1998-99 ALL-PAC TEAMS

Grove City senior Karin Hendrickson has been named the PAC Most Valuable Player after ranking among the league's best in five statistical categories. Hendrickson finished fourth in scoring (13.4 ppg), fourth in shooting (48.3%), fifth in rebounds (7.0 rpg), third in assists (4.0 apg) and second in steals (2.8 spg). She closed her career with 1,081 points, 711 boards, 347 assists and 247 steals. Two other 1,000-point career scorers joined Hendrickson on the PAC First Team: W&J senior Regina Dixon, the conference scoring champion (18.3 ppg), and Bethany junior Rose Scott (13.5 ppg). PAC champion Bethany netted a league-high three all-PAC placements as well as coach of the year honors for second-year mentor Jina Skinner.

BETHANY NETS TWO SEED AT ECAC CHAMPIONSHIP

Bethany (18-7) is headed to the ECAC Southern Women's Basketball Tournament as the second seed and will play third seed Allentown (15-10) on Saturday, March 6, at a site and time to be determined. King's (18-8) won the tournament's top seed and will open against fourth seed Delaware Valley (17-8) on Saturday. The championship game will be played Sunday, March 7.

The Bison advanced to the ECAC tournament in 1994-95 and 1995-96 and the NCAA championship in 1996-97. They dropped their first-round game in each playoff appearance.

BETHANY WINS PAC CHAMPIONSHIP

Jill Kamerer (Rayland, OH/Buckeye Local) fired in 24 points as Bethany cruised to its second PAC title in three years with a 74-51 win over Grove City in the winner-take-all at Bethany's Hummel Field House last Tuesday.

The Bison drilled 17 of 24 shots in the second half (70.8%) after leading at intermission, 32-24. Racquel Burns (Wheeling, WV/Wheeling Central Catholic) knocked down 13 points, Rose Scott (Struthers, OH/Struthers) tossed in 12 and Stephanie Cunningham (Bethany, WV/Brooke) tallied 11 points. Kamerer grabbed a team-high nine rebounds and Cunningham added four assists.

Karin Hendrickson (New Wilmington, PA/Wilmington) paced the Lady Wolverines with 18 points and nine boards.

Bethany, led by second-year head coach Jina Skinner, closed the regular season with wins in 11 of its last 12 games. Grove City won six of its last seven and eight of 10.
