BETHANY: The Bison come out of their bye with an overall record of 6-3.

CASE: Closed out road schedule with loss to Thomas More in first-ever meeting between schools.

CMU: Carnegie Mellon dropped a 28-7 decision at Chicago Saturday ... Freshman **Drew Fitzmorris** shined in the setback at Chicago, finishing with a career-best 16 tackles and recording his first career interception.

GENEVA: A 43-40 come-from-behind victory over Saint Vincent raised season record to 3-6 ... Senior WR **Josh Guiser** returned a fourth quarter kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown, ending a string of 30 unanswered points by the Bearcats ... With the return, Guiser became Geneva's career kickoff return leader with 1,898 yards ... Senior DB **Brady Beech** finished with a career-high three interceptions.

GROVE CITY: Wolverines host Thiel in 31st battle for Mercer County Cup Saturday ... Grove City looks to win Cup for unprecedented eighth-straight season ... Grove City closed road schedule Saturday at Westminster.

SAINT VINCENT: The Bearcats close out the 2014 season Saturday with a trip to Bethany ... Despite winning three games this season, the Bearcats have went winless on the road (0-5).

THIEL: Sophomore QB **Ryan Radke** completed 22-of-41 passes Saturday for 230 yards and three touchdowns ... He also led Thiel on the ground with 88 yards on 14 carries.

THOMAS MORE: Thomas More closed out the regular season with a 66-34 home win over Case Western Reserve ... The Saints are ranked No. 25 in this week's D3football.com Top 25.

W&J: W&J clinched its 24th PAC title and 24th NCAA Division III playoff appearance with a 49-18 win at Thiel ... The Presidents racked up 701 yards of total offense in the win ... Freshman WR **Jesse Zubik** has five touchdowns on eight catches in his last two games.

WAYNESBURG: Has had two weeks to prepare for Saturday's regular season finale against Washington & Jefferson ... Senior QB **Carter Hill** needs 241 yards passing to move past **Brad Dawson** for second place in career passing yards ... He also needs just one touchdown pass to tie the career record of 64 set by **Jeff Dumm**.

WESTMINSTER: Won 41-7 over visiting Grove City Saturday ... Win was Westminster's largest since defeating Thiel 35-0 in 2010 ... Freshman QB **Paul Columbo** tied a career high with four touchdown passes for a career-best 340 yards ... Columbo added another score off of a school-record 96-yard scamper.

Zubik finished with five catches for 190 yards and three touchdowns Saturday, helping lead W&J to a 49-18 win at Thiel. The win locked up W&J's 24th PAC crown and NCAA Division III playoff appearance. He topped 100 yards receiving for the third-straight game and was his fourth 100-plus yard game in W&J's previous five. Over his last two games, Zubik has eight catches that have gone for five touchdowns and 291 yards, including a pair of 80-yard scores.




Brady Beech • Senior defensive back • Geneva College

Beech had three interceptions and five total stops in Saturday's win over visiting Saint Vincent. Just the sixth player in school history to post three interceptions in a game, Beech's first interception came on the Bearcats' first play from scrimmage and set up an early Geneva score. After registering a key special teams tackle early in the fourth, his interception at the Golden Tornadoes' 24-yard line with just 44 seconds remaining thwarted a potential game-winning drive by Saint Vincent.

Guiser returned a fourth quarter kickoff 98 yards for a touchdown, snapping a run of 30-straight points by Saint Vincent and helping the Golden Tornadoes secure a home victory over Saint Vincent. His fourth quarter return for a score moved him into the top spot on the school's career kickoff return yardage leaderboard with 1,898 yards. Guiser currently leads the PAC and ranks 10th among NCAA Division III counterparts with his 29.7 yards per kickoff return.

Freshman quarterback **Aaron Channing** finished seven-of-19 passing for 100 yards and a pair of touchdowns.



Junior quarterback **Jensen Gebhardt** was 11-of-13 passing for 178 yards and two touchdowns in Saturday's regular-season finale ... Senior running back **Domonique Hayden** had 26 carries for 170 yards and four touchdowns, while also pulling in two catches for 27 yards ... Freshman running back **CT Tarrant** had four carries for 100 yard and two scores ... Defensively, the Saints were led by freshman linebacker **Tre' Tunstill**, who finished with 14 tackles, including one tackles for a loss ... Junior DE **Erick Butler** had 10 stops ... Thomas More outgained Case Western Reserve 549 yards (313 rushing/236 passing) to 393 yards (61 rushing/332 passing) in the win ... For the season, Thomas More is outscoring its opponents 45.0 points per game to 20.0 points per game ... The Saints' defense is only giving up 291.7 yards of total offense per game, including 88.5 yards rushing per game ... Hayden has rushed for 1,421 yards and 25 touchdowns on 209 carries ... Gebhardt is 145-of-243 passing for 2,235 yards and 17 touchdowns ... Butler leads the defense with 65 tackles, including seven sacks and one forced fumble.

W&J clinched its 24th PAC title and 24th NCAA Division III playoff appearance with a 49-18 win at Thiel in which the Presidents racked up 701 yards of total offense ... It was the first time W&J topped 700 yards of total offense in a game since October 18, 2008 against Saint Vincent, and its first time over 600 yards three weeks later against Bethany ... W&J posted five of its eight longest plays of the season in the win and had nine plays from scrimmage over 20 yards ... The Presidents' first play from scrimmage was a 73-yard touchdown to freshman **Jesse Zubik** who finished with three touchdowns and a career-high 190 yards on five catches ... In his last two games, Zubik has five touchdowns and 291 yards on eight catches, and he's gone over 100 yards in three-straight and four-of-five ... **Pete Coughlin** threw for 300-plus yards (334) for the fifth time ... **Ryan Ruffing** racked up a career-best 196 yards on the ground, moving him into fifth place in the nation in yards ... Ruffing's 26 total touchdowns (23 rushing) are second most in W&J single-season history and he enters the final week of the regular season 146 yards from becoming the third W&J rusher to reach 1,500 yards in one season ... **Jared Pratt** made nine tackles, including 3.0 for loss, to give the PAC's leading tackler 96 stops on the year, four shy of being the third President in the last 10 years to make 100 stops in a season ... **Ryan Torrance** (11), **Bryce Merrill** (10) and **Alec Schram** (10) all posted double-digit showings in tackles.
