# **QUICK HITS**

FROM SUN UP TO AFTER DARK: Action this week kicks off for #Pac12FB on Friday with a Pac-12 South rivalry from the desert with ARIZONA STATE at ARIZONA, and continues bright & early on Saturday:

- On Wednesday, FOX and the Pac-12 announced that the UTAH at COLORADO game will move from Friday evening on FS1 to FOX's Big Noon Kickoff on Saturday at 9a PT / 10a MT.
- FOX continues with a Pac-12 North showdown with WASHINGTON at OREGON right after at 1p PT / 2p MT.
- ABC will feature another Pac-12 South rivalry with USC at UCLA at 4:30p PT / 5:30p MT.
- A pair of 7:30p PT kickoffs wrap up the day with CAL at WASHINGTON STATE on FS1 and STANFORD at OREGON STATE on ESPNU.

**THE 2020 #PAC12FCG:** Saturday will feature several matchups between Pac-12 North and Pac-12 South opponents that will look to determine participants in the 2020 Pac-12 Football Championship Game, presented by 76.

- Pac-12 North: The winner of the WASHINGTON at OREGON would earn the Pac-12 North division title and a trip to the #Pac12FCG.
- Pac-12 South: The division title for the south will come down to contests between USC at UCLA and/or UTAH at COLORADO, as the Buffs would need a win AND a win for UCLA, while the Trojans would need a win OR a win for UTAH.
- All #Pac12FCG scenarios presented are based on the current schedule of games being played this week.
- The #Pac12FCG will be home-hosted this year, with the site location coming down to the Pac-12 South division winner.
- The 2020 #Pac12FCG will be Friday, Dec. 18 at 5p PT / 6p MT on FOX.

**FINAL WEEK'S MATCHUPS:** The Pac-12 will announce its final week of matchups (week seven) following this weekend's contests.

BUFFALO STAMPEDE: COLORADO improved to 4-0 on the season this past week, starting 4-0 for the first time since 2018 (started 5-0 that year). The Buffs have now started 3-0 in conference play for the first time since 2002 (first 3-0 start in Pac-12 play ever for the Buffs.)

- Head Coach Karl Dorrell is now the second Colorado coach since 1905 to his first four games as a head coach (Rick Neuheisel won his first five in 1995, with Dorrell as his offensive coordinator).
- Buffs ran for 407 yards vs. ARIZONA, the most rushing yards in a single game by a Pac-12 team this season (next most, 281 by UCLA).

- **WE CU, JAREK:** Buffs RB **Jarek Broussard** last week ran for a career-high 301 yards, becoming the fourth player in COLORADO history to run for 300+ yards.
  - Broussard's 155 rush yards in the second quarter vs. ARIZONA were the most yards in a single quarter in Buffs history.
  - He is now the first player in Buffs history to start his career with 100+ yards in his first four games.
  - Currently ranks second in FBS in rush yards per game with 183.3.

**FIGHT ON:** On Sunday evening, USC's **Amon-Ra St. Brown** recorded four TD receptions, all in the first quarter vs. WASHINGTON STATE.

- With the performance, the Trojans receiver became just the second player in FBS history with four receiving TDs in a single quarter (also, Duke's Corey Thomas had four in 1997 vs. Georgia Tech).
- Trojans QB Kedon Slovis had five total TDs in the first half on Sunday, finishing with 287 yards total on the day (first Trojans QB with five TD in a half since 2014, Cody Kessler vs. Notre Dame).
- With the win on Sunday, USC has started 4-0 for the first time since 2017 and will be looking to go 5-0 to start a season for the first time since 2006 (started 6-0 that season). USC has started 4-0 in conference play for the first time since 2006.
- USC is one of nine remaining undefeated teams in FBS (also, COLORADO in the Pac-12).

AWARDS WATCH: This week, a number of National College Football Awards Association semifinalists were announced, in addition to a pair of honors for COLORADO student-athletes with Nate Landman earning the Chuck Bednarik Award Player of the Week honor and Jarek Broussard the Early Campbell Tyler Rose Award Player of the Week honor, for their performances last weekend.

- The seventh & final week will feature all 12 teams in action highlighted by the Pac-12 Football Championship Game, presented by 76®, on Dec. 18, which this year will take place in a home-hosted format.
- Week seven match up information will be announced following week six conclusion.

# **HEALTH AND SAFETY**

For universities utilizing daily antigen testing, at least one weekly PCR test will also be administered for each student-athlete, in addition to all positive tests to be confirmed with a PCR test. All testing recommendations will be reviewed and updated as needed on an ongoing basis.

In addition to the consistent access to sufficient testing across all Pac-12 programs, community prevalence has shown continued improvement in the majority of communities across the Pac-12 footprint. To address concerns regarding potential health outcomes related to the virus, each Pac-12 sports medicine group will be implementing cardiac monitoring protocols for all student-athletes with a positive test. The Pac-12 institutions are also participating in a national COVID-19 cardiac registry which will allow for medical practitioners to monitor closely, and gain greater insight into, potential health outcomes in student-athletes.

Key elements of the testing protocols for football student-athletes include the following:

- Daily point-of-care testing on each day of full practice, higher-risk of transmission activity, travel, and games;
- Minimum once weekly PCR test (in addition to daily point-of-care testing). For football game weeks, the weekly PCR test will take place within 36 hours of game time for home team student-athletes and within 36 hours of travel departure for visiting team student-athletes:
- Any positive daily point-of-care antigen test must be followed by a PCR test within 24 hours;
- A third-party testing administrator will administer game day point-of-care antigen tests (and PCR tests as applicable) for each team and on-field officials;
- Game day air ambulance service will be available in case any individual tests positive while traveling for competition; and
- All testing protocols continue to be subject to state, local, and campus public health requirements.

# **GAME CANCELLATION POLICY**

The Pac-12 has established minimum thresholds to play a football game of at least 53 scholarship players available to participate and the following minimum number of position scholarship players available to begin a game: seven (7) offensive linemen, one (1) quarterback and four (4) defensive linemen. Each institution shall provide a complete roster by position to the Conference office prior to the season. The impacted institution has the option to play the game with fewer than the 53 scholarship players or fewer than the minimum number of position players listed above if it elects to do so. Otherwise, upon approval by the Commissioner, the game would be rescheduled or declared a no contest.

In addition, a game should be rescheduled or declared no contest in the event of the following COVID-19 related impacts:

- 1. Inability to isolate new positive cases within a team or athletic department or to quarantine high-risk contacts.
- Unavailability or inability to perform testing as provided by the Pac-12 medical guidelines.
- Campus-wide or local community transmission rates that are considered unsafe by local public health officials.
- Inability to perform adequate contact tracing consistent with governmental requirements.
- Local public health officials of the home team state that there is an inability for the hospital infrastructure to
- accommodate a surge.

## **TIEBREAKER INFORMATION**

The Pac-12 has also announced updated tiebreaker information for the 2020 season, with all updating information available at Pac-12.com (click to read).

#### Tiebreak Procedures To Determine Division Champions (Unbalanced Conference Schedule)

In order for teams to be considered in a divisional tiebreak scenario, teams must play no less than one fewer conference game than the average number of conference games played by all conference teams (rounded up/down at .50). For example, if the average number of conference games played in the 2020 season is 5.25 (value of 5 when rounded down), a team would be eligible to win their Division if that team played 4 conference games.

The winner of each Division will be determined by the best winning percentage (both divisional and cross-divisional) within the conference. In the event of an unbalanced schedule where there is a tie for the best record in the loss column, head-to-head results will take precedence over winning percentage.

In determining the divisional champions, the following will apply: If any team(s) has not played six (6) Conference games (due to not being able to reschedule a postponed Conference game) and any team(s) is within one Conference win from the team(s) with the highest conference winning percentage AND has an equal number of losses, those teams shall be declared tied.

The following procedures will be applied to determine the Pac-12 Championship Game representatives:

#### Two-Team Tie

- Head-to-head results
- Record in games played within the division
- Record against the next highest placed team in the division (based on record in all games played within the Conference), proceeding through the division
- Record in common Conference games
- Team with the highest College Football Playoff (CFP) ranking
- Cumulative winning percentage of each tied team's Conference opponents
- Highest ranking by SportSource Analytics (Team Rating Score metric) following the last weekend of regularseason games
- 8. Coin toss

### Multiple-Team Ties

The following procedures will only be used to eliminate all but two teams, at which point the two- team tiebreaking procedure will be applied:

- Head-to-head (best record in games among the tied teams)
- 2. 3. Record in games played within the division
- Record against the next highest placed team in the division (based on record in all games played within the Conference), proceeding through the division
- Record in common Conference games
  Team with the highest College Football Playoff (CFP) ranking 5
- Cumulative winning percentage of each tied team's Conference opponents
- Highest ranking by SportSource Analytics following the last weekend of regular-season games

### **Determination of Championship Game Host**

The home team in the Pac-12 Championship Game will be determined by the record in all Conference games. In the event of a tie, the following procedures will be applied to determine the home team:

- Head-to-head competition, if applicable
- Record against the next highest-placed common opponent in the Conference (based on recording all games played within the Conference) proceeding through the Conference
- Record in common Conference games
- Team with the highest College Football Playoff (CFP) ranking 4.
- 5. Highest ranking by SportSource Analytics following the last weekend of regular-season games
- Coin toss
