PAC-12 PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSE

Laviska Shenault, WR, COLO

In CU's 33-28 win at Nebraska, Shenault caught 10 passes for 177 yards and the game winning touchdown, a 40-yard reception with 1:06 remaining. ... Rushed twice for 5 yards and a touchdown, but picked up key first downs on 4th-&-1 (his TD) and 4th-&-2 ... In two games, he now has 21 receptions (FBS-leading 10.5 per game) for 388 yards, the latter the second-most receiving yards in back-to-back games in CU history.

DEFENSE

Chase Hansen, LB, UTAH

Finished the game with 12 tackles (2.0 sacks, 2.5 TFL), an interception return for a touchdown and a key fourth-quarter fumble recovery that stopped an NIU drive on first and 10. It was his third career game with 10-plus tackles ... With Utah clinging to a 10-6 lead with under 3:00 remaining, Hansen scored the final points of the game on a 40-yard return of an interception for a touchdown ... One of Hansen's two sacks came on NIU's last offensive drive of the game, sending the Huskies back 15 yards on a first-and-10. He secured the victory with a 5-yard tackle for loss on fourth down for the Huskies.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Brandon Ruiz, PK, ASU

Connected on all three of his field goal attempts (49, 24, 28), including the game-winning kick from 28 yards as time expired in ASU's 16-13 upset of then-No. 15 Michigan State ... Scored ASU's first points of the game with a 49-yard field goal to cut MSU's lead to 6-3 in the third quarter. Hit his second field goal (24 yards) early in the fourth quarter to get ASU within a touchdown, 13-6, of the Spartans.

PAC-12 FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

THE RANKINGS: Five Pac-12 teams are ranked in both the AP and Coaches polls. STANFORD (9/9), WASHINGTON (10/12), OREGON (20/23), USC (22/21) and ARIZONA STATE (23/25) ... The Sun Devils appear in the Top 25 for the first time since the 2015 preseason poll (No. 15) ... WASHINGTON has now appeared in the AP Top 25 for 35 consecutive ranking periods ... UTAH is the top team among others receiving votes in the AP poll, and is 27th in the Coaches poll.

REMAINING PERFECT: There are 53 FBS teams that are a perfect 2-0. Seven of those teams are from the Pac-12. Only the 14-team SEC and Big Ten have more teams with nine and eight, respectively, sitting at 2-0.

IT'S EARLY, BUT...: Just two weeks into the season and the Pac-12 finds several players and teams among the FBS leaders in various statistical categories:

Completions per game: **Gardner Minshew II**, Washington State (36.0)
Receptions per game: **Laviska Shenault**, Colorado (10.5)
Receiving yards per game: **Laviska Shenault**, Colorado (194.0)
Interceptions per game: **Jaylinn Hawkins**, California (1.5)
Rushing defense: Arizona State (32.5 yards allowed/game)
Passing defense: Utah (68.0 yards allowed/game)
Total defense: Utah (143.5 yards allowed/game)
Punt returns: Oregon State (46.0 per return)

PUT YOUR HANDS IN THE AIR: Pac-12 wide receivers are grabbing the headlines early into the 2018 season. Six receivers are averaging better than 100 receiving yards per game, while 12 different players have hauled in 10 or more receptions this season ... Receivers have garnered the season's first two Pac-12 Offensive Player of Week honors, while just two receivers claimed those same honors over the previous three seasons combined. In fact, Pac-12 receivers collected back-to-back Conference honors just three times since 1983 (2011 - Robert Woods, USC and Paul Richardson, COLO; 2007 - Mark Bradford, STAN and Yvenson Bernard, OSU; 2001 - Reggie Williams, WASH and Bobby Wade, ARIZ).

GOING THE EXTRA YARD: The CFP Extra Yard for Teachers (#CFPEXtraYard) campaign kicks off as teachers will be recognized during games over the next two weekends. The mission of Extra Yard for Teachers is to elevate the teaching profession by inspiring and empowering teachers.

NFL OPENING DAY ROSTERS: The Pac-12 had 211 former players listed on NFL Opening Day active rosters (see page 7 for complete list, which includes players on practice squads). The Pac-12 led all conferences with seven former quarterbacks getting the start on opening day - Arizona - **Nick Foles** (Eagles); California - **Aaron Rodgers** (Packers), **Jared Goff** (Rams); Oregon - **Marcus Mariota** (Titans); Stanford - **Andrew Luck** (Colts); USC - **Sam Darnold** (Jets); Utah - **Alex Smith** (Redskins).

PAC-12 HEADLINERS: Among 177 returning starters are a number of headliners, including a total of 10 first-team and 12 second-team All-Pac-12 performers. Nine of the 12 squads return at least six starters on offense, and seven squads return at least six starters on defense ... Returning are the reigning Offensive Player of the Year in Stanford senior running back **Bryce Love**, as well as the Freshman Co-Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in Arizona running back **J.J. Taylor** and Stanford offensive lineman **Walker Little**, and Arizona linebacker **Colin Schooler**. Four teams have multiple returning First Team all-conference performers - USC linebacker **Cameron Smith**, defensive back **Marvell Tell** and all-purpose/special teams **Michael Pittman Jr.**; Stanford's Love and offensive lineman **Nate Herbig**; Washington offensive lineman **Kaleb McGary** and defensive back **Taylor Rapp**; Utah placekicker **Matt Gay** and punter **Mitch Wishnowsky**. Additional returning first team performers include Arizona State junior wide receiver **N'Keal Henry** and Oregon junior all-purpose/special teams **Brenden Schooler**.

THE COACHING RANKS: Five new coaches enter the league this season. It's the highest number of new coaches to grace the sidelines in one season for the Pac-12. UCLA's **Chip Kelly** returns for his second stint in the Pac-12. Kelly posted a 46-7 record in four seasons at Oregon (2009-12) and led the Ducks to the 2010 BCS title game ... ARIZONA's **Kevin Sumlin** has averaged 8.7 wins over 10 seasons, including back-to-back 10-win seasons at Houston (2011) and Texas A&M (2012) ... ARIZONA STATE's **Herm Edwards** moves from his role as an ESPN analyst back to the sidelines where he last coached in the NFL for eight seasons (2001-08 - five with the Jets, three with the Chiefs) ... OREGON's **Mario Cristobal** moves from co-offensive coordinator to head coach. Cristobal has reached the pinnacle of college football with a pair of national titles as a player for Miami (1989, 1991) and one CFP title as an Alabama assistant coach (2015) ... OREGON STATE's **Jonathan Smith** returns to his alma mater for his head coaching debut. Like his Civil War counterpart, Smith achieved success as a player (MVP of the 2000 Fiesta Bowl/BCS) and as a Washington offensive coordinator (2016 Peach Bowl/CFP semifinal).

TAKE IT ON THE RUN: Among the Power 5 conferences, the Pac-12 returns the most players (5) who rushed for 1,000 or more yards last season.

Bryce Love, Stanford - 2,118 yards (needs 1,009 to set Cardinal career rushing mark)

Khalil Tate, Arizona - 1,411 yards (3 200-yard rushing games last year are more than all other Pac-12 quarterbacks combined have tallied in the history of the league)

Myles Gaskin, Washington - 1,318 yards (has rushed for at least 1,300 in each of his first 3 seasons. No Pac-12 player has rushed for 1,000 yards in each of his four seasons)

Zack Moss, Utah - 1,173 yards (Utes have had a 1,000-yard rusher in each of the last 4 seasons)

Patrick Laird, California - 1,127 yards (last Bear with back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons was Marshawn Lynch in 2005-06)

AROUND THE PAC-12

UC Davis (2-0) at STANFORD (2-0)
Sat., Sept. 15 • 11:00 am CT • P12N • #UCDvsSTAN

STANFORD: The Cardinal opened Pac-12 play with a 17-3 conference victory over USC. It was the fewest points allowed by Stanford against USC in 77 years ... Held USC to 114 rushing yards behind LBs **Bobby Okereke** and **Sean Barton**, who each had a team-high sharing 10 tackles ... FS **Malik Antoine** thwarted USC's air attack by pilfering two fourth-quarter passes ... RB **Bryce Love** ran for 136 yards on 22 carries and tallied his first TD of the season on a 6-yard run. It marked the 16th time in his career he has surpassed 100 yards rushing and the 15th time in his last 17 games. He broke off scampers of 59 and 28 yards ... Love has tallied a run of 50 or more yards in 14 of his last 17 outings.

San Jose State (0-2) at OREGON (2-0)
Sat., Sept. 15 • 2:00 noon PT • P12N • #SJSUvsUO

OREGON: 12 Ducks have at least one touchdown, the most in the country through two weeks of this college football season. Ohio State and Boston College are second with 11 ... QB **Justin Herbert** finished 20-of-26 for 250 yards with 4 TDs in the win over Portland State. Through two games he has nine touchdown passes, to six different receivers ... Marked the 10th time in Herbert's 17 career starts that Oregon has scored 40-plus points ... Averaging 43.4 PPG in Herbert's 17 career starts ... Had multiple 100 yard rushers (**Tony Brooks-James** - 107, **CJ Verdell** - 106) for the first time this season, third time in the last five games and 28th time in program history.

New Hampshire (0-2) at COLORADO (2-0)
Sat., Sept. 15 • 3:00 am MT • P12M • #UNHvsCOLO

COLORADO: QB **Steven Montez** was 33-of-50 for 351 yards and 3 TDs in the 33-28 win at Nebraska. First win for the Buffs in Lincoln since 2004. Montez had 344 yards of total offense and now has 5,261 for his career (eighth in CU history. Of those yards, 4,681 are passing, as he remains ninth on that list and looking to join six others who have reached 5,000 ... He now owns an NCAA quarterback rating of 178.6 for the season (689 yards, 55-of-75, 7 TD/1 INT), good for 18th in the FBS ... WR **Laviska Shenault** had 10 receptions for 177 yards and now has 21 receptions for 388 yards. His 10.5 receptions per game leads the FBS ... WR **Jay MacIntyre** had career high eight receptions and his first career 2-TD game.

Idaho State (1-0) at CALIFORNIA (2-0)
Sat., Sept. 15 • 3:00 pm PT • P12BA • #IDSTvsCAL

CALIFORNIA: Redshirt-freshman **Chase Garbers** made his first career start, completing 18 of 28 passes for 176 yards and 2 touchdown passes ... RB **Patrick Laird** set a career high with 7 catches for 53 yards, including a 25-yard TD reception ... Over the first two games of the year, Cal's defense has not allowed a touchdown in the first three quarters of either contest ... After registering a career-high 14 tackles vs. North Carolina last week, LB **Evan Weaver** posted his second career double-digit tackle performance, finishing with 12 tackles. He also posted multiple pass break-ups in a game for the first time in his career, collecting 3 vs. BYU.

OREGON STATE (1-1) at Nevada (1-1)
Sat., Sept. 15 • 4:00 pm PT • ESPN3 • #OSUvsNEV

OREGON STATE: The Beavers finished with 649 total yards in the 48-25 win over Southern Utah, the seventh-highest total in program history and the best output since going for 683 yards vs. Nicholls State in 2012 ... Oregon State's 41 first-half points was more than the Beavers scored in any game last season, and the most by an Oregon State team in the first half since the Beavers put up 42 vs. Eastern Washington on Aug. 31, 2006 ... Freshman **Jermar Jefferson** rushed for 238 yards in the win - the third best rushing game in Oregon State history and the top mark ever by a Pac-12 freshman. Jefferson also matched the Oregon State single-game record for rushing touchdowns with four, joining Pete Pifer, Bill Enyart, Ken Simonton (twice), Steven Jackson and Jacquizz Rodgers as Beavers with four rushing touchdowns.

Eastern Washington (2-0) at WASHINGTON STATE (2-0)
Sat., Sept. 15 • 5:00 pm PT • P12N • #EWUvsWSU

WASHINGTON STATE: Recorded its first shutout of the season, recorded two last season (Colorado, Montana State), is the fourth shutout under Mike Leach ... Held San Jose State to 109 yards of total offense, the fourth-fewest yards allowed in program history, the fewest allowed since holding Oregon to 97 yards in 1994, a 21-7 Cougar win in Pullman. WSU held SJSU to nine rushing yards, the fewest rushing yards allowed since limiting Baylor to -10 yards in 2006 ... QB **Gardner Minshew II** completed 34 of 51 passes for 414 yards and 3 TDs - two of those TD tosses went to WR **Tay Martin**, who had six catches for 68 yards.

USC (1-1) at Texas (1-1)
Sat., Sept. 15 • 7:00 pm CT • FOX • #USCvsTEX

USC: Trojans visit Austin for the first time since 1966 ... In the 17-3 loss at Stanford, USC scored its fewest points since a 27-0 shutout to the hands of Washington on Nov. 1, 1997. The Trojans own the Pac-12's longest active streak with a school record 249 games without being shutout (not including 15 games later vacated due to NCAA penalty; revised record streak: 264 games) ... PK **Chase McGrath** has six field goals in the first two games (a pace that would break USC's season record of 19) ... Senior ILB **Cameron Smith**, who has led USC in tackles each of the last two seasons, has 16 this season and needs four more to reach 300 tackles for his career.

WASHINGTON (1-1) at UTAH (2-0)
Sat., Sept. 15 • 8:00 pm MT • ESPN • #UWvsUTAH

WASHINGTON: QB **Jake Browning** threw his 80th and 81st career TDs in the 45-3 win over North Dakota. He is the 12th Pac-12 player to throw 80 or more TD passes in their career. Went for over 300 yards passing (313) for the eighth time in his career. He broke into the Pac-12's all-time top-20 list and now has 9,713 career passing yards, which places him 19th all-time ... Browning has 9,833 yards total offense and is 171 away from passing by Cody Pickett (10,103) as the school's all-time leader ... RB **Myles Gaskin** rushed for 53 yards and now has 4,183 for his career, ninth all-time in Pac-12 history ... WR **Quinten Pounds** was one of 11 different Huskies to catch a pass vs. North Dakota. He had three receptions for a team-high 98 yards and was one of four different Huskies to surpass 70 or more receiving yards.

UTAH: The Utes lead the FBS in passing yards allowed (62.0 ypg) and total defense (143.5 ypg) ... WR **Britain Covey** tied his career high with 129 yards on eight catches in the 17-6 win over Northern Illinois. He has two career 100-yard receiving games (129 vs. USC in 2015) ... RB **Zack Moss** scored his team-leading third touchdown of the season in the third quarter. He has two rushing and one receiving touchdown this season. Moss led Utah with 66 yards rushing on 16 carries ... QB **Tyler Huntley** threw for 286 yards (20-of-31, 0 INT, 0 TD) for his ninth career 200-yard passing game ... LB **Chase Hansen** scored a touchdown on a 40-yard interception return. He has two career interception return touchdowns (Arizona State, 2016). Hansen had 12 tackles and led Utah with 2.5 tackles for loss (2.0 sacks).

ARIZONA STATE (2-0) at San Diego State (1-1)
Sat., Sept. 15 • 7:30 pm PT • CBSN • #ASUvsSDSU

ARIZONA STATE: The Sun Devils have won their last four games against nationally ranked non-conference opponents in the regular season (No. 15 Michigan State in 2018, No. 8 Notre Dame in 2014, No. 20 Wisconsin in 2013, No. 21 Missouri in 2011) ... After allowing 44 rushing yards in the first quarter, the Sun Devils held the Spartans to just 19 yards rushing the rest of the game ... The Sun Devils lead the FBS in rushing defense (32.5 ypg) ... QB **Manny Wilkins** threw for a career-high 380 yards, surpassing his previous career-best of 372 yards (vs. Arizona in 2016) ... Junior **Kyle Williams** put together his third career 100-yard performance (7 catches, 104 yards) as eight different Sun Devil receivers caught at least two passes ... Freshman LB **Merlin Robertson** was recognized as the Walter Camp National Player of the Week after recording nine tackles, 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble

Fresno State (1-1) at UCLA (0-2)
Sat., Sept. 15 • 7:30 pm PT • FS1 • #FRESvsUCLA

UCLA: The Bruins are off to a 0-2 for the first time since the 2010 season ... **Dorian Thompson-Robinson** is the first Bruin true freshman quarterback to start a game since Josh Rosen in 2015. He is the eighth Bruin true freshman quarterback to start a game and the fourth to start their first career game at a road venue. Thompson completed 16 of 26 passes for 254 yards and 1 TD ... Junior WR **Theo Howard** has now caught at least one pass in each of the last 18 games, pulling down 70 receptions for 737 yards during that span. Over the five games, he's collected 30 receptions for 338 yards.

Southern Utah (0-2) at ARIZONA (0-2)
Sat., Sept. 15 • 8:00 pm PT • P12N • #SUUvsAZ

ARIZONA: The Cats start 0-2 for the first time since 1981 ... Junior QB **Khalil Tate** established a new career high in passing yards (341), pass attempts (45) and completions (24) at Houston ... Arizona totaled 381 passing yards. That's the team's highest total since passing for 395 yards in a 28-26 loss to USC in 2014 ... Senior WR **Shawn Poindexter** finished with career highs of 7 catches and 134 yards (first career 100-yard game). Poindexter's 134 yards were the most by an Arizona receiver since Cayleb Jones had 182 yards on four catches in the 2015 New Mexico Bowl ... Sophomore LB **Tony Fields** had 10 total tackles to lead Arizona. It marked the ninth time in 15 career games he's totaled double-digit tackles.

POLL NOTES: WASHINGTON's preseason AP No. 6 ranking was its highest preseason ranking in the AP poll since 1997 when the Huskies opened the year at No. 4.
