PAC Storylines

BETHANY: The Bison dropped their second-straight game Saturday, falling at Geneva 20-14 ... In the loss, the defensive unit registered a season-high 17.0 tackles for loss.

CASE: Junior LB **Gavin Sandidge** blocked a field goal last week at W&J ... The Spartans started five freshmen on offense.

CMU: Carnegie Mellon dropped its fourth road contest of the season, falling 38-31 at Saint Vincent ... Carnegie Mellon jumped out to an early 13-0 lead with 11:46 to play in the first quarter after running only three offensive plays ... The Tartans turned in their most total yards of the season as they outgained Saint Vincent 446-380.

GENEVA: Freshman **Malcolm Hill** returned an interception 30 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter of Saturday's 20-14 home win over Bethany ... Hill's interception return for a score was one of five interceptions by the Golden Tornadoes in the win.

GROVE CITY: Wolverines return home to face Bethany after consecutive road games in conference play ... Grove City's final three games will be played within 15 miles of campus -- two home games sandwiching road fray at Westminster in Week 10.

SAINT VINCENT: Coming off a thrilling 38-31 victory over Carnegie Mellon this past Saturday, the Bearcats will look to wrap up the home portion of their schedule 4-0 with a win over Westminster this Saturday.

THIEL: Freshman WR **Marcus Johnson** finished Saturday's contest with Waynesburg with the Tomcats' fifth-highest single-game receiving yards total, catching 10 passes for 210 yards and a pair of scores.

THOMAS MORE: Thomas More defeated Grove City 64-7 Saturday at The Bank of Kentucky Field ... With his touchdown catch late in the first quarter, junior WR **Goose Cohorn** set the Thomas More career touchdown receptions record (19) ... The touchdown pass was junior QB **Jensen Gebhardt's** 50th, tying offensive coordinator **Trevor Stelman's** mark atop the Saints' record book.

W&J: W&J moved up to No. 17 in the D3football.com Top 25 after a 34-24 Homecoming win over Case Western Reserve ... The W&J defense held its opponent under 300 yards of total offense for the third-straight week ... QB **Pete Coughlin** threw for 300-plus yards for the fourth time this season.

WAYNESBURG: Senior RB **Jake Forsythe** posted at least 200 yards for a second-straight game during the Yellow Jackets' 35-32 win over Thiel ... It was the first time since 2007 a Jacket running back has reached the 200-yard mark on the ground in consecutive contests ... Forsythe upped his season rushing total to 1,050 yards and now has 10 touchdowns in 2014.

WESTMINSTER: Was off last week ... The Titans will travel to Saint Vincent on Saturday, Nov. 1 for a 1 p.m. matchup with the Bearcats.

Borgen put together his best performance of the season on Saturday, combining for five touchdowns (three rushing, two passing) to lead the Bearcats to a thrilling 38-31 come-from-behind victory over Carnegie Mellon. Borgen tossed an 86-yard touchdown pass to **Dustin Lowman** late in the third quarter to give the Bearcats their first lead of the contest, then connected with **DJ Oceant-Kelly** on the game-winning 16-yard touchdown in the fourth. He finished the day 15-of-23 passing for 254 yards and two touchdowns and rushed 14 times for 58 yards and three scores.



Along with posting a season-high 17.0 tackles for loss, the defensive unit also forced three turnovers in the game, including fumble recoveries by **Nadim Raddar** and **Anthony Thompson**, as well as an interception by **Dion Williams** ... Junior **Eric Blinn** led the offense with nine catches for 102 yards and two scores ... Sophomore **Tyler Ambush** posted his first 100-yard game, finishing with six receptions for 115 yards ... The Green & White have now notched 89.0 tackles for loss during the 2014 campaign (average of 11.1 per game) ... Four different Bison have registered at least 10 tackles for loss on the season, led by Raddar's 18.0 ... Junior **Donavan Hayden** is second on the team with 14.0, while sophomore **Khallid Pierce** (13.0) and junior **Larry Kpadehyea** (10.0) rank third and fourth on the squad, respectively ... 
