QUICK HITS

WHAT A WEEKEND TO WATCH: Following a few schedule changes for this weekend, the Pac-12 is set to have:

- ABC doubleheader on Saturday with COLORADO at #18 USC at 12:30p PT / 1:30p MT followed by UTAH at WASHINGTON at 4:30p PT / 5:30p MT.
- ESPN showcase with #15 Oregon at Oregon State at 4:30p PT.
- FOX with a pair of Pac-12 football matchups including The Big Game on Friday at 1:30p PT and ARIZONA at UCLA on Saturday at 5p PT / 6p MT.

MOOR TO THIS OFFENSE: The 3-0 Ducks enter rivalry week for the North division having gained 7.65 yards per play thus far, the sixth-highest mark among FBS teams.

- OREGON's offense has produced 38.7 points per game, tied for 19th among FBS teams.
- Overall, the Ducks have produced 499.7 total yards per game, ranking 16th among FBS teams.
- On third downs, OREGON has converted at a 57.6% rate, the fourth-best mark among FBS teams.
- OREGON is one of three Power 5 programs averaging over 275 yards passing and 200 yards rushing this season (minimum two games played).
- The Ducks rank ninth in the country with 5.69 yards per rush and fourth with 152 rushing yards per game in the second half.

JOE MOORE AWARD: OREGON and UCLA have been named to the Joe Moore Award Midseason Honor Roll, honoring the Most Outstanding Offensive Line Unit in college football.

- The Joe Moore Award voting committee judges on six criteria that historically proven to distinguish winning O-line play: toughness, effort, teamwork, consistency, technique, and finishing.

FOR THE AXE: The Big Game is the sixth-most played FBS rivalry game. CALIFORNIA is STANFORD's most common opponent, and STANFORD's 64 wins over the Bears are its most against any opponent.

THE FIGHT IS ON: USC has started 3-0 for the second time in the last nine seasons, their first 3-0 start since 2017 (eventual Rose Bowl champs that year).

- The Trojans have started 3-0 in Pac-12 play for the first time since 2006 (also eventual Rose Bowl champs that year).

RESTED OPPONENTS: When USC takes on Colorado this weekend, it will be the fourth-straight week the Trojans face an opponent that did not play the previous week.

- The Trojans have started 3-0 in Pac-12 play for the first time since 2006 (also eventual Rose Bowl champs that year).
- USC's remaining schedule sees the Trojans in Los Angeles with two home games and a "road trip" to face UCLA.
- The Trojans have won 14 of their last 15 home games vs. Pac-12 South opponents, and 19 of their last 22 home games against Pac-12 opponents overall.

PURPLE REIGN: WASHINGTON's defense has been stout this season, allowing just 291.5 yards per game, including 172 pass yards per game, both of which rank sixth in FBS.

- The Huskies have also allowed just a 24 percent third-down conversion rate, the second-best clip in the nation.

HE DOES IT ALL: OREGON STATE's Tristian Gebbia became the 11th Pac-12 player since 1996, and first since 2018, to have a pass TD, rush TD and receiving TD in the same game after accomplishing the feat against Cal last weekend.

SOMETHING'S A BRUIN: UCLA has rushed for at least 200 yards as a team in seven of the last 11 games, including the past two contests.

- The Bruins have allowed just 1.0 sack per game to rank 10th nationally in the category.

2020 SCHEDULE INFO

- Each team is set to play five divisional games and one crossover game against a non-division opponent, with these six games being evenly distributed between home and away for each team.
- The seventh & final week will feature all 12 teams in action highlighted by the Pac-12 Football Championship Game, presented by 76®, on Dec. 18, which this year will take place in a home-hosted format.
- Week seven match up information will be announced at a later date.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

For universities utilizing daily antigen testing, at least one weekly PCR test will also be administered for each student-athlete, in addition to all positive tests to be confirmed with a PCR test. All testing recommendations will be reviewed and updated as needed on an ongoing basis.

In addition to the consistent access to sufficient testing across all Pac-12 programs, community prevalence has shown continued improvement in the majority of communities across the Pac-12 footprint. To address concerns regarding potential health outcomes related to the virus, each Pac-12 sports medicine group will be implementing cardiac monitoring protocols for all student-athletes with a positive test. The Pac-12 institutions are also participating in a national COVID-19 cardiac registry which will allow for medical practitioners to monitor closely, and gain greater insight into, potential health outcomes in student-athletes.

Key elements of the testing protocols for football student-athletes include the following:

- Daily point-of-care testing on each day of full practice, higher-risk of transmission activity, travel, and games;
- Minimum once weekly PCR test (in addition to daily point-of-care testing). For football game weeks, the weekly PCR test will take place within 36 hours of game time for home team student-athletes and within 36 hours of travel departure for visiting team student-athletes;
- Any positive daily point-of-care antigen test must be followed by a PCR test within 24 hours;
- A third-party testing administrator will administer game day point-of-care antigen tests (and PCR tests as applicable) for each team and on-field officials;
- Game day air ambulance service will be available in case any individual tests positive while traveling for competition; and
- All testing protocols continue to be subject to state, local, and campus public health requirements.

GAME CANCELLATION POLICY

The Pac-12 has established minimum thresholds to play a football game of at least 53 scholarship players available to participate and the following minimum number of position scholarship players available to begin a game: seven (7) offensive linemen, one (1) quarterback and four (4) defensive linemen. Each institution shall provide a complete roster by position to the Conference office prior to the season. The impacted institution has the option to play the game with fewer than the 53 scholarship players or fewer than the minimum number of position players listed above if it elects to do so. Otherwise, upon approval by the Commissioner, the game would be rescheduled or declared a no contest.

In addition, a game should be rescheduled or declared a no contest in the event of the following COVID-19 related impacts:

1. Inability to isolate new positive cases within a team or athletic department or to quarantine high-risk contacts.
2. Unavailability or inability to perform testing as provided by the Pac-12 medical guidelines.
3. Campus-wide or local community transmission rates that are considered unsafe by local public health officials.
4. Inability to perform adequate contact tracing consistent with governmental requirements.
5. Local public health officials of the home team state that there is an inability for the hospital infrastructure to accommodate a surge.
