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Hawai'i Pacific Clinches First PacWest Tournament Berth

IRVINE, Calif. -- Hawai'i Pacific has punched its ticket to Azusa, California, for the PacWest Championships, which will be held on March 6-8. The Sharks got their 15th win in a row in conference play to take a four-game lead over Azusa Pacific for the conference title.

Rivera Starr made three shots from beyond the arc and scored 19 points in the Sharks' win over Academy of Art. The Sharks will not play again until February 10 when they travel to Azusa Pacific to begin a four-game road trip through Southern California.

Azusa Pacific extended its winning streak to seven in a row with a road win against Biola, which is ranked in the top 10 in the West Region. **Savanna Hanson** tallied 17 points and 14 rebounds in the victory.

Biola moved into fourth place in the PacWest standings after an 81-73 win against Point Loma. **Stephanie Lee** scored a career-high 26 points off the bench and **Jazz Benn** added 15 points and nine rebounds in the victory for the Eagles.

Fresno Pacific and Point Loma both got wins on the road on Saturday to remain in the playoff picture with four weeks left in the PacWest season.

This week, Azusa Pacific will play at Point Loma on Wednesday before hosting Chaminade on Saturday. Academy of Art will host both Biola and Fresno Pacific this weekend. Concordia will be on the road in the Bay Area to face Dominican and Holy Names. Hawai'i Hilo also starts its trip to the Bay Area this week against Dominican.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK



Allie Navarette, Hawai'i Hilo F, Jr., 6-0 -- Torrance, Calif.

Navarette posted back-to-back 30-point games for Hawai'i Hilo and made double-digit field goals in all three of the Vulcans games last week. The junior finished the week with 90 points, 25 rebounds and four steals. She scored 34 points against Academy of Art on 11 of 18 shooting. Against Chaminade, she led the Vulcans to their sixth conference win, scoring 31 points with 10 rebounds for her sixth double-double of the season. Navarette is now averaging 18.5 points and 8.1 rebounds per game.

DEFENDER OF THE WEEK



Cassie Pisik, Fresno Pacific F, Sr., 5-11 -- Lincoln, Calif.

Pisik recorded her second and third consecutive double-doubles this week with a combined 36 points and 27 rebounds in two games. Pisik had 22 points and 10 rebounds against Notre Dame de Namur with eight of those rebounds coming on the defensive end. On Saturday, Pisik tallied 14 points, 17 rebounds, four steals, three blocks and one assist in the Sunbirds' win over Dominican. Her 17 blocks and four steals were both season highs for the senior, who is now averaging 16.0 points and 9.5 rebounds per game.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK



Stephanie Lee, Biola G, Fr., 5-8 -- Brea, Calif.

Lee scored a career-high 26 points against Point Loma in an efficient shooting performance to earn her fifth PacWest Freshman of the Year award. She made 9 of 13 shots, including 5 of 6 from beyond the arc. She added three assists and four rebounds in the win over the Sea Lions. On Saturday night against Azusa Pacific, Lee tallied eight points with five rebounds and three assists. She made 2 of 5 shots from 3-point territory and both of her free throws.
