## THIS WEEK'S OVC HIGHLIGHTS/STORYLINES

The 72nd season of Ohio Valley Conference football began last week with OVC teams going 7-2 overall (including six wins over FCS opponents)...Tennessee Tech trailed Samford 44-28 with 2:20 left in regulation before scoring two touchdowns and converting two two-point conversions in the final 1:18 to force overtime...In the second overtime TTU went for two points and converted to top the Bulldogs 59-58; the last time the teams played in 2007, Samford had won 59-52...TTU quarterback Bailey Fisher (this week's STATS National Offensive Player of the Week) accounted for five touchdowns (2 passing, 3 rushing) and three two-point conversions (2 passing, 1 rushing) while netting 463 yards of total offense (the most by a FCS player during the week)...Southeast Missouri's Zach Hall, last year's National Defensive Player of the Year, had 19 tackles in the team's win over Southern Illinois; the 19 stops are the most by a FCS player this season...UT Martin scored in every phase of the game last week with touchdowns on offense, defense and special teams; it marked the first time the Skyhawks have accomplished such a feat since Sept. 27, 2008 against Murray State...UTM's Wanya Moton had two interceptions, including returning one 78 yards for a touchdown; he was one of three FCS players with two picks during week one...Tennessee State kicker Antonio Zita had four field goals in the Tigers 26-20 win over Mississippi Valley State...Eku's Alonzo Booth rushed for three touchdowns in his team's win over Valparaiso; the three rushing scores are tied for the most nationally...The OVC was the only scholarship FCS conference without a game against a Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team in Week 1; this week six OVC teams will play FBS opponents...OVC teams are 35-237-1 all-time against FBS opponents including wins in six of the past nine seasons...Seven of this week's nine games this week can be seen on the ESPN Family of Networks, including eight on ESPN+ and one on ESPN3...This season 69 of 72 total OVC football games will air on ESPN Networks, including 52 on ESPN+ and 12 on ESPN3.....This year marks the 150th anniversary of the first college football games.

## OVC PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

### OFFENSIVE

#### **Bailey Fisher, QB • 5-11, 205, So. • Clayton, Ga. • Tennessee Tech**

Fisher accounted for 463 yards of total offense (the most by a FCS player during the week), five touchdowns (2 passing, 3 rushing) and three two-point conversions as Tennessee Tech overcame a 23-point deficit to top Samford 59-58 in double overtime. From the 0:51 mark in the third quarter, Fisher threw two touchdowns passes, rushed for three touchdowns, then also completed three of four 2-point conversions, including the game-tying (rush) to send the game to overtime. The final two touchdowns and two-point conversions came in the final 1:18 of regulation, as Tech had trailed 44-28 with 2:20 to play. After the teams traded touchdowns in the first overtime, Samford took a lead on the first possession of the second extra period. Following a touchdown run by Andrew Fleming, Bailey converted the winning two-point conversion, a pass to David Gist, to give his team the win. Fisher finished the game 31-of-44 for 415 yards and two touchdowns (no interceptions) and rushed 13 times for 48 yards and three touchdowns. The 415 passing yards and the 463 yards of total offense were each the third-best performances in TTU history. In addition, Fisher also punted the ball twice for 76 yards, pinning both inside the Samford 20-yard line. Fisher was responsible for 36 points, the most of any Division I player (FBS or FCS) in the country in week one.

### DEFENSIVE

#### **Wanya Moton, S • 6-1, 190, So. • Murfreesboro, Tenn. • UT Martin**

Moton had seven tackles and a pair of interceptions, one of which he returned 78 yards for a touchdown, as UT Martin topped Northwestern State 42-20 in its season-opener. His first interception came in the second quarter, stopping a drive at the UT Martin 36-yard line, as the Skyhawks went into the locker room trailing 20-14. After the Skyhawks had taken the lead in the third quarter, Moton picked off a pass with five minutes to play in the fourth quarter, returning it to pay dirt to put his team on top 35-20. Moton is one of three FCS players who had two interceptions in week one.

### CO-SPECIALIST

#### **Antonio Zita, K • 5-9, 170, So. • Fayetteville, Tenn. • Tennessee State**

Zita connected on four field goals, including a career-long 44-yarder, in Tennessee State's 26-20 win over Mississippi Valley State in the John Merritt Classic. The sophomore missed his first attempt of the night (in the second quarter), but was perfect after that, including scoring the final nine points of the game for the Tigers who overcame a 13-10 deficit. Zita hit from 31 yards at the end of the first half, connected from 28 yards in the third quarter and then made field goals of 44 and 26 yards in the fourth quarter. He was one of only two kickers in the FCS to hit four field goals in week one. His 14 points scored were the third-most by a kicker in a TSU game.

### CO-SPECIALIST

#### **Terry Williams, RS • 5-10, 165, Sr. • Southaven, Miss. • UT Martin**

Williams had 199 all-purpose yards, including returning a punt 55 yards for a touchdown, as UT Martin came from behind to top Northwestern State 42-20. With his team holding a one-point lead late in the third quarter, Williams grabbed the punt and raced to the end zone to extend the lead to 28-20. The senior finished the game with four punt returns for 98 yards, four kickoff returns for 73 yards and two receptions for 28 yards.

### NEWCOMER

#### **Metrius Fleming, WR • 6-0, 173, Fr. • Elberton, Ga. • Tennessee Tech**

Fleming had 108 all-purpose yards, including a 66-yard rushing touchdown on the third play of the game, in Tennessee Tech's 59-58 double overtime win against Samford. The freshman finished the game with 60 rushing yards, caught a pass for seven yards and returned an important kickoff 41 yards. That kickoff game in the fourth quarter against Samford had kicked a field goal to go ahead 44-28 with 2:20 to play. Fleming took the ensuing kickoff 41 yards to the TTU 44-yard line, setting up a Golden Eagle touchdown six plays later.

## NOTES FROM AROUND THE GRIDIRON

**CFB150:** This year marks the 150th anniversary of college football which began on November 6, 1869 when Princeton played Rutgers. The commemoration will showcase the rich history and traditions of the sport and its positive impact on lives and communities, while also promoting the opportunity it continues to provide to thousands of student-athletes across all levels of the sport. **Fisher Named National Player of the Week (Sept. 2):** Tennessee Tech sophomore quarterback **Bailey Fisher** was named the FCS National Offensive Player of the Week by STATS on Sept. 2 after his performance in a 59-58 double overtime victory over Samford. Fisher accounted for 463 yards of total offense, five touchdowns (2 passing, 3 rushing) and three two-point conversions as Tennessee Tech overcame a 23-point second half deficit. From the 0:51 mark in the third quarter, Fisher threw two touchdowns passes, rushed for three touchdowns, then also completed three of four two-point conversions, including the game-tying (rush) to send the game to overtime. The final two touchdowns and two-point conversions came in the final 1:18 of regulation, as Tech had trailed 44-28 with 2:20 to play. After the teams traded touchdowns in the first overtime, Samford took a lead on the first possession of the second extra period. **OVC in NCAA Statistical Leaders:** In the latest NCAA statistical rankings, Tennessee Tech ranks first in fewest interceptions thrown (0), turnovers lost (0), fourth down conversion percentage (100%) and red zone offense (100%), second in total offense (671.0 yards/game), fourth in passing offense (425.0 yards/game), scoring offense (59.0 points/game) and time of possession (38:42), fifth in punt return defense (-2.0 yards/return) and ninth in kickoff return yardage defense (11.4 yards/return). Eastern Kentucky ranks first in net punting (56.0 yards/punt), punt return defense (-9.0 yards/return), red zone defense (0.0%) and red zone offense (100%), third in scoring defense (7.0 points/game) and tackles-for-loss (12.0/game), fourth in total defense (184.0 yards/game), eighth in scoring offense (53.0 points/game) and fumbles recovered (2), ninth in rushing offense (333.0 yards/game) and 10th in punt returns (15.0 yards/return). Murray State ranks first in turnovers lost (0), second in fumbles recovered (3), third in turnover margin (+3.0/game) and tackles-for-loss (12.0/game), fourth in scoring offense (59.0 points/game), seventh in turnovers gained (3), eighth in kickoff returns (31.0 yards/return) and ninth in rushing defense (46.0 yards/game). Southeast Missouri ranks first in sacks allowed (0.0/game), fourth down conversion (100%), red zone offense (100%) and tackles-for-loss allowed (0.0/game) and fourth in punt returns (18.5 yards/return). Austin Peay is fifth in total defense (192.0 yards/game), seventh in scoring defense (10.0 points/game) and 10th in total offense (563.0 yards/game) while Jacksonville State is sixth in passing offense (414.0 yards/game). Individually, Tennessee Tech's **Bailey Fisher** is first in total offense (463.0 yards/game), rushing touchdowns (3), scoring (20.0 points/game) and points responsible for (36.0/game), fourth in passing yards (415.0/game) and completions (31.0/game), 11th in passing efficiency (164.7) and 13th in completion percentage (70.5%). Austin Peay's **Kentel Williams** is second in rushing yards/carry (11.58), fifth in rushing (139.0 yards/game) and sixth in all-purpose yards (208.0/game). EKU's **Alonzo Booth** is first in rushing touchdowns (3), second in scoring (18.0 points/game) and ninth in rushing yards/game (128.0). Tennessee State's **Chris Rowland** is second in receptions/game (11.0) and receiving yards/game (172.0) and third in all-purpose yards (235.0/game). UTM's **Peyton Logan** is fourth in rushing (149.0/game) and rushing yards/carry (11.46). Jacksonville State's **Zerrick Cooper** is second in completions/game (40.0) and completion percentage (76.9%) and fifth in passing yards/game (405.0). Austin Peay's **DeAngelo Wilson** is second in receiving touchdowns (3) while JSU's **Trae Barry** is fourth in receptions/game (10.0). TSU's **Antonio Zita** is first in field goals made (4.0/game) while SEMO's **Zach Hall** is first in tackles (19.0/game).

**Southeast Missouri and Jacksonville State Ranked in National Polls:** After Week 1 both Southeast Missouri and Jacksonville State remain ranked in the Top 25 polls. The Redhawks are now No. 12 in the STATS Poll and No. 13 in the FCS Coaches Top 25 after its win over Southern Illinois. It is the highest ranking for Southeast Missouri since being 13th in the final poll of the 2010 season. After starting the season No. 6 in both polls, Jacksonville State dropped to No. 17 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 18 in the STATS Poll. It marks just the fourth time in the past 75 weeks that the Gamecocks have not been ranked in the Top 10; JSU has been ranked in the Top 25 in 76-straight polls.

**OVC Teams Against FBS Opponents:** OVC teams will play nine total games against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents in 2019. OVC teams are now a combined 35-237-1 all-time against FBS foes, including wins over FBS teams in six of the past nine seasons (2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017).

**JSU's Cooper and Pearson on Walter Payton Award Watch List:** Jacksonville State junior quarterback **Zerrick Cooper** and senior wide receiver **Josh Pearson** are two of the initial 25 players named to the Walter Payton Award Watch List. The award, sponsored by STATS and first awarded in 1987, is given to the top offensive player in the FCS and has twice been won by an OVC player: Eastern Illinois' Tony Romo (2002) and Jimmy Garoppolo (2013). The Payton Watch List can undergo revision during the season. A national panel of over 150 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries will vote on the winner following the regular season.

**Three OVC Players on Buck Buchanan Award Watch List:** Three OVC players have been named to the 2019 Buck Buchanan Award Watch List by STATS. The award is given to the top defensive player in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). The OVC selections were Jacksonville State senior defensive back **Marlon Bridges**, Southeast Missouri senior linebacker **Zach Hall** and Eastern Kentucky senior defensive lineman **Aaron Patrick**. The watch list will have updates during the season. A national panel of over 150 sports information and media relations directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries will vote on 25 finalists following the regular season. The award was first bestowed in 1995 and the first OVC player to win the honor was Jacksonville State's Darius

**Sgt. York Trophy Presented by Delta Dental and Farm Bureau Health Plans:** This year marks the 13th of the Sgt. York Trophy presented by Delta Dental of Tennessee and Farm Bureau Health Plans. The trophy (founded in 2007 by the Nashville Sports Council and OVC) goes to the winner of the quadrangular season football series between the four OVC football-playing schools located in the state of Tennessee (Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin). The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. As a corporal in the 2nd battalion, 328th Infantry, in the Battle of the Meuse River-Argonne (Oct. 8, 1918), York and seven other soldiers captured 132 prisoners, was promoted to sergeant and received the Distinguished Service Cross, the French Croix de Guerre, the French Legion of Honor, the Croce di Guerra of Italy and the War Medal of Montenegro. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. The trophy goes to the team with the best record against the other schools (in case of a tie there will be co-champions and the actual trophy will be retained by the defending champion if they are involved in the tie or if the defending champion is not involved in the tie it will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy).

**NCAA Division I Playoff Information:** This season marks the seventh of an expanded 24-team field for the NCAA Division I Football Championship; in 2010 the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) playoff field expanded to 20 teams, up from 16 previously, and in 2013 the field increased to 24 for the first time. The expansion in 2010 to 20 teams was the first since the field grew from 12 to 16 teams in 1997. The 24-team field is comprised of 10 automatic bids and 14 at-large berths. There are eight first round matchups (16 total teams), while eight (8) teams receive a bye into the second round. For the 10th time in 2019, the championship game will be played in Frisco, Texas at Toyota Stadium, a 20,500-seat multi-purpose stadium. The Southland Conference serves as the host of the championship, which will be held on Saturday, January 11.

**Recent Playoff Success:** Beginning with the 2001 season the OVC went until 2013 without a FCS Playoff victory. But over the past six seasons OVC teams have performed well in the playoffs. In 2013 the OVC placed three teams in the field for the first time and each won at least one game with Eastern Illinois and Jacksonville State advancing to the quarterfinals (the first time that had happened in the league since 1991). In 2015 Jacksonville State (who during that year became the first OVC team ranked No. 1 in the Top 25 since 1999) won three playoff games to become the first OVC team to advance to the National Championship game since 1982. Along the way JSU set an OVC record for points in a playoff game with 58 against Charleston Southern in the quarterfinals, and then broke the record a week later in a 62-10 victory over Sam Houston State in the semifinals. A year ago Jacksonville State and Southeast Missouri each won a game in the playoffs.

**OVC Game of the Week on ESPN3:** For the seventh-straight year the OVC is producing a "Game of the Week" package that will air on ESPN3 this fall. The eight-game schedule is once again in conjunction with Tupelo Raycom. Kevin Ingram, host of "The Wake Up Zone" on 104.5 The Zone in Nashville, will handle play-by-play duties while Bob Belvin, on-air talent and contributor at ESPN Clarksville, will provide analysis. The duo has worked together each of the past seven years in the league's TV package.

This season 52 OVC football games will air on ESPN+ (eight other games will be on ESPN3). Fans can subscribe to ESPN+ for \$4.99 a month (or \$49.99 per year). ESPN+ is an integrated part of the completely redesigned ESPN App and also available on the web, iPhone, iPad, tvOS, Android Handset, Apple TV, Roku, Chromecast and FireTV. **Three OVC Quarterbacks on CFPA FCS National Performer of the Year Watch List:** Three OVC quarterbacks are among the 40 players named to the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) FCS National Performer of the Year Watch List. The selections were Austin Peay junior **Jeremiah Oatsvall**, Jacksonville State junior **Zerrick Cooper** and Southeast Missouri senior **Daniel Santacaterina**. The 2019 CFPA FCS National Performer of the Year Trophy is a 22-inch K-9 optic crystal tower with eight-inch crystal football on top. All FCS players are eligible for the award. The award winner will be announced January 15, 2020.

**Two OVC Punters Named to FCS Punter of the Year Watch List:** Murray State's **Steve Dawson** and Southeast Missouri's **Jake Reynolds** are two of 28 players nationally named to the inaugural FCS Punter of the Year Preseason Watchlist by the Augusta Sports Council. The 2019 season will be the first for the FCS Punter of the Year Award which is presented by the Augusta Sports Council. Based in Augusta, Georgia, the Council is also home to the Ray Guy Award, which honors the nation's top FBS punter each year. The FCS Punter of the Year Preseason Watchlist was chosen based on 2018 All-Americans, 2018 All-Conference selections, and conference nominations. Players were reviewed based on their eligibility and inclusion on their team's 2019 roster.

**Academic Success:** During the past academic year (2018-19) there were 106 OVC football student-athletes who were named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll for having a 3.25 grade point average or higher. In addition, 10 student-athletes were awarded the OVC Academic Medal of Honor for achieving perfect 4.0 GPAs. The OVC also awards a Team Academic Award for the football program with the highest percentage of players with a 3.25 grade point average or higher; that award went to Murray State for 2018-19.

**A Look at the Coaches:** Seven of the nine OVC coaches from last season return to their respective teams in 2019. Jacksonville State's **John Grass**, Tennessee State's **Rod Reed** and Tennessee Tech's **Dewayne Alexander** are currently coaching at their alma maters. The longest tenured coach in the league is UT Martin's **Jason Simpson** who is in his 14th season with the Skyhawks in 2019. Simpson has 81 overall victories in his career, tied for sixth-most in OVC history (one win away from tying for sixth-place).

**NFL Connections:** As of September 1, there are 15 former Ohio Valley Conference players on NFL rosters (11 active, 2 practice squad, 2 injured reserve). Those players include former Eastern Illinois standout quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo, who has won two Super Bowl Championship with the Patriots and is now the starter for the San Francisco 49ers, and Tennessee State's Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie, a former First Round Draft pick who was a starter for the Arizona Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII and who has been a Pro Bowl selection. Seven of the nine current OVC football schools have at least one player in the NFL.

**Preseason Forecasts:** For the sixth-straight year and eighth time in the past 10 years, Jacksonville State has been picked the preseason football favorite in the Ohio Valley Conference for 2019. The Gamecocks, who have won five-straight OVC Championships and 39 of its last 40 OVC games, received 14 of a possible 18 first-place votes in a poll of league head coaches and communications directors. The Gamecocks totaled 126 total points to out-distance Southeast Missouri, who ended the Gamecocks 36-game OVC win streak a season ago and earned an at-large berth into the FCS playoffs, who picked up the other four first-place votes and was tabbed second (115 points). Eastern Kentucky was picked third (98) and followed by Austin Peay (70), Murray State and Tennessee State (61), UT Martin (60), Eastern Illinois (35) and Tennessee Tech (22).

**JSU's Cooper, SEMO's Hall Headline Preseason All-OVC Team:** Jacksonville State junior quarterback **Zerrick Cooper** and Southeast Missouri State senior linebacker **Zach Hall** were named the 2019 OVC Preseason Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in a vote of by the league's head football coaches and communications directors. Jacksonville State led the way with seven total preseason selections, while Southeast Missouri followed with six picks, Tennessee State had four selections, Eastern Kentucky, Murray State and UT Martin had three apiece, Austin Peay had two picks and Eastern Illinois had one. Returning players who were first-team All-OVC selections last year (15 in total) were automatic selections to the preseason team this year. The squad also included eight players who were second-team picks in 2018. Of the 29 total selections, 26 were seniors and three were juniors.

**Let's Get It Started:** The 72nd season of Ohio Valley Conference football got underway on Thursday, August 29. The OVC is made up of nine football-playing schools; since its beginning, 15 of the 18 total schools that have played football in the league have claimed at least one championship.

**Instant Replay:** For the third-straight year, the OVC will have instant replay for all non-conference and conference home football contests. The league has partnered with DVSport to implement replay which is defined by Rule 12 of the NCAA Football Rule Book.

**I-AA No More:** Although some people may still refer to it as I-AA football, the term that represents the level of Division I football in which the Ohio Valley Conference competes has been long retired. Beginning with the 2006 National Championship game, the term Football Championship Subdivision (or FCS) is to be used. Teams who play at the FCS level can offer a maximum of 63 scholarships (Football Bowl Subdivision teams can offer 85) and compete in a 24-team playoff at the end of the season to determine the national champion.

## SGT. YORK TROPHY

The 2019 season marks the 13th of competition for the Sergeant York Trophy, an award created by the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference. The trophy is contested between the four OVC football-playing schools in the state of Tennessee - Austin Peay, Tennessee State, Tennessee Tech and UT Martin - and goes to the team with the best combined record versus those schools in a given year.

The award is co-sponsored by Delta Dental of Tennessee and Farm Bureau Health Plans.

In the event of a tie, the award will be shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972. The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor. Following the war York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee.

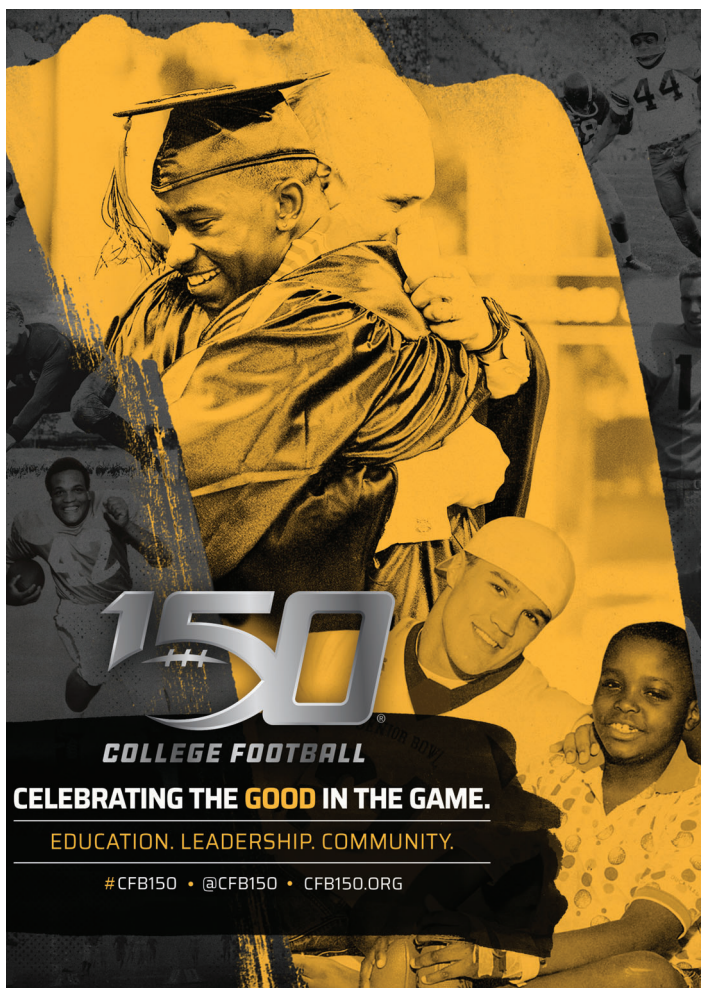

**GAME NOTES:** After a season-opening win over Samford, in which the Golden Eagles matched their win plateau from all of 2018, Tennessee Tech will challenge Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Miami (Ohio) this weekend. It is the first matchup between the schools since 1953. Tennessee Tech is 2-35 all-time against FBS opponents, with its last win coming in 1980 against Western Carolina. The game pits a pair of young quarterbacks in Tennessee Tech true sophomore Bailey Fisher and Miami true freshman Brett Gabbert.

**SCOUTING TENNESSEE TECH:** Playing former OVC rival Samford for the first time since 2007 (a game Samford won 59-52), Tennessee Tech tallied a school record 671 yards of total offense (the second-most nationally this season) and overcame a 23-point second half deficit in besting the Bulldogs 59-58 in double overtime. TTU trailed 38-15 midway through the third quarter and were down 16 points (44-28) with 2:20 to play in regulation before mounting a comeback. Freshman Metrius Fleming, this week's OVC Newcomer of the Week, returned the ensuing kickoff 41 yards and six players later Tennessee Tech scored and added a two-point conversion. After getting the on-side kick, Tech needed just seven plays to score and convert another two-point conversion to force overtime. Tennessee Tech and Samford each scored a touchdown in the first overtime, and after Samford went up by seven points in the second overtime, TTU scored on a 14-yard scamper by Andrew Goldsmith. But instead of going on kicking the PAT, the Golden Eagles went for the win and quarterback Bailey Fisher connected with a wide-open David Gist on the winning play. Fisher, the OVC Offensive Player of the Week and STATS National Player of the Week, completed 31-of-44 passes for a career-high 415 yards and also added 48 rushing yards to finish with 463 yards of total offense, the third-most in TTU single-game history. Fisher rushed for three touchdowns, passed for two scores and converted a trio of two-point conversions. His 36 points accounted for were the most by a Division I player during the week. Goldsmith had 97 rushing yards and caught three passes for 34 yards while Darrius Stafford caught seven passes for 110 yards. Neither team had a turnover in the game and combined for 1,233 yards of total offense.

**SCOUTING MIAMI (OHIO):** Miami held a 7-3 second quarter lead over No. 19 ranked Iowa but could not make it last, eventually falling 38-14 on Saturday. Quarterback Brett Gabbert became the first true freshman to ever start a game for the RedHawks, completing 17-of-27 passes for 186 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He connected with Jack Sorenson on an 11-yard score in the second quarter and added a 20-yard strike to Andrew Homer in the fourth quarter. Miami would lose the rushing battle, finishing with only 59 net yards while the Hawkeyes finished with 213 rushing yards and 465 yards of total offense (to just 245 for Miami). Defensively Sterling Weatherford and Ryan McWood had 10 tackles apiece while Mike Brown added seven.

**GAME NOTES:** Austin Peay will welcome Central Arkansas to Fortera Stadium on Saturday afternoon. It is only the second meeting between the schools and first since the 1975 season.

**SCOUTING CENTRAL ARKANSAS:** Central Arkansas opened its season with a 35-28 victory over Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) Western Kentucky, its third all-time win over a FBS foe (including a 2009 win over WKU). The Bears scored 21 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to overcome a 28-14 deficit, putting together scoring drives of 64, 80 and 74 yards in the final frame. Sophomore quarterback Breylin Smith completed 20-of-28 passes for 324 yards and three touchdowns (with no interceptions), including completing eight passes to Lujan Winningham who racked up 222 receiving yards and three scores. Winningham (who had just 12 receptions for 158 yards and one touchdown in all of 2018) caught an 80-yard halftime option pass from running back Carlos Blackman to tie the game at 28; Blackman would then score the game-winning touchdown on a one-yard rush later in the period. On defense Robert Rochell finished the game with seven tackles, an interception and two pass breakups. After its win the Bears moved up No. 18 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 20 in the STATS Top 25.

**SCOUTING AUSTIN PEAY:** Austin Peay kicked off the Mark Hudspeth Era with a convincing 41-10 win over North Carolina Central last Thursday. Hudspeth became the first Govs coach to win in their debut since 2007. Austin Peay finished the game with 563 yards of total offense (291 rushing, 272 passing), which was the sixth-highest total in school history while limited their opponent to just 192 yards (139 passing, 53 rushing). APSU has now scored 40 or more points in four of its last five home games and is 9-2 at Fortera Stadium since the start of the 2017 season. Senior running back Kentel Williams, who led all of FCS in rushing yards/carry last season (8.0), continued that trend by averaging 11.6 yards on 12 carries against NCCU. Williams gained 139 total yards on the night, caught four passes for 26 yards and had 43 kickoff return yards to finish the night with 208 all-purpose yards. Quarterback Jeremiah Oatsvall completed 24-of-39 passes for 232 yards and three touchdowns while also rushing for 29 yards. DeAngelo Wilson caught a career-high three touchdown passes (all in the first half), which was one shy of the Austin Peay single-game record. He finished the game with 106 receiving yards, marking his second 100-yard career game. The defensive side of the ball recorded 10 tackles-for-loss and allowed North Carolina Central into the red zone just twice. Linebacker Pat Walker led the team with a career-best seven stops (including 1.5 for loss) while Jack McDonald added six tackles. Kicker Logan Birchfield converted on two field goals including a career-long of 49 yards. After its win Austin Peay picked up votes in the AFCA FCS Coaches Top 25 poll this week.

**GAME NOTES:** Eastern Illinois will make the two-hour journey to Bloomington, Indiana on Saturday for its first all-time meeting against Indiana. The Panthers are 10-37 all-time against FBS, including most recently wins over San Diego State (2013) and Miami (Ohio) in 2016. Overall the Panthers are 2-6 in its last eight contests against FBS opponents. Indiana has won 15 of its last 16 non-conference games, including seven-straight.

**SCOUTING EASTERN ILLINOIS:** Eastern Illinois opened the Adam Cushing Era with a 24-10 loss at Chattanooga last Thursday night. UTC struck first, converting a fumbled punt into seven points. The Panthers pulled to within 14-10 late in the second quarter before a Mocs field goal made the margin at the break 17-10. There was only seven points scored in the entire second half, with Chattanooga scoring a touchdown on its first drive of the third quarter to end the scoring. EIU would drive deep into Mocs territory several times the rest of the way but could not score. Starting quarterback Johnathan Brantley passed for 119 yards and a touchdown while Harry Woodberry finished with 121 yards through the air. Xander Richards had a team-high five catches for 67 yards. Freshman Jaelin Hayes-Benefield led EIU with 76 all-purpose yards, including a team-best 49 on the ground. Joe Caputo had a team-high eight tackles (seven solo), including 1.5 for loss. Raymond Crittenden and Bryce Dewberry each had an interception for the Panthers who out-gained UTC by a 370 to 350 margin in total offense.

**SCOUTING INDIANA:** Indiana opened its 2019 campaign (its 135th season of football) with a 34-24 season-opening win over Ball State at Lucas Oil Stadium in Indianapolis. The Hoosiers got a career performance from kicker Logan Justus, who begins the season on the Lou Groza Award Watch List. Groza connected from 48, 49, 50 and 30 yards on the afternoon to tie the school record for made field goals in a game. Justus is now 19-of-22 on field goal attempts for his career and is just the 11th Hoosier to hit a 50-yarder in a game. Redshirt freshman Michael Penix Jr. became the first IU freshman to start at quarterback since Antwaan Randle El in 1998. Penix completed 24-of-40 passes for 326 yards and a touchdown and rushed for a team-best 64 yards on seven carries (9.6 yards/carry). Nick Westbrook hauled in a 75-yard touchdown in the first quarter and now has three 70-plus yard scores in his career. Stevie Scott III added 48 yards on the ground and scored a pair of touchdowns for Indiana. Senior Reakwon Jones led IU with a career-high 11 tackles while junior Marcelino Ball matched his career-high with 10 stops. Jaylin Williams had an interception in the fourth quarter; Indiana has had at least one takeaway in their last 19 games, the longest streak in the FBS (the team has had at least one interception in 11-straight games).

**GAME NOTES:** After an easy season-opening victory over Pikeville, Murray State steps up the difficulty level on Saturday when it travels to Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) foe Georgia who is ranked No. 3 in both major FBS polls. It is the first meeting between the two teams since the 1945 season, a 49-0 UGA victory. Murray State is 3-29-1 all-time against FBS opponents with its last win coming versus Louisville in 1984. The game, the home opener for Georgia, could prove to be one of the largest crowds to ever watch an OVC team play. There have been seven games with an attendance over 90,000 in league history, two of which include sellouts at Georgia (Tennessee Tech in 2009 and Austin Peay last year). The largest crowd to witness a Murray State game is 77,527 at Wisconsin in 1998.

**SCOUTING MURRAY STATE:** Murray State jumped out to a 31-3 lead on its way to a 59-20 season-opening victory over Pikeville last Thursday night. After falling behind 3-0, Quinaz Turner returned the ensuing kickoff 95 yards for a touchdown to put the Racers ahead for good. In his debut as the Racers starting quarterback, Preston Rice completed 20-of-31 passes for 170 yards and two touchdowns and carried the ball 11 times for 50 yards. Overall the Racers finished the contest with 249 rushing yards, as Jared McCray led the way with 76 yards and two touchdowns while Rodney Castille added 63 yards and two scores. Castille was the team's leading receiver, pulling in six passes for 25 yards; he finished the game with 97 all-purpose yards. After completing his eligibility with the Racers basketball team, Brion Sanchious made his debut with the football squad and hauled in one pass for a nine-yard touchdown. Defensively, Tay Carothers recovered two fumbles in the game, the first MSU player to do that since Derrick Townsel in 2007. Edmond McGhee had five tackles (2.0 for loss) and forced a fumble while Anthony Koclanakis had a game-high six tackles and a sack. Murray State did not have a turnover in the game, the first time the team has achieved that feat since 2016. The Racers currently rank third nationally in turnover margin (+3.0/game).

**SCOUTING GEORGIA:** Georgia held Vanderbilt to a pair of field goals and just 225 yards of total offense (including only five plays over 10 yards) in opening the season with a 30-6 win over Saturday night in Nashville. The third-ranked team in the FBS finished the game with 481 yards of total offense, including 325 on the ground. D'Andre Swift led that attack with 149 yards on 16 carries (9.3 yards/carry) while Brian Herrien added 65 yards and a touchdown and Zamir White had 51 yards. Quarterback Jake Fromm, who is 24-5 all-time as a starter, completed 15-of-23 passes for 156 yards and a touchdown to Demetris Robertson. He was one of eight different receivers to catch a pass from Fromm on the evening. The Bulldogs defense limited Vanderbilt to just 3-of-14 on third down. Junior defensive back Mark Webb and junior linebacker Monty Rice each had seven tackles while freshman Azeez Ojulari added six stops and half a sack. Kicker Rodrigo Blankenship was perfect on the night, connecting from 50, 37 and 31 yards.

**GAME NOTES:** After not playing a season ago, regional rivals Jacksonville State and Chattanooga will renew their rivalry on Saturday. Two years ago the teams met in Week Zero as part of the Guardian Credit Union FCS Kickoff, a game JSU won 27-13. That marked the fifth-straight win in the series for the Gamecocks who have won nine of the last 10 overall (with UTC winning in 2011) and 10 of 12 since the rivalry resumed in 2004 (after a 21-year break). In each of the past five games (and six of the past seven) both teams have been ranked in the Top 25. In the 2017 contest, Roc Thomas rushed for 122 yards and a touchdown and Bryant Horn added 31 yards on the ground to go along with 182 passing yards (completing 14-of-20 passes). Jonathan Hagler returned an interception 52 yards in the third quarter to put the game out of reach. Nick Tiano passed for 218 yards and a touchdown for UTC while adding a team-best 68 yards on the ground.

**SCOUTING CHATTANOOGA:** Chattanooga got its season (the first under Rusty Wright) off on a winning note (just the fourth time in the past 13 years the Mocs had won its season-opener) by besting OVC foe Eastern Illinois. Chattanooga led 14-3 in the second quarter and after the Panthers pulled to within four points with 2:39 to go in the quarter, the Mocs closed the half with a 37-yard field goal to extend the advantage to 17-10. The only scoring of the second half was a 1-yard run five minutes into the third quarter by Ailym Ford. Ford finished the game with a team-high 50 rushing yards. Senior quarterback Nick Tiano passed for 256 yards and a touchdown and added a rushing score. Bryce Nunnally had six catches for 100 yards, including a 59-yard touchdown. Marshall Cooper had a team-best 10 tackles and added two pass breakups.

**SCOUTING JACKSONVILLE STATE:** Five-time defending OVC champion Jacksonville State gave up six sacks and threw two interceptions that led to touchdowns in a 35-14 season-opening loss at Southeastern Louisiana. An interception on the third play of the game was returned to the four-yard line and SLU scored a play later to go up 7-0. After a JSU punt, the Lions marched down the field in nine plays and grabbed a 14-0 lead. The Gamecocks were able to cut that margin in half when Zerrick Cooper hooked up with Josh Pearson on a 33-yard touchdown early in the second quarter. But JSU would get no closer and its only other score came in the fourth quarter when Cooper connected with Michael Matthews. Cooper finished the game 40-of-52 for 414 yards and two touchdowns. The 414 yards were the fourth-most in JSU single-game history while his 40 completions shattered the school mark of 32. Trae Barry led the way with 10 catches for 83 yards and was one of 11 different Gamecocks to catch a pass in the game. JSU was limited to just 67 net rushing yards for the game. After its loss, Jacksonville State slipped from No. 6 in both FCS Top 25 polls to No. 17 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 18 in the STATS Poll. It marks only the fourth time in the past 75 weeks that the team has not been ranked in the Top 10 nationally.

**GAME NOTES:** For the 28th time, Eastern Kentucky will battle Louisville on the gridiron. The two teams first played in 1927 and last played during the 2013 season. In that game, the No. 8 ranked Cardinals led 27-0 at halftime on its way to a 44-7 win over the Colonels, who were ranked No. 21 in the FCS. Teddy Bridgewater passed for 397 yards and four touchdowns for UofL while Jared McClain had 85 passing yards and a score for the Colonels while also rushing for a team-high 27 yards. The last ECU win in the series came in 1985, a 45-21 victory. Since the formation of the FCS (then I-AA) in 1978, ECU is 7-29 against FBS opponents, win its last win coming at Miami (Ohio) in 2014. A year ago the Colonels gave Bowling Green all it could handle before falling 42-35.

**SCOUTING EASTERN KENTUCKY:** Following a season-opening 53-7 win over Valparaiso, Eastern Kentucky has now won five games in a row dating back to the 2018 season. The Colonels scored just 1:48 into the game as Daryl McCleskey Jr. rushed for a 64-yard touchdown. Less than a minute later Corey Glass picked up a fumble and returned it 29 yards for a score to put the Colonels up 15-0. Eastern led 32-0 at halftime and finished the game with 442 yards of total offense while limiting the Crusaders to just 184 yards (the fewest allowed to an opponent since 2013). Alonzo Booth had a team-best 128 yards and three touchdowns on just seven carries (18.3 yards/carry) while McCleskey finished the game with 69 yards on the ground. Booth had an 86-yard touchdown run, the fourth longest ECU run from scrimmage since 2007. Overall the Colonels had 333 team rushing yards. Glass led the team with eight tackles, while Steven Crowder added 11 (3.0 for loss) and a sack. The 46-point win was the largest for ECU against a Division I team since a 49-0 win over Tennessee State in 2005. ECU is still receiving votes in both Top 25 polls.

**SCOUTING LOUISVILLE:** Louisville opens the 2019 season on Monday night by hosting nationally-ranked Notre Dame; it marks the first time the Fighting Irish have visited the Cardinals. It marks the first game with the Cardinals under head coach Scott Satterfield, who played quarterback at Appalachian State before later becoming the program's head coach, leading the transition from FCS to FBS. In 23 years with the program (as quarterback, assistant and head coach) the program won three national championships and 11 conference titles. Quarterback Jawon Pass threw for 1,960 yards and eight touchdowns a season ago. Sophomore Tutu Atwell is coming off a season where he had 24 catches for 406 yards, leading the team with a 16.9 yards/catch average. On the defensive side of the ball, UofL is looking to improve on its scoring defense after allowing 44.1 points/game last season. That defensive unit returns seven starters.

**GAME NOTES:** Former OVC rivals Middle Tennessee and Tennessee State will meet for the first time since the 1998 season on Saturday. That is when the Blue Raiders left the conference to join the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS). Tennessee State won six of the first seven games in the all-time series (which began in 1973), before the Blue Raiders won six-straight from 1987-92. TSU won back-to-back games in 1996 and 1997 before dropping the last meeting in 1998. This marks the fourth-straight season that Tennessee State has played a FBS opponent. The Tigers are 5-7 all-time against opponents from the FBS.

**SCOUTING TENNESSEE STATE:** Tennessee State had 447 yards of total offense and got four field goals from sophomore Antonio Zita in topping Mississippi Valley State 26-20 in the annual John Merritt Classic. TSU is now 15-6 all-time in the event. Senior Chris Rowland caught 11 passes for a career-high 172 yards and a touchdown; he also added 61 punt return yards and two rushing yards to finish the contest with 235 all-purpose yards, which ranks him third among all FCS players after week one. Starting quarterback Cameron Rosendahl completed 25 passes for 330 yards and a touchdown and also rushed for a score. In addition to Rowland, Steven Newbold (who missed most of last year with an injury), caught five passes for 61 yards. Zita was effective with his right foot. After missing a 36-yard field goal in the second quarter, he connected from 31, 28, a career-long 44 and 26 yards for the Tigers. Zita scored the final nine points for the Tigers. The 14 points scored by kicking were the third-most in school history. The TSU defense limited the Delta Devils to just 247 yards, including just 42 yards on the ground (the eight-lowest output allowed nationally during the week). Jahsun Bryant had nine tackles while Terry Straughter added seven stops (including 1.5 for loss).

**SCOUTING MIDDLE TENNESSEE:** Middle Tennessee, which has played in a school record four-straight bowl games, opened its 2019 season with a 40-21 loss to No. 7 ranked Michigan in the Big House. MTSU had nine first-time starters in the game (7 on offense, 2 on defense), including the entire offensive line. Quarterback Asher O'Hara was one of the first-time starters, passing for 217 yards on 22 completions and tossing two touchdowns. O'Hara also had a team-high 32 rushing yards and scored on an 18-yard run on the Blue Raiders first possession of the game. Ty Lee, who has now made a catch in 41-straight games, had a team-high four catches, although 14 different receivers had at least one reception in the game. Senior Khalil Brooks had half a sack against the Wolverines to move his career total to 15.0 which ranks fourth in school history. He is also now seventh in tackles-for-loss yards (138), fourth in sack yards (108) and tied for fourth in career tackles-for-loss (34). Head coach Rick Stockstill is in his 14th season at MTSU his is the sixth-longest tenured coach in the FBS.

**GAME NOTES:** UT Martin will travel to "The Swamp" for its first-ever matchup with the Florida Gators on Saturday. The Skyhawks, who will end the season with another SEC foe Kentucky, are 1-26 all-time against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents. That lone win came against Memphis in 2012. This marks the seventh SEC opponent for the Skyhawks since 2008.

**SCOUTING UT MARTIN:** UT Martin scored 28 unanswered second half points to overcome a 20-14 halftime deficit to top Northwestern State 42-20 last Thursday. The victory was the 81st for head coach Jason Simpson at UT Martin, moving him into a tie for sixth place in OVC history. UTM held Northwestern State to just 166 yards of total offense in the second half and scored on a 78-yard interception return by Wanya Moton, one of two picks on the night for the sophomore. Overall the Skyhawks scored on defense, special teams (a 55-yard punt return by Terry Williams), by rushing and passing. It marked the first since UTM had scored on offense, defense and special teams in the same game since September 27, 2008 against Murray State. Junior Peyton Logan finished the game with 149 rushing yards on 13 carries (11.5 yards/carry) and scored a pair of touchdowns (21 yards and 53 yards). It was the first 100-yard rushing game for a UTM player since the 2017 season. Quarterback John Bachus III earned his first career start and passed for 130 yards and two scores and ran for 20 yards. In addition to his two interceptions, Moton had seven tackles while TJ Jefferson added a team-best 12 stops and a sack.

**SCOUTING FLORIDA:** Florida opened its 2019 campaign during Week Zero, topping in-state rival Miami by a 24-20 margin. The game was played at Camping World Stadium in Orlando and marked just the second win by UF over the Hurricanes since 1986. Quarterback Feleipe Franks completed 17-of-27 passes for 254 yards and a pair of touchdowns (66 yards in the first quarter and 8 yards in the third quarter). Franks capped the scoring with a 3-yard run with 8:18 to play in what proved to be the game-winner. Franks has accounted for three or more touchdowns in a game six times in two seasons under head coach Dan Mullen. The Gators were able to rush for only a net of 50 yards, 42 coming from Lamical Perine. Josh Hammond added a career-high 93 receiving yards. The Florida defense was stingy, holding Miami to just 2-of-13 (15.4%) on third down and racking up 10 sacks, its highest single-game total since 1996. Ventrell Miller had two of those sacks to go along with six tackles and a pass breakup; the tackles and sack totals were both career-highs.

**GAME NOTES:** Southeast Missouri will travel to Big Sky country for its first-ever matchup with Montana State on Saturday. The game is the only contest of week two to pit nationally-ranked teams against each other. Both programs won playoff games a season ago. Southeast Missouri head coach Tom Matukewicz has five wins over nationally-ranked teams in his previous five years at Southeast Missouri; that is the most in school history.

**SCOUTING SOUTHEAST MISSOURI:** Coming off one of its best seasons in school history (which included its first-ever playoff win), Southeast Missouri opened the 2019 campaign with a convincing 44-26 win over regional rival Southern Illinois. The Redhawks were slow out of the gate, falling behind 14-7 near the end of the second quarter. But two touchdowns in the final 4:30 before halftime put Southeast on top and a 17-0 third quarter put the game out of reach. Senior linebacker Zach Hall, the 2018 Buck Buchanan Award Winner as the National Defensive Player of the Year, picked up where he left off, tallying 19 tackles to push his career total to over 300. Hall also had a sack in the win. Senior quarterback Daniel Santacaterina passed for 248 yards and a touchdown and rushed for 54 yards and two additional scores in the win. In the process he went over 3,000 career passing yards. Senior Kristian Wilkerson caught six passes for 146 yards and a touchdown. The Redhawks finished the game with 281 yards on the ground, as Zion Custis had 78 yards and a touchdown, Geno Hess added 77 yards and a score and Mark Robinson had 72 yards and a touchdown. It marked the eighth-straight home win for the Redhawks. Southeast Missouri is now ranked No. 12 in the STATS Top 25 poll and No. 13 in the FCS Coaches Poll.

**SCOUTING MONTANA STATE:** Montana State finished last season 8-5 and won a first round FCS Playoff game before losing to eventual national champion North Dakota State in the second round. They finished last year ranked 17th nationally. MSU opened this season with a 45-10 loss to FBS opponent Texas Tech in Lubbock. Casey Bauman finished the game with 120 passing yards and a 31-yard touchdown pass to Coy Steel in the second quarter. Steel was one of six different receivers to catch a pass, nabbing three for 56 yards while Kevin Kassis also had three receptions. Isaiah Ifanse had 77 rushing yards including a run of 40 yards. Athlete Troy Anderson, who is on the Walter Payton Watch List and played mainly quarterback last year, threw a pair of passes, carried the ball once and made four tackles on defense. Brayden Konkol had a team-high nine tackles while Bryce Sterk had six tackles and a sack. Montana State is ranked No. 13 in the STATS Top 25 poll this week and No. 19 in the FCS Coaches Poll.
