## QUICK HITS

**TOP 25 AND MORE:** OREGON remains No. 11 in the AP and now ranks No. 13 in the Coaches poll, while USC remains at No. 20 in both. UTAH, WASHINGTON and ARIZONA STATE all received votes in the AP heading into this weekend.

**WELL, SHOUGH(S):** With 312 passing and 81 rushing yards this past weekend, OREGON's Tyler Shough's became the first Oregon QB with 200+ pass yards & 80+ rush yards in back-to-back games since Marcus Mariota's Heisman campaign in 2014.

- He is one of just four quarterbacks in the country this season to throw for more than 200 yards and rush for over 80 yards in at least two games (Liberty's Malik Willis, Virginia Tech's Hendon Hooker and Middle Tennessee State's Asher O'Hara).
- Shough was named to the Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award's Great 8 list for his performance in Week 11.

**MORE ON THE DUCKS:** Oregon has won 17 of 19 games dating to Nov. 2018. The Ducks' .895 win percentage over that span is 4th best in FBS behind only Ohio State, Clemson and Appalachian State.

- Oregon has racked up 538.5 YPG this year, tops in the Pac-12 and 7th in FBS.
- The Ducks run game, led by CJ Verdell, is racking up 269.0 YPG, tops in the Pac-12 and 5th best in FBS.

**THE STAMPEDE:** COLORADO's Jarek Broussard became the first Pac-12 player since Arizona's Nick Wilson in 2014 to have 100+ rush yards in their first two collegiate games.

- Broussard is the third COLORADO player to have 100+ rush yards in his first two games and the first since 2000 (Marcus Houston).
- The Buffs are 2-0 to start the year for the fifth-straight season, scoring 41.5 PPG to lead the Pac-12.
- QB Sam Noyer, this past week's Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week, presented by Nextiva, has thrown for 250+ yards in both games this season. The former safety last week became the first Buffs QB since 2015 to throw two TD and run for two TD.

**BETTER LATE THAN NEVER:** For the first time in USC history, the Trojans have won back-to-back contests with game-winning scores in the final two minutes.

- USC has won six of its last eight contests by eight points or less.

**HE'S STILL NOT KEDON AROUND:** After throwing for 325 yards against Arizona last weekend, USC quarterback Kedon Slovis has now thrown for over 300 yards in seven career games and in five of the last six contests.

- Has thrown for 28 touchdowns in the last ten games.
- In his career in the 4th quarter, he has thrown 11 touchdowns and no interceptions.
- His 71.4% completion percentage ranks 7th in FBS this year.
- Over the last four Trojans games, dating back to last year, over 100 of his yards have been complete to Amon-Ra St. Brown, which ties Brown for the longest such active streak in FBS.

**AIR RAID:** Since 2012, WASHINGTON STATE has had 15 players with 10+ catch games, the most in the FBS. The next most in the Pac-12 is USC with eight.

- In his 10 catches, Renard Bell totaled 158 yards and a touchdown, both career highs.

**RUNNING INTO BEAVER HISTORY:** OREGON STATE's Jermar Jefferson ran for 133 yards and a touchdown on 23 carries last weekend vs. WASHINGTON.

- The 100-yard game was the 12th of Jefferson's career.
- He is now 7th on the Beavers' all time rushing list, passing Pete Fifer.
- His score on Saturday ties him with Ryan Nall for 7th on the school's all-time rushing TD list.

**WELCOME, COACH!:** With WASHINGTON making its season debut on Saturday, new head coach Jimmy Lake was welcomed with a win.

- Of the 24 new head coaches in 2020, three remain undefeated, including Lake(1-0), COLORADO's Karl Dorrell (2-0) and Old Dominion. Just four have won their first two games.

## 2020 SCHEDULE INFO

- Each team is set to play five divisional games and one crossover game against a non-division opponent, with these six games being evenly distributed between home and away for each team.
- The seventh & final week will feature all 12 teams in action highlighted by the Pac-12 Football Championship Game, presented by 76®, on Dec. 18, which this year will take place in a home-hosted format.
- Week seven match up information will be announced at a later date.

## HEALTH AND SAFETY

For universities utilizing daily antigen testing, at least one weekly PCR test will also be administered for each student-athlete, in addition to all positive tests to be confirmed with a PCR test. All testing recommendations will be reviewed and updated as needed on an ongoing basis.

In addition to the consistent access to sufficient testing across all Pac-12 programs, community prevalence has shown continued improvement in the majority of communities across the Pac-12 footprint. To address concerns regarding potential health outcomes related to the virus, each Pac-12 sports medicine group will be implementing cardiac monitoring protocols for all student-athletes with a positive test. The Pac-12 institutions are also participating in a national COVID-19 cardiac registry which will allow for medical practitioners to monitor closely, and gain greater insight into, potential health outcomes in student-athletes.

Key elements of the testing protocols for football student-athletes include the following:

- Daily point-of-care testing on each day of full practice, higher-risk of transmission activity, travel, and games;
- Minimum once weekly PCR test (in addition to daily point-of-care testing). For football game weeks, the weekly PCR test will take place within 36 hours of game time for home team student-athletes and within 36 hours of travel departure for visiting team student-athletes;
- Any positive daily point-of-care antigen test must be followed by a PCR test within 24 hours;
- A third-party testing administrator will administer game day point-of-care antigen tests (and PCR tests as applicable) for each team and on-field officials;
- Game day air ambulance service will be available in case any individual tests positive while traveling for competition; and
- All testing protocols continue to be subject to state, local, and campus public health requirements.

## GAME CANCELLATION POLICY

The Pac-12 has established minimum thresholds to play a football game of at least 53 scholarship players available to participate and the following minimum number of position scholarship players available to begin a game: seven (7) offensive linemen, one (1) quarterback and four (4) defensive linemen. Each institution shall provide a complete roster by position to the Conference office prior to the season. The impacted institution has the option to play the game with fewer than the 53 scholarship players or fewer than the minimum number of position players listed above if it elects to do so. Otherwise, upon approval by the Commissioner, the game would be rescheduled or declared a no contest.

In addition, a game should be rescheduled or declared a no contest in the event of the following COVID-19 related impacts:

1. Inability to isolate new positive cases within a team or athletic department or to quarantine high-risk contacts.
2. Unavailability or inability to perform testing as provided by the Pac-12 medical guidelines.
3. Campus-wide or local community transmission rates that are considered unsafe by local public health officials.
4. Inability to perform adequate contact tracing consistent with governmental requirements.
5. Local public health officials of the home team state that there is an inability for the hospital infrastructure to accommodate a surge.
