The Patriot League



Now in its third decade as an all-sport conference combining academic and athletic excellence, the Patriot League sponsors championships in 24 men and women's sports. Initially started as an NCAA Division I-AA football conference in 1986, the Patriot League became an all-sport conference in 1990 and includes American, Army, Boston University, Bucknell, Colgate, Holy Cross, Lafayette, Lehigh, Loyola and Navy as full members, and Fordham, Georgetown, MIT and Richmond as associate members. These institutions are among the oldest and most prestigious in the nation and their alumni have and continue to play leadership roles in shaping our country.

The Patriot League will celebrate its 25th Anniversary as an all-sport conference during the 2015-16 season, while Jennifer Heppel begins her tenure as the League's Executive Director in August.

Since 1998, the Patriot League has ranked first each year among all Division I conferences awarding athletic aid in the NCAA Graduation Rate Report. The League also had 92 percent of its teams score above the national APR average in the most recent data, and 101 Patriot League teams earned NCAA Academic Performance Program Public Recognition Awards after posting academic progress rate scores in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sports.

The Patriot League's mission is simple: to provide successful competitive athletic experiences while maintaining high academic standards, and to prepare its student-athletes to be leaders in society.

During the 2014-15 academic year, Patriot League student-athletes and teams have accomplished the following:

*101 Patriot League teams earned NCAA Public Recognition Awards for ranking in the top 10 percent of their sport in Academic Progress Rate (APR), with 88 of those squads earning perfect scores.

*The Patriot League ranked second among all conferences in Public Recognition Awards, while Bucknell, Lafayette and Colgate all placed in the top six nationally.

*92 percent of Patriot League teams scored above the national average in APR, while more than 70 percent had at least a 990 score in the multi-year rate.

*Eleven student-athletes earned Capital One Academic All-America recognition, including first-team accolades for Navy's Tom Buffone (Track and Field) and Ellen Bradford (Swimming and Diving), American's Jen Dumiak (Women's Basketball) and Fordham's Brett Biestek (Football).

*Navy's Tom Buffone (Track and Field) and Loren Generi (Women's Lacrosse) and Lafayette's Cory Spera (Baseball) earned NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships.

*Buffone and Dumiak were named the Corvias Patriot League Male and Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year honorees, respectively.

*Thirty-four student-athletes received Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-District recognition.

*There were 2,745 student-athletes on the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll in 2014-15, including 217 with a semester GPA of at least 4.0.

*Bucknell's Ryan Frazier (Men's Basketball) and Andrea Siefert (Women's Rowing) each received the Patriot League Award of Outstanding Leadership and Character, while Lehigh's Ashley Blanks (Women's Soccer) was named the League's Sportsmanship Award winner.

*Four Patriot Leaguers were named Senior CLASS Award finalists, with Colgate's Caroline Brawner (Women's Soccer) and Army West Point's Sam Somers (Men's Lacrosse) earning first-team recognition.

*Brawner was also one of the League's nominations for the NCAA Woman of the Year award along with Boston University's Valentina Cerda Eimbcke (Field Hockey).

*Navy won the Corvias Patriot League Presidents' Cup for the third time in the last four years.

*The Mids also won the men's title while Boston University repeated as women's champion.

*Loyola won a pair of NCAA Tournament games to become the first Patriot League women's lacrosse team to advance to the quarterfinal round, and also finished in the top 10 of the IWLCA Coaches Poll.

*Fordham (Football) and Lehigh (Softball) also won NCAA Tournament contests in 2014-15.

*Fordham running back Chase Edmonds won the Jerry Rice Award as the FCS Freshman of the Year.

*Edmonds was also named the ECAC Offensive Rookie of the Year, while Bucknell's Evan Byers was selected as the ECAC Defensive Player of the Year.

*Twenty-four Patriot Leaguers were named All-Americans in team sports, with first-team status for Byers and Fordham's Mason Halter in football and Navy's Joseph Greenspan in men's soccer

*Four Patriot Leaguers competed at the NCAA Cross Country Championships, and Lehigh's Elizabeth Weiler became the League's first female All-American since 2005.

*Lehigh's Ryan Mahalsky became the first Patriot Leaguer since 2007-08 and sixth all-time to compete at the NCAA Championships for both cross country and outdoor track and field in the same season.

*Bucknell's Emma Levendoski competed in both the 100-meter and 200-meter backstroke at the NCAA Women's Swimming and Diving Championship.

*A League record nine student-athletes were selected in the Major League Lacrosse (MLL) Draft entering the 2015 season, with Army West Point's John Glesener, Loyola's Nikko Pontrello and Colgate's Ryan Walsh among the top 11 picks.

*Navy's Joseph Greenspan and Boston University's Dominique Badji were both selected in the first four rounds of the Major League Soccer (MLS) Draft.

*Five Patriot Leaguers were taken in the Major League Baseball (MLB) First-Year Player Draft, with Lehigh's Justin Pacchioli and Navy's Stephen Moore each selected in the 10th round.

Fordham Edges Bucknell as Preseason Favorite in Patriot League Football

Fordham and Bucknell played an epic game last season, with the Rams winning a matchup of League unbeatens in overtime to clinch the Patriot League title and automatic playoff berth. If preseason predictions ring true, the teams could be in the same spot in 2015 as the defending champion Rams narrowly topped the Bison for first place in the Patriot League preseason poll announced on August 4 at the League's Football Media Day.

Fordham grabbed 10 first-place votes and totaled 66 points to come just in front of Bucknell, which had the remaining four first-place votes and 63 points. Colgate followed in third place with 48 points, and Lafayette (44), Lehigh (31), Holy Cross (29) and Georgetown (13) rounded off the poll order. The preseason poll was voted on by Patriot League football head coaches and sports information directors.

Recent history looks good for Fordham, as the Rams have won an FCS playoff game in each of the last two years and have an overall record of 23-5 in that time with an 11-1 mark against Patriot League opponents. However, Fordham will have to overcome heavy losses to contend again as the Rams bring back only four starters from last season and see 15 All-Patriot League players depart, including 12 who made the first team and two-time Offensive Player of the Year Mike Nebrich. The good news can be found in the return of two key players who won the Patriot League individual awards going into the season. Sophomore running back Chase Edmonds was named Patriot League Preseason Offensive Player of the Year after winning the Jerry Rice Award as the FCS Freshman of the Year last season and rushing for 1,838 yards and 23 touchdowns. Stephen Hodge returns for a graduate year after missing last season due to injury, but is still the Patriot League Preseason Defensive Player of the Year after notching 124 tackles, 16 tackles for loss, five sacks and five forced fumbles in winning the Defensive Player of the Year award in 2013. Offensive lineman Garrick Mayweather and defensive linemen Marlin Crook and Justin Vaughn join Edmonds and Hodge on the Preseason All-Patriot League Team, while Kevin Anderson is set to take over at quarterback.

Bucknell has improved in each of the last two seasons, and last season had its highest overall win total since 1997 at 8-3 while going 4-2 in the Patriot League. The Bison came just shy of winning the League title, and have 13 starters back to try and finish the job. The six starters back on offense include quarterback R.J. Nitti (1,553 yards, 13 TDs), running back C.J. Williams (901 yards, 9 TD) and wide receiver Will Carter (53 rec., 959 yards, 9 TDs), with the latter two earning Preseason All-Patriot League status along with offensive linemen Ramy Kased and Julie'n Davenport. Three first-team All-Patriot League players depart on defense including 2014 Defensive Player of the Year Evan Byers at linebacker, but the Bison have seven starters back on the unit including Preseason All-League picks in Abdullah Anderson (28 TT) on the line and Clayton Ewell (53 TT, 4 INT) in the secondary.

Colgate closed the 2014 season with a win at Bucknell, and the Raiders hope to build on that with Jake Melville back at quarterback after throwing for 1,028 yards and six touchdowns and running for 435 yards and four scores last season as a sophomore despite playing in only seven games due to injury. John Wilkins and Demetrius Russell combined to run for 1,124 yards and 11 touchdowns, while the four players who caught 20 or more passes last season all return to the lineup and John Quazza is a Preseason All-League pick. John Weber made the Preseason All-League Team on the offensive line, where Jordi Dalmau also returns to the lineup. Three of the top four tacklers are gone on defense, but lineman Victor Steffen (56 TT, 11.5 TFL) and linebacker Kyle Diener (89 TT) are Preseason All-League picks.

With running back Ross Scheuerman departed, Lafayette will rely more on Drew Reed, who threw for 1,022 yards and seven touchdowns in limited action last season, to lead the offense. Lafayette brings back two starting wide receivers in Matt Mrazek (26 rec., 360 yards) and Tim Vangelas and Connor Staudle and Nick Zataveski are both Preseason All-Patriot League picks on the offensive line. The secondary leads the defense with Matt Smalley (61 TT, 1 INT) and Jared Roberts (57 TT, 2 INT) on the Preseason All-League Team and Draeland James (45 TT) and Phillip Parham (27 TT, 3 INT) as returning starters. Leading tackler Mark Dodd (89 TT, 2 INT) returns as a Preseason All-League pick at linebacker, with the team's No. 2 tackler, Chris Brockman (77 TT, 7 TFL), also back in the lineup as well as Brandon Bryant (55 TT, 6.5 TFL).

After four straight seasons with at least eight victories and six consecutive years of a winning Patriot League record, Lehigh fell back last season in going 3-8 overall and 2-4 in League action. The Mountain Hawks will look to two young playmakers to keep the offense going, as Nick Shafnisky threw for 2,373 yards and 14 touchdowns while rushing for 526 yards and six scores at quarterback and Troy Pelletier had a breakout freshman season at wide receiver with 49 receptions for 815 yards and seven touchdowns. Lehigh gave up 33.2 points per game on defense last year, but hopes for a quick turnaround with eight starters back. Linebacker Colton Caslow (67 TT) is a Preseason All-League pick, while leading tackler Pierce Ripanti (75 TT) is also back at the position. LaQuan Lambert (65 TT, 2 INT) returns at defensive back with Brandon Leaks (47 TT, 3 INT) and Oliver Rigaud (46 TT, 1 INT).

Holy Cross has seven starters back on each side of the ball as it looks to post its first winning overall and Patriot League records since 2011. Peter Pujals leads the way as a Preseason All-League pick at quarterback after throwing for 2,353 yards and 10 touchdowns and rushing for 705 yards and six scores last season. His top target, Jake Wieczorek, is a Preseason All-League wideout after totaling 50 receptions for 694 yards and five scores. Running back Gabe Guild (588 yards, 5 TD) and wide receiver Kalif Raymond (39 rec., 305 yards, 2 TD) also return to the Crusader offense. The defense loses its top two tacklers, but Dean Doe, Mike Galantini and Richard Barber are back on the line after combining for 91 tackles, 12 tackles for loss and six sacks last year and three starters are also returning in the defensive backfield as seniors Steven Martinez (43 TT, 4 INT) and Matt Bhaya (40 TT, 4 PBU) are back along with sophomore Alim Muhammad (32 TT, 4 PBU).

Georgetown has four players back at the skill positions on offense in quarterback Kyle Nolan, running back Jo'el Kimpela and wide receivers Jake DeCicco and Justin Hill. Nolan threw for 1,763 yards and nine touchdowns last season, while Kimpela rushed for 838 yards and three scores. DeCicco caught 43 passes for 446 yards and two scores while Hill hauled in 31 receptions for 401 yards and three touchdowns. The defense has to replace three All-League picks including first-team defensive end Alec May and linebacker Nick Alfieri, but the Hoyas have a Preseason All-League member at defensive back in Ettian Scott (40 TT, 4 INT, 12 PBU), and bring back the team's second-leading tackler in linebacker Matthew Satchell (92 TT).

The Patriot League football season kicks off on the weekend of Sept. 4-5 with all seven teams in action. The first League contest will be played on Sept. 26 when Colgate visits Holy Cross, with three League games in each of the final five weeks of the regular season. The Patriot League champion earns the League's automatic berth to the FCS Playoffs.



Patriot League Football Preseason All-League Team Announced

Fordham sophomore running back Chase Edmonds earned the Patriot League Preseason Offensive Player of the Year award while his teammate, graduate linebacker Stephen Hodge, was named the League's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year to headline the Preseason All-Patriot League Team announced on August 4 during Media Day at Green Pond Country Club in Bethlehem, Pa.

While the Rams captured both of the individual honors, the All-League Team was evenly distributed. Bucknell and Lafayette each notched six selections on the squad, while Fordham and Colgate totaled five, Lehigh had three, Holy Cross notched two and Georgetown had one.

The Preseason All-Patriot League offense does not have any seniors at the skill positions, with four juniors and a sophomore joining Edmonds at quarterback, running back and wide receiver. Holy Cross junior Peter Pujals took the quarterback spot, Bucknell junior C.J. Williams was named along with Edmonds at running back and juniors Will Carter (Bucknell) and Jake Wiecezorek (Holy Cross) were selected along with Lehigh sophomore Troy Pelletier at wide receiver. Colgate senior John Quazza earned the tight end spot, with seniors Garrick Mayweather (Fordham), Ramy Kased (Bucknell), John Weber (Colgate) and Nick Zataveski (Lafayette) and juniors Julie'n Davenport (Bucknell) and Connor Staudle (Lafayette) on the offensive line. Lafayette senior Matt Smalley was selected as the return specialist, with Colgate junior Jonah Bowman at the placekicker spot.

The defense was young on the line and at linebacker, with four juniors and a sophomore earning five of the eight spots. The defensive line included Fordham juniors Marlin Crook and Justin Vaughn, Colgate senior Victor Steffen and Bucknell sophomore Abdullah Anderson. Hodge took one of the spots at linebacker along with Lafayette senior Mark Dodd and a pair of juniors in Lehigh's Colton Caslow and Colgate's Kyle Diener. The defensive backfield featured four seniors with Smalley and Jared Roberts from Lafayette, Ettian Scott from Georgetown and Clayton Ewell from Bucknell. Lehigh senior Austin Devine is the punter.

Voting for the individual awards and preseason All-League Team was conducted by the Patriot League's head coaches and football sports information directors, who could not vote for their own players.

Edmonds adds to his haul of preseason honors, which includes a spot on the candidate list for the FCS Offensive Player of the Year award and as a first-team All-American, both from STATS. He was named the Jerry Rice Award winner as the FCS Freshman of the Year last season and earned All-America honors while setting school records and placing in the top five in Patriot League single-season history with 1,838 rushing yards and 23 rushing touchdowns. He set the Patriot League single-season all-purpose yardage record as his total of 2,473 eclipsed the record of 2,425 set by Colgate's Kenny Gamble in 1986.

Edmonds led the Patriot League and ranked in the top 10 nationally in both rushing yards (131.3) and all-purpose yards (176.6) per game for the season. His overall rushing and all-purpose yardage totals ranked in the top five in FCS in each category, and Edmonds tied for second in the nation with the 23 rushing touchdowns.

Hodge missed the 2014 season with an injury, but comes back ready for 2015 as the leader of the Fordham defense. In his last playing season in 2013, Hodge earned Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year honors while finishing with 124 tackles, 16 tackles for loss, five sacks, five forced fumbles, three fumble recoveries and an interception. He tied for the national lead in forced fumbles and also paced all FCS players with 94 solo tackles.

Pujals threw for 2,353 yards and 10 touchdowns last season, and proved to be a dual threat on the ground with 705 yards and six touchdowns. Williams ran for 901 yards and nine touchdowns for the Bison despite missing time with injuries. All three wide receivers had standout seasons, with Carter catching 53 passes for 959 yards and nine touchdowns and Wiecezorek totaling 50 receptions for 694 yards and five touchdowns as sophomores while Pelletier had 49 catches for 815 yards and seven touchdowns in his freshman season.

The six offensive linemen each played key roles on their teams, while Bowman made 14-of-16 field goals for Colgate and Smalley led the Patriot League with a 23.5 average on kickoff returns.

Among the defensive linemen, Anderson had 28 tackles for Bucknell, Steffen notched 56 tackles and 11.5 tackles for loss for Colgate while Crook had 25 tackles and 7.5 sacks and Vaughn notched 24 tackles and a sack for Fordham. Joining Hodge at linebacker were Lehigh's Caslow (67 TT), Colgate's Diener (89 TT) and Lafayette's Dodd (89 TT). In the defensive backfield, Lafayette's Smalley (61 TT, 1 INT) and Roberts (57 TT, 2 INT) each enjoyed strong seasons along with Bucknell's Ewell (53 TT, 4 INT) and Georgetown's Scott (40 TT, 4 INT, PBU). Devine averaged 42.2 yards per attempt last season for the Mountain Hawks.

The Preseason All-Patriot League squad features 19 players who earned All-Patriot League status last season. Edmonds, Carter, Davenport, Mayweather and Bowman made the first-team offense, while Smalley, Roberts and Devine were first-team picks on the defense. Thirteen players are entering their senior season, while 11 juniors and three sophomores are on the squad.

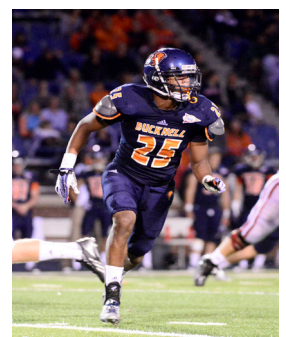

EDMONDS HAULS IN PRESEASON HONORS

Fordham running back Chase Edmonds starts the year as a candidate for the FCS Offensive Player of the Year award by STATS as well as on the watch list for the National Performer of the Year honor from College Football Performance Awards. He was also selected as a Preseason All-American by STATS. The honors come after Edmonds won the Jerry Rice Award as the FCS Freshman of the Year last season.

Edmonds set school records and placed in the top five in Patriot League single-season history with 1,838 rushing yards and 23 rushing touchdowns in 2014. He set the Patriot League single-season all-purpose yardage record as his total of 2,473 eclipsed the record of 2,425 set by Colgate's Kenny Gamble in the inaugural Patriot League season in 1986.

Edmonds led the Patriot League and ranked in the top 10 nationally in both rushing yards (131.3) and all-purpose yards (176.6) per game for the season. His overall rushing and all-purpose yardage totals ranked in the top five in FCS in each category, and Edmonds tied for second in the nation with the 23 rushing touchdowns.

TWO MORE NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

Joining Edmonds on the STATS Preseason FCS All-America squad were his teammate Garrick Mayweather, a second-team offensive lineman, and Lafayette's Matt Smalley as a third-team defensive back. Mayweather was one of the top blockers for an outstanding Fordham offense that featured Edmonds as well as a high-powered passing attack. He helped the Rams rank in the top five in FCS in passing, scoring and total offense. Smalley comes off another strong season as a starting cornerback for Lafayette. He finished last year's campaign with 61 tackles, five tackles for loss, two sacks and an interception, and tied for third in the Patriot League with 12 passes defended. Smalley also averaged 23.5 yards on kickoff returns as a junior.

FORDHAM'S DAWSON A CANDIDATE FOR AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

Fordham junior linebacker George Dawson is one of 197 nominees for the 2015 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. Dawson, who started every game at linebacker in 2014, recorded 68 total tackles and two interceptions last season. Off the field, he is active with numerous community service projects with the team including participating with the Rams continued work at The Eagle Academy, an ongoing partnership between Fordham football and the school. The Allstate AFCA Good Works Team® recognizes college football players from across the country who exemplifies a superior commitment to community service and volunteerism.

2015 PATRIOT LEAGUE NON-LEAGUE SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS

In addition to the League race, there are plenty of highlights in the non-League schedules including three games against the service academies which compete as full members in the Patriot League but play football at the FBS level. That includes two matchups on the opening weekend as Fordham goes to Army West Point on Sept. 4 and Colgate is at Navy on Sept. 5, while Bucknell also visits Army West Point on Oct. 17.

The non-League matchups also include seven games against opponents from the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA), with five of those played over the first two weekends. Lafayette hosts William & Mary to open the season on Sept. 5, while games on Sept. 12 include Colgate hosting New Hampshire, Fordham welcoming Villanova, Lehigh at James Madison and Lafayette at Delaware. Holy Cross also goes to Towson on Sept. 19 and hosts Albany on Oct. 3. New Hampshire advanced to the FCS semifinals last season, Villanova made it to the quarterfinals and James Madison also appeared in the postseason.

Each Patriot League team will open the season on Labor Day weekend. Lehigh is at Central Connecticut in addition to the Fordham-Army West Point game on Sept. 4, while the opening Saturday on Sept. 5 includes Georgetown at St. Francis (Pa.), Holy Cross at Monmouth and Bucknell hosting Marist in addition to Colgate-Navy and William & Mary-Lafayette. Additional home openers include UNH-Colgate, Villanova-Fordham and Marist-Georgetown on Sept. 12, Penn-Lehigh on Sept. 19 and Colgate-Holy Cross, which also serves as the first Patriot League contest of the year, on Sept. 26.

Matchups against opponents from the Ivy League begin on Sept. 19 as six Patriot League schools take on an Ivy foe. There will be 15 contests against Ivy League opponents spanning until Oct. 17. The non-League slate also features five games against teams from the Northeast Conference, three versus opponents from the Big South and a pair against Marist, which is part of the Pioneer Football League.



FOLLOW THE NATION THROUGH FCS INSIDER

The FCS Insider website debuted in the fall of 2013 and includes coverage on all of the teams and conferences throughout the country. A notebook will be produced each week to highlight the top storylines for each conference.

The 2015 FCS playoffs will once again be a 24-team event, with 10 automatic berths and 14 at-large participants. 2015 Bucknell Bison

HEAD COACH: Joe Susan, 6th Season at Bucknell
34-31 overall/24-31 at Bucknell, 12-18 Patriot League

2014 RECORD: 8-3 Overall, 4-2 Patriot League (2nd place)

OFFENSE: The Bison bring back six starters, including their key players at the skill positions. R.J. Nitti threw for 1,553 yards and 13 touchdowns and C.J. Williams ran for 901 yards and nine scores last season, putting up the numbers despite each having their seasons interrupted with games missed. Will Carter had a breakout season at wide receiver as he caught 53 passes for 959 yards and nine touchdowns and Bobby Kaslander hauled in 27 catches for 362 yards and four scores. The offensive line will once again be led by Julie'n Davenport and Ramy Kased, who earned Preseason All-League honors along with Williams and Carter. The Bison did lose Lonnie Rawles from the line after an All-Patriot League year.

DEFENSE: Bucknell has seven starters back on defense, though the group loses three first-team All-Patriot League honorees in defensive lineman Demetrius Baldwin-Youngblood and linebackers Lee Marvel and Evan Byers, the 2014 Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year. Abdullah Anderson (28 TT) is back on the defensive line and Clayton Ewell (53 TT, 4 INT) returns at defensive back as both earned Preseason All-League honors, while Louis Taglianetti (62 TT, 3 INT) and Colin Jonov (23 TT, 2 INT) are also in the defensive backfield with Doug Whitlock (4 sacks) joining Anderson on the line.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Derek Maurer handled both the placekicking and punting duties last season, so the Bison will have new faces in both areas. A pair of sophomores are slated to step in with John Burdick at kicker and Matt Muh as the punter.

RECRUITING CLASS Bucknell brought in 22 student-athletes in 2015, with 16 of those from either New Jersey or Pennsylvania. The group was evenly distributed with 11 on defense, 10 on offense and one kicker.

SCHEDULE: After beating Marist, Cornell and VMI last season, the Bison will take on each squad again over the first five weeks. Bucknell opens with home games against Marist (Sept. 5) and Duquesne (Sept. 12), then has road trips to Cornell (Sept. 19) and VMI (Oct. 3) wrapped around a bye. Patriot League play starts at home against Lehigh on Oct. 10, and the Bison then finish the non-League slate at Army West Point on Oct. 17. Bucknell plays League contests over the final five weeks, hosting Georgetown (Oct. 24) and Holy Cross (Nov. 14) and visiting Lafayette (Oct. 31), Fordham (Nov. 7) and Colgate (Nov. 21).

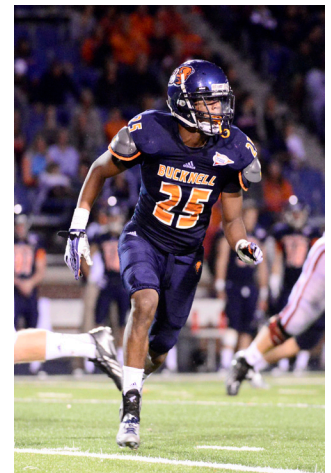

2015 Colgate Raiders

HEAD COACH: Dan Hunt, 2nd Season at Colgate
5-7 Overall/Colgate, 3-3 Patriot League

2014 RECORD: 5-7 overall, 3-3 Patriot League (T3rd place)

OFFENSE: Jake Melville threw for 1,028 yards and six touchdowns and ran for 435 yards and four scores last season as a sophomore despite playing in only seven games, so the Raiders have high hopes of a strong full season in 2015. John Wilkins and Demetrius Russell combined to run for 1,124 yards and 11 touchdowns, while the four players who caught 20 or more passes last season all return to the lineup and John Quazza is a Preseason All-League pick. John Weber made the Preseason All-League Team on the offensive line, where Jordi Dalmau also returns.

DEFENSE: The Raiders were vastly improved on defense last year, but to keep it up they will have to replace three of the team's top four tacklers as defensive back Mike Armiento and linebackers Kris Kent and Vinny Russo have all moved on. The top tackler is back as Kyle Diener is a Preseason All-Patriot League pick at linebacker after making 89 stops last year with four sacks and three interceptions. Victor Steffen is a Preseason All-League honoree on the line after making 56 tackles and 11.5 tackles for loss last year, while Chris Morgan (71 TT, 2 INT) and Adam Bridgeforth (60 TT, 2 INT) return in the defensive backfield with Pat Afriyie (33 TT, 4.5 sacks) joining Diener at linebacker.

SPECIAL TEAMS: The Raiders might have the best special teams situation in the League coming back with proven performers in all three areas. Jonah Bowman (14-16 FG) is back at kicker as a Preseason All-League pick, Nikko Armiento (39.6 avg) returns as the punter and John Maddaluna III (23.0 KR avg) was an All-League return specialist last season.

RECRUITING CLASS Colgate announced a class of 16 student-athletes on national signing day, coming from seven states. Nine were on the offensive side with six on defense, and two quarterbacks were added to the roster.

SCHEDULE: Colgate was the last Patriot League team to take on Navy back in 1998, and the Raiders will re-start the series for League squads when they visit the Mids to open the season on CBS Sports Network on Sept. 5. Two more non-League challenges follow with home dates against New Hampshire (Sept. 12) and Yale (Sept. 19), with the Raiders then playing in the Patriot League opener when they visit Holy Cross on Sept. 26 on American Sports Network. That matchup starts a four-game road trip with non-League visits to Cornell (Oct. 2) and Princeton (Oct. 10) before a matchup at Georgetown* (Oct. 17). After a bye week, Colgate concludes with three of its final four games at home as it welcomes Fordham (Oct. 31), Lehigh (Nov. 14) and Bucknell (Nov. 21) around a road trip to Lafayette (Nov. 7).

HEAD COACH: Joe Moorhead, 4th Season at Fordham

29-10 Overall/Fordham, 14-4 Patriot League

2014 RECORD: 11-3 Overall, 6-0 Patriot League (1st place)

FCS PLAYOFFS: First Round: Beat Sacred Heart; Second Round: Lost at UNH

OFFENSE: A team known for its prolific passing game over the past two seasons loses almost all of its contributors in that area as quarterback Mike Nebrich departs after claiming the last two Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year awards and wide receivers Brian Wetzell, Sam Ajala and Tebucky Jones Jr. are gone along with tight end Dan Light after all posting outstanding numbers. If the Rams have to rely more on the running game, they are in great shape as Chase Edmonds ran for 1,838 yards and 23 touchdowns and had a Patriot League single-season record 2,473 all-purpose yards in his award-winning freshman season. Garrick Mayweather returns on the line after earning first-team All-League honors along with Edmonds, though the Rams lose their other eight first-team All-League players from last season. Anthony Coyle is also a returning starter on the line. Kevin Anderson, a transfer from Marshall, is expected to start at quarterback.

DEFENSE: Like the offense, Fordham's defense was gutted by graduation as linebacker George Dawson (68 TT, 5.5 TFL) is the only returning starter from last season. However, the unit will get a boost from the return of linebacker Stephen Hodge, who was injured last year but had 124 tackles and 16 tackles for loss in winning the Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year award in 2013 and is the preseason honoree this year. Fordham's losses from the defense include first-team All-Patriot League selections in lineman Brett Biestek and DeAndre Slate, linebacker Austin Hancock and defensive backs Ian Williams and Jordan Chapman.

SPECIAL TEAMS: The Rams have to replace a standout kicker as Michael Marando graduated as the Patriot League's all-time leader in points at the position. Joe Pavlik (38.8) is back after an All-League season at punter, while Edmonds proved to be a dynamic threat in the return game as a freshman.

RECRUITING CLASS With 18 starters and 30 letterwinners lost, Fordham was in need of reinforcements and got them in the form of a 22-player recruiting class. The class features 13 players on offense and nine on defense, with the student-athletes coming from 14 different states.

SCHEDULE: Fordham has a chance to avenge its two regular-season losses from last season as it opens at Army West Point (Sept. 4) and then plays at home against Villanova (Sept. 12). That matchup starts a three-game homestand as the Rams also play Columbia (Sept. 19) and Monmouth (Sept. 26) before beginning League play at Lafayette (Oct. 3). After concluding non-League action at Penn (Oct. 10), Fordham finishes with five straight Patriot League games as it hosts Holy Cross (Oct. 17), Lehigh (Oct. 24) and Bucknell (Nov. 7) and visits Colgate (Oct. 31) and Georgetown (Nov. 14) before an open date on the final regular-season Saturday.

3-8 Overall/Georgetown, 1-5 Patriot League

2014 RECORD: 3-8 overall, 1-5 Patriot League (7th place)

OFFENSE: The Hoyas only averaged 13.5 points per game last season, but can look for improvement behind returning starters at quarterback (Kyle Nolan), running back (Jo'el Kimpela) and wide receiver (Jake DeCicco, Justin Hill). Nolan threw for 1,763 yards and nine touchdowns last season, while Kimpela rushed for 838 yards and three scores. DeCicco caught 43 passes for 446 yards and two scores while Hill hauled in 31 receptions for 401 yards and three touchdowns. Kevin Liddy is the leader on the offensive line which does lose some key pieces, including second-team All-League honoree Mike Roland.

DEFENSE: Georgetown has a history of replacing standout players on defense, and the Hoyas face that task again as three All-Patriot League players are gone from the unit, including first-team honorees Alec May on the defensive line and Nick Alfieri at linebacker. The Hoyas do have a Preseason All-League member in the defensive backfield in Ettian Scott (40 TT, 4 INT, 12 PBU), and also bring back the team's second-leading tackler in linebacker Matthew Satchell (92 TT). Four of the team's top five tacklers are gone, so the Hoyas will look for players like defensive back Garrett Powers (49 TT, 3 INT) and linebacker Tyrell Williams (47 TT) to step up.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Georgetown has experience at both of the kicking positions, with Harry McCollum (42.1 average) back at punter and Henry Darmstadter (7-10 FG) as the placekicker. There is little experience at the kick return spot, but DeCicco served as the team's punt return man last season.

RECRUITING CLASS: The Hoyas announced a class of 23 student-athletes on national signing day, with 11 players joining the team on offense and 12 on defense. The group hails from 14 different states and includes two quarterbacks.

SCHEDULE: The Hoyas will play their non-League slate over the first five weeks of the season. They begin the year at St. Francis (Pa.) (Sept. 5), then have back-to-back home games against Marist (Sept. 12) and Dartmouth (Sept. 19) before a two-game Ivy League road trip to Columbia (Sept. 26) and Harvard (Oct. 2). Patriot League play opens with two home games as Lafayette (Oct. 10) and Colgate (Oct. 17) come to town, with a road trip next to Bucknell (Oct. 24) and Lehigh (Oct. 31). After a bye week, Georgetown concludes the season at home against Fordham (Nov. 14) and at Holy Cross (Nov. 21).

2015 Holy Cross Crusaders

HEAD COACH: Tom Gilmore, 12th Season at Holy Cross
60-64 overall/Holy Cross, 35-31 Patriot League

2014 RECORD: 4-8 overall, 2-4 Patriot League (T5th place)

OFFENSE: Holy Cross has a solid core back on offense with seven starters returning, including the Preseason All-League quarterback in Peter Pujals. The junior has started since early in his freshman season and threw for 2,353 yards and 10 touchdowns while rushing for 705 yards and six scores last season. Top players are also back at the skill positions in running back Gabe Guild (588 yards, 5 TD), Preseason All-League wide receiver Jake Wiczorek (50 rec., 694 yards, 5 TD) and fellow wide-out Kalif Raymond (39 rec., 305 yards, 2 TD) as well as tight end Lucas Nikolaisen (12 rec., 106 yards). Hunter Hudgins and James Murray are back as starters on the offensive line, though the unit loses Jay Knighton and Blake Berresford after each player started all 12 games last season.

DEFENSE: The Crusaders bring back seven starters on the defensive side of the ball, though they lose their top two tacklers at linebacker in John Zakrzewski and Shane Thompson. Dean Doe, Mike Galantini and Richard Barber are back on the line after combining for 91 tackles, 12 tackles for loss and six sacks last year. Three starters are also returning in the defensive backfield as seniors Steven Martinez (43 TT, 4 INT) and Matt Bhaya (40 TT, 4 PBU) return along with sophomore Alim Muhammad (32 TT, 4 PBU).

SPECIAL TEAMS: Connor Fitzgerald is back for the Crusaders after going 11-of-17 on field goals and averaging 41.2 yards per punt in taking on both duties last season. Raymond has also shown to be a dynamic player in the return game.

RECRUITING CLASS Holy Cross re-stocked its roster with a 25-player recruiting class, featuring 13 players on offense, nine on defense and three specialists. The group comes to Worcester from 12 different states.

SCHEDULE: The Crusaders open their season with a pair of road games, visiting Monmouth (Sept. 5) and Towson (Sept. 19) around a bye on Sept. 12. 2015 Lafayette Leopards

HEAD COACH: Frank Tavani, 16th Season at Lafayette
81-88 Overall/Lafayette, 48-45 Patriot League

2014 RECORD: 5-6 Overall, 3-3 Patriot League (T3rd place)

OFFENSE: With Ross Scheuerman now in NFL training camp after rushing for 1,191 yards and 12 touchdowns and leading the team with 57 catches for 521 yards, the Leopards will look for playmakers to step up and fill the void. What would really help that happen would be a healthy full season for quarterback Drew Reed, who threw for 1,022 yards and seven touchdowns in limited action last season. The Leopards bring back two starting wide receivers in Matt Mrazek (26 rec., 360 yards) and Tim Vangelas (30 rec., 240 yards, TD), and DeSean Brown (247 yards) has some experience at running back. Connor Staudle and Nick Zataveski are both Preseason All-Patriot League picks on the offensive line.

DEFENSE: The secondary looks like a strength for the Leopards once again as both Matt Smalley (61 TT, 1 INT) and Jared Roberts (57 TT, 2 INT) have earned Preseason All-Patriot League honors, with Smalley adding an All-America honor heading into the year. The entire starting defensive backfield returns with Draeland James (45 TT) and Phillip Parham (27 TT, 3 INT) also back. Leading tackler Mark Dodd (89 TT, 2 INT) returns as a Preseason All-League pick at linebacker, with the team's No. 2 tackler, Chris Brockman (77 TT, 7 TFL), also back in the lineup as well as Brandon Bryant (55 TT, 6.5 TFL). Matt Rothrock (23 TT) and Steve Mercado (17 TT) are back as starters on the interior of the line.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Ryan Gralish is back as the placekicker after an inconsistent season, while Ryan Forrester returns at punter after posting a 39.4 average last season. The Leopards should also be formidable in the return game again as Smalley averaged 23.5 yards on kickoff returns and is the Preseason All-League pick at the position and Vangelas averaged 9.9 yards on punt returns.

2015 Lehigh Mountain Hawks

HEAD COACH: Andy Coen, 10th Season at Lehigh
62-41 overall/Lehigh, 37-17 Patriot League

2014 RECORD: 3-8 overall, 2-4 Patriot League (T5th place)

OFFENSE: Lehigh has six starters returning on the offensive side of the ball, led by quarterback Nick Shafnisky. In addition to passing for 2,373 yards and 14 touchdowns, Shafnisky also placed second on the team in rushing with 526 yards and six scores. His top target is back as Troy Pelletier had a breakout freshman season with 49 receptions for 815 yards and seven touchdowns. Brandon Short is the team's top returning lineman. Lehigh does have to replace dependable contributors at running back (Rich Sodeke) and wide receiver (Josh Parris) as well as first-team All-League offensive lineman Ned Daryoush.

DEFENSE: The Lehigh defense struggled last season, allowing 33.2 points per game in the 3-8 campaign. But the Mountain Hawks have the chance for a quick turnaround with eight starters returning to the lineup. Leading tackler Pierce Ripanti (75 TT) and Preseason All-League pick Colton Caslow (67 TT) each return at linebacker, while the team's No. 3 tackler, LaQuan Lambert (65 TT, 2 INT) holds his spot at defensive back along with Brandon Leaks (47 TT, 3 INT) and Oliver Rigaud (46 TT, 1 INT). Tyler Cavenas (12 TT) also returns on the defensive line along with Matthew Laub (34 TT, 10 TFL) in the front seven. There is one key loss as second-team All-League honoree Tim Newton (51 TT, 5 sacks) is gone from the line.

SPECIAL TEAMS: The Mountain Hawks hope Austin Devine can put together another strong season at punter as the first-team All-Patriot League honoree averaged 42.2 yards per attempt last season. Lehigh does not have any experience at kicker, however, with only a pair of freshmen listed on the roster. There are a handful of players with experience in the return game.

RECRUITING CLASS Lehigh welcomed the largest recruiting class in the Patriot League with 31 student-athletes joining the program. There were 12 states represented and multiple players at almost every position group. The group included 16 players on offense, 13 on defense and a pair of specialists.

SCHEDULE: Lehigh opens the season with a pair of road games, starting on a Friday night at Central Connecticut State (Sept. 4) before a trip to James Madison (Sept. 12). The non-League schedule wraps up the next three weeks with a home date against Penn (Sept. 19), visit to Princeton (Sept. 26) and matchup in Bethlehem against Yale (Oct. 3). Lehigh opens Patriot League action at Bucknell (Oct. 10), then has its bye week before finishing the year with five straight weeks of League competition. The Mountain Hawks are at Fordham (Oct. 24) and Colgate (Nov. 14) and play at home down the stretch against Georgetown (Oct. 31), Holy Cross (Nov. 7) and archrival Lafayette (Nov. 21) in the 151st meeting between the schools.

2014 Patriot League Season in Review

FORDHAM CLAIMS FIRST PATRIOT LEAGUE TITLE SINCE 2007....

Fordham was eligible for the Patriot League title for the first time since 2009, and made sure to capitalize on it by winning its first League crown since 2007 and third overall. Fordham finished unbeaten in Patriot League play for the first time, and captured the title in dramatic fashion when it beat Bucknell 30-27 in overtime in a nationally-televised contest on Nov. 7. The Rams were the outright champion for the second time after also pulling it off in 2007.

....AND FINISHES IN TOP 15 NATIONALLY

After a top-10 finish last year, Fordham just missed the mark in 2014 as the Rams came in at No. 11 in the final Sports Network Top 25 poll and No. 14 in the FCS Coaches Poll. Fordham won an FCS playoff game for the second year in a row as it defeated Sacred Heart 44-22 at home on Nov. 29 before falling at top-seed New Hampshire the next weekend.

EDMONDS WINS JERRY RICE AWARD AS FCS FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR

An unbelievable debut season was recognized nationally for Fordham running back Chase Edmonds as he was named the Jerry Rice Award winner as the FCS Freshman of the Year. Edmonds easily captured the award as he took home 95 of a possible 160 first-place votes. Edmonds set school records and placed in the top five in Patriot League single-season history with 1,838 rushing yards and 23 rushing touchdowns in 2014. He set the Patriot League single-season all-purpose yardage record as his total of 2,473 eclipsed the record of 2,425 set by Colgate's Kenny Gamble in the inaugural Patriot League season in 1986. He was also the only freshman up for the Walter Payton Award, finishing in 15th place, and was named a second-team All-American by The Sports Network and third-team by the AP, while Fordham wide receiver Brian Wetzel and Georgetown defensive end Alec May also earned second-team Sports Network All-America status.

MORE POSTSEASON HONORS

Edmonds was not the only Patriot Leaguer to earn a season-ending award or All-America honors. Bucknell linebacker Evan Byers was also a big winner, as he claimed the ECAC Defensive Player of the Year award as well as All-America honors from the AFCA, Sports Network and Associated Press, with second-team status from the latter two organizations. Fordham offensive lineman Mason Halter was named a first-team All-American by The Sports Network and third-team by the AP, while Fordham wide receiver Brian Wetzel and Georgetown defensive end Alec May also earned second-team Sports Network All-America status.

HANDFUL OF PATRIOT LEAGUERS EARN ACADEMIC HONORS

Fordham's Brett Biestek and Dan Light each earned Capital One Academic All-America status, with Biestek on the first team and Light making the second team. Five Patriot Leaguers were named to the FCS ADA Academic All-Star Team with Bucknell's Matt DelMauro and Derek Maurer, Holy Cross' Sam Jones, Georgetown's Alec May and Lehigh's Josh Parris earning the distinction. Twenty-four Patriot Leaguers went on to make the NFF Hampshire Honor Society.

FORDHAM DOMINATES ALL-PATRIOT LEAGUE TEAM

After setting a record with 18 All-Patriot League selections in 2013, League champion Fordham outdid itself by having 20 selections in 2014 along with a pair of individual award winners. Fordham senior quarterback Mike Nebrich was named Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year for the second year in a row while freshman running back Chase Edmonds turned his outstanding debut season into the 2014 Patriot League Rookie of the Year award. Bucknell senior linebacker Evan Byers was named Patriot League Defensive Player of the Year, while Joe Susan was selected as the Patriot League Coach of the Year for the Bison. Fordham's 15 first-team All-League honorees topped the 12 for Holy Cross in 1987 as the most in Patriot League history. In addition to the All-League success, Fordham added another major award when graduate student defensive end Brett Biestek was named the Corvias Patriot League Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year.
