



# POST-GAME NOTES

## 2018 Pac-12 Men's Basketball Tournament Wednesday, March 7 // Las Vegas // T-Mobile Arena Final Score: #6 Oregon 64, #11 Washington 62 (OT)

- With today's win, Oregon will face No. 3 seed Utah tomorrow in the quarterfinals at 8:30 p.m. PT in a rematch of the 2016 Pac-12 Championship.
- Oregon is now 27-15 all-time at the Pac-12 Tournament and is 3-3 against Washington State. UO is also 1-1 all-time as the No. 6 seed. This is just the second time in the last seven years that Oregon has been seeded worse than third. The Ducks have won at least one game in 12 of their last 15 appearances at the Pac-12 Tournament.
- The last time there were back-to-back overtime games was back on March 11, 2016 in the tourney semifinals. Oregon was a part of one of them against Arizona when it won 95-89, advancing to the championship and eventually winning the title over Utah.
- Prior to tonight's game, there had been 12 overtime games in the Pac-12 Tournament. The average combined score of those 12 games was 162.6 points. Tonight was a much different story as the two teams combined for just 126 points.
- Tonight wasn't the first time Oregon and Washington State went to overtime at the Pac-12 Tournament. Back in 2010, the Ducks defeated the Cougars in the first game of the tournament by a score of 82-80.
- Oregon is now 4-0 in overtime games at the Pac-12 Tournament while Washington State is 0-2.
- The Ducks have played in overtime in three of the last four games, winning two of them. They also beat DePaul in overtime back on Nov. 24. Overall, their record is 3-1 in overtime this season.
- Oregon scored 17 points in the first half, which is the fewest they have scored in one half all season. The previous season low was 25 against Oregon State on Jan. 27. Their first-half season-low was 28 back on Feb. 8. Their first points came at the 15:16 mark with a Payton Pritchard mid-range jumper.
- The Ducks are now 14-1 when holding teams to below 70 points. This was also the second time all season Oregon has won a game while shooting under 40 percent.
- Oregon shot 16-50 (32%) in the first 37 minutes of the game, but shot 8-12 (67%) in the final eight minutes of the game. UO also made its final four shots of the game.
- The Ducks took their first lead with 59 seconds left in the second half on a layup by MiKyle McIntosh. Oregon led for just 1:11 tonight.
- Oregon shot 16-for-40 from inside the arc tonight and 8-for-22 from three.
- Oregon's Payton Pritchard was the driving force of the offense for the most part tonight as he scored 18 points to go along with four 3-pointers. He has now led the Ducks in scoring 12 times this season.
- McIntosh has reached double-figures in points in 11 of the last 16 games after pouring in 18 points as well. In his previous two games, he scored a combined 15 points.
- Elijah Brown hit double-figures for the 21st time this season and 91st for his career as he scored 10 points for the Ducks tonight.
- Kenny Wooten blocked two shots tonight, including the one that clinched the game at the end of overtime, to give him 88 for the season, which is two short of tying Jordan Bell for the third-most in school history.
- Washington State is now 1-1 in overtime games this year. They beat Texas Southern in the first game of the season 86-84.
- With seven made three-pointers by Washington State, it has made 341 this season, just 13 short of the Pac-12 record of 354 set by UCLA last season. No. 2 on the list is Ernie Kent's Oregon Ducks when they made 350 in the 2001-02 season.
- The Cougars had gone 8:11 without a field goal in the final nine minutes of the second half, but Malachi Flynn tied the game up at 53-53 with a three-pointer with 32 seconds to go to end the drought.
- In the first 25 minutes of the game, Washington State shot 15-30 and finished the game shooting 5-19 in the final 20 minutes.
- Washington State allowed just 17 points in the first half, which is a season-low for points allowed in one half by the Cougars. The previous season-low was 18 in the second half vs. Bethune-Cookman on Dec. 22 and the previous first-half season-low was 25 vs. California back on Jan. 13.
- Flynn passed Taylor Rochestie for career three-pointers as he knocked down three tonight. That gives him 135 for his career and also gives him 77 for the season, which is tied for the seventh-most in a single season for Washington State. He scored 22 points tonight to give him seven double-figure games in his last seven appearances.
- Robert Franks had scored in double-figures in 10-straight prior to scoring eight in the regular season finale against Oregon State. He got back on track tonight, scoring 16 points.
- Milan Acquaah was two points shy of his career-high, scoring 11 points.
- Neither team scored in the final three minutes of the first half and Washington State didn't score for the final four minutes of the first half.
