, who have dominated the series by winning 24 of the 28 all-time games. In last year's game, Southeast Missouri scored 20 second quarter points to jump out to a 20-3 halftime lead on its way to the 19-game win (equaling its largest-ever victory over the Colonels). Marquis Terry rushed for 184 yards and two touchdowns for Southeast, as the Redhawks tallied 299 yards as a team for the game. The SEMO defense limited EKU to just 11 net rushing yards for the game. Tim Boyle passed for 232 yards for the Colonels. EKU will honor the 2007 and 2008 OVC Champions at the game on Saturday. EKU is 12-2 against SEMO in games played in Richmond.

SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI: Southeast Missouri snapped a 10game road losing streak dating back to the 2016 season in topping regional rival Southern Illinois 48-44 (its first win in Carbondale since 2010). The backand-forth affair saw SIUE pull ahead 44-41 with 1:52 to play, before SEMO rebounded with a 7-play, 76-yard drive capped by a Daniel Santacaterina 14-yard touchdown pass to Austin Crump with 25 seconds remaining. It was one of two touchdown passes for the NIU transfer who has accounted for seven touchdowns (six passing) and just one interception in three games this year. Senior running back Marquis Terry was the other hero of the night, establishing OVC records for rushing yards (311) and all-purpose yards (438) in a game; both of those are the most by a NCAA player at any level (FBS, FCS, II, III) this season. Terry also added four touchdown runs and now is first nationally in all-purpose yards (264.67/game) and rushing touchdowns (6), second in rushing (196.7 yards/game) and rushing yards (590) and fifth in rushing yards/carry (10.73) and scoring (12.0/game). The Redhawks are first nationally in red zone offense (100%) and fumbles lost (0), and third in turnover margin (+2.67/game).

SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY: Eastern Kentucky narrowly missed pulling out a win over FBS opponent Bowling Green, driving to the Falcons 15-yard line on the final drive before running out of time. The Colonels had led 14-0 to open the game and were up 35-34 at the end of the third quarter after Daryl McCleskey, Jr. scored on a 27-yard touchdown run. McCleskey had a game-high 168 rushing yards and scored a trifecta of touchdowns, including a 68-yard run in the second quarter. He currently ranks second in the OVC and 23rd nationally in rushing (103.7 yards/game). Redshirt freshman Dakota Allen added 63 rushing yards and a touchdown while LJ Scott had 50 rushing yards. The Colonels finished the game with 389 rushing yards (259 more than BGSU) and now ranks seventh nationally in rushing (310.7 yards/ game). Sophomore Steven Crowder was named OVC Defensive Player of the Week after netting 11 tackles and a key sack and interception that each led to EKU scores. Aaron Patrick had a sack to increase his season total to 3.5, moving him into a tie for 10th place on the school's all-time list. The EKU defense has four interceptions through three games after tallying only five picks in 11 games in 2017.

GAME NOTES: Jacksonville State, the four-time defending OVC champions, begins Conference play this season by hosting Tennessee Tech. The Gamecocks have won 32-consecutive OVC games dating back to the 2013 season; that is the longest mark in league history and seven games away from the longest streak in FCS history. Jax State has won six-straight and 11 of the last 13 games against the Golden Eagles, including a 34-7 win in Cookeville a season ago. In that game, Jacksonville State tallied 523 yards of total offense while limiting Tennessee Tech to just 229 yards for the game. Roc Thomas rushed for 102 yards for JSU while quarterback Bryant Horn added 88 rushing yards to go along with 28 passing yards. TTU was paced by Yeedee Thaenrat who rushed for 50 yards while Dontez Byrd caught six passes for 92 yards and a score.

SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH: Tennessee Tech is coming off a 73-12 loss at FBS foe Utah State. It marked the third-consecutive Thursday night game for the Golden Eagles. Senior kicker Nick Madonia connected on a careerhigh four field goals in the game, hitting from 54, 20, 23 and 45 yards in the game. The 54-yarder was the second-longest in school history, trailing only the 57-yarder Madonia hit against TSU two years ago. Quarterback Luke Ward passed for 14 yards and had a team-high 52 rushing yards against Utah State. Shannon Fayne had a game-best 10 tackles and ranks second in the OVC and 33rd nationally in tackles/game (9.7). As a team, Tennessee Tech is ninth nationally in fewest yards penalized/game (31.0). TTU has lost eight road games in a row dating back to 2016.

SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE: Having competed in a Week Zero game for the second consecutive season, Jacksonville State has already had a pair of bye weeks this year. Two weeks ago the Gamecocks racked up 654 yards of total offense (the second-most in school history) in scoring 71 points, the most in program history against a Division I opponent, in a 71-0 win over Mississippi Valley State. The JSU defense was stout, limiting the Delta Devils to -8 net rushing yards (the fewest against the JSU defense in school history) and just 133 yards of total offense. As a team, JSU is second nationally in rushing defense (14.5 yards/game) and total defense (140.5 yards/game) and sixth in scoring defense (10.0 points/game) after two games. In limited action, Zerrick Cooper completed 12-of-17 passes for 211 yards and two touchdowns while also rushing for a score. Cooper leads the OVC in total offense (295.0 yards/game) and passing efficiency (166.9). Josh Pearson caught two of his passes, netting 113 receiving yard and two scores. Pearson is ninth nationally in receiving yards/game (130.0). Seven different players had more than 25 rushing yards, including Uriah West who had 57 yards on the ground and scored three touchdowns. As a team, the Gamecocks rank sixth nationally in total offense (528.5 yards/game) and seventh in scoring offense (44.0 points/game). After falling out of the Top 10 for two weeks, JSU is back in the Top 10 this week (No. 9 in the Coaches Poll, No. 10 in the STATS poll); the Gamecocks have been ranked in the Top 10 in 61 of the past 63 weeks.
