QUICK HITS

- ESPN's GameDay visits the Pac-12 this Saturday when the iconic college football show lands in Eugene, Ore. The last time GameDay appeared in Eugene was Sept. 6, 2014 prior to the #3 Ducks' 46-27 win over #7 Michigan State.
- #7 STANFORD at #20 OREGON is one of two FBS games this week that pits AP ranked foes against each other. The other is No. 22 Texas A&M at No. 1 Alabama.
- This is the fifth Stanford-Oregon meeting since 2009 where both teams enter the game ranked in the AP Top 25. Only once since 2009 did the matchup between Stanford and Oregon not feature at least one team ranked in the Top 25 (team in bold captured the Conference title that same season).

PAC-12 PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OFFENSE

Gardner Minshew II, QB, WSU

In WSU's 59-24 win over Eastern Washington, Minshew completed 45-of-57 passes (78.9%) for 470 yards, 2 TDs and no interceptions. The 470 passing yards is fifth-best among FBS quarterbacks this season. Minshew led WSU on seven scoring drives, including three of 80-plus yards (83, 98 and 99 yards). Minshew scattered passes to nine different receivers. Minshew leads the nation in passing average (401.0 ypg), completions per game (39.0).

DEFENSE

Ben Burr-Kirven, LB, WASH

Led the Huskies defense that held Utah to just seven points and 261 yards of total offense in a 21-7 win in Salt Lake City. For the third game out of three this season, he led all tacklers with 11 total. Three times in the fourth quarter, Burr-Kirven and the Huskies held the Utes out of the endzone despite Utah moving deep into UW territory. Early in the fourth, Utah started a drive at the UW 11, but turned the ball over on downs. Later in the fourth, Utah started at the Husky 28 and the UW 42, but came away scoreless on both occasions.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Travell Harris, WR/KR, WSU

Totaled three kickoff returns for 125 yards and a touchdown in WSU's 59-24 win over Eastern Washington. Harris accounted for the Cougars' third touchdown when he returned a kick 100 yards. It marked the first kickoff return for a touchdown for WSU since 2016. Harris leads the Pac-12, and seventh in the FBS, in kick return average at 37.0 ypg.

PAC-12 FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

THE RANKINGS: Three Pac-12 teams are ranked in both the AP and Coaches polls. STANFORD (7/7), WASHINGTON (10/12), and OREGON (20/19) ... WASHINGTON has now appeared in the AP Top 25 for 36 consecutive ranking periods ... Five other Pac-12 teams are receiving votes in both polls (COLORADO, CALIFORNIA, ARIZONA STATE, UTAH, WASHINGTON STATE).

REMAINING PERFECT: There are 34 FBS teams that remain undefeated, with 28 teams posting a 3-0 mark. Of those 28, five are from the Pac-12. Only the 14-team SEC has more teams with six sitting at 3-0.

RUN, FORREST, RUN! Three FBS players returned kickoffs for a touchdown Saturday, and all three are from the Pac-12: ARIZONA's **J.J. Taylor** (84-yard return vs. Southern Utah), CALIFORNIA's **Ashlyn Davis** (89-yard return vs. Idaho State), WASHINGTON STATE's **Travell Harris** (100-yard return vs. Eastern Washington). Harris' return of 100 yards is the first of that distance for the Cougars since Robert Taylor did the same against Arizona State in 2016.

GOING THE EXTRA YARD: The CFP Extra Yard for Teachers (#CFPEXtraYard) campaign continues as teachers will be recognized during games over the weekend. The mission of Extra Yard for Teachers is to elevate the teaching profession by inspiring and empowering teachers.

NFL OPENING DAY ROSTERS: The Pac-12 had 211 former players listed on NFL Opening Day active rosters (see page 7 for complete list, which includes players on practice squads). The Pac-12 led all conferences with seven former quarterbacks getting the start on opening day - Arizona - **Nick Foles** (Eagles); California - **Aaron Rodgers** (Packers); **Jared Goff** (Rams); Oregon - **Marcus Mariota** (Titans); Stanford - **Andrew Luck** (Colts); USC - **Sam Darnold** (Jets); Utah - **Alex Smith** (Redskins).

PAC-12 HEADLINERS: Among 177 returning starters are a number of headliners, including a total of 10 first-team and 12 second-team All-Pac-12 performers. Nine of the 12 squads return at least six starters on offense, and seven squads return at least six starters on defense ... Returning are the reigning Offensive Player of the Year in Stanford senior running back **Bryce Love**, as well as the Freshman Co-Offensive and Defensive Players of the Year in Arizona running back **J.J. Taylor** and Stanford offensive lineman **Walker Little**, and Arizona linebacker **Colin Schooler**. Four teams have multiple returning First Team all-conference performers - USC linebacker **Cameron Smith**, defensive back **Marvell Tell** and all-purpose/special teams **Michael Pittman Jr.**; Stanford's Love and offensive lineman **Nate Herbig**; Washington offensive lineman **Kaleb McGary** and defensive back **Taylor Rapp**; Utah placekicker **Matt Gay** and punter **Mitch Wishnowsky**. Additional returning first team performers include Arizona State junior wide receiver **N'Keal Henry** and Oregon junior all-purpose/special teams **Brenden Schooler**.

THE COACHING RANKS: Five new coaches enter the league this season. It's the highest number of new coaches to grace the sidelines in one season for the Pac-12. UCLA's **Chip Kelly** returns for his second stint in the Pac-12. Kelly posted a 46-7 record in four seasons at Oregon (2009-12) and led the Ducks to the 2010 BCS title game ... ARIZONA's **Kevin Sumlin** has averaged 8.7 wins over 10 seasons, including back-to-back 10-win seasons at Houston (2011) and Texas A&M (2012) ... ARIZONA STATE's **Herm Edwards** moves from his role as an ESPN analyst back to the sidelines where he last coached in the NFL for eight seasons (2001-08 - five with the Jets, three with the Chiefs) ... OREGON's **Mario Cristobal** moves from co-offensive coordinator to head coach. Cristobal has reached the pinnacle of college football with a pair of national titles as a player for Miami (1989, 1991) and one CFP title as an Alabama assistant coach (2015) ... OREGON STATE's **Jonathan Smith** returns to his alma mater for his head coaching debut. Like his Civil War counterpart, Smith achieved success as a player (MVP of the 2000 Fiesta Bowl/BCS) and as a Washington offensive coordinator (2016 Peach Bowl/CFP semifinal).

TAKE IT ON THE RUN: Among the Power 5 conferences, the Pac-12 returned the most players (5) who rushed for 1,000 or more yards last season.

Bryce Love, Stanford - 2,118 yards (needs 1,009 to set Cardinal career rushing mark)

Khalil Tate, Arizona - 1,411 yards (3 200-yard rushing games last year are more than all other Pac-12 quarterbacks combined have tallied in the history of the league)

Myles Gaskin, Washington - 1,318 yards (has rushed for at least 1,300 in each of his first 3 season. No Pac-12 player has rushed for 1,000 yards in each of his four seasons)

Zack Moss, Utah - 1,173 yards (Utes have had a 1,000-yard rusher in each of the last 4 seasons)

Patrick Laird, California - 1,127 yards (last Bear with back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons was Marshawn Lynch in 2005-06)

AROUND THE PAC-12

WASHINGTON STATE (3-0) at USC (1-2)
Fri., Sept. 21 • 7:30 pm PT • ESPN • #WSUvsUSC

WASHINGTON STATE: Improved to 3-0 for the second straight season ... QB **Gardner Minshew II** threw for a career-high 470 yards as he completed 45 of 57 passes with 2 TDs. Over the last two games, he's completed 79 of 108 for 884 yards and 5 TDs ... Minshew II is the first Cougar quarterback to win his first three starts since Steve Birnbaum won the first three games in 1998 ... RB **James Williams** rushed for three touchdowns, the first Cougar with 3 rushing TD since Carl Winston in 2012 Apple Cup ... WR **Tay Martin** set a career highs with 13 receptions for 149 yards, tied for 5th-most catches in WSU single-game history. Martin has 19 receptions for 217 yards over the last two games ... LB **Peyton Pelluer** played his 44th career game, Gabe Marks (WR) and Daniel Ekuale (DL) hold WSU record with 51 games played.

USC: The Trojans have won their past 17 games in the Coliseum and also own a 12-game home winning streak over Pac-12 teams ... Freshman QB **JT Daniels** has completed 67 of 117 pass attempts for 819 yards. He's connected with his former high school teammate freshman WR **Amon-Ra St. Brown** 18 times for 304 yards ... Senior ILB **Cameron Smith** led USC with nine tackles at Texas and now has 305 tackles for his career ... The Trojans look to get the ground game going after stalling for a total of -5 rushing yards at Texas. It was their lowest rushing output since 1999 when Arizona held the Trojans to -20 yards.

ARIZONA (1-2) at OREGON STATE (1-2)
Sat., Sept. 22 • 1:00 p.m. PT • P12N • #AZvsOSU

ARIZONA: Finished with 626 yards of total offense in Saturday's victory over Southern Utah. It's the most total yardage in a single game since totaling 644 yards against Oregon State on Oct. 10, 2015. ... Junior QB **Khalil Tate** finished with a career high in passing yards with 349. It bested his previous career high of 341 set one week ago at Houston. Tate also threw five TD passes, tying his career high, which was set in the Foster Farms Bowl last year against Purdue ... Tate completed four passes of 50 yards or more in Saturday's victory. It's the first time since at least 1997 that an Arizona quarterback has thrown four passes of 50 or more yards in a single game. Tate completed a 53-yard pass to **Devaughn Cooper**, a 55-yard pass to **Tony Ellison**, a 65-yard touchdown pass to **Shun Brown** and a 75-yard touchdown pass to **Shawn Poindexter**. Since 2007, it's the only time a Pac-12 QB has had 4+ 50+ yard passing plays in a single game. Since 2010, he's just the seventh Power 5 QB to toss 4+ 50+ yard passing plays in a single game.

OREGON STATE: WR **Isaiah Hodgins** tied Oregon State's single-game receiving record with a career-high 14 catches totaling 200 yards with two touchdowns ... WR **Timmy Hernandez** made a career-high 11 receptions for a career-high 116 yards marking the first time OSU had two receivers with 10 catches in the same game since Shane Morales and Sammie Stoughter in a 2008 game at Stanford ... QBs **Connor Blount** and **Jake Luton** combined to complete 35-of-55 for 459 yards and 2 TDs ... Freshman RB **Jermar Jefferson** rushed for 106 yards and 2 TDs. He's seventh in the FBS, and tops all freshmen, averaging 130.3 rushing yards per game, and second in rushing TDs with six.

STANFORD (3-0) at OREGON (3-0)
Sat., Sept. 22 • 5:00 pm MT • ABC • #STANvsUO

STANFORD: With the 31-10 win over UC Davis, the Cardinal has limited three straight opponents to 10 points or fewer for the second time in three seasons ... With RB Bryce Love sidelined for the game, RB **Trevor Speights** saw extensive action with 11 carries for 87 yards ... TE **Kaden Smith** pulled down a career-best six receptions for 68 yards, giving him 10 receptions for 145 yards over the last two games ... Since 2011, Stanford has led all Pac-12 teams with 50 Conference wins, followed by USC with 45, and then Oregon with 44 ... With its No. 7 ranking this week, STANFORD has now appeared in the AP Top 10 59 times since 2010. It appeared in the Top 10 a total of 37 times in the AP ranking period between 1936-2009.

OREGON: Won 23 of last 25 games as a ranked team at Autzen Stadium ... Oregon ranks fifth and ninth nationally, respectively, in rush defense in terms of yards per carry (1.96) and rush yards per game (77.0) ... Oregon leads the Pac-12 and ranks eighth in the FBS in scoring offense at 51.7 points per game ... 12 different players have scored an offensive touchdown, which is tied for the national lead ... Averaging 42.9 PPG in QB Justin Herbert's 18 career starts. ... QB **Justin Herbert** threw for 309 yards (fourth career 300-yard game) and 3 TDs in the win over San Jose State. In the process, he extended his streak of consecutive games with a TD pass to 18 ... Herbert has multiple TD passes in five straight games and 12 times in his career. He has the most passing yards through 20 career games at Oregon with 4,759.

ARIZONA STATE (2-1) at WASHINGTON (2-1)
Sat., Sept. 22 • 7:30 pm PT • ESPN • #ASUvsUW

ARIZONA STATE: WR **N'Keal Harry** finished with nine receptions at San Diego State, moving into fifth place in school history in career receptions (161). With his fourth-quarter TD reception, Harry moved into a tie for 10th place on ASU's all-time list. He now has 17 career TD receptions. Harry has caught a pass in 28 consecutive games ... This is the second time QB **Manny Wilkins** has posted back-to-back 300-yard passing games. Wilkins threw for 381 yards last week vs. Michigan State and had 341 yards at SDSU. Last season Wilkins has consecutive 300-yard outings at Texas Tech (326 yards - 9/16/17) and vs. Oregon (347 yards - 9/23-17). ... For the third consecutive game this season, the Sun Devils did not allow a point in the first quarter - outscoring SDSU 7-0 and now outscoring opponents 21-0 in the frame on the season.

WASHINGTON: RB **Myles Gaskin** led the Huskies to a 21-7 win at Utah Saturday, rushing for 143 yards on 30 carries, with one touchdown. Gaskin tied the UW career record with his 21st career 100-yard game, while also extending his school records for career rushing yards (4,326 yards), rushing TDs (47) and total TDs (51). His 4,326 career rushing yards rank seventh in Pac-12 history. With 78 yards, he'll move up to sixth, passing former UCLA RB Jonathan Franklin (4,403 yards from 2009-12) ... QB **Jake Browning** needs 132 passing yards to become the 17th quarterback in Conference history to reach 10,000 career passing yards. That's one spot behind UW's career record holder Cody Pickett (10,220 passing yards, 1999-2003). Browning needs 68 yards of total offense to pass Pickett as the school's all-time leader.

OPEN DATE

CALIFORNIA (3-0): With the 45-23 win over Idaho State, Cal improved to 3-0 for the second straight year under head coach Justin Wilcox. Wilcox is now 6-0 vs. non-conference opponents, and the Bears have won their last seven straight nonconference games dating back to 2016. It's the second longest active streak in the Pac-12, trailing Utah (22 straight non-conference wins) ... Cal held Idaho State scoreless in the first quarter. The Bears have not allowed any points scored in the first quarter this season. Cal has not allowed a touchdown in the first half this season, and the Bears have only allowed six points on two field goals in the first half this season (at BYU, vs. Idaho State) ... LB **Evan Weaver** earned double-digit tackles for the third straight game. He led the Bears with 13, one shy of his career high. He's second in the Pac-12 and fifth nationally with 39 tackles and an average of 13.0 stops per game.

COLORADO (3-0): 3-0 in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 1994-95 ... The Buffs are 16-3 in non-conference play under coach Mike MacIntyre ... With the 45-14 win over New Hampshire, the Buffs improved to 122-2 all-time when scoring 42 or more points ... QB **Steven Montez** was 9-of-10 in the first quarter vs. New Hampshire for 74 yards and 1 TD. In the first quarter through three games, he is 30-of-33 for 293 yards and 4 TDs (205.5 rating) ... TB **Travon McMillian** rushed 15 times for a career-high 162 yards and 2 TDs. His previous best was 142 yards vs. Duke during his redshirt freshman year at Virginia Tech in 2015 ... With five receptions for 67 yards and 1 TD, WR **Laviska Shenault** now has 26 receptions for 455 yards (FBS leading 151.7 yards per game) and 3 TDs this season.

UTAH (2-1): Utah leads the nation in total defense (204.7 ypg), pass defense (93.0 ypg) and pass efficiency defense (75.62) ... WR **Britain Covey** had his third-straight 100-yard all-purpose game with 133 yards (54 receiving, 77 punt return, 2 rushing) against Washington ... LB **Chase Hansen** led the Utes with 11 tackles vs. Washington, his second double-figure tackle game this season and fourth of his career ... The Utes have sold out 53 straight games in Rice-Eccles Stadium since the 2010 season opener, including 50 standing room-only crowds.

UCLA (0-3): The Bruins are off to a 0-3 for the first time since the 1971 season when they opened the year at 0-4 ... Redshirt senior DB **Adarius Pickett** led the Bruins in tackles for the third game in a row with 13 against Fresno State. He has reached double figures in tackles in all three contests (15 vs. Cincinnati, 12 at Oklahoma). It was the sixth double-figure tackle game of his career. Pickett now leads the Pac-12, and tied for third in the FBS, with 40 tackles (13.3 per game) ... Junior WR **Theo Howard** has now caught at least one pass in each of the last 19 games, pulling down 74 receptions for 817 yards during that span. Over the last six games, he's collected 34 receptions for 418 yards ... Senior P **Stefan Flintoft** leads the Pac-12 and is 12th in the FBS averaging 45.6 yards per punt.

The Huskies have now appeared in the AP Top 25 for 36 consecutive ranking periods ... STANFORD has appeared in the AP preseason Top 25 for the eighth consecutive year. The Cardinal are one of eight teams to have appeared in the preseason AP poll in each of the last eight seasons, joining Alabama, Ohio State, Florida State, USC, Oklahoma, LSU and Georgia ... USC has appeared in each of the last 17 preseason AP polls and 58 preseason polls overall. Only Ohio State (65) and Oklahoma (60) have appeared in more preseason AP Top 25 polls.
