**Bethany:** The Bison air attack, which piled up 417 yards against Thiel last week, was held to 94 yards by Westminster in Saturday's home loss.

**Carnegie Mellon:** Dropped a 20-16 contest at No. 18 Thomas More Saturday ... **Sam Benger** was held under 100 yards rushing for the first time in 10 games ... Benger finished with 55 yards.

**Case Western Reserve:** Rushed for 286 yards, including 163 yards and four touchdowns from junior **Jacob Burke**, in 35-7 win at Waynesburg on Saturday.

**Geneva:** 2-0 at Reeves Field this season after 35-27 Homecoming win over Thiel ... Will travel to Waynesburg Oct. 8 following bye.

**Grove City:** Hosts Waynesburg this Saturday in the annual Homecoming game at Robert E. Thorn Field ... It's the third time in the last six years that the Wolverines have hosted Waynesburg for Homecoming.

**Saint Vincent:** **Derek Stewart** threw for 442 yards and seven touchdowns, to lead the Bearcats to a 57-32 win over Grove City on Homecoming in Latrobe.

**Thiel:** **Ryan Radke** paced the Tomcats with 198 passing yards and 78 rushing yards in a 35-27 PAC loss at Geneva Saturday.

**Thomas More:** 16th-ranked Saints defeated Carnegie Mellon 20-16 on Saturday during Homecoming in Crestview Hills, Ky.

**W&J:** The Presidents were idle last week and begin the final seven-week stretch of the regular season with a 3 p.m. kickoff at Thiel Saturday.

**Waynesburg:** Hosted Case Western Reserve on Saturday ... Turnovers ultimately doomed the Yellow Jackets, who fell 35-7 at John F. Wiley Stadium.

**Westminster:** Won at Bethany 38-9 in Saturday's PAC opener ... Improved to 3-0 on the season, its best start since 1997.

## Offensive Player of the Week

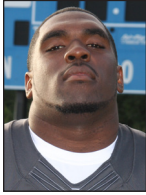


**Derek Stewart** • Senior quarterback • Saint Vincent College

Stewart completed 28-of-38 passes for 442 yards and seven touchdowns in Saturday's Homecoming victory over Grove City. His seven touchdowns tied the league's single-game record, while his 442 yards rank fifth among the PAC's single-game leaders. It was his second game throwing for 400-plus yards and at least five touchdowns this season.

## PAC Title History

After claiming the PAC title outright in 2015, Thomas More ran its conference championship total to seven since joining the league in 2005. The Saints have won at least a share of the PAC title in the last three seasons (2013-15).

The PAC has crowned co-champions six times during its 61-year run, including in three of the last four seasons (W&J, Thomas More in 2014 and 2013; W&J, Waynesburg in 2012).

There have been a total of 41 PAC teams to post undefeated and untied league records since 1955: W&J (19), John Carroll (5), Thomas More (4), Carnegie Mellon (4), Western Reserve (3), Thiel (2), Allegheny (1), Bethany (1), Grove City (1) and Waynesburg (1). The most recent program to record an undefeated league record was Thomas More (8-0) in 2015.

## Division III Playoff History

**1973:** The 1973 NCAA Division III Football Championship playoffs were the first single-elimination tournament to determine the national champion. The inaugural Division III Championship playoffs featured four teams.

**1975:** The bracket for the 1975 Division III Football Championship playoffs expanded from four to eight teams.

**1985:** The bracket for the 1985 Division III Football Championship playoffs expanded from eight to 16 teams.

**1999:** The bracket for the 1999 Division III Football Championship playoffs expanded from 16 to 28 teams.

**2005:** The bracket for the 2005 Division III Football Championship playoffs expanded from 28 to 32 teams, where it remains today.
