PAC-12 NOTES

PREVIEWING THE WEEK: A thrilling week of Pac-12 baseball is ahead filled with top-25 matchups, competitive tournaments and the start of Pac-12 Networks extensive coverage of the 2019 season, which includes over 95 broadcast games. The week kicks off with No. 5 Stanford hosting No. 11 Texas for a three-game series starting on Thursday, March 7. No. 2 Oregon State and Washington compete in Seattle this week at the Seattle Baseball Showcase, as they take on Minnesota, Indiana and No. 16 Coastal Carolina. A top-20 showdown between Coastal Carolina and the Beavers will be broadcast on Pac-12 Network, as well as the matchup between Minnesota and Washington.

USC and UCLA play in the annual Dodger Stadium College Baseball Classic. The Bruins and the Trojans both host a game against No. 19 Michigan and Oklahoma State on Friday and Saturday, before the crosstown rivals head to Dodger Stadium on Sunday for a matchup broadcast on Pac-12 Networks.

WEEKLY RECAP: Three weeks into the season, the Pac-12 boasts an 82-38 (.683) non-conference record. Arizona State is one of just four teams still undefeated in the nation at 12-0. After sweeping Michigan State in a three-game home series last week, ASU's 12-0 start is the longest winning streak for the Sun Devils (and longest streak to start the season) since ASU went 24-0 to start the 2010 campaign.

Oregon is yet to lose a game at PK park this season, defeating LMU in three-straight games last week. Junior shortstop **Spencer Steer** had a productive series, batting .455 with two home runs, four RBI and four runs scored. Utah has picked up the pace in the last week, winning three of its last four and scoring at least 12 runs in each of those wins. Junior catcher **Zack Moeller** was instrumental to those wins, racking up 13 RBI in four games.

IN THE RANKINGS: Four Pac-12 teams are ranked in the latest USA Today Coaches Poll, including three in the top five, the most of any conference in the top five. Oregon State moved up in the rankings to No. 2, UCLA is No. 4 and Stanford is No. 5. Entering the rankings is undefeated Arizona State at No. 23. Also receiving votes is Oregon and Washington. The Bruins, Beavers and Cardinal rank in the top-11 in all five national rankings.

BY THE NUMBERS: The Sun Devil's offense has put up big numbers during its start, ranking second nationally in runs (141), hits (157) and batting average (.357). In Tucson, the Wildcats have also had hot bats. Arizona ranks fifth in the country with 149 hits, the fourth-best on base percentage (.452) and the second-most runs (141). The Wildcats have racked up the extra base hits as well, ranking fifth nationally with 31 doubles and seventh nationally with six triples.

Pac-12 pitchers have dominated on the mound as four teams rank in the top 20 in ERA. UCLA has the second-best ERA in the nation at 1.08 and has held its opponents to seven hits or fewer in every game this season, the only program in the country that can boast that fact. Oregon State's pitching staff has an ERA of 2.18 that's good for ninth-best, Arizona State is 10th-best at 2.21 and Stanford comes in at 16th with a 2.46 ERA.

Pac-12 student-athletes have knocked it out of the park this year, as six student-athletes rank in the top 26 for home runs this year. Cal's **Andrew Vaughn** has already smashed seven homers, third-best in the nation. ASU's **Hunter Bishop** and OSU's **Adley Rutschman** are tied for 10th with five homers each while Arizona State's **Trevor Hauver**, UW's **Joe Wainhouse** and Stanford's **Brandon Wulff** are all tied for 26th with four a piece.

STAR POWER: A year after winning the Golden Spikes Award, Cal's **Andrew Vaughn** has started his junior season hitting .529 (18-for-34) with seven homers, 18 RBI and 15 walks through 10 games, contributing to a 1.176 slugging percentage. He leads the league in batting average, homers, walks, slugging percentage and on base percentage (.680).

Oregon State's reliever and NCBWA Stopper of the Year preseason watch list selection **Brandon Eisert** leads the nation with four victories and is one just 19 pitchers in the country that have pitched more than 10 innings this year and still hold a 0.00 ERA. On top of that, he's given up only five hits and has struck out eight.

Washington is on a seven-game win streak, its longest since 2014, largely behind the play of Pac-12 Player of the Week **Braiden Ward** and Pitcher of the Week **Josh Burgmann**. Ward is batting .361 with a Pac-12 leading 11 stolen bases and 14 runs scored, while Burgmann currently leads the Pac-12 in strikeouts with 26 and is 2-0 with a 0.90 ERA.

PRESEASON NODS: The Pac-12 has 20 total preseason All-America selections from seven different schools. Six student-athletes were named to all five preseason All-America lists and 2018 Golden Spikes Award winner Cal's **Andrew Vaughn**, 2018 CWS Most Outstanding Player OSU's **Adley Rutschman** and All-Pac-12 selection UCLA's **Chase Strumpf** were named to the first team by five national outlets. Rutschman was also tabbed the Projected Player of the Year by *Collegiate Baseball*. *Baseball America* highlighted several league student-athletes as All-American Best Tools with Vaughn earning best hitter, Arizona State's **Spencer Torkelson** selected as the best power hitter and Rutschman tabbed as the best defensive catcher.

GOLDEN SPIKES: The Pac-12 is home to eight Golden Spikes Award winners after **Andrew Vaughn** claimed the award last season, tying the ACC and SEC for most of any conference. This year, ten student-athletes from seven different league schools were named to the preseason Watch List, including Vaughn. He is just one of four Golden Spikes Award recipients all-time to return to school after winning the award. Oregon State, UCLA and Stanford each boast a pair of student-athletes on the prestigious list. The preseason watch list features 55 of the nation's top amateur players. The 42nd Golden Spikes Award will be presented on June 14, 2019.

PAC-12 BASEBALL COACHES VOTE UCLA AS 2019 FAVORITE

SAN FRANCISCO - In a polling of the Pac-12 baseball coaches, UCLA has been selected as the preseason favorite to win the Conference title for the 2019 season. This is the third time in program history and the first since 2015 that the Bruins were chosen to win the Pac-12, which was also the last time UCLA clinched the Conference crown.

Led by head coach **John Savage**, UCLA advanced to the 2018 Minnesota Regional in the NCAA Tournament, notching 38 or more wins for the fifth time in the last eight seasons. The Bruins return a strong nucleus of position players including 2018 All-Pac-12 selections in second baseman **Chase Strumpf**, first baseman **Michael Togli** and outfielder **Jeremy Ydens**. After finishing fourth in the Conference last year, the Bruins have now been ranked inside the top ten in every major national preseason poll released this offseason.

2018 Pac-12 Champion STANFORD was selected to finish second for the third-consecutive year. In head coach **David Esquer**'s first season at the helm, the Cardinal clinched its first league title since 2004, posted its second-highest winning percentage in program history (.793) and reached the NCAA Regional for the second-consecutive season. A consensus first team All-American, sophomore reliever **Jack Little** returns to the mound after tying a program record with 16 saves.

Under the direction of first year head coach and longtime associate head coach **Pat Bailey**, NCAA Champion OREGON STATE was tabbed to finish third. In 11 years with OSU, Bailey helped the program to the 2018 national championship, three trips to Omaha and nine overall postseason appearances. Bailey replaces retired legendary head coach Pat Casey, who led the Beavers to all three of its NCAA titles. The 2018 CWS Most Outstanding Player **Adley Rutschman** is back behind the plate after setting a school record 102 hits and 83 runs batted in last season.

ARIZONA finished fourth with 67 points and WASHINGTON, a year after reaching the NCAA College World Series for the first time in program history, totaled 56 points to round out the top five.

ARIZONA STATE takes the sixth spot with 59 points and OREGON tallied 49 points for seventh. CALIFORNIA received 37 points for eighth and USC was tabbed to finish ninth with 32 points. WASHINGTON STATE is 10th with 15 points and UTAH totaled 14 points for 11th.

The 2019 Pac-12 baseball campaign begins Friday, Feb. 15 with all 11 teams competing, featuring Oregon State in the Sanderson Ford College Baseball Classic and California and Stanford competing in the Angels College Classic. Pac-12 Networks will broadcast over 95 baseball games this season, including 18 rivalry matchups as well as a two-game set featuring Oklahoma State at Oregon State May 4-5.
