BETHANY REPEATS AS PAC CHAMPION

Championship Game: Bethany 62, Washington & Jefferson 52

Less than two hours after accepting the league's Most Valuable Player award, Bethany senior Rose Scott led the Bison to their second straight Presidents' Athletic Conference championship and third title in the last four years. Scott fired in a game-high 24 points, including 12 of 13 from the free-throw line, as the Bison topped Washington & Jefferson, 62-52, in Bethany, WV. Scott added eight rebounds, six assists and four steals. Bison senior Jill Kamerer, the PAC scoring champion, posted 20 points and eight boards. Bethany extended a 34-28 halftime lead to an 11-point advantage (40-29) before W&J went on a 14-4 run to trim the deficit to one-point, 44-43, with 12:23 left. Scott wouldn't let the Presidents get any closer, however, scoring 13 of the Bison's final 18 points. W&J freshman Reina Genis sparked W&J's comeback bid and finished with 13 points, nine boards and five blocked shots. Junior Diana Brush paced the Presidents with 14 points.

Semifinal: Bethany 50, Grove City 41

Top-seeded Bethany overcame a three-point deficit late in the second half to defeat fourth-seeded Grove City, 50-41. Rose Scott sparked the rally, scoring six unanswered points as part of an 11-0 Bison run. Scott finished with 12 points in the game (8-8 FT), 10 coming in the last four minutes. Jill Kamerer tallied a team-high 15 points and tied Scott for high-rebound honors with seven boards. Grove City erased a 10-point halftime deficit when Livia Wright (Economy,

PA/Ambridge) drilled three consecutive field goals that put the Lady Wolverines ahead 38-35 with 5:25 left. Wright posted a team-best 12 points and grabbed five rebounds. The Lady Wolverines outshot the Bison, 37% to 32%.

Semifinal: Washington & Jefferson 55, Thiel 53

Washington & Jefferson's Diana Brush nailed a jumper with eight seconds showing to slip the Presidents past third-seeded Thiel, 55-53. Reina Genis recorded a team-high 17 points and 13 rebounds for W&J, who trailed through the first 36 minutes. Brush also closed in double figures with 11 points. Tammy Willrich paced the Lady Cats with 19 points on 7-for-10 shooting, including a 3-for-4 effort from outside the arc. Amanda Brown contributed 13 points and eight caroms.

Thiel led by as many as 11 points (49-38) midway through the second half.
