QUICK HITS

BOWL UPDATES: Today, Dec. 2, ESPN Events announced that the 2020 Las Vegas Bowl will not be played due to the COVID-19 pandemic. On Tuesday, Dec. 1, the Sun Bowl Association announced the 2020 Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl will not be played, also due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

- Following the news, the Pac-12's current bowl lineup, as of Dec. 2, includes: Rose Bowl (CFP semifinal), Valero Alamo Bowl, LA Bowl and Independence Bowl.
- Pac-12 teams this season are required to be .500-or-better to be considered bowl eligible.

RESTED OPPONENTS: When USC faces WASHINGTON STATE on Sunday, Dec. 6, it will be the Cougs first game since Nov. 14 (and Trojans first game since Nov. 21).

- Every opponent for USC this season, including this week's, did not play the prior week (ARIZONA STATE on Nov. 7, ARIZONA on Nov. 14 and UTAH on Nov. 21).

JUST FIGHT ON: USC has allowed opponents to convert just 2-of-15 third downs in the second half this year (1-of-10 in the fourth quarter).

DAVEY O'BRIEN AWARD: On Tuesday, Dec. 1, the Davey O'Brien Foundation announced the 35 quarterbacks named to the Davey O'Brien QB Class of 2020, with each member of the group now an official candidate to win the 2020 Davey O'Brien National Quarterback Award. Pac-12 candidates include OREGON's Tyler Shough and USC's Kedon Slovis.

- Kedon Slovis this season has thrown for over 260 yards in all three of USC's games. His 70.7 completion percentage leads the Pac-12 and ranks ninth best in the country. His 31.3 completions per game lead the nation, while his 323.3 pass YPG rank seventh in FBS and lead the Pac-12.
- Tyler Shough has now thrown multiple TDs in each of his last three games, with nine total over that span. He is the third Oregon QB since 1962 with multiple total TDs in each of his first four starts (also, Darron Thomas & A.J. Feeley).

THIS MAN IS LANDING ON LISTS: COLORADO's Nate Landman had a career-high three sacks in the Buffs win over San Diego State last week.

- He is now the third CU player since 2010 with three sacks in a game, the first to do so since Mustafa Johnson had three in 2019 vs. Nebraska.
- Landman's performance earned him honors with being named a Butkus Award semifinalist on Monday, Nov. 30 as well as the Football Writers Association of America's Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week on Tuesday, Dec. 1.
- Also named Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week, presented by Nextiva, his second weekly honor of the season (also, week two).

MORE ON THE BUFFS: COLORADO's Jarek Broussard is the first Buffs RB since Eric Bienemy in 1988 to rush for 100+ yards in a season's first three games.

- Broussard is also the second player in COLORADO history to have 100+ rush yards in the first three games of his career (Charlie Davis in 1971).
- COLORADO quarterback Sam Noyer has recorded a rush TD and pass TD in all three games this season.

THE DAWG POUND: WASHINGTON's Zion Tupuola-Fetui has 7.0 sacks this season, the most by any FBS player since 2012 in a team's first three games.

- WASHINGTON ranks 12th in the country in today defense allowing just 314.0 yards per game and third in passing yards allowed with 162.7.
- Huskies have now shut out their opponents in at least one half of every game this season (OREGON STATE & ARIZONA in first half, UTAH in second half).

CALL IT A COMEBACK: Last weekend WASHINGTON overcame a 21-0 halftime deficit, which was the largest halftime deficit the Huskies have overtime to win since 1988.

- It was also the forth time since 1996 a Pac-12 school has come back from a deficit of 21 or more points.

YOUNG DUCK: OREGON's Noah Sewell is one of three FBS freshmen with 10 tackles and two stops for loss in a single game this season.

RUN IT: OREGON STATE's Jermar Jefferson ranks second in FBS with 168.8 rush yards per game and COLORADO's Jarek Broussard ranks fourth with 144.0 yards per game.

2020 SCHEDULE INFO

- Each team is set to play five divisional games and one crossover game against a non-division opponent, with these six games being evenly distributed between home and away for each team.
- The seventh & final week will feature all 12 teams in action highlighted by the Pac-12 Football Championship Game, presented by 76®, on Dec. 18, which this year will take place in a home-hosted format.
- Week seven match up information will be announced at a later date.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

For universities utilizing daily antigen testing, at least one weekly PCR test will also be administered for each student-athlete, in addition to all positive tests to be confirmed with a PCR test. All testing recommendations will be reviewed and updated as needed on an ongoing basis.

In addition to the consistent access to sufficient testing across all Pac-12 programs, community prevalence has shown continued improvement in the majority of communities across the Pac-12 footprint. To address concerns regarding potential health outcomes related to the virus, each Pac-12 sports medicine group will be implementing cardiac monitoring protocols for all student-athletes with a positive test. The Pac-12 institutions are also participating in a national COVID-19 cardiac registry which will allow for medical practitioners to monitor closely, and gain greater insight into, potential health outcomes in student-athletes.

Key elements of the testing protocols for football student-athletes include the following:

- Daily point-of-care testing on each day of full practice, higher-risk of transmission activity, travel, and games;
- Minimum once weekly PCR test (in addition to daily point-of-care testing). For football game weeks, the weekly PCR test will take place within 36 hours of game time for home team student-athletes and within 36 hours of travel departure for visiting team student-athletes;
- Any positive daily point-of-care antigen test must be followed by a PCR test within 24 hours;
- A third-party testing administrator will administer game day point-of-care antigen tests (and PCR tests as applicable) for each team and on-field officials;
- Game day air ambulance service will be available in case any individual tests positive while traveling for competition; and
- All testing protocols continue to be subject to state, local, and campus public health requirements.

GAME CANCELLATION POLICY

The Pac-12 has established minimum thresholds to play a football game of at least 53 scholarship players available to participate and the following minimum number of position scholarship players available to begin a game: seven (7) offensive linemen, one (1) quarterback and four (4) defensive linemen. Each institution shall provide a complete roster by position to the Conference office prior to the season. The impacted institution has the option to play the game with fewer than the 53 scholarship players or fewer than the minimum number of position players listed above if it elects to do so. Otherwise, upon approval by the Commissioner, the game would be rescheduled or declared a no contest.

In addition, a game should be rescheduled or declared no contest in the event of the following COVID-19 related impacts:

1. Inability to isolate new positive cases within a team or athletic department or to quarantine high-risk contacts.
2. Unavailability or inability to perform testing as provided by the Pac-12 medical guidelines.
3. Campus-wide or local community transmission rates that are considered unsafe by local public health officials.
4. Inability to perform adequate contact tracing consistent with governmental requirements.
5. Local public health officials of the home team state that there is an inability for the hospital infrastructure to accommodate a surge.

Tiebreak Procedures To Determine Division Champions (Unbalanced Conference Schedule)

In order for teams to be considered in a divisional tiebreak scenario, teams must play no less than one fewer conference game than the average number of conference games played by all conference teams (rounded up/down at .50). For example, if the average number of conference games played in the 2020 season is 5.25 (value of 5 when rounded down), a team would be eligible to win their Division if that team played 4 conference games.

The winner of each Division will be determined by the best winning percentage (both divisional and cross-divisional) within the conference. In the event of an unbalanced schedule where there is a tie for the best record in the loss column, head-to-head results will take precedence over winning percentage.

In determining the divisional champions, the following will apply: If any team(s) has not played six (6) Conference games (due to not being able to reschedule a postponed Conference game) and any team(s) is within one Conference win from the team(s) with the highest conference winning percentage AND has an equal number of losses, those teams shall be declared tied.

The following procedures will be applied to determine the Pac-12 Championship Game representatives:

Two-Team Tie

1. Head-to-head results
2. Record in games played within the division
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (based on record in all games played within the Conference), proceeding through the division
4. Record in common Conference games
5. Team with the highest College Football Playoff (CFP) ranking
6. Cumulative winning percentage of each tied team's Conference opponents
7. Highest ranking by SportSource Analytics (Team Rating Score metric) following the last weekend of regular-season games
8. Coin toss

Multiple-Team Ties

The following procedures will only be used to eliminate all but two teams, at which point the two- team tiebreaking procedure will be applied:

1. Head-to-head (best record in games among the tied teams)
2. Record in games played within the division
3. Record against the next highest placed team in the division (based on record in all games played within the Conference), proceeding through the division
4. Record in common Conference games
5. Team with the highest College Football Playoff (CFP) ranking
6. Cumulative winning percentage of each tied team's Conference opponents
7. Highest ranking by SportSource Analytics following the last weekend of regular-season games

Determination of Championship Game Host

The home team in the Pac-12 Championship Game will be determined by the record in all Conference games. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the home team:

1. Head-to-head competition, if applicable
2. Record against the next highest-placed common opponent in the Conference (based on recording all games played within the Conference) proceeding through the Conference
3. Record in common Conference games
4. Team with the highest College Football Playoff (CFP) ranking
5. Highest ranking by SportSource Analytics following the last weekend of regular-season games
6. Coin toss
