PAC Names All-Conference Baseball Team;
John Carroll Sweeps Top League Honors

PITTSBURGH--The Presidents' Athletic Conference (PAC) announced its all-conference baseball team today (May 15) at a meeting of league coaches. As expected, the Blue Streaks of John Carroll University, who captured their fourth consecutive PAC baseball championship with a 9-0 conference record, took the league's top three honors.

JCU Head Coach Jerry Schweickert was voted PAC "Coach-of-the-Year", senior lefthander Brian Clarke garnered "Most-Outstanding-Pitcher" honors for the second straight season, and senior rightfielder/pitcher Steve Healy was named the PAC's "Most-Valuable-Player."

Clarke, a graduate of St. Joseph's High School in Euclid, Ohio, posted a 7-1 overall mark and a 4-0 PAC slate this year. In his four PAC victories Clarke recorded a league-high 30 strikeouts and allowed only five earned runs in 30 innings for a 1.50 earned-run-average (ERA). He fanned 66 batters in 57-and-a-third innings overall and allowed 15 earned runs for an overall ERA of 2.35.

Healy, a graduate of Boston College High School in Quincy, Mass., batted .348 with 19 runs-batted-in (RBI) overall and eight in the PAC. He led the Streaks with four game-winning RBI. On the pitching mound Healy posted a 6-1 overall mark and a 2-0 record in conference games. In PAC action he struck out 11 in 13-and-a-third innings and allowed six

earned runs for a 4.05 ERA. Overall in 53-and-two-thirds innings he fanned 34, and allowed only 13 earned runs for a 2.18 ERA.

Other than Clarke, those players repeating on the All-PAC team include John Carroll second-baseman Matt O'Connor and designated hitter Jim Catalano, Thiel College outfielder Tony Allegretto and Washington & Jefferson shortstop Mike Savrese.
