PAC Storylines

BETHANY: The Bison opened their season with a 58-7 home loss to third-ranked Mount Union ... Bethany committed no turnovers against one of the nation's top defenses, while forcing the Purple Raiders to commit two.

CASE: Case Western Reserve outgained Carnegie Mellon 498-188 in a 30-0 shutout ... The shutout was the first for the CWRU defense since Sept. 8, 2012.

CMU: Carnegie Mellon has a bye after suffering a season-opening 30-0 setback at Case Western Reserve in the 29th Academic Bowl / PAC Kickoff Classic ... The Tartans will travel to W&J on September 20 ... The Tartans are 33-9 when winning the turnover battle since the start of the 2006 season, but have dropped the last four games when doing so, including last week at Case.

GENEVA: Geneva opened its 2014 season with a 24-19 loss at Frostburg State ... After just two plays from scrimmage, the game was delayed for one hour, 20 minutes due to lightning detected in the area ... The game marked the sixth-straight season the two programs have met to get their seasons underway.

GROVE CITY: Grove City forces four turnovers in season opener against Juniata ... Grove City starts four newcomers in lidlifter ... Wolverines open road schedule at Geneva.

SAINT VINCENT: Saint Vincent travels to Waynesburg for a non-conference contest between the two PAC schools ... SVC was shutout by #10 John Carroll in week one, while Waynesburg earned a shutout victory against Muskingum.

THIEL: Quarterback **Ryan Radke** rushed for 89 yards and three touchdowns in Thiel's 28-14 win over Allegheny ... It was Thiel's first win in a season opener since 2006 ... It was also the program's first win over Allegheny since 1985.

THOMAS MORE: Thomas More fell on the road 35-20 to fifth-ranked Wesley.

W&J: The Presidents racked up 321 yards rushing and 522 yards of total offense en route to the program's 698th all-time victory ... Junior running back **Ryan Ruffing** (150) and sophomore quarterback **Pete Coughlin** (106) each topped 100 yards rushing in W&J's season opener.

WAYNESBURG: Waynesburg posted its first home shutout since 2004 by blanking Muskingum 33-0 Saturday ... After allowing 381.8 yards per game last year, the Waynesburg defense gave up just 278 total yards to the Muskies, including just 93 yards passing ... Waynesburg has now won three-straight season openers.

WESTMINSTER: Despite leading 24-3 at the half, Westminster fell to Hiram in its season opener 30-27 ... Hiram mustered 27 points in the second half, including 20 in the fourth quarter, to complete the comeback.

PAC unbalanced schedule information

Beginning with the 2014 season, PAC football programs will play an unbalanced football schedule with eight conference and two non-conference dates. While some schools have decided to use one of the two non-conference slots to play a non-conference game against a team in the PAC, those non-conference games against league members will not count in the conference standings.

Ruffing rushed 37 times for 150 yards and found the end zone five times to help W&J rally from a 17-7 deficit and earn a 51-17 season-opening win against Wooster. He scored on runs of nine, one, seven, two and five yards, respectively, and finished one touchdown shy of W&J's single-game record of six rushing scores, set in 1905 by **Roy Hupp** against Ohio University. He also tied former W&J running back **Dion Wiegand's** five touchdown effort against Grove City in 2013 for the second-most single-game rushing scores in PAC history.

Mundell enjoyed a terrific debut for Waynesburg in Saturday's 33-0 win over Muskingum. The native of nearby Carmichaels, Pa. intercepted two passes, one of which he returned 41 yards for a touchdown, forced a fumble, and made three solo tackles. His efforts helped Waynesburg secure its first home shutout since the 2004 season.

Cannon returned a Frostburg State punt 95 yards for a score in the third quarter of Geneva's 24-19 loss to the Bobcats Saturday evening. The return for a touchdown started a run of 19-straight points by the Golden Tornadoes in the second half. With the score Cannon broke Geneva's punt return record, set by **Ron Michel** in 1997 with a 89-yarder against Walsh. Defensively, Cannon also pulled in his first career interception and added three tackles.


