DURHAM, N.C.— The Southeastern Conference has been college baseball's best in recent years, and the talent coming through continued to shine in 2015. The SEC boasts the College Player of the Year in Arkansas outfielder Andrew Benintendi and leads all leagues with 11 representatives on our three All-America teams.

The SEC was fairly top heavy in terms of the quality of its teams, and that was reflected in the All-America teams, with eight of its 11 players coming from powerhouses Florida, Louisiana State and Vanderbilt. Vanderbilt and LSU each put multiple players on the All-America first team, and LSU finished with four All-Americans in total.

The Atlantic Coast and Pacific-12 conferences finished with the second-most All-Americans, each producing eight, and the improving Big Ten placed four players on the list, including three from national seed Illinois. North Florida out of the Atlantic Sun Conference also produced two All-Americans in Donnie Dewees and Corbin Olmstead.

Four players from our Preseason All-America first team also made the postseason first team: Alex Bregman, Carson Fulmer, D.J. Stewart and Dansby Swanson. David Thompson moves up from the second team in the preseason to the first team in the postseason, and first-teamer Scott Kingery was on the second team in the preseason.
