PAC Names All-Conference Basketball Teams;
Unice Voted Coach-of-the-Year, Torchia MVP,
Coleman and Juhola, Co-Rookies-of-the-Year

PITTSBURGH--The Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC) announced its 1985 all-conference basketball teams at a meeting of league coaches today. Washington & Jefferson coach John Unice was unanimously voted the league's "Coach of the Year", while Washington & Jefferson's junior forward Tony Torchia won Most-Valuable-Player honors. Hart Coleman, a freshman center for Carnegie-Mellon, and Andy Juhola, a freshman forward for John Carroll, were named Co-Rookies-of-the-Year.

Unice led the Presidents to an 18-4 overall mark and their first PAC basketball championship since 1971. W&J's 18 victories tied a school record set in 1942-43 for most wins in a season.

Torchia, a 6-4 forward from Carnegie, Pa. (Carlynton High School), led the Presidents in scoring (19.6 ppg), rebounding (8.8 rpg) and field goal percentage (.549). He finished the regular-season ranked fourth in PAC scoring (19.8 ppg), third in rebounding (9.4 rpg) and third in field goal percentage (.541).

Coleman and Juhola earned Rookie-of-the-Year honors with outstanding first-year performances. Both were their team's second-leading scorer and top rebounder. Coleman averaged 10.1 points and 9.0 rebounds per game for Carnegie-Mellon, while Juhola averaged 15.2 points and 7.9 rebounds per contest for John Carroll.
