Navy falls to #4 Syracuse in NCAA Men's Lacrosse title match, 14-13

Second-ranked Mids surrender season-high scoring total; finish with 15-3 record

May 31, 2004

BALTIMORE, MD. - Fourth-ranked Syracuse (15-2) scored three-straight goals in a four-minute span late in the contest and gained a 14-13 victory over second-ranked Navy (15-3) in the 2004 NCAA Men's Lacrosse championship game at M&T Bank Stadium in Baltimore, Md.

The Mids, who rallied from a two-goal deficit entering the fourth quarter to take a 12-11 lead with 5:40 left in the contest, played the final eight minutes without first team All-American goalie **Matt Russell**, who was forced to leave the game with a separated shoulder.

Syracuse, appearing in the national championship game for the fifth time in the last six seasons, picked up its third national crown in five years. The Orange topped Princeton for the trophy in 2000 and 2002.

Navy's defense surrendered a season-high 14 goals. It was just the fourth time this season a team reached double-digits against the Mids. Ohio State (12-9) and No. 1 Johns Hopkins (10-9 in overtime) handed Navy its other two losses this season, and the Mids surrendered 10 goals in an 18-10 win over arch-rival Army.

Navy, appearing in the NCAA title match for the first time since 1975, is the second Patriot League team to fall in the national championship game this academic year. Like the Mids, Colgate's football squad won three games in the NCAA Division I-AA football playoffs before falling in the title tilt versus Delaware.

Neither team could gain more than a one-goal lead until Syracuse scored three-straight goals in the second quarter for a 7-5 advantage. Navy, however, bounced back with a pair of scores in the final six minutes to send the game to halftime tied at 7-7.

The Orange scored three of the four goals in the third quarter for a 10-8 lead heading into the final 15 minutes. But again, the Mids bounced back with the first three goals of the fourth quarter, the third by senior **Joe Bossi** against the Syracuse zone defense, to take an 11-10 lead with 9:59 left.

Navy took the lead again on a transition goal by **Clipper Lennon** with 5:40 left, but Syracuse scored on all three shots against freshman keeper **Colin Finnegan**, who replaced Russell with 8:01 remaining. Bryan Nee and Mike Powell combined for two goals, assisting on each other's goals, to give the Orange a 14-12 lead with 1:00 to go.

Powell, a four-time first team All-American, scored what proved to be the game-winning goal in transition after a Navy turnover. He also contributed five assists. Nee chipped in a team-high three goals.

Navy played to the wire, with sophomore attackman **Ian Dingman** bulling his way to a score with :40 seconds left. Dingman had two goals and two assists in the title match. The Mids had two more possessions down the stretch, but were unable to get the equalizer.



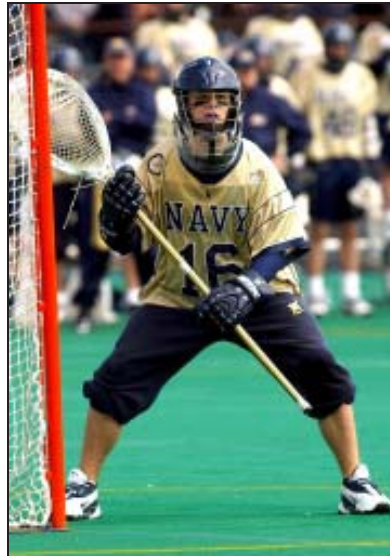
Navy goalkeeper Matt Russell, a first team All-American, was forced to leave the national championship game with eight minutes remaining due to a separated shoulder.

Matt Russell of the United States Naval Academy was selected as the national Goalie of the Year last year. He also helped the Midshipmen advance to the 2004 NCAA Men's Lacrosse national championship game, before falling to Syracuse, 14-13. Navy was one of three Patriot League men's lacrosse teams to qualify for the NCAA Tournament last season.

- ◆ Bucknell's **Kevin Miller** and Holy Cross' **Drew Bigda** were selected in the 2004 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. It marked the sixth year in a row that at least one Patriot League student-athlete was selected in the draft.
- ◆ Army's **Anita Allen** represented the United States in the modern pentathlon and **Dan Browne** ran in the marathon at the 2004 Summer Olympic Games in Athens, Greece.
- ◆ American's **Keira Carlstrom** finished 17th at the 2004 Women's NCAA Cross Country Championship meet, earning her second-consecutive All-America honor.
- ◆ In 2004, the Patriot League advanced two teams, Lafayette and Lehigh, to the NCAA Division I-AA football playoffs, one of only six conferences in the nation to earn multiple bids.
- ◆ Three Patriot League teams won first round games in their respective NCAA Tournaments during the fall of 2004: Colgate women's soccer, American men's soccer and American field hockey.

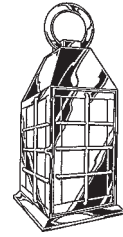


Directions To The Patriot League Office

From East or West: Take Interstate-78 to Exit 60 South (Rt. 309 South toward Quakertown). Bear right at first exit. Turn left at the stop light onto Center Valley Parkway, go across Rt. 309, continue one block and make first left onto Corporate Parkway. The Patriot League office is on the first floor of the building on the right.

From North or South: Take Interstate-476 (Northeast Extension of Pennsylvania Turnpike) to Exit 33. Proceed east on Rt. 22 to first exit -- take Rt. 309 South. Rt. 309 will merge with Interstate-78 East. Proceed to Exit 60 South (Rt. 309 South toward Quakertown). Bear right at first exit. Turn left at the stop light onto Center Valley Parkway, go across Rt. 309, continue one block and make first left onto Corporate Parkway. The Patriot League office is on the first floor of the building on the right.

- 1986 Colonial League is founded and begins full round-robin play in football only; Lafayette College associate professor **Alan Childs** is named the Executive Director.

- 1999 **Carolyn Schlie Femovich** is selected as the fourth Executive Director of the League; Villanova University begins League play as an associate member in women's lacrosse and Hobart College as an associate member in men's lacrosse.
- 2000-01 League celebrates its 10th Anniversary; League policy regarding merit aid expanded to include all sports except football, beginning with the class entering in the fall of 2001.
- 2001 American University joins the League as a full member; Georgetown University joins as an associate member in football.
- 2003 U.S. Naval Academy increases participation from 12 sports to 18 by joining PL in men's lacrosse, men's swimming & diving and all cross country and track & field programs.

Defending national runner-up Navy picked to win Patriot League men's lacrosse title

CENTER VALLEY, Pa. – The Navy Midshipmen men's lacrosse team, the 2004 Patriot League champion and NCAA national runner-up, has been selected to win the 2005 Patriot League title in a preseason vote of the League's head coaches and sports information directors, it was announced on Tuesday. Coaches and SIDs are not permitted to vote for their own institution in the poll.

Navy received 12 first-place votes and 72 total points to easily come out on top. Arch-rival Army was second, picking up the remaining two first-place votes and 61 points. Bucknell was third with 50 points, while Lehigh's 38 points edged out Colgate's 37 for fourth. Lafayette (21) and Holy Cross (15) rounded out the poll.

It promises to be an exciting season of men's lacrosse in the Patriot League, as four of the League's games will be televised live by College Sports TV: Maryland at Navy on Apr. 8, Army at Navy on Apr. 16, North Carolina at Colgate on Apr. 20 and the Patriot League Tournament championship game on May 1. Time Warner Sports in upstate New York will also carry the UNC-Colgate contest. In addition, the new ESPN channel, scheduled for launch on March 4, 2005, will broadcast a pair of Navy games, at Georgetown on Apr. 2 and at Johns Hopkins on Apr. 23.

It comes as no surprise that the Midshipmen were picked to win the League again, as Navy returns six preseason All-Americans in junior goalkeeper **Matt Russell** (Madison, Conn./Fairfield Prep) and senior defenseman **Mitch Hendler** (Reisterstown, Md./Boys' Latin) on the first team, senior midfielder **Graham Gill** (Medford, N.J./Shawnee) on the second team, junior defensive midfielder **Steve Looney** (Silver Spring, Md./DeMatha Catholic) and senior face-off specialist **Chris Pieczonka** (Hamburg, N.Y./Hamburg) on the third team and junior attack **Jon Birsner** (Levittown, N.Y./MacArthur) as an honorable mention.

Russell was the 2004 recipient of the Ens. C. Marklund Kelly Award, given to the nation's top goalkeeper. Head coach **Richie Meade**, also picked up a major award, the Morris Touchstone Memorial Award for the National Coach of the Year. The Mids fell short in the NCAA championship game, 14-13, against Syracuse. No. 2 Navy made its first appearance in the tournament since 1999 and first in the championship game since 1975. The Mids finished 2004 with a 15-3 overall record, after blazing through the PL with a perfect 7-0 mark, and then winning the League's first-ever postseason tournament, 9-8, over former League member Hobart.

Navy will once again play a challenging schedule in 2005. In addition to the Patriot League slate, the Mids will take on non-League foes Ohio State, North Carolina, Georgetown, Maryland and Johns Hopkins. The *Faceoff Yearbook/Inside Lacrosse* preseason coaches' poll has tabbed the Mids for fourth in the country.

Hobart and Army were the Patriot League's other two representatives in last year's NCAA Tournament, and the Black Knights and head coach **Jack Emmer** have been picked for second place. Army, with 668 all-time wins, is the fourth-winningest men's lacrosse program in NCAA history. The Black Knights will be looking for their third straight Tournament bid after winning the PL title in 2003 and getting an at-large berth last year.

The Black Knights were ranked 16th by *Faceoff Yearbook/Inside Lacrosse* in the preseason and return three preseason All-Americans, including senior attack **Jim Wagner** (Grand Island, N.Y./Grand Island), whose 3.07 goals per game average last year was tops in the country.

The biggest story in the League has taken place in Lewisburg, Pa. Legendary head coach **Sid Jamieson**, the only head coach in the history of Bucknell men's lacrosse, has announced that he will step down following the 2005 season, his 37th at the helm. Jamieson has compiled an overall record of 234-227 on the sideline, and will hand the program over to veteran assistant **Frank Fedorjaka**.

Last year, Jamieson led the Bison to a 6-8 overall record and a 4-3 mark in League play. The Bison return 130 of their 148 goals from last season, including their top two scorers. Reigning Patriot League Offensive Player of the year, senior attack **Chris Cara** (Medford, N.Y./Patchogue-Medford), who led the nation in total points in 2004 with 78 (38 goals, 40 assists), will anchor the offensive unit, and will get plenty of help from fellow senior attack **Patrick Christensen** (Leonardtown, Md./St. Mary's Ryken), BU's second leading scorer a year ago with 38 goals and three assists.

Lehigh has high hopes following last year's 4-10 record, mainly because the Mountain Hawks return 22 letterwinners from last year, including Second Team All-League selections, junior defenseman **Jeff King** (Levittown, N.Y./MacArthur) and senior attack **Andrew Lucas** (Baldwin, N.Y./Oceanside). King ranked in the top five in the Patriot League last season with 5.14 ground balls per game, while Lucas' 41 goals a year ago raised his career total to 75. Senior goalie **Tom Ellis** (Timonium, Md./St. Paul's) is 69 saves away from 500 for his career.

The biggest surprise of the poll may be Colgate's fifth-place position. The Raiders had the 17th-best scoring defense in the NCAA last year, allowing just 8.20 goals per game, and they return the League's Co-Rookie of the Year from 2003 in goalie **Andrew Jarolimek** (Silverthorne, Colo./Arapahoe).

Offensively, head coach **Jim Nagle** will look to sophomore attack **Rob Ryan** (Manhasset, N.Y./Manhasset Jr.-Sr.) and junior midfielder **Robert Trasolini** (New Hyde Park, N.Y./New Hyde Park Memorial), who scored 12 and 16 goals last year, respectively.

Lafayette, picked for sixth, will be tested often, as 25 of the Leopards' 32 student-athletes are either freshmen or sophomores. LC also must play eight of its 13 matches away from Metzgar Fields. The Leopards will turn to sophomore attack **Bart Seifert** (Vienna, Va./Salisbury School), who led Lafayette last year with 27 points on 16 goals and 11 assists.

Holy Cross, coming off a 5-9 season and a winless PL campaign, looks to first-year head coach **Adam Pascal** and assistant **Patrick Ammendolia** to turn things around. The Crusaders will have nine seniors to lead the way, including tri-captains, defenseman **P.J. Farrell** (Commack, N.Y./Commack), attack **Mike McKee** (Sloatsburg, N.Y./Lawrenceville) and defenseman **Edmund Yip** (Providence, R.I./Choate Rosemary Hall).

The first date of competition is Feb. 19, with three games: Navy vs. Providence at noon in Branford, Conn., Colgate hosting Villanova at 1 p.m. and Lehigh at Delaware at 3 p.m. The season will culminate with the Patriot League Tournament on Friday, Apr. 29 and Sunday, May 1, at the campus of the No. 1 seed.

2005 Outlook

- ◆ The 2005 campaign will be the 37th and final for head coach **Sid Jamieson**. Veteran assistant **Frank Fedorjaka** will succeed the retiring Jamieson, becoming only the second head coach in BU lacrosse history.
- ◆ **Chris Cara** led the nation in scoring in 2004 with 78 points (38 goals and 40 assists). Cara, the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year and an honorable mention All-America, is also a 2005 preseason All-America pick by Inside Lacrosse. He needs 37 points to become BU's all-time leading scorer and 55 to become the PL's all-time leader.
- ◆ The team's second-leading scorer, **Patrick Christensen**, also returns, as the Bison welcome back 130 of their 148 goals from last season.
- ◆ **Matt Baran** returns to the crease in 2005, following a sophomore campaign that saw him debut as a starter and play 95 percent of the team's minutes. He finished with a .579 save percentage and a 9.30 goals-against average.

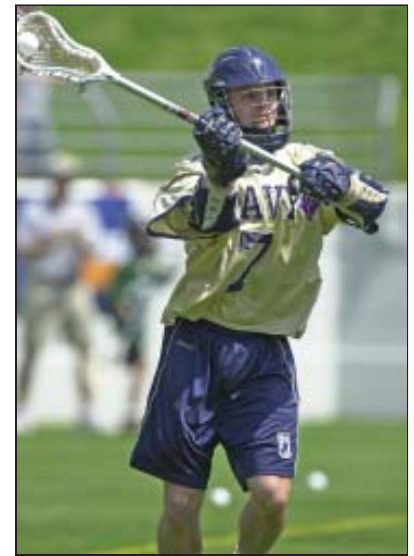

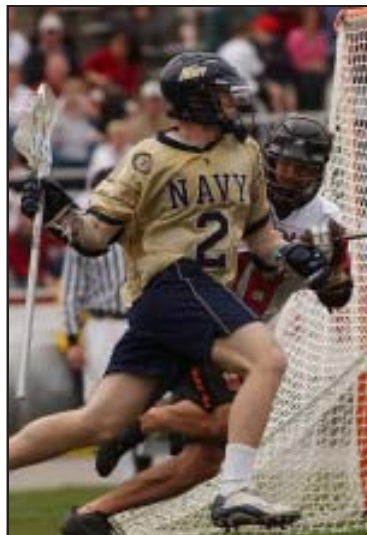
