Patriot League Mission

The Patriot League promotes opportunities for students to compete in Division I intercollegiate athletics programs within a context that holds paramount the high academic standards and integrity of member institutions, and the academic and personal growth of student-athletes.

Patriot League Vision

The Patriot League will be the exemplary intercollegiate athletics conference in the country for student-athletes who demonstrate success both in academic achievement and athletic competition.

- Offering broad-based and diverse athletic programs, the League schools are dedicated to shared values of integrity, character and the personal development of all students.

- Student-athletes are provided the opportunity to achieve their athletic potential and compete successfully at the NCAA Division I level.

- The Patriot League will be recognized nationally for the effective integration of Division I athletics into the educational mission of the institution.

- Student-athletes are prepared to become leaders and to make meaningful contributions to society.

Now in its third decade as an all-sport conference combining academic and athletic excellence, the Patriot League sponsors championships in 23 men and women's sports. Initially started as an NCAA Division I-AA football conference in 1986, the Patriot League became an all-sport conference in 1990 and includes American, Army, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh and Navy as full members, and Fordham, Georgetown and MIT as associate members. These institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation and their alumni have, and continue to play leadership roles in shaping our country.

Since 1998, the Patriot League has ranked first each year among all Division I conferences awarding athletic aid in the NCAA Graduation Rate Report. The League finished at the top spot with 96 percent of its teams reporting a graduation rate of 85 percent or higher in the most recent data. In addition, 90 Patriot League teams earned NCAA Academic Performance Program Public Recognition Awards after posting academic progress rate scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports.

The Patriot League's mission is simple, to provide successful competitive athletic experiences while maintaining high academic standards, and to prepare its student-athletes to be leaders in society.

During the 2009-10 academic year, Patriot League student-athletes and teams have accomplished the following:

*11 Patriot League student-athletes earned CoSIDA/*ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-America honors, with Army's Andrew Maisano (Men's Lacrosse), Erin Anthony (Women's Basketball) and Elizabeth Betterbed (Women's Soccer), Navy's Beth Reed (Women's Soccer), Alex Buck (Men's Swimming and Diving) and Mark Van Orden (Track and Field) and Bucknell's Patrick Selwood (Men's Soccer) receiving First-Team Academic All-America honors.

*50 Patriot League student-athletes received CoSIDA/*ESPN The Magazine* Academic All-District honors.

*The Patriot League placed second among all Division I conferences with 90 teams receiving NCAA Public Recognition Awards for their performance in the classroom.

*Navy's Beth Reed and Mark Van Orden received NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships.

*Reed was also named the CoSIDA/*ESPN The Magazine* Women's Soccer Academic All-American of the Year, and won the Patriot League Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award.

*Reed and American's Anne-Meike de Wiljes earned the Patriot League's nominations for the NCAA Woman of the Year award.

*Army's Andrew Maisano won the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for Men's Lacrosse, and earned the Patriot League Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year award.

*Other Candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award: Marquis Hall, Lehigh (Men's Basketball); Andrew Kydes, Army (Men's Soccer); Elizabeth Betterbed, Army (Women's Soccer); Mandy Correale, Holy Cross (Softball).

*Army's Elizabeth Betterbed was selected as a Rhodes Scholar.

*Holy Cross' Olivia Pruszek earned a Fulbright English Teaching Assistantship

*Holy Cross' Dominic Randolph finished fifth in the voting for the Walter Payton Award, given to the Most Outstanding Player in the Football Championship Subdivision, and won the ECAC Player of the Year honor.

*Fordham's John Skelton became the first Patriot League player taken in the NFL Draft since 1995.

*Lehigh's C.J. McCollum was named the ECAC Men's Basketball Rookie of the Year and received multiple national freshman honors.

*Navy's Adam Meyer was named the Mid-Major Swimmer of the Year by CollegeSwimming.com, and received Honorable Mention All-America honors at the NCAA Championship Meet.

*Bucknell won the 2010 Patriot League Presidents' Cup. The Bison also won the male and female trophies.

*It was the eighth time in Patriot League history that a school won the overall, male and female titles.

*Every Patriot League team won at least one championship for just the fifth time in League history.

*Army Men's Lacrosse defeated No. 2 Syracuse, 9-8, in double overtime in the NCAA Tournament first round.

*Bucknell defeated Princeton in the first round of the NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament.

*A pair of Patriot League teams played in the postseason in women's basketball. Lehigh made the NCAA Tournament, while American qualified for the WNIT.

*Three Patriot Leaguers were selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft, while a pair were chosen in the Major Lacrosse League Draft.

*Army's Garret Thul was named national freshman of the year by Inside Lacrosse.

*Three teams were ranked in the final Sports Network FCS top 25 for the first time since 2005.

1986 The Colonial League is founded and begins full round-robin play in football only; Lafayette College Associate Professor Alan Childs is named Executive Director.

1999 Carolyn Schlie Femovich is selected as the fourth Executive Director of the Patriot League.

2000-01 Patriot League celebrates its 10th Anniversary; Patriot League policy regarding merit aid expanded to include all sports except football, beginning with the class entering in the fall of 2001.

2001 American University joins the Patriot League as a full member; Georgetown University joins as an associate member in football.

2003 United States Naval Academy increases participation from 12 sports to 18 by joining Patriot League in men's lacrosse, men's swimming and diving and men's and women's cross country and track and field.

2004 Women's rowing added as Patriot League's 23rd sport.

2005 Patriot League celebrates 20th anniversary for the sport of football.

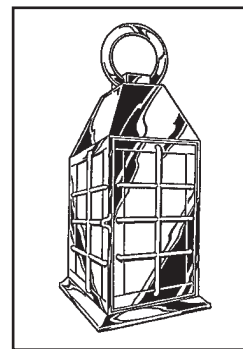
2007 Patriot League unveils broadband package for men and women's basketball. Nearly 100 regular-season and a dozen Patriot League Tournament games are streamed. A two-year agreement for basketball TV package with ESPNU begins. 2010 Massachusetts Institute of Technology joins the Patriot League as an associate member in rowing.

Carolyn Schlie Femovich - Executive Director

In selecting Carolyn Schlie Femovich as its fourth Executive Director, the Patriot League Council of Presidents continued its adherence to equity and innovation in its approach to intercollegiate athletics. Femovich brought 17 years experience at the NCAA Division I level to the Patriot League when she was appointed Executive Director in July of 1999. She is one of four women to hold the top post of a combined men and women's conference at the NCAA Division I level.

Throughout her tenure at the Patriot League, Femovich has focused on key areas including the development of a comprehensive multimedia package, expansion of League membership, improvement of League competitiveness, and quality of services to the membership.

Under her direction, Patriot League basketball has gained increased television exposure through contracts with national outlets and as a result of the League's broadband initiative, which streams more than 100 men and women's basketball games live annually via the Internet. Additionally, selected Patriot League Olympic sports have found a home as a part of the League's all-sport packages with various television entities and have seen increased visibility through the streaming of Patriot League Championship events.

In 2001 Femovich orchestrated the addition of American University as a full member and Georgetown as an associate member in football, which has helped to strengthen and stabilize the membership. She has also increased service to the membership with improvements in championship administration, League governance and a focus on the student-athlete experience. During her time with the Patriot League, emphasis has been placed on the competitiveness of its men and women's basketball programs, as well as other key sports that present unique opportunities for the League.

Femovich has served in national leadership positions with the NCAA as chair of the Division I Championship/Competition Cabinet and as the League representative on the NCAA Management Council. She was also chairperson of the prestigious Collegiate Women's Sports Award Program, where she continues to serve as a board member. Currently, she serves as a board member of the National Association of Collegiate Women Athletic Administrators (NACWAA).

During her tenure as Senior Associate Athletics Director (1986-99) and Associate Athletics Director (1982-85) at the University of Pennsylvania, her responsibilities included administration of intercollegiate sports and recreation programs, strategic planning and facilities development, human resource management and event planning. In her initial years with the Quakers, Femovich supervised 15 intercollegiate programs, coaching staffs and athletics facilities. She also served as Penn's Interim Director of Athletics in 1985. Femovich represented the University in a variety of external capacities with the Ivy League and NCAA, and on a number of sports committees and boards.

Femovich's career in intercollegiate athletics began in 1974 at Indiana University as a graduate teaching assistant. In 1975, she moved to Gettysburg College as head coach of women's basketball, women's tennis, assistant professor of health and physical education and the Coordinator of Women's Athletics.

Included in the impressive list of regional and national committees Femovich has served on are the NCAA Basketball Marketing Sub-Committee, the NCAA Division I Business/Finance Cabinet and the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee, arguably the most prestigious women's sport committee in the NCAA. She played a primary role in bringing the 2000 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four to Philadelphia and is a member of the executive board of the Philadelphia Sports Congress. She also held the office of President of the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) in 1996, which now includes more than 300 member institutions.

Femovich is a graduate of Valparaiso University and received a master of science degree from Indiana University. Femovich and her husband Robert reside in Hellertown, Pa.

2010-11 PATRIOT LEAGUE MEN'S BASKETBALL NOTEBOOK

REPEAT FOR LEHIGH'S MCCOLLUM?

Lehigh sophomore C.J. McCollum put together a record-setting first season, and will be looking to make an impact again after becoming the first student-athlete in League history to earn Player and Rookie of the Year recognition in the same year. He is the top returning scorer in the Patriot League after averaging 19.1 points per game last year, where he won numerous national and regional honors for his performance.

NO CLEAR FAVORITE IN 2010-11

The top five teams in the Patriot League preseason poll were separated by just 10 total points, giving the League a very balanced look heading into the 2010-11 season. American just earned the favorite status over Bucknell, Lafayette, Holy Cross and Lehigh.

SIX ALL-LEAGUE PLAYERS RETURN

McCollum might be the headliner, but he's certainly not the only accomplished player returning to the court. Six of last year's 10 All-Patriot League performers are back, with Lafayette senior Jared Mintz and American senior Vlad Moldoveanu joining McCollum on the first team and Holy Cross senior Andrew Keister, Lafayette sophomore Ryan Willen and Bucknell sophomore Mike Muscala earning Second-Team All-Patriot League honors. Also returning are American junior Stephen Lumpkins and Lafayette junior Jim Mower after being named to the Patriot League All-Tournament Team.

PATRIOT LEAGUE ON CBS COLLEGE SPORTS

For the second straight year, Patriot League regular season and postseason contests will be shown nationally on CBS College Sports Network. The Patriot League and CBS College Sports Network entered into an agreement for the 2011 season that showcases 10 contests, including three Patriot League Men's Basketball Tournament games. The Patriot League Tournament coverage begins with a men's quarterfinal game on March 2 at 7 p.m. Both men's basketball semifinal contests will be shown on CBS College Sports Network on March 6, with a tip-off at 5 p.m. followed by a 7:30 p.m. start. Seven Patriot League men's basketball contests will be broadcast by CBS College Sports Network during the regular season, with the return of the flex schedule on the final two weekends. Coverage starts on Jan. 16 when Holy Cross visits Bucknell at 2 p.m. CBS College Sports Network is available through cable operators as well as on DIRECTV Channel 613 and Dish Network Channel 152.



TIEBREAKING PROCEDURES

In the case of ties in the Patriot League final regular-season standings, the following process will be used until all ties are broken and the seeding process is completed (ties will be broken in rank order beginning with the highest seed):

Head-to-Head Competition: The higher seed will go to the team that has won the most Patriot League contests played against the other team (s) involved in the tie.

If a Tie Still Exists: A Comparison of records will be made between the tied institutions starting at the highest possible seed and continuing through the lowest possible seed, if necessary.

If a Tie Still Exists: The Patriot League office will use the RPI according to the *Collegiate Basketball News men's RPI Report*, published on the day following the final regular-season Patriot League game to determine the higher-seeded team (or the next day that the report is available). Note - *If a game must be postponed for any reason, the first Men's RPI Report rankings calculated following the conclusion of that game will be used.* The team with the higher RPI will receive the higher seed and the opportunity to host the tournament final (should that team advance to the championship game).

BROWN TAKES OVER AT HOLY CROSS

Holy Cross will have a new head coach for the second consecutive year, as Milan Brown took over direction of the program in April. Brown comes to Worcester after seven seasons as the head coach at Mt. St. Mary's, where he led the Mountaineers to a winning record and two postseason berths in the past two seasons. His teams posted a 54-44 record (.551) during those three years, including a 35-19 mark (.648) in Northeast Conference play.

TOUGH TESTS AHEAD

Patriot League teams will play two months worth of games before the first League contests on Jan. 8, and there will be plenty of matchups against top-notch competition during that stretch. League squads play 16 games against opponents from BCS-level conferences, including matchups with national champion Duke, Final Four participant West Virginia and No. 1 seed Syracuse. The schedule gets tough right from the start, with Navy at Texas, Bucknell at Villanova and Marquette and Lehigh at Penn State on the first week of the season.

PATRIOT LEAGUE COORDINATOR OF OFFICIALS

Reggie Greenwood begins his second season as the Coordinator of Men's Basketball Officials for both the Patriot and Ivy League in 2010-11. Greenwood has nearly 30 years of officiating experience, with most of those seasons at the NCAA Division I level. He has worked for nine Division I conferences, including the Big East, Big 10, Atlantic Coast Conference and Atlantic 10 in addition to the Patriot League and Ivy League.

TEAM NOTEBOOKS

American The Eagles are picked first in the Patriot League with all five starters and 12 letterwinners returning. Vlad Moldoveanu (18.1 ppg, 6.5 rpg) and Stephen Lumpkins (13.0 ppg, 8.5 rpg) headline the frontcourt, with depth in the backcourt. American takes on a very difficult non-League slate that includes games against West Virginia, Pittsburgh and Florida.

Army The Black Knights are faced with the task of replacing the core of last year's team, with four of the top five scorers graduated. Julian Simmons (11.3 ppg) boasts the top mark among returning players. Army's opening roster features seven freshman.

Bucknell The Bison have all five starters back from last year's team that finished 9-5 in Patriot League play. Sophomores Mike Muscala, Joe Willman and Bryson Johson all made the Patriot League All-Rookie Team, with Muscala also earning a Second-Team All-Patriot League nod after scoring 9.9 points per game and leading the Patriot League in blocked shots. Bucknell's early schedule includes matchups with Villanova, Marquette and Boston College.

Colgate The Raiders welcome back Mike Venezia, who missed almost the entire 2009-10 season with an injury. Yaw Gyawu returns after placing fifth in the Patriot League in scoring, while Virginia transfer John Brandenburg joins Gyawu to strengthen the frontcourt. Colgate plays two of last year's top teams when it visits Duke and Syracuse.

Holy Cross Head Coach Milan Brown inherits perhaps the deepest starting lineup in the Patriot League, as seniors Andrew Keister and Andrew Beinert and juniors R.J. Evans, Devin Brown and Mike Cavataio all placed in the top 20 in the Patriot League with more than 10 points per game last season. Keister also led the Patriot League with 8.9 rebounds per game.

Lafayette The Leopards should be loaded on offense once again, with top scorers Jared Mintz (14.1 ppg), Jim Mower (13.8) and Ryan Willen (12.2) all back for last year's Patriot League runner-up. Mintz and Willen were All-Patriot League selections, while Willen and Mower made the Patriot League All-Tournament Team. Mintz was the only player in League history to finish first in both field goal and free throw percentage, while Mower enters the year as the top three-point shooter in League history at 44.6 percent.

Lehigh The Mountain Hawks lost three starters from last year's team, but will still be able to rely on Patriot League Player of the Year C.J. McCollum (19.1 ppg). Gabe Knutson averaged 9.5 points and 5.6 rebounds per game last season. Lehigh tries to win consecutive Patriot League titles.

Navy The Mids lost plenty of firepower with the graduation of Patriot League-leading scorer Chris Harris, but still have potent offensive players in junior Jordan Sugars (15.8 ppg, 8.0 rpg) and senior O.J. Avworo, who led the Patriot League in assists. Navy will enjoy one of the earliest starts to the season on Nov. 8 at Texas in the 2K Sports Classic.

American Edges Out Competitors as First-Place Pick in Patriot League Men's Basketball

Lehigh's McCollum Named Preseason Player of the Year

If the preseason poll is any indication, the 2010-11 Patriot League men's basketball season promises to be a memorable one as five teams were separated by just 10 points at the top of the rankings by coaches and sports information directors.

American emerged from the group as the top choice in the poll, as the 2008 and 2009 champion Eagles garnered 79 points and also led the way with seven first-place votes. Bucknell followed with 76 points and three first-place votes to take second place. Lafayette, Holy Cross and Lehigh were closely bunched in the next three spots, with each team picking up a pair of first-place nods. Lafayette claimed third place with 73 points, followed by Holy Cross with 70 and the defending champion Mountain Hawks with 69. Navy, Colgate and Army filled out the rankings.



The Preseason Player of the Year selection offered little drama, as Lehigh's C.J. McCollum (pictured above) was the runaway winner after claiming the award after his outstanding freshman season last year. McCollum also headlines the Preseason All-Patriot League Team, where the top six teams in the preseason poll all placed one player. McCollum was joined by Holy Cross senior forward Andrew Keister, Lafayette senior forward Jared Mintz, American senior forward Vlad Moldoveanu, Bucknell sophomore forward/center Mike Muscala and Navy junior guard/forward Jordan Sugars. Five of the six players were All-Patriot League selections in 2009-10.

American (11-20, 7-7 in 2009-10) is projected to have a bounce-back season with all five starters and 12 letterwinners returning. Moldoveanu comes off a First-Team All-Patriot League campaign where he averaged 18.1 points and 6.5 rebounds per game, while Stephen Lumpkins averaged 13.0 points and 8.5 rebounds to form an imposing front line duo. The Eagles also return senior Nick Hendra among a collection of guards, and should get an extra boost from SEC transfers Troy Brewer and Charles Hinkle.

Bucknell (14-17, 9-5) placed a record three players on the Patriot League All-Rookie Team, with Muscala also earning a Second-Team All-Patriot League honor after averaging 9.9 points and posting a League-high 65 blocks. The Bison return all five starters and nine of the top 10 scorers from last year's team, including leading scorer Darryl Shazier (10.1 ppg) who also placed third in the Patriot League in assists.

Lafayette (19-13, 8-6) brings back a strong nucleus after making the Patriot League title game last season. The Leopards will be led again by Mintz, who averaged team highs of 14.1 points and 5.7 rebounds per game and became the first player to lead the Patriot League in both field goal and free throw percentage. Juniors Ryan Willen (12.2 ppg, 4.6 rpg) and Jim Mower (13.8 ppg, 92 3-PT FG) also return to a high-powered offense that averaged 72.5 points per game last season.

Holy Cross (9-22, 5-9) looks to rebound behind first-year Head Coach Milan Brown. The Crusaders will have an opportunity with four starters and 11 letterwinners back, as Keister, senior Andrew Beinert and juniors R.J. Evans, Devin Brown and Mike Cavataio all placed in the top 20 in the Patriot League in scoring by averaging more than 10 points per game.

Lehigh (22-11, 10-4) loses key cogs Marquis Hall, Zahir Carrington and Dave Buchberger from last year's championship team, but McCollum is capable of carrying the load after averaging 19.1 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.4 assists in his Player of the Year campaign. Fellow sophomore Gabe Knutson also returns on the front line after averaging 9.5 points and 5.6 rebounds in his first season.

Navy (13-17, 7-7), Colgate (10-19, 6-8) and Army (14-15, 4-10) all finished far behind the top five in the preseason rankings, but have reason for optimism with talented players back in 2010-11. Sugars was fourth in the Patriot League with 15.8 points per game last year and third with 8.0 rebounds, and will once again have Patriot League assist leader O.J. Avworo dishing him the ball. Colgate welcomes back junior Mike Venezia from his season-ending injury early last year, and Yaw Gyawu headlines the frontcourt after placing fifth in the Patriot League with 14.3 points per game in 2009-10. Army was the top defensive team in the Patriot League last year, and Head Coach Zach Spiker will look for the same effort in his second season.

Patriot League teams begin the season on Nov. 8 when Navy plays at Texas in the 2K Sports Classic. Patriot League play tips off on January 8, and will once again include regular-season games on CBS College Sports Network. The Patriot League Tournament begins with the quarterfinals on March 2 and semifinals on March 6, with one quarterfinal and both semifinals televised on CBS College Sports Network. The Patriot League Championship is set for March 11 at 4:45 p.m. on ESPN2. All Tournament games are played at the higher seed.

Bender Arena (3,044)

Now entering its 23rd season as the home of American University Athletics, Bender Arena officially opened its doors on Jan. 23, 1988, with a women's basketball team vs. James Madison University. Bender Arena was made possible in part through the generosity of alumni benefactors Howard and Sondra Bender and named in honor of Jack I. Bender, Howard's father. The newly reconfigured arena holds 3,044 fans for basketball, wrestling and volleyball home contests.

On January 15, 2003, American University dedicated the competition floor to the memory of Stafford H. "Pop" Cassell. Cassell was a legendary figure on campus serving as Director of Athletics, coach, teacher and student-athlete during his time at AU. Prior to the 2001-02 season, the arena received a new scoreboard, which includes a 7-by-9-foot animation/video display and advertising signage for corporate sponsors. Improvements this decade also include the installation of chairback seating throughout the arena, back-lit scorers tables encircling the main court and arena graphics bearing the Athletics logo and depicting the rich history of AU Athletics. Bender Arena is housed in a complex that also includes the Reeves Aquatics Center, Jacobs Fitness Center and Marilyn Meltzer Wrestling Room, making it the center of activity for the entire campus community.

It is also a significant venue in the capital city's sports, entertainment and political scene. Bender Arena has hosted a myriad of events including rock concerts, high school and amateur sporting events, career fairs and important civic discourse.

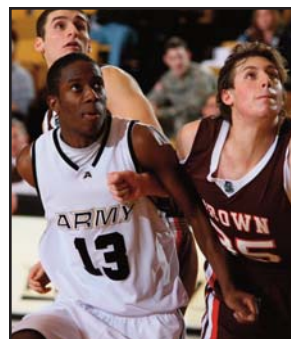

Christl Arena (5,043)

The Holleder Center houses not only the Edward C. Christl Jr. Arena that seats 5,043 for basketball, but the Joseph S. and Frederick H.S. Tate Rink that seats 2,746 for ice hockey as well. The building, dedicated Oct. 1, 1988, was named for Maj. Donald W. Holleder (USMA '56), who was killed in action in Vietnam in 1967. While at West Point, Holleder excelled both in basketball and football. He earned All-America honors in the latter, and has been enshrined in the NCAA Hall of Fame.

The basketball arena was named for 1st Lt. Edward C. Christl Jr. (USMA '44), who was killed in Austria in 1945. Elected basketball team captain during his senior year, Christl led the Black Knights to a perfect 15-0 record.

The building is constructed of concrete and steel framed masonry complete with spectator and support facilities. It contains two concession areas, an Army Athletic Association gift shop, ticket office, sports medicine room, storage areas and offices for coaching and administrative personnel.

Christl Arena possesses a Horner hardwood basketball floor, which was refurbished recently and measures 149x116 feet. Shower and locker room facilities for Army's men and women squads, plus three visiting locker rooms are located close by. The arena also contains six Hydra-Rib basketball supports, fixed chair and bench seating for spectators and two new scoreboards at either end, put up for the start of the 2001-02 season.

Christl Arena has been host to other sporting events such as international volleyball and gymnastics meets and exhibition basketball contests. Christl Arena welcomed network television cameras for the first time in February of 1996 when CBS Sports broadcast the Army-Navy tilt to a regional audience.



DIRECTIONS TO CHRISTL ARENA

From JFK Airport VanWyck Parkway to Bronx-Whitestone Bridge. After crossing the bridge, look for the Cross Bronx Expressway. Follow the Cross Bronx Expressway to the Bronx River Parkway north.

Take the Bronx River Parkway to left fork for the Sprain Brook Parkway. Follow Sprain Brook Parkway to Route 287, left exit to Tappan Zee Bridge and Interstate 87 (New York State Thruway). Over bridge, take exit 13N onto the Palisades Interstate Parkway heading north.

Take the PIP north to its end (Bear Mountain traffic circle). Follow signs for Route 9W north (3d exit off traffic circle). Exit 9W via West Point exit, Stony Lonesome exit, or Route 293 exit.

From LaGuardia Airport Take the Whitestone Parkway to Bronx-Whitestone Bridge. After crossing the bridge, look for the Cross Bronx Expressway. Follow the Cross Bronx Expressway to the Bronx River Parkway north. Follow from above.

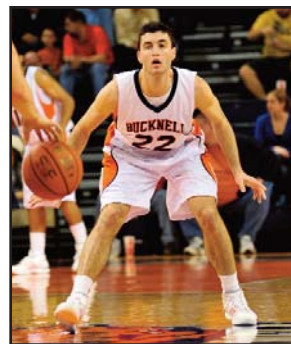

Sojka Pavilion (4,000)

Bucknell plays its home games in Sojka Pavilion, which is in its eighth full season. The 4,000-seat arena opened Jan. 15, 2003.

The building was dedicated in honor of Dr. Gary A. Sojka, former president of Bucknell University and a retired faculty member from the biology department. Sojka oversaw Bucknell's highly successful move into the Patriot League in the mid-1980s. He is also a former NCAA Faculty Athletics Representative.

Sojka Pavilion represented the final major piece of Bucknell's state-of-the-art Recreation and Athletics Center when it opened in 2003. In use since the fall of that year was the Krebs Fitness Center and Kinney Natatorium, as well as the sports medicine center and administrative and coaches' offices.

The pavilion includes "walk-down" access and unobstructed views of the playing surface from all seating areas. Many of the 4,000 seats are fixed in place, while others are retractable to allow for an expandable open floor area with sufficient space for three regulation basketball courts for recreational use as well as varsity practice. The facility also features concession areas, ticket windows, restrooms, handicapped seating, team and officials locker rooms, a media room and other meeting areas.

Bucknell holds an all-time record of 70-28 in men's basketball games at Sojka Pavilion. The Bison have a 51-12 record at home against Patriot League foes, and went unbeaten at home in League play in four straight seasons (2004-2007) while compiling a 38-game unbeaten streak against Patriot League opponents.

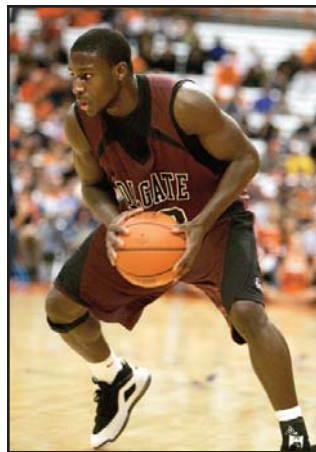

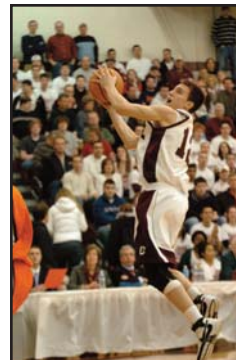

Cotterell Court (3,100)

Cotterell Court, located in the Wendt wing of the Reid Athletic Center, has been the home of the Colgate basketball for the past 36 seasons, and volleyball for 32 years. The arena was named for Wesley M. Cotterell, a two-time basketball letterman and member of the class of 1919, who was a trustee of the University until his death in 1965.

In May 2000, Phase I renovations of Cotterell Court were completed. The half million dollar project included fresh paint throughout the venue, new comfortable VIP chairback seats on the team bench side and colorful maroon and gray bleachers on the opposite side of the floor and a new state of the art sound system. The following year, the floor was resurfaced and painted and a new rectangular drop down center scoreboard was installed. The scoreboard is a gift from the Colgate Class of 1950 and completed Phase II renovations.

Cotterell Court was the site of the 2004 Patriot League Women's Basketball Championship, which Colgate captured to win its first women's basketball title in program history. It also served as the host site of the 1995 and 1996 men's Patriot League Basketball Championship games, both of which Colgate won to advance to the NCAA Tournament.

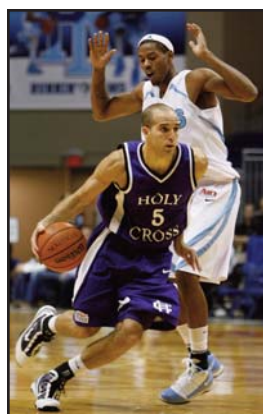

Hart Center (3,600)

Since the Crusader men's basketball team defeated Loyola (Md.) 94-85 on the newly built Hart Recreation Center court on Dec. 1, 1975, the Hart Center has been a tremendous home court advantage for men's and women's teams alike. Both the men's and women's teams have won more than 70 percent of their games at the Hart Center.

The 3,600 seat capacity has been exceeded often, as "standing room only" crowds of 4,000 make the Hart Center into a loud and intimidating playing environment for opponents.

Some of the great teams who have faced the Crusaders on their home floor are Connecticut, Georgetown, Ohio State and Providence on the men's side, and Connecticut, Maryland, Stanford and North Carolina on the women's side.



DIRECTIONS TO HART CENTER

From the East and West Massachusetts Turnpike I-90. Take Exit 10 to I-290 East toward Worcester. Take Exit 11 (College Square/Southbridge Street) off I-290. Cross over to the right lane immediately after coming off the ramp to College Square. Take the first right (before the traffic light) onto College Street. To get to Fitton Field, take the first left onto Fitton Ave. To get to the Hart Recreation Center go up the hill and enter the last gate on the left, Gate 7. Take your first right and head up the hill. The Hart Center is at the top of the hill.

From the North I-495 South to I-290 West, Exit 25B. From I-290 West take Exit 11 (College Square, Southbridge Street). Bear left coming off the ramp onto Southbridge Street. Take the first right (before the traffic light) onto College Street. Follow from above.

From the Southeast I-495 North to Massachusetts Turnpike I-90. Take Exit 10 to I-290 East toward Worcester. Take Exit 11 (College Square/Southbridge Street) off I-290. Follow from above.

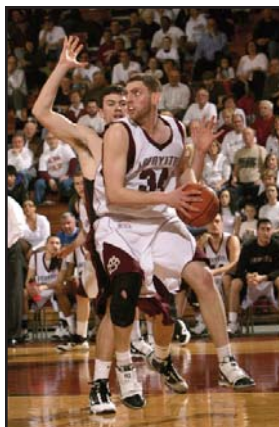

Kirby Sports Center (3,500)

The Allan P. Kirby Field House, constructed in 1973, underwent a major facelift and interior renovations to make it compatible with the new addition to become the Allan P. Kirby Sports Center. The renovations included improved locker rooms, creation of classroom space and additional space for the coaching and administrative staffs.

The arena in Kirby Sports Center is nearly the size of a football field, at 270 feet by 165 feet.

Additionally, the main floor received a major renovation in the summer of 1997. The basketball floor was resurfaced, while a state-of-the-art 220-yard flat track was installed, replacing the previous surface which had been a fixture for 24 years. In the summer of 2004, the basketball playing surface was refurbished, as both sidelines were replaced, all of the lines were re-painted and the Leopard logo was hand-painted at center court.

The arena in Kirby Sports Center has a permanent seating capacity of 3,500, while additional seating can be provided for tournaments, concerts, and other special events to bring the capacity to nearly 6,000. Surrounding the basketball and auxiliary practice areas is a 220-yard flat track.

Dedicated on June 2, 2000, the \$35 million Allan P. Kirby Sports Center gives Lafayette the finest athletic complex of any college of its size in the country. It includes a new, 110,000-square-foot intramural and recreational sports facility attached to the previously existing Kirby Field House. The field house itself received a \$2.5 million facelift and interior renovations.

Stabler Arena (5,600)

Stabler Arena is home to the Lehigh University basketball programs, as well as the host of an occasional Lehigh wrestling match. Completed prior to the start of the 1979-80 winter sports season, the arena was named in honor of Mr. Donald Stabler, a Lehigh alumnus and major benefactor to the arena. In December of 1979, Stabler dedicated the facility in honor of his parents.

Stabler Arena has undergone many improvements aimed at elements related to the Lehigh basketball and wrestling programs. Midway through the 1998-99 season, a new basketball floor was installed at Stabler. With the addition of two new scoreboards, including message boards and pro-style scorer's tables, Stabler boasts a "big-time" basketball and wrestling atmosphere. In the summer of 2004, new state-of-the-art locker rooms and a new team meeting area were built for the Lehigh basketball teams.

Stabler Arena has played host to many sporting events, including the 2004 and 2010 Patriot League Men's Basketball Championship games and several Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association (EIWA) championships. Other events held at Stabler include the Harlem Globetrotters, U.S. Olympic volleyball competition, the annual National Prep high school wrestling tournament, World Wrestling Entertainment events, and the Pennsylvania state high school basketball tournament.

Stabler Arena is also a mainstay in the Lehigh Valley for top musical concerts. Blues Traveler, Tom Petty, Billy Joel, Faith Hill, Phil Collins, and the Grateful Dead are just a few of the artists to perform.

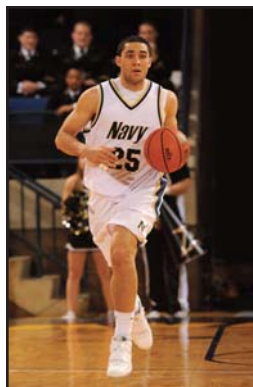

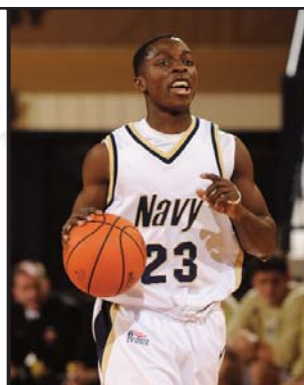

Alumni Hall (5,710)

A state-of-the-art functional facility. A memorial hall. That's how retired Navy Captain Harry A. Seymour Jr., director of the capital campaign for the Naval Academy Alumni Association, describes Alumni Hall.

For more than 50 years, the U.S. Naval Academy had actively sought a multi-purpose facility where the entire Brigade of Midshipmen, faculty and staff can assemble for professional, academic and entertainment activities.

The building of Alumni Hall was authorized by Congress in the mid-1980s, but funding was inadequate to build the entire facility. It was left to Naval Academy alumni and friends, through a Capital Campaign spearheaded by the Naval Academy Alumni Association, to augment the government funds to complete the building, including furnishings, decoration and landscaping.

Construction for the \$30 million Alumni Hall began in December 1987 by Donohoe Construction company with \$13 million authorized by the Department of the Navy and \$17 million to be raised in private funds. The United Service Organization (USO) donated \$500,000 as the lead gift to complete the auditorium within Alumni Hall in honor of an American who has done much for those in uniform – Bob Hope.

In efforts to enhance the training and development of the members of the brigade, the Naval Academy Athletic Association contributed \$1 million towards the facility.

A multi-purpose facility with seating for up to 6,500 – including 5,710 for basketball – the hall features an auditorium that can easily be adapted for lectures, assemblies, theatrical productions, concerts, official ceremonies, indoor sports and other events.

Alumni Hall has served as the site for Patriot League Women's Basketball Tournament games in 1994, 1998 and 2007, while the Patriot League Men's Basketball Tournament has made four visits to "The Yard" (1994, 1997, 1998, 2001).



DIRECTIONS TO ALUMNI HALL

From North From I-95-South exit onto I-695-East and then take the I-97-South exit. Follow I-97 south until it merges into Route 50 East toward Annapolis. Take Exit 24, Rowe Blvd, and bear right (south) at the bottom of the exit ramp. Follow Rowe Blvd to a left at the second stop light at Taylor Ave. Follow Taylor Ave. about two blocks until it "T" intersects with Annapolis St. Bear right onto Annapolis St. At the first stop light, turn right onto King George St. Turn left at the second stop light onto Maryland Ave. In one block, Maryland Ave. will take you into Gate 3 of the Naval Academy. The guard on duty will direct you to Public Affairs Office and parking.

From South Take I-95-North, MD Route 2 North or U.S. Route 301 North to Route 50. Travel east to Annapolis. Take Exit 24, Rowe Blvd, and bear right (south) at the bottom of the exit ramp and Follow Rowe Blvd to a left at the second stop light at Taylor Ave. Follow from above.

LEHIGH TOPS RIVAL LAFAYETTE FOR THE LEAGUE TITLE

Lifted by a dominant final 10 minutes from senior and Tournament Most Valuable Player Zahir Carrington, Lehigh outscored rival Lafayette, 23-9, down the stretch to beat the Leopards, 74-59, in the Patriot League Championship game on March 12 at Stabler Arena. The Mountain Hawks finished on a 12-1 run, and held Lafayette without a field goal for nearly the last six minutes.

SCHOOL-RECORD VICTORY TOTAL FOR MOUNTAIN HAWKS

Lehigh set a school record with 22 wins in the 2009-10 season. The Mountain Hawks had previously recorded 21 wins in the 1987-88 season. Lehigh finished 15-2 at Stabler Arena, and posted an 18-5 record after a 4-6 start.

LEHIGH DOMINATES PATRIOT LEAGUE TOURNAMENT

Lehigh put together one of the most dominant runs in Patriot League Tournament history, winning its three games by a combined 56 points (18.7 per game) and recording at least a 15-point victory in each contest. Lehigh is the first champion to win all of its Patriot League Tournament games by 15 points or more, and joins Bucknell (2006) as the only team to claim all double-digit victories.

FOUR SENIORS CAP OUTSTANDING CAREERS

The Patriot League had a light class of seniors in 2010, with just 23 student-athletes playing the finale for their teams. But that group had some standout players, including four who left their mark in the League record book. Colgate's Kyle Roemer led the class in scoring with 1,636 points, good for 11th all-time, and places seventh in three-pointers made with 267. Navy's Chris Harris joined Bucknell's Kevin Bettencourt (2002-06) as the only Patriot League players in the record book for points (1,635/12th), three-pointers (288/4th), free throw percentage (84.8/3rd) and steals (174/14th). Lehigh's senior duo of Marquis Hall and Zahir Carrington each established a lasting image in the record book. Hall is the only player in League history with 1,500 points and 500 assists, placing 20th in points (1,514) and second in assists (566) as well as 13th in steals (175) in League history. Carrington finishes with 1,260 points (43rd) and 670 rebounds (9th).

NABC ALL-DISTRICT HONORS FOR FOUR PATRIOT LEAGUERS

A record four Patriot League men's basketball players were named 2010 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division I All-District selections, with Lehigh freshman C.J. McCollum and Navy senior Chris Harris on the First Team and American junior Vlad Moldoveanu and Colgate senior Kyle Roemer on the Second Team. The four selections break the League record of three previously set in 1995 and then again last season.

LEHIGH'S HALL EARNS SENIOR ALL-AMERICA HONOR

Lehigh senior Marquis Hall was named to the 2010 Lowe's Men's Basketball All-Senior All-America Team. He was placed on a team that includes student-athletes from top programs in the nation.

BUCKNELL'S COHEN MID-MAJOR DEFENSIVE ALL-AMERICAN

Bucknell sophomore guard Bryan Cohen, the 2010 Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year, was also named to the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Defensive All-America Team.

PATRIOT LEAGUERS AMONG NCAA STATISTICAL LEADERS

Six Patriot League teams were listed among the final top 50 of NCAA statistical categories at the conclusion of the season. Patriot League champion Lehigh finished in four different categories, while runner-up Lafayette had the highest position for a Patriot League team in any category by ranking fifth in free-throw percentage—ree-pointers per game. Eleven different Patriot League student-athletes were in the NCAA statistical top 50 in at least one category, with Navy's Chris Harris leading the way by placing 18th in scoring (21.1 ppg). Lehigh's C.J. McCollum (44th, 19.1) and Colgate's Kyle Roemer (47th, 18.8) joined Harris to give the Patriot League three players in the NCAA top 50 in scoring.

2009-10 PATRIOT LEAGUE MEN'S BASKETBALL SEASON REVIEW

Lehigh's McCollum Makes League History

The 2009-10 Patriot League Men's Basketball season will be remembered for many things, but none more so than the amazing breakout season for Lehigh freshman C.J. McCollum.

McCollum put together the most impressive freshman season in Patriot League annals. He became the first to ever receive Patriot League Player and Rookie of the Year honors in the same season, as well as joining Colgate's Adonal Foyle (1994-95) as only the second freshman to earn First-Team All-Patriot League honors. His nine Rookie of the Week selections tied for the most in Patriot League history, and his 631 points shattered Foyle's freshman scoring record of 509. He also led all players with 61 points in the Patriot League Tournament to earn All-Tournament honors.

McCollum's season was recognized on the national and regional level, too. He was selected as an Honorable Mention AP All-America, as well as an NABC First-Team All-District pick and ECAC Third-Team All-Star. McCollum was given a multitude of freshman honors, including the ECAC Rookie of the Year, Sporting News All-Freshman Second-Team, Freshman All-America by CollegeInsider.com and Rivals.com Freshman All-America Second Team and Non-Big Six Freshman All-America First Team. McCollum scored 19.1 points per game, making him the only freshman in the NCAA top 50.

Joining McCollum as Patriot League award winners were Lafayette Head Coach Fran O'Hanlon and Bucknell sophomore Bryan Cohen. O'Hanlon won his third Coach of the Year award, while Cohen received the Defensive Player of the Year honor. Lehigh's Marquis Hall was named the Patriot League Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the second straight season.
